

Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the *State Register*

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 75 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific *Minnesota Rule* chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the *Minnesota Rules* are published. This is a ten-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Proposed and adopted emergency rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

If an agency seeks outside opinion before issuing new rules or rule amendments, it must publish a NOTICE OF INTENT TO SOLICIT OUTSIDE OPINION in the *Official Notices* section of the *State Register*. When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues 1-13 inclusive; issues 14-25 inclusive; issue 26, cumulative for issues 1-26; issues 27-38 inclusive; issue 39, cumulative for 1-39; issues 40-51 inclusive; and issue 52, cumulative for 1-52. An annual subject matter index for rules appears in August. 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Proposed Rules

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. §14.22, an agency may propose to adopt, amend, suspend or repeal rules without first holding a public hearing, as long as the agency determines that the rules will be noncontroversial in nature. The agency must first publish a notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing, together with the proposed rules, in the *State Register*. The notice must advise the public:

1. that they have 30 days in which to submit comment on the proposed rules;
2. that no public hearing will be held unless 25 or more persons make a written request for a hearing within the 30-day comment period;
3. of the manner in which persons shall request a hearing on the proposed rules; and
4. that the rule may be modified if the modifications are supported by the data and views submitted

If, during the 30-day comment period, 25 or more persons submit to the agency a written request for a hearing of the proposed rules, the agency must proceed under the provisions of §§14.14-14.20, which state that if an agency decides to hold a public hearing, it must publish a notice of intent in the *State Register*.

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§14.29 and 14.30, agencies may propose emergency rules under certain circumstances. Proposed emergency rules are published in the *State Register* and, for at least 25 days thereafter, interested persons may submit data and views in writing to the proposing agency.

Proposed Permanent Rules Governing Rule Adoption Proceedings

NOTICE:

Notice of Intent to Adopt a Rule Without a Public Hearing Unless 25 or More Persons Request a Hearing

Introduction: The Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) intends to adopt a permanent rules without a public hearing following the procedures set forth in the Administrative Procedures Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.22 to 14.28. You have 30 days to submit written comments on the proposed rules and may also submit a written request that a hearing be held on the rule.

Subject of Rule and Statutory Authority. The proposed rules are about agency procedures for adopting rules under *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 14 and OAH review of agency rules. The statutory authority to adopt these rules is *Minnesota Laws* 1995, Chapter 233, Art. 2, §§ 27, 29 and 31. This legislation transfers the responsibility for review of rules adopted without a hearing from the Attorney General to the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) effective January 1, 1996, and requires OAH to adopt new rules and revise the Attorney General's applicable rule. OAH also has rulemaking authority under *Minnesota Statutes* § 14.51 (1994). A copy of the proposed rule is published in the *State Register* and attached to this notice as mailed.

Copy of the Rule: A free copy of the rules is also available upon request from the agency contact person listed above.

Comments. You have until 4:30 p.m. on December 6, 1995, to submit written comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed rules or any part or subpart of the rule. Your comment must be in writing and received by the agency contact person by the due date. Comment is encouraged. Your comment should identify the portion of the proposed rule addressed, the reason for the comment, and any change proposed.

Request for a Hearing. In addition to submitting comments, you may also request that a hearing be held on the rules. Your request for a public hearing must be in writing and must be received by the agency contact person by 4:30 p.m. on December 6, 1995. Your written request for a public hearing must include your name, address and telephone number. You are encouraged to identify the portion of the proposed rule which caused your request, the reason for the request, and any changes you want made to the proposed rules. If 25 or more persons submit a written request for a hearing, a public hearing will be held unless a sufficient number withdraw their requests in writing. If a public hearing is required, the agency will follow the procedures in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20.

Proposed Rules

Modifications. The proposed rules may be modified as a result of public comment. The modifications must be supported by data and views submitted to OAH agency and may not result in a substantial change in the proposed rules as attached and printed in the *State Register*. If the proposed rules affect you in any way, you are encouraged to participate in the rulemaking process.

Statement of Need and Reasonableness. A statement of need and reasonableness is now available from the agency contact person. The statement describes the need for and reasonableness of each provision of the proposed rules. One free copy of the statement may be obtained by contacting the agency contact person listed above.

Small Business Considerations. The rulemaking considerations required by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.115, subdivision 2 do not apply because the proposed rule is about the specific agency procedures for adopting rules and does not affect small businesses directly. The Statement of Need and Reasonableness addresses this in greater detail.

Expenditure of Public Money by Local Public Bodies. The agency estimates that the proposed rules will not result in additional local costs because the proposed rules govern state agency rulemaking procedure and OAH rule review. Additionally, the substantive changes in the rules are required by the 1995 legislation.

Impact on Agricultural Lands. The agency has determined in the review required under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.11, subdivision 2, that the proposed rules do not have a direct and substantial adverse impact on agricultural land in Minnesota, nor will they affect farming operations within the meaning of *Minnesota Laws* 1995, Ch. 233, Art. 1, § 1.

Adoption and Review of Rule. If no hearing is required, after the end of the comment period the agency may adopt the rules. The rules and supporting documents will then be submitted to the attorney general for review as to legality and form to the extent form relates to legality. You may request to be notified of the date that the rules are submitted to the attorney general or be notified of the attorney general's decision on the rule. If you so wish to be notified, or wish to receive a copy of the adopted rule, submit your request to the agency contact person listed above.

Rules as Proposed (all new material)

1400.2000 SCOPE.

Parts 1400.2010 to 1400.2560 govern all proceedings by an agency for adopting any rule under *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 14.

1400.2010 DEFINITIONS.

Subpart 1. **Scope.** The definitions in this part apply to parts 1400.2000 to 1400.2560.

Subp. 2. **Agency.** "Agency" has the meaning given in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.02, subdivision 2.

Subp. 3. **Chief administrative law judge or chief judge.** "Chief administrative law judge" or "chief judge" means the chief administrative law judge of the Office of Administrative Hearings.

Subp. 4. **Judge.** "Judge" means the administrative law judge assigned by the chief administrative law judge to conduct a rule hearing or review a rule.

Subp. 5. **Legislative commission.** "Legislative commission" means the Legislative Commission to Review Administrative Rules.

Subp. 6. **Multimember agency.** "Multimember agency" means an agency described in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 15.0597, subdivision 1, paragraph (a), clause (1), and the Capitol Area Architectural and Planning Board.

Subp. 7. **Office.** "Office" means the Office of Administrative Hearings.

Subp. 8. **Revisor.** "Revisor" means the Revisor of Statutes.

Subp. 9. **Rule.** "Rule" has the meaning given in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.02, subdivision 4.

Subp. 10. **Substantially different.** "Substantially different" has the meaning given in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.05, subdivision 2, paragraph (b).

Proposed Rules

1400.2020 ASSIGNMENT AND DISQUALIFICATION OF JUDGE.

Subpart 1. **Assignment.** The chief judge must promptly assign a judge to a rule proceeding after the chief judge receives a request to schedule a rule hearing, or a filing from an agency under parts 1400.2060, 1400.2300, 1400.2400, or 1400.2450.

Subp. 2. **Disqualification.** An assigned judge must withdraw from a rule proceeding at any time the judge decides that he or she is disqualified for any reason.

Subp. 3. **Disqualification by affidavit.** If an affected person files an affidavit of prejudice against a judge assigned to a rule-making hearing, the chief judge must decide whether to disqualify the judge. The affidavit must be received by the chief judge at least five working days before the rulemaking hearing.

1400.2030 COUNTING TIME AND FILING DOCUMENTS.

Subpart 1. **Counting time.** To count a time period, the day of filing, mailing, publication, or other action is not counted and the last day of the time period is counted. Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays are included in calendar daytime periods and are not included in working daytime periods. If a calendar daytime period ends on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday, the time period ends on the next day which is not a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday. A time period is in calendar days unless it is stated as "working days."

Subp. 2. **Paper size.** All documents must be submitted to the office on standard size 8-1/2 inch by 11 inch paper, except:

- A. the proposed or adopted rules prepared by the revisor;
- B. handwritten comments from the public; and
- C. exhibits.

Subp. 3. **Facsimile transmission.** A person may file any document with the office using facsimile transmission. Filing a facsimile is equivalent to filing the original document, and is effective when the office receives it. A transmission commenced before 4:30 p.m. on the last day of filing is timely filed. The person filing the document must mail or deliver the original signed document to the office within five days.

1400.2040 PETITION FOR RULEMAKING.

Subpart 1. **Content of petition.** A petition to an agency requesting rulemaking under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.09, must be in the format of, and contain the information required in, the form in part 1400.2500.

Subp. 2. **Filing of petition with agency.** The petition must be filed with the executive director or head of the agency in person or by United States mail.

Subp. 3. **Agency response to petition.** The agency must reply in writing to the petition within 60 days after receiving it. The reply must meet the requirements of *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.09, and be signed by a person authorized to adopt a rule or, for multimember agencies, by a member or officer.

1400.2050 REQUEST FOR COMMENTS ON PLANNED RULE.

An agency must comply with *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.101, before publishing a notice of intent to adopt rules or notice of hearing. Part 1400.2510 is a recommended form for the published request for comments.

1400.2060 APPROVAL OF NOTICE PLAN.

Subpart 1. **Optional prior approval.** An agency may ask the office for prior approval of its plan for additional notice of planned rulemaking under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.101, or of its plan for additional notice of proposed rules under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.131, 14.14, 14.22, and 14.23.

Subp. 2. **Filing.** An agency asking the office for prior approval of a notice plan must file with the office:

- A. For notice plans under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.101:
 - (1) a description of its proposed additional notice plans;
 - (2) the agency's proposed request for comments on planned rule; and
 - (3) an explanation of why the agency believes that its notice plan complies with *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.101.

- B. For notice plans under *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131, 14.14, 14.22, and 14.23:

- (1) the proposed rule;
- (2) a draft of or a final copy of the statement of need and reasonableness under part 1400.2070, containing the agency's proposed notice plan;

(3) the agency's proposed notice of intent to adopt rules, notice of hearing, or dual notice under part 1400.2080; and

(4) an explanation of why the agency believes that its notice plan complies with *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.14, subdivision 1a, or 14.22.

Subp. 3. Review. If a proposed notice plan is filed with the office, a judge must review, and approve or disapprove it within five working days after the office receives it. The judge must approve the notice plan if the judge finds that the notice plan meets the requirements of the applicable statute.

Subp. 4. Approval and disapproval. An approved notice plan is the office's final determination that the notice plan is adequate. If the notice plan is disapproved, the judge must explain why and tell the agency what changes are necessary for approval. The agency may resubmit the notice plan for review after changing it. The judge must review and approve or disapprove the revised notice plan within five working days after the office receives it.

1400.2070 STATEMENT OF NEED AND REASONABLENESS.

Subpart 1. General content. The statement of need and reasonableness must summarize the evidence and argument that the agency is relying on to justify both the need for and the reasonableness of the proposed rules, and must state how the evidence rationally relates to the choice of action taken. The statement must explain the circumstances that created the need for the rulemaking and why the proposed rulemaking is a reasonable solution for meeting the need. The statement must be sufficiently specific so that interested persons will be able to fully prepare any testimony or evidence in favor of or in opposition to the proposed rules. A general description of the statute being implemented or restating the proposed rule is not sufficient. The statement must include:

A. citations to any economic, scientific, or other manuals or treatises the agency anticipates relying on;

B. citations to any statutes or case law the agency anticipates relying on;

C. a list of any witnesses the agency anticipates asking to testify if there is a hearing on the rule, and a summary or description of their testimony; and

D. a citation to the agency's grant of statutory authority to adopt the rule and, if the grant of authority was made after January 1, 1996, the effective date of the agency's statutory authority to adopt the rule.

The statement need not contain evidence and argument in rebuttal of evidence and argument presented by the public. If an agency is amending existing rules, the agency need not demonstrate the need for and reasonableness of the existing rules not affected by the proposed amendments.

Subp. 2. Specific requirements. The statement must also contain the following:

A. for rules to be adopted after a public hearing, the information required by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.131;

B. for rules to be adopted without a public hearing, the information required by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.23;

C. an explanation of what effort the agency made to obtain any information that it states could not be ascertained through reasonable effort; and

D. information required by any other law or rule to be included in the statement, or which the agency is required by law or rule to consider in adopting a rule. Examples include: *Minnesota Statutes*, section 16A.1285, subdivision 5; 115.43, subdivision 1; 116.07, subdivision 6; or 144A.29, subdivision 4.

Subp. 3. Timing. The statement must be prepared before the agency publishes or mails its notice of intent to adopt rules, notice of hearing, or dual notice. The agency must send a copy of the statement to the legislative commission when it becomes available for public review.

1400.2080 NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE.

Subpart 1. General content. A notice of intent to adopt rules under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.22, must contain the information in subparts 2 and 3. A notice of hearing under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.14, must contain the information in subparts 2 and 4. A dual notice must contain the information in subparts 2, 3, and 4. Parts 1400.2520, 1400.2530, and 1400.2540 contain recommended forms for these notices.

Subp. 2. Contents of all notices. A notice of intent to adopt rules, notice of hearing, or dual notice must state:

Proposed Rules

A. that the agency intends to adopt a rule and identify the parts of *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 14, and this chapter that the agency must follow;

B. a citation to the specific statutory authority for the rule;

C. that the proposed rule is attached to the notice or if the text of the proposed rule is not attached, a description of the nature and effect of the rule and how to obtain a free copy from the agency;

D. if applicable, that an entire rule is being repealed and a citation to the rule;

E. that the statement of need and reasonableness is available to the public, that the statement contains a summary of the justification for the proposed rule, including who will be affected by the proposed rule and an estimate of the probable cost of the proposed rule, and how to obtain a copy from the agency;

F. that the proposed rule can be modified if the modifications are supported by the information and comments submitted and do not make the rule substantially different;

G. that persons may register with the agency to receive notice of future rule proceedings;

H. any other information required by law or rule to be included in the notice; and

I. the signature of the person authorized to give notice of intent to adopt rules, notice of hearing, or dual notice.

Subp. 3. Additional contents for a notice of intent to adopt rules. A notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing must state:

A. that the public has 30 days to comment in support of or in opposition to the rule or any part of it, and that comment is encouraged;

B. the calendar date that the comment period ends;

C. that each comment should identify the part of the rule addressed, any change proposed, and the reason for the suggested change;

D. that if 25 or more persons submit a written request for hearing during the comment period, a public hearing must be held on the rule unless a sufficient number later withdraw their requests in writing;

E. that any person requesting a hearing must include his or her name and address, must identify the portion of the rule to which the person objects or a statement that the person objects to the entire rule, and that a request that does not provide this information is invalid and will not count when determining whether a public hearing must be held;

F. that any person requesting a hearing is encouraged to propose changes to the rule;

G. how persons must submit their comments or requests for hearing;

H. that if a public hearing is held the agency must proceed under *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20;

I. that if no hearing is required the agency must, after adopting the rule, submit the rule and supporting documents to the office for review for legality;

J. that persons must submit comments on the legality of the rule during the 30-day comment period; and

K. that persons may request to be notified of the date that the rule is submitted to the office for review and how to make that request.

Subp. 4. Additional contents for a notice of hearing. A notice of hearing must state:

A. the time, date, and place of the hearing;

B. that all interested persons will have an opportunity to participate;

C. how interested persons may present their views at the hearing;

D. the procedure in part 1400.2230 for submitting written materials after the hearing;

E. that persons can ask the judge questions about the procedure, and the name, address, and telephone number of the judge;

F. that persons can obtain the statement of need and reasonableness from the office at the cost of copying;

G. that any person can ask to be notified of the date on which the judge's report will become available and that the request can be made at the hearing or in writing to the judge;

H. that any person can ask to be notified of the date on which the agency adopts the rule and files it with the secretary of state, and that the request can be made at the hearing or in writing to the agency;

I. that lobbyists must register with the ethical practices board, that questions should be referred to the board, and the board's address and telephone number; and

J. that a hearing is ordered.

Subp. 5. **Approval of notice of hearing and dual notice.** The agency must obtain the judge's approval of any notice of hearing or dual notice prior to mailing it or publishing it in the *State Register*. The judge must also advise the agency as to when and where the hearing should be held in order to allow for participation by all affected interests. A draft of or a final copy of the statement of need and reasonableness must be filed with a notice submitted for approval. The judge must review the proposed notice within five working days of receiving it and must either approve the notice or advise the agency how the notice must be revised.

Subp. 6. **Timing.** A notice of hearing, dual notice, or notice of intent to adopt rules must be mailed at least 33 days before the end of the comment period or the start of the hearing, and must be published in the *State Register* at least 30 days before the end of the comment period or the start of the hearing.

Subp. 7. **Affidavit of mailing and certificate of mailing list.** The agency must prepare an affidavit of mailing the notice to the rulemaking mailing list and a certificate of the rulemaking mailing list. Part 1400.2550 contains a recommended format for this document.

1400.2090 ORDER ADOPTING RULE

An agency order adopting a rule must contain the following:

A. if any changes were made to the proposed rule in the adopted rule, a description of the changes, and an explanation of the reasons for the changes and why they do not make the rule substantially different, unless the procedures in part 1400.2110 were followed;

B. a statement that the agency has complied with all notice and procedural requirements. For multimember agencies, the order must state that proposal of the rule was authorized by the agency and provide either:

(1) a copy of the authorization; or

(2) the date of the agency meeting where the person was authorized to do so, and state that a quorum was present and authorized proposal of the rule;

C. for rules adopted without a public hearing, the number of persons who requested a hearing, and the number of persons who withdrew their request;

D. the number of persons who requested notice that the rule has been submitted to the office;

E. a statement that the rule is needed and reasonable;

F. a statement that the rule is adopted by the agency; and

G. the signature of the person authorized to adopt the rule or sign the order and the date the person signed the order. For multimember agencies, the order must state that the person is authorized by the agency to sign the order and provide either:

(1) a copy of the authorization; or

(2) the date of the agency meeting where the rule was adopted, and state that a quorum was present and the agency authorized the person to sign the order adopting the rule.

Part 1400.2560 is a recommended form for an order adopting rules.

1400.2100 STANDARDS OF REVIEW.

A rule must be disapproved by the judge or chief judge if the rule:

A. was not adopted in compliance with procedural requirements of this chapter, *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 14, or other law or rule, unless the judge decides that the error must be disregarded under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.15, subdivision 5, or 14.26, subdivision 3, paragraph (d);

B. is not rationally related to the agency's objective or the record does not demonstrate the need for or reasonableness of the rule;

Proposed Rules

- C. is substantially different than the proposed rule, and the agency did not follow the procedures of part 1400.2240, subpart 8;
- D. exceeds, conflicts with, does not comply with, or grants the agency discretion beyond what is allowed by, its enabling statute or other applicable law;
- E. is unconstitutional or illegal;
- F. improperly delegates the agency's powers to another agency, person, or group;
- G. is not a "rule" as defined in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.02, subdivision 4, or by its own terms cannot have the force and effect of law; or
- H. is subject to *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.25, subdivision 2, and the notice that hearing requests have been withdrawn and written responses to it show that the withdrawal is not consistent with *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.001, clauses (2), (4), and (5).

1400.2110 PROCEDURE TO ADOPT SUBSTANTIALLY DIFFERENT RULES.

Subpart 1. **Required procedure.** An agency may adopt a substantially different rule if it has complied with the procedures in this part.

Subp. 2. **Notice.** The agency must mail or deliver to each person or group that made a written or oral comment during the rule proceeding or registered at the rule hearing, if the person's address is known to the agency:

- A. a copy of the substantially different rule; and
- B. a statement that tells the recipient that the chief judge found the rule to be substantially different, explains the agency's reasons for modifying the rule, tells the recipient that the agency must accept written comments for 15 days, and gives the date the comment period ends.

Subp. 3. **Filing.** After considering any comments received, the agency must submit the documents listed in subpart 2 and any written responses to the chief judge.

Subp. 4. **Review.** The chief judge must review the agency's filing to decide whether:

- A. the agency has met the requirements of this part;
- B. the substantially different modifications to the rule are based on comments or evidence in the record;
- C. the substantially different rule complies with part 1400.2100; and
- D. in light of the nature of the substantially different modification and the course of the rule proceeding, it would not be fair to affected persons to allow the agency to adopt the modification without initiating a new rule proceeding.

The chief judge must either approve or disapprove the substantially different rule within ten days after the office receives it, unless it is withdrawn by a person authorized to withdraw the rule.

Subp. 5. **Rule adoption.** The agency may adopt the substantially different rule five working days after it has received the chief judge's written approval.

Subp. 6. **Effect of disapproval.** If the chief judge decides that the substantially different modifications must be disapproved under subpart 4, the agency may not adopt them without initiating and completing a new rule proceeding.

RULEMAKING HEARINGS

1400.2200 APPLICABILITY

Parts 1400.2200 to 1400.2240 apply to rule hearings and review of rules adopted by agencies under *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20.

1400.2210 CONDUCT OF HEARING

Subpart 1. **Registration of participants.** All persons who present evidence or ask questions must register with the judge before presenting evidence or asking questions at the hearing. Any person may register whether or not they speak at the hearing. Those who register must legibly print their names, addresses, telephone numbers, and the names of any individuals or associations that the persons represent at the hearing on a register provided by the judge. Persons may request on the register to be informed when the judge's report will be available. Persons may also request on the register that the agency inform them when the agency adopts the rules and files them with the secretary of state.

Subp. 2. **Introduction by judge.** The judge must start the hearing and must explain the purpose of the hearing and the procedure to be followed. The judge must explain how written materials can be submitted after the hearing under part 1400.2230. The judge must also explain the requirements for registration of lobbyists under *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 10A.

Subp. 3. **Agency presentation.** The agency representatives and witnesses must identify themselves for the record. The agency

must then make its presentation under part 1400.2220. Presentation by the agency of evidence not summarized in the statement of need and reasonableness, other than bona fide rebuttal, constitutes grounds for the judge, upon proper motion by any interested person, to recess the hearing to allow all interested persons an opportunity to prepare evidence in opposition to the newly presented evidence. The hearing recess must not exceed 25 days.

Subp. 4. Opportunity for questions. Interested persons may ask questions of the agency representatives or witnesses and other interested persons who speak. Agency representatives may question interested persons who speak. The questions may relate to the purpose or intended operation of the proposed rules, a suggested modification, or may be conducted for other purposes if material to the evaluation or formulation of the proposed rules.

Subp. 5. Opportunity to present statements and evidence. Interested persons may present oral and written statements and evidence regarding the proposed rules.

Subp. 6. Questioning by judge. The judge may question the agency representatives and witnesses and other interested persons who speak.

Subp. 7. Further agency evidence. The agency may present any further evidence that it considers appropriate in response to statements made by interested persons. Interested persons may respond to this evidence.

Subp. 8. Powers of judge. Consistent with law, the judge is authorized to do all things necessary and proper to conduct the hearing and to promote justice, fairness, and economy. This includes but is not limited to: presiding at the hearing; administering oaths or affirmations when appropriate; hearing and ruling on objections and motions; questioning witnesses where necessary to make a complete record; ruling on the admissibility of evidence and striking from the record objectionable evidence; limiting repetitive or immaterial oral statements and questioning; and determining the order of making statements and questions.

Subp. 9. Court reporters. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.52, governs the use of court reporters.

Subp. 10. Transcript. A transcript of the hearing must be made if requested by the agency, the attorney general, the chief judge, or any interested person. If a transcript is requested by an interested person, that person must pay for the original and one copy. Otherwise, the agency must pay for the original and any copies it requires. Any interested person may purchase a copy of a transcript once the original has been ordered by another person. The cost of an original or copy of a transcript must be determined by the office's contract with court reporters. When a transcript has been prepared, the original must be filed with the office. When a transcript has been prepared after the judge's report is issued, the original must be filed with the office and forwarded to the agency as soon as the office has completed its recordkeeping.

1400.2220 AGENCY PRESENTATION AT HEARING.

Subpart 1. Rulemaking documents. The agency must place into the hearing record the following documents:

- A. the request for comments published in the *State Register*;
- B. the petition for rulemaking, if the rule was proposed in response to it;
- C. the proposed rule, including the revisor's approval;
- D. the statement of need and reasonableness;
- E. a copy of the transmittal letter or an affidavit showing that the agency sent a copy of the statement of need and reasonableness to the legislative commission;
- F. the notice of hearing as mailed and as published in the *State Register*;
- G. the affidavit of mailing the notice of hearing and certificate of mailing list. Part 1400.2550 is a recommended affidavit form;
- H. an affidavit of additional notice if given;
- I. any written comments on the proposed rule received by the agency; and
- J. if the legislative commission has authorized the agency to omit from the notice of hearing the text of any proposed rule, a copy of the document authorizing the omission.

Subp. 2. Copies available. The agency must have copies of the proposed rules and the statement of need and reasonableness available at the hearing.

Proposed Rules

Subp. 3. **Showing.** The agency must make its affirmative presentation of facts showing the need for and the reasonableness of the proposed rules and must present any other evidence necessary to fulfill all substantive and procedural requirements of law or rule. The agency may choose to rely on the statement of need and reasonableness as its presentation and the statement may be introduced as an exhibit into the record as though read.

Subp. 4. **Agency representatives present.** Agency representatives or other persons thoroughly familiar with the proposed rules and the statement of need and reasonableness must be available at the hearing for questioning by the judge and other interested persons or to briefly summarize all or a portion of the statement if requested by the judge.

1400.2230 WRITTEN COMMENTS AFTER HEARING AND CLOSE OF HEARING RECORD.

Subpart 1. **Written comments.** The judge must allow written comments to be submitted into the hearing record by the agency and all interested persons for five working days after the hearing ends, and may extend this time to no more than 20 days after the hearing ends. In its comment, the agency may state whether these are rule modifications that it intends to adopt. The office must receive the written comments no later than 4:30 p.m. on the last day for submission.

Subp. 2. **Written responses.** The office must allow the agency and all interested persons to review the submissions received under subpart 1 and must allow them five working days to respond in writing to any new information submitted. The office must receive the responses no later than 4:30 p.m. on the last day. In its response, the agency may state whether there are rule modifications that the agency intends to adopt. Additional evidence may not be submitted during this response period. The written responses are part of the hearing record.

Subp. 3. **Close of hearing record.** The hearing record closes on the last date for receipt of written responses filed under subpart 2.

1400.2240 ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE'S REPORT.

Subpart 1. **Report.** The judge must prepare a report on the rule within 30 days after the hearing record closes, unless an extension is granted by the chief judge under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.15, subdivision 2.

Subp. 2. **Standard of review.** The judge or chief judge must review the hearing record and must disapprove the rule if the judge makes any of the findings in part 1400.2100, items A to G.

Subp. 3. **Approval.** If the judge approves the rule, the judge must promptly send the original report and the hearing record to the agency. The agency and the office must make copies of the report available to any interested person at reasonable cost. The agency may not adopt the rule for at least five working days after receiving the report, so that interested persons may examine it.

Subp. 4. **Review by chief judge.** If the judge disapproves the rule, the judge must submit the report and the hearing record to the chief judge for review. The chief judge must review the rule and the judge's report and prepare a report within ten days. If the chief judge disapproves the rule, the chief judge must explain why and tell the agency what changes are necessary for approval. The chief judge must promptly send the chief judge's report, the judge's report, and the hearing record to the agency. The agency may resubmit the rule to the chief judge for review after changing it. The agency may also request that the chief judge reconsider the disapproval. The chief judge must review and approve or disapprove the changed rule or a request for reconsideration within five working days after the office receives it.

Subp. 5. **New changes to rule.** If the agency wants to adopt the rule with changes other than those recommended by the judge or chief judge, the agency must submit to the chief judge:

- A. the rule initially proposed;
- B. the agency's proposed order adopting rules; and
- C. the rule, showing the agency's changes.

The chief judge may request that the agency also return the hearing record. The chief judge must review the agency's changes to decide if they make the rule substantially different than the proposed rule. The chief judge must make a written decision within ten days after the office receives the rule.

Subp. 6. **Disapproval of need and reasonableness.** If the chief judge disapproves the rule because the agency has not shown it to be needed and reasonable, and if the agency chooses not to follow the chief judge's recommended corrections, the agency must submit the rule to the legislative commission for review under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.15, subdivision 4.

Subp. 7. **Disapproval based on substantial difference.** If the chief judge disapproves the rule because it is substantially different than the proposed rule, the agency may end the rule proceeding, may start a new rule proceeding to adopt the substantially different rule, or may proceed under part 1400.2110. The agency may adopt the portions of the rules which are not substantially different.

Subp. 8. **Withdrawal of rule.** The agency may withdraw a rule by submitting a request signed by a person authorized to with-

draw the rule unless the withdrawal of a rule or a portion of the rule makes the remaining rules substantially different. The request must explain the person's authority to withdraw the rule. The office must return the agency's filing promptly after receiving this request.

Subp. 9. **Effect of disapproval.** Disapproval of a rule or part of a rule is binding on the agency to the extent specified in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.15, subdivisions 3 and 4, and 14.16.

Subp. 10. **Rule adoption.** Once the judge or chief judge approves the rule or the review period for the legislative commission has passed, the agency may adopt the rule. The agency must obtain the revisor's approval of the rule's form, file two copies of the rule with the secretary of state, and publish a notice of rule adoption in the *State Register*.

RULES ADOPTED WITHOUT A PUBLIC HEARING

1400.2300 REVIEW OF RULES ADOPTED WITHOUT A PUBLIC HEARING.

Subpart 1. **Applicability.** Parts 1400.2300 to 1400.2310 apply to review of rules adopted by agencies under *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.22 to 14.28.

Subp. 2. **Filing.** The agency must file with the office the documents listed in part 1400.2310.

Subp. 3. **Review.** A judge must review the agency's filing and either approve or disapprove it within 14 days after the office receives it, unless it is withdrawn. In reviewing the filing, the judge must decide whether the rule meets the standards of part 1400.2100.

Subp. 4. **Withdrawal of rule.** The agency may withdraw a rule from review by submitting a request signed by a person authorized to withdraw the rule unless the withdrawal of a rule or a portion of the rule makes the remaining rules substantially different. The request must explain the person's authority to withdraw the rule. The office must return the agency's filing promptly after receiving this request.

Subp. 5. **Approval.** If the rule is approved, the agency may publish notice of adoption of the rule in the *State Register*. The office must file two copies of the rule with the secretary of state, and send a copy of its decision to persons who requested a copy of this decision, to the legislative commission, and to the attorney general. The office must send the agency a copy of its decision and promptly return the agency's filing.

Subp. 6. **Disapproval.** If the rule is disapproved, the judge must state in writing the reasons for the disapproval and recommend what changes are necessary for approval. The written reasons for disapproval must then be submitted to the chief judge for approval. The chief judge shall approve or disapprove the judge's determination within ten days and shall state the reasons in writing and shall advise the agency what changes are required for approval. The office must send a copy of the chief judge's decision to persons who requested a copy of the decision, the legislative commission, the revisor, and the attorney general. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.26, subdivision 3, governs the effect of any disapproval. The chief judge shall then promptly send the rule record to the agency.

Subp. 7. **Resubmission.** The agency may resubmit the rule to the chief judge for review after changing it and may request that the chief judge reconsider the disapproval. The agency must file with the office:

- A. the agency's initial filing under subpart 2;
- B. the rule with the agency's proposed changes; and

C. an explanation of the changes, why they solve the problems identified by the chief judge, and why they do not result in a substantially different rule.

The chief judge must review the resubmitted rule under subparts 3, 5, and 6 within five working days of receiving it.

Subp. 8. **Disapproval of need and reasonableness.** If the chief judge disapproves the rule because the agency has not shown it to be needed and reasonable, and if the agency chooses not to follow the chief judge's recommended corrections, the agency must submit the rule to the legislative commission for review under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.15, subdivision 4.

1400.2310 DOCUMENTS TO BE FILED.

The agency must file the following documents with the office:

- A. the request for comments published in the *State Register*;

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Proposed Rules

- B. the petition for rulemaking, if the rule was proposed in response to it;
- C. the proposed rule, including the revisor's approval;
- D. the statement of need and reasonableness;
- E. the notice of intent to adopt rules as mailed and as published in the *State Register*;
- F. if the legislative commission authorized the agency to omit from the notice of intent to adopt rules the text of any proposed rule, a copy of the document authorizing the omission;
- G. the affidavit of mailing the notice of intent to adopt rules and certificate of mailing list;
- H. an affidavit of additional notice, if given;
- I. a copy of the transmittal letter or affidavit showing that the agency sent a copy of the statement of need and reasonableness to the legislative commission;
- J. all written comments and submissions on the proposed rule, requests for hearing and withdrawals of requests for hearing received by the agency, except those that only requested copies of documents;
- K. if required by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.25, subdivision 2, the notice of withdrawal of hearing request, evidence that the notice of withdrawal was sent to all persons who requested a hearing, and any responsive comments received;
- L. three copies of the adopted rule, showing any modifications to the proposed rule and the revisor's approval of them;
- M. if the agency adopted a substantially different rule using the procedure in part 1400.2110, a copy of the notice that was sent to persons or groups who commented during the comment period and evidence that the notice was sent to those persons or groups;
- N. the order adopting the rule; and
- O. the notice of submission of the rule to the office, if anyone requested this notice, and a copy of the transmittal letter or affidavit showing that the agency sent out this notice.

Part 1400.2550 is a recommended affidavit form.

EXEMPT RULES

1400.2400 REVIEW OF EXEMPT RULES.

Subpart 1. **Applicability.** This part applies to review of rules adopted by agencies under *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.386 and 14.388.

Subp. 2. **Filing.** The agency must file with the office:

- A. the rule, including the revisor's approval; and
- B. an order adopting the rule, which must include any explanation needed to support the legality of the rule, and:
 - (1) the citation to the rule's statutory exemption from the rulemaking procedures of *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 14, and any argument needed to support the claim of exemption; or
 - (2) an explanation of why the rule meets the requirements of the good cause exemption under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.388; and
 - (3) any other information required by law or rule.

Subp. 3. **Review.** A judge must review the agency's filing and either approve or disapprove it within 14 days after the office receives it. In reviewing the filing, the judge must decide whether the rule meets the standards of part 1400.2100, items A and D to G, and whether the agency has established its exemption from rulemaking under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.386 or 14.388.

Subp. 4. **Approval and disapproval.** If the rule is approved, the agency may publish it in the *State Register*. If the rule is disapproved, the judge must tell the agency why and what changes are necessary for approval or why the rule is not exempt from rule-making procedures. The agency may resubmit the rule to the judge for review after changing it. The judge must review and approve or disapprove the rule within five working days after receiving it. A rule does not take effect unless approved.

Subp. 5. **Review by chief judge.** An agency may ask the chief judge to review a rule that has been disapproved by a judge. The agency must make this request within five working days of receiving the judge's decision. The chief judge must review the agency's filing and, within 14 days of receiving it, either approve or disapprove it under the standards in subpart 3.

MEDIATION

1400.2450 MEDIATION.

Subpart 1. **Request.** An agency may ask the chief judge to assign a judge to be a neutral party assisting in mediating or negotiat-

ing a resolution to disputes relating to proposed rules. The chief judge must assign a judge and notify the agency of the assignment within ten days after receiving the agency's written request.

Subp. 2. **Scheduling and notice.** The assigned judge must contact the agency to establish a date, time, and place for the first mediation session and to assist the agency in giving notice of the mediation. The agency must give notice of the mediation by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 15 days before the session and by mailing the notice to all persons registered with the agency to receive rulemaking notices.

Subp. 3. **Conduct of judge.** The judge assigned must not communicate, either directly or indirectly, about any facts or issues in the mediation with any person not participating in the mediation unless authorized to do so by all persons involved in the mediation.

Subp. 4. **Procedures and guidelines.** Procedures and guidelines for the mediation sessions must be established at the first session by agreement of all participants.

Subp. 5. **Subsequent sessions.** If additional mediation sessions are needed, the date, time, and place must be determined by agreement of the participants or by the judge if the participants do not agree. Notice of future sessions must be given orally to the participants present and by mail to any persons who have indicated a desire to participate but who are not present.

Subp. 6. **Termination.** The mediation terminates either when the agency decides to terminate it or when the agency and the participants sign an agreement resolving the disputed issues.

Subp. 7. **Involvement of mediation judge in subsequent proceedings.** The mediation judge shall not be assigned to any subsequent rule hearing or review that involves the rule that was the subject of the mediation.

Subp. 8. **Compliance with other requirements.** The agency must comply with all requirements of law or rule in subsequently adopting a rule on which agreement was reached through mediation under this part.

If, however, 25 or more persons submit a written request for a hearing on the rules within 30 days or by 4:30 p.m. on December 6, 1995, a public hearing will be held on Tuesday, December 19, 1995. To find out whether the rules will be adopted without a hearing or if the hearing will be held, you should contact the agency contact person after December 6, 1995, and before December 19, 1995.

The statutory authority to adopt the rules is *Minnesota Statutes*, section 62J.321, subdivision 6. A copy of the proposed rules is published in the *State Register*. Under the rules, group purchasers will have to provide aggregate data, including financial data on revenues and expenses and statistical data on subscribers and members. Rules Development Process. The Department used a work group containing representatives of many stakeholders to advise on the development of the rules. The organizations represented on the work group included: Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Minnesota, Delta Dental of Minnesota, HealthPartners, the Insurance Federation of Minnesota, JWB Associates, Mayo Health Plan, Medica/Allina Health System, Metropolitan Health Plan, Minneapolis Urban League, Minnesota Nurses Association, PreferredOne, Prudential Ins., State Farm Insurance Co., and UCare Minnesota. NOTE that participation in the work group did not constitute an endorsement of the rules by these organizations and that there may be areas of disagreement with some of the statutory and rules requirements. The work group members were, however, pleased with their involvement and input into the process.

Hearing Procedure. If a hearing is held, you and all interested or affected persons including representatives of associations or other interested groups, will have an opportunity to participate. You may present your views either orally at the hearing or in writing at any time prior to the close of the hearing record. All evidence presented should relate to the proposed rules. You may also mail written material to the Administrative Law Judge to be recorded in the hearing record for five working days after the public hearing ends. This five-day comment period may be extended for a longer period not to exceed 20 calendar days if ordered by the Administrative Law Judge at the hearing. Comments received during this period will be available for review at the Office Of Administrative Hearings. You and the Department may respond in writing with rebuttal arguments or material within five business days after the submission period ends to any new information submitted after the hearing. All written materials and responses submitted to the Administrative Law Judge during the rebuttal period must be received at the Office Of Administrative Hearings no later than 4:30 p.m. on the due date. No additional evidence may be submitted during the five-day rebuttal period. This rule hearing procedure is governed by *Minnesota Rules*, parts 1400.0200 to 1400.1200, and *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20. Questions about procedure may be directed to the Administrative Law Judge.

Statement Of Need And Reasonableness. A Statement Of Need And Reasonableness is now available. This Statement describes the need for and reasonableness of each provision of the proposed rules. It also includes a summary of all the evidence and argument which the Department anticipates presenting at the hearing, if one is held. A free copy of the Statement may be obtained from Brenda Holden at the address or telephone number listed above. The Statement may also be reviewed and copies obtained at the cost of reproduction from the Office Of Administrative Hearings.

Small Business Considerations. In preparing these rules, the Department has considered the requirements of *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.115, in regard to the impact of the proposed rules on small businesses. These rules affect small businesses that are group purchasers in that they are required to provide aggregate data, including financial data on revenues and expenses and statistical data on subscribers and members. The report form will be very similar to the report form used to report 1994 data. The amendments to the rules in many ways reduce the burden of the rules on group purchasers by adding definitions and clarifying definitions based on the experiences of advisory work group members who completed the report of 1994 data. Anyone who wants to comment on the impact of the rules and ways to reduce this impact is encouraged to submit suggestions during the 30-day comment period. One way that the rules minimize the burden is that group purchasers that are insurers with less than \$3,000,000 in total health premiums for Minnesota residents in the year prior to the reporting year may file an abbreviated survey. The Department's evaluation of the applicability of the methods contained in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.115, subdivision 2, for reducing the impact of the proposed rules is addressed further in the Statement Of Need And Reasonableness.

Expenditure Of Public Money By Local Public Bodies. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.11, subdivision 1, does not apply because adoption of these rules will not result in additional spending by local public bodies in excess of \$100,000 per year for the first two years following adoption of the rules.

Impact On Agriculture Lands. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.11, subdivision 2, does not apply because adoption of these rules will not have an impact on agricultural land.

Departmental Charges. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 16A.1285, subdivisions 4 and 5, do not apply because the rules do not establish or adjust departmental charges.

Lobbyist Registration. *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 10A, requires each lobbyist to register with the Ethical Practices Board. You may request to be notified of the date the rules are submitted to the Attorney General or be notified of the Attorney General's decision on the rules. If you want to be so notified, or wish to receive a copy of the adopted rules, submit your request in writing to Brenda Holden at the address listed above.

Adoption Procedure After A Hearing. If a hearing is held, after the close of the hearing record, the Administrative Law Judge will issue a report on the proposed rules. You may request to be notified of the date on which the Administrative Law Judge's

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report will be available, after which date the Department may not take any final action on the rules for a period of five working days. If you want to be notified about the report, you may so indicate at the hearing. After the hearing, you may request notification by sending a written request to the Administrative Law Judge. 4652.0100 DEFINITIONS.

[For text of subpart 1, see M.R.]

Subp. 1a. Administrative services fee revenue. "Administrative services fee revenue" includes all revenue from fees related to health administrative services only contracts written for Minnesota residents. An administrative services only contract means a contract between a group purchaser and a third party, including a self-insured, under which the group purchaser provides claims administration and other services.

Subp. 4. Chemical dependency services expenses. "Chemical dependency services expenses" means all costs related to inpatient and outpatient chemical dependency services that are coded using one or more of the following codes or amended equivalent codes:

A. ICD-9 diagnosis code ranges 303.00 to 305.92; and

B. CPT codes 90801, 90841, 90843, 90844, 90844.22, 90846, 90847, 90847.22, 90849, 90853, 98900, 98902, 98910, and 98912.

Chemical dependency services expenses also means all costs related to inpatient and outpatient chemical dependency services that are coded using codes from another coding system where the commissioner determines that the codes indicate diagnoses or procedures comparable to or consistent with codes listed in items A and B. A group purchaser may use a nationally recognized standardized reporting system to capture costs for chemical dependency inpatient, outpatient, and other professional services. Chemical dependency services expenses does not include prescription drugs or supplies administered or dispensed which are billed directly through a hospital or health care provider.

Subp. 5. Claim processing expenses. "Claim processing expenses" means all costs associated with the adjudication and adjustment of claims, coordination of benefits processing, maintenance of the claim system, printing of claim forms, claim quality assurance audit function, electronic data interchange expenses pertaining to claim processing, and fraud investigation. Examples of traditional expense categories that a group purchaser may allocate in whole or in part to claim processing expenses are: information systems and legal.

Subp. 9. Durable medical goods expenses. "Durable medical goods expenses" means all costs for such items as wheel chairs, eyeglasses eyewear, hearing aids, surgical appliances, bulk and cylinder oxygen, equipment rental, and other devices or equipment that can withstand repeated use.

Subp. 10. Emergency services expenses. "Emergency services expenses" means all costs for medical care provided in the emergency room of a hospital. Emergency services expenses includes the room, board, and any services such as X-ray and laboratory services billed by the facility. Emergency services expenses does not include expenditures for physician services.

Subp. 13. Home health care expenses. "Home health care expenses" means all costs for medical care services delivered in the home under the direction of a physician. Home health care expenses includes costs for noninpatient hospice care.

Subp. 14. Inpatient hospital services expenses. "Inpatient hospital services expenses" means all costs for those services furnished by a hospital for inpatient services, including inpatient hospice care. Inpatient hospital services expenses does not include costs of mental health services and chemical dependency services.

Subp. 19. Mental health services expenses. "Mental health services expenses" means all costs related to inpatient and outpatient mental health services that are coded using one or more of the following codes or amended equivalent codes:

A. ICD-9 diagnosis code ranges 290 to 302.9 and 306 to 319; and

B. CPT codes: 90801, 90841, 90843, 90844, 90844.22, 90846, 90847, 90847.22, 90849, 90853, 98900, 98902, 98910, and 98912.

Mental health services expenses also means all costs related to inpatient and outpatient mental health services that are coded using codes from another coding system where the commissioner determines that the codes indicate diagnoses or procedures comparable to or consistent with codes listed in items A and B. A group purchaser may use a nationally recognized standardized reporting system to capture costs for chemical dependency inpatient, outpatient, and other professional services. Mental health services expenses does not include prescription drugs or supplies administered or dispensed which are billed directly through a hospital or health care provider.

Subp. 19a. Minimum premium plan revenue. “Minimum premium plan revenue” means revenue from insurance plan policies written from Minnesota residents whereby an employer self-funds a fixed percentage of the estimated monthly claims and the insurer covers the remainder.

Subp. 20. MinnesotaCare tax expenses. “MinnesotaCare tax expenses” means all payments made for the MinnesotaCare tax under *Minnesota Statutes*, section sections 295.52 and 295.582.

Subp. 24a. Patient services revenue. “Patient services revenue” means fee-for-service revenue received for medical and dental services delivered to patients by clinics that are owned by the group purchaser.

Subp. 25. Pharmacy and other nondurable medical goods expenses. “Pharmacy and other nondurable medical goods expenses” means all costs paid by the group purchaser to a pharmacist or medical supply company to provide pharmaceuticals and nonreusable supplies or pieces of equipment that are used to treat a health condition. Pharmacy and other nondurable medical goods expenses does not include the cost of pharmaceuticals and other nondurable medical goods administered or dispensed which are billed directly through a hospital or health care provider.

Subp. 26. Physician services expenses. “Physician services expenses” means costs for all services provided by or under the supervision of licensed medical doctors; and doctors of osteopathy, and ophthalmologists including pharmaceuticals and supplies administered or dispensed from the physician’s office and billed directly through the physician. Physician services expenses does not include costs of mental health services and chemical dependency services.

Subp. 29. Quality assurance and utilization management expenses. “Quality assurance and utilization management expenses” means all costs associated with quality assurance, practice protocol development, utilization review, peer review, credentialing, outcomes analysis related to existing products, nurse triage, and other medical care evaluation activities. Examples of traditional expense categories that a group purchaser may allocate in whole or in part to quality assurance and utilization management expenses are: information systems and legal.

Subp. 30a. Reinsurance assumed revenue. “Reinsurance assumed revenue” means total revenue from reinsurance plan policies for Minnesota residents received by a group purchaser who writes the reinsurance plan policies. Reinsurance assumed revenue does not include payments received for reinsurance claims.

Subp. 32. Skilled nursing facilities expenses. “Skilled nursing facilities expenses” means all costs for those services furnished by a facility primarily engaged in providing skilled nursing care and related services for patients who require medical or nursing care or rehabilitation services. Skilled nursing facilities expenses includes room and board incurred at skilled nursing facilities. Skilled nursing facilities expenses does not include costs of mental health services and chemical dependency services.

Subp. 33. Subscriber. “Subscriber” means ~~an individual, employee, or employee with dependents~~ a person who has been enrolled with a group purchaser and for whom the group purchaser has accepted the responsibility for the provision of basic health services under a contract, where the contract is either directly between the person and the group purchaser or between the employer of the person and the group purchaser. The subscriber may or may not have dependents who are covered under the contract.

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Subp. 34. **Total premium revenue.** "Total premium revenue" means all premiums charged on all health insurance policies written for Minnesota residents, including the change in unearned premium from the previous year, minus refunds based on experience. Total premium revenue does not include minimum premium revenue, administrative services fee revenue, utilization review fee revenue, reinsurance assumed revenue, and patient services revenue.

Subp. 34a. Utilization review fee revenue. "Utilization review fee revenue" means all revenue from fees not part of premium revenue related to health utilization review products written for Minnesota residents.

4652.0110 GROUP PURCHASER REPORTING.

Subpart 1. **Group purchasers must report; exceptions.** All group purchasers, except as noted in items A to D, shall file with the commissioner a financial and statistical report on forms or computer format provided or approved by the commissioner.

A. An insurance company, as defined in part 4652.0100, subpart 15, that collected less than \$3,000,000 in total health premiums for Minnesota residents in the year prior to the year that the data is covering may file a short report in lieu of filing a report that meets the requirements of part 4652.0120. The short report must be in writing, must state the amount that the group purchaser collected ~~less than \$3,000,000~~ in total health premiums for Minnesota residents in the year prior to the year that the data is covering, and must provide the total number of members and subscribers covered at the end of the reporting period. For purposes of this item, "health premiums" means premiums for health and medical related coverages, excluding accidental death and dismemberment coverages, short-term disability coverages, long-term disability coverages, long-term care coverages, workers' compensation coverages, the medical component of automobile insurance coverages, and personal accident coverages.

4652.0120 CONTENTS OF REPORT.

The report filed by a group purchaser must meet the requirements of items A to G. The information for each item must pertain to health and medical related coverages, excluding accidental death and dismemberment coverages, short-term disability coverages, long-term disability coverages, long-term care coverages, workers' compensation coverages, the medical component of automobile insurance coverages, and personal accident coverages.

A. The report must include total premium revenue and other revenue. "Other revenue" means, and must be specifically itemized into, the categories of minimum premium plan revenue, administrative services fee revenue, utilization review fee revenue, ~~and reinsurance assumed revenue, and patient services revenue.~~ Each revenue category must separate commercial, Medicare, Medicare supplement, and non-Medicare other public programs amounts.

B. The report must include total expenses incurred by type of policy, including ~~insured business commercial, self-insured business, Medicare, medical assistance Medicare supplement, and general assistance other public programs.~~ The report must separately list member liability for each policy category.

C. The report must include total expenses incurred by service category, including physician services, other health professional services, inpatient hospital services, outpatient services, skilled nursing facilities, home health care, emergency services, pharmacy and other nondurable medical goods, durable medical goods, chemical dependency services and mental health services, dental services, and total indirect health care expenses. Each service category must be itemized by type of policy as specified in item B. For ~~Medicare Supplement coverages and for coverages designed solely to provide payments on a per diem, fixed indemnity, or non-expense-incurred basis,~~ the report may list total expenses rather than itemizing the expenses for these coverages by service category.

F. The report must include the total number of members and subscribers, as of the end of the reporting period, by type of policy, including family policies and individual policies and member months for the reporting period. Member months must be totaled for the calendar year of the report. This information must be reported separately for medical and dental contracts. Each category must be itemized by commercial, self-insured, Medicare, Medicare supplement, and other public programs. Group purchasers that do not maintain member information may submit actuarial estimates of total number of members covered under all health policies.

4652.0140 VARIANCES.

Subpart 1. **Data from other sources.** On a request by a group purchaser or on the commissioner's own initiative, the commissioner shall determine whether to use data from other sources instead of collecting data required by this chapter. To make this determination, the commissioner shall consider whether:

A. the data from other sources are duplicative of data required under this chapter;

B. the data from other sources are available at a reasonable cost;

C. the commissioner has the resources readily available to use the data from other sources; and

D. the commissioner will be able to use the data from other sources to meet all statutory data collection, analysis, and privacy requirements.

Subp. 2. Aggregate reporting for systems. An organization operating a group purchaser which is part of a system of group purchasers, hospitals, or clinics may request to report to the commissioner for all components of the system as an aggregate. If the commissioner determines that the commissioner will be able to use the data from the system as an aggregate to meet all statutory data collection, analysis, and privacy requirements, then the commissioner shall grant the request.

The Minnesota Department of Revenue intends to repeal a permanent rule without a public hearing following the procedures set forth in the Administrative Procedures Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.22 to 14.28. You have 30 days to submit written comments on the proposed repeal of the rule and may also submit a written request that a hearing be held on the rule.

Subject of Rule and Statutory Authority. *Minnesota Rules*, part 8130.4900 is an explanation of the types of transactions that are exempt from Minnesota taxation due to mandates of the United States Constitution. The majority of this rule was created to explain that the federal government and certain units thereof are exempt from state taxation under certain federal doctrines, such as the doctrine of intergovernmental immunity or the due process clause of the 14th amendment to the federal constitution. Since these are federal doctrines, developed by federal law, and because the explanations currently in the rule create more confusion than they alleviate, the Department has concluded that the rule should be repealed in its entirety.

The commissioner of revenue has general rulemaking authority under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 270.06 (14). In addition, *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.05, subd. 1, grants the Department of Revenue the authority to adopt, suspend, or repeal its rules in accordance with the procedures specified in sections 14.001 to 14.69. A copy of the proposed repealer is published in the *State Register* on November 6, 1995 and attached to this Notice as mailed. A free copy of the rule is available upon request from the agency contact person.

Comments. You have until 4:30 p.m. on December 6, 1995, to submit written comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed repeal of the rule. Your comment must be in writing and received by the agency contact person by the due date. Comment is encouraged. Your comments should identify the portion of the rule addressed, the reason for the comment, and any change proposed.

Request for a Hearing. In addition to submitting comments, you may also request that a hearing be held on the rule. Your request for a public hearing must be in writing and must be received by the agency contact person by 4:30 p.m. on December 6, 1995. Your written request for a public hearing must include your name, address and telephone number. The rules proposed and published at *State Register*, Volume 19, Number 28, pages 1481-1489, January 9, 1995 (19 SR 1481), are adopted with the following modifications:

1558.0020 DEFINITIONS.

Subp. 2. **Agriculturally related organism.** "Agriculturally related organism" means any organism that is used in agricultural production or processing of agricultural products. It includes livestock and livestock products; dairy animals and dairy products; poultry and poultry products; domestic fur-bearing animals; animal feeds; horticultural stock; nursery stock, as detailed in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 18.46, subdivision 3; ~~fruits~~ fruit; vegetables; forage; grain; wild rice; seeds; bees; apiary products; and products for the control or mitigation of noxious weeds. It excludes vaccines and drugs for use in humans; genetic engineering of human germ cells and human somatic cells intended for use in human gene therapy; vaccines for use in livestock, dairy animals, poultry, domestic fur-bearing animals, or private aquatic life; genetically engineered wild animals; and forestry products.

Subp. 6. **Containment facility.** "Containment facility" means a laboratory, greenhouse, building, structure, or other similar facility that complies with the most recent applicable National Institute of Health Guidelines for Research Involving Recombinant DNA Molecules which is incorporated by reference and published in the *Federal Register* or is certified by the USDA Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service as a containment facility. Such facilities must also be certified under part 1558.0080, subpart 2 ~~1~~, or has been exempted by the commissioner under part 1558.0080, subpart 3 ~~2~~.

Subp. 7. **Environment.** "Environment" means the physical conditions existing in the area that may be affected by a proposed release. It includes land, air, water, minerals, flora, fauna, ambient noise, energy resources, and artifacts or natural features of historic, geologic, or aesthetic significance.

Subp. 8. **Environmental assessment worksheet; EAW.** "Environmental assessment worksheet" or "EAW" means a document complying with part 4410.0200, subpart 24.

Subp. 8- ~~2~~ **Environmental impact statement; EIS.** "Environmental impact statement" or "EIS" has the meaning given in part 4410.0200, subpart 26.

Subp. 9- ~~10~~ **Environmental Quality Board; EQB.** "Environmental Quality Board" or "EQB" means the Minnesota Environmental Quality Board.

Subp. ~~10~~ ~~11~~ **Federal application.** "Federal application" means an application, notification, or petition and supporting documents submitted to any agency of the United States government for the release of a genetically engineered organism.

Subp. ~~11~~ ~~12~~ **Genetic engineering.** "Genetic engineering" means the introduction of new genetic material into an organism or the regrouping of an organism's genes using techniques or technology designed by humans or any progeny containing the new genetic material or regrouping. This does not include selective breeding, hybridization, or nondirected mutagenesis.

Subp. ~~14-~~ **15. Release.** "Release" means the placement or use of a GEO outside a containment facility or under any other conditions not specifically determined by the commissioner to be adequate containment pursuant to part 1558.0080, subpart 1 or 2.

Subp. ~~15-~~ **16. Release permit.** "Release permit" means the terms, conditions, and authorization by the commissioner under this chapter for the release of a genetically engineered organism.

Subp. ~~16-~~ **17. Responsible person.** "Responsible person" means a person who has custody of, control of, or responsibility for an agriculturally related genetically engineered organism.

Subp. 18. Unreasonable adverse effects. "Unreasonable adverse effects" means an unreasonable risk to humans or the environment, taking into account the environmental costs and benefits of the use of a genetically engineered organism.

Subp. ~~17-~~ **19. USDA.** "USDA" means the United States Department of Agriculture.

1558.0030 CONSIDERATIONS.

Subpart 1. **Considerations.** In determining whether a release permit, notification, or exemption for commercial use should be issued, denied, modified, suspended, or revoked, and in specifying or modifying conditions of release, the commissioner must consider the following:

C. the potential for the genetically engineered organism to cause any adverse ~~environmental effects, including but not limited to effects on humans or the environment, such as:~~

(3) the extent of the changes to the genetically engineered organism's competitiveness and survivability under normal and environmentally stressful conditions ~~including, but not limited to, such as~~ resource base, dormancy, temperature tolerance, fire resistance, drought resistance, or ability to disperse in the environment, that have been made as a result of the genetic engineering;

(5) the potential of the genetically engineered organism to ~~adversely affect~~ affect the groundwater environment or to pass ~~harmful genes~~ transgenes to organisms found in groundwater;

E. any previous risk assessments for the same or similar organisms prepared by federal or state agencies and their adequacy and relevance to the current proposal, ~~including, but not limited to, such as~~ consideration of the following:

Subp. 2. **Federal documents.** Relevant federal documents may be used to address some or all of the considerations in subpart 1.

1558.0040 RELEASE PERMIT PROCEDURES.

Subpart 1. **Procedure and application.** Release permits, including EAWs prepared by the commissioner, are required from the commissioner for all releases of GEOs except those exempted under subpart 13, or those regulated under part 1558.0060, 1558.0070, or 1558.0080. The commissioner shall provide application forms.

B. During the permit process, the commissioner may request additional information necessary to determine the potential for ~~unreasonable~~ adverse effects on human health or the environment of the proposed release.

Subp. 3. **Application distribution.** Within 14 days of the application acceptance, a copy of the application with not public ~~information~~ data deleted, including the EAW prepared by the Minnesota Department of Agriculture, must be distributed to: the chair of the EQB, the Legislative Reference Library, local government units within whose boundaries the release is proposed, and any other person upon request to the commissioner. Those persons shall be added to the mailing list maintained by the commissioner of persons interested in receiving information on the release of GEOs. EAWs must be distributed according to the EQB distribution list. Not public data is available for review by any state agency according to provisions of *Minnesota Statutes*, section 13.05, subdivision 9, of the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act.

Subp. 4. **Application review.** The application must be reviewed using an interdisciplinary approach that will ensure the integrated use of the natural and environmental sciences, including involvement of the following disciplines as appropriate: microbiology, ecology, public health, biological safety, agronomy, animal science, plant biology, risk assessment, molecular biology, biochemistry, entomology, vertebrate biology, physical and biological containment, and other appropriate disciplines. Application review must address the considerations in part 1558.0030, including federal documents, and evidence from laboratory studies and previous releases. After reviewing a completed release permit application including the EAW and comments from reviewers, the commissioner may issue a release permit for GEOs if the commissioner determines that the applicant has adequately demonstrated

that the proposed release does not have the potential for unreasonable adverse effects on human health or the environment. The commissioner may deny issuance of a GEO release permit if the release of the GEO under proposed terms and conditions of the release permit may cause unreasonable adverse effects on human health or the environment.

The Board of Animal Health must be consulted during the review on permits that relate to livestock and domestic animals.

Subp. 6. **Permit conditions.** The commissioner may prescribe terms and conditions ~~including, but not limited to,~~ such as the period for the GEO release permit, the amount or number of GEOs to be released, monitoring activities, department inspection schedules, reporting of experimental results, and experiment termination procedures. The commissioner may impose additional reasonable and appropriate release permit conditions to mitigate or minimize the adverse effects of the release on human health or the environment.

Subp. 7. **Violation of the permit.** A person ~~may~~ shall not violate terms or conditions of a permit issued under this section. The commissioner may modify, suspend, or revoke the release permit at any time if the commissioner finds that its terms or conditions are being violated or are inadequate to avoid unreasonable adverse effects on human health or the environment pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes*, section 18F.07, subdivision 2. If adverse effects are observed, the permit will be suspended. If adverse effects can be mitigated by modification of the conditions for release, the permit may be reinstated. Revocation ~~may~~ shall result in termination and disposal of all GEOs if the commissioner determines that the GEOs pose a significant environmental risk. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 18D.301, subdivision 1, authorizes procedures and penalties as outlined in *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 18D, to be applied to violations of *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 18B, 18C, or 18F.

Subp. 13. **Partial or complete exemptions.** Partial or complete exemptions from the permit procedures may be given by the commissioner based on the considerations in part 1558.0030 and adequacy of alternative oversight as it relates to those considerations.

A. The applicant may file a written request to the commissioner for the exemption of an individual release or for a class of releases. The request must include a copy of the federal application or documentation and the information necessary to determine if there is a potential for ~~significant adverse environmental effects~~ adverse effects on humans or the environment. The determination must be based on the considerations in part 1558.0030 and the adequacy of alternative oversight as it relates to those considerations. The commissioner shall make a determination within 30 days of the receipt of the exemption request and documentation. Class exemptions may be initiated by the commissioner.

B. There will be public notice of the request in the first available EQB Monitor and a 30-day public comment period for class exemptions. The determination must be based on the considerations in part 1558.0030, the adequacy of alternative oversight as it relates to those considerations, and review of comments.

1558.0050 ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT WORKSHEETS.

Subp. 3. **EAW review.** The EAW must be reviewed using an interdisciplinary approach that will ensure the integrated use of the natural and environmental sciences, including involvement of the following disciplines as appropriate: microbiology, ecology, public health, biological safety, agronomy, animal science, plant biology, risk assessment, molecular biology, biochemistry, entomology, vertebrate biology, physical and biological containment, and other appropriate disciplines. The notice of availability of the EAW and ~~the~~ a 30-day public comment period must be published in the first available EQB Monitor.

Subp. 4. **EAW findings.** The commissioner shall issue findings of fact based on the EAW. The findings must determine if there is a potential for significant environmental effects. If there is a potential for significant environmental effects, ~~an EIS must be prepared. The findings may also be used to determine if the permit should be granted or denied, and if any permit conditions are needed to mitigate or lower risks that have been identified by the EAW an EIS must be prepared, and no permit may be issued until after preparation of an EIS. If there is a finding of no potential for significant environmental effects, and the commissioner chooses to decide on the permit application at this stage, the commissioner must base the decision to grant or deny the permit or impose conditions on granting a permit on the findings made under this part.~~

Subp. 5. **EIS preparation and review.** An EIS, if required, must be written and reviewed under the procedures in ~~part~~ parts 4410.2000 to 4410.2300.

1558.0060 NOTIFICATION PROCEDURES FOR CERTAIN GENETICALLY ENGINEERED PLANTS.

Subpart 1. **Genetically engineered plants eligible for release under the notification procedure.** In accordance with

Adopted Rules

Minnesota Statutes, section 116C.98, genetically engineered plants that meet the eligibility criteria of items A to F and whose release meets the performance standards in subpart 2 are eligible for release under the notification procedure of subpart 3.

A. The genetically engineered plant is:

(2) additional plant species that the commissioner, after public notice and after complying with *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 18F, and the rules adopted under it, has determined may be safely used in accordance with the organism eligibility criteria in items B to F and the release performance standards in subpart 2. Supplemental notice of Federal Register items announcing changes in the list of plant species must be published in the EQB Monitor and sent to the Minnesota Department of Agriculture GEO mailing list. The Minnesota Department of Agriculture shall accept comments during the federal comment period.

F. The plant has not been modified to contain the following genetic material from ~~animals~~ animal or human pathogens:

Subp. 9. Administrative action in response to notification.

A. The commissioner shall publish notice of the proposed release at the earliest opportunity in the EQB Monitor and shall mail notice to the ~~chief executive chair~~ board of the county and the tribal council of any reservation within which the release will take place.

1558.0070 COMMERCIAL USE EXEMPTION.

Subp. 2. **Procedures.** Granting of exemptions must be based on federal delisting or deregulation, experience from past releases, and the considerations in part 1558.0030, subpart 1. GEOs that have a commercial use exemption need not obtain a release permit.

B. Supplemental notice of Federal Register items regarding delisting or deregulation of agriculturally related GEOs must be published in the EQB Monitor and sent to the Minnesota Department of Agriculture GEO mailing list. The Minnesota Department of Agriculture shall accept comments during the federal comment period. Notice of the exemption of GEOs to allow for commercial use must be published in the EQB Monitor at least 30 days prior to sale commercial use.

C. The commissioner may require additional use conditions or marketing limits to mitigate or lower risk for ~~unreasonable~~ adverse effects on ~~human health~~ humans or the environment resulting from commercial use of a GEO.

D. The commissioner may allow an exemption from item A, B, or C for commercial use of individual GEOs or classes of GEOs based on a history of past releases. There will be public notice in the first available EQB Monitor for individual exemptions. For class exemptions there must be a 30-day public comment period.

E. The commissioner may reject an application for a GEO commercial use exemption based on ~~unreasonable~~ adverse effects on ~~human health~~ humans or the environment.

F. The commissioner may modify, suspend, or revoke the commercial use exemption should any evidence of unreasonable adverse effects on human health or the environment be observed.

1558.0080 USES NOT REQUIRING A RELEASE PERMIT, NOTIFICATION, OR COMMERCIAL USE EXEMPTION.

Subp. 2. **Facility exemption.** The use of a GEO in a facility that does not meet the requirements of a containment facility, but, has been found by the commissioner to provide adequate containment, to prevent unreasonable risk of release into the environment for the specific use proposed, is not a release and does not require a release permit. The commissioner retains the right to inspect facilities to ensure compliance.

The Governor shall ensure to the extent possible that membership of the commission is balanced according to geography, race, ethnicity, age and gender. The Governor shall appoint up to five ex-officio nonvoting members from among the following agencies: Departments of Economic Security, Natural Resources, Human Services, Health, Corrections, Agriculture, Public Safety, Finance, Labor and Industry, the Minnesota Office of Volunteer Services, Housing Finance Agency, and Minnesota Technology, Inc. A representative of the Corporation for National and Community Services shall also serve as an ex-officio nonvoting member. Voting and ex-officio nonvoting members may appoint designees to act on their behalf. Monthly meetings, from 1:00 to 4:30 p.m. at the Veterans Service Building. The commission expires January 1, 1997.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) is seeking opinions, information and comments from sources outside the MPCA to assist in the preparation of proposed amendments to state water quality standards found in *Minnesota Rules* ch. 7050. In accordance with *Minnesota Statutes* § 14.09 (1994), the MPCA also seeks outside opinion, information and comment on a petition submitted to the MPCA by the National Wildlife Federation (NWF) and Great Lakes United (GLU). This NWF/GLU petition pertains to special antidegradation designations for Lake Superior. Detailed information for obtaining a copy of the NWF/GLU petition and a copy of draft rule amendments is provided later in this notice. The amendment of *Minnesota Rules* ch. 7050 is authorized by *Minnesota Statutes* § 115.03, subd. 1.

Minnesota Rules ch. 7050 includes general standards applicable to all waters of the state, including numerical water quality standards for the protection of specific beneficial uses such as swimming and fishing, effluent limitations for dischargers, and a use classification system for all waters of the state. *Minnesota Rules* ch. 7050 applies to both point and nonpoint source discharges.

On December 27, 1994, the MPCA published its first Notice to Solicit Outside Information and Opinion in the *State Register* (19 S.R. 1430). The December 27, 1994, Notice indicated the MPCA's intention to propose general statewide amendments to *Minnesota Rules* ch 7050. The MPCA now plans to focus the amendments to standards related to the Great Lakes Water Quality Initiative (GLI), to modifications of the trout waters list, and to review of specified reclassification requests identified below. Accordingly, the proposed amendments to Chapter 7050 will primarily focus on the adoption of the GLI in the Lake Superior watershed. The GLI was finalized by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in March, 1995, (60 Fed. Reg. 15366). The eight Great Lake States are required to adopt the GLI by March, 1997. If the MPCA would fail to adopt the GLI, or would adopt a version determined by EPA to be inconsistent with the final GLI (40 C.F.R. Part 132), the EPA can promulgate the GLI in Minnesota.

The MPCA may also propose amendments pertaining to reclassification of specific water bodies, which may be located outside the Lake Superior watershed. Water bodies being considered for reclassification include:

1. Additions or modifications to the list of Class 2A (trout) waters listed in *Minnesota Rules* 7050.0470 to reflect an update of waters designated as trout streams or trout lakes by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources.

2. Review of requests to reclassify specific water bodies as Class 7, Limited Resource Value Waters, as follows:
 - a. Branch No. 3, Lateral no. 2, Co. Ditch 67 and 13, at East Bethel, Anoka County;
 - b. Trout Brook, at St. Paul, Ramsey County;
 - c. Silver Creek, at Aurora, St. Louis County;
 - d. Unnamed Ditch, near Owatonna, Steele County;
 - e. Unnamed Ditch, Co. Ditch No. 37, and West Fork Beaver Creek, near Renville, Renville County; and
 - f. Unnamed Ditches, Buffalo Creek, and High Island Ditch, near Arlington, Sibley County.

The types of groups or persons likely to be affected by proposed rule amendments to *Minnesota Rules* ch. 7050 include point and nonpoint dischargers located in the Lake Superior watershed, and to the other waters that may be reclassified, also industries and municipalities located in the Lake Superior watershed, special interest groups interested in the use of waters for fishing and recreation, those persons interested in establishing water quality standards for Minnesota waters, and any other person interested in Minnesota water quality. Any interested person or groups may submit ideas, comments or opinions on proposed rule amendments, the petition submitted to the MPCA by NWF and GLU regarding special antidegradation designations for Lake Superior, and on MPCA's proposal for adopting the GLI as outlined in this Notice below.

Comments can be submitted in writing or submitted orally by telephone or in person. Oral statements will be received Monday through Friday during regular business hours from 8:00 A.M. (CST) to 4:30 P.M. (CST). All statements of information and opinion will be accepted by the MPCA until 4:30 P.M. (CST) on January 19, 1996. The MPCA does not intend to form a public task force or advisory committee for this rulemaking. MPCA's first Notice to Solicit Outside Information and Opinion, as published in the *State Register* (19 S.R. 1430) on December 27, 1994, stated that the MPCA intended to use a Technical Advisory Committee in this rulemaking under *Minnesota Statutes* § 115.54. The MPCA does not intend to use this Technical Advisory Committee as this Committee's existence was sunsetted. The MPCA does plan to hold three public meetings on the proposed rule amendments. A public meeting will take place in the evening on December 13, 1995, in Virginia, Minnesota; a second meeting will take place in the afternoon on December 14, 1995, in Duluth, Minnesota; and a third public meeting will take place in Duluth on the evening of December 14, 1995. These public meetings will provide additional opportunities for the public to comment on proposed rule amendments governing water quality standards. Details on the times and exact locations of these public meetings will be made available when final meeting arrangements have been made. Interested persons may contact David E. MPCA's Proposed Outline for Adopting GLI

- I. **Scope:** The MPCA plans to adopt the GLI in the Lake Superior watershed only, not statewide.
- II. **GLI Criteria:** The GLI includes 29 numerical water quality criteria to protect fisheries and recreation.
 - 1.) The MPCA proposes to amend several of the 29 GLI numerical water quality criteria. Some of the criteria protect drinking water and the consumption of fish by humans. These criteria are proposed to be amended in two ways:
 - A. Some GLI criteria will be lowered to be made more stringent, so that they better conform with Minnesota's exposure assumption of 30 grams of fish consumed per day (about equivalent to one half pound meal per week). This proposed change will replace GLI's 15 grams per day.
 - B. A higher and more stringent percent fat content will be assumed for the game fish taken in Lake Superior, but a slightly lower and less stringent fat content will be assumed for cool and warm water fish in the non-trout tributaries to Lake Superior, as compared to the fat content values assumed by the GLI.

2.) State water quality standards for the Lake Superior watershed address both toxicity to aquatic organisms and impacts on humans that eat fish or drink water from lakes and rivers. However, not all of EPA's GLI criteria address both aquatic toxicity and human health. The MPCA therefore, proposes to:

- A. Amend *Minnesota Rules* ch. 7050 so that where GLI criteria have not addressed both toxicity and human health, and where the existing MPCA standard is more stringent, the rules will maintain the *more stringent* standard and will continue to apply them statewide, including in the Lake Superior watershed.
- B. GLI criteria that have addressed both toxicity and human health, and that are less stringent than current state standards, will replace those standards in the Lake Superior watershed.

III. **Criteria Methods:** The MPCA proposes to adopt the GLI criteria development methodologies in the Lake Superior watershed. The statewide methods are not proposed to be modified.

IV. **Antidegradation and Special Designations:** The existing state "nondegradation" language in *Minnesota Rules* ch. 7050, appears to satisfy much of the GLI antidegradation requirements. A part of the GLI antidegradation provisions applicable to Lake Superior and its watershed, includes the option of adopting the special designations (e.g. Outstanding International Resource Waters) specified in the *Binational Agreement to Restore and Protect the Lake Superior Basin*. This Binational Agreement, signed by the Governors of all three states bordering Lake Superior, promotes the goal of zero discharge of certain bioaccumulative pollutants into the watershed.

The MPCA proposal for special designations in the Lake Superior watershed is to retain our existing Outstanding Resource Value Water (ORVW) designations on certain waters in the watershed; and to add the Outstanding International Resource Waters (OIRW) designation to all waters in the Lake Superior watershed. The MPCA believes this proposal is consistent with the Binational Agreement and the GLI. The OIRW designation on waters in the watershed would require dischargers to apply best available treatment technology to nine highly bioaccumulative and persistent chemicals. These nine chemicals are:

2,3,7,8-TCDD (dioxin)	Octachlorostyrene	Hexachlorobenzene
Chlordane	DDT and metabolites	Dieldrin
Toxaphene	PCBs	Mercury

V. **Implementation:** The MPCA is seeking the most efficient way to implement the GLI implementation procedures. Options being considered include incorporating them into Chapter 7050 by reference, or by placing the implementation procedures into a guidance document outside the rule.

Petitions Received by the MPCA:

The MPCA has been petitioned by the National Wildlife Federation (NWF) and Great Lakes United (GLU) to designate the Minnesota waters of Lake Superior as Outstanding National Resource Waters (ONRW). The ONRW designation would prohibit new or expanded discharges of persistent, bioaccumulative chemicals into Lake Superior from point and nonpoint sources including the tributaries to the Lake. ONRW designation would not affect existing discharges. The NWF/GLU list of persistent and bioaccumulative chemicals includes the nine chemicals listed in this Notice above, plus additional chemicals identified in the *Lake Superior Lakewide Management Plan*. NWF and GLU recommend adopting the ONRW designation in place of the OIRW designation as currently proposed by the MPCA and the GLI. As noted previously, MPCA is seeking opinion, information and comment on this NWF/GLU petition.

Sentencing Guidelines Commission

Notice of Public Hearing to Consider Modifications to the Sentencing Guidelines

The Minnesota Sentencing Guidelines Commission will hold a public hearing on Wednesday, December 6, 1995, at 4:30 PM in Room 15, Ground Floor, State Capitol, St. Paul, Minnesota. The Commission forwarded a report to the 1995 Legislature that detailed a proposal to modify the sentencing guidelines to ensure that scarce prison resources are reserved for the violent offender. The proposal was discussed in legislative committees and legislators suggested more study was needed to address concerns regarding the specifics of the proposal. The Commission worked to revise their proposal taking into account the various concerns of numerous interested groups and organizations. The revised proposal, while significantly different from the original, continues to address the need to reserve prison resources for the violent offender yet results in little direct impact on local correctional resources.

Just as was true with the first proposal, this proposal was developed to work together as a balanced package toward the goals of protecting the public's safety and ensuring that state correctional resources are reserved for violent offenders. The components of the proposal are outlined in section I below. Section I.a., I.b. and I.c. are currently within the Commission's authority to adopt. If adopted, the Legislature must review these modifications before they can go into effect. The Commission does not currently have the authority to adopt section I.d., which involves changes to the Intensive Community Supervision (ICS) Program. The Commission is considering recommending that the Legislature make the necessary statutory changes to implement these modifications. Section I.e. does not involve any changes to the sentencing guidelines or state law.

A summary of these proposed modifications is presented below in section I. Other modifications are noted in section II and deal with a new crime passed by the 1995 Legislature.

All interested persons are encouraged to attend the hearing and offer comments. Persons wishing to speak may register in advance by contacting the Commission staff at the above address/telephone number.

The Commission will hold the record open for five days after the public hearing to accept additional written comment on the proposed modifications. On December 12, 1995, the Commission will meet at 3:00 PM at the Minnesota Department of Corrections, 1450 Energy Park Drive, Suite 200, St. Paul, Minnesota to adopt or reject the proposed modifications. **If the proposed modifications in section II are adopted, they will become effective on December 13, 1995. If any of the stated modifications in section I.a, I.b., or I.c. are adopted, they will become effective August 1, 1996, after review by the 1996 Legislature. The Commission will also vote whether to recommend to the Legislature the proposed modifications in section I.d..**

I. Summary of Proposed Modification Package (Displayed in Accompanying Grid)

a. Reverse the Order of Severity Levels on the Guidelines Grid

Modify the grid to display severity levels in descending order. This will clearly reflect the emphasis on reserving prison resources for person offenders and is similar to guideline grids used in a number of other states.

b. Adjust Increases in Durations Across Criminal History

Provide for increases in durations across criminal history at severity levels I-VI that are at uniform intervals, consistent with increases at severity levels seven and above. Durations across history scores would increase by increments of two months at severity levels I, II and III; three months at severity level IV; five months at severity level V; and six months at severity level VI.

c. Eliminate the Distinction between Theft and Theft Related Offenses

Eliminate the distinction between Theft and Theft Related Offenses, and rank these offenses at the current Theft Related levels. For consistency, the rankings for Receiving Stolen Property would also be adjusted.

Theft Crimes over \$2,500 and Receiving Stolen Property over \$2,500 would move from the severity level IV to severity level III. These offenses would continue to be weighted at one in the calculation of criminal history scores. Theft Crimes of \$2,500 or Less and Receiving Stolen Property of \$2,500 or Less would move from severity level III to severity level II. These offenses would be weighted at one-half in the calculation of criminal history. Theft over \$35,000 would remain ranked at the severity level VI; Theft from Person, Theft of a Firearm and Motor Vehicle Theft would remain ranked at severity level IV. Motor Vehicle Use Without Consent would remain ranked at severity level III.

d. Shift Discretion from the Department of Corrections to the Sentencing Judge with Regard to Whether to Place an Offender in the Intensive Community Supervision (ICS) Program

Offenders in certain grid cells (severity levels I and II at history score six and severity levels III and IV at history scores of four or more) would be eligible to be sentenced to the ICS program. The option would apply to cells on the grid where the presumptive disposition is Commitment to the Commissioner of Corrections but the presumptive duration listed on the grid is 30 months or less. The Court, at its discretion, could sentence the offender to state prison or could choose to commit the offender to prison but sentence the offender to participate in the ICS program. Neither option would be a departure from the guidelines. The Commission is considering recommending that the Legislature make the necessary statutory changes to implement this proposal (I.d.) as it is not currently within the Commission's authority to adopt.

e. Support the Continued Development of Structured Policies and Monitoring Systems at the Local Level

Support and offer assistance to counties to continue to develop ways to structure the efficient and effective use of local resources and to develop local monitoring systems. Also, support the improvement of state-wide criminal justice information systems to include more specific information on local sanctions. With these developments, greater progress can be made toward the rational use of all limited correctional resources, not just the prison system.

II. Domestic Assault

The Commission proposes to rank Domestic Assault, *Minnesota Statutes* § 609.2242, subd. 4, at severity level I which is the same severity level ranking for the similar crime of Assault in the Fifth Degree. The Commission also proposes to add the crime of Domestic Assault to the *Misdemeanor and Gross Misdemeanor Offense List*.

Grant 1. Lead Cleanup Equipment and Material Grants

Proposals must identify lead cleanup equipment to be purchased, its cost, and how it will be made available to the public. Lead cleanup equipment includes high efficiency particle accumulator and wet vacuum cleaners, drop cloths, secure containers, respirators, scrapers, dust and particle containment material, and other cleanup and containment materials to remove loose paint and plaster, patch plaster, control household dust, wax floors, clean carpets and sidewalks, and cover bare soil. Lead cleanup equipment may include other items if the applicant justifies it as being effective at removal or disposal of lead waste.

Eligible applicants

Grant applicants must be nonprofit community-based organizations in areas at high risk for toxic lead exposure. Applicants must make an affirmative showing that the eligibility criteria are met. The IRS classifies nonprofit organizations as "501 (c) (3)" organizations.

Applicants must demonstrate ability to provide services to people who are at risk for lead exposure. Areas at high risk for toxic lead exposure include census tracts that meet one or more of the following criteria:

1. elevated blood lead levels have been diagnosed in a population of children or pregnant women;
2. many residential structures are known to have or are suspected of having deteriorated lead-based paint; or
3. median soil lead levels greater than 100 parts per million.

Eligible Costs

Eligible costs include:

1. purchase of the equipment identified in the proposal;
2. provision of a location for storage and loan to people for cleanup of residential property;
3. training of grantee's staff and of people borrowing equipment;
4. routine cleaning and maintenance of the equipment by grantee's staff; and
5. proper disposal of any waste materials on or in the equipment when it is returned.

Grant 2. Safe Housing Grants

Safe housing includes lead-safe temporary shelter for families displaced by lead abatement ordered by a board of health.

Eligible applicants

Applicants must be boards of health.

Eligible Costs

Eligible costs include:

1. inspection of housing prior to purchase or rent;
2. purchase or rent of temporary housing found by inspection to be free of sources of immediate lead exposure, i.e., free of deteriorating lead-based paint, free of bare lead-contaminated soil and dust, and free of lead-contaminated drinking water; and
3. moving expenses up to \$250 per family.


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
