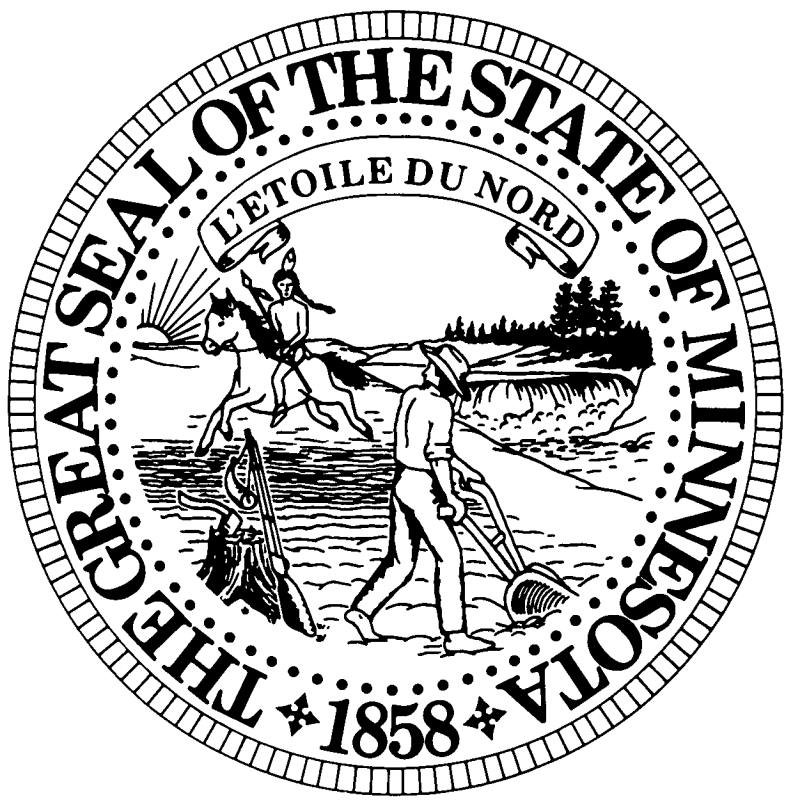

The *State Register* is the official publication of the State of Minnesota, containing executive and commissioners' orders, proposed and adopted rules, official and revenue notices, professional, technical and consulting contracts, non-state bids and public contracts, contract awards, grants, and a monthly calendar of cases to be heard by the state supreme court.

A *Contracts Supplement* is published Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday and contains bids and proposals, including printing bids.

*Deadline extensions may be possible at the editor's discretion; however, none will be made beyond the second Wednesday (12 calendar days) preceding the issue date for rules, proposed rules and executive orders, or beyond the Wednesday (5 calendar days) preceding the issue date for official notices. Requests for deadline extensions should be made only in valid emergency situations.

**Notices of public hearings on proposed rules and notices of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing are published in the Proposed Rules section and must be submitted two weeks prior to the issue date.

The *State Register* is published every Monday (Tuesday when Monday is a holiday) by the State of Minnesota, Department of Administration, Print Communications Division, 117 University Avenue, St. Paul, Minnesota 55155, pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* § 14.46. A *State Register Contracts Supplement* is published every Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday. The Monday edition is the vehicle for conveying all information about state agency rulemaking, including official notices; hearing notices; proposed, adopted and emergency rules. It also contains executive orders of the governor; commissioners' orders; state contracts and advertised bids; professional, technical and consulting contracts; non-state public contracts; state grants; decisions of the supreme court; a monthly calendar of scheduled cases before the supreme court; and other announcements. The *State Register Contracts Supplement* contains additional state contracts and advertised bids.

In accordance with expressed legislative intent that the *State Register* be self-supporting, the following subscription rates have been established: the Monday edition costs \$150.00 per year and includes an index issue published in August (single issues are available at the address listed above for \$3.50 per copy); the combined four editions cost \$195.00 (subscriptions are not available for just the *Contracts Supplement*); trial subscriptions are available for \$60.00, includes four editions, last for 13 weeks, and may be converted to a full subscription anytime by making up the price difference. No refunds will be made in the event of subscription cancellation.

Both editions are delivered postpaid to points in the United States, second class postage paid for the *State Register* at St. Paul, MN, first class for the *Contracts Supplement*. Publication Number 326630 (ISSN 0146-7751).

Subscribers who do not receive a copy of an issue should notify the *State Register* circulation manager immediately at (612) 296-0931. Copies of back issues may not be available more than two weeks after publication.

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The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 75 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific *Minnesota Rule* chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the *Minnesota Rules* are published. This is a ten-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Proposed and adopted emergency rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

If an agency seeks outside opinion before issuing new rules or rule amendments, it must publish a NOTICE OF INTENT TO SOLICIT OUTSIDE OPINION in the *Official Notices* section of the *State Register*. When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues 1-13 inclusive; issues 14-25 inclusive; issue 26, cumulative for issues 1-26; issues 27-38 inclusive; issue 39, cumulative for 1-39; issues 40-51 inclusive; and issue 52, cumulative for 1-52. 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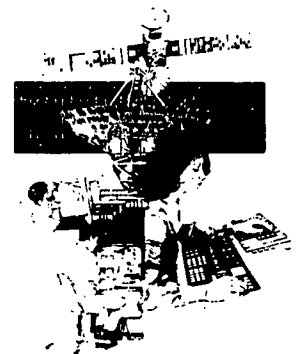

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Adopted Rules

The adoption of a rule becomes effective after the requirements of Minn. Stat. §14.14-14.28 have been met and five working days after the rule is published in *State Register*, unless a later date is required by statutes or specified in the rule.

If an adopted rule is identical to its proposed form as previously published, a notice of adoption and a citation to its previous *State Register* publication will be printed.

If an adopted rule differs from its proposed form, language which has been deleted will be printed with strikeouts and new language will be underlined. The rule's previous *State Register* publication will be cited.

An emergency rule becomes effective five working days after the approval of the Attorney General as specified in Minn. Stat. §14.33 and upon the approval of the Revisor of Statutes as specified in §14.36. Notice of approval by the Attorney General will be published as soon as practicable, and the adopted emergency rule will be published in the manner provided for adopted rules under §14.18.

Adopted Permanent Rules Relating to Health Maintenance Organizations

The rules proposed and published at *State Register*, Volume 17, Number 17, pages 888-897, October 26, 1992 (17 SR 888), are adopted with the following modifications:

Rules as Adopted

DEFINITIONS

4685.0100 DEFINITIONS.

Subp. 9b. **Medically necessary care.** "Medically necessary care" means health care services appropriate, in terms of type, frequency, level, setting, and duration, to the enrollee's diagnosis or condition, and diagnostic testing and preventive services. Medically necessary care must:

A. be consistent with generally accepted ~~principles of practice parameters~~ as determined by health care providers in the same or similar general specialty as typically manages the condition, procedure, or treatment at issue; and

B. help restore or maintain the enrollee's health; or

D. prevent the ~~possible~~ reasonably likely onset of a health problem or detect an incipient problem.

Subp. 12a. **Primary care physician.** "Primary care physician" means a licensed physician, either employed by or under contract with the health maintenance organization, who is in general practice, or who has special education, training, or experience, or who is board-certified or board-eligible and working toward certification in a board approved by the American Board of Medical Specialists or the American Board of Osteopathy in family practice, pediatrics, internal medicine, or obstetrics and gynecology.

Subp. 12b. Primary care provider. "Primary care provider" means a primary care physician as defined in subpart 12a or a licensed practitioner such as a licensed nurse, optometrist, or chiropractor who, within that practitioner's scope of practice as defined under the relevant state licensing law, provides primary care services.

Subp. 13a. **Referral.** "Referral" means a prior written authorization from the health maintenance organization or an authorized provider that ~~directs~~ allows an enrollee to have one or more appointments with a health care provider, for consultation, diagnosis, or treatment of a medical condition, to be covered as a benefit under the enrollee's health maintenance organization contract.

Subp. 13b. **Specialty physician.** "Specialty physician" means a licensed physician, ~~other than a primary care physician,~~ either employed by or under contract with the health maintenance organization, who has specialized education, training, or experience, or who is board-certified or board-eligible and working toward certification in a specialty board approved by the American Board of Medical Specialists or the American Board of Osteopathy ~~from the major areas of clinical services.~~

ACCESSIBILITY OF SERVICES

4685.1010 AVAILABILITY AND ACCESSIBILITY.

Subpart 1. **Definitions.** For the purpose of this part, the terms in items A and B have the meanings given them.

A. "Referral centers of excellence" means medical facilities that provide specialized medical care such as organ transplants and coronary artery bypass surgery. Examples of criteria the health maintenance organization may use in designating a facility as a referral center of excellence are volume of services provided annually and the case mix and severity adjusted mortality and morbidity rates. Referral centers of excellence may be located within or outside the health maintenance organization's service area.

Subp. 2. **Basic services.** The health maintenance organization shall have available, either directly or through arrangements, appropriate and sufficient personnel, physical resources, and equipment to meet the projected needs of its enrollees for covered health care

services. The health maintenance organization shall develop and implement written standards or guidelines which address the assessment of provider capacity to provide timely access to health care services in accordance with subpart 6.

A. Primary care ~~physician~~ services.

(3) The health maintenance organization shall ensure that there are a number of primary care physicians with hospital admitting privileges at one or more participating general hospitals within the health maintenance organization's service area so that necessary admissions are made on a timely basis consistent with generally accepted ~~principles of practice~~ parameters.

(4) To the extent that primary care services are provided through primary care providers other than physicians, and to the extent permitted under applicable scope of practice in state licensing laws for a given provider, these services shall be available and accessible as required by subitems (1) to (3).

B. Specialty physician services.

(1) The health maintenance organization shall provide directly, contract for, or otherwise arrange for specialty physician services which are covered benefits and to which enrollees have continued access in the health maintenance organization's service area. These services shall be available and accessible 24 hours per day, seven days per week. The health maintenance organization shall fulfill this requirement through written standards for:

(3) The health maintenance organization shall ensure that there are a number of specialty physicians with hospital admitting privileges so that necessary admissions are made on a timely basis consistent with generally accepted ~~principles of practice~~ parameters.

C. Services of facilities licensed as general hospitals under chapter 4640 (general hospital services) shall be provided through contracts between the health maintenance organization and hospitals. These services shall be available and accessible, on a timely basis consistent with generally accepted ~~principles of practice~~ parameters, 24 hours per day, seven days per week within the health maintenance organization's service area. Services of facilities licensed as specialized hospitals under chapter 4640 (specialized hospital services), including chemical dependency and mental health services, shall be provided through contracts between the health maintenance organization or its contracted providers and hospitals, either within or outside the health maintenance organization's service area. These services shall be available during normal business hours consistent with generally accepted ~~principles of practice~~ parameters.

D. The health maintenance organization shall contract with or employ sufficient numbers of providers of ancillary services to meet the projected needs of its enrollees. The services shall be available during normal daytime business hours consistent with generally accepted ~~principles of practice~~ parameters.

E. The health maintenance organization shall contract with or employ sufficient numbers of qualified providers of outpatient mental health and chemical dependency services to meet the projected needs of its enrollees consistent with generally accepted ~~principles of practice~~ parameters.

(4) The health maintenance organization, either directly or through its contracted mental health or chemical dependency provider, shall have available services that are culturally specific or appropriate to a specific age, gender, or sexual preference, to the extent reasonably possible. If any of these services cannot be provided by licensed providers and programs, the health maintenance organization shall file a request for an exception to the requirements of subitems (1) to (4). A request for an exception shall be considered a filing under part 4685.3300. The health maintenance organization shall submit specific data in support of its request.

F. The health maintenance organization shall provide directly, contract for, or otherwise arrange for residential treatment programs licensed by the Department of Human Services under parts 9530.4100 to 9530.4450 to provide services to people with alcohol and other chemical dependency problems.

G. The health maintenance organization shall provide directly, contract for, or otherwise arrange for emergency care and urgently needed care to be available and accessible within the health maintenance organization's service area 24 hours per day, seven days per week. Contracts may be with hospitals, urgent care centers, and after hours clinics. Emergency care and urgently needed care provided by noncontracted providers shall be covered in accordance with subpart 7.

~~G. H.~~ H. If a specific health maintenance organization provider refuses to continue to provide care to a specific health maintenance organization enrollee, the health maintenance organization shall furnish the enrollee with the name, address, and telephone number of other participating providers in the same area of medical specialty. Examples of reasons for refusal to continue to provide care to an enrollee are: unpaid bills incurred by that individual before enrollment in the health maintenance organization; unpaid copayments

or coinsurance incurred by the enrollee after enrollment in the health maintenance organization; an enrollee who is uncooperative or abusive toward the provider; and the inability of the enrollee and the provider to agree on a course of treatment.

~~H. 1.~~ The health maintenance organization is responsible for implementing a system that, to the greatest possible extent, assures that routine referrals, either by the health maintenance organization or by a participating provider, are made to participating providers. An enrollee cannot be held liable if the health maintenance organization provider, in error, gives a referral to a nonparticipating provider. This issue may be addressed in contracts between the health maintenance organization and its providers.

Subp. 3. Geographic accessibility.

C. The provisions of items A and B do not apply when enrollees are referred to referral centers of excellence for health care services, or when enrollees have chosen a health plan with full knowledge that the health plan has no participating providers within 30 miles or 30 minutes of the enrollee's place of residence, or to service areas approved prior to the effective date of parts 4685.0100 to 4685.3300.

Subp. 5. Coordination of care.

A. The health maintenance organization shall provide the services of primary care ~~physicians~~ providers, either directly or through contracts or other arrangements, to provide initial and basic care to enrollees. In plans in which referrals to specialty physicians and ancillary services are required, the primary care ~~physicians~~ providers or the health maintenance organization shall initiate the referrals. The health maintenance organization shall inform its primary care ~~physicians~~ providers of their responsibility to provide written referrals and any specific procedures that must be followed in providing referrals. If requested by an enrollee, or if determined necessary because of a pattern of inappropriate utilization of services, an enrollee's health care may be supervised and coordinated by the primary care ~~physician~~ provider. An enrollee who is dissatisfied with the assigned or selected primary care ~~physician~~ provider shall be allowed to change primary care ~~physicians~~ providers in accordance with the health maintenance organization's procedures and policies.

B. The health maintenance organization shall provide for the coordination and continuity of care for enrollees given a referral to specialty physicians and, where possible, provide this coordination through the enrollee's primary care ~~physician~~ provider.

Subp. 6. Timely access to health care services.

A. The health maintenance organization, either directly or through its provider contracts, shall arrange for covered health care services, including referrals to participating and nonparticipating specialty physicians, to be accessible to enrollees on a timely basis in accordance with medically appropriate guidelines consistent with generally accepted ~~principles of practice~~ parameters.

Adopted Permanent Rules Relating to Medical Care Surcharge on Health Care Providers

The rules proposed and published at *State Register*, Volume 17, Number 9, pages 431-434, August 31, 1992 (17 SR 431) and Volume 17, Number 21, pages 1266-1269, November 23, 1992 (17 SR 1266), are adopted with the following modifications:

Rules as Adopted

9510.2020 MEDICAL CARE SURCHARGE.

Subpart 1. **Nursing homes.** Effective October 1, 1992, and each July 1 after, ~~non-state operated nursing homes must pay~~ an annual medical care surcharge of \$535 ~~for is levied upon~~ each nursing home bed licensed by the Minnesota Department of Health ~~on July 1~~ in nonstate operated nursing homes. Each nonstate operated nursing home must pay the surcharge for those beds licensed in its nursing home as of July 1 of each year, except that if the number of licensed beds is reduced after July 1, but prior to August 1, the surcharge shall be based on the number of remaining licensed beds. A nursing home entitled to a reduction in the number of beds subject to the surcharge under this provision must demonstrate to the satisfaction of the commissioner by August 5 that the number of beds has been reduced. Payments are due in equal monthly installments on the 15th day of each month beginning November 15, 1992. The monthly payment must be equal to the annual surcharge divided by 12. The November 15, 1992, payment shall be based on the number of licensed nursing home beds in the nursing home on July 1, 1992. Beginning July 1, 1993, the surcharge will be based on the number of licensed beds in the nursing home on July 1, 1993, and will change yearly on July 1 based on the then existing number of licensed nursing home beds in that nursing home.

Subp. 2. **Minnesota hospitals.** Effective October 1, 1992, ~~each Minnesota hospitals~~ hospital must pay ~~a~~ an annual medical care surcharge equal to 1.4 percent of ~~the that hospital's~~ that hospital's net patient revenue, excluding ~~that hospital's~~ net Medicare revenues, as reported to the health care cost information system for the fiscal year two years before the fiscal year ending June 30. This surcharge shall be paid in monthly installments due the 15th of the month, beginning October 15, 1992. The monthly payment must be equal to the annual surcharge divided by 12.

For the purpose of this subpart, the definitions in items A to D apply.

Subp. 3. **Health maintenance organizations.** Health maintenance organizations must pay ~~a~~ an annual medical care surcharge equal to six-tenths of one percent of the total premium revenues, ~~excluding premiums attributable to prepaid dental contracts, of that health maintenance organization~~ as reported to the commissioner of the Department of Health for the fiscal year two years before the fiscal year ending June 30. This surcharge shall be paid in monthly installments due the 15th day of the month, beginning October 15, 1992. The monthly payment must be equal to the annual surcharge divided by 12.

For the ~~purpose~~ purposes of this subpart, "total premium revenues" ~~has the meaning given "premium" in part 4685.1930, subpart 3,~~ mean:

A. premium revenue recognized on a prepaid basis from individuals and groups for provision of a specified range of health services over a defined period of time, normally one month; and

B. premiums from Medicare wrap-around subscribers for health benefits which supplement Medicare coverage.

If advance payments are made under item A or B to the HMO for more than one reporting period, the portion of the payment that has not yet been earned must be treated as a liability.

Subp. 4. **Installment due date, acceptable postmark.** An installment payment postmarked on or before the 12th of a month satisfies the due date requirement for the 15th day of the month.

Subp. 4. ~~5.~~ **Closed or closing nursing homes and hospitals.** The medical care surcharge as amended in 1992 does not apply to Minnesota hospitals or nursing homes closed before October 1, 1992.

Nursing homes that close or are in the process of closing after October 1, 1992, are subject to the medical care surcharge for each month after October 1, 1992, in which the home operates and maintains licensed beds.

Minnesota hospitals that close or are in the process of closing after October 1, 1992, are subject to the medical care surcharge until the first month after the hospital is completely closed.

Subp. ~~5-~~ **6.** **Nursing homes and hospitals that change ownership or enter into receivership.** The medical care surcharge continues for nursing homes and Minnesota hospitals that change ownership or enter into receivership.

Subp. **7.** **HMOs that cease operation.** HMOs that cease operation after October 1, 1992, are subject to the medical care surcharge until the first month after the HMO completely ceases operation. The medical care surcharge continues for HMOs that merge as long as any of the certificates of authority of the merging HMOs remain in force. If the certificate of authority for a merging HMO no longer remains in force, the medical care surcharge for that HMO will be discontinued.

Subp. ~~6-~~ **8.** **Nursing homes, Minnesota hospitals, and HMOs that begin operations after October 1, 1992.** Nursing homes, Minnesota hospitals, and HMOs that begin operations after October 1, 1992, are subject to the medical care surcharge under ~~items~~ item A and B, or C.

B. The surcharge for Minnesota hospitals ~~and health maintenance organizations~~ begins the month immediately after the date when data has been reported to the health care cost information system for the fiscal year two years before the year of surcharge.

C. The surcharge for health maintenance organizations begins the month immediately after the date when data have been reported to the commissioner of health for the fiscal year two years before the year of surcharge.

9510.2030 NOTIFICATION OF SURCHARGE AMOUNT.

The commissioner must give written notice to a nursing home, Minnesota hospital, or HMO of the medical care surcharge amount owed at least 30 days before the date each payment is due. Notwithstanding the requirement that the monthly installments under part 9510.2020, subparts 1, 2, and 3, are due on the 15th day of the month, if written notice from the commissioner under this part is not received at least 30 days prior to the 15th, the due date of the monthly installment will be extended to 30 days from the day the notice is actually received by the nursing home, hospital, or HMO.

8260.0600 FINANCING STATEMENT: FORM UCC-1.

Subpart 1. **Permitted use.** This form must be used when a financing statement is filed pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes*, section 336.9-401, subsection (1), paragraphs (a) and (b). The use of any other form not described in this part results in a nonstandard fee charge.

Subp. 3. **Report format for multipart form.** A standard financing statement must be in substantially the following form:

Subp. 2. **Intergovernmental immunity.** The doctrine of intergovernmental immunity developed by the federal courts in their construction of the federal constitution precludes the state of Minnesota from imposing a tax upon the federal government, its agencies, and instrumentalities. For purposes of this part, the federal government, its agencies, and instrumentalities are referred to as the "federal government."

Emergency Rules

- 4) that the emergency rule may be modified if the data and views submitted support such modification.

Adopted Emergency Rules

Emergency rules take effect five working days after approval by the attorney general, and after compliance with Minn. Stat. §§14.29-14.365. As soon as possible, emergency rules are published in the *State Register* in the manner provided for in section 14.18.

Emergency rules are effective for the period stated in the notice of intent to adopt emergency rules. This may not exceed 180 days.

Continued/Extended Emergency Rules

Adopted emergency rules may be continued in effect (extended) for an additional 180 days. To do this, the agency must give notice by: 1) publishing notice in the *State Register*; and 2) mailing the same notice to all persons who requested notification on rulemaking. No emergency rule may remain in effect 361 days after its original effective date. At that point, permanent rules adopted according to Minn. Stat. 14.14-14.28 supercede emergency rules.
