

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## Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions =

#### NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. The current 1999 set is a 13-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the most current edition of the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive; issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26; issues #27-38 inclusive; issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39; issues #40-51 inclusive; and issues #1-52 (or 53 in some years), cumulative for issues #1-52 (or 53). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. ## **Board of Pharmacy**

Request for Comments on Planned Amendment to Rules Governing Pharmacy Practice, including Lunch Breaks for Pharmacists, Electronic Prescribing, Controlled Substance Rescheduling, Expiration Dates, Returns of Medications, Telepharmacy, OBRA 90 expansion, Reciprocity Examinations, Internship Requirements, Lighting Standards, and Hospital Emergency Room Dispensing, *Minnesota Rules*, 6800.0100 et seq

**Subject of Rules.** The Minnesota Board of Pharmacy requests comments on its planned amendment to rules governing Pharmacy Practice. The Board is considering rule amendments that address Lunch Breaks for Pharmacists, Electronic Prescribing, Controlled Substance Rescheduling, Expiration Dates, Returns of Medications, Telepharmacy, OBRA 90 expansion, Reciprocity Examinations, Internship Requirements, Lighting Standards, and Hospital Emergency Room Dispensing.

Persons Affected. The amendment to the rules would likely affect all pharmacists practicing in Minnesota.

**Statutory Authority.** *Minnesota Statutes*, section 151.06 Subd. 1 (c), authorizes the Board to adopt rules for carrying out the provisions of the Pharmacy Practice Act and *Minnesota Statutes*, section 152.02 Subd. 8, authorizes the Board to schedule and reschedule controlled substance drugs.

**Public Comment.** Interested persons or groups may submit comments or information on these planned rules in writing until 4:30 p.m. on Friday June 8, 2001. The Board does contemplate appointing an advisory committee to comment on the planned rules. Representatives of MPhA, MSHP, and others will be invited to participate on the advisory committee.

Rules Drafts. The Board has not yet prepared a draft of the planned rule amendments.

## Opinions Sought on a Proposed Variance from Rules as Applicable to State-Aid and Federal-Aid Construction Plans

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Commissioner of Transportation pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* 162.02, subd. 3a, shall accept comments concerning a proposed variance from rules as applicable to state-aid and federal-aid construction plans.

The proposed variance from *Minnesota Rules* for State Aid Operations 8820.9920, adopted pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* Chapters 161 and 162, allows bridge replacement projects located off the State Aid system to be excluded from the Surfacing requirement on projects with Annual Daily Traffic of 150 or greater. This variance shall expire at the subsequent adoption of rules or by notice of the Commissioner of Transportation.

Any person may file a written objection to the variance request with the Commissioner of Transportation, Transportation Building, St. Paul, Minnesota 55155.

### Appointment of a State Aid Variance Committee

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Commissioner of Transportation has appointed a State Aid Variance Committee who will conduct a meeting on Wednesday, March 28, 2001 at 9:30 a.m. in Conference Room 9, Arden Hills Training Center, 1900 West County Road I, Shoreview, Minnesota, 55126.

The purpose of this open meeting is to investigate and determine recommendations for variance requests from minimum State Aid roadway standards and administrative procedures as governed by *Minnesota Rules* for State Aid Operations 8820.3300 adopted pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* Chapters 161 and 162.

The agenda will be limited to the following:

- 1. **Petition of the City of Ham Lake** for a variance from *Minnesota Rules* 8820.9936 as they apply to a construction project on Municipal State Aid Street No. 123 (Johnson Street and 136th Lane), located between Bunker Lake Boulevard and Trunk Highway No. 65 in the City of Ham Lake, Minnesota, so as to permit the horizontal design speed at the intersections located at Johnson Street and 136th Lane and 136th Lane and the Trunk Highway No. 65 Frontage Road at less than the required 30 mph design speed.

Request for Proposals for Targeted Ad Placement and Ad Development of Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) and Other Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STDs) Prevention and Service Related Materials

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the AIDS/STD Prevention Services Section, Division of Infectious Disease Prevention and Control, Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) is seeking proposals from qualified agencies for targeted placement and development of print indoor/outdoor, and/or media broadcast media products with HIV/STD prevention and service related materials.

#### **Background**

The Minnesota Department of Health has \$60,000 in federal funds for targeted ad placements and ad development of HIV/STD prevention and service related materials for the period, August 1, 2001 - July 31, 2003. The contract period and the total amount of funding for placement may be extended beyond the given contract period at the option of the state.

#### Goal

It is the goal of this project to increase the number of residents from the selected target audiences accessing the Minnesota AIDS Project (MAP) AIDSLine and the Family Planning and STD Hotline for accurate, up-to-date information about the prevention,

testing and treatment of HIV/AIDS and other STDs; and to increase the number of residents accessing MDH funded agencies providing HIV/STD prevention interventions. Messages will encourage members of the target audiences to know their HIV/STD status and to practice prevention such as condom usage and avoiding needle sharing for injecting drugs, tattooing or body piercing.

#### **Target Audiences**

"Select" audiences will continue to be important target groups for all HIV/STD risk reduction media efforts. It is important to reach "select" audiences with HIV/STD risk reduction messages due to the disproportionate number of HIV infections and STDs within these groups. Among the select audiences, it is paramount to reach young persons (ages 13 to 29 years) who are engaging in high risk behaviors for acquiring or spreading HIV/STDs, such as injecting drug use and unprotected sex:

- Men who have sex with men (MSM) including those who identify and don't identify as MSM
- MSM or Color (African American, Latino, Native American and Asian)
- · African American heterosexual young women
- African American heterosexual young men

### Eligibility

Responders must demonstrate administrative, organizational, fiscal, and creative capability to develop targeted media materials and produce corresponding media placement plans, and to implement and evaluate each placement effort. Other desirable qualifications include experience with public service or public health projects and experience in working with the identified select audiences as described in the Request for Proposal application.

### **Minimum Expectations**

The selected agency for this contract will be responsible for developing some print, indoor/outdoor and/or broadcast media materials and corresponding comprehensive media placement plans at designated times during the contract period, August 1, 2001 - July 31, 2003, for a total amount of \$60,000 (approximately \$20,000 for ad placements and \$40,000 for ad development). Sample tasks may include:

- Develop, implement and evaluate a comprehensive media placement plan for a one- or two-month period at a designated time in 2002 to promote the MAP AIDSLine as advised by the MAP Advisory Group (\$20,000 total cost for the ad placements and development of one new ad).
- Develop two new radio ads for use during National STD Awareness Month, April 1 April 30, 2002, for \$20,000 total cost, to promote the Minnesota Family Planning and STD Hotline.
- Develop, implement and evaluate a comprehensive media placement plan for a two-month period, May 1 June 30, 2002, for \$20,000 total cost for the ad placements and development of one new indoor/outdoor ad in association with the Gay/Lesbian/Bisexual/Transgender Pride Month to promote MDH funded agencies providing HIV/STD prevention programs for MSM.

The selected agency shall not claim more than five percent commission on any and all ad placements. As needed, the selected agency will localize print and broadcast ads provided by the MDH as directed by the MDH. The selected agency will actively negotiate additional public service time, space and rate reductions and behalf of the media placement effort. The selected agency shall provide a written report to the MDH after each campaign that will evaluate the campaign, document costs per space and air purchases, estimate the number of readers, listeners and viewers reached with the campaign for the identified target groups.


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
