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The *State Register* is the official publication of the State of Minnesota's Executive Branch of government, published weekly to fulfill the legislative mandate set forth in *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 14, and *Minnesota Rules*, Chapter 1400. 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NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. Notice of Proposed Revised Rule Minnesota Uniform Companion Guide for the Implementation of the ASC X12N/005010X279A1 Health Care Eligibility Benefit Inquiry and Response (270/271)

Introduction. Notice is hereby given that the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) is seeking information or opinions from outside sources regarding a proposed revised version of the *Minnesota Uniform Companion Guide for the Implementation of the ASC*

X12N/005010X279A1 Health Care Eligibility Benefit Inquiry and Response (270/271), hereinafter referred to as MUCG 270/271.

The revised version is proposed by the Commissioner of Health and was developed in consultation with the Minnesota Administrative Uniformity Committee (AUC) and its Eligibility Technical Advisory Group (TAG).

Contact Person. MDH requests information and opinions concerning the applicability and functionality of proposed revision be submitted to Judy Edwards as described below. Interested persons or groups may submit data or views in writing, to be received no later than 4 p.m. September 5, 2012; electronic submissions should be sent in Word format. Written statements should be addressed to Judy Edwards, Minnesota Department of Health, P.O. Box 64882, St. Paul, MN 55164-0822, or submitted via **e-mail** at: health.asaguides@state.mn.us or, **faxed to:** (651) 201-3830. E-mail is preferred.

Description of the Rules. *Minnesota Statutes, section 62J.536*, requires the Minnesota Commissioner of Health, in consultation with the Minnesota Administrative Uniformity Committee (AUC), to promulgate rules pursuant to section 62J.61 establishing and requiring group purchasers, clearinghouses, and health care providers to exchange specified health care administrative transactions electronically, using the applicable single, uniform companion guide adopted by the Commissioner of Health. Under *Minnesota Statutes, section 62J.61*, the Commissioner of Health is exempt from chapter 14, including section 14.386, in implementing sections 62J.50 to 62J.54, subdivision 3, and 62J.56 to 62J.59.

Technical Changes and Updates to Previously Adopted Rule. The Commissioner of Health, in consultation with the AUC and its Technical Advisory Groups (TAGs) has determined that it is necessary to make revisions to the *MUCG* (270/271) rule previously adopted in the *Minnesota State Register*, Volume 35, Number 47, May 23, 2011, page 1816. The previously adopted *MUCG* (270/271) is known as "version 4.0" and is available at: http://www.health.state.mn.us/asa/270271v5010atc051411clean.pdf. The proposed new version of the rule is called "version 5.0." and is available at http://www.health.state.mn.us/asa/ starting August 6, 2012.

Because the Commissioner of Health has determined that it is unduly cumbersome to publish the entire text of the rule, the Commissioner is publishing this notice of the proposed revision to the adopted rules.

The proposed revised rule describes the data content and other transaction specific characteristics of the ASC12/005010X279A1 Health Care Eligibility Benefit Inquiry and Response (270/271), hereinafter referred to as 005010X279A1, for use by entities covered under Minnesota Statutes, section 62J.536.

When the proposed rule is adopted, it:

- Is to be used in conjunction with all applicable Minnesota and federal regulations, including 45 CFR Parts 160, 162, and 164 (HIPAA Administrative Simplification, including adopted federal operating rules) and related ASC X12N and retail pharmacy specifications (ASCX12N and NCPDP implementation specifications).
- Will supplement, but will not otherwise modify, the 005010X279A1 in a manner that will make its implementation by users to be out of compliance.
- Must be appropriately incorporated by reference and/or the relevant transaction information must be displayed in any companion guides provided by entities covered by Minnesota Statutes, section 62J.536. In particular, the applicable information in the adopted rule must be appropriately incorporated by reference and/or displayed in companion guides of covered entities to meet requirements of CFR 45 § 162.1203 for companion guide compliance with "Phase I CORE 152: Eligibility and Benefit Real Time Companion Guide Rule, version 1.1.0, March 2011, and CORE v5010 Master Companion Guide Template. (Incorporated by reference in § 162.920)."

Modifications. The proposed revision was developed to improve the clarity and readability of the rule. As a result, the organization, content, and appearance of the proposed version 5.0 of the *MUCG* (270/271) are often different than the most recently adopted version (version 4.0).

The following modifications to version 4.0 of the MUCG (270/271) have been proposed in version 5.0 as summarized below.

• The title page through section 4.5.2 in version 4.0 have been reorganized, revised, and in many cases shortened in version 5.0 to provide greater clarification, ease of use, and to reflect changes in the data content tables of the rule. In some cases, sections appearing in version 4.0 considered as redundant or no longer necessary, were not included in version 5.0.

- The data content tables in sections 5.2 and 6.2 in version 4.0 have been appreciably shortened and moved to sections 4.2 and 5.2 of the proposed version 5.0 as a result of:
 An overall reorganization of the MUCG (270/271);
 Deleting references to and explanations of the designation "Not Considered for Processing (NCFP);"
 Listing only those loops, segments, and elements for which there are clarifications and/or instructions that are different than the 005010X279A1.
 - · Appendices with examples in version 4.0 have been deleted from version 5.0.
 - · Other grammatical and formatting revisions were made in version 5.0 to improve readability, organization, and ease of use.

Public Review Process. MDH will provide free copies of the proposed revised version (version 5.0) of the *MUCG* (270/271), in paper or electronic PDF format, to persons and organizations interested in reviewing them. The proposed version will be available for viewing and downloading on August 6, 2012 at: http://www.health.state.mn.us/asa/. Comments and suggestions for improvements of the proposed rule will be accepted at the above address until 4 p.m. September 5, 2012.

After the Commissioner of Health has considered all comments received, the Commissioner will publish a notice of adoption of any revisions to the above referenced *MUCG* (270-271) rule in the State Register. The rule will take effect 30 days subsequent to that notice.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA), pursuant to *Minnesota Rules* 7001.1440, requests comments on its draft Clean Water Act (CWA) Section 401 Water Quality Certification (401 Certification) for the proposed Chippewa River Diversion Channel Bank Stabilization by the St. Paul District of the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). The MPCA is proposing to issue a 401 Certification to the applicant, the St. Paul District of the United States Army Corps of Engineers, 180 East Fifth Street, Suite 700, St. Paul, Minnesota 55101, for projects within the State of Minnesota that qualify for coverage under GP-001-MN.

The proposed project is located along the approach channel of the Chippewa River diversion, located in west-central Minnesota near the city of Watson. The proposed project would address erosion problems resulting from a combination of high flows, ice, and high nearbank velocities. On occasion, high flow during spring months, the west bank (which has riprap) has been observed covered with ice, thus constricting the channel and creating scour conditions along the east bank. As a result, the east shoreline (which has no riprap) has sustained considerable damage in the form of lost bank vegetation and exposed over-steepened banks. Portions of the bank have slumped and exposed a portion of a pipeline that is a part of the upstream USGS gage station.

In addition, a portion of the existing riprap on the west bank had settled or been lost to the channel. Without stabilization measures, high flows would continue to eat away at the banks, threatening the Chippewa River diversion structure that serves to protect against downstream flooding to the city of Montevideo. The purpose of the proposed project is to protect and stabilize these banks against future erosion from the river.

Interested persons are invited to submit written comments on the MPCA's proposed waiver of the 401 Certification for the project. The public comment period begins on Monday, August 6, 2012, and ends at 4:30 p.m. on Thursday, August 16, 2012.

A material issue of fact means a fact question, as distinguished from a policy question, whose resolution could have a direct bearing on a final MPCA decision.

A petition for a contested case hearing must include the following information:

- A statement of reasons or proposed findings supporting the MPCA decision to hold a contested case hearing according to the criteria in *Minnesota Rule* 7000.1900, as discussed above
- A statement of the issues proposed to be addressed by a contested case hearing and the specific relief requested or resolution of the matter

In addition and to the extent known, a petition for a contested case hearing should also include the following information:

- 1. A proposed list of prospective witnesses to be called, including experts, with a brief description of proposed testimony or summary of evidence to be presented at a contested case hearing
- 2. A proposed list of publications, references, or studies to be introduced and relied upon at a contested case hearing
- 3. An estimate of time required for you to present the matter at a contested case hearing

MPCA Decision

You may submit a petition to the Commissioner requesting that the MPCA Citizens' Board (Board) consider the 401 Certification. To be considered timely, the petition must be received by the MPCA by 4:30 p.m. on the date the public comment period ends. Under the provisions of *Minnesota Statute* 116.02, subd. 6(4), the decision whether to issue the Certification and, if so, under what terms will be presented to the Board for decision if: (1) the Commissioner grants the petition requesting the matter be presented to the Board; (2) one or more Board members request to hear the matter before the time the Commissioner makes a final decision on the Certification; or (3) a timely request for a contested case hearing is pending. You may participate in the activities of the Board as provided in *Minnesota Rule* 7000.0650.

The written comments, requests, and petitions submitted on or before the last day of the comment period will be considered in the final decision on this Certification. If the MPCA does not receive written comments, requests, or petitions during the public comment period, MPCA staff, as authorized by the Board, will make the final decision on the draft Certification.
