

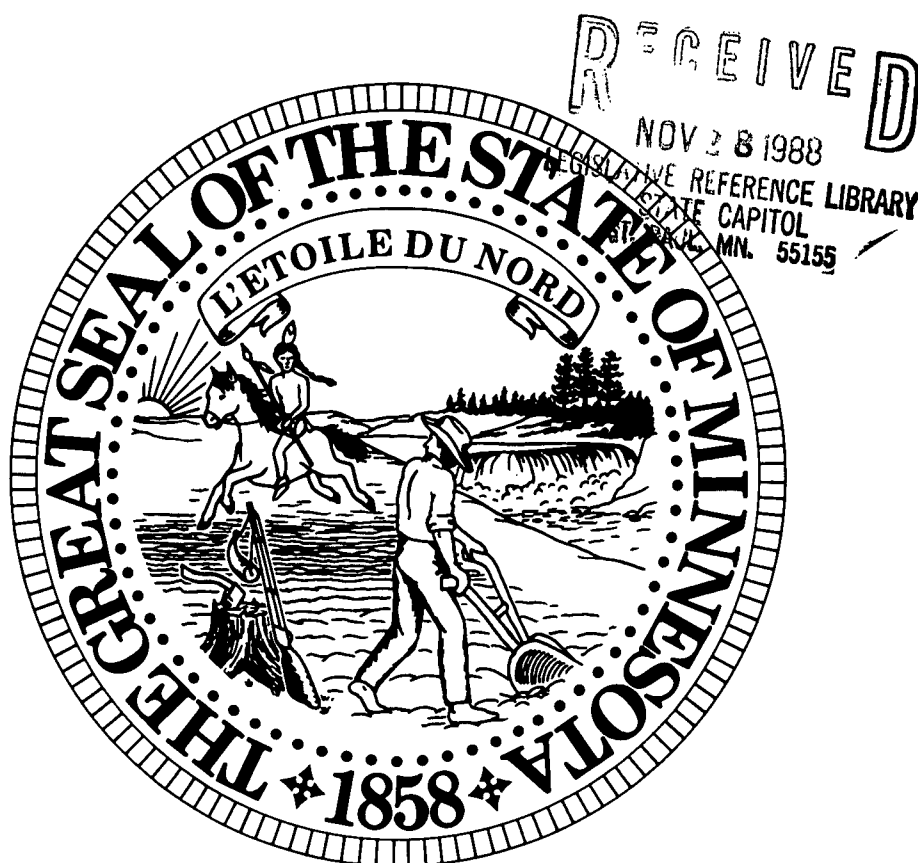

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NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 75 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific *Minnesota Rule* chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the *Minnesota Rules* are published. This is a ten-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Proposed and adopted emergency rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

If an agency seeks outside opinion before issuing new rules or rule amendments, it must publish a NOTICE OF INTENT TO SOLICIT OUTSIDE OPINION in the *Official Notices* section of the *State Register*. When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as **Proposed Rules**. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues 1-13 inclusive; issues 14-25 inclusive; issue 26, cumulative for issues 1-26; issues 27-38 inclusive; issue 39, cumulative for 1-39; issues 40-51 inclusive; and issue 52, cumulative for 1-52. An annual subject matter index for rules appears in August. 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Proposed Rules

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§ 14.22, an agency may propose to adopt, amend, suspend or repeal rules without first holding a public hearing, as long as the agency determines that the rules will be noncontroversial in nature. The agency must first publish a notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing, together with the proposed rules, in the *State Register*. The notice must advise the public:

1. that they have 30 days in which to submit comment on the proposed rules;
2. that no public hearing will be held unless 25 or more persons make a written request for a hearing within the 30-day comment period;
3. of the manner in which persons shall request a hearing on the proposed rules; and
4. that the rule may be modified if the modifications are supported by the data and views submitted.

If, during the 30-day comment period, 25 or more persons submit to the agency a written request for a hearing of the proposed rules, the agency must proceed under the provisions of §§ 14.14-14.20, which state that if an agency decides to hold a public hearing, it must publish a notice of intent in the *State Register*.

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§ 14.29 and 14.30, agencies may propose emergency rules under certain circumstances. Proposed emergency rules are published in the *State Register* and, for at least 25 days thereafter, interested persons may submit data and views in writing to the proposing agency.

Minnesota Housing Finance Agency

Proposed Permanent Rules Relating to Home Improvement Grants and Rehabilitation Loans Program

Notice of Intent to Adopt a Rule Without a Public Hearing

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency ("agency") proposes to adopt the above-entitled rules without a public hearing. The agency has determined that the proposed adoption of these rules will be noncontroversial in nature and has elected to follow the procedures set forth in *Minnesota Statutes* section 14.21 to 14.28.

Persons interested in these rules shall have 30 days to submit comments in support of or in opposition to the proposed rules within the 30-day comment period. Such comments are encouraged, and should identify the portion of the proposed rule addressed, the reason for the comment, and any change proposed. The proposed rule may be modified as the result of comments received if the modifications are supported by the data and views submitted to the agency and do not result in a substantial change in the proposed language. Unless twenty-five or more persons submit written requests for a public hearing on the proposed rule within the 30-day comment period, a public hearing will not be held. In the event a public hearing is required, the agency will proceed according to the provisions of *Minnesota Statutes* section 14.14 et. seq. Any person requesting a public hearing should state his or her name and address, and is encouraged to identify the portion of the proposed rule addressed, the reason for the request, and any change proposed.

Authority for the adoption of these rules is contained in *Minnesota Statutes* section 462A.06, Subdivision 4 and 11. Additionally, a Statement of Need and Reasonableness that describes the need for and reasonableness of each provision of the proposed rules, and that identifies the data and information relied upon to support the proposed rules has been prepared and is available from Kathleen J. Johnson upon request.

Upon adoption of the final rules without a public hearing, the proposed rules, this notice, the Statement of Need and Reasonableness, all written comments received, and the final rules as adopted will be delivered to a designee of the Attorney General for review as to form and legality, including the issue of substantial change, and to determine whether the agency has the authority to adopt the rules and whether the record demonstrates a rational basis for the need for and reasonableness of the proposed rules. Persons who wish to receive notice of the date of submission of these rules to the Attorney General for review, or who wish to receive a free copy of the final rules as adopted, should make such requests to Kathleen J. Johnson.

A copy of the proposed rule is attached to this notice. Additional copies may be obtained by contacting Kathleen J. Johnson.

Please be advised that *Minnesota Statutes* chapter 10A.03 requires each lobbyist to register with the State Ethical Practices Board within five (5) days after he or she commences lobbying. A lobbyist is defined in *Minnesota Statutes* section 10A.01, subdivision 11 as any individual:

Proposed Rules

(a) Engaged for pay or other consideration, or authorized by another individual or association to spend money, who spends more than five hours in any month or more than \$250.00, not including his own travel expenses and membership dues, in any year, for the purpose of attempting to influence legislative or administrative action by communicating or urging others to communicate with public officials; or

(b) Who spends more than \$250.00, not including his own traveling expenses and membership dues, in any year for the purpose of attempting to influence legislative or administrative action by communicating or urging others to communicate with public officials.

Rules as Proposed

4900.0010 DEFINITIONS.

Subpart 1. to 22. [Unchanged.]

Subp. 23. **Persons and families of low and moderate income.** "Persons and families of low and moderate income" means:

A. to C. [Unchanged.]

D. With respect to home improvement grants and rehabilitation loans pursuant to parts 4900.0610 to 4900.0700 to be made by the agency, those persons and families ~~whose adjusted income does not exceed \$7,000 and whose assets, excluding the property to be improved, does do~~ not exceed \$25,000, and

(1) with respect to home improvement grants and rehabilitation loans defined in part 4900.0610 as deferred loans, those persons and families whose adjusted income does not exceed \$7,000; or

(2) with respect to rehabilitation loans defined in part 4900.0610 as revolving loans, those persons and families:

(a) in the counties of Anoka, Carver, Dakota, Hennepin, Ramsey, Scott, and Washington whose adjusted income does not exceed \$15,000; and

(b) in all other counties whose adjusted income does not exceed \$12,000.

E. [Unchanged.]

4900.0610 SCOPE.

Rules in parts 4900.0610 to 4900.0700 govern the home improvement grant program authorized by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 462A.05, subdivision 15 and the rehabilitation loan program authorized by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 462A.05, subdivision 14a. The agency is authorized to make rehabilitation loans with or without interest or periodic payments. In parts 4900.0610 to 4900.0700 loans made with interest and periodic payments shall be referred to as "flexible revolving loans" and loans made without interest or periodic payments shall be referred to as "deferred loans."

~~In addition to the requirements of parts 4900.0610 to 4900.0700, a flexible loan must meet the requirements of parts 4900.0510 and 4900.0520, except that the applicant for a flexible loan need not be a reasonable credit risk as required in part 4900.0510, subpart 3, and the structure to be improved need not be at least 15 years old as required by part 4900.0510, subpart 4.~~

4900.0630 ELIGIBLE RECIPIENTS OF REHABILITATION GRANTS AND LOANS.

Subpart 1. to 3. [Unchanged.]

Subp. 4. **Deferred loan assets.** "Assets" for purposes of deferred loans described in parts 4900.0610 to 4900.0700 ~~shall be~~ is the sum of the following, after deducting any outstanding indebtedness:

A. to E. [Unchanged.]

Proposed Rules

Subp. 5. Revolving loan assets. Assets for the purposes of revolving loans is the sum of the following, after deducting any outstanding indebtedness:

A. cash on hand or in checking or savings accounts;

B. securities or United States Savings Bonds;

C. market value of all interests in real estate, exclusive of the structure to be improved and a parcel of real property of not more than two contiguous platted lots or 160 contiguous acres on which such structure is located;

D. cash value of life insurance policies; and

E. all other property, exclusive of household furnishings, clothing, one automobile, and real estate, equipment, supplies, and inventory used in a business.

Subp. 6. Previous revolving loans. No applicant may receive a revolving loan to improve a property if the combined original principal amounts of revolving loans received by the applicant to improve the property will exceed \$15,000, or if the outstanding balance of revolving loans will exceed the maximum loan amount in part 4900.0640, subpart 2.

Subp. 7. Other assistance. Applicants for receipt of revolving loans cannot be eligible for assistance provided under parts 4900.0510 to 4900.0520 and 4900.0590 to 4900.0605; or for local or federal government housing rehabilitation financing programs which may be available in the area in which the property is located.

4900.0640 AMOUNT OF GRANT OR LOAN.

Subpart 1. [Unchanged.]

Subp. 2. Amount of loan. The amount of the rehabilitation loan shall not exceed the lesser of \$7,500 the amount in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 462A.05, subdivision 14a, the actual cost of the work performed, or that portion of the cost of rehabilitation that the agency determines cannot otherwise be paid by the person or family without spending an unreasonable portion of the income of the person or family thereon.

Subp. 3. [See Repealer.]

4900.0660 ELIGIBLE PROPERTIES.

Grant and loan funds shall be used only to improve properties which meet the following criteria:

A. to C. [Unchanged.]

D. No property shall be eligible for a home improvement grant or deferred loan if it has been improved by such a grant or loan within the five-year period immediately preceding the date on which application for such grant or loan is made, ~~except.~~ No property is eligible for a revolving loan if it has been improved by a revolving loan within the two-year period immediately preceding the date on which application for the loan is made. These limitations do not apply in extraordinary circumstances relating to damage to the property as a result of events beyond the control of the applicant or to failure of plumbing, heating, or electrical systems, or defects in the roof or foundation systems, as determined by the agency in its sole discretion.

E. [Unchanged.]

Occupational Safety and Health Review Board

Proposed Permanent Rules Relating to the Occupational Safety and Health Review Board

Notice of Intent to Adopt a Rule Without a Public Hearing

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Occupational Safety and Health Review Board (hereinafter "Board") intends to adopt a rule of procedure clarifying the contested case process, enhancing effective and efficient resolution of disputes, and increasing the efficiency of the existing rule. The Board intends to adopt the rule without a public hearing following the procedures set forth in *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.22 to 14.28 (1986) of the Administrative Procedure Act. The statutory authority to adopt the rule is *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.06, 182.661, subds. 3 and 3a, and 182.664, subd. 3.

All persons have 30 days in which to submit comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed rule or any part or subpart of the rule. Comment is encouraged. Each comment should identify the portion of the proposed rule addressed, the reason for the comment, and any change proposed.

Proposed Rules

Any person may make a written request for a public hearing on the rule within the 30-day comment period. If 25 or more persons submit a written request for a public hearing within the 30-day comment period, a public hearing will be held unless a sufficient number withdraw their request in writing. Any person requesting a public hearing should state his or her name and address and is encouraged to identify the portion of the proposed rule addressed, the reason for the request, and any change proposed. If a public hearing is required, the Board will proceed pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.131 to 14.20 (1986).

If no hearing is required, upon adoption of the rule, the rule and the required supporting documents will be submitted to the Attorney General for review as to legality and form to the extent the form relates to legality. Rules as Proposed

DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRY OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH REVIEW BOARD

5215.0711 SERVICE AND NOTICE TO UNREPRESENTED EMPLOYEES.

Subpart 1. Notice of contest or petition for abatement date. If there are any affected employees who are not represented by an authorized employee representative, the employer shall, within two working days of receiving the acknowledgment of the notice of contest or petition for modification of abatement date, post, where the citation is required to be posted, a copy of the notice of contest and a notice informing affected employees of their right to party status and of the availability of all pleadings for inspection and copying at reasonable times.

If, because of the nature of the employer's operations, it is not practicable to post the notice of contest and notice to employees at or near the worksite, the notice must be posted in a prominent place where it can be readily observable by all affected employees. For example, if employers are engaged in activities which are physically dispersed, these notices must be posted at the location to which employees report each day. If employees do not primarily work at or report to a single location, these notices must be posted at the location from which the employees operate to carry out their activities. If the employer's operation at the cited worksite ceases and affected employees are no longer employed by that employer, the employer must serve a copy of the notice of contest and notice to employees on all affected employees either by hand delivery or by mail to the last known address.

A notice in the following form complies with this subpart:

Proposed Rules

(Name of employer)

Your employer has been cited by the commissioner of labor and industry for violation of the Minnesota Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1973. The citation has been contested and may be the subject of a hearing. Affected employees are entitled to participate in this hearing as parties in the rules of procedure established by the Occupational Safety and Health Review Board. Notice of intent to participate should be sent to: Executive Secretary, Occupational Safety and Health Review Board, 443 Lafayette Road, Saint Paul, MN 55101, or any other address that the review board has. The notice of intent to participate must contain the employees' names, addresses, representatives, if any, and a statement that they are affected employees of the cited employer.

All papers relevant to this matter may be inspected at:

(Place reasonably convenient to employees, preferably at or near workplace.)

Service and notice to affected employees not represented by an authorized employee representative are deemed accomplished by posting.

Certification of the posting required in this subpart must be filed with the executive secretary of the board within five working days of receipt of the acknowledgment of the notice of contest. If the employer fails to certify the posting in the prescribed manner, the board may issue an order to show cause why the contest should not be dismissed on the grounds that the employer has failed to comply with the posting requirements. If the employer fails to show cause or to certify that the notice of contest has been posted, the administrative law judge may dismiss the notice of contest. In those cases where an employer has a demonstrated history of failing to certify that the notice of contest has been posted timely, the employer must show cause and certify that the notice of contest has been posted to avoid dismissal of the notice of contest.

Subp. 2. Notice of hearing. A copy of the notice of hearing to be held before the administrative law judge must be served by the employer on affected employees who are not represented by an authorized employee representative. The notice of hearing must be posted within two days of receipt at or near the place where the citation is required to be posted.

Certification of the posting required in this subpart must be filed with the administrative law judge and a copy served on the commissioner within five working days of receipt of the notice of hearing. If the employer fails to certify the posting in the prescribed manner, the administrative law judge may on a motion by one of the parties or on the judge's own motion render a default decision.

5215.0721 SERVICE AND NOTICE TO REPRESENTED EMPLOYEES.

Subpart 1. Notice of contest. If there are any affected employees who are represented by an authorized employee representative, the employer shall by first class mail or personal delivery serve upon the representative the notice in part 5215.0711, subpart 1, and a copy of the notice of contest.

Service and notice to employees represented by an authorized employee representative are deemed accomplished by serving the representative by first class mail or personal delivery.

Certification of the service required in this subpart must be filed with the executive secretary of the board within five working days of receipt of the acknowledgment of the notice of contest. If the employer fails to certify the service in the prescribed manner, the board may issue an order to show cause why the contest should not be dismissed on the grounds that the employer has failed to comply with the service requirements. If the employer fails to show cause or to certify that the notice of contest has been served, the administrative law judge may dismiss the notice of contest. In those cases where an employer has a demonstrated history of failing to certify that the notice of contest has been served timely, the employer must show cause and certify that the notice of contest has been served to avoid dismissal of the notice of contest.

Subp. 2. Notice of hearing. A copy of the notice of hearing to be held before the administrative law judge shall be served by the employer on the authorized employee representative of affected employees, if any, by mail or personal delivery, if the employer has not been informed that the authorized employee representative has entered an appearance as of the date the notice is received by the employer.

Certification of the service of the notice of hearing required in this subpart must be filed with the administrative law judge and a copy served on the commissioner of the board within five working days of receipt of the notice of hearing. If the employer fails to certify the service in the prescribed manner, the administrative law judge may on a motion by one of the parties or on the judge's own motion render a default decision.

5215.0730 NOTICE OF CONTEST FILED BY EMPLOYEE OR REPRESENTATIVE.

Subpart 1. to 3. [Unchanged.]

Subp. 4. Failure to serve notice of contest. If the parties referred to under subparts 1 to 3 fail to certify that the notice of contest has been posted or served as required, the board may issue an order to show cause why the contest should not be dismissed on

the grounds that the contesting party has failed to comply with the posting or service requirements. If the party fails to show cause or to certify that the notice of contest has been served, the board may dismiss the notice of contest.

5215.2000 EMPLOYER CONTESTS.

Subpart 1. and 2. [Unchanged.]

Subp. 3. **Answer.** Within 15 days after service of the complaint, the party against whom the complaint was issued shall file an answer with the board.

The answer must contain a short and plain statement denying those allegations in the complaint which the party intends to contest. Any allegation not denied is deemed admitted.

If an answer is not filed with the executive secretary in a timely manner, the notice of contest shall be dismissed.

Subp. 4. **Failure to file.** If the complaint, notice to respondent, or the answer is not filed with the executive secretary in a timely manner, the board or one of the parties may move to dismiss the contest or the complaint. The hearing on any such motion shall be conducted before the administrative law judge.

5215.2560 NOTICE OF READINESS FOR HEARING.

Subpart 1. **Filing and service Notice of readiness for hearing.** Subsequent to the timely filing of an answer, a party that is prepared for hearing may file a notice of readiness for hearing with the board and serve a copy on all parties. Upon receipt of the notice of readiness for hearing, the board shall schedule a hearing.

Subp. 2. **Notice of hearing and order readiness not filed.** Upon receipt of the notice of readiness for hearing, the board shall schedule a hearing. The board shall serve a written notice of hearing and order on all parties at least 30 days prior to the hearing date. The employer shall serve a copy of the notice of hearing and order on affected employees and authorized employee representatives pursuant to parts 5215.0700 to 5215.0750. The notice of hearing and order must state the following: If a notice of readiness for hearing is not filed with the board within 45 days of receipt of the answer, the board may schedule a hearing and shall serve written notice of hearing and order on all parties.

A- that if a party chooses to appear at the hearing, a notice of appearance must be filed by that party with the administrative law judge within 20 days of the date of service of the notice of hearing and order pursuant to part 1400.5700; and

B- that a failure to appear at the hearing may result in the allegations of the pleadings being taken as true.

Subp. 3. **Notice of hearing and order.** The board shall serve a written notice of hearing and order under part 1400.5600 and all further proceedings shall be conducted pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, chapter 14.

The employer shall serve a copy of the notice of hearing and order on affected employees and authorized employee representatives pursuant to parts 5215.0700 to 5215.0730.

5215.5300 SETTLEMENT.

Subpart 1. **Settlement encouraged.** Settlement is encouraged at any stage of the proceedings if the settlement is consistent with the provisions and objectives of the act, but shall not delay the scheduling of a hearing in the matter.

Subp. 2. **Signed and dated Service and notice.** Settlement agreements must be signed and dated by each party. B. Settlement agreements must contain a provision stating the date on which the employer has served the agreement upon affected employees in the manner prescribed by part 5215.0750, subpart 2;

C. an affirmative statement that the contesting party withdraws the notice of contest; and

D. an affirmative statement as to how the settlement agreement affects the status of the contested citation.

Subp. ~~18-~~ 16. **Estimated operating costs.** "Estimated operating costs" means a facility's estimated operating costs during the first two years after completion of the project.

Subp. ~~20-~~ Financing costs. "Financing costs" means the estimated long-term financing costs that, according to part 4655.1078 [Emergency], item H, must be provided with a proposal.

This subpart refers only to those parts of the facility affected by the proposal.

If ownership of a facility has changed in the two years before the submission deadline, a history of complaints shall be collected only for the tenure of the current owner.

The extent to which the physical design of identified in a proposal will improve the quality of life, comfort, and convenience of the residents through improvements such as increased privacy, increased opportunities for social interaction, improved temperature control, or improved efficiency of care.

The rules proposed and published at *State Register*, Volume 13, Number 5, pages 230-232, August 1, 1988 (13 S.R. 230) are adopted with the following modifications:

Rules as Adopted

5510.2410 APPLICATION.

Parts 5510.2410 to 5510.3210 govern the conduct of negotiations between an exclusive representative and an employer, the conduct of mediation, the certification of unresolved ~~issues~~ items to the board, the arbitration of unresolved ~~issues~~ items, and the notification of intent to strike.

5510.2905 CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION.

Subp. 2. **Final positions.** Final positions submitted by a party in conjunction with a dispute that has been referred to interest arbitration is are regarded as protected nonpublic data with regard to data not on individuals and as confidential data on individuals until both parties have filed their final positions with the commissioner under part 5510.2930, subpart 4. The commissioner may release the information to the board, and the board may release the information to the arbitration panel, to fulfill procedural requirements of the act and parts 5510.2410 to 5510.3210, but the information shall remain nonpublic and confidential until the commissioner has affirmed that final positions have been filed by both parties or until an interest arbitration hearing is commenced by the arbitration panel, at which time the final positions are classified as public data.

5510.2930 REFERRAL TO ARBITRATION.

Subpart 1. **Referral.** The commissioner may refer a matter to the board for arbitration when ~~it~~ the commissioner has ~~been~~ determined that further mediation efforts would serve no purpose and:

A. in the case of essential employees, either or both parties have requested arbitration; or

B. in the case of nonessential employees, a request to arbitrate has been made by one party and has been agreed to by the other within 15 days of the request.

Requests for arbitration and agreements to arbitrate must be in writing and be served on the other party and the commissioner under part 5510.0310, subpart 19. The requests and agreements are binding on the parties except to the extent they otherwise agree in writing, ~~except that~~. An offer to arbitrate for nonessential employees that has not been accepted in writing within the 15-day period shall be considered rejected and withdrawn.

Subp. 2. **Form of arbitration.** All interest arbitration shall be conventional arbitration except:

A. if the parties ~~may~~ agree in writing to limit the arbitrator's authority to final offer item-by-item or final offer total-package; or

B. if the case involves a unit of principals and assistant principals, the panel must use final offer item-by-item arbitration.

Subp. 3. **Unresolved issues.** In requesting or agreeing to interest arbitration, each party shall list all issues, items, or matters not previously agreed upon. Based upon the submissions of the parties and prior efforts to mediate the dispute, the commissioner shall determine the unresolved ~~issues~~ items that will be submitted to arbitration.

Subp. 4. **Final positions.** When an agreement or requirement to arbitrate has been established, and the commissioner has determined the ~~issues~~ items to be submitted to arbitration, the commissioner shall certify the matters to the board and direct each party

to submit their final position on the ~~issues~~ items certified by the commissioner. Final positions shall be presented in the form of the contract language desired by each party to resolve the matter in dispute. Final positions must be submitted to the commissioner within 15 days of the date when the commissioner certifies the matter to the board. The deadline for submitting final positions may be extended a reasonable period of time by the commissioner upon an adequate and timely showing of good cause by a party.

If the arbitration form is a final offer variety, the final positions of the parties may not be withdrawn or amended except by mutual written consent or to correct nonsubstantive errors of a clerical-technical nature or matters solely of form.

Subp. 6. **Effect of untimely final positions.** The failure of a party to submit timely final positions on an issue item that has been submitted to final-offer arbitration shall be noted by the arbitration panel and shall ~~prejudice that party's interests in the issue~~ result in a default award unless the delinquent party, in the sole discretion of the panel, can demonstrate good cause for the delinquency, in which case the panel may proceed as if the delinquency had not occurred. The failure of a party to submit timely final positions in a conventional arbitration matter shall be noted by the arbitration panel and may be considered by the panel in weighing the testimony, evidence, and overall good faith behavior of that party with respect to the ~~matters~~ items before the panel.

Subp. 7. **Continued mediation.** The commissioner may continue efforts to aid the parties in resolving issues ~~even~~ after a matter has been certified for arbitration.

5510.3005 STRIKES.

Subp. 2. **Dates right to strike matures and terminates.** The dates the right to strike matures and terminates shall be determined by the commissioner ~~pursuant to the act~~ in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, section 179A.18, and the commissioner shall provide written notice of the dates to the parties. No strike shall commence during the first ten days after receipt of a notice of intent to strike.

According to Minn. Stat. of 1984, §§ 14.29-14.30, state agencies may propose adoption of emergency rules if: 1) expressly required; 2) authorized by statute; or 3) if the manner permitted by a directive (given by statute, federal law or court order) does not allow for compliance with sections 14.14-14.28. The agency must, however, publish a notice of intent to adopt emergency rules, along with the rules themselves, in the *State Register*. The notice must advise the public:

- 1) that a free copy of the proposed emergency rule is available upon request from the agency;
- 2) that notice of the date that the rule is submitted to the attorney general will be mailed to persons requesting notification;
- 3) that the public has at least 25 days after publication of the proposed emergency rule to submit data and views in writing; and
- 4) that the emergency rule may be modified if the data and views submitted support such modification.

Adopted Emergency Rules

Emergency rules take effect five working days after approval by the attorney general, and after compliance with Minn. Stat. §§ 14.29-14.365. As soon as possible, emergency rules are published in the *State Register* in the manner provided for in section 14.18.

Emergency rules are effective for the period stated in the notice of intent to adopt emergency rules. This may not exceed 180 days.

Continued/Extended Emergency Rules

Adopted emergency rules may be continued in effect (extended) for an additional 180 days. To do this, the agency must give notice by: 1) publishing notice in the *State Register*; and 2) mailing the same notice to all persons who requested notification on rulemaking. No emergency rule may remain in effect 361 days after its original effective date. At that point, permanent rules adopted according to Minn. Stat. 14.14-14.28 supercede emergency rules.

The proposed emergency rules may be modified if the modifications are supported by data and views submitted to the Agency and do not result in a substantial change in the proposed emergency rules as noticed.

Any person may request notification of the date of submission to the Attorney General. The emergency rules will take effect five working days after approval by the Attorney General and be effective for 180 additional days if the Agency gives notice of continuation in accordance with *Minnesota Statutes* 14.35 (1986).

Rules as Proposed (all new material)

7530.0010 [Emergency] GENERAL.

This chapter sets the standards and procedures necessary for the implementation of *Minnesota Statutes*, section 299F.631.

7530.0020 [Emergency] DEFINITION.

"Quarter" means the three-month period ending March 31, June 30, September 30, or December 31.

7530.0030 [Emergency] ACTUAL EXPENSES.

Subpart 1. **Definition.** "Actual expenses" means the expenses incurred by the Office of Pipeline Safety while performing annual inspections of pipeline operators providing metered service. Actual expenses include the time, equipment, and travel expenses of the pipeline safety inspectors, senior engineer inspectors, and the chief inspector in conducting annual inspections, preparing to conduct annual inspections, and preparing reports to document annual inspections.

Subp. 2. **Method of assessment.** Each quarter, a pipeline operator providing metered service will be assessed a pro rata share of the actual expenses incurred that quarter based on the number of meters in service on the preceding December 31 and as recorded on the United States Department of Transportation annual report form.

7530.0040 [Emergency] DIRECT CHARGES.

Subpart 1. **Definition.** "Direct charges" means the expenses incurred by the Office of Pipeline Safety in performing the functions listed in subpart 2. Direct charges include the time, equipment, and travel expenses of the pipeline safety inspectors, senior engineer inspectors, and chief inspector in performing the functions in subpart 2.

Subp. 2. **Inspection and investigation; expenses and charges.** The office of pipeline safety shall:

A. conduct specialized inspections and charge the expenses directly to the pipeline operator, when any of the following factors exist:

(1) a particular condition that can only be adequately inspected with a specialized inspection;

(2) a history of past problems that indicates a need for continuing inspection of a particular condition related to a pipeline operator's activities; or

(3) a potential danger to the public that can best be addressed by a specialized inspection;

B. conduct annual inspection of a pipeline operator that does not provide metered service and charge the expenses directly to the pipeline operator;

C. investigate complaints regarding activities of a pipeline operator and charge the expenses directly to the pipeline operator;

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Emergency Rules

D. investigate pipeline accidents and charge the expenses directly to the pipeline operator;

E. conduct inspections necessary to follow up letters of concern, notices of probable violation, warning letters, and hazardous facility orders, and charge the expenses directly to the pipeline operator; and

F. conduct inspections necessary to ensure safe pipeline construction and charge the expenses directly to the pipeline operator.

Subp. 3. **Method of assessment.** Each quarter, the direct charges related to a function in subpart 2 will be assessed against the pipeline operator for the function that was performed.

7530.0050 [Emergency] SUPPORT COSTS.

Subpart 1. **Definition.** "Support costs" means the expenses incurred by the Office of Pipeline Safety for operating the Office of Pipeline Safety that are not actual expenses defined in part 7530.0030, or direct charges defined in part 7530.0040.

Subp. 2. **Method of assessment.** Support costs are assessed as follows:

A. Support costs for each quarter must be divided between and assessed against natural gas operators, liquefied natural gas operators, hazardous liquid operators, and transmission operators that specifically transport a product for resale to another operator, in proportion to the time that will be spent by inspectors on functions related to each type of pipeline operator during the current year.

B. The portion of support costs assessed against natural gas operators must be divided between and assessed against each operator in proportion to the number of meters in service the preceding December 31 as recorded on the United States Department of Transportation annual report form.

7530.0060 [Emergency] PROCEDURE.

Subpart 1. **Assessment form.** Within 30 days of the end of each quarter, the Office of Pipeline Safety shall mail to each pipeline operator an itemized assessment indicating the amounts of support costs, actual expenses, and direct charges assessed against that pipeline operator.

Subp. 2. **Complaint procedure.** A pipeline operator that disagrees with an assessment may file a written complaint with the Office of Pipeline Safety within 15 days of the receipt of the assessment. The director of the Office of Pipeline Safety shall review each complaint and issue a written determination affirming, amending, or rescinding the assessment. The pipeline operator may appeal the determination of the director of the Office of Pipeline Safety to the commissioner of public safety.

A pipeline operator may withhold the assessed charges during the time that a complaint or appeal is pending, and the Office of Pipeline Safety shall not assess penalty and interest charges unless the director determines that the complaint or appeal is solely for the purpose of delay.

Interagency Board for Quality Assurance

Request for Proposals for Exception to the Nursing Home Moratorium

Purposes

The Interagency Board for Quality Assurance is accepting proposals from nursing homes and boarding care homes requesting an exception to the nursing home moratorium. The Commissioner of Health, in coordination with the Commissioner of Human Services, may approve such requests under conditions listed in *Minnesota Statutes* 144A. 0733. These conditions refer to four categories of exceptions which are defined as:

- (a) "Conversion" means the relocation of a nursing home bed from a nursing home to an attached hospital.
- (b) "Renovation" means extensive remodeling of, or construction of an addition to, a facility on an existing site with a total cost exceeding ten percent of the appraised value of the facility or \$200,000, whichever is less.
- (c) "Replacement" means the demolition and reconstruction of all or part of an existing facility.
- (d) "Upgrading" means a change in the level of licensure of a bed from a boarding care bed to a nursing home bed in a certified boarding care facility.

Emergency Rules

Rules governing procedures for exceptions to the nursing home bed moratorium were effective November 7, 1988 and notice of their adoption is being published in the *State Register* on November 28, 1988.

Appropriation Available

The commissioner of health may license or certify beds through the exception review process, provided the projected total annual increased state medical assistance costs of all licenses or certifications granted during the biennium under any exception to the moratorium do not exceed \$300,000.

Eligibility

A proposal for an exception to the moratorium may be submitted by an organization or individual authorized by a facility's governing board or management to prepare and submit a proposal to the Interagency Board for Quality Assurance.

Children's Trust Fund

Notice of Availability of the Children's Trust Fund Grants/Request for Proposals (RFP)

The Notice of Availability which follows is applicable to grants to be awarded by the Minnesota Department of Public Safety, the Children's Trust Fund (CTF), under the authority of *Minnesota Statute* 299A.20.

I. PURPOSE, SCOPE, AND ELIGIBILITY

The Children's Trust Fund was established to provide funding for programs and services which help to strengthen families and thereby prevent child abuse and neglect.

Revenue for the trust fund is generated from a surtax of \$3.00 for each certified copy of a birth certificate purchased, and from federal money and gifts, donations and bequests.

The Commissioner of Public Safety, with the advice and consent of the Advisory Council, may disburse trust fund money to any public or private nonprofit agency to fund a primary or secondary child abuse or neglect prevention program.

Minnesota Statutes, 299A.21 DEFINITIONS

Subd. 8. "Prevention Program" means a system that directly provides primary or secondary child abuse prevention services to a child, parent or prospective parent, guardian, or professional who works regularly with children, and may also include a research program related to the prevention of child abuse.

Subd. 9. "Primary prevention" means a program or service designed to promote the general welfare of children and families.

Subd. 10. "Secondary prevention" means a program or service designed to prevent abuse of children who are in circumstances where there is a high risk that abuse will occur.

State Grants

Subd. 11. "Tertiary prevention" means a program or service provided after child abuse has occurred that is designed to prevent its recurrence.

No money shall be distributed for programs and services involving tertiary prevention.

In addition, the CTF Advisory Council has augmented the above with the following definitions:

PRIMARY PREVENTION is taking measures to keep child abuse from happening before it has ever occurred. The key aspects of primary prevention efforts are as follows:

- It is offered to all members of a population;
- It is voluntary;
- It attempts to influence societal forces which impact on parents and children; and
- It seeks to promote positive family functioning rather than to just prevent problems.

SECONDARY PREVENTION is taking measures to keep child abuse from happening before it has occurred to a serious degree, but after certain warning signals have appeared. The major components of secondary prevention are as follows:

- It is offered to a pre-defined group of "at risk" individuals;
- It is voluntary;
- It is more problem-focused than primary prevention; and on the particular stresses of identified parents or guardians.

II. PRIORITIES

The CTF Advisory Council recognizes that a prevention effort, in order to demonstrate effectiveness, is usually a long-term proposition. Applicants are, therefore, encouraged to be creative in designing and developing multi-year programs directed at producing measurable change and preventing child abuse and neglect.

The CTF Advisory Council also recognizes that to cope successfully with their roles in the family, both parents and children require certain supports, education and resources. Based on what is known or believed to enhance an individual's ability to function in a healthy way within a family, program areas that contribute to a strategy for supporting and strengthening the parent's role and responsibilities are encouraged.

Starting in 1989, applicants may submit proposals for programs that span a maximum of three years. If awarded a grant, a multi-year contract will be executed. Continuation funding for years two and three will be contingent upon an annual performance review. Reapplication will not be required.

Approximately 70% of the funds awarded will be for proposals that address the needs of parents whose children are under five years of age.

The most recent data from the Department of Human Services, Child Maltreatment Report for 1985-1986, page 18, states that of the 27,306 children on reports of maltreatment in 1986, 43% were under 5 years of age. Therefore, the Children's Trust Fund Advisory Council has determined that programs addressing the needs of children in this age group and their parents, will receive priority consideration for the next 3 to 5 years. Prenatal programs are included in this category.

Applicants are encouraged to analyze their respective county's child maltreatment data for this category in order to target programs and their anticipated outcomes at alleviating factors that contribute the potential for maltreatment of children in this age group.

The following requirements apply to all applicants:

- The needs of unserved and underserved populations, including male children and fathers, be addressed.
- The recruitment and utilization of volunteers, when and where appropriate, be described.
- That a minimum of 10% of the program funds be dedicated to program evaluation.
- That interagency collaboration and coordination be specifically described by respective agencies in letters of agreement or support, when applicable.
- That diminished dependence on CTF funding, future program and funding plans be described in realistic terms.
- A clear description be given of the methodology to be used to assure utilization of the services to be provided by the target population.
- Agreement to provide information and consultation about the program model to parties interested in replication.
- If the proposal requests funds for curriculum development, provide documentation that there is no curriculum currently available or that can be adapted for this population.
- If an existing curriculum is to be utilized, copies of the curriculum must accompany the application.

Match Requirements—Trust fund money shall only be distributed to applicants that demonstrate an ability to match 40 percent of the amount of trust fund money requested. The matching requirement may be met through in-kind donations. Priority is given to applicants whose matching funds do not consist, in whole or in part, of state or federal funds.

Any trust fund money received must not be used to compensate for a decrease in previously existing funding levels unless that decrease is attributable to a decision made by state, federal, or other entities not controlled by the applicant and the applicant demonstrates that they have made reasonable efforts to retain all previous existing funding.

Local Council Review—To be eligible to receive a grant from the trust fund, an applicant must have had its application reviewed by their single or multi-county child abuse prevention council, duly authorized by the Children's Trust Fund.

In reviewing all such applications, the local council shall consider the extent to which the applicant meets the program priorities of the Children's Trust Fund and the needs of the geographic area as set forth in their county's Plan for the Prevention of Child Abuse. The local council shall provide to the CTF advisory council, its comments and recommendations concerning each application reviewed, and its prioritization by rank ordering of all applications reviewed.

III. GRANT CATEGORIES

Re-Application—Applicants that received funding in 1987 or 1988, and who are re-applying for funds to continue their program in 1989-90, must submit with their application, a summary report of the previous year(s) accomplishments and a rationale for continuation funding.

Single or Multi-County Programs—Programs may be funded that serve a single or multi-county area, provided the county(s) has an authorized child abuse prevention council. Applications for single or multi-county programs are to be submitted to the respective local child abuse prevention council for review.

Regional Programs—Programs may be funded that serve a region larger than the area served by a single or multi-county council. However, regional programs may only serve those counties that have an authorized child abuse prevention council. Applicants proposing programs that serve a multi-county area are required to submit their proposals to each authorized child abuse prevention council in the counties affected.

Local Council Programs—Funds may be disbursed to a county child abuse prevention council for primary or secondary prevention programs on the same basis as any other applicant. Applications for programs sponsored by local child abuse prevention councils are to be submitted directly to the CTF Advisory Council for review.

Local Council Administrative Costs—Funds may also be disbursed to a county child abuse prevention council for administrative costs in carrying out their responsibilities under this Act. Funds disbursed as administrative costs to a local council must not exceed five percent (5%) of the total funds awarded to the area served by the local council. Applications from local councils for administrative costs are to be submitted in a simplified application format directly to the CTF Advisory Council for review.

Statewide Programs—Program proposals that intend to serve the entire state may be submitted by public or private non-profit agencies. Applicants considering state-wide programs are required to include letters of support with their application from agencies with whom they intend to collaborate, describing their respective roles and their collaborative activities. Applications for statewide programs are to be submitted directly to the CTF Advisory Council for review.

Lakeshore Lease Lot Sales Held: The first in a series of lakeshore lease lot sales has been successfully held by the DNR with 91 of 96 parcels offered for sale actually sold. Most of the parcels went to the lessees for minimum bids at the auction, which were attended by an estimated 850 people at the three auctions in Grand Marais, Grand Rapids and Eveleth. Actually, only 200 of those in attendance were registered bidders, with the remainder including many other lessees who wanted to observe the auction. Real Estate Management Bureau staff reported that the land prices were bid up on eight lots. Total sale revenues, including sales costs, were about \$1,373,200, which was 4.2 percent above appraised value. The Bureau collected \$267,720 in down payments, and \$1,105,480 was financed at 8 percent. "This money will go to the Permanent School Trust Fund, not to the DNR," explained James Lawler, manager of records, sales, and leases for the Bureau. "Over the next 10 years, the Bureau must sell 1,659 additional leased lakeshore lots worth, in today's dollars, about \$16 million." Lawler said he expects interest in the sales to rise as people find out that the lots will include islands, Lake Superior shoreland, and lands within the Boundary Waters Canoe Area (BWCA). Sales are now being scheduled for next year. The remaining 1,659 lots to be sold are located on 143 platted areas on 86 lakes in 11 counties. Modifications to the Sentencing Guidelines: The Minnesota Sentencing Guidelines Commission will hold a public hearing on Thursday, December 8, 1988, at 5:30 PM in Hearing Room 10, Ground Floor, State Office Building, 100 Constitution Ave., St. Paul, Minnesota. The public hearing is for the Commission to consider public comment regarding the recommendations set forth in the preliminary report of the Attorney General's Task Force on the Prevention of Sexual Violence Against Women. The recommendations of the report are as follows: 1) Increase presumptive sentences for severity level VII criminal sexual conduct perpetrated with force or coercion. 2) Increase presumptive sentences for severity level VIII criminal sexual conduct perpetrated with force or coercion. Create another severity level between the present severity level VIII and IX to permit this change. 3) Classify criminal sexual conduct in the second degree, which does not involve penetration, but involves personal injury, a weapon or fear of great bodily harm, as a severity level VIII offense. 4) Increase presumptive sentence for fourth degree criminal sexual conduct perpetrated with force or coercion. 5) Give prior crimes against the person additional weight in calculating criminal history under the sentencing guidelines. 6) Modify sentencing guidelines rules to permit judges to impose sentences above the guideline sentence (aggravated durational departure) if the current and prior offenses are sexual assaults or other crimes against the person, without the need to prove an additional "injury" to the person. 7) Remove the limit on the number of criminal history points which can be accumulated under the sentencing guidelines for felony level juvenile offenses committed above age 15.

The Legislature has directed the Commission to study the three issues listed below and report back to the Legislature by February 1, 1989. The public hearing will also be for the Commission to consider public comment regarding the following issues: 1) Should criteria and procedures be developed to limit the length of aggravated durational departures from presumptive sentences. 2) Whether improved criteria and procedures can be developed to minimize or eliminate the use of social and economic factors as the basis for dispositional departures from presumptive sentences. 3) Whether and to what extent guidelines should be developed to govern the type and severity of nonimprisonment sanctions imposed by sentencing judges as conditions of stayed sentences.
