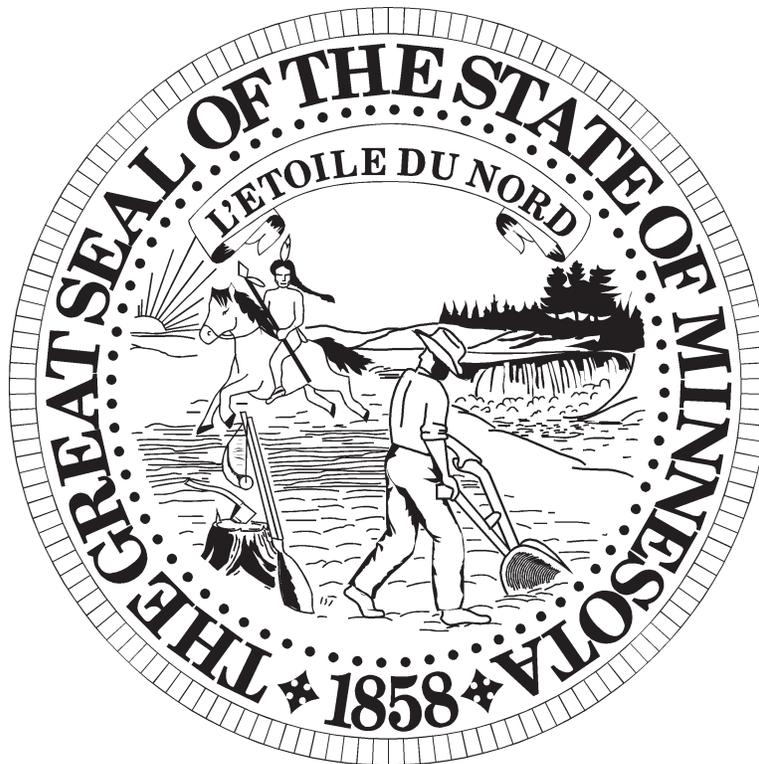

Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. Official Notices

Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101, an agency must first solicit comments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

The *State Register* also publishes other official notices of state agencies and non-state agencies, including notices of meetings and matters of public interest.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Agricultural and Economic Development Board (the “Ag Board”) or its designee representative, shall meet on May 24, 2011 at 9:00 a.m., at 1st National Bank Building, 332 Minnesota Street, Suite E200, Saint Paul, Minnesota, for the purpose of conducting a public hearing on a proposed issue of one or more series of bonds by the Colorado Health Facilities Authority (the “CoHFA Bonds”) to finance or refinance projects on behalf of The Evangelical Lutheran Good Samaritan Society, a North Dakota nonprofit corporation (the “Applicant”). Such persons as desire to be heard with reference to said issue of bonds will be heard at this public hearing.

The projects located in Minnesota (the “Mn Projects”) whose debt is to be financed or refinanced and the estimated principal amounts of the financing attributable to each project, are:

(i) from approximately \$800,000 to \$1,700,000 for remodeling of the skilled nursing facility located at 75507 240th Street in Albert Lea, Minnesota;

(iii) \$5,640,000 for the construction of an addition and remodeling to the Good Samaritan Center - Battle Lake facility located at 105 Glenhaven Drive, Battle Lake, Minnesota;

(iv) \$595,000 for rehabilitation of resident rooms and conversion at Good Samaritan Society - Maplewood located at 550 Roselawn Avenue, St. Paul, Minnesota; and

(v) \$1,510,000 for the construction of a skilled nursing facility addition and remodel at the Good Samaritan Society - Mary Jane Brown located at 110 S. Walnut Avenue, Luverne, Minnesota.

The Applicant is the initial owner of the Mn Projects, and the Mn Projects will be owned, operated and managed by the Applicant. It is contemplated that the Mn Projects will be used, or will continue to be used, as nursing homes, senior housing, assisted living or related facilities. The total estimated amount of the CoHFA Bonds attributable to the Mn Projects is an amount not to exceed \$16,870,000. The CoHFA Bonds and the interest thereon shall be payable solely from the revenue pledged to the payment thereof, and no holders of any such bonds shall ever have the right to compel any exercise of the taxing powers of the State of Minnesota or any political subdivision thereof to pay the CoHFA Bonds or the interest thereon nor to enforce payment against any property of said State or said political subdivision.

Notice of Permit Decision for Remanded Route Segment in the Matter of the Route Permit Application for a 345 kV Transmission Line from Brookings County, South Dakota to Hampton, Minnesota (Docket Number ET2/TL-08-1474)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at a meeting on February 3, 2011, and in an Order issued March 1, 2011, the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) amended the route permit issued September 14, 2010, in this docket to include a description and official maps of the remanded portion of the route or Segment 4, the segment which connects the Cedar Mountain Substation in Renville County on the west to the Helena Substation in Scott County in the east by means of the Alternate Route utilizing the Gibbon Crossover Route, with an aerial crossing of the Minnesota River at Belle Plaine. The Commission also approved the Division of Energy Resources final Environmental Impact Statement, finding that it meets the requirements of *Minnesota Rules*, Part 7850.2500, subpart 10, for the remanded portion of the route (Section 4).

The RI Work Plan includes soil and groundwater sampling in areas of known or suspected releases identified in the Phase I Environmental Assessment of the Site ("Phase I ESA").
