**ORDER ON REVIEW OF  
RULES UNDER  
MINN. STAT. § 14.26**

This matter came before Administrative Law Judge Barbara J. Case upon the application of the Minnesota Department of Human Services (the Department) for a legal review under Minn. Stat. § 14.26 (2022)

The Department seeks review and approval of the above-entitled rules, which the Department adopted pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 14.26. On September 15, 2022, the Department filed all documents required under Minn. Stat. § 14.26 and Minn. R. 1400.2310 (2021) with the Office of Administrative Hearings.

Based upon a review of the written submissions and filings, Minnesota Statutes, Minnesota Rules,

**IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED:**

1. The Department has the statutory authority to adopt the rules.
2. The Department adopted the rules in compliance with the procedural requirements of Minn. Stat. §§ 14.001-.69 (2022); Minn. R. 1400.2000-.2310 (2021).<sup>1</sup>
3. The modifications to the rule made by the Department following publication of the proposed rules in the *State Register* do not result in substantially different rules within the meaning of Minn. Stat. §§ 14.05, subd. 2, 14.24.
4. The record demonstrates the rules are needed and reasonable.
