1.3 **2201.0010 AUTHORITY AND PURPOSE.**

1.4 The purpose of this chapter is to establish standards for the physical examination and 1.5 condition of boxers and referees and to establish other rules necessary to carry out the 1.6 purposes of Minnesota Statutes, chapter 341, including, but not limited to, the conduct 1.7 of boxing exhibitions, bouts, and fights, and their manner, supervision, time, and place 1.8 pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, section 341.25.

1.9 **2201.0020 DEFINITIONS.**

1.10 Subpart 1. Generally. The terms used in this chapter have the meanings given them1.11 in this part.

Subp. 2. Amateur. "Amateur" means an individual who participates in a tough
person contest as a pastime rather than a profession and who is not receiving or competing
for and has never received or competed for any purse or other article or thing of value that
exceeds \$50 in value for participating in a contest.

1.16 Subp. 3. Association of Boxing Commissions or ABC. "Association of Boxing
1.17 Commissions" or "ABC" means the Association of Boxing Commissions, of which the
1.18 Minnesota Boxing Commission is a member.

1.19 Subp. 4. Boxer. "Boxer" means an individual that practices the act of attack and
1.20 defense with the fists, using padded gloves. Where applicable, boxer includes an individual

1.21 who engages in the practice of boxing by using hands, feet, or both in any manner.

1.22 Subp. 5. Combatant. "Combatant" means a licensed boxer or mixed martial artist

"Pre-contest physical examination" 2.12 means a physical examination performed by a physician licensed in this state that occurs 213 within the 36 three hours immediately prior to entering the ring. 2.14 Subp. 12. Professional. "Professional" means any person who competes for any 2.15 money prize or a prize that exceeds the value of \$50 or teaches, pursues, or assists in the 2.16 practice of boxing as a means of obtaining a livelihood or pecuniary gain. 2.17 Subp. 13. Referee. "Referee" means an individual that is the sole arbiter, umpire, 2.18 judge, or adjudicator of a boxing contest or a tough person contest. 2.19 Subp. 14. Tough person. "Tough person," "tough man," or "tough woman" means 2.20 an individual a boxer who engages in the practice of boxing by using hands, feet, or 2.21 both in any manner. 2.22 Subp. 15. Tough person contest. "Tough person contest" means any boxing contest 2.23 consisting of a maximum of four total rounds that do not exceed two minutes between 2.24
