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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. Expedited Emergency Rules

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt expedited emergency rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for emergency rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the emergency conditions. Expedited emergency rules are effective upon publication in the State Register, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain emergency conditions.

Expedited emergency rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific *Minnesota Statute* citations accompanying these expedited emergency rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.

Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Adopted Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rules: 2015 Elk Season

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the above-entitled rules have been adopted through the process prescribed by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 84.027, subdivision 13(b). The statutory authority for the contents of the rule is *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 97A.433 and 97B.515.

The conditions that do not allow compliance with *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 97A.0451 to 97A.0459, are that population and harvest data needed prior to setting quotas and bag limits for elk are not available until March. Quota numbers and bag limits are necessary so that harvests and populations can be managed at sustainable levels and to allow applicants to evaluate where they want to apply.

6232.4300 SEASONS AND OPEN AREAS 2015 SEASON DATES AND QUOTAS FOR TAKING ELK.

Subpart 1. Taking elk. Elk may be taken by a licensed hunter using a legal firearm or a legal bow and arrow during seasons authorized by the commissioner.

Subp. 2. Open areas.

A. A license for the Grygla elk zones is valid for taking elk within the Primary Grygla Elk Zone prescribed in part 6232.4600, subpart 1, and the Secondary Grygla Elk Zone as described in part 6232.4600, subpart 2 The Primary Grygla Elk Zone described in part 6232.4600, subpart 1, and the Secondary Grygla Elk Zone described in part 6232.4600, subpart 2, are closed for 2015.

B. A license for the Kittson County Central Elk Zone is valid for taking elk within the elk zone prescribed in part 6232.4600, subpart 3.

C. A license for the Kittson County Northeast Elk Zone is valid for taking elk within the elk zone prescribed in part 6232.4600, subpart 4.

Subp. 3. Season dates. In 2015, licensed hunters may take elk September 12 to 20.

Subp. 4. Quotas. The number of licenses available for the 2015 elk hunting season is five licenses in the Kittson County Central Elk Zone, valid for legal antlered bull elk, and two licenses in the Kittson County Northeast Elk Zone, valid for legal antlered bull elk only. There are no licenses available in the Primary and Secondary Grygla Elk Zones.

6232.4500 ELK LICENSE APPLICATION PROCEDURE.

Subpart 1. General provisions. The provisions in this part apply to the elk license application process.

A. If the number of applications for any zone <u>and season</u> exceeds the quota, a random selection will be conducted to determine the successful applicants.

D. The application deadline is the Friday nearest July June 15.

Subp. 3.Drawing procedure.

A. A random drawing from a pool consisting of general drawing applicants must be used to distribute legal antlered bull licenses that are offered in the Kittson County Northeast Elk Zone.

A.<u>B.</u> If one or more than one qualified landowners landowner in either zone apply, a drawing to select one landowner in the Primary and Secondary Grygla Elk Zones, combined, and one landowner in the Kittson County Central Elk Zone shall occur first. The remaining parties shall then be selected in a general drawing to finalize successful parties. If no qualified landowners apply, all licenses shall be drawn from the general pool of applicants applies, a drawing to select one landowner licensee must occur first.

B: <u>C</u>. There shall also be alternate parties drawn from the pool of unsuccessful parties. These parties would be offered the opportunity to purchase licenses that have been offered to a successful party, but not purchased. The pool consists of the remaining landowners, tenants, and parties from the general drawing. An alternate party shall only be notified in the event that a successful party decides not to purchase a license.

EFFECTIVE PERIOD. The emergency amendments to Minnesota Rules, parts 6232.4300 and 6232.4500, expire February 28, 2016. After the emergency amendments expire, the permanent rules as they read prior to the amendments again take effect, except as they may be amended by permanent rule.

Commissioners' Orders

Various agency commissioners are authorized to issue "commissioner's orders" on specified activities governed by their agency's enabling laws. See the *Minnesota Statutes* governing each agency to determine the specific applicable statutes. Commissioners' orders are approved by assistant attorneys general as to form and execution and published in the *State Register*. These commissioners orders are compiled in the year-end subject matter index for each volume of the *State Register*.

Commissioner's Order: Motorized Watercraft Restrictions on Pelican Lake in Wright County

> Effective Date: Statutory authority:

May 18, 2015 Minnesota Statutes, section 97A.101, subd. 4 (b) and (c)

BACKGROUND

- The commissioner of natural resources may restrict the use of motorized watercraft and recreational vehicles on lakes designated for wildlife management purposes as provided in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 97A.101, subdivision 4 (b) and (c).
- Pelican Lake (DOW #86003100) in Wright County is a designated wildlife management lake.
- The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) proposed to implement restrictions on Pelican Lake to enhance the use and value of the lake for migratory waterfowl and to limit the disturbance of migratory waterfowl while they are feeding and resting during the spring migration, especially for the benefit of Lesser and Greater Scaup, Canvasbacks, Redheads, Ringnecks, and Ruddy ducks.
- The DNR held a public meeting about the proposed restrictions on March 17, 2015, at the Monticello Community Center in Monticello, Minnesota.
- The DNR sent a notice of the public meeting to adjacent landowners by U.S. mail on February 13, 2015.
- Notice of the public meeting was published in the Wright County Journal Press on February 12, 2015, and March 5, 2015. The DNR also issued a news release for the local area and to the St. Cloud Times.
- · Three persons attended the public meeting, all of whom were Pelican Lake landowners.
- The DNR accepted public comments through April 16, 2015, at the DNR office in Sauk Rapids, Minnesota. The DNR received no comments outside of the public meeting.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, pursuant to authority vested in me by law, including *Minnesota Statutes*, section 97A.101, subdivision 4 (b) and (c), that:

1. Portions of the surface waters of Pelican Lake in Wright County (DOW #86003100) are closed to all motorized watercraft every year from March 15 through May 15 except as otherwise provided by this notice or special permit. The closed zone is described as the portion of Pelican Lake located south and east of a line connecting the points UTM zone 15N Lat., Long 440466.288, 5007950.766 (NE point) and 439699.479, 5007035.266 (SW point), Wright County, Minnesota. This area consists of portions of Sections 5, 6, 7, 8, 17 and 18 of Saint Michael Township 120N, Range 24W, and a small portion of Section 12 in Buffalo Township 120N, Range 25W.

2. All public access points on the lake will be posted and the restricted zone will be marked with buoys every year from March 15 through May 15.

3. Motorized watercraft use by agents of the commissioner of the Department of Natural Resources (DNR), the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, or local law enforcement agencies is authorized in the closed zone as described in #1, except that airboats used

during non-emergency situations by agencies other than DNR must be authorized by a special permit from its director of the DNR Fish and Wildlife Division.

4. Special permits may be issued by the DNR to riparian resident landowners and their immediate family members or tenants to operate motorized watercraft in the closed zone.
