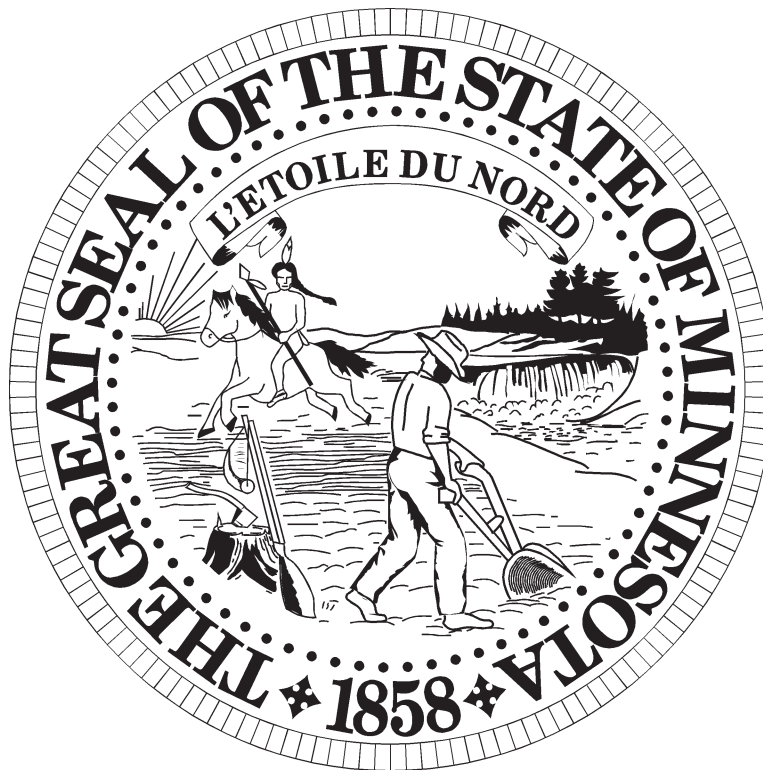

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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. 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Expedited Rules

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt expedited rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for normal rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the conditions. Expedited rules are effective upon publication in the State Register, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain conditions.

Expedited rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific *Minnesota Statute* citations accompanying these expedited rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.

Proposed Expedited Permanent Rules Relating to Plumbing Code; Nonwater Urinals

NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT EXPEDITED RULES WITHOUT A PUBLIC HEARING

Proposed Expedited Permanent Rules Relating to the Minnesota Plumbing Code; *Minnesota Rules*, Chapter 4715.0100, subps. 38 and 74a, 4715.0200, clause S, 4715.0950, 4715.1410; Nonwater Urinals

Introduction. The Minnesota Plumbing Board ("Board") intends to adopt standards for waterless urinals, including their installation and maintenance under the legislatively granted expedited rulemaking process. *Laws of Minnesota 2010*, Chapter 347, Article 3, Section 73. You may submit written comments on the proposed expedited rules until December 8, 2010.

Subject of the Expedited Rules and Statutory Authority. The proposed expedited rules amend Chapter 4715.0100, subp. 38 and 74a, 4715.0200, clause S, 4715.0950, and add part 4715.1410, to incorporate standards for waterless urinals, including their installation and maintenance. The Board intends to amend rules incorporating waterless urinals using the expedited rulemaking process set out in the rules of the Office of Administrative Hearings, *Minnesota Rules*, part 1400.2410 and the Administrative Procedure Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, Section 14.389. The authority to adopt these proposed rules under the expedited rulemaking process is found in *Laws of Minnesota 2010*, Chapter 347, Article 3, Section 73.

Minnesota Statutes, Section 326B.43 authorizes the Board to adopt and amend rules of minimum standards for plumbing. *Minnesota Statutes*, Section 326B.435 authorizes the Board to adopt and amend the plumbing code. A copy of the proposed rules will be published in the *State Register* and is attached to this notice as mailed. The proposed expedited rules may be viewed at:

Comments. You have until 4:30 p.m. on Wednesday, December 8, 2010, to submit written comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed expedited rules and any part or subpart of the rules. Your comment must be in writing and received by the Board contact person above by the due date. The Board encourages comment. Your comment should identify the portion of the proposed expedited rules addressed and the reason for the comment. In addition, you are encouraged to propose any change desired. Any comments you would like to make on the legality of the proposed rules must be made during this comment period.

Modifications. The Board may modify the proposed expedited rules using either of two avenues: The Board may modify the rules so long as the modifications do not make the rules substantially different as defined in *Minnesota Statutes*, Section 14.05, Subdivision 2, paragraphs (b) and (c). Or the agency may adopt substantially different rules if it follows the procedure under *Minnesota Rules*, part 1400.2110. If the final rules are identical to the rules originally published in the *State Register*, the Board will publish a notice of adoption in the *State Register*. If the final rules are different from the rules originally published in the *State Register*, the Board must publish a copy of the changes in the *State Register*. If the proposed expedited rules affect you in any way, the Board encourages you to participate in the rulemaking process.

Alternative Format. Upon request, this information can be made available in an alternative format, such as large print, braille, or audio. To make such a request, please contact the Board contact person at the address or telephone number listed above.

Adoption and Review of Expedited Rules. The Board may adopt the rules at the end of the comment period. The Board will then submit rules and supporting documents to the Office of Administrative Hearings for review for legality. You may ask to be notified of the date that the Board submits the rules. If you want to be so notified, or want to receive a copy of the adopted rules, or want to register to receive notice of future rule proceedings, submit your request to the Board contact person listed above. The rules will be effective 180 days after filing with the Secretary of State.

4715.0100 DEFINITIONS.

[For text of subps 1 to 37, see M.R.]

Subp. 38. **Dead end.** “Dead end” means a branch leading from a soil, waste, or vent pipe, building drain, ~~or~~ building sewer, or water distribution branch, and terminating at a developed length of two feet or more by means of a plug, cap, or other fitting.

[For text of subps 39 to 74, see M.R.]

Subp. 74a. **Nonwater urinal.** “Nonwater urinal” means a plumbing fixture that is designed to receive and convey only liquid waste through a trap seal into the gravity drainage system without the use of water for such function.

[For text of subps 75 to 128, see M.R.]

4715.0200 BASIC PLUMBING PRINCIPLES.

This code is founded upon certain basic principles of environmental sanitation and safety through properly designed, acceptably installed and adequately maintained plumbing systems. Some of the details of plumbing construction may vary but the basic sanitary and safety principles desirable and necessary to protect the health of the people are the same everywhere. As interpretations may be required, and as unforeseen situations arise which are not specifically covered in this code, the twenty three principles which follow shall be used to define the intent.

[For text of items A to R, see M.R.]

S. Each fixture shall be provided with a separate, accessible, self-scouring, reliable ~~water-seal~~ trap placed as near to the fixture as possible.

[For text of items T to W, see M.R.]

4715.0950 TRAP SEALS.

Fixture traps shall have a ~~water~~ liquid seal depth of not less than two inches and not more than four inches, except where, under special conditions, a trap with a deeper seal may be found necessary by the administrative authority.

The horizontal length of the seal of any fixture trap shall not exceed six inches where the waste pipe required is two inches or less in diameter.

Traps shall be set true and level with respect to their ~~water~~ liquid seals and where necessary shall be protected from freezing.

4715.1410 URINALS.

Subpart 1. **Prohibited urinals.** Floor-type trough urinals are prohibited.

Subp. 2. **Nonwater urinals.** Nonwater urinals must comply with ASME A112.19.19-2006. Where a nonwater urinal is installed, a water-supplied fixture must be installed upstream of the nonwater urinal at the end of the same drainage branch. The water distribution system must be designed to allow for replacement of nonwater urinals with water-supplied urinals without dead ends.

Each nonwater urinal must be separately trapped by a nonpetroleum liquid seal that is lighter than water to protect from odor escape or evaporation of the trap contents. Metallic traps or traps with elastomeric membranes for nonwater urinals are prohibited.

Expedited Rules

Nonwater urinals that meet the requirements of this part are exempt from fixture trap requirements described in parts 4715.0900 and 4715.0960.

The owner of each nonwater urinal must ensure that the urinal is cleaned and maintained in strict compliance with the manufacturer's requirements.

EFFECTIVE DATE. These amendments are effective 180 days after the filing of the amendments with the secretary of state.

Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) Regional Division Public Notice of Availability of Draft Jessie Lake Nutrient TMDL Report and Request for Comment

Public Comment Period Begins:	November 8, 2010

The Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) is requesting comments on the draft Report for the Jessie Lake Nutrient Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL). The draft TMDL Report for Jessie Lake is available for review at:

Following the comments, the MPCA will revise the draft TMDL Report and submit it to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for approval. Comments must be sent to the MPCA contact person listed below by 4:30pm on December 8, 2010.

Official Notices

Required by the Federal Clean Water Act, a TMDL is a scientific study that calculates the maximum amount of a pollutant that a waterbody can receive and still meet water quality standards for that pollutant. It is a process that identifies all the sources of the pollutant causing impairment and allocates necessary reductions among them. This multi-year effort results in a pollution reduction plan and engages stakeholders and the general public. An approved TMDL is followed by implementation activities for achieving the necessary reductions. Jessie Lake, located in Northwestern Itasca County, is an impaired water under section 303(d) of the Federal Clean Water Act. Water quality monitoring on Jessie Lake indicates excessive levels of phosphorus, a nutrient that can cause nuisance to severe algae blooms that inhibit recreation activities such as swimming, boating, and fishing.

The Jessie Lake watershed is about 32.4 square miles of primarily forest land in the Big Fork River Watershed, a subwatershed of the larger Rainy River basin. The Lake has a surface area of 1,723 acres with an average depth of 22.9 feet and a maximum depth of 40 feet. Jessie Lake lies within the Chippewa Sand Plains, a sub-region of the Northern Lakes and Forest Ecoregion.

The state placed Jessie Lake on the 2004 impaired waters list for aquatic recreation because it exceeds the water quality standard for nutrients. Excess nutrients such as phosphorus create poor water quality conditions causing frequent summer algal blooms, which limit recreational activities. A reduction of 23 percent in phosphorus loading to Jessie Lake would be required to consistently meet water quality standards under average precipitation conditions. In-lake phosphorus load management and the reduction of phosphorus from runoff in the watershed by retrofitting best management practices (BMP) would have the most impact on reducing phosphorus loads and improving water quality in Jessie Lake.

Preliminary Determination on the draft TMDL Report: The MPCA Commissioner has made a preliminary determination to submit this TMDL Report to the EPA for final approval. A draft TMDL Report and fact sheet are available for review at the MPCA office at the address listed above, and at the MPCA Web site:

Suggested changes will be considered before the final TMDL Report is sent to the EPA for approval.

Written Comments: You may submit written comments on the conditions of the draft TMDL report or on the Commissioner's preliminary determination. Written comments must include the following:

1. A statement of your interest in the draft TMDL Report;
2. A statement of the action you wish the MPCA to take, including specific references to sections of the draft TMDL that you believe should be changed; and
3. The reasons supporting your position, stated with sufficient specificity as to allow the Commissioner to investigate the merits of your position.

Petition for Public Informational Meeting: You also may request that the MPCA Commissioner hold a public informational meeting. A public informational meeting is an informal meeting that the MPCA may hold to solicit public comment and statements on matters before the MPCA, and to help clarify and resolve issues.

A petition requesting a public informational meeting must include the following information:

1. A statement identifying the matter of concern;
2. The information required under items 1 through 3 of "Written Comments," identified above;
3. A statement of the reasons the MPCA should hold a public informational meeting; and
4. The issues that you would like the MPCA to address at the public informational meeting.

Petition for Contested Case Hearing: You also may submit a petition for a contested case hearing. A contested case hearing is a formal evidentiary hearing before an administrative law judge. In accordance with *Minnesota Rules* 7000.1900, the MPCA will grant a petition to hold a contested case hearing if it finds that:

1. There is a material issue of fact in dispute concerning the application or draft TMDL Report;
2. The MPCA has the jurisdiction to make a determination on the disputed material issue of fact; and
3. There is a reasonable basis underlying the disputed material issue of fact or facts such that the holding of the contested case hearing would allow the introduction of information that would aid the MPCA in resolving the disputed facts in making a final decision on the draft TMDL Report. A material issue of fact means a fact question, as distinguished from a policy question, whose resolution could have a direct bearing on a final MPCA decision.

A petition for a contested case hearing must include the following information:

1. A statement of reasons or proposed findings supporting the MPCA decision to hold a contested case hearing according to the criteria in *Minnesota Rules* 7000.1900, as discussed above; and
2. A statement of the issues proposed to be addressed by a contested case hearing and the specific relief requested or resolution of the matter.

In addition and to the extent known, a petition for a contested case hearing should also include the following information:

1. A proposed list of prospective witnesses to be called, including experts, with a brief description of proposed testimony or summary of evidence to be presented at a contested case hearing;
2. A proposed list of publications, references, or studies to be introduced and relied upon at a contested case hearing; and
3. An estimate of time required for you to present the matter at a contested case hearing.

MPCA Decision: You may submit a petition to the Commissioner requesting that the MPCA Citizens' Board (Board) considers the TMDL Report approval. To be considered timely, the petition must be received by the MPCA by 4:30 p.m. on the date the public comment period ends, identified on page 1 of this notice. Under the provisions of *Minnesota Statutes* § 116.02, subd 6(4), the decision whether to submit the TMDL Report and, if so, under what terms will be presented to the Board for decision if:

1. The Commissioner grants the petition requesting the matter be presented to the Board;
2. One or more Board members request to hear the matter before the time the Commissioner makes a final decision on the TMDL Report; or
3. A timely request for a contested case hearing is pending. You may participate in the activities of the MPCA Board as provided in *Minnesota Rules* 7000.0650.

The written comments, requests, and petitions submitted on or before the last day of the public comment period will be considered in the final decision on this TMDL Report. If the MPCA does not receive written comments, requests, or petitions during the public comment period, MPCA staff as authorized by the Board, will make the final decision on the draft TMDL Report.
