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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. The current 1999 set is a 13-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the most current edition of the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive; issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26; issues #27-38 inclusive; issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39; issues #40-51 inclusive; and issues #1-52 (or 53 in some years), cumulative for issues #1-52 (or 53). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. Notice of Intent to Accept Applications for Clean Water Legacy Phosphorous Reduction Grants

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Public Facilities Authority (PFA) is accepting applications for Clean Water Legacy Phosphorus Reduction Grants. The Minnesota Legislature established the Phosphorus Reduction Grants program in *Minnesota Laws* 2006, Chapter 251, Section 14 (to be codified as *Minnesota Statutes* Section 446A.074) to assist municipalities with the costs of wastewater treatment projects, or portions thereof, that will reduce the discharge of total phosphorus to one milligram per liter or less. Grants will be awarded by the Authority to governmental units for up to 75% of the eligible capital costs for phosphorus treatment.

Background:

The Phosphorus Reduction Grant program is administered by the PFA in cooperation with the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA). The MPCA is responsible for identifying eligible projects, approving facilities plans, determining eligible project costs, and reviewing and certifying approved projects to the PFA. The PFA is responsible for managing the application process, ensuring that total financing for each project is in place, and awarding the grants.

Eligible Projects:

To be eligible for a Phosphorus Reduction grant, a municipality's discharge permit incorporating the applicable discharge limit must have been issued on or after March 28, 2000. Additional eligibility requirements are described in the program statutes in *Minnesota Laws* 2006, Chapter 251, Section 14 (to be codified as *Minnesota Statutes* Section 446A.074). Eligible projects must be publicly-owned and meet all requirements for the use of state general obligation bonds. or by calling the PFA at (651) 296-3562. In addition, MPCA must review and approve a facilities plan for the project and certify the eligible costs to the PFA.

Project Priorities:

Priority will first be given to projects that start construction after July 1, 2006 and meet all eligibility requirements, including MPCA approval and certification, by May 1, 2007. Any funds remaining after May 1, 2007 will be used for grants to projects that started construction prior to July 1, 2006. In either case, grants will be awarded in the order of the date of the MPCA's approval of the project facilities plan.

Funds Available in FY 2007: \$2,310,000. A grant must not exceed \$500,000 per project.

Notice of Intent to Accept Applications for Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) Grants

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Public Facilities Authority (PFA) is accepting applications for Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) grants. The Minnesota Legislature has created the TMDL grant program under *Minnesota Statutes*, Section 446A.073 (2005, and amended by *Minnesota Laws 2006*, Chapter 251, Section 21, Subdivision 9) to assist municipalities with the cost of publicly-owned wastewater or stormwater projects needed to meet wasteload reductions under a TMDL study or implementation plan prepared and approved in accordance with the federal Clean Water Act. A project may receive a TMDL grant for up to 50% of the eligible project costs.

Background:

The TMDL grant program is administered by the PFA in cooperation with the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA). The MPCA is responsible for identifying eligible projects, determining eligible project costs, reviewing project plans and specifications, and certifying approved projects to the PFA. The PFA is responsible for managing the application process, ensuring that total financing for each project is in place, and awarding the grants.

Eligible Projects:

To be eligible for a TMDL grant, a proposed project must be necessary to achieve wasteload reductions identified in a TMDL study or implementation plan prepared in accordance with Section 303(d) of the federal Clean Water Act. Eligible projects must be publicly-owned and meet all requirements for the use of state general obligation bond proceeds. TMDL studies must be certified by the MPCA to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and approved by the EPA. A list of potentially eligible municipalities is available on the MPCA's website at www.pca.state.mn.us/water/wastewater.html#financial

or by calling the PFA at (651) 296-3562. In addition, MPCA must review and certify approved projects and eligible costs, including calculation of the essential project component percentage in accordance with *Minnesota Statutes*, Section 116.182.

Project Priorities:

The PFA will reserve money for projects first in the order that their TMDL study was approved by the EPA, and secondly, in the order that their applications are received. Funds will be reserved based on the estimated eligible costs or the as-bid costs, whichever is less. Projects with funds reserved will have until June 30, 2007 to receive MPCA approval and certification of their plans and specifications, and to document that total project financing is in place. Projects not meeting these requirements by June 30, 2007 will lose their funding priority for that year and will have to reapply for the program in the following year, if additional funds are available.

Funds Available: \$5,000,000 appropriated in 2006, plus any remaining balance from funds appropriated in 2005.

Notice of Intent to Solicit Intercity Bus Grant Proposals

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Department of Transportation (Mn/DOT), Office if Transit is currently soliciting grant applications through its Intercity Bus Grant Program. Intercity Bus is a grant program funded through the United States Department of Transportation, Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5311(f). Grants are for operating assistance for routes between regional trade centers in Greater Minnesota. Grants are also available for capital assistance, marketing and planning studies.

FTA requires that 15 percent of the state's apportionment for non-urbanized area transit funding be used to support the following national objectives:

- Support meaningful connections between nonurbanized areas and the regional or national system of intercity bus service;
- · Support services to meet the intercity needs of residents in nonurbanized areas; and
- Support the infrastructure of the intercity bus network through planning, marketing assistance, and capital investment in facilities and equipment.

Funding granted to support operating either new or existing intercity bus routes will be at the rate of fifty percent of the operating deficit. Funding granted for capital, marketing or planning will be at the rate of eighty percent of budgeted expenses. This program is funded by federal funds and successful applicants will be required to abide by all pertinent rules and regulations related to federal grants. The State of Minnesota (State) through its Department of Administration's State Architect's Office (SAO), requests proposals and fee schedules from firms and individuals (Responder) to provide industrial hygiene services, including but not limited to, project management, testing, sample collection and analysis, and surveys for abatement of asbestos and other hazardous materials.
