Except 3.4 for acts beyond their control, an agent must agree to be responsible for lost, stolen, 3.5 missing, or destroyed electronic licenses and materials and point-of-sale equipment 3.6 relating to electronic licenses. An agent, except for those agents who are appointed as a 3.7 deputy registrar of motor vehicles by the commissioner of public safety under Minnesota 3.8 Statutes, section 168.33, must provide a deposit not to exceed \$500 per set of equipment. 3.9 The deposit shall be held in a clearing account. The deposit shall be refunded at the 3.10 time an agent terminates the agent's contract if all point-of-sale equipment and related 3.11 materials are returned to the commissioner in good working condition and if the agent 3.12 has no outstanding debt owed to the Department of Natural Resources.
