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If an agency seeks outside opinion before issuing new rules or rule amendments, it must publish a NOTICE OF INTENT TO SOLICIT OUTSIDE OPINION in the *Official Notices* section of the *State Register*. When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues 1-13 inclusive; issues 14-25 inclusive; issue 26, cumulative for issues 1-26; issues 27-38 inclusive; issue 39, cumulative for 1-39; issues 40-51 inclusive; and issue 52, cumulative for 1-52. 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Adopted Rules

The adoption of a rule becomes effective after the requirements of Minn. Stat. §14.14-14.28 have been met and five working days after the rule is published in *State Register*, unless a later date is required by statutes or specified in the rule.

If an adopted rule is identical to its proposed form as previously published, a notice of adoption and a citation to its previous *State Register* publication will be printed.

If an adopted rule differs from its proposed form, language which has been deleted will be printed with strikeouts and new language will be underlined. The rule's previous *State Register* publication will be cited.

An emergency rule becomes effective five working days after the approval of the Attorney General as specified in Minn. Stat. §14.33 and upon the approval of the Revisor of Statutes as specified in §14.36. Notice of approval by the Attorney General will be published as soon as practicable, and the adopted emergency rule will be published in the manner provided for adopted rules under §14.18.

The rules proposed and published at *State Register*, Volume 17, Number 27, pages 1693-1704, January 4, 1993 (17 SR 1693), are adopted with the following modifications:

Rules as Adopted

9560.0216 BASIC REQUIREMENTS.

Subp. 1a. **County of service: no imminent danger.** The local agency shall provide child protective services to any child residing in the county who is alleged to have been maltreated.

~~A. In a any situation of no imminent danger, including a situation where a report of maltreatment involves a member of the family unit who is an employee or board member of the local agency, the local agency shall may request another local agency to provide child protective services if a report of maltreatment involves a member of the family unit who is an employee or board member of the local agency.~~

~~B. In other situations of no imminent danger, the local agency may request another local agency to assist in an assessment.~~

9560.0220 RESPONSE TO REPORTS OF MALTREATMENT WITHIN THE FAMILY UNIT.

Subp. 2. **Coordination with law enforcement.** The local agency shall:

A. ask a representative from a law enforcement agency to accompany the child protection worker to interview the child when a report of maltreatment:

(2) alleges occurrence of sexual abuse, physical abuse, or malicious punishment of a child; ~~or neglect or endangerment of a child under *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 609;~~

Subp. 3. **Child interviews.** ~~The When a local agency shall and a law enforcement agency that coordinates assessments and investigations, jointly determines that an interview the by one person with the child who is reported to be maltreated is in the best interests of the child, and the interview is conducted by the law enforcement agency, the interview can be substituted for the procedures in items A to F.~~

When necessary to make the determinations in subpart 6, the local agency shall interview any other minors within the family unit. When interviewing children, the local agency shall follow the procedures in items A to F.

Subp. 6. **Local agency determinations.** When the local agency has completed its assessment under subparts 1 to 5, the local agency shall make determinations.

A. The local agency shall make a determination that maltreatment has occurred if:

(1) ~~the information obtained through the assessment leads the child protection worker to conclude that it is more likely than not there is a preponderance of evidence~~ that a child is a victim of maltreatment as defined in part 9560.0214, subpart 18; and

9560.0222 INVESTIGATION OF REPORTS OF MALTREATMENT IN A FACILITY.

Subp. 2. **Coordination with law enforcement.** The local agency shall:

A. ask a representative from a law enforcement agency to accompany the child protection worker to interview the child when a report of maltreatment:

(2) alleges occurrence of sexual abuse, physical abuse, or malicious punishment of a child; ~~or neglect or endangerment of a child under *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 609;~~

Subp. 8a. Other interviews. When necessary to make the determinations in subpart 10, the local agency shall interview other

persons who the agency believes may have knowledge of the alleged maltreatment.

Subp. 10. **Local agency determination determinations.** The local agency shall determine that maltreatment has occurred within the facility on the basis of the criteria in items A and B:

A. ~~the information obtained through the assessment leads the child protection worker to conclude that it is more likely than not there is a preponderance of evidence~~ that a child is a victim of maltreatment as defined in part 9560.0214, subpart 18; and

9560.0223 PLACEMENT PREFERENCE.

Items A to E must be followed when a local agency temporarily removes a child from the home in accordance with part 9560.0220, subpart 9, or from a facility in accordance with part 9560.0222, subpart 13:

B. If a child is ~~in imminent danger~~ has been taken into immediate custody, placement may be with a child's relative or in a shelter care facility ~~according to Minnesota Statutes, section 260.173, subdivision 2.~~

9560.0228 PROTECTIVE SERVICES.

Subp. 2. **Written protective services plan.** The written protective services plan based on the risk assessment in part 9560.0216 must be prepared within 60 days after the assessment is completed. The written protective services plan must meet the criteria in items A to D:

A. A child protection worker shall work with the appropriate members of the family unit, and, if applicable, custodians, guardians ad litem, and, if a tribe has intervened, tribal representatives to formulate the protective services plan and shall provide the appropriate members of the family unit with a copy of the protective services plan signed by the appropriate members of the family unit and the child protection worker. If the appropriate members of the family unit ~~does do~~ not sign the plan, the child protection worker shall document the reasons why the appropriate members of the family unit did not sign.

B. The written protective services plan must identify:

(2) achievable ~~family unit~~ family unit goals of the appropriate members of the family unit to reduce risk of harm to the child, and observable behaviors and timelines that will demonstrate achievement of these goals;

(4) specific tasks to be performed by each appropriate ~~family member of the family unit~~, the child protection worker, and other service providers;

Subp. 5. **Quarterly reassessment.** The child protection worker and the appropriate members of the family unit shall meet at least quarterly to jointly assess the written protective services plan to:

A. assess the family unit's progress in achieving goals; and

Subp. 6. **Termination of protective services.** A risk assessment tool under part 9560.0220, subpart 6, item B, must be used when the local agency considers termination of protective services. Protective services to a the appropriate members of the family unit must be terminated when the local agency determines:

A. the goals in the written protective services plan have been accomplished and the appropriate members of the family unit no longer ~~needs need~~ protective services; or

B. the family unit fails to achieve goals and there are insufficient legal grounds to proceed with court action that would authorize the local agency to provide involuntary protective services, unless the appropriate members of the family unit ~~agrees agree~~ to voluntary protective services.

9560.0230 OFFICIAL RECORDS.

Subp. 6. **Retention of report records.** The local agency's records relating to reports of maltreatment must be retained or destroyed according to items A to C.

A. If the local agency has made determinations that maltreatment has not occurred and that child protective services are not needed, the local agency may retain the records of the report up to four years. However, if the alleged offender requests the destruction of the records, the local agency must destroy the records within 30 days of the request.

Maximum Lawful Rate of Interest for Mortgages and Contracts for Deed and Time Share Financing Rate for the Month of July 1993

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes*, Section 47.20, Subdivision 4a, the maximum lawful rate of interest for conventional home mortgages and contracts for deed for the month of July, 1993, is eleven and forty-five hundredths (11.45) percentage points. This rate is based on the Federal National Mortgage Association posted yield on 30-year mortgage commitments for delivery within 60 days on standard conventional fixed-rate mortgages published in *The Wall Street Journal* for May 31, 1993, which was 7.45 percent, plus four (4) percentage points.

Chapter 257, 1993 Session Laws, established an additional rate index for conventional loans or contracts for deed with a duration of ten years or less for financing the purchase of a time share interest in real estate otherwise regulated in *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 83, Subdivided Land. The maximum lawful rate will be the lesser of 15.75 percent per year or the rate established above for conventional loans and contracts for deed plus an additional three (3) percentage points. The rate for time share financing loans or contracts for July 1993 is fourteen and forty-five hundredths (14.45) percentage points.

IMPORTANT

This will be the last monthly rate publication by the Commerce Department. The 1993 session law repealed this rate publication requirement because the index is readily available to the public in *The Wall Street Journal* which carries the official publication of the Federal National Mortgage Association rates in its column entitled "Money Rates."

Notice of Solicitation of Outside Information or Opinions in the Matter of the Proposed Adoption of Rules Relating to Plumbers, Plumber's Apprentices, and Water Conditioning Contractors and Installers

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Department of Health is seeking information or opinions from sources outside the Department in preparing to revise existing *Minnesota Rules* relating to plumbers, plumber apprentices, and water conditioning contractors and installers. The department is considering amending the following rule parts:

Parts 4715.3140 to 4715.3170 relating to the registration of plumber's apprentices, experience requirements, and fees for examination, licensure and registration of plumbers and apprentices.

Part 4715.5000 to 4715.6000 relating to fees for licensing and examination of water conditioning contractors and installers.

The department is considering the specification in rule of specific experience requirements for plumber's apprentices who wish to become licensed, and an increase in fees for the plumber and water conditioner examinations and licenses.

Authority for the commissioner to adopt and amend rules relating to plumbers and plumber's apprentices, water conditioners, and fees is contained in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 16A.128; section 144.12, subdivision 1, clauses (2), (5), and (10); section 144.122, paragraph (a); sections 326.37 to 326.45; and sections 326.57 to 326.65.

However, department staff will be discussing changes to existing rules with the advisory council on plumbing code and examinations, and representatives of the Plumbing, Heating and Cooling Contractors Association, plumber's unions, the Minnesota Mechanical Contractor's Association, and the Water Quality Association.

Notice of Solicitation of Outside Information or Opinions Regarding Proposed Rule Governing MinnesotaCare

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the State Department of Human Services is seeking information or opinions from sources outside the agency in preparing to propose the adoption of the rule governing MinnesotaCare. The adoption of the rule is authorized by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 256.9352, subdivision 2, which requires the agency to adopt permanent rules to administer MinnesotaCare.

The rule will make permanent the MinnesotaCare emergency rule (*Minnesota Rules*, parts 9506.0010 to 9506.0110), effective December 28, 1992, which established access to comprehensive health care for children and adults. That rule instituted MinnesotaCare eligibility criteria; the application and premium payment processes; clarified covered health services; set out what information enrollees must provide to the agency; allowed the agency access to enrollees' medical records in order to monitor compliance; required coordination of MinnesotaCare and the medical assistance program; and allowed for an appeals process. The proposed permanent rule will: clarify premium calculations, due dates, overdue dates, and payment procedures; set out criteria to assess if a person has been uninsured for at least four months; set out criteria to assess if a person had access to subsidized health care through an employer, set out criteria to determine when enrollees must apply for medical assistance; establish procedures for determining terminations for non-cooperation with the medical assistance program; and clarify eligibility criteria for the recently enacted \$48.00 premium.

The State Department of Human Services requests information and opinions concerning the subject matter of the rule. Interested persons or groups may submit data or views on the subject matter of concern in writing or orally. The following organ and tissue transplant procedures will require prior authorization for dates of service on or after June 28, 1993, and are in addition to other prior authorization requirements for organ and tissue transplant procedures previously published in the *State Register*.

PRIOR AUTHORIZATION LIST:

As authorized by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 256B.0625, subdivision 25, the following organ and tissue transplant procedures require prior authorization as a condition of Medical Assistance or General Assistance Medical Care reimbursement, or, after July 1, 1993, MinnesotaCare reimbursement:

Public Notice Regarding Changes in the Medical Assistance (MA) Program and the General Assistance Medical Care Program (GAMC)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to recipients and providers of Minnesota Medical Assistance (MA) and to the public of certain changes affecting the MA program that were enacted by the 1993 Legislature. This notice is published pursuant to *Code of Federal Regulations*, Title 42, section 447.205. The purpose of this notice is to inform the public of changes in the MA program due to changes in State law. The changes to the MA program expected to result in an estimated net increase in MA expenditures of \$215 million for the 1994/1995 biennium. This notice also contains changes to the MinnesotaCare and General Assistance Medical Care (GAMC) programs that are of interest to providers and recipients.

The actual text of these changes are contained in 1993 Minnesota Session Laws, at the chapters cited below. Citations to Minnesota Session Laws refer to Chapter 1, First Special Session, unless otherwise noted.

- IX. ELDERLY WAIVER (EW), COMMUNITY ALTERNATIVES FOR DISABLED INDIVIDUALS (CADI), TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY (TBI) WAIVER, COMMUNITY ALTERNATIVE CARE (CAC).
- X. SENIORS AGENDA FOR INDEPENDENT LIVING (SAIL)
- XI. TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY PROGRAM
- XII. MINNESOTACARE CHANGES
- XIII. OTHER

Information related to implementation of these provisions will be sent to local human services agencies through instructional and informational bulletins and manual updates, to MA and GAMC recipients with their identification cards, and to health care providers through newsletters, bulletins and updates to the provider manuals.

HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES OMNIBUS APPROPRIATIONS BILL LAWS OF MINNESOTA 1993, FIRST SPECIAL SESSION, CHAPTER 1 (Unless otherwise noted)

I. MA AND GAMC ELIGIBILITY

- Effective July 1, 1993, MA eligibility for children receiving non-Title IV-E adoption assistance payments is not automatic, but must be based on a special medical or rehabilitative need. Article 5, §§ 30 and 115.
- Effective July 1, 1993, the exclusion of the homestead from countable assets for a person residing in a medical institution will continue beyond six months only if the person can be reasonably expected to return home as documented by a physician, and if the person can demonstrate that the cost of care will be met upon return home, through MA or other means. Article 5, § 31.
- Effective October 1, 1992, the MA personal needs allowance for the surviving spouse of a veteran with an improved pension, and who has no dependent children is increased to \$90 per month. Article 5, § 32.
- Effective July 1, 1994, the minimum amount of assets that may be retained by the spouse of a person residing in a medical institution will increase to \$20,000. Article 5, §§ 33 and 34.
- Effective July 1, 1993, or upon receipt of any necessary federal approval, whichever is later, changes will be made in the MA policies governing uncompensated transfers of assets. They are: (1) uncompensated transfers made within sixty months prior to application will result in a penalty; (2) the penalty for an uncompensated transfer will not be limited to thirty months loss of coverage and will include partial months of ineligibility (total transfers in one month up to \$1,000 shall be disregarded); (3) uncompensated transfers of assets that are not counted for purposes of MA eligibility will also be penalized, with certain exceptions; and (4) the penalty for an uncompensated transfer will be ineligibility for all MA services. Effective July 1, 1993, if one or more uncompensated transfers are made during a period of ineligibility, the uncompensated transfer amounts will be added together and the resulting penalty will begin with the month the first transfer was made. Article 5, §§ 35 and 130.
- Effective July 1, 1993, the statute governing claims against estates of former MA/GAMC recipients is amended to clarify that the claim includes the cost of alternative care services provided to MA/Elderly Waiver recipients. Article 5, § 82.
- Effective July 1, 1993, a lien against certain real property is established for the cost of MA services received by a person who resides in medical institution. Article 5, §§ 117 to 122.
- The interagency long-term care planning committee is required to study and report to the legislature regarding the feasibility of implementing a long-term care insurance program which would involve creating incentives to encourage the purchase of long-term care insurance. Article 5, § 125.
- Effective July 1, 1993, payments made by a MA applicant or recipient who is aged, blind or disabled, pursuant to a court order for child support shall be excluded from income in an amount not to exceed the difference between the MA income standard for aged, blind and disabled persons, and the MA income standard for families with children. A MA applicant or recipient who is eligible using the income methodology for families and children is allowed a full exclusion of court-ordered child support. Article 6, § 25.
- Undocumented aliens and nonimmigrant aliens are ineligible for GAMC, except for emergency services. This provision does not apply to children under age 18, Cuban or Haitian entrants, or aliens that are aged, blind or disabled. Article 6, § 28.
- The Department of Human Services is required to develop a "voluntary recognition of parentage" form, and educational materials for new parents that describes the benefits and effects of establishing paternity. Effective January 1, 1994, hospitals that provide obstetric services shall distribute the form and the educational materials to new parents and shall assist parents in understanding the form. Article 6, § 40.
- Current state law governing the enforceability of trusts that relate to public assistance is amended to allow enforceability of "special needs trusts"; and to clarify the effective date of a 1992 law declaring unenforceable clauses in trusts that make trust income or assets unavailable upon the beneficiary's eligibility for public assistance. Chapter 108.
- Effective July 1, 1993, the income standard for MA for pregnant women and infants less than one year of age is 275% of the federal poverty guidelines. The Department is required to request a waiver of federal medicaid law to require those pregnant women and infants with income between 185% and 275% of federal poverty to pay a premium equal to the premium charged for MinnesotaCare, and to increase the MA income standard for children between one and two years of age to 275% of the federal poverty guidelines. Chapter 345, article 9, §§ 11, 12, and 16.
- Effective July 1, 1993, assets are not counted in determining MA or GAMC eligibility for parents with MA or GAMC eligible children under age 21 living in the same household. Chapter 345, article 9, §§ 13 and 15.
- Effective July 1, 1993, persons who elect to pay their MA/GAMC spenddown amounts to the county in advance must make those payments by the 10th day of each month. Chapter 339, § 14.

II. MA SERVICES

- The Department of Human Services is required to request a waiver from federal medicaid law that would eliminate the need for certain attachments to invoices in order to encourage the use of electronic billing. Article 1, § 2.
- Effective July 1, 1993, MA covers child welfare case management services for children under age 21 who have been determined by the local agency to be at risk of out-of-home placement, maltreatment or in need of protection or services. Payment for case management services will be based on time-study data on activities of provider service staff and reports required under *Minnesota Statutes*, §§ 245.482, 256.01 and 256E.08 (1992). Article 3, §§ 23 and 24.
- Effective July 1, 1993, MA drug formulary committee members may serve three year terms and may be reappointed once. Recommendations for appointment to the committee may be considered from all professional medical and pharmacist associations. This provision also clarifies that the authority of a pharmacy provider to require an MA recipient with a spenddown to pay for services to the extent of the spenddown amount, under certain conditions, exists until the on-line, real-time pharmacy claims adjudication system is in place. Article 5, § 40.
- Effective July 1, 1993, the MA drug utilization review board members shall be selected from lists submitted by all professional medical and pharmacist associations. Article 5, § 41.
- Effective May 28, 1993, MA covers heart-lung transplants for persons with primary pulmonary hypertension and performed at Minnesota transplant centers meeting united network for organ sharing criteria to perform heart-lung transplants; lung transplants using cadaveric donors and performed at Minnesota transplant centers meeting united network for organ sharing criteria to perform lung transplants; pancreas transplants for uremic diabetic recipients of kidney transplants and performed at Minnesota facilities meeting united network for organ sharing criteria to perform pancreas transplants; and allogeneic bone marrow transplants for persons with stage III or IV Hodgkin's disease. Transplant centers must meet American Society of Hematology and Clinical Oncology criteria for bone marrow transplants and be located in Minnesota to receive reimbursement for bone marrow transplants. Also, the Commissioner of Human Services has authority to add MA/GAMC coverage for new transplant procedures if the new procedures are recommended by the Advisory Committee on Organ and Tissue Transplants and by the Commissioner. Article 5, §§ 45 and 55.
- Effective July 1, 1993, MA covers services performed by a certified obstetric/gynecological nurse practitioner in independent practice if those services are otherwise covered as a physician service, and if the service is within the scope of practice in the nurse practitioner's license. Article 5, § 46.
- Effective July 1, 1993, public health nursing services includes services provided by a registered nurse practicing in a public health nursing clinic. Article 5, § 47.
- Effective July 1, 1993, previously uncodified law requiring MA and GAMC coverage and payment for services provided by American Indian Health Service facilities is now codified at *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.0625, subd. 33. Article 5, § 49.
- Effective July 1, 1993, GAMC covers services performed by certified pediatric, family, adult, OB/GYN or geriatric nurse practitioner in independent practice, if the services are otherwise covered under chapter 256D, and if the service is within the nurse practitioner's license to practice. Article 5, § 113.
- Effective July 1, 1993, the definition of a "person with serious and persistent mental illness" is clarified regarding documentation of a written opinion by a mental health professional. Article 7, § 3.
- Effective August 1, 1993, law governing MA/GAMC coverage for nutritional supplement products is amended to clarify that these products are covered when solid food or nutrients thereof cannot be absorbed properly by the body, and to establish a nutritional supplementation products advisory committee to review and recommend products that require prior authorization. Also, the MA/GAMC drug formulary is amended to include coverage for over-the-counter vitamins for adults with documented vitamin deficiencies. Chapter 246.
- Requires the Commissioner to request appropriate waivers of federal Medicare and Medicaid law in order to provide MA and Medicare coverage through Integrated Service Networks. Chapter 345, article 5, § 14.
- Current law requires a vendors of medical care and health maintenance organizations (HMOs) to participate as a provider or contractor in the MA, GAMC and MinnesotaCare Programs as a condition of participating as a provider in health insurance plans or contractor for state employees under *Minnesota Statutes*, § 43A.18, public employees insurance plan under *Minnesota Statutes*, § 43A.316, the workers' compensation system under *Minnesota Statutes*, § 176.135, and the Minnesota comprehensive health association plans under *Minnesota Statutes*, §§ 62E.01 to 62E.17. This law was amended effective July 1, 1993 to require that participating as a provider for health insurance plans offered to local statutory or home rule charter cities, counties and school district employees is also conditioned upon participation in MA, GAMC and MinnesotaCare. This law was also amended to provide that limitations on insurance plans offered to local government employees shall not be applicable in geographic areas where provider participation is limited by managed care contracts with the department of human services. Chapter 345, article 9, § 14.
- Effective July 1, 1994 or when necessary waivers are granted, whichever is later, the Commissioner is authorized to conduct

a demonstration project to contract, on a prospective, per capita payment basis, with a nonprofit health service plan corporation or a health maintenance organization for the provision of all dental care services under the MA, GAMC and MinnesotaCare Programs. Article 5, § 27.

III. MA AND GAMC PAYMENT RATES

- Effective July 1, 1993, if federal financial participation in MA is reduced due to lack of compliance with provider tax law and regulation, the commissioner must appeal the reduction and may rateably reduce all MA and GAMC payments by a like amount to eliminate the shortfall. Amounts later recovered through appeal must be used to reimburse providers for any rateable reductions taken. Article 1, § 2.
- Effective July 1, 1993, previously uncodified law providing the Commissioner to estimate the 50th percentile of the prevailing charge for the relevant base year in determining certain provider payment rates is now codified. Article 5, § 50.
- Effective July 1, 1993, MA/GAMC payments for masters-prepared mental health professionals shall be 75% of the rate for doctoral-prepared professionals, and effective July 1, 1994, shall be 80% of the rate for doctoral-prepared professionals. Article 1, § 2.
- Effective for prescription drugs provided on or after January 1, 1994, the MA "actual acquisition cost" cost of a drug shall be estimated by the commissioner at average wholesale price minus 7.6%. Chapter 345, article 13, § 1.
- For admissions occurring during the 1994/1995 biennium, MA payments for inpatient hospital services shall be increased by 9% for a children's hospital, which is defined as a hospital that is engaged in furnishing services to inpatients who are predominantly under 18 years of age. MA inpatient hospital payments are increased by 6% for a public hospital with calendar year 1991 noncapitation MA inpatient dollar volume in excess of 13% of total calendar year 1991 noncapitation MA inpatient dollar volume. MA inpatient hospital payments are increased by 3% for a teaching hospital operated by the University of Minnesota having calendar year 1991 noncapitation MA inpatient dollar volume in excess of 8% of total calendar year 1991 noncapitation MA dollar volume. Article 1, § 2.
- Effective July 1, 1993, previously uncodified law governing MA payments for services provided by physical and occupational therapy assistants is now codified. Article 1, § 2.
- Effective July 1, 1993, previously uncodified law governing MA payments for anesthesiology services is now codified. Article 5, §§ 36 and 39.
- The Commissioner of Human Services is required to conduct a study and report the results to the Legislature by February 1, 1994 on developing a Medicaid inpatient hospital payment system similar to current Medicare methodology. The Commissioner must also develop a plan to combine the MA reimbursement system with the reimbursement system to be developed by the health care commission. Article 1, § 2.
- Effective July 1, 1993, the Commissioner may not adjust hospital reimbursement rates to provide a new hospital payment for short length of stay mental health patients without the prior approval of the legislature unless the adjustment will result in budget savings. Article 1, § 2.
- Effective for services provided on or after July 1, 1993, the MA payment rate for ambulance services will be increased by 3%.
- Effective for services provided on or after July 1, 1993, the MA payment rate for special transportation services is increased to \$14 per trip and \$1.10 per mile. Article 5, § 43.
- Effective July 1, 1993, the Commissioner may seek federal waivers necessary to implement an integrated management and planning system for persons with mental retardation or related conditions that would achieve comprehensive reform, service access and coordination, and reduce duplicative paperwork. Article 4, § 12.
- Effective July 1, 1993, for MA and GAMC denials of inpatient hospital coverage due to lack of medical necessity, a physician or hospital may appeal the result of the administrative reconsideration process by submitting a written request for review to the commissioner within 30 days after receiving notice of the action. The commissioner shall review the appeal and issue an order upholding or reversing the decision. A hospital or physician who is aggrieved by an order of the commissioner may appeal the order to the district court of the county in which the physician or hospital is located by serving a written copy of the notice of appeal upon the commissioner within 30 days after the date the commissioner issued the order. Article 5, § 17.
- For inpatient hospital admissions occurring during the biennium ending June 30, 1995, the MA hospital cost index shall be limited to five percent under the MA program, including small rural hospitals, and the one percentage point increase for MA to reflect changes in technology is eliminated. Article 5, § 18.
- Effective for July 1, 1993, for MA inpatient hospital payments, cost outlier payments for each diagnostic category are eliminated. Article 5, § 19.

- For admissions on or after July 1, 1993, a disproportionate share payment is established in the amount of \$1,010,000 due on the 15th of each month, beginning July 15, 1993 for a hospital that (i) had MA fee-for-service payment volume during calendar year 1991 in excess of 13 percent of total MA fee-for-service payment volume; or (ii) had MA fee-for-service payment volume during calendar year 1991 in excess of eight percent of total MA fee-for-service payment volume and is affiliated with the University of Minnesota. Article 5, § 20.

- For admissions on or after July 1, 1993, an inpatient hospital payment adjust is established that is equal to the disproportionate share payment. Payments under this section are reduced by the disproportionate share payment. Article 5, § 24.

- For admissions on or after July 1, 1994 or the implementation of the new Medicaid Management Information System (MMIS), whichever is later, the Commissioner is required to establish hospital peer groups, and limit MA and GAMC payments to each hospital by the limit established for its peer group. These limits must be established so that the statewide payment level is reduced by 10% under MA and 15% under GAMC. The commissioner is required to establish a task force to assist the commissioner in developing a peer grouping plan and report to the Legislature. Article 5, §§ 25 and 126.

- For admissions occurring on or after July 1, 1992, the Commissioner is required to adjust payment rates established after the implementation of the new MMIS to compensate for the rebasing of payment rates on July 1, 1992. The adjustment must be determined using claim specific payment changes that result from the rebased rates and revised methodology in effect after the MMIS upgrade. Any adjustment that is greater than zero shall be rateably reduced by 20%. Hospitals are required to revise claims so that services provided by rehabilitation distinct parts are reported separately. The payment adjustments shall be in effect until the amount due to or owed by the hospital is fully paid over a number of admissions that is equal to the number of admissions under adjustment multiplied by 1.5. The statute also defines the time periods and the base years for which the adjustment shall be made. Article 5, § 26.

- Effective for services provided on or after July 1, 1993, when an MA or GAMC recipient has other accident or health care coverage, MA or GAMC payment will not be made when either covered charges are paid in fully by a third party or the provider has an agreement to accept payment for less than charges as payment in full. Payment for recipients with third party coverage will be determined as the lesser of: (1) the patient liability according to the provider/insurance agreement; (2) the covered charge minus the third party payment amount; or (3) the relevant MA or GAMC rate minus the third party payment amount. A negative difference will not be implemented. Article 5, §§ 88, 89 and 114.

- Effective for services provided on or after July 1, 1993, MA payments are increased by 38% for rehabilitation services provided by an entity that operates both a Medicare certified comprehensive outpatient rehabilitation facility and a facility which was certified prior to January 1, 1993, that is licensed under *Minnesota Rules*, parts 9570.2000 to 9570.3600, and for whom at least 33% of the clients receiving rehabilitation services in the most recent calendar year are MA recipients. This increase affects only those services provided within the comprehensive outpatient rehabilitation facility and provided to residents of nursing facilities owned by the entity. Article 5, § 123.

- Effective for services provided on or after July 1, 1994, payment rates for the following services shall be increased by 3%: nursing services and home health aide services under § 256B.0625, subd. 6a; personal care services and nursing supervision of personal care services under § 256B.0625, subd. 19a; private duty nursing services under § 256B.0625, subd. 7; home and community-based services waiver for persons with mental retardation and related conditions under § 256B.501; community alternatives for disabled individuals waiver under § 256B.49; community alternative care waiver under § 256B.49; home- and community-based services waiver for the elderly under § 256B.0915; alternative care program under § 256B.0913; traumatic brain injury waiver under § 256B.093; adult residential program grants, under rule 12, under *Minnesota Rules*, parts 9535.2000 to 9535.3000; adult and family community support grants under rules 14 and 78, under *Minnesota Rules*, parts 9535.1700 to 9535.1760; day training and habilitation services for adults with mental retardation and related conditions under § 252.40 to 252.47; and semi-independent living services under § 252.275. Article 1, § 2.

IV. LONG TERM CARE SERVICES AND PAYMENTS

Nursing Facilities. *Minnesota Statutes* regulating Nursing Facilities were amended in several sections of the law. The general areas affecting nursing facilities include: the moratorium law, reserve bed days, facility inflation, the surcharge, the nursing operating and property costs, facility certified audits, and rate appeals.

- Effective July 1, 1993, the reserve bed day payment rate was reduced to 79 percent of the Medical Assistance payment rate. Article 5, § 92.

- Effective July 1, 1993, a change in the facility Short Length of Stay definition, with a one year grandfather for those currently receiving that benefit. Article 5, § 91.

- Effective July 1, 1993, certain IRS employee pension plans as well as certain workers compensation self-insurance plans will be recognized as allowed costs. Article 5, § 97.

- Effective July 1, 1993, the maximum efficiency incentive will remain at \$2.20 for State Fiscal Year (FY) 1994, and a new

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progressive, savings sharing efficiency incentive was adopted for FY 1995 with a maximum of \$2.44. The new efficiency incentive is effective July 1, 1994. Article 5, § 99.

- Effective July 1, 1993, a per diem payment of eight cents for unfunded federal mandates will be added to each facility's case mix rates. Article 5, § 97.
- Effective July 1, 1993, the facility administrative cost limit for larger facilities was made more restrictive. Article 5, § 97.
- Effective July 1, 1993, the sale of a nursing facility between "close relatives", and within federal limits is permitted. Article 5, § 94.
- Effective July 1, 1993, a base property rate change is permitted for a qualifying facility. Article 5, § 101.
- Effective July 1, 1993, a modification to the capital repairs provision requiring such expenditures to be greater than \$500 per bed. Article 5, § 95.
- Effective July 1, 1993, all recomputations of the facility's rental rate, whether that rate increases or decreases will change the facility's property-related payment rate. Article 5, § 97.
- Effective July 1, 1993, a modification to the maximum therapy rent computation was enacted. Article 5, § 102.
- Effective July 1, 1993, the law significantly revised the Nursing Home Moratorium law, and added four new moratorium exceptions which are: (1) permits the conversion of 4 bed wards to single or double bedrooms in a 115 bed county facility; (2) permits 106 bed layaway project for a facility that is closing; (3) permits the expansion of a previously approved moratorium project; and, (4) permits the layaway of 30 beds in a 368 bed facility, and the possible transfer of those beds to other nursing home owned by the same provider upon approval of the Health Department. The Moratorium Review Process was also refined to place a cap on project cost overruns. Article 5, §§ 2 to 5.
- Effective July 1, 1993, a technical change was made in the provisions dealing with indexing certain thresholds correcting cross references. Article 5, § 96.
- Effective July 1, 1993, the conditions of participation were changed expanding the prohibition against requiring residents to utilize facility vendors of any type. Article 5, § 103.
- Effective July 1, 1993, an appeal resolution process was established for the resolution of certain outstanding appeals. Article 5, § 108.
- Effective July 1, 1993, modification of provisions relating to property rate adjustments for construction projects. Chapter 339, § 20.
- Effective July 1, 1993, technical clarification to the Department's authority to make reasoned assumptions in proposing audit adjustments. Chapter 339, § 21.
- Beginning in 1994, the commissioner shall pay a nursing home payment adjustment on May 31 to a county in which is located a nursing home that, as of January 1 of the previous year, was county-owned and had over 40 beds and MA occupancy in excess of 50 percent during the reporting year ending 9/30/91. The payment adjustment is an amount equal to \$16 per calendar day multiplied by the number of beds licensed in the facility as of 9/30/91. Payments under this section are excluded from MA per diem rate calculations. A facility receiving a payment adjustment under this section may not increase charges to private pay residents by an amount equivalent to the per diem amount payments under this paragraph would equal if converted to a per diem. Article 5, § 98.

ICFs/MR and Nursing Facilities. Technical statutory amendments made which affect the program administration both Nursing Facilities and ICFs/MR are as follows:

- Effective July 1, 1993, the customary annual inflationary adjustment was provided for both Nursing Facilities and ICFs/MR. Article 1, § 2.
- Effective July 1, 1993, both ICFs/MR and Nursing Facilities are required to maintain in greater detail supporting documentation regarding all employee time and attendance records. Article 5, § 101.
- Effective July 1, 1993, modified the central office cost allocation statute so that the ratio of total operating expenses is used. Article 5, § 100.
- Effective July 1, 1993, certified audits are no longer required, but if completed in compliance with past requirements and submitted remain a reimbursable cost. Article 5, §§ 104 and 111.
- Effective July 1, 1993, a new appeals project was authorized in a effort to speed-up the resolution of rate appeals. Also, some technical changes were made regarding the appeal filing date. Article 5, §§ 106 and 107.

ICFs/MR. Laws 1993, First Special Session, Chapter 1, also included changes which affect Intermediate Care Facilities for the Mentally Retarded (ICF/MR) MA reimbursement. The following riders were in Article 1, § 2, of the bill:

- Effective July 1, 1993, the mortgage equity requirement can be waived during fiscal year 1994 where the interest rate does not exceed state agency tax exempt financing. Article 1, § 2.
 - Effective July 1, 1993, and during fiscal year 1994, a facility in receivership that is sold to an un-related organization can be considered a new facility for rate setting purposes, and that facility's purchase price is limited to the historical cost of the prior owner's cost for physical plant, land, and land improvements. Article 1, § 2.
 - Effective July 1, 1993, authority was granted for the Commissioner to conduct a two year study individual compensation of providers of DD services, and report the results to the legislature. Article 1, § 2.
 - Effective July 1, 1993, authority was granted for the Commissioner to establish a pilot project in Cottonwood County to downsize a 45 beds facility to 21 beds. Article 1, § 2.
- Minnesota Statutes* regulating Intermediate Care Facilities for the Mentally Retarded (ICF/MR) were amended. The general areas affecting ICFs/MR reimbursement include: the client based reimbursement mandate, changes in the facility's operating and property payments, employee wage adjustment review process, and special needs funding.
- Effective October 1, 1993, the mandate to implement the client based reimbursement system was eliminated, however, the client assessment system continues. Article 5, §§ 109 and 110.
 - Effective October 1, 1993, certain IRS employee pension plans as well as certain workers compensation self-insurance plans will be recognized as allowed costs. Article 5, § 111.
 - Effective October 1, 1993, the maximum efficiency incentive was reduced from \$2.00 to \$1.50. Article 5, § 111.
 - Effective October 1, 1993, the capital debt reduction allowance above \$.50 was reduced by 25 percent. Article 5, § 111.
 - Effective October 1, 1993, the required annual review the 1½ percent wage adjustment was extended to a two year review. Article 5, § 112.
 - Effective July 1, 1993, the special needs program was modified to permit greater flexibility in the annual cap on hours of service. Chapter 339, § 22.

V. CHANGES TO PROVIDER SURCHARGE

- Effective July 1, 1993, the nursing facility surcharge will increase to \$620, and effective July 1, 1994, it will increase to \$625. Also, if the number of licensed beds is reduced, the surcharge shall be based on the number of remaining licensed beds the second month following the receipt of timely notice by the Commissioner of Human Services that beds have been delicensed. Nursing homes are required to notify the Commissioner of Health in writing when beds are delicensed. Article 5, § 11.
- Effective the day following enactment, a surcharge disclosure statement is required on resident billings for non-Medical Assistance nursing homes. Article 5, § 131.
- The physician license surcharge applies to a physician who is licensed as of or after October 1, 1992 and whose license is issued or renewed on or after April 1, 1992. Article 5, § 6.
- Upon application or notice of license renewal, the Board of Medical Practice must notify the applicant of any additional fees, surcharges, or other costs which the person is obligated to pay as a condition of licensure, and advise the applicant of the right to apply to be excused from the surcharge or relinquish the right to practice medicine. Article 5, § 7.
- The Commissioner is required to request a waiver from federal law to exclude from the physician surcharge certain physicians. Article 5, § 12.
- The Commissioners of Human Services and Revenue shall study and recommend to the legislature by 1/15/94 a plan to replace the physician license surcharge with a surcharge on the tax levied under § 295.52. Article 5, § 127.
- Effective July 1, 1994, the hospital surcharge is increased to 1.56% of net patient revenues excluding net Medicare revenues reported by that provider to the health care cost information system. Article 5, § 14.
- The law governing the HMO surcharge is amended to clarify the definition of "total premium revenue." This section is intended to clarify, rather than to change, the original intent of the statutes amended. Article 5, §§ 15 and 129.
- Effective July 1, 1993, the Commissioner of Human Services has the power to abate penalties and interest for violations of the surcharge laws when discrepancies occur resulting from circumstances of error and mail delivery. This section also establishes authority to bring appropriate civil actions to collect provider payments due under § 256.9567 and § 147.01, subd. 6. Article 5, § 16.
- From July 1, 1993 through June 30, 1994, Hennepin County is required to transfer to the Commissioner an amount equal to 1.8% of the public hospital's net patient revenues, excluding net Medicare revenue. Effective July 1, 1994, Hennepin County and the University of Minnesota are required to transfer on a monthly basis an amount equal to 1.8% of the public hospital's net patient revenues, excluding net Medicare revenue. Article 5, § 84.

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- Effective July 1, 1993, Hennepin County and the University of Minnesota are required to make a monthly payment to the Commissioner of \$1,000,000 before noon on the 15th of each month. Article 5, § 85.

- Beginning in 1994, each of the governmental units designated in this paragraph shall transfer before noon on May 31 to the Commissioner an amount equal to the number of licensed beds in any nursing home owned by the county multiplied by \$5,723. These governmental units are the counties of Becker, Beltrami, Clearwater, Cook, Dodge, Hubbard, Itasca, Lake, Mahnomon, Pennington, Pipestone, Ramsey, St. Louis, Steele, Todd, Traverse, and Wadena. Article 5, § 86.

VI. PRIOR AUTHORIZATION FOR MEDICAL ASSISTANCE HOME CARE

- Effective July 1, 1993, DHS is authorized to waive the requirement that a personal care assistant (PCA) be employed by an agency when services are provided under a relative hardship waiver and at least two agencies have refused to employ or contract with the PCA. Article 5, § 28.

- Effective July 1, 1993, MA covers home health services, private duty nursing, and PCA services for residents of institutions if the resident is on leave from the facility and the facility pays for the home health services or forgoes the per diem for those days. Article 5, § 36.

- Effective July 1, 1993, the supervisory nurse for home care services is required to develop the plan of care, and must provide patient with a copy within 30 days. Article 5, § 51.

- Effective July 1, 1993, personal care covered services are expanded to include delegated therapy tasks, ambulation, assisting monitoring or prompting the recipient, and redirection and intervention for behavior and seizure disorders. Coverage for personal care services provided by a residence for more than four persons and services that are the responsibility of the program license holder under the services agreement are prohibited. Article 5, § 52.

- Effective July 1, 1993, up to two assessments by a supervising nurse are allowed without prior authorization each year. The home care provider must conduct a face-to-face assessment initially and at least annually thereafter. Article 5, § 53.

- Effective July 1, 1993, the Commissioner may authorize an added 12 months of services when the supervising nurse reviews the case with the department and the recipient displays no significant change. Home health aide and nurse visits are limited to no more than one visit each per day. Article 5, § 53.

- Effective July 1, 1993, the prior authorization for home care services is based on a home care rating which includes a combination of assessment tools and specific criteria for complex behaviors. Behaviors are classified and defined at two levels. Criteria for authorizing maximum levels of private duty nursing services are defined. Article 5, § 53.

- Authorization for home care services is not valid prior to that date the commissioner receives the request. The Commissioner must provide a detailed explanation of why services are reduced. Temporary approval via telephone may be given for a period which does not exceed 45 days. Article 5, § 53.

- Effective July 1, 1993, the Commissioner is authorized to employ registered nurses and support staff to provide prior authorization for MA home care services. Article 5, § 54.

VII. PREADMISSION SCREENING (PAS)

- Effective July 1, 1993, payment for PAS to counties not participating in SAIL projects is the greater of FY 1993 payment or the county's FY 1993 estimate. Payment for counties participating in SAIL projects that did not receive inflation adjustment in FY 1993 receive a one-time 5% inflation adjustment to the FY 1993 payment. Payment for FY 1995 is the same as FY 1994. Article 5, § 60.

- Effective July 1, 1993, all persons entering a nursing facility are required to be screened and approved for admission. Time requirements for screenings are defined and telephone or face-to-face screenings are authorized. MA payment to nursing facilities is made only if screening has been conducted prior to admission; exceptions are defined. Article 5, § 56.

- Effective July 1, 1993, the Commissioner of DHS must apply for a waiver to allow screening team to approve MA reimbursement for nursing facility care. Article 5, 61.

VIII. ALTERNATIVE CARE (AC)

- Effective July 1, 1993, MA asset transfer restrictions apply to AC clients. Residential care services is added to AC covered services and defined. Assisted living services are redefined. Payment rates for residential care and assisted living services are negotiated by the county and rate limits are defined. Client premiums are clarified. Article 5, §§ 62, 64 and 65.

- Effective July 1, 1993, the county biennial plan for PAS, AC, Elderly Waiver (EW), and CADI shall be incorporated into the biennial CSSA plan. Article 5, § 66.

- Effective July 1, 1993, AC rate limits remain the same as FY 1993 with the exception of those counties whose rates are less than 60% of the maximum rate for individual AC services; those counties rates will increase to the 60% level. Effective July 1, 1994,

AC rate limits remain the same as FY 1994, but are subject to a 65% factor. Article 5, § 67.

- Effective July 1, 1993, the maximum rate for home delivered meals is increased to \$4.50 per meal. Article 5, § 67.

IX. ELDERLY WAIVER (EW), COMMUNITY ALTERNATIVES FOR DISABLED INDIVIDUALS (CADI), TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY (TBI) WAIVER, COMMUNITY ALTERNATIVE CARE (CAC).

• By December 31, 1993, the Commissioner shall request an amendment to the elderly waiver to revise the standards for case management as a waiver service. If the Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA) does not approve the waiver, DHS must amend the state plan to use administrative funds for EW case management. Article 5, § 71.

• Effective July 1, 1993, elderly waiver rate limits remain the same as FY 1993 with the exception of those counties whose rates are less than 60% of the maximum rate for individual elderly waiver services; those counties rates will increase to the 60% level. Effective July 1, 1994, elderly waiver rate limits remain the same as FY 1994, but are subject to a 65% factor. Article 5, § 72.

• Effective July 1, 1993, the Commissioner shall amend the CAC waiver to allow persons over age 65 to be served under the waiver if they are at risk of an acute care hospital. Article 5, § 105.

X. SENIORS AGENDA FOR INDEPENDENT LIVING (SAIL)

• Effective July 1, 1993, the six SAIL projects may be continued. A local long term care strategy is required, which increases clients serviced under AC, resulting in a reduction of MA nursing facility caseload. A report on the continuation and expansion of the SAIL strategy is required by 2/15/95. Article 5, §§ 73 to 79.

XI. TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY PROGRAM

• Effective July 1, 1993, the TBI advisory committee is limited to no more than 30 members to serve two year terms. The Commissioner shall investigate the need for rules or statutes for the TBI waiver and for TBI services not covered by any other statutes or rule. Article 5, §§ 80 and 81.

• Effective July 1, 1993, the TBI program is authorized to coordinate the TBI waiver and the case managers are authorized to approve TBI waiver care plans. Article 5, §§ 80 and 81.

XII. MINNESOTACARE CHANGES

• Effective July 1, 1993, children who are one year of age or older but less than 18 years of age, who have gross family incomes that are equal to or less than 150% of the federal poverty guidelines, who are not eligible for MA, and who are not otherwise insured for the covered services, are eligible for MinnesotaCare by paying a \$48 annual premium. Chapter 345, article 9, §§ 4, 5 and 7.

• Effective July 1, 1993, children not eligible under the paragraph above, parents and dependent siblings residing in the same household, who are not eligible for MA who have gross family incomes that are equal to or less than approximately 275% of the federal poverty guidelines, and who meet the insurance criteria, are eligible for premiums on a sliding scale. Chapter 345, article 9, §§ 5 and 7.

• Effective July 1, 1993, enrollees must apply for and cooperate with MA by the last day of the third month following admission to an inpatient hospital. Enrollees and their families who do not apply for and cooperate with MA are disenrolled, and may not reenroll. Chapter 345, article 9, § 3.

• Effective July 1, 1993, applicants potentially eligible for MA shall be allowed to enroll in MinnesotaCare for a period of 60 days, so long as the applicant meets all other conditions of eligibility. The applicants must apply for and cooperate with the county social service agency in determining MA within the 60 day period. Enrollees and their families who do not apply for and cooperate with MA are disenrolled. Chapter 345, article 9, § 5.

• To be eligible for MinnesotaCare, individuals must cooperate with the state agency in obtaining third party payments. Chapter 247, article 4, § 5.

• The effective date of coverage for eligible newborns or newly adopted children is the date of entry into the family. The effective date of coverage for other new recipients added to the family is the first day of the month following the month in which eligibility is approved and the first premium payment has been received. Chapter 247, article 4, § 6.

• Effective July 1, 1993, adult dental care will only include preventive services. Chapter 345, article 9, § 3.

• Effective July 1, 1993, outpatient mental health services covered include diagnostic assessments, psychological testing, explanation of findings, day treatment, partial hospitalization, individual, family and group psychotherapy, and medication management. There are no longer annual dollar caps on these services, however they are subject to the same payment rates and conditions as the same services under MA. Chapter 345, article 9, § 3.

• Effective July 1, 1993, covered health services shall include individual outpatient treatment of alcohol or drug dependency by a qualified health professional or outpatient program, so long as the enrollee is assessed for treatment by a local agency, and placed

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for treatment by the local agency or managed care plan under contract to DHS pursuant to *Minnesota Rules*, parts 9530.6600 to 9530.6660. These services are no longer subject to a cap of 10 hours per year. Chapter 345, article 9, § 3.

- Effective July 1, 1993, covered health services shall include inpatient hospital services, including inpatient hospital mental health services and inpatient hospital and residential chemical dependency treatment. The inpatient hospital benefit level for adults is subject to an annual benefit limit of \$10,000. Adults shall pay a copayment of 10% of the submitted charge, up to a maximum out-of-pocket expense for inpatient hospital of \$1,000 per person or \$3,000 per family per year. Chapter 345, article 9, § 3.

- Effective July 1, 1993, covered health services shall include hospice care services. Chapter 345, article 9, § 3.

- Effective July 1, 1993, services provided by federally qualified health centers, rural health clinics, and facilities of the Indian Health Service shall be paid for according to the same rates and conditions applicable to the same service provided by providers that are not federally qualified health centers, rural health clinics, and facilities of the Indian Health Service. Chapter 345, article 9, § 9.

- Effective July 1, 1993, the MA rate for inpatient hospital services means the rates established under section 256.9685 to 256.9695 for providing inpatient hospital services to MA recipients who receive aid to families with dependent children. Chapter 345, article 9, § 9.

- When the state agency provides, pays for, or becomes liable for covered health services, the agency has a lien for the cost of those service upon any and all causes of action accruing to the enrollee, or the enrollee's legal representatives, as a result of the occurrence that necessitated the payment for the covered services. Liens are subject to the same provisions as MA liens. Chapter 247, article 4, § 4.

- Effective July 1, 1993, the Commissioner is authorized to provide MinnesotaCare services through contracts with prepaid capitation plans, including Integrated Service Networks. The new law sets forth procedural requirements for these contracts. Chapter 345, article 9, § 10.

- Chapter 345, article 9, § 9 defines MinnesotaCare payments for inpatient hospital services in situations where a patient has a copayment or the patient's benefit limit has been reached. Effective July 1, 1993.

XIII. OTHER

- Effective July 1, 1993, maximum rate limits for new day training and habilitation services or existing day training and habilitation services seeking a rate variance are 95% of 125 of the statewide median rates or 125% of the regional average rates, whichever is larger. In some cases, the maximum rate determined can be a weighted average rate with new clients with very severe medical or behavioral challenges, or clients being discharged from a regional treatment center assigned a rate equal to 200% of the statewide median rates for purposes of determining the weighted average. Article 4, § 6.

- Effective July 1, 1993, no insurer providing benefits under policies covered by 62A.045 shall use eligibility for MA, GAMC or MinnesotaCare as a reason to deny or reduce benefits, or as an underwriting guideline or reason for nonacceptance of the risk. Article 5, § 1.

- Effective July 1, 1993, when a "party to a claim" has an obligation to notify the Commissioner of its potential claim for MA or GAMC costs under §§ 256.015, 256B.042, subd. 4, 256B.37, subd. 3, and 256D.03, subd. 8, a party to claim is amended to include the plaintiff, the defendants, and any other party to the cause of action. Article 5, §§ 9, 29, 87 and 114.

The proposed regional trail addition is called the "Birch Lake Regional Bikeway/Walkway". - Metropolitan Parks and Open Space Commission reviews trail master plan and associated draft amendment to *Recreation Open Space Development Guide/Policy Plan*—late June.
- Metropolitan Council adopts public hearing draft/late July.
- Metropolitan Council Committee of the Whole conducts public hearing—September.
- Metropolitan Council Committee of the Whole considers public hearing report and staff recommendations—late September.
- Metropolitan Council considers Committee of the Whole recommendations—October.

The Minnesota Housing Finance Agency (MHFA) and the Housing Trust Fund Advisory Committee (HTFAC) announce the availability of \$1,300,000 in loan funds to eligible sponsors to assist them in the development, construction, acquisition, preservation and rehabilitation of affordable rental housing, limited equity cooperative housing, and homes for ownership by low income persons. These funds were generated by interest earnings on real estate brokers' trust accounts; interest accrued on revenue bond application fees and forfeited fees; and state appropriated funds.

FORM OF FUNDS: Funds are awarded to projects in the form of a zero interest deferred loan. To encourage the long term affordability of the housing provided under this program, a thirty year repayment schedule is used. The loan must be repaid in full if the project fails to operate as affordable housing for low income persons during the first ten years of the loan. During the next twenty years, five percent of the loan is forgiven each year provided that the housing remains affordable for low income persons and families.

SET ASIDE: Up to twenty percent (approximately \$260,000) of the total funds available may be used for projects that are not compatible with the 30 year repayment schedule. Within the twenty percent set aside, up to \$130,000 will be available for home ownership projects. The MHFA's and the HTFAC's intent is to use this set aside of funds to encourage innovative proposals which would otherwise not be possible to fund given the 30 year use commitment. Applications submitted under the set aside will be evaluated with all applications received in response to the Request for Proposals.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS: Eligible applicants are individuals, for-profit entities, nonprofit entities, Minnesota Cities, joint power boards established by two or more cities, and Housing and Redevelopment Authorities.

ELIGIBLE PROJECTS: The legislation requires that the funds from the trust fund account be used "to provide loans or grants for projects for the development, construction, acquisition, preservation, and rehabilitation of low income rental and limited equity cooperative housing units and homes for ownership. At least 75 percent of the rental and cooperative housing units, and 100 percent of the homes for ownership in the development or all of the units funded by the housing trust fund account, must be rented to or cooperatively owned, or owned by persons and families whose income does not exceed 30 percent of the median family income for the metropolitan area." (*Minnesota Statutes*, Section 462A.201, Subdivision 2, as amended.) As of February 1993, 30 percent of the Minneapolis/St. Paul area median income was \$14,880.

It is the desire of the MHFA and the HTFAC to use the Housing Trust Fund Housing Program to encourage and support innovative approaches to housing problems which provide affordable housing with strong local support. It is expected that these funds will be used to leverage other funds or to provide the final piece of a financing package. They can be used in conjunction with other MHFA, State, or Federal programs as appropriate.

The range of Housing Trust Fund awards from the smallest to the largest has been \$3,000 to \$150,000. The MHFA will not be accepting applications for proposals whose primary purpose is lead based paint abatement.
