3 Proposed Permanent Rules Relating to Project Discover License

5 Rules as Proposed (all new material)

6 3709.0350 PROJECT DISCOVER LICENSE.

7 Subpart 1. May teach. A person holding a technical
8 college Project Discover license may teach personal development,
9 career development, and applied issues courses in Project
10 Discover.

11 Subp. 2. Other requirements. The applicant must meet the
12 requirements in part 3709.0100, subpart 2.

13 Subp. 3. Licensure requirements. The applicant must have
14 the educational and occupational experience described in items A
15 to D. The education must be from an accredited postsecondary
16 institution.

17 A. A minimum of two years of postsecondary education
18 resulting in completion with a certificate, diploma, or degree.

19 B. Four thousand hours of verified experience. The
20 experience must be from two areas or more of the areas listed in
21 this item:

- 22 (1) counselor;
- 23 (2) support group facilitator;
- 24 (3) advocate within an educational or social
25 service institution;
- 26 (4) human service caseworkers;
- 27 (5) employment counselor;
- 28 (6) affirmative action coordinator or officer;
- 29 (7) career counselor; and
- 30 (8) teacher in an educational institution.

31 C. A total of 12 quarter credits from two or more of
32 the areas listed in this item:

- 33 (1) career development;
- 34 (2) group process;
- 35 (3) interpersonal communications;



- 1 (4) behavioral sciences;
2 (5) women's studies;
3 (6) family life education; and
4 (7) counseling techniques.

5 D. Twelve hours of state sponsored workshops in
6 teaching Project Discover.

7 Subp. 4. Substitution for required experiences. The
8 applicant may use the substitutions as described in items A and
9 B.

10 A. The applicant may substitute up to 1,000 hours of
11 occupational experience required in subpart 3, item B, through
12 verified volunteer activity that occurred under supervision of
13 paid professional staff within a human service agency. This
14 experience may be in a shelter for the homeless, battered woman
15 program, chemical dependency program, head start program, crises
16 center, displaced homemaker program, handicapped program for
17 special populations, minority advocacy agency, and legal
18 advocacy program.

19 B. The applicant may substitute up to six credits of
20 educational experience as required in subpart 3, item C, at the
21 ratio of 12 clock hours for each quarter credit in the following
22 topics: sexual harassment, decision making techniques, personal
23 development, stress management, group facilitation, equal
24 opportunity/affirmative action, career assessment, assertiveness
25 training, interpersonal communications, financial planning, and
26 human behavior.

27 Subp. 5. Recent occupational experience. An applicant for
28 a license to teach in Project Discover must have 1,000 hours of
29 the occupational experience within the five years before
30 applying for the license.

31 Subp. 6. Conversion of current Project Discover
32 instructors. Applicants verifying teaching a complete session
33 of Project Discover to include personal development, career
34 development, and applied issues within four years before the
35 effective date of this part and verification of 12 hours of
36 state sponsored workshops in teaching Project Discover within
