## Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. The current 1999 set is a 13-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the most current edition of the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

## **Exempt Rules**

Exempt rules are excluded from the normal rulemaking procedures (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.386 and 14.388). They are most often of two kinds. One kind is specifically exempted by the Legislature from rulemaking procedures, but approved for form by the Revisor of Statutes, reviewed for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings, and then published in the *State Register*. These exempt rules are effective for two years only.

The second kind of exempt rule is one adopted where an agency for good cause finds that the rulemaking provisions of *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 14 are unnecessary, impracticable, or contrary to the public interest. This exemption can be used only where the rules:

- (1) address a serious and immediate threat to the public health, safety, or welfare, or
- (2) comply with a court order or a requirement in federal law in a manner that does not allow for compliance with *Minnesota Statutes* Sections 14.14-14.28, or
  - (3) incorporate specific changes set forth in applicable statutes when no interpretation of law is required, or
  - (4) make changes that do not alter the sense, meaning, or effect of the rules.

These exempt rules are also reviewed for form by the Revisor of Statutes, for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings and then published in the *State Register*. In addition, the Office of Administrative Hearings must determine whether the agency has provided adequate justification for the use of this exemption. Rules adopted under clauses (1) or (2) above are effective for two years only. The Legislature may also exempt an agency from the normal rulemaking procedures and establish other procedural and substantive requirements unique to that exemption.

#### **Summary of Change**

The following is a brief summary of the proposed change. The complete text of the proposed revision follows this brief summary.

The MPCA is modifying *Minnesota Rules*, part 7001.1030, subpart 2(A) which exempts persons who discharge sewage or effluent from a vessel. The MPCA is removing the exemption for effluent discharges from vessels but retaining the sewage exemption.

#### Background:

Recent court decisions are the basis for the proposed removal of the MPCA's current exemption of vessel discharges from NPDES permitting.

On April 21, 2008, the Ramsey County District Court in Minnesota found the agency's rule exempting vessel discharges from NPDES permitting (*Minnesota Rule* 7001.1030) invalid with respect to ballast water discharges into Lake Superior and ordered the rule vacated as of October 1, 2008.

In addition, on March 30, 2005, the Federal District Court in Northern California issued a ruling that the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) had exceeded its statutory authority when, over 30 years ago, the EPA issued a regulation excluding "discharges incidental to normal operation of a vessel at 40 CFR 122.3(a)" from CWA NPDES permit requirements. On September 18, 2006, the Court issued an order vacating the regulation as of September 30, 2008. *Northwest Environmental Advocates v. EPA*, No. C 03-5760 SI, 2006 EL 2669042 (N.D. Cal. Sep. 18, 2006) On July 23, 2008, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth District upheld the ruling of the lower court declaring the earlier exemption unlawful and requiring EPA to develop a permit program by September 30, 2008. EPA requested an extension to this deadline, and in an order signed August 31, 2008, the Federal District Court for Northern California granted an extension of the vacatur until December 19, 2008.

*Minnesota Rule* 7001.1030, subpart 2(A) currently exempts vessel discharges from NPDES permitting. (Since sewage discharges are currently regulated under Section 312 of the Clean Water Act, that exemption would be retained.) The MPCA must remove this exemption to be consistent with the federal court's ruling and to comply with the Ramsey County District Court's order.

#### 7001.1030 PERMIT REQUIREMENT AND EXEMPTIONS.

Subpart 1. **Permit required.** Except as provided in subpart 2, no person may discharge a pollutant from a point source into the waters of the state without obtaining a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit from the agency.

Subp. 2. Exemptions. The following persons are not required to obtain a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit:

A. persons who discharge sewage or effluent from a vessel;

#### **Request for Information in Conducting Forest Management**

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the Request for Information (RFI) is for the Department of Natural Resources, to obtain information from vendors who might be interested in conducting forest management on select state owned lands in St. Louis, Lake, Cook and Koochiching Counties through a lease program. The lands are outside of state forests, scattered throughout these counties (see map).

#### 2. OBJECTIVE

The objective of the Department of Natural Resources is to improve the productivity of scattered lands through more intensive management by the most cost effective means. The lease would provide for exclusive rights to biomass and timber resources for a 10-year lease period in exchange for lease and royalty payments to the State. DNR's interest is in accomplishing sustainable management objectives in accordance with a sustainable forest management plan. Following forest certification management principles and activities should result in more productive forest stands for the future.

#### 3. TECHNICAL CONSIDERATIONS

The proposed lease lands are located in scattered parcels ranging from 20 to 200 acres, with a median size of approximately 80 acres. Total acres are approximately 8000. Parcels identified include conifer stands requiring precommercial thinning (~280 acres), upland and lowland brush sites (~2400 acres) and highly damaged and declining forest stands with low timber volume (~5300 acres).
