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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. 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Executive Orders

The governor has the authority to issue written statements or orders, called Executive Orders, as well as Emergency Executive Orders. The governor's authority is specified in the *Constitution of the State of Minnesota*, Article V, and in *Minnesota Statutes* § 4.035. Emergency Executive Orders, for protection from an imminent threat to health and safety, become effective immediately, are filed with the secretary of state, and published in the *State Register* as soon as possible after they are issued. Other Executive Orders become effective 15 days after publication in the *State Register* and filing with the secretary of state. Unless otherwise specified, an executive order expires 90 days after the date the governor who issued the order vacates office.

Office of the Governor

Emergency Executive Order 12-09: Declaring a State of Emergency in the State of Minnesota and Providing for Emergency Relief from Regulations to Motor Carriers and Drivers Operating in Minnesota

I, MARK DAYTON, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes, do hereby issue this Executive Order:

WHEREAS, on June 18, 2012, a severe weather event with high winds and flooding began, resulting in extensive damage to public infrastructure, the utility distribution system and private property; and

WHEREAS, rivers in Dakota, Goodhue, and Rice Counties flooded resulting in damage to homes, businesses and public infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, high winds toppled trees and power lines resulting in damage to homes, businesses and public infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, portions of Interstate 35, U.S. Highway 2, and Minnesota Highways 23, 33, 53, 61, 65, 73, 200, 210 are closed, local road restrictions are in place and no unnecessary travel is advised in the region; and

WHEREAS, neighborhoods in the City of Duluth and surrounding areas have been evacuated, two shelters opened, and residents are present; campers were evacuated from Jay Cooke State Park and the park closed; city and state government office buildings in the City of Duluth are closed; and St. Luke's Hospital in Duluth, a federally designated Regional Trauma Center, is impacted by flooding; and

WHEREAS, the resources of local, county, and state governments have been fully utilized to ensure immediate response to protect the life and safety of persons in the affected areas, including the counties of Aitkin, Carlton, Cook, Dakota, Goodhue, Lake, Rice, and St. Louis, and to protect property and infrastructure from additional damage; and

WHEREAS, emergency assistance of motor carriers is needed to transport supplies and materials to affected areas of the state;

NOW, THEREFORE, I hereby order that:

1. A state of peacetime emergency exists pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes*, section 12.31, and relief for vehicles used to provide direct assistance to the emergency is required to assist the counties of Aitkin, Carlton, Cook, Dakota, Goodhue, Lake, Rice, and St. Louis.
2. The Department of Public Safety Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management will activate the Minnesota Emergency Operations Plan, continue the provision of on-site support and assistance to the affected local governments, and determine the need for supplementary disaster aid.
3. State agencies are directed to provide necessary assistance to help local units of government respond to and recover from this emergency.
4. Carriers or drivers of commercial motor vehicles providing direct assistance for emergency relief are exempted from the regulations incorporated in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 221.0314, subdivision 9, pertaining to hours of service for carriers and drivers of commercial motor vehicles.

5. Nothing in this order relieves motor carriers and drivers from regulations pertaining to driver qualifications; driving of commercial motor vehicles; commercial drivers' licenses; drug and alcohol testing for drivers; or equipment, parts, and accessories necessary for the safe operation of vehicles.
6. No motor carrier operating under terms of this emergency order shall require or allow an ill or fatigued driver to operate a commercial motor vehicle. Any driver who informs a carrier that he or she needs immediate rest shall be given at least ten consecutive off-duty hours before the driver is required to return to service.
7. No driver operating under terms of this emergency order shall operate a commercial motor vehicle while fatigued or ill. Fatigued drivers shall take at least ten hours off-duty before returning to service.
8. Upon the expiration of this emergency order, or when a driver or carrier ceases to provide direct assistance to the emergency relief effort, a driver that has had at least thirty-four consecutive hours off-duty must be permitted to start his or her on-duty status hours and 60/70-hour clock at zero.
9. The Adjutant General of Minnesota order to state active duty on or about June 20, 2012, in the service of the State, such personnel and equipment of the military forces of the State as required and for such period of time as necessary to provide assistance and emergency relief services.
10. The Adjutant General is authorized to purchase, lease or contract for goods and services necessary to accomplish the mission.
11. The cost of subsistence, transportation, fuel, pay and allowances of said individuals shall be defrayed from the general fund of the State, as provided for in Minnesota Statutes, sections 192.49, subdivisions 1 and 2; 192.52; and 192.54, and as otherwise permitted by law.

Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes*, section 4.035, subdivision 2, this Emergency Executive Order is effective immediately and must be filed with the Secretary of State and published in the *State Register* as soon as possible after its issuance. Emergency relief from regulations for motor carriers and drivers remains in effect for 30 days from the date of the initial declaration of the emergency, or until the commercial motor carrier or driver ceases direct assistance in providing emergency relief, whichever occurs first. For purposes of this Emergency Executive Order, direct assistance is defined in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 221.0269, subdivision 3, paragraph (c). This Emergency Executive Order may be extended in accordance with *Minnesota Statutes*, section 221.0269, subdivision 2.

Commissioners' Orders

Commissioners' orders are approved by assistant attorneys general as to form and execution and published in the *State Register*. These commissioners orders are compiled in the year-end subject matter index for each volume of the *State Register*.

Commissioner's Order: Designation of State Forest Road #1857 in the Paul Bunyan State Forest

Effective Date: July 31, 2012
Statutory authority: *Minnesota Statutes*, section 89.17, subd. 1
Supplements: Designation and Undesignation of Forest Roads in the Paul Bunyan State Forest in Hubbard County, effective December 31, 2006

BACKGROUND

Minnesota Statutes, section 89.002, subd. 3, directs "the commissioner of natural resources to provide a system of state forest roads for access to state forest land and other forest land under the commissioner's authority, which is adequate to permit the commissioner to manage, protect, and develop those lands and their resources consistent with the forest resource management policy, and to meet demands for forest resources."

Minnesota Statutes, section 89.71, subd. 1, provides that "the commissioner 1) shall designate forest roads by written order published in the *State Register*" and "2) may undesignate, by written order published in the *State Register*, all or part of a state forest road that is not needed to carry out forest resource management policy."

All notice and procedural requirements have been complied with that are in *Minnesota Statutes*, and other applicable rules and laws.

The route identified in *Exhibit A* was overlooked during the Forest Reclassification and Road/Trail Designation process. The route is sustainable and has a history of providing motorized access to state land for hunters, berry pickers and other recreational users.

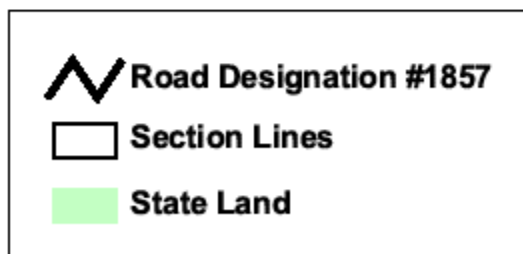
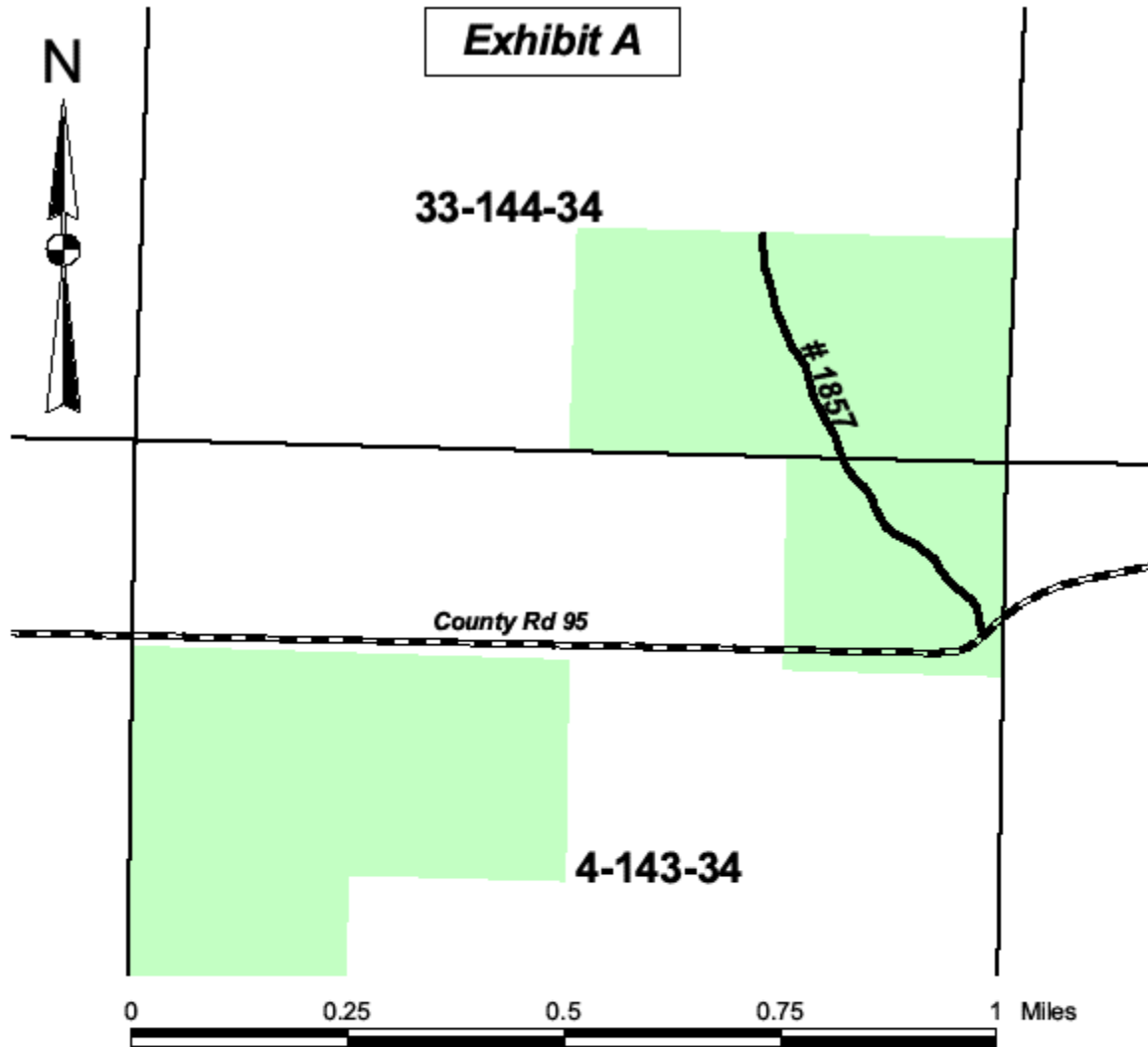

BACKGROUND

Minnesota Statutes, section 89.002, subd. 3, directs “the commissioner of natural resources to provide a system of state forest roads for access to state forest land and other forest land under the commissioner’s authority, which is adequate to permit the commissioner to manage, protect, and develop those lands and their resources consistent with the forest resource management policy, and to meet demands for forest resources.”

Minnesota Statutes, section 89.71, subd. 1, provides that “1) the commissioner shall designate forest roads by written order published in the *State Register*” and “2) may undesignate, by written order published in the *State Register*, all or part of a state forest road that is not needed to carry out forest resource management policy.”

All notice and procedural requirements have been complied with that are in *Minnesota Statutes*, and other applicable rules and laws.

Both of the routes identified in *Exhibit A* have been gated and closed to motorized use since they were established. Because these routes are gated year-round, they do not meet the criteria for status as forest roads. The Forest Reclassification and Road/Trail Designation Plan will not be affected, as these routes have no history of public motorized use.

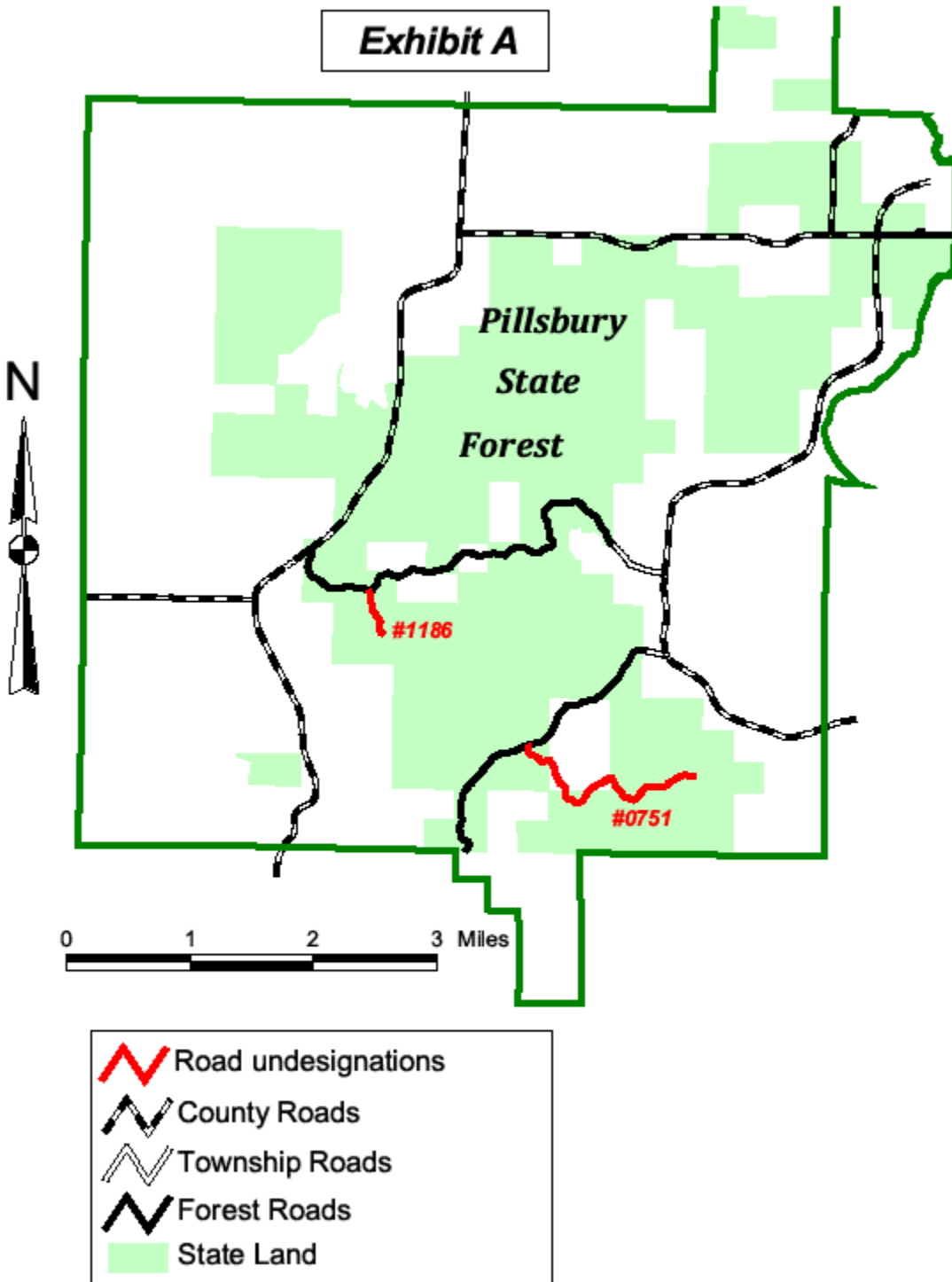

Notice of a Revised List of Tests to be Performed to Determine the Presence of a Heritable or Congenital Disorder in Newborn Infants in Minnesota

THIS NOTICE IS GIVEN to meet requirements of *Minnesota Statutes* 144.125 “Tests of infants for heritable and congenital disorders.” The statutes describe the mechanism for revising the list of tests as follows:

“The list of tests to be performed may be revised if the changes are recommended by the advisory committee established under section 144.1255, approved by the commissioner, and published in the *State Register*. The revision is exempt from the rulemaking requirements in Chapter 14, and sections 14.385 and 14.386 do not apply.”

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the addition of Severe Combined Immune Deficiency (SCID) and related T-cell lymphocyte deficiencies testing to the newborn screening panel has been recommended by the advisory committee and approved by the commissioner. Implementation of SCID testing is anticipated to begin in Fall 2012.

Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Notice of Hearing on Sale of State Land in Scott County

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes*, section 97A.135, subd. 2a, a hearing will be held by the Department of Natural Resources, at the DNR Central Office, 4th floor Main Conference Room, 500 Lafayette Road, St. Paul, Minnesota, on July 9, 2012 at 9:00 a.m.

The purpose of the hearing is for public input regarding the sale of state land situated in the County of Scott, and described as:

All of the following:

That part of the Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter and Government Lot 2, Section 1, Township 115 North, Range 23 West, shown as Parcel 6 on Minnesota Department of Transportation Right of Way Plat Numbered 70-40 as the same is on file and of record in the office of the Registrar of Titles in and for Scott County, Minnesota; the title thereto being registered as evidenced by Certificate of Title No. 8309; containing 4.91 acres, more or less;

Subject to the following restriction and reservation:

The State of Minnesota Department of Natural Resources reserves an access and trail easement in perpetuity running over and across said Parcel 6 as shown on said Minnesota Department of Transportation Right of Way Plat numbered 70-40 and shown as an access and trail easement on said plat.

Minnesota Statutes, section 97A.135, subd. 2a, requires that a public hearing be held before lands within a Wildlife Management Area can be disposed of through sale or exchange. The parcel is designated as part of Raguet Wildlife Management Area.

It is proposed that this parcel of land be offered for sale by the Department of Natural Resources in a transfer of custodial control to the Department of Transportation. This parcel is no longer needed for public purposes. If, after public hearing, the disposal of the land is in the public interest, the Commissioner of Natural Resources may vacate the parcel from Wildlife Management Area designation.

1. A proposed list of prospective witnesses to be called, including experts, with a brief description of proposed testimony or summary of evidence to be presented at a contested case hearing.
2. A proposed list of publications, references, or studies to be introduced and relied upon at a contested case hearing.
3. An estimate of time required for you to present the matter at a contested case hearing.

MPCA Decision

You may submit a petition to the Commissioner requesting that the MPCA Citizens' Board (Board) consider the 401 Certification. To be considered timely, the petition must be received by the MPCA by 4:30 p.m. on the date the public comment period ends. Under the provisions of *Minnesota Statute* § 116.02, subd. 6(4), the decision whether to issue the 401 Certification and, if so, under what terms will be presented to the Board for decision if: (1) the Commissioner grants the petition requesting the matter be presented to the Board; (2) one or more Board members request to hear the matter before the time the Commissioner makes a final decision on the 401 Certification; or (3) a timely request for a contested case hearing is pending. Subject of Rule. The Minnesota Department of Public Safety requests comments on its possible rules governing motorcycle road guard certification and qualification requirements. In order to comply with statutory requirements, the department is considering new rules that would establish procedures for the department to: (1) establish qualifications and requirements for a person to obtain a motorcycle road guard certificate; (2) develop and offer a motorcycle road guard certificate course; (3) establish safety and equipment standards for a person who operates under a motorcycle road guard certificate; and (4) establish a fee for each applicant for a motorcycle road guard certificate.

Persons Affected. The possible new rules would likely affect class D license holders with a motorcycle endorsement, motorcycle dealers, clubs and owners groups, motorcycle instructors and training schools, state and bordering law enforcement agencies, the Minnesota Department of Transportation, political subdivisions, including cities, townships, and counties, the automotive insurance industry, and the general public.

Statutory Authority. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 171.60, subd. 5, and *Minnesota Laws 2012*, Chapter 287, article 3, sections 27 and 43, authorize the Commissioner of Public Safety to adopt rules governing motorcycle road guard certification and qualification requirements.

Public Comment. Interested persons or groups may submit comments or information on these possible rules in writing until further notice is published in the *State Register* that the department intends to adopt or to withdraw the proposed rules. Additionally, the department is interested in comments addressing the cumulative effect of any possible new rules governing motorcycle road guard certification and qualification requirements. The Department of Labor and Industry (DLI) announces continuation of its safety hazard abatement matching grant program under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 79.253, and *Minnesota Rules*, parts 5203.0010 through 5203.0070. Employers covered by workers' compensation insurance, and those approved as self-insured employers, are eligible to apply for safety/health matching grants to abate safety hazards in their workplace. The safety/health hazards must have been identified in an on-site survey conducted by one of the following:

- 1) MNOSHA safety/health investigator,
- 2) DLI Workplace Safety Consultation safety/health consultant,
- 3) in-house employee safety/health committee,
- 4) workers' compensation underwriter,
- 5) private safety/health consultant or
- 6) a person under contract with the Assigned Risk Plan.

The on-site safety/health survey must have resulted in specifically recommended safety and/or health practices or equipment, training for purchased equipment, and/or tuition reimbursement designed to reduce the risk of injury to employees. Costs eligible for program participation are all or part of the cost of purchasing and installing recommended safety/health equipment, training for purchased equipment, tuition reimbursement, the cost of operating or maintaining safety/health equipment, and/or the cost of purchasing or renting real property, if necessary, to meet criteria established by the on-site safety/health survey. Automobiles, weapons, or personnel costs, such as salary and benefits, will not be covered by these grants.

Whether we approve your grant application or not, does not diminish, delay, or absolve you of any obligation to abate hazards as required by law. No state funds will be distributed until all grant documents are signed by all parties and the safety grant project is completed, including payments for all items in the project.
