The amount of money distributed for breeders' awards or purse supplements pursuant 6 7 to subpart 3, shall be paid out in the same percentage as the purse money in the race. 8 9 [For text of subp 5, see M.R.] 10 Time of payment. Purse supplements are part of Subp. 6. 11 the purse and shall be credited to owners' accounts at the time 12 the purses are earned. Subp. 3. Artificial insemination. Beginning with the 2006 1 breeding season, foals conceived by transported semen (including 2 semen shipped out of Minnesota) shall be considered 3 Minnesota-bred as long as they meet the requirements of Rule 26, 4 5 Section 6, of the United States Trotting Association rules for artificial insemination. The stallion must still meet the 6 requirements in part 7895.0275 for stallion registration in 7 Minnesota. 8
