No Androgenic-anabolic steroids 7.1 (AAS) shall be permitted in test samples collected from racing horses except for 7.2 endogenous concentrations of nandrolone and naturally occurring substances boldenone 7.3 and testosterone at concentrations less than the indicated thresholds. Concentrations 7.4 of these AAS shall not exceed the following plasma or serum thresholds for free (i.e. 7.5 not conjugated) substance or urine threshold concentrations for total (i.e., free drug or 7.6 metabolite and drug or metabolite liberated from its conjugates): 7.7 A. Boldenone - 15 ng/ml of total boldenone in urine of male horses other than 7.8 geldings; 1 ng/ml in fillies, mares, and geldings; or not greater than 25 pg/ml of boldenone 7.9 in plasma or serum of all horses regardless of sex. 7.10 B. Nandrolone: 7.11 (1) in geldings - 1 ng/ml total nandrolone in urine or not greater than 25 7.12 pg/ml of nandrolone in plasma or serum; 7.13 (2) in fillies and mares - 1 ng/ml total nandrolone in urine or not greater 7.14 7.15 than 25 pg/ml of nandrolone in plasma or serum; and (3) in male horses other than geldings - 45 ng/ml of metabolite 7.16 $(5\alpha$ -oestrane-3 β , 17 α -diol in urine). 7.17 C. Any horse 8.2 to which one of these AAS has been administered in order to assist in the recovery from an 8.3 illness or injury may be placed on the veterinarian's list in order to monitor the concentration 8.4 of the drug or metabolite in urine. After the concentration has fallen below the designated 8.5 threshold for the administered AAS, the horse is eligible to be removed from the list. 8.6 [For text of subp 8, see M.R.] 8.7 Subp. 9. Endogenous, dietary, and environmental substances. No endogenous, 8.8 8.9 dietary, or environmental substances other than those listed below shall be allowed in the test sample of a horse. Levels shall not exceed the limits found in the Racing 8.10 Commissioners International Endogenous, Dietary, or Environmental Schedule, 8.11 8.12 RCI Chapter 11 and Chapter 25, which is incorporated by reference. No medications other than those 8.18 listed in this subpart or found in part 7890.0100, subpart 13, items A to D, shall be 8.19 allowed in the test sample of a horse. Serum or urine thresholds on the following 8.20 medications shall not exceed those found in the Racing Commissioners International 8.21 Schedule of Controlled Therapeutic Substances, RCI Chapter 11 and Chapter 25, which 8.22 is incorporated by reference. (4) the name of each patient (horse) for whom the medication is prescribed 9.18 or dispensed; 9.19

- the name of the person (trainer) to whom the medication was dispensed; 9.20 (5)
- 9.21 (6) the name, active ingredient, and quantity of the medication prescribed;
- the dose, dosage, route of administration, and duration of treatment; and 9.22 (7)
