1.3 **6212.1400 GENERAL RESTRICTIONS FOR POSSESSION PERMITS.**

1.4 Subpart 1. **Permit requirements.** Permits for the taking, transportation, disposal, or 1.5 possession of protected wild animals, whether dead or alive, or their parts, nests, or eggs 1.6 will be issued as provided by parts 6212.1400 to 6212.1700 this part. Applications for 1.7 permits from individuals or institutions must be made in writing and must be submitted 1.8 as specified. The commissioner will determine whether the applicant meets the criteria 1.9 for issuance of the permit.

1.10 Subp. 2. Issuance of permits.

<u>A.</u> Permits may be issued only upon written application made by individuals or
 institutions currently conducting propagation, research, scientific programs, or educational
 programs in the fields of biology or natural history, and that.

B. Permits may be issued upon written application made by media outlets to
enable them to conduct educational programs and to promote outdoor recreation and
programs in the fields of biology or natural history.

1.17 <u>C. Individuals, media outlets, or institutions must</u> have appropriate and adequate
1.18 facilities for the care, exhibition, or storage of the specimens sought to be taken, acquired,
1.19 or possessed.

<u>D.</u> A permit may not be issued unless the commissioner has first determined that
the permitted act will not be detrimental to the species or cause harm to natural resources.
