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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. 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Proposed Rules

Comments on Planned Rules or Rule Amendments. An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

Rules to be Adopted After a Hearing. After receiving comments and deciding to hold a public hearing on the rule, an agency drafts its rule. It then publishes its rules with a notice of hearing. All persons wishing to make a statement must register at the hearing. Anyone who wishes to submit written comments may do so at the hearing, or within five working days of the close of the hearing. Administrative law judges may, during the hearing, extend the period for receiving comments up to 20 calendar days. For five business days after the submission period the agency and interested persons may respond to any new information submitted during the written submission period and the record then is closed. The administrative law judge prepares a report within 30 days, stating findings of fact, conclusions and recommendations. After receiving the report, the agency decides whether to adopt, withdraw or modify the proposed rule based on consideration of the comments made during the rule hearing procedure and the report of the administrative law judge. The agency must wait five days after receiving the report before taking any action.

Rules to be Adopted Without a Hearing. Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* § 14.22, an agency may propose to adopt, amend, suspend or repeal rules without first holding a public hearing. An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public. The agency then publishes a notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing, together with the proposed rules, in the *State Register*. If, during the 30-day comment period, 25 or more persons submit to the agency a written request for a hearing of the proposed rules, the agency must proceed under the provisions of §§ 14.14-14.20, which state that if an agency decides to hold a public hearing, it must publish a notice of intent in the *State Register*.

Proposed Amendment and Adoption of the Rules Governing Lawful Gambling: General Provisions, *Minnesota Rules*, parts 7861.0210 to 7861.0340; Gambling Equipment Distributors; Distributor Salespersons, *Minnesota Rules*, parts 7863.0210 and 7863.0220; Linked Bingo Game Providers, *Minnesota Rules*, parts 7863.0250 and 7863.0260; Gambling Equipment Manufacturers, *Minnesota Rules*, parts 7864.0210 to 7864.0230; and Gambling Licensees; Disciplinary Actions, *Minnesota Rules*, parts 7865.0210 to 7865.0250, and Proposed Repeal of Obsolete Language.

NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT RULES WITHOUT A PUBLIC HEARING.

Introduction. The Gambling Control Board intends to adopt rules without a public hearing following the procedures set forth in the rules of the Office of Administrative Hearings, *Minnesota Rules*, parts 1400.2300 to 1400.2310, and the Administrative Procedure Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.22 to 14.28. Until December 1, 2010, you may submit written comments on the proposed rules. Until December 1, 2010, you may submit a written request that a hearing be held on the rules.

Agency Contact Person. Comments or questions on the rules and written requests for a public hearing on the rules must be submitted to the agency contact person. Subject of Rules and Statutory Authority. The proposed rules pertaining to lawful gambling, chapters 7861, 7863, 7864, and 7865, are being amended to address statutory changes that occurred in 2007, 2008, and 2009; to repeal obsolete language; delete unnecessary language; provide clarification of rule language; and consolidate similar requirements.

- In part 7861.0210, the proposed rules pertain to definitions commonly used in the lawful gambling industry by organizations, distributors, linked bingo game providers, manufacturers, and independent testing laboratories. Definitions are being clarified, a new definition of lessor's immediate family is added, and obsolete definitions deleted.
- In part 7861.0220, the proposed rules pertaining to an organization license application primarily address the 2009 statutory changes establishing a perpetual organization license term, eliminating license renewal, requiring tax identification numbers, and deleting unnecessary application information.

Proposed Rules

- In part 7861.0230, the proposed rules pertaining to the gambling manager and assistant gambling manager primarily address statutory changes that eliminate gambling manager license renewals, delete obsolete training requirement language, and amend the emergency gambling manager replacement process.
- In part 7861.0240, the proposed rules pertaining to premises permits primarily address statutory changes that eliminate premises permit renewals. Other changes include a simplification of the resolution process and creating a separate subpart for the contents of a lease by using existing rule language.
- In part 7861.0260, the proposed rules pertaining to the conduct of lawful gambling are primarily to address statutory changes; delete obsolete language; clarify language pertaining to advertising; and provide an exception to allow required posting information to be included in the bingo program as an alternative to posting the information. The proposed rules also allow an exception for advance prize ownership for raffles with gross receipts of \$60 or less, and also allow an organization to purchase from the lessor a certificate for merchandise or gift card to be redeemed for food or beverages at the premises with certain restrictions.
- In part 7861.0270, the proposed rules pertaining to the conduct of bingo address statutory changes, remove obsolete language, and clarify existing language. Proposed changes include clarification of terms, such as facsimiles, used in conjunction with electronic bingo devices; removing restrictions and clarifying bingo games that may be played with an electronic bingo device; creating a new subpart with existing language for use of electronic bingo devices; amending language to allow audio function for electronic bingo devices; clarifying that bingo sales must take place at the permitted premises; removing advertising restrictions; deleting the reference to “immediate family member” for bingo game verification; clarifying that a bingo player may win a game based on game requirements instead of a winning pattern; and moving linked bingo game provider requirements for the conduct of linked bingo to part 7863.0260.
- In part 7861.0280, the proposed rules pertaining to the conduct of pull-tabs clarifies the restrictions for transferring games at an owned or leased site; eliminates obsolete language; and for pull-tab dispensing devices removes restrictions on currency, advertising, electronic display, random dispensing, and use of columns.
- In part 7861.0290, the proposed rules pertaining to the conduct of tipboards clarifies the restrictions for transferring games at an owned or leased site and eliminates obsolete language;
- In part 7861.0300, the proposed rules pertaining to the conduct of paddlewheels clarifies the requirements for determining a paddlewheel winner; eliminates obsolete language; and requires that a replacement gambling manager attend a paddlewheel with table training class.
- In part 7861.0310, the proposed rules pertaining to the conduct of raffles clarifies recordkeeping, clarifies the awarding of alcohol prizes; removes the commercial advertising restriction; and simplifies record retention for button raffles.
- In part 7861.0320, the proposed rules pertain to a licensed organization’s operations, accounts, reports, and records. The proposed rules address statutory changes; require the use of a board-prescribed internal controls form; clarify expenditures made electronically; clarify all income derived from lawful gambling; clarify that fund losses include prizes paid from a game not conducted in compliance with statute and rule; clarify annual reporting standards for 501(c)(3) organizations and 501(c)(4) festival organizations; clarify immediate family members of active military personnel; and delete obsolete allowable expense calculation language.
- In parts 7861.0330 and part 7861.0340, the proposed rules pertaining to excluded bingo and exempted lawful gambling include an amendment for organization tax identification, if any.
- In part 7863.0210, the proposed rules pertaining to distributors and distributor salesperson licenses include an amendment for tax identification information and clarifies and reduces application information for nonsales employees.
- In part 7863.0220, the proposed rules pertaining to distributor operations, accounts, reports, and records address statutory changes including delinquency report requirements; clarify lease requirements for electronic bingo devices; new language pertaining to gambling equipment sold or leased on an exclusive basis; new language pertaining to sales invoices for promotional tickets; and amend sales invoice requirements to include tax identification numbers.

Proposed Rules

- In part 7863.0250, the proposed rules pertaining to linked bingo game provider licenses addresses statutory changes; deletes advertising restrictions; requires tax identification numbers; and deletes and moves linked bingo game system requirements to part 7863.0260.
- In part 7863.0260, the proposed rules pertaining to linked bingo game provider operations, accounts, reports, and records includes new subparts using existing language for the linked bingo game system and the conduct of linked bingo; addresses statutory changes including fee structure and delinquency reporting requirements; requires tax identification numbers for invoices; and includes new language for the lease of electronic bingo devices.
- In part 7864.0210, the proposed rules pertaining to manufacturer licenses includes requiring tax identification numbers and clarifying sales employee.
- In part 7864.0230, the proposed rules pertaining to manufacturer standards for lawful gambling equipment will consolidate existing language, amend standards for pull-tab dispensing devices and electronic bingo devices, and establish standards for programmable electronic devices.
- In part 7864.0230, the proposed rules pertaining to pull-tab and tipboard standards include a consolidation of existing language; deletion of obsolete ticket price language; allowance for latex-type seals for flares and prize pool boards but not for tickets; clarifying the heat-seal process; for new members of a previously approved family of games requiring the manufacturer to provide the date when that family of games was previously approved by the board; and providing timeframes when games must be in compliance with the standards.
- In part 7863.0230, the proposed rules include new language for manufacturing standards for promotional tickets that mimic a pull-tab and tipboard.
- In part 7863.0230, the proposed rules pertaining to pull-tab dispensing devices include the deletion of the advertising restriction; allowance for electronic display screen; deletion of randomization dispensing requirement; modifying column requirements; and deletion of United States currency denomination restriction.
- In part 7863.0230 the proposed rules pertaining to electronic bingo devices allows the devices to be used for breakopen bingo games and for games in which the bingo player selects bingo numbers; removes the advertising restrictions; clarifies facsimiles of bingo faces; allows audio component for winner notification; and addresses statutory changes.
- In part 7863.0230 the proposed rules contain new language establishing standards for programmable electronic devices as defined in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 349.12, subdivision 18.
- In part 7864.0240, the proposed rules pertaining to manufacturer operations, accounts, reports, and records addresses statutory changes for delinquency reports; amends with new language clarification of lawful gambling equipment sold or leased on an exclusive basis; clarifies the lease of electronic bingo devices; and for sales invoices requires tax identification information.
- In part 7865.0210, the proposed rules pertaining to the compliance review group includes clarification of the existing process, criteria, and consent orders.
- In part 7865.0220, the proposed rules pertaining to suspension or revocation of licenses or permits includes a clarification of criteria based on statutory language and when the matter becomes a contested case.
- In part 7865.0225, the proposed rules pertaining to reimbursements to the gambling account includes clarification of when the reimbursement becomes a contested case.
- In part 7865.0230, the proposed rules pertaining to fines and other sanctions amends the language based on statutory changes and repeals obsolete language pertaining to fines for expenses calculations.
- In part 7865.0250, the proposed rules pertaining to rule variances includes clarification of the rule variance process, including reference to *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.056.

Proposed Rules

- In part 7865.0260, the proposed rules pertaining to hearings and appeals of incomplete or denied license and permit applications includes the deletion of obsolete language referencing organization license renewals.
- Being repealed are *Minnesota Rules*, parts 7861.0210, subparts 10, 23, and 27; 7861.0320, subparts 10, 11, 12, and 13; 7864.0230, subpart 3; 7865.0230, subpart 2; and 7865.0260, subpart 3.

Your comment should identify the portion of the proposed rules addressed and the reason for the comment. You are encouraged to propose any change desired. Any comments that you would like to make on the legality of the proposed rules must also be made during this comment period.

Request for a Hearing. In addition to submitting comments, you may also request that a hearing be held on the rules. Your request for a public hearing must be in writing and must be received by the agency contact person by 4:30 p.m. on December 1, 2010. Your written request for a public hearing must include your name and address. You must identify the portion of the proposed rules to which you object or state that you oppose the entire set of rules. Any request that does not comply with these requirements is not valid and cannot be counted by the agency when determining whether a public hearing must be held. You are also encouraged to state the reason for the request and any changes you want made to the proposed rules.

Withdrawal of Requests. If 25 or more persons submit a valid written request for a hearing, a public hearing will be held unless a sufficient number withdraw their requests in writing. If enough requests for hearing are withdrawn to reduce the number below 25, the agency must give written notice of this to all persons who requested a hearing, explain the actions the agency took to achieve the withdrawal, and ask for written comments on this action. If a public hearing is required, the agency will follow the procedures in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20.

Alternative Format. Upon request, this Notice can be made available in an alternative format, such as large print, Braille, or cassette tape. To make such a request, please contact the agency contact person at the address or telephone number listed above.

Modifications. The proposed rules may be modified as a result of public comment. The modifications must be supported by comments and information submitted to the agency, and the adopted rules may not be substantially different than these proposed rules.

NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT RULES WITHOUT A PUBLIC HEARING

Proposed Amendment to Rules Governing Scheduling of Controlled Substances *Minnesota Rules*, 6800.4210

Introduction. The Minnesota Board of Pharmacy intends to adopt rules without a public hearing following the procedures in the rules of the Office of Administrative Hearings, *Minnesota Rules*, parts 1400.2300 to 1400.2310, and the Administrative Procedure Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.22 to 14.28. You may submit written comments on the proposed rules and may also submit a written request that a hearing be held on the rules until December 1, 2010.

Subject of Rules and Statutory Authority. The proposed rules concern the scheduling of controlled substances. Specifically, the Board is proposing to add synthetic cannabinoids to Schedule I. The statutory authority to adopt the rules is *Minnesota Statutes*, section 152.02 Subds. 7 and 8, which authorize the Board to adopt rules to add controlled substances to the state's schedules of controlled substances. A copy of the proposed rules is published in the *State Register* and attached to this notice as mailed.

Comments. You have until 4:30 p.m. on Wednesday, December 10, 2010, to submit written comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed rules and any part or subpart of the rules. Your comment must be in writing and the agency contact person must receive it by the due date. The Board encourages comment. Your comment should identify the portion of the proposed rules addressed and the reason for the comment. You are encouraged to propose any change desired. You must also make any comments about the legality of the proposed rules during this comment period.

Request for a Hearing. In addition to submitting comments, you may also request that the Board hold a hearing on the rules. Your request must be in writing and the agency contact person must receive it by 4:30 p.m. on Wednesday, December 1, 2010. Your written request for a public hearing must include your name and address. You must identify the portion of the proposed rules that you object to or state that you oppose the entire set of rules. 6800.4210 SCHEDULE I CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES.

Schedule I shall consist of the drugs and other substances, by whatever official name, common or usual name, chemical name, or brand name designated, listed in this part.

G. Cannabinoids.
