Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. The current 1999 set is a 13-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the most current edition of the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive; issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26; issues #27-38 inclusive; issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39; issues #40-51 inclusive; and issues #1-52 (or 53 in some years), cumulative for issues #1-52 (or 53). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101, an agency must first solicit comments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

Notice of Public Comment Period on the Draft Revisions to the Minnesota Pesticide Management Plan: A Plan for the Protection of Groundwater and Surface Water

NOTICE IS HERBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Department of Agriculture (MDA) is seeking comment on draft revisions to the state Pesticide Management Plan (PMP). The PMP is the state of Minnesota's plan for preventing and addressing pesticide non-point source contamination of surface water and groundwater resources. Comments should be submitted to the MDA by September 13, 2007. After September 13, the MDA will review and consider submitted comments and publish a revised PMP, or the MDA may further revise the PMP and seek additional public comment.

The PMP was most recently revised through public stakeholder meetings held in the fall of 2003. A final PMP was published in June 2005. The Minnesota Office of the Legislative Auditor conducted an audit of MDA pesticide programs in 2005 and published its findings in February 2006. The audit included recommendations that the MDA further revise the PMP to better address issues of urban pesticide use, aquatic pesticides, and product registration.

The MDA is seeking public comment on those portions of the PMP that have undergone revision in response to the audit. A draft version of the PMP that includes the proposed revisions is available for download from the MDA web site at:

Minnesota Department of Commerce REQUEST FOR COMMENTS on Possible Rules Governing Military Sales Practices

Subject of Rules. The Minnesota Department of Commerce requests comments on its possible rules governing the solicitation or sale of life insurance or annuity products by an insurer or an insurance producer to an active duty service member of the U.S Armed Forces. The Department is considering the adoption of the NAIC Military Sales Practices Model Regulation that would set forth standards to protect active duty service members from dishonest and predatory insurance sales practices and identify certain practices as false, misleading, deceptive and unfair. The proposed model regulation has been developed to meet the Congressional mandates set forth in the federal Military Personnel Financial Services Protection Act, Pub. L. No. 109-290 (2006.)

Persons Affected. The rules would likely affect insurance companies and producers that sell life insurance and annuity products.

Statutory Authority. *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 72A.19 subd. 2, 72A.20 subd. 18 and 45.023 authorize the Department to adopt rules to administer and enforce prohibitions against unfair methods of competition or unfair or deceptive acts or practices in the business of insurance.

Public Comment. Interested persons or groups may submit comments or information on these possible rules in writing until further notice is published in the *State Register* that the Department intends to adopt or to withdraw the rules. The Department does not contemplate appointing an advisory committee to comment on the possible rules.

Rules Drafts. The Department has not yet prepared a draft of the proposed rules, however it intends to follow closely the language of the NAIC Military Sales Practices Model Regulation. A copy of the model regulation is available for review.

Notice of Availability of Funds for Employment Services, Re-Entry, and Mentoring for Ex-Offenders and Children of Incarcerated Parents

The Minnesota Department of Corrections, Community Services Division, announces the availability of funds for the 21-month period of October 1, 2007, through June 30, 2009, for the following categories:

Category A: Employment Services for Ex-Offenders Pilot Project

\$400,000 is available to a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization for one pilot project to provide employment services to ex-criminal offenders living in the **North Minneapolis** community.

Category B: Domestic Abuse Re-Entry

\$400,000 is available to a non-profit or a public or private institution of higher education to provide services to re-entering offenders and their intimate partners to: (1) reduce the incidence of domestic violence among offenders re-entering the community; (2) reduce occurrences of domestic violence, serious injury, and death experienced by intimate partners who are in relationships with offenders recently released from jail or prison; and (3) reduce criminal recidivism due to domestic violence.

Category C: Mentoring Grant for Children of Incarcerated Parents

\$750,000 is available to a non-profit 501(c)(3) organizations to provide one-to-one mentoring relationships to youth between the ages of 7 and 13 whose parent or other significant family member is incarcerated in a county workhouse, county jail, state prison, or other type of correctional facility or is subject to correctional supervision.

The submission deadline for proposals is 12:00 noon, Monday, August 20, 2007.
