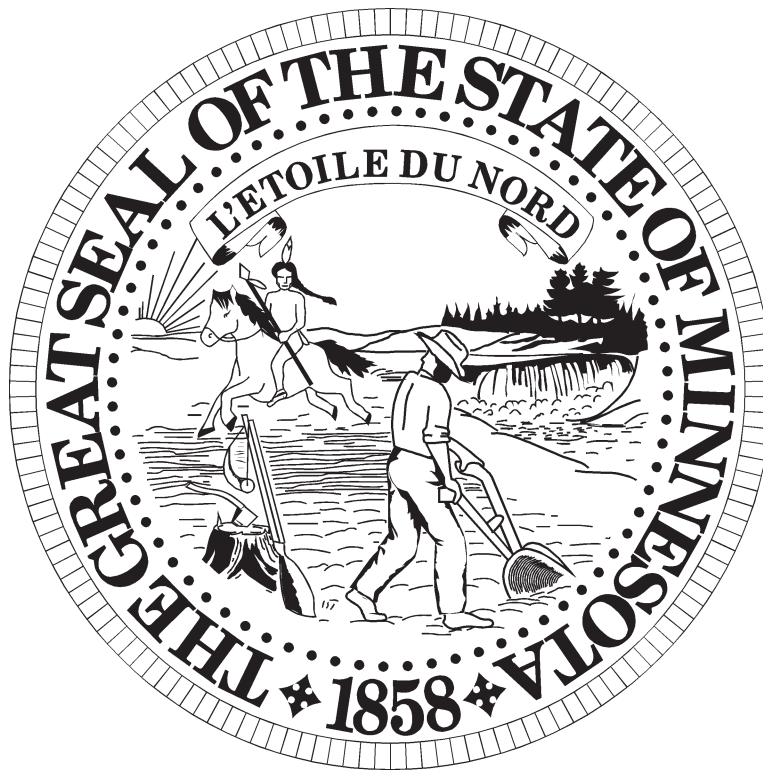

# Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

## NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. 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# Commissioners' Orders

Various agency commissioners are authorized to issue "commissioner's orders" on specified activities governed by their agency's enabling laws. See the *Minnesota Statutes* governing each agency to determine the specific applicable statutes. Commissioners' orders are approved by assistant attorneys general as to form and execution and published in the *State Register*. These commissioners orders are compiled in the year-end subject matter index for each volume of the *State Register*.

## Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Commissioner's Order: Designation of "No Registration Weekend" for All-Terrain Vehicles, June 7 and June 8, 2014

**WHEREAS**, *Minnesota Statutes*, section 84.922, subdivision 13, requires the Commissioner of Natural Resources to designate one "no registration weekend" each year for all-terrain vehicles.

**WHEREAS**, during the designated "no registration weekend" an all-terrain vehicle may be operated on state and grant-in-aid all-terrain vehicle trails without a registration or a nonresident state trail pass, notwithstanding the requirements of *Minnesota Statutes*, section 84.922, subdivision 1, and *Minnesota Statutes*, section 84.9275, subdivision 1.

**WHEREAS**, the designation must be by written order published in the *State Register*.

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED**, pursuant to authority vested in me by law, including but not limited to *Minnesota Statutes*, section 84.922, subdivision 13, that June 7 and June 8, 2014 are designated a "no registration weekend" during which time an all-terrain vehicle may be operated on state and grant-in-aid all-terrain vehicle trails without the registration required by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 84.922, subdivision 1. Nonresidents may operate an all-terrain vehicle on state and grant-in-aid all-terrain vehicle trails without possessing a state trail pass issued under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 84.9275.

This order is effective upon publication in the *State Register*.

# Official Notices

## Minnesota State Arts Board

### REQUEST FOR COMMENTS on Possible Amendment to Rules Governing the Procedures and Criteria Followed in the Distribution of Grants and Other Assistance in the Furtherance of the Arts in Minnesota, *Minnesota Rules*, Part 1900; Revisor's ID Number R-04243

**Subject of Rules.** The Minnesota State Arts Board requests comments on its possible amendments to rules governing the distribution of grants and other assistance in the furtherance of the arts. The board is considering a repeal of the rules governing arts funding programs that have been discontinued and the adoption of rules that make permanent those pilot programs that have proven to be successful. Specifically, the board plans to repeal the rules governing the Institutional Support, Arts Across Minnesota, and the Presenter Support programs, and to implement rules making the following pilot programs permanent: Operating Support; Minnesota Festival Support; Arts Tour Minnesota; Arts Access; and Partners in Arts Participation.

In addition, the Arts Board proposes several amendments to existing programs that do not fundamentally change the nature of those programs such that they would warrant the creation of a new program or the elimination of an existing program.

The board acts as fiscal agent for a statewide system of regional arts councils. The board will use this rulemaking to make minor changes to rules that govern its relationships with the councils.

Finally, the board will use this rulemaking as an opportunity to make other minor changes as needed to make its rules more clear and further the Arts Board's mission to stimulate and encourage the creation, performance and appreciation of the arts in the state.

**Persons Affected.** These amendments to the rules would likely affect people or organizations seeking grants for the production, presentation, or exhibition of art in Minnesota, and the state's eleven regional arts councils.

**Statutory Authority.** *Minnesota Statutes*, section 129D.04, subd.1 requires the Minnesota State Arts Board to:

(5) promulgate by rule procedures to be followed by the board in receiving and reviewing requests for grants, loans or other forms of assistance; and

(6) promulgate by rule standards consistent with this chapter to be followed by the board in the distribution of grants, loans, or other forms of assistance.

**Public Comment.** Interested persons or groups may submit comments or information on these possible rules until further notice is published in the *State Register* that the Arts Board intends to adopt or to withdraw the rules. The board will not publish a notice of intent to adopt the rules until more than 60 days have elapsed from the date of this request for comments. The Arts Board does not plan to appoint an advisory committee to comment on the possible rules.

**Rules Drafts.** The Arts Board has not yet drafted the possible amendments and does not anticipate that a draft of the rules will be available before the publication of the proposed rules. ## Minnesota Department of Commerce REQUEST FOR COMMENTS on Possible Amendment to Rules Governing Residential Thermal Insulation Standards, *Minnesota Rules*, Chapter 7640

**Subject of Rules.** The Minnesota Department of Commerce requests comments on the possible amendment to rules governing residential thermal insulation standards. The proposed modifications to the rules are intended to: 1) update references to national standards, 2) amend reporting requirements, and 3) amend provisions pertaining to applicability and conduct.

**Persons Affected.** The amendments to the rules would likely affect the following persons: manufacturers, wholesalers and installers of residential thermal insulation.

**Statutory Authority.** Minnesota Statutes, sections 45.023 and 325F.20, authorize the Commissioner of Commerce to adopt rules establishing standards for the product quality, safety, installation, and labeling of residential thermal insulation products.

**Public Comment.** Interested persons or groups may submit comments or information on these possible rules in writing until further notice is published in the *State Register* that the Department intends to adopt or to withdraw the rules. The Department will not publish a notice of intent to adopt the rules until more than 60 days have elapsed from the date of this request for comments.
