# How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking Action in the State Register

State agencies must publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. If an agency seeks outside opinion before promulgating new rules or rule amendments, it must publish a NOTICE OF INTENT TO SOLICIT OUTSIDE OPINION also.

#### The PROPOSED RULES section contains:

- Proposed new rules (including notice of hearing and/or notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing).
- Proposed amendments to rules already in existence in the Minnesota Rules.
- Proposed emergency rules.
- Withdrawal of proposed rules (option; not required).

# The ADOPTED RULES section contains:

- Notice of adoption of new rules and rule amendments adopted without change from the previously published proposed rules. (Unchanged adopted rules are not republished in full in the *State Register* unless requested by an agency.)
- · Adopted amendments to new rules or rule amendments (adopted changes from the previously published proposed rules).
- · Notice of adoption of emergency rules.
- · Adopted amendments to emergency rules (changes made since the proposed version was published).
- Extensions of emergency rules beyond their original effective date.

#### The OFFICIAL NOTICES section includes (but is not limited to):

- Notice of intent to solicit outside opinion before promulgating rules.
- Additional hearings on proposed rules not listed in original proposed rules calendar.

ALL ADOPTED RULES and ADOPTED AMENDMENTS TO EXISTING RULES published in the *State Register* and filed with the Secretary of State before April 8, 1985 are published in the *Minnesota Rules 1985*. ADOPTED RULES and ADOPTED AMENDMENTS TO EXISTING RULES filed after April 8, 1985 are included in a supplement published in Spring, 1986. # PROPOSED RULES

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. of 1982, §§ 14.22, an agency may propose to adopt, amend, suspend or repeal rules without first holding a public hearing, as long as the agency determines that the rules will be noncontroversial in nature. The agency must first publish a notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing, together with the proposed rules, in the *State Register*. The notice must advise the public:

- 1. that they have 30 days in which to submit comment on the proposed rules;
- 2. that no public hearing will be held unless 25 or more persons make a written request for a hearing within the 30-day comment period;
- 3. of the manner in which persons shall request a hearing on the proposed rules; and
- 4. that the rule may be modified if the modifications are supported by the data and views submitted.

If, during the 30-day comment period, 25 or more persons submit to the agency a written request for a hearing of the proposed rules, the agency must proceed under the provisions of §§ 14:14-14.20, which state that if an agency decides to hold a public hearing, it must publish a notice of intent in the State Register.

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§ 14.29 and 14.30, agencies may propose emergency rules under certain circumstances. Proposed emergency rules are published in the *State Register* and, for at least 25 days thereafter, interested persons may submit data and views in writing to the proposing agency.

# **Proposed Permanent Rules Relating to Interstate Banking**

# Notice of Intent to Adopt Rules without a Public Hearing

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Commerce proposes to adopt the above-entitled rules without a public hearing. The Commissioner of Commerce has determined that the proposed adoption of these rules will be noncontroversial in nature and has elected to follow the procedures set forth in the Minnesota Administrative Procedures Act, Sections 14.22 to 14.28.

Persons interested in these rules shall have 30 days to submit comments in support of or in opposition to the rules. Each comment should identify the portion of the proposed rule addressed, the reason for the comment, and any change proposed. The proposed

rules may be modified if the modifications are supported by the data and views submitted to the Department and does not result in a substantial change.

No public hearing will be held unless twenty-five (25) or more persons make a written request for a hearing within the 30 day comment period. In the event a public hearing is required the agency will proceed according to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 14.14, subd. 1. If a sufficient number of those who request a hearing withdraw their requests for hearing in writing the hearing will not be held.

Persons who wish to submit comments or a written request for a public hearing should submit them to Richard G. Gomsrud, Department Counsel, Department of Commerce, 500 Metro Square Building, St. Paul, MN 55101 telephone (612) 296-5689. Any person requesting a public hearing should state her or his name and address and is encouraged to identify the portion of the proposed rule addressed, the reason for the request and any change proposed and send this information to the above address.

Authority for the adoption of these rules is contained in Minnesota Statutes, Sections 45.023, 48.93 & 48.99. Additionally a Statement of Need and Reasonableness of each provision and identifying the data and information relied upon to support the proposed rules has been prepared and is available upon request from the Department. Persons wishing copies should contact Richard G. Gomsrud at the address noted above.

Pursuant to Minnesota Laws 1983, chapter 188 codified as Minnesota Statutes Section 14.115, subdivision 2, the impact on small business has been considered in the promulgation of the rules. Anyone wishing to present evidence or argument as to the rules' effect on small business may do so. The Department's position regarding the impact of the rules on small business is set forth in the Statement of Need and Reasonableness.

Upon adoption of the final rules without a public hearing, the proposed rules, this Notice, the Statement of Need and Reasonableness, all written comments received, the final Rules as Adopted and all required supporting documents will be delivered to the Attorney General for review as to form and legality, including the issue of substantial change. Persons who wish to be advised of the submission of this material to the Attorney General, or who wish to receive a copy of the final rules as proposed for adoption, should submit a written statement of such request to Richard G. Gomsrud, Department Counsel, Department of Commerce, 500 Metro Square Building, St. Paul, MN 55101.

# Rules as Proposed (all new material)

# 2655.0100 APPLICABILITY AND SCOPE.

Parts 2655.0100 to 2655.0600 govern applications by a bank holding company, with its principal place of business located in another state, to acquire a Minnesota bank under Minnesota Statutes, sections 48.93 and 48.99.

# **2655.0200 DEFINITIONS.**

- Subpart 1. Scope. As used in parts 2655.0100 to 2655.0600, the following terms have the meanings given them.
- Subp. 2. Acquiree. "Acquiree" means the Minnesota bank or bank holding company being acquired by the applicant.
- Subp. 3. Affiliate. "Affiliate" means a person who directly or indirectly has beneficial ownership of ten percent or more of any class of voting securities.
- Subp. 4. Alternate energy loans and alternate conservation loans. "Alternate energy loans and alternate conservation loans" means all loans for any purpose under Minnesota Statutes, section 116M.03, subdivision 26.
- Subp. 5. Applicant. "Applicant" means a bank holding company that has filed an application to acquire a Minnesota bank under the Minnesota Reciprocal Interstate Banking Act.

- Subp. 6. Control. "Control" means, with respect to a bank holding company, bank, or bank to be organized under Minnesota Statutes, chapters 46, 47, 48, 300, and parts 2655.0100 to 2655.0600:
- A. the ownership, directly or indirectly, or acting through one or more other persons, control of or the power to vote 25 percent or more of any class of voting securities;
  - B. control in any manner over the election of a majority of the directors; or
  - C. the power to exercise, directly or indirectly, a controlling influence over management and policies.
  - Subp. 7. Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the commissioner of the Department of Commerce.
- Subp. 8. Community. "Community" means the area the bank has designated for purposes of compliance with the Community Reinvestment Act of 1977 (12 USC 2901-2905), as being the area that it serves.
- Subp. 9. Community development corporation. "Community development corporation" is as defined in Minnesota Statutes, section 116M.04.
  - Subp. 10. Developmental loans. "Developmental loans" include the following categories:
    - A. low and moderate income housing;
    - B. operating loans for family farmers;
    - C. loans made in distressed areas;
    - D. minority- and woman-owned businesses;
    - E. alternative energy and energy conservation practices;
    - F. community development corporations;
    - G. Indian reservations and student education loans; and
- H. any other specifically defined class of people, businesses, or projects which meet the standards under Minnesota Statutes, section 645.445, subdivision 5, for socially or economically disadvantaged persons, projects, or businesses.
  - Subp. 11. Developmental investments. "Developmental investments" shall include investments for the following purposes:
    - A. low and moderate income housing;
    - B. operating loans for family farmers;
    - C. loans made in distressed areas;
    - D. minority- and woman-owned businesses;
    - E. alternative energy and energy conservation practices;
    - F. community development corporations;
    - G. Indian reservations and student education loans; and
- H. any other specifically defined class of people, businesses, or projects which meet the standards under Minnesota Statutes, section 645.445, subdivision 5, for socially or economically disadvantaged persons, projects, or businesses.
- Subp. 12. **Distressed area.** "Distressed area" is defined to include any area designated as a distressed area under Code of Federal Regulations, title 24, section 570.452 (1986) by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development.
  - Subp. 13. Equity capital. "Equity capital" means the sum of common stock, preferred stock, surplus, and undivided profits.
- Subp. 14. Family farmers. "Family farmers" means family farms and family farm corporations as defined in Minnesota Statutes, section 500.24.
  - Subp. 15. Investments. "Investments" means funds or capital extended, contributed, or otherwise invested, but not loaned.
- Subp. 16. Low and moderate income housing. "Low and moderate income housing" means housing defined as such by any of the following:
  - A. regulations promulgated by the Farmers Home Administration; and

- B. section 8 of the United States Housing Act of 1937, and the regulations promulgated under the act.
- Subp. 17. Minnesota loan. "Minnesota loan" means loans made to Minnesota residents to be used in Minnesota or loans where the bank has been advised by the borrower that the loan proceeds will be used in Minnesota.
  - Subp. 18. Minnesota residents. "Minnesota residents" are:
    - A. individuals located within a Minnesota zip code;
    - B. private profit or nonprofit corporations, or subsidiaries or divisions thereof, located and doing business within Minnesota;
- C. profit or nonprofit partnerships, trust, or any form of other business enterprise located and doing business within Minnesota; and
  - D. any municipality, agency, or other public authority established and operating under the laws of Minnesota.
- Subp. 19. Minority-owned business and woman-owned business. "Minority-owned business" and "woman-owned business" means any socially or economically disadvantaged person under Minnesota Statutes, section 645.445, subdivision 5. A minority-owned business or woman-owned business must have at least 50 percent of the ownership interest controlled by such disadvantaged class of persons.
- Subp. 20. **Net new funds.** "Net new funds" means a net increase in lending, investment and credit involvement brought to Minnesota on behalf of the acquiree as described in the application filed with the commissioner.
- Subp. 21. Relevant market area. "Relevant market area" includes the standards established by the Federal Reserve Board for evaluation of concentration of financial institution deposits.

#### 2655.0300 APPLICATION.

- Subpart 1. Attachments. Each application shall include, but not be limited to, the following attachments:
- A. A certified copy of the applicant board's resolution authorizing submission of the application and designating the officers authorized to sign it.
- B. A copy of the most recent Report of Bank Holding Company Inspection for the applicant. If the applicant is prohibited from releasing this report, it shall file a copy of a written request to the appropriate federal reserve bank requesting delivery of the report to the commissioner.
- C. A copy of all invitations, tenders, or advertisements making a tender offer to stockholders for purchase of their stock to be used in connection with the proposed acquisition.
  - D. A copy of all acquisition agreements, detailing the terms and conditions of any proposed acquisition.
  - E. An organizational chart of the applicant and its subsidiaries.
  - F. A copy of the most recent consolidated report of condition and statement of earnings of the applicant.
  - G. A pro forma balance sheet of the applicant on a consolidated basis both before and after the acquisition.
- H. The names and addresses of the anticipated board of directors of the Minnesota bank being acquired by the applicant. If a bank holding company located in Minnesota is being acquired, provide the names and addresses of the anticipated board of directors of the bank's subsidiary located in Minnesota of the bank holding company. If the anticipated board is not known, an explanation of how the directors will be determined must be included.
  - I. If a bank holding company located in Minnesota is being acquired, list the names and addresses of all of its subsidiaries.
- J. Any other exhibit that the commissioner deems relevant to a determination of whether the acquisition will result in a satisfactory level of developmental loans or net new funds.
  - Subp. 2. Information. The application shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
    - A. The name and address of the applicant.
    - B. The name and address of the acquiree.
- C. The full name of each shareholder who owns or controls ten percent or more of the stock of the acquiree who is tendering its stock.
- D. The total number of shares presently held by each shareholder who owns or controls ten percent or more of the stock of the acquiree who is tendering its stock.
- E. The total number of shares to be sold or transferred by each shareholder who owns or controls ten percent or more of the stock of the acquiree.

- F. The total number of shares to be held by each shareholder of the acquiree who will hold or control ten percent or more of the stock following completion of the proposed transaction.
  - G. The total number of voting shares authorized by either the acquiree bank or the acquiree bank holding company.
  - H. The total number of outstanding voting shares of the acquiree.
  - I. The number of shares involved in this transaction.
  - J. The total number of shares of the acquiree currently held by the applicant.
  - K. The total consideration for the proposed transaction.
- L. The identity, personal history, business background, and experience of the applicant. If known to the applicant, or any officer or director of the applicant, the identity, personal history, business background and experience of its affiliates, including any material business activities and affiliations during the past five years.
- M. A description of any material pending legal or administrative proceeding in which the applicant is a party, and any criminal indictment or conviction of that person by a state or federal court; and, if known by the applicant or any officer or director of the applicant, similar proceedings involving an affiliate of the applicant must be disclosed.
- N. A statement of the assets and liabilities of the applicant, as of the end of the calendar year for each of the five years immediately preceding the date of the application, together with related statements of income, sources, and application of funds for each of the calendar years then concluded, all prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, consistently applied.
- O. An interim statement of assets and liabilities of the applicant, together with related statements of income, source, and application of funds as of a date not more than 90 days before the date of the filing of the application.
- P. The source and amount of funds or other consideration, except those funds borrowed, to be used in making the acquisition. The applicant should particularly describe any of its assets that are to be liquidated to finance the acquisition.
- Q. If any part of the funds or other consideration are to be borrowed for the purpose of making the acquisition, the applicant must describe the collateral to be pledged and the terms of the transaction, including the name of the lender, interest rates, requirements, guarantors, endorsers, and any other arrangements, agreements, and understandings between and among the parties. The application must include copies of any loan commitments obtained from lenders in connection with the proposed acquisition.
- R. If borrowed funds are to be obtained, the applicant must indicate the sources of funds for debt service. Additionally, the applicant shall detail the extent to which the applicant intends to rely on dividends and fees or other funds from the bank being acquired for debt servicing requirements.
- S. The applicant must identify any person retained or compensated by the applicant, or by any person on the applicant's behalf, to make solicitations or recommendations to stockholders for the purpose of assisting in the acquisition, and a brief description of the terms of any retainer or arrangements for compensation.
- T. The applicant must disclose any plans or proposals regarding any partial or full liquidation of the acquiree, of any plans or proposals to sell the acquiree's assets or merge it, or any other major change in the acquiree's business or corporate structure or management.
  - U. The applicant must describe how the acquisition will bring net new funds, under part 2655.0500, to Minnesota.
- V. The application must also disclose how the acquisition will not result in undue concentration of resources or a substantial lessening of competition in Minnesota. The application shall delineate the relevant market area of the bank or banks to be acquired and located in Minnesota. This delineation is to be described by map or drawing showing the other commercial banks and thrift institutions accompanied by a schedule of correspondent current total deposits of each.
  - W. The applicant shall describe its plan of compliance in providing the developmental loans and investments.
  - X. The applicant must describe developmental loans or developmental investments as set forth in part 2655.0400.
- Y. The commissioner may additionally require other information as may be necessary to determine whether the application should be approved.

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# PROPOSED RULES I

#### 2655.0400 DEVELOPMENTAL LOANS.

- Subpart 1. Mandatory factors. The commissioner shall consider the following factors in determining an acceptable level of developmental loans in the community by an applicant through its acquiree:
  - A. the level of developmental loans, in terms of number and amount, held by the acquiree at the end of:
    - (1) its last calendar quarter immediately before the date of the application; and
    - (2) each of the last two calendar years immediately before the date of application;
- B. the projected level of developmental loans, in terms of number and amount, held at the end of each of the next three calendar years from the date of application;
- C. any developmental investments for the classifications listed under developmental loans held at the time periods described in items A and B;
- D. any developmental loans or developmental investments originated by the acquiree which has or will be participated in or sold to other institutions during the time periods described in items A and B;
  - E. the acquiree's financial condition at the close of the time periods described in items A and B;
  - F. the bank's asset quality at the close of the time periods described in items A and B;
  - G. the economic condition of the community during the time periods described in items A and B;
- H. the asset mix of the bank and the socioeconomic makeup of the community in terms of socially and economically disadvantaged persons;
- I. the extent of loans made by the acquiree in its Community Reinvestment Act territories during the time periods described in items A and B; and
  - J. the volume of developmental loans made in the community during the time periods described in items A and B.
  - Subp. 2. Permissive factors. The commissioner may also consider:
- A. Any peer group average for developmental loans and investments by similar financial institutions concerning geography, financial condition, asset quality, asset mix, and community reinvestment criteria.
- B. Any other material fact or information concerning the appropriate level of developmental loans to be made by the acquiree.

## 2655.0500 NET NEW FUNDS.

- Subpart 1. Lending, investment, and capital involvement. In determining whether additional lending, investment, and capital involvement by the acquiree will occur as a result of the application being approved, the commissioner shall consider the following data at the close of each of its last two calendar years, and the close of its most recent calendar quarter before the filing of the application, together with projections of the same data for the close of its next three calendar years:
  - A. the total deposits of the acquiree;
  - B. the total loans of the acquiree;
  - C. the total equity capital of the acquiree;
  - D. the total Minnesota loans;
  - E. the total loan-to-asset ratio;
  - F. the total loan-to-deposit ratio;
  - G. the total loan-to-equity capital ratio;
  - H. the total Minnesota loan-to-asset ratio;
  - I. the total Minnesota loan-to-deposit ratio;
  - J. the total Minnesota loan-to-equity capital ratio;
  - K. the total Minnesota loan-to-total loan ratio:
  - L. the total loan-to-deposit ratio considering only loans made in the acquiree's community; and
  - M. the total loan-to-deposit ratio considering only loans made outside the acquiree's community.
  - Subp. 2. Acquiree; community economic factors. The commissioner shall also consider:
    - A. the acquiree's financial condition on the dates described in subpart 1;

- B. the acquiree's asset quality on the dates described in subpart 1;
- C. the economic characteristics of the community served by the acquiree including, but not limited to, population trends, area use for residential, commercial, industrial, and agricultural purposes, the level of socially and economically disadvantaged persons, families of low and moderate income and low and moderate income housing, and location therein of enterprise zones and distressed areas:
- D. the extent of loans and investments made by the acquiree in the community served by it on the dates described in subpart 1; and
- E. the initial capital investment of the applicant, and with respect to the acquiree, its loan policy, investment policy, dividend policy, and general plan of business, including the full range of consumer and business services which will be offered.
- Subp. 3. Affiliated banks. In order to determine whether the applicant will actively participate in the community and in Minnesota, the commissioner shall also consider the following data for each bank affiliated with the applicant at the close of its last two calendar years and at the end of its most recent calendar quarter before the filing of the application:
  - A. the total deposits of each bank;
  - B. the total loans of each bank;
  - C. the total equity capital of each bank;
  - D. the total loan-to-deposit ratio considering only loans made in the bank's community; and
  - E. the total loan-to-deposit ratio considering only loans made outside of the bank's community.
  - Subp. 4. Additional factors. The commissioner shall also consider:
- A. any peer group averages of other Minnesota banks for market share, loan-to-deposit ratio, net interest spread, return on average assets, return on average equity, net charge offs, capital, and loans for real estate, consumers, financial institutions, farmers, and commercial property;
- B. any other material fact or information brought to the commissioner's attention concerning the appropriate level of net new funds; and
- C. a business plan as to any lending, investment, bank service, or grant program administered by the applicant, or any affiliate of the applicant, which serves the needs and communities of people defined by the development loan categories of these regulations, accompanied by a statement of how the programs will be applied to the applicant's or applicant affiliate's programs and activities in Minnesota.

## 2655.0600 NOTICE.

- Subpart 1. **Publication.** Within 30 days of the filing of an application, the applicant shall publish a notice of the filing of the application in a newspaper of general circulation within the county in which the bank to be acquired or the proposed bank is located. In addition, the applicant shall mail by certified mail, return receipt requested, notice of the filing of the application to all commercial banks within a three mile radius of the bank to be acquired or located.
- Subp. 2. **Proof of publication.** The applicant shall submit to the commissioner a certified publisher's affidavit, including a tear sheet of the publication, setting forth the fact that the publication has been made.
- Subp. 3. **Proof of mailing.** The applicant shall file with the commissioner the receipts certifying that the notices were sent by first class mail to the commercial banks located within the three mile radius of the bank to be acquired or located.
  - Subp. 4. Content of notice. The application shall disclose the following:
    - A. the name and address of the applicant or the applicant's attorney;
    - B. the name and address of the bank to be acquired or chartered;
    - C. the date that the application was filed with the department;
- D. notice that public comment addressed to the name and address of the commissioner will be accepted for a period of not less than 30 days from the date of publication;

- E. that the application to acquire or charter a bank by an interstate bank holding company must establish certain statutory criteria for approval under Minnesota Statutes;
  - F. that the application, before being approved, must demonstrate that the acquisition of the bank:
    - (1) will not result in undue concentration of resources or substantial lessening of competition in the locality; and
    - (2) will bring net new funds into Minnesota;
- G. that the application, subject to any limitations imposed by federal or state statutes, is available to members of the public by contacting the commissioner of the Department of Commerce at 500 Metro Square Building, Saint Paul, Minnesota 55101; and
- H. any other information that the commissioner deems relevant to a proper disclosure surrounding the facts and circumstances of the acquisition.
- Subp. 5. Format. The publication required in this part shall by typeset in a format acceptable for the publication of a bank charter application.

# Notice of Intent to Adopt Rules without a Public Hearing

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Labor and Industry, Labor Standards Division, proposes to adopt the above-captioned amendments to Minn. Rules, parts 5200.0010-5200.0250 and 5200.0970 without a public hearing. The Department has determined that the proposed adoption of these amendments will be noncontroversial in nature and has elected to follow the procedures set forth in Minn. Stat. Section 14.21-14.28 (1984).

Persons or groups interested in these amendments shall have 30 days to submit comments on the proposed amendments. Comments in support of or in opposition to the proposed amendments are encouraged. Each comment should identify the portion of the proposed amendments addressed, the reason for the comment, and any change proposed. The proposed amendments may be modified if the modifications are supported by the data and views submitted to the Department and do not result in a substantial change in the proposed language.

A public hearing will be held if 25 or more persons submit written requests for a public hearing on the proposed amendments within the 30-day comment period. If a public hearing is required, the Department will proceed according to the provisions of Minn. Stat. Section 14.131-14.20 (1984). Any person requesting a public hearing should state his or her name and address, and is encouraged to identify the portion of the proposed amendments addressed, the reason for the request, and any change proposed.

# 5200.0010 PROOF OF MINOR'S AGE.

Subpart 1. **Requirement.** Employers claiming an employee is under 18 must have his or her birthdate substantiated by a birth certificate or an age certificate issued by the Department of Labor and Industry through the local superintendent of schools, or a photocopy of the employee's driver's license, or a Minnesota identification card issued by the Department of Transportation included in the payroll records kept for such the employee. Failure to provide proof of the ages of minors employed makes the employer liable for the adult minimum wage and other penalties imposed for failure to keep and maintain records related to the employment of minors.

Subp. 2. [Unchanged.]

#### HANDICAPPED WORKERS

#### 5200.0030 SUBMINIMUM WAGE RATES FOR HANDICAPPED WORKERS.

<u>Subpart 1.</u> **Permit required.** Subminimum wage rates may be paid to handicapped workers only after receiving a permit from the Labor Standards Division. If no permit is issued, a worker, no matter how severely handicapped, shall be paid the minimum wage. The subminimum rate will be based on the extent to which the worker's performance is limited but in no case may it fall below 50 percent of minimum wage, except as provided under subpart 4. "Performance" is based on a time study of handicapped workers as compared to a time study of nonhandicapped workers on the same job. The time study must be conducted under the same working conditions for the handicapped and the nonhandicapped.

- <u>Subp.</u> 2. Limit on work force at subminimum wage. No profit-making organization may employ handicapped workers at a subminimum wage for more than ten percent of its total work force unless granted a special permit by the commissioner of labor and industry to exceed the ten percent limitation.
- Subp. 3. **Sheltered workshops.** Sheltered workshops are excluded from the above percentage limitations of numbers of employees and percentage of minimum wage contained in subparts 1 and 2, but not from the permit requirement.
- Subp. 4. United States labor permits. Permits issued by the United States Department of Labor under Code of Federal Regulations, title 29, part 524 or 525, authorizing subminimum wage rates shall be accepted by the division in lieu of the permit required in subpart 1. Where the worker would otherwise be employed in a sheltered workshop, the commissioner of labor and industry may grant a special permit authorizing a wage rate of less than 50 percent of the minimum wage.

# 5200.0060 MEAL ALLOWANCE.

A meal allowance is credited toward the minimum wage only when the meal is furnished by the employer and accepted by the employee. The employer shall not require the employee to accept meals as a condition of employment. A meal is defined as an adequate portion of a variety of wholesome, nutritious foods and shall include at least one food from each of the following four groups: fruits or vegetables; cereals, bread, or potatoes; eggs, meat, or fish; milk, tea, or coffee; except that for breakfast, eggs, meat, or fish may be omitted if both cereal or bread are offered. The employer must keep a record of each meal accepted by the employee before any meal credit can be taken.

Meals must be consistent with the employee's work shift. Meal periods of less than 20 minutes may not be deducted from hours worked, nor may meal periods be deducted where the employee is not entirely free from work responsibility.

The meal allowance is \$1.15 60 percent of the adult minimum wage rate for one hour of work per meal.

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# PROPOSED RULES =

## 5200.0070 LODGING ALLOWANCE.

- Subpart 1. Conditions. If practical or economic realities of the employment situation require employees to accept lodging owned or controlled by the employer, or where the employee must accept that lodging as a condition of employment, the employer may credit toward the minimum wage the cost of the lodging only as provided in either subpart 2 or 3.
- Subp. 2. Daily allowance. A lodging allowance of \$1.50 per day may be eredited towards the minimum wage if furnished by the employer and accepted by the employee. Such lodging must be not to exceed 75 percent of the adult minimum wage for one hour of work may be taken per day if the lodging is adequate, decent, and sanitary according to usual and customary standards.
- Subp. 3. Fair market value. However, Lodging, the nature of which is ordinarily and commonly considered to be a tenancy in the chief place of residence of the employee, shall be credited toward the minimum wage of that employee at the rate of the fair market value of the lodging provided. Where more than one employee shares the same residence, the lodging allowance for the total number of employees sharing the residence shall not exceed the fair market value of the residence. The tenancy shall be evidenced by a written or oral lease agreement providing for at least a month-to-month tenancy, and shall include exclusive, self-contained bathroom and kitchen facilities.
- Subp. 4. Seasonal employment. Where employment is available only on a seasonal basis, the maximum lodging credit will be as provided in subpart 2.

# 5200.0080 THP GRATUITIES/TIPS CREDITS.

Subpart 1. [See Repealer.]

Subp. 2. [Unchanged.]

- Subp. 3. Computation of tip credit. Tip credit is based on the actual amount of tips received and reported on signed statements by the employee divided by the number of hours worked in a given pay period and may not exceed the maximum credit set by Minnesota Statutes, section 177.28, subdivision 4. A maximum tip credit may be allowed up to 20 percent of the applicable minimum wage. The employer's records must also indicate that the individual employee received at least \$35 per month in gratuities in order that any tip credit be allowed in that period.
- Subp. 4. **Tip pooling or sharing of gratuities.** Tip Pooling or sharing of gratuities may not be a condition of employment. Tip sharing or pooling shall be on an individual person to person basis. Another An indirect service employee who benefits because the recipient shares the gratuity with him or her shall not have such the remuneration considered in the calculation of his or her wages.
- Subp. 4a. Obligatory charges. For purposes of Minnesota Statutes, section 177.23, subdivision 9, obligatory charges which might reasonably be construed by the guest, customer, or patron as a sum to be given to an employee as payment for personal services rendered, include, but are not limited to, service charges, tips, gratuities, and surcharges.
- Subp. 4b. Clear and conspicuous notice. For purposes of Minnesota Statutes, section 177.23, subdivision 9, clear and conspicuous notice that the obligatory charge is not a gratuity is notice clearly printed, stamped, or written in bold type on the menu, placard, the front of the statement of charges, or other printed material given to the customer. Type which is at least 18 point (one-fourth inch) on the placard, or 9 point (one-eighth inch) or larger on all other notices is clear and conspicuous.
  - Subp. 5. [See Repealer.]
- Subp. 6. Service person Direct service employee. A "direct service person employee" is one who in a given situation performs the main direct service for a customer and is to be considered the recipient of the gratuity for purposes of wage calculation a tipped employee. An indirect service employee includes, but is not limited to, bus people, dishwashers, cooks, hosts, or others who assist a direct service employee.
- Subp. 7. Credit cards or charges. Gratuities presented to a <u>direct</u> service <u>person</u> <u>employee</u> via inclusion on a charge or credit card shall be credited to that pay period <u>in which they are received by the direct service employee and</u> for which they appear on the <u>direct</u> service <u>person's employee's</u> tip statement.

Where a tip is given by a customer through a credit or charge card, the full amount of tip must be allowed the <u>direct</u> service <u>person employee</u> minus only the percentage deducted from the tip in the same ratio as the percentage deducted from the total bill by the service company.

Subp. 8. Banquet Divided gratuities. When more than one direct service employee provides direct service to a customer or customers in a given situation such as banquets, cocktail and food service combinations, or other combinations, money presented by customers, guests, or patrons at a banquet as a gratuity to be and divided among the service people shall be credited to that time period for which it appears on the service person's tip statement direct service employees is not a violation of Minnesota Statutes, section 177.24, subdivision 3.

Subp. 9. [See Repealer.]

#### 5200,0090 DEDUCTIONS.

Subpart 1. When prohibited. Deductions from the minimum wage, whether direct or indirect, may not be made for shortages in money receipts or merchandise, for the purchase or rental of uniforms or nonhome maintenance of uniforms, consumable supplies, travel expenses, for spoilage, for breakage or other damage, for cash shortages or losses resulting from ommissions or other errors, for walkouts, bad checks, bad credit slips, missing guest checks, or robbery, or for fines for disciplinary purposes. These are considered matters separate from wages. The term "uniform" means wearing apparel and accessories required by the employer to be worn by the employee as a condition of employment. "Consumable supplies" means materials required to perform duties of employment that are used up in the course of employment. "Consumable supplies" may include, but are not limited to, materials used by cosmetologists in the care and beautification of the hair and body of customers, building and utility costs, office supplies, parts and materials used in manufacture or repair, and chemicals used in lawn care. "Travel expenses" means receipted out-of-pocket expenses for transportation, meals and lodging, or an agreed upon allowance, whichever is greater.

Subp. 2. Indirect. An indirect deduction is any recoupment or payment received by an employer by methods other than payroll deductions, such as cash payments or endorsing over of checks, or the purchase or rental of any of the items listed in Minnesota Statutes, section 177.24, subdivision 4, by the employee directly from the supplier.

#### 5200.0120 HOURS WORKED.

<u>Subpart 1.</u> General. The <u>minimum wage must be paid for all hours worked.</u> Hours worked include training time, call time, cleaning time, waiting time, or any other time when the employee must be either on the premises of the employer or involved in the performance of duties in connection with his or her employment or <u>must remain on the premises until work is prepared or available</u>. Rest periods of less than 20 minutes may not be deducted from total hours worked.

Subp. 2. On-call time. An employee who is required to remain on the employer's premises or so close to the premises that the employee cannot use the time effectively for the employee's own purposes is working while on call. An employee who is not required to remain on or near the employer's premises, but is merely required to leave word at the employee's home or with company officials where the employee may be reached is not working while on call.

Subp. 3. Off-duty. Periods when the employee is completely relieved of duty and free to leave the premises for a definite period of time, and the period is long enough for the employee to use for the employee's own purposes, are not hours worked.

Subp. 4. Meals. Bona fide meal periods are not hours worked. Bona fide meal periods do not include rest periods such as coffee breaks or time for snacks. The employee must be completely relieved from duty for the purpose of eating regular meals. Thirty minutes or more is ordinarily long enough for a bona fide meal period. A shorter period may be adequate under special conditions. The employee is not completely relieved from duty if required to perform any duties, whether active or inactive, while eating. It is not necessary that an employee be permitted to leave the premises, if the employee is otherwise completely freed from duties during the meal period. If the meal period is frequently interrupted by calls to duty, the employee is not relieved of all duties and the meal periods must be considered as hours worked.

# 5200.0121 SLEEPING TIME AND CERTAIN OTHER ACTIVITIES.

Subpart 1. Less than 24-hour duty. An employee who is required to be on duty for less than 24 hours is working even though the employee is permitted to sleep or engage in other personal activities when not busy except as provided in Minnesota Statutes, section 177.23, subdivision 11.

Subp. 2. Duty of 24 hours or more. If an employee is required to be on duty for 24 hours or more, the employer and the employee may agree to exclude bona fide meal periods and a bona fide regularly scheduled sleeping period of not more than eight hours from hours worked, provided adequate sleeping facilities are furnished by the employer and the employee can usually enjoy an uninterrupted sleeping period. If a sleeping period is of more than eight hours, only eight hours may be excluded. Where no expressed or implied agreement to the contrary is present, the lunch periods and up to eight hours of sleeping time constitute hours worked.

If the sleeping period is interrupted by a call to duty, the interruption must be counted as hours worked. If the period is interrupted so that the employee cannot get a minimum of five hours of sleep, the entire period must be counted as hours worked.

Subp. 3. Employees residing on employer's premises or working at home. An employee who resides on the employer's premises on a permanent basis or for extended periods of time is not considered as working all the time the employee is on the

premises. Ordinarily, an employee may enjoy periods of complete freedom from all duties, during which the employee may engage in normal private pursuits. These free periods are not considered hours worked.

## 5200.0211 SALARY.

Subpart 1. Guaranteed weekly wage. A salary is not an hourly rate. An employee is paid a salary if the employee, through agreement with an employer, is guaranteed a predetermined wage for each workweek. An employee may still be salaried even if complete days absent are deducted from salary for reasons other than no work available. Should those deductions reduce the salary for the workweek below the minimum salary required by Minnesota Statutes, section 177.23, subdivision 7, clause (2), or parts 5200.0190 to 5200.0210, the employer will lose the exemption in that workweek.

Subp. 2. Weeks of no work. Complete weeks in which an employee performs no work may be deducted from salary.

# 5200.0221 INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR.

An independent contractor is not an employee. Parts 5222.0330 and 5222.0340 shall be used to determine whether an employment relation exists, except that control of the method and manner of performance is not the most important factor. All factors must be weighed to determine whether the worker is economically dependent upon the business to which the worker provides services.

# **5200.0241 STAFF MEMBER.**

For purposes of Minnesota Statutes, section 177.23, subdivision 7, clause (5), "staff member" means any employee who spends more than half of the employee's working hours in direct personal assistance and guidance to campers. "Staff member" does not include a regular organizational noncamp employee who may be assigned temporarily to camp and does not include camp personnel hired primarily for the purpose of maintenance or kitchen chores.

# 5200.0242 SEASONAL BASIS DEFINED.

For purposes of Minnesota Statutes, section 177.23, subdivision 7, and part 5200.0070, "seasonal" means no more than 30 weeks in any calendar year. Any part of a calendar week shall be counted as a week.

# 5200.0251 PAYMENT OF BACK WAGES AND/OR GRATUITIES TO MISSING EMPLOYEES.

Sums due to employees who cannot be located shall be reported as unclaimed property under Minnesota statutes.

#### **5200.0260 AGRICULTURE.**

For purposes of Minnesota Statutes, section 177.23, subdivision 7, "agriculture" means farming in all its branches and includes, but is not limited to, dairying, the field production, cultivation, growing, and harvesting of any agricultural or horticulture commodity, and the raising of livestock, bees, fur-bearing animals, and poultry. Agriculture includes repair, maintenance, and construction work incidental to such operation and the cleaning, processing, preservation, loading, and transporting to market or storage of the farmer's own agricultural products. Industrial operations and processes that are more akin to manufacturing than to agriculture are not included. It does not include greenhouse work. It does not extend to outside services hired by the farmer. It does not include services performed for others, including, but not limited to, boarding or training of animals, lawn care, or landscaping.

# 5200.0261 SPECIFIED DEFINED.

For purposes of Minnesota Statutes, section 177.23, subdivision 7, clause (1), the term "specified" shall be applied on a workweek-to-workweek basis and means all employees paid a salary where the employer has two or fewer employees paid a salary. Where employees paid a salary exceed two in any given workweek, the employer must designate in the payroll records which two are exempt and notify the employees concerned. The burden of proof will be on the employer should an employee claim non-notification.

# 5200.0262 FARMING UNIT OR OPERATION.

For purposes of Minnesota Statutes, section 177.23, subdivision 7, clause (1), a "farming unit" is a legal entity engaged in agricultural activities as defined by part 5200.0260. A farming operation is one or more commonly-owned farming units in which employees and/or equipment is shared. No more than two workers may be exempt under Minnesota Statutes, section 177.23, subdivision 7, clause (1), regardless of the number or location of the farming units that make up the farming operation.

#### **5200.0270 FAIR DEFINED.**

For purposes of Minnesota Statutes, section 177.23, subdivision 7, a fair is an enterprise with or without payment of an admission fee that derives revenues principally from the sale of admission to events such as rides, sideshows, or exhibits. "Fair" includes amusement parks, carnivals, and circuses but does not include trade shows.

REPEALER. Minnesota Rules, parts 5200.0080, subparts 1, 5, and 9; 5200.0250; and 5200.0970, are repealed.

## **Rules as Proposed**

## **6500.0100 DEFINITIONS.**

Subpart 1. Scope. The following terms and expressions when used in these rules shall this chapter have the meanings hereinafter stated given them in this part.

Subp. 2. Act. "Act" means the Minnesota Optometric Practice Act, Minnesota Statutes, sections 148.52 et seq to 148.62.

Subp. 3. Board. "Board" means the Minnesota Board of Optometry.

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# PROPOSED RULES —

- Subp. 4. Clinical rounds. "Clinical rounds" means a group of people sponsored by a clinic or a hospital assembled for discussion of information.
- <u>Subp. 5.</u> Contact hour equivalents. "Contact hour equivalents" means the number of hours of home study equivalent to one hour of continuing education credit.
- <u>Subp. 6.</u> Home study. "Home study" means the utilization of educational programs and materials outside the classroom setting. 6500.0150 CONTINUING EDUCATION.
- Subpart 1. Home study and contact hours. Licensees may acquire nine hours of continuing education credits through home study in each three-year compliance period. Licensees may earn continuing education credits through contact hour equivalents.

  One contact hour is equivalent to one continuing education credit. Contact hour equivalents include:
- A. Licensees may utilize self-instruction components presented in vision care periodicals, audio, and audio-visual taped programs, and other program materials specifically designed for self-instruction. All programs must include a self-test. One contact hour may be earned for each hour of self-instruction activity. Contact hours may include both the instructional and testing activity.
- B. The presentation of a lecture before an audience of optometric or other health professionals will result in one contact hour for each hour of presentation. For one time only, the lecturer can also acquire two contact hours for preparation of the lecture for each hour of presentation. A syllabus or lecture manuscript shall be furnished to the board to document the presented program.
- C. Licensees may earn continuing education credits for the preparation of articles accepted for publication in optometric journals or other health-related journals and for the preparation of books accepted for publication. A maximum of three hours of continuing education credits will be granted for acceptance and publication of articles in optometric or health-related journals. A maximum of nine hours of continuing education credits will be granted for acceptance and publication of books on optometry-related subjects.
  - D. Each hour spent in clinical rounds will be granted one contact hour equivalent.
- Subp. 2. Approval of other home study programs. Upon written request, the board may approve the use of home study methods not listed in subpart 1, and may determine the number of earned contact hours. Board approval will be determined on the following criteria:
- A. Whether or not the program is likely to contribute to the advancement and extension of professional skill and knowledge in the practice of optometry.
- B. Whether the sponsor or author of the program is recognized by the board as being qualified to design a program of home study in the field of optometry.
- C. As a condition of approval of a program of self-instruction, the board may require that the author, sponsor, or licensee furnish the board with copies of instructional materials and testing tools.

## 6500.2700 OPTOMETRIST EMERITUS REGISTRATION.

- Subpart 1. Application. Any optometrist duly licensed to practice optometry in Minnesota pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, sections 148.52 to 148.62 who declares that he or she is retired from active practice of optometry may apply to the board for emeritus registration on the annual license renewal form. To qualify, the optometrist must be retired and must not be subject to any disciplinary action or be subject to an order of the board imposing a suspended, conditional, or restricted license to practice optometry.
- <u>Subp. 2.</u> Status of registrant. The emeritus registration is not a license which permits the registrant to practice optometry as defined in Minnesota Statutes, sections 148.52 to 148.62, and the rules of the board.
- <u>Subp. 3.</u> Continuing education. The <u>continuing education requirements of part 6500.0900 are not applicable to emeritus registration.</u>
  - Subp. 4. Change to active status. The emeritus optometrist must:
    - A. apply to the board for reinstatement of his or her active license; and
- B. comply with the continuing education requirements for the time period in which the license was in emeritus status. This requirement must be fulfilled prior to petitioning the board for reinstatement of license.
- Subp. 5. Renewal cycle or fees. Being registered as an emeritus optometrist will not subject the person to the annual license renewal cycle or renewal fee.

# 7503.0800 REVOCATION PERIODS.

Subpart 1. and 2. [Unchanged.]

Subp. 3. Driving after revocation. The commissioner shall revoke the driver's license or driving privilege of increase the revocation period imposed for any person convicted under Minnesota Statutes, section 169.121 or 169.129 for a period of, or convicted under a statute from another state in conformity with either of these provisions, if the driver's license or driving privilege of the person was suspended, revoked, or canceled at the time of the driving incident for which the person was subsequently convicted. The length of the additional revocation period is 30 days, 90 days, or one year, depending on the number of convictions for violations of Minnesota Statutes, section 169,129 or 171,24 on the person's driving record during the one-year period preceding the date of the incident times the person has been convicted of a moving traffic offense while the person's driver's license was canceled, revoked, suspended, or otherwise withdrawn at the time of the offense. For the purposes of this subpart, a moving traffic offense is a conviction under a law regulating the use of motor vehicles in which the operation of a motor vehicle is an element of the offense charged. Only convictions that occur during a three-year period that includes the date of the incident for which the driver is convicted under Minnesota Statutes, section 169.121 or 169.129, or convicted under a statute from another state in conformity with either of these provisions, are counted in determining the length of the revocation period. The additional revocation shall be period is 30 days if there are no other convictions for driving after withdrawal during the preceding year a three-year period. The additional revocation period shall be is 90 days if there is one other conviction for driving after withdrawal during the preceding year a three-year period. The additional revocation period shall be is one year if there are two or more other convictions for driving after withdrawal in the preceding year. A revocation ordered for a conviction under Minnesota Statutes, section 169.129 shall not run concurrently with any other revocation imposed as a consequence of the same incident upon which the revocation for conviction under Minnesota Statutes, section 169.129 is based during a three-year period.

Subp. 4. to 7. [Unchanged.]

# Sec. 40. [62I.21] [ACTIVATION OF MARKET ASSISTANCE PLAN AND JOINT UNDERWRITING ASSOCIATION.]

At any time the commissioner of commerce deems it necessary to provide assistance with respect to the placement of general liability insurance coverage on Minnesota risks for a class of business, the commissioner shall by notice in the *State Register* activate the market assistance plan and the joint underwriting association. The plan and association are activated for a period of 180 days from publication of the notice. The chief administrative law judge shall, within three business days of receipt of the copy of the petition, set a hearing date, assign an administrative law judge to hear the matter, and notify the commissioner of the hearing date and administrative law judge assigned to hear the matter. The hearing date must be no less than 60 days nor more than 90 days from the date of receipt of the petition by the chief administrative law judge.

- **Subd. 2.** [HEARING.] The commissioner of commerce shall publish notice of the hearing in the *State Register* at least 30 days before the hearing date. The notice should be that used for rulemaking under chapter 14. Approval by the administrative law judge of the notice prior to publication is not required.

Each application and bid, together with a certified check, cashier's check, or bank money order, payable to the State Treasurer in the sum of \$50.00, must be submitted in a bid envelope obtained from the Commissioner.

At the time specified, the Commissioner, together with the State Executive Council, will publicly open the bids and announce the amount of each bid separately. Leases will be awarded by the Commissioner, with the approval of the State Executive Council, to the highest bidder for the respective mining units, but no bids will be accepted that do not equal or exceed the base royalty

rates set forth in the rules or that do not comply with all provisions of the rules. The right is reserved to the State, through the Executive Council, to reject any or all bids.

The purpose of Minnesota's copper, nickel, and associated minerals rules is to promote and regulate the prospecting for, mining and removal of copper, nickel, and associated minerals on state-owned and state-administered lands. These rules, and the leases issued under the rules, authorize exploration and development of these minerals and impose cerain requirements on the lessee. The requirements include: the payment of minimum rentals which increase with the passage of time, the payment of royalty for all ore mined and removed, the submission of data and other reports, and the addressing of certain environmental considerations. In addition, the state lessee must comply with all applicable regulatory laws.

In the absence of satisfactorily demonstrated past technical and financial competence to perform under similar circumstances, a bidder may be required to provide evidence of technical and financial competence to perform under the state's lease to prospect for, mine and remove copper, nickel, and associated minerals. The information requested by the Commissioner must be submitted within 30 days of the date of the request. The State, through the Executive Council, may refuse to award a lease to any bidder not suppyling satisfactory evidence of technical and financial competence to perform under the state lease.

Upon the award of a lease, the check submitted with the bid will be deposited with the State Treasurer as a fee for the lease. All bids not accepted will become void, and the checks accompanying such bids will be returned to the respective bidders.



### Proposed Modifications to Section G. Convictions for Attempts or Conspiracies: . . .

The Commission proposes to increase durations for Attempted Murder in the First Degree to establish proportionality between Attempted Murder 1st Degree durations and the recently adopted modifications for Severity Level X durations that will go into effect August 1, 1987 barring any legislative action to the contrary.

### NON-STATE PUBLIC CONTRACTS

The State Register also serves as a central marketplace for contracts let out on bid by the public sector. The Register meets state and federal guidelines for statewide circulation of public notices. Any tax-supported institution or government jurisdiction may advertise contracts and requests for proposals from the private sector.

It is recommended that contracts and RFPs include the following: 1) name of contact person; 2) institution name, address, and telephone number; 3) brief description of project and tasks; 4) cost estimate; and 5) final submission date of completed contract proposal. Allow at least three weeks from publication date (four weeks from date article is submitted for publication). Surveys show that subscribers are interested in hearing about contracts for estimates as low as \$1,000. Contact the editor for further details.

### Decisions Filed Friday 24 October, 1986

C5-85-1342 Jeffrey Arndt, et al., petitioners, Appellants, v. American Family Insurance Company, Ronald Kieffer. Court of Appeals.

Court of Appeals properly declined to address issue where respondent insurer failed to file a notice of review.

Exclusion in insurance policy applies to bar recovery against insurer.

Affirmed in part; reversed in part; and judgment of trial court reinstated. Amdahl, C.J.

Dissenting, Yetka, J.

C5-85-1356 In the Matter of the Termination of Employment of Philip W. Schrader on October 5, 1983, as Director of Information at Southern Minnesota Municipal Power Agency, hereinafter referred to as S.M.M.P.A. Southern Minnesota Municipal Power Agency v. Philip W. Schrader, Appellant. Court of Appeals.

In all hearings held pursuant to the Veterans Preference Act, Minn. Stat. § 197.46 (1984), the hearing board has the authority to modify the disciplinary sanction if it finds extenuating circumstances.

In this case, the extenuating circumstances listed by the hearing board to support its modification of the disciplinary sanction are not supported by substantial evidence.

### SUPREME COURT DECISIONS

A public employer who wishes to remove a veteran from his position of employment must notify the veteran, in writing, of its intent, must set forth the charges against the veteran, and must inform the veteran of his rights under the Act. The veteran must serve upon the employer a written request for a hearing within 60 days of the veteran's receipt of the employer's notice. Following the hearing, both the veteran and the employer can seek review, in the district court, of the decision of the hearing board. In reviewing a decision of a veterans preference hearing board, the question for the reviewing court is whether the hearing board abused its discretion.

When conducting a hearing pursuant to the Veterans Preference Act, the job of the hearing board is twofold: (1) to determine whether the employer acted reasonably; (2) to determine whether extenuating circumstances exist justifying a modification of the disciplinary sanction.

Affirmed in part, reversed in part. Amdahl, C.J.

### C2-86-370 State of Minnesota v. Jeff Litzinger, petitioner, Appellant. Court of Appeals.

Record does not justify upward durational departures from presumptive concurrent sentences obtained using so-called *Hernandez* method of computing defendant's criminal history score.

Affirmed as modified. Amdahl, C.J.

C2-85-2013 Simin Y. Hickman and Chris A. Hickman, individually and as parents and natural guardians of Jessica Hickman v. Group Health Plan, Inc., et al., Appellants, State of Minnesota. Hennepin County.
