Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. The current 1999 set is a 13-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the most current edition of the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive; issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26; issues #27-38 inclusive; issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39; issues #40-51 inclusive; and issues #1-52 (or 53 in some years), cumulative for issues #1-52 (or 53). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. Minnesota Higher Education Facilities Authority Notice of Public Hearing on Revenue Obligations for Macalester College, St. Paul, Minnesota

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing will be held by the Minnesota Higher Education Facilities Authority (the "Authority") with respect to a proposal to issue revenue bonds or other obligations on behalf of Macalester College (the "College"), as owner and operator of the College, at the Authority's office at Suite 450, 380 Jackson Street, Saint Paul, Minnesota on October 20, 2004 at 2:00 p.m.

Under the proposal, the Authority would issue its revenue bonds or other obligations in an original principal amount of up to approximately \$17,250,000 to finance a project (the "Project") generally described as: (a) the refunding of the Authority's outstanding Revenue Bonds, Series Four-C (Macalester College), dated November 1, 1995, which were issued in the original principal amount of \$11,245,000 to provide funds for the renovation and expansion of Rice and Olin Halls into a single science and math facility; and (b) the refunding of the Authority's outstanding Revenue Bonds, Series Four-J (Macalester College), dated May 1, 1997, which were issued in the original principal amount of \$11,000,000 to provide funds for (i) the construction, furnishing and equipping of George Draper Dayton Hall, a residence hall for approximately 113 beds with recreational and instructional space; (ii) acquisition and installation of a boiler, central chiller, heating oil tank and related piping and tunneling; and (iii) partial renovation of Wallace and Bigelow Halls to expand capacity by 30 to 35 beds; all owned and operated by the College and located on the College's campus, the principal street address of which is 1600 Grand Avenue, Saint Paul, Minnesota 55105.

At said time and place the Authority shall give all parties who appear or who have submitted written comments and opportunity to express their views with respect to the proposal to undertake and finance the Project.

Department of Human Services Request for Grant Proposals to Support and Facilitate Access and Visitation by Non-Custodial Parents with Their Children

The Minnesota Department of Human Services, Office of Child Support Enforcement (State), is seeking proposals from qualified Responders operating programs in Minnesota which support and facilitate access and visitation by non-custodial parents with their children. Successful Responder(s) will receive project funds to be used to address critical needs in providing access and visitation programming.

Funds for this initiative are made available by the federal Access and Visitation Grant, administered by the Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families. Eligible Responders for this funding include courts, state or local public agencies, and/or nonprofit entities such as community and faith-based organizations. Applicants awarded grant funding must meet all federal and state grant requirements and adhere to the terms and conditions of the standard contract agreement to receive Access to Visitation Grant funds. **The State will not award grant funding to programs that do not meet grant compliance requirements.** Preference will be given to fund programs and activities that have regional or statewide impact and that serve low- and moderate-income individuals and families.

Selected programs must be conducted in an effective and efficient manner and, most importantly, contain procedures necessary to ensure the safety of parents and children. Pursuant to 42 U.S.C. §669B(a), program activities may include, but are not limited to:

- · Facilitating, expediting, or enforcing visitation
- · Voluntary mediation to resolve custody and visitation disagreements
- · Development of parenting plans
- Education
- Counseling
- Neutral drop-off and pick-up services
- · Supervised visitation, and
- · Development of guidelines for visitation and alternative custody arrangements

Successful Responder(s) will provide these services through a one year grant contract entered into with the State. Selected Proposals will have the potential of receiving up to four one year extensions of the grant, depending on a variety of factors, including program performance and fund availability.

A total of \$123,675.00 in federal funding is available for the projects outlined in this RFP. Multiple grants may be awarded to different agencies. In accordance with federal law, the maximum federal match for the grant is 90 percent of eligible expenditures. Therefore, Successful Grantees must provide a minimum of 10 percent match of the total project amount. This match can be met via cash and in-kind by the Grantee. Proposals may be made for any amount, to include up to the total federal grant amount of \$123,675.00.

The number of grants awarded and the amount of each will depend on the demand for funds and the nature of the requests. Because of the high demand for the types of services funded under this grant program and the number of anticipated grant proposals, some applicants may not receive funding. The State determines the final number and amounts of grant awards. The grant funds shall be awarded with the intent of approving as many requests for proposals as possible while assuring that each approved proposal would provide beneficial services and satisfy the overall goals of the program. The anticipated start date for the grant is February 1, 2005.

Proposals must be submitted by **4:00 p.m. on November 15, 2004.** This RFP does not obligate the State to complete the proposed project and the State reserves the right to cancel the solicitation if it is considered to be in its best interest.
