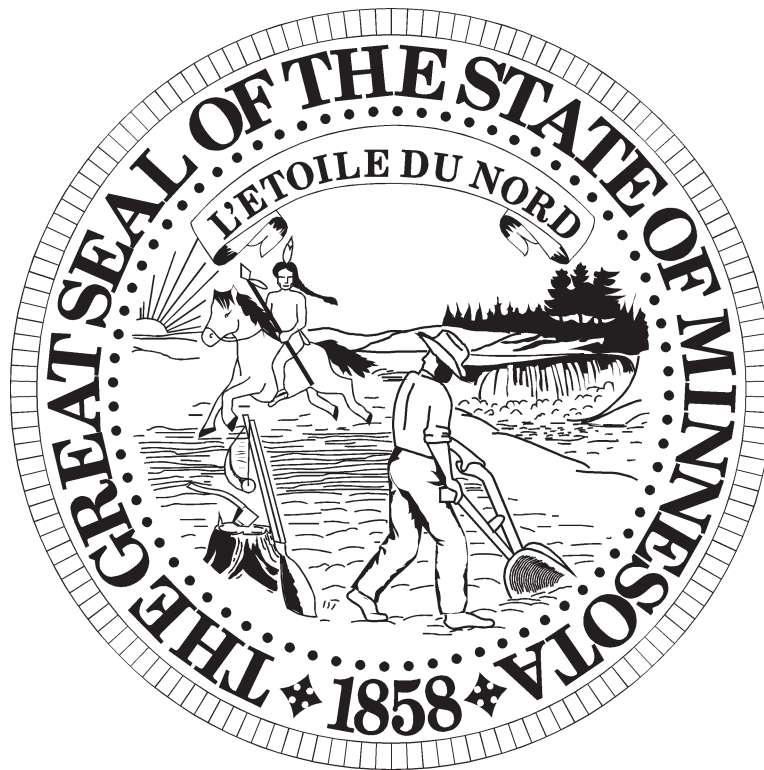

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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. 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A rule becomes effective after the requirements of *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.05-14.28 have been met and five working days after the rule is published in the *State Register*, unless a later date is required by statutes or specified in the rule. If an adopted rule is identical to its proposed form as previously published, a notice of adoption and a citation to its previous *State Register* publication will be printed. If an adopted rule differs from its proposed form, language which has been deleted will be printed with strikeouts and new language will be underlined. The rule's previous *State Register* publication will be cited.

KEY: Proposed Rules - Underlining indicates additions to existing rule language. ~~Strikeouts~~ indicate deletions from existing rule language. If a proposed rule is totally new, it is designated "all new material." **Adopted Rules** - Underlining indicates additions to proposed rule language. ~~Strikeout~~ indicates deletions from proposed rule language.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Agricultural and Economic Development Board (the “Board”) or its designated representative, will meet on Tuesday, July 1, 2014, at 9:00 a.m., or as soon thereafter as reasonably possible at 332 Minnesota Street, Suite E200, in St. Paul, Minnesota, for the purpose of conducting a public hearing on a proposed issue of revenue obligations (the “Obligations”) in one or more series, whether taxable or tax exempt, under *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 41A and Sections 469.152 through 469.165, as amended (collectively, the “Act”), to undertake and finance a project on behalf of Essentia Health, a Minnesota nonprofit corporation and organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the “Borrower”) and its affiliates. The Obligations are proposed to be issued pursuant to the authority granted under Section 41A.05, subdivision 2 and Section 469.153, subdivision 2(d) of the Act.

The project consists of the following: (a) to refund in a current refunding the Board’s outstanding Health Care Facilities Revenue Bonds (Essentia Health Obligated Group), Series 2011A, dated March 29, 2011, previously issued to finance: (i) land acquisition and constructing and equipping an approximately 3,920 square foot, one-story clinic/medical office building of St. Mary’s Regional Health Center, d/b/a Essentia Health St. Mary’s – Detroit Lakes, a Minnesota nonprofit corporation (“SMRHC”), located at 300 Main Avenue East, Frazee, Minnesota; (ii) land acquisition and constructing and equipping an approximately 44,000 square foot, two-story clinic/medical office building of Brainerd Lakes Integrated Health System, a Minnesota nonprofit corporation, located at 13060 Isle Drive, Baxter, Minnesota; (iii) refinancing outstanding indebtedness of SMRHC incurred to finance capital improvements to its 96-bed skilled nursing facility located at 1027 Washington Avenue, Detroit Lakes, Minnesota; and (iv) land acquisition and constructing an approximately 6,480 square foot, one-story clinic/medical office building for SMRHC located at 301 North Broadway, Pelican Rapids, Minnesota; (b) to finance capital expenditures to be incurred by Essentia Health Virginia, LLC, the sole member of which is SMDC Medical Center, to replace the chiller unit in the hospital, to be located at 901 Ninth Street North, Virginia, Minnesota; (c) to finance capital expenditures incurred and to be incurred by Brainerd Medical Center to renovate approximately 118,000 square-feet of the existing clinic space located at 2024 South Sixth Street, Brainerd, Minnesota; (d) to finance capital expenditures incurred and to be incurred by St. Joseph’s Medical Center, a Minnesota nonprofit corporation, consisting of remodeling and equipping the existing clinic space located at 20918 County Road 1, Emily, Minnesota; (e) to finance capital expenditures incurred and to be incurred by SMRHC, consisting of expanding and remodeling the imaging area in the emergency room of its existing hospital facilities located at 1027 Washington Avenue, Detroit Lakes, Minnesota; and (f) to pay costs associated with the issuance of the bonds. The activity listed at (a) is referred to as the “Refinanced Project.” The activities listed at (b) through (e) are referred to as the “2014 Project.”

The owner of the Refinanced Project and the 2014 Project (together, the “Projects”) will be the Borrower or an affiliated entity of the Borrower, and the Projects are expected to be owned, operated and managed by the Borrower or an affiliated entity. The Projects will be used primarily for hospitals and medical clinics and related facilities. The estimated amount of the Obligations is an amount not to exceed \$35,000,000. The Obligations will be limited obligations of the Board. The Obligations and the interest thereon will be payable solely from the revenue pledged to the payment thereof and other security arrangements to be established by or on behalf of the Borrower. Notwithstanding the foregoing, no holders of any of the Obligations will ever have the right to compel any exercise of the taxing powers of the State of Minnesota or any political subdivision thereof to pay the Obligations or the interest thereon or to enforce payment against any property of said State or any political subdivision thereof.

Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) Office of Traffic Safety and Technology Notice of Public Comment Period, Minnesota Strategic Highway Safety Plan

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Department of Transportation is holding a 30-day public comment period from June 9, 2014 to July 8, 2014 to provide an opportunity for the public to comment on the draft Minnesota Strategic Highway Safety Plan. A Strategic Highway Safety Plan is a major component and requirement of the federal Highway Safety Improvement Program (23 U.S.C. 148). This Minnesota Strategic Highway Safety Plan provides insight and direction on how to further reduce traffic-related crashes. It

describes how many, where, what type and to whom crashes occur. The Minnesota Strategic Highway Safety Plan is a comprehensive policy plan based on data and trends that will affect traffic safety during the next several years. It was developed in consultation with safety stakeholders from education, emergency medical and trauma services, enforcement, engineering and other disciplines. The plan presents Minnesota's crash history along with future focus area priorities and a framework for selecting traffic safety strategies that will continue moving the state toward zero deaths. It also highlights opportunities for collaboration and performance measures to chart progress.

After the public comment period, MnDOT will make appropriate changes in the plan and submit it to the Federal Highway Administration. Minnesota Statute section 161.315 prohibits the Commissioner, counties, towns, or home rule or statutory cities from awarding or approving the award of a contract for goods or services to a person who is suspended or debarred, including:

- 1) any contract under which a debarred or suspended person will serve as a subcontractor or material supplier,
- 2) any business or affiliate which the debarred or suspended person exercises substantial influence or control, and
- 3) any business or entity, which is sold or transferred by a debarred person to a relative or any other party over whose actions the debarred person exercises substantial influence or control, remains ineligible during the duration of the seller's or transfer's debarment.

State Grants & Loans

In addition to requests by state agencies for technical/professional services (published in the State Contracts Section), the *State Register* also publishes notices about grants and loans available through any agency or branch of state government. Although some grant and loan programs specifically require printing in a statewide publication such as the *State Register*, there is no requirement for publication in the *State Register* itself.
