1.4 **2500.1900 LICENSE REINSTATEMENT.**

1.5 A license ~~which is~~ terminated by reason of the licensee's failure to comply with the
1.6 continuing education requirements of parts 2500.1200 to 2500.2000, or failure to submit a
1.7 completed application for license renewal as prescribed by the board, may, ~~at the election~~
1.8 ~~of the licensee or former licensee,~~ be reinstated or restored to full status by ~~either of the~~
1.9 following one of the applicable procedures: in items A to E.

1.10 ~~A. submission to the board of proof of the makeup of all continuing education~~
1.11 ~~requirements which would have been necessary for continuous licensure from the date of~~
1.12 ~~the person's last license renewal or initial licensure, whichever is more recent, and proof~~
1.13 ~~of attendance at an additional ten units of board recognized and approved continuing~~
1.14 ~~education courses for each intervening renewal year; or~~

1.15 ~~B. reexamination approved by the board.~~

1.16 ~~A license which is terminated by reason of the licensee's failure to submit fees or~~
1.17 ~~comply with continuing education reporting requirements may be reinstated subject to~~
1.18 ~~the procedures in this part, provided that the appropriate renewal fees and all accrued~~
1.19 ~~penalty fees are also paid.~~

1.20 A. An applicant whose license has been terminated for a period of less than five
1.21 years, and who can verify continual practice elsewhere during that time, may be reinstated
1.22 by completing all interim continuing education and paying all interim licensure fees
1.23 that would have been required for continual licensure, paying any accrued penalty fees
1.24 established in part 2500.1100, subpart 3, and repairing any other deficiencies that led
1.25 to the termination.

2.1 B. An applicant whose license has been terminated for a period of greater than
2.2 five years and who can verify continual practice elsewhere during that time must, in
2.3 addition to item A, complete the board's jurisprudence examination.

2.4 C. An applicant whose license has been terminated for a period of less than five
2.5 years, and who cannot verify continual practice during that time, may be reinstated by
2.6 completing all interim continuing education that would have been required for continual
2.7 licensure, completing an additional ten units of approved continuing education for each
2.8 intervening renewal year, paying all accrued penalty fees and interim licensure fees
2.9 required for continual licensure, and repairing any other deficiencies that led to the
2.10 termination.

2.11 D. An applicant whose license has been terminated for a period of greater than
2.12 five years, and who cannot verify continual practice during that time, may be reinstated by
2.13 paying all accrued penalty fees and interim licensure fees that would have been required
2.14 for continual licensure, repairing any other deficiencies that led to the termination, taking
2.15 the board's jurisprudence examination, and completing the Special Purposes Examination
2.16 in Chiropractic administered by the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners, or other
2.17 examination approved by the board.

2.18 E. At the election of the applicant, the board shall waive any of the continuing
2.19 education requirements in items A to C upon successful completion of the Special
2.20 Purposes Examination in Chiropractic administered by the National Board of Chiropractic
2.21 Examiners, or any other examination approved by the board, within 12 months preceding
2.22 the application.

2.23 Any units acquired in another jurisdiction for the purposes of license renewal may be
2.24 applied to item A, B, or C. None of the continuing education units obtained for the purpose
2.25 of reinstating a terminated license apply to the current annual requirement. Applicants
2.26 must complete a board-approved application for reinstatement.

3.1 **2500.2040 REINSTATEMENT OF INACTIVE LICENSE.**

3.2 An inactive license may be reinstated to a ~~nonrestricted~~ an active license according to
3.3 items A to E:

3.5 **2500.2110 REINSTATEMENT OF VOLUNTARILY RETIRED LICENSE.**

3.6 A. ~~A licensee~~ An applicant who has voluntarily retired a license for a period
3.7 equal to or less than five years may be reinstated to a ~~nonrestricted license after:~~ or
3.8 restored to full status by:

3.9 ~~A.~~

3.10 (1) completion of ~~completing~~ a board-approved application of reinstatement;

3.11 ~~B.~~

3.12 (2) payment of ~~paying~~ a reinstatement fee in the amount of \$100;

3.13 (3) submitting a certification of good standing from each state the doctor
3.14 was granted a license; and

3.15 (4) following one of the applicable procedures in items B to G.

3.16 ~~C. payment of license fees for each year the license was voluntarily retired; and~~

3.17 ~~D. completion of 30 units of board-approved continuing education for each~~
3.18 ~~year the license was voluntarily retired.~~

3.19 ~~None of the continuing education units obtained for the purpose of reinstating a~~
3.20 ~~voluntarily retired license apply to the current annual requirement.~~

3.21 ~~A license which has been voluntarily retired for more than five years by a chiropractor~~
3.22 ~~who has also not been in active practice in another state or country during the period of~~
3.23 ~~voluntary retirement in Minnesota may only be reinstated following successful completion~~
3.24 ~~of the written and practical licensing examinations as approved by the board.~~

4.1 B. An applicant who has been voluntarily retired for a period of less than five
4.2 years, and who can verify continual practice elsewhere during that time, may be reinstated
4.3 by completing all interim continuing education and paying all accrued penalty fees and
4.4 interim licensure fees which would have been required for continual licensure, and
4.5 repairing any deficiencies that occurred prior to retirement.

4.6 C. An applicant who has been voluntarily retired for a period of greater than
4.7 five years who can verify continual practice elsewhere during that time must, in addition
4.8 to following the procedures in items A and B, complete the board's jurisprudence
4.9 examination.

4.10 D. An applicant who has been voluntarily retired for a period of less than five
4.11 years, and who cannot verify continual practice during that time, may be reinstated by
4.12 completing all interim continuing education that would have been required for continual
4.13 licensure, completing an additional ten units of approved continuing education for each
4.14 intervening renewal year, paying all accrued penalty fees and interim licensure fees that
4.15 would have been required for continual licensure, and repairing any deficiencies that
4.16 occurred prior to retirement.

4.17 E. An applicant who has been voluntarily retired for a period of greater than five
4.18 years, and who cannot verify continual practice during that time, may be reinstated by
4.19 paying all accrued penalty fees and interim licensure fees that would have been required
4.20 for continual licensure, repairing any other deficiencies that may have occurred prior to
4.21 retirement, taking the board's jurisprudence examination, and completing the Special
4.22 Purposes Examination in Chiropractic administered by the National Board of Chiropractic
4.23 Examiners, or any other examination the board may deem appropriate.

4.24 F. At the election of the applicant, the board shall waive any of the continuing
4.25 education requirements in items B to E, upon successful completion of the Special
4.26 Purposes Examination in Chiropractic administered by the National Board of Chiropractic

5.1 Examiners, or other examination the board may deem appropriate, within the 12 months
5.2 preceding the application.

5.3 Any hours acquired in another jurisdiction, for the purposes of license renewal, may
5.4 be applied to items B and D. None of the continuing education units obtained for the
5.5 purpose of reinstating a voluntarily retired license apply to the current annual requirement.
5.6 Applicants must complete a board-approved application of reinstatement.

5.7 **2500.2130 EMERITUS CHANGE TO ACTIVE STATUS.**
