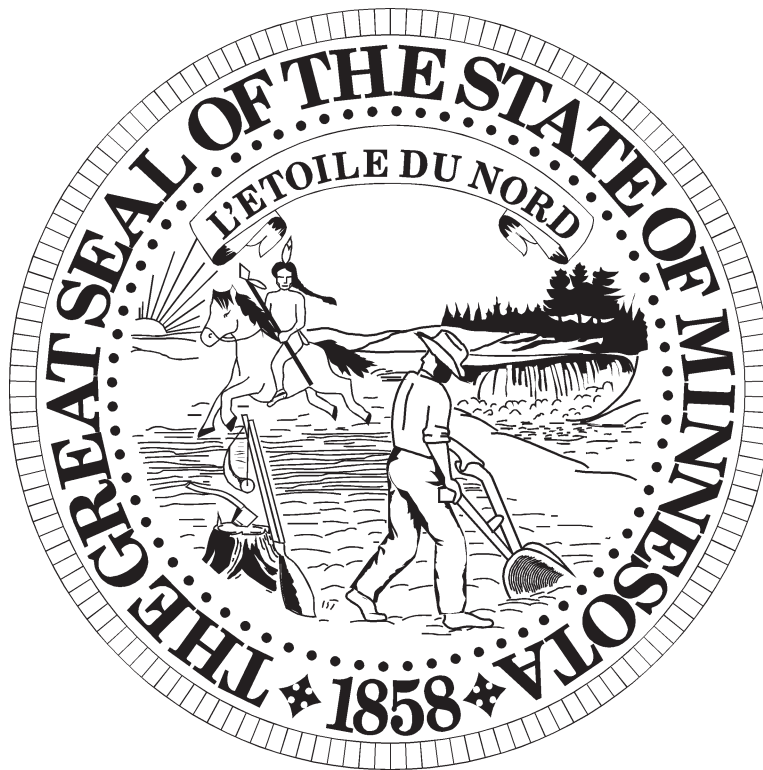

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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. 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Expedited Emergency Rules

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt expedited emergency rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for emergency rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the emergency conditions. Expedited emergency rules are effective upon publication in the State Register, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain emergency conditions.

Expedited emergency rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific *Minnesota Statute* citations accompanying these expedited emergency rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.

Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Adopted Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rules: Lac qui Parle Wildlife Management Area; Falconry; Taking Bear, Mourning Doves, and Migratory Game Birds; Sandhill Crane Hunting

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the above entitled rules have been adopted through the process prescribed by *Minnesota Statutes*, Section 84.027, subdivision 13 (b). The statutory authority for the contents of the rule is *Minnesota Statutes*, sections *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 97A.045, 97A.091, 97A.092, 97A.105, 97A.137, 97A.401, 97B.112, 97A.401, 97B.411, 97B.105, 97B.731, and 97B.803.

The conditions that do not allow compliance with *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 97A.0451 to 97A.0459, are as follows: The waterfowl hunting seasons are based on annual determinations of season timing and selection of the options as allowed under federal frameworks for migratory bird hunting. Provisions for taking waterfowl are based on population data that are not available until June and selection of options as allowed under federal frameworks for migratory bird hunting announced in August of each year. Changes are also being made to clarify a previously published bear bag limit and to allow additional hunting opportunities at the Lac qui Parle controlled hunting zone.

6230.0600 DESCRIPTIONS OF CONTROLLED HUNTING ZONES.

Subp. 3. Lac qui Parle zones, Chippewa and Lac qui Parle Counties.

A. On the Lac qui Parle Wildlife Management Area in Chippewa and Lac qui Parle Counties, the controlled hunting zone includes the following:

The Northwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (NW 1/4 SW 1/4) and the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (SE 1/4 SW 1/4) of Section 32, Township 119 North, Range 42 West, and the Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter (NW 1/4 NE 1/4) and the East Half of the Northwest Quarter (E 1/2 NW 1/4) of Section 5, Township 118 North, Range 42 West, all in Lac qui Parle County.

And also the East Half of the Northwest Quarter (E 1/2 NW 1/4), the East Half of the Southwest Quarter (E 1/2 SW 1/4) and the West Half of the West Half of the Southeast Quarter (W 1/2 W 1/2 SE 1/4) of Section 12, Township 118 North, Range 42 West, the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (SE 1/4 SW 1/4), the Northeast Quarter (NE 1/4) except that part lying northeasterly of State Highway 7, the East Half of the Southeast Quarter (E 1/2 SE 1/4), and those parts of the Northwest Quarter (NW 1/4) owned by the state and posted as "Wildlife Management Area, Controlled Hunting Zone," all in Section 1, Township 118 North, Range 42 West, all in Chippewa County.

And also all state owned land posted as "Wildlife Management Area, Controlled Hunting Zone" located between

6232.2800 GENERAL REGULATIONS FOR TAKING BEARS.

Subpart 1. **Bag limit.** A person may not take more than one bear in quota areas and ~~two bears~~ one bear in no-quota areas during any calendar year whether by firearm or archery. Bears taken may be of either sex or any age except that bear cubs may not be taken.

6234.0800 HUNTING BY FALCONRY.

Subp. 4. **Open season and hours for migratory game birds.** Woodcock, sora and Virginia rails, mourning dove, and common snipe may be taken by falconry from September 1 to December 16. Ducks, coots, and moorhens (Gallinules) may be taken by falconry from ~~the Saturday nearest October 1 to the Saturday nearest January 14~~ September 27 to December 6 during the open seasons as prescribed in part 6240.0640, subpart 1, and from December 13 to January 27 statewide. Geese may be taken by falconry during any open goose season. Crows may be taken by falconry during the open season. Falconry hours are from one-half hour before sunrise to sunset, except during the regular waterfowl season when falconry hours are the same as waterfowl shooting hours.

6240.0200 GENERAL RESTRICTIONS FOR TAKING AND POSSESSION OF MIGRATORY GAME BIRDS.

Subpart 1. **Shooting hours.** Shooting hours for migratory waterfowl, coots, gallinules, rails, and snipe are one-half hour before sunrise to sunset, except as follows:

A. on the opening day of the duck season, shooting hours begin at 9:00 a.m.; and

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B: from the opening day of the duck season to ~~the Saturday nearest~~ October 8 10, shooting hours end at 4:00 p.m.

Subp. 2. **Possession limits.** The possession limit is ~~twice~~ three times the daily limit, except for rails where the daily and possession limits are the same. All restrictions specific to a species or gender apply.

Subp. 7. **Taking in open water.** A person may take migratory waterfowl, coots, gallinules, rails, and snipe in open water on the following waters of Minnesota with the following restrictions:

A. Mississippi River from the U.S. Highway 61 bridge at Hastings to the Iowa border: hunting is allowed not more than 100 feet from any shoreline, including islands, from boats that must be at anchor;

B. Lake Pepin, Lake of the Woods, and Lake Mille Lacs: hunting is allowed from boats that must be at anchor; and

C. Lake Superior north and east of Minnesota/Park Point peninsula: hunting is allowed from boats that must be at anchor.

6240.0250 TAKING MOURNING DOVES.

Subpart 1. **Open season.** Mourning doves may be taken during the ~~60~~ 70-day period beginning September 1.

6240.0610 YOUTH WATERFOWL HUNTING DAYS.

Subpart 1. **Dates, eligibility, and license requirements.** Ducks, mergansers, coots, moorhens, and Canada geese may be taken statewide on ~~the Saturday nearest~~, September 17 13, by hunters 15 years of age or younger. An adult mentor 18 years of age or older, who is authorized by the youth's parent or guardian, must accompany the youth hunter at all times during the hunt. The accompanying adult may not hunt. No hunting license or waterfowl stamps are required.

6240.0630 SANDHILL CRANE HUNTING.

Subpart 1. **Open season.** Sandhill cranes may be taken from September 13 through October 19.

Subp. 2. **Shooting hours.** Shooting hours for sandhill cranes are one-half hour before sunrise to sunset, except beginning on the opening day of duck season, shooting hours are the same as the duck season according to part 6240.0200, subpart 1.

Subp. 3. **Open area; restrictions on taking.**

A. Sandhill cranes may be taken only in the Northwest Goose Zone described in part 6240.0860.

B. Taking sandhill cranes during the early goose season is prohibited on or within 100 yards of all surface waters.

C. Sandhill cranes may be taken by bow and arrow or shotgun with nontoxic shot approved by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service. A person may not take sandhill cranes with a rifle or handgun.

Subp. 4. **License and permit requirements.**

A. Sandhill cranes may be taken only under a valid sandhill crane permit issued by the commissioner for a fee of \$3, and a small game license, unless exempted.

B. A hunter must have a sandhill crane permit in possession when taking or possessing sandhill cranes.

C. A hunter must not have had small or big game hunting privileges revoked within one year of purchasing a sandhill crane permit.

Expedited Emergency Rules

Subp. 5. **Bag limits.** A person may not take more than one sandhill crane per day or have more than three sandhill cranes in possession.

Subp. 6. **Penalties.** Violation of this part or the conditions of any permit issued under this part results in revocation of the permit and any other penalties provided by state or federal law.

Subp. 7. **Game refuges and waterfowl refuges.** All state game refuges closed to migratory waterfowl hunting are closed to taking sandhill cranes under this part. All waterfowl refuges closed by posting to taking ducks or geese during any portion of the fall waterfowl seasons are closed to taking sandhill cranes under this part.

6240.0640 TAKING COOTS, MOORHENS, AND DUCKS.

Subpart 1. **Open season.** Coots, moorhens, and ducks may be taken as follows:

A. in the North Waterfowl Zone, described in subpart 3, during the 60-day period from September 27 to November 25;

B. in the Central Waterfowl Zone, described in subpart 3, during the 60-day period that includes September 27 to October 5 and October 11 to November 30; and

C. in the remainder of the state, during the 60-day period that includes September 27 to 29 and October 11 to December 6.

Subp. 2. **Daily limits.** In any one day, a person may not take more than six ducks, five mergansers, and a total of 15 coots and moorhens. The daily limit of ducks, other than mergansers, may not include more than four mallards, including two female mallards; two pintail; two redheads; three scaup; three wood ducks; one black duck; and one canvasback. The daily limit of mergansers may not include more than two hooded mergansers.

Subp. 3. **Waterfowl zones.** Zones for ducks and geese are designated and described as follows:

A. the North Waterfowl Zone is that portion of the state north of a line beginning on Minnesota Highway 210 at the west boundary of that state; thence along Minnesota Highway 210 to Minnesota Highway 23; thence along Minnesota Highway 23 to Minnesota Highway 39; thence along Minnesota Highway 39 to the eastern border of the state;

B. the South Waterfowl Zone is that portion of the state south of a line extending east from the South Dakota state line along U.S. Highway 212 to Interstate 494; thence east along Interstate 494 to Interstate 94; thence east along Interstate 94 to the Wisconsin state line; and

C. the Central Waterfowl Zone is that portion of the state that is not included in the North or South Waterfowl Zones.

6240.0950 TAKING CANADA GEESE.

Subpart 1. **Open season.** Canada geese may be taken:

A. in the North Waterfowl Zone, described in part 6240.0640, subpart 3, during the 90-day period from September 27 through December 25;

B. in the Central Waterfowl Zone, described in part 6240.0640, subpart 3, during the 81-day period that includes September 27 through October 5 and October 11 through December 30; and

C. in the South Waterfowl Zone, described in part 6240.0640, subpart 3, during the 87-day period that includes September 27 through 29 and October 11 through January 5.

Subp. 2. **Daily limit.** A person may not take more than three Canada geese statewide.

6240.1200 TAKING GEESE DURING EARLY SEASON.

Subp. 4. **Daily limits.** A person may not take more than five Canada geese per day during the early season, except that the bag limit is ten in the open area for the August Canada goose management harvest described in Minnesota Rules, part 6240.0650, subpart 2, published in the State Register, volume 39, page 36, July 14, 2014.

6240.2300 COMMON CROW SEASON.

Subpart 1. **Open dates.** Common crows may be taken from July 15 through October 15 and from March 1 through March 31 September 1 to October 31, 2014; December 14, 2014, to January 15, 2015; and March 1 to 31, 2015.

REPEALER. The emergency amendment to *Minnesota Rules*, part 6232.2800, subpart 1, published in the *State Register*, volume 38, page 1381, April 21, 2014, is repealed. *Minnesota Rules*, part 6230.0700, subparts 3 and 6, are repealed.

EFFECTIVE PERIOD. The emergency amendments to *Minnesota Rules*, parts 6230.0600, 6230.0700, 6232.2800, 6234.0800, 6240.0200, 6240.0250, 6240.0610, 6240.1200, and 6240.2300, expire January 30, 2015. After the emergency amendments expire, the permanent rules as they read prior to those amendments again take effect, except as they may be amended by permanent rule. *Minnesota Rules*, parts 6240.0630, 6240.0640, and 6240.0950, expire January 30, 2015.

Revenue Notices

The Department of Revenue began issuing Revenue Notices in July of 1991. Revenue Notices are statements of policy made by the department that provide interpretation, detail, or supplementary information concerning a particular statute, rule, or departmental practice. The authority to issue Revenue Notices is found in *Minnesota Statutes*, Section 270C.07.

Minnesota Department of Revenue (MDOR) Revenue Notice # 14-02: Income Tax – Apportionment of Compensation of Nonresident Corporate Board Members

Background

Minnesota Statutes, section 290.191 governs the apportionment of net income from a trade or business carried on partly within and partly without Minnesota. Subdivision 5(j) requires that sales of services must be attributed to the state where the services are received.

Minnesota Statutes, section 290.20 allows the Commissioner of Revenue to accept alternative methods of apportionment in some circumstances. This Revenue Notice provides an alternative method of apportionment for certain nonresident, corporate board members.

Department Position

If, during a tax year, an individual receives compensation for being a board member of not more than two corporate boards of directors and the individual is a nonresident, then the Commissioner of Revenue will allow an alternative method to apportion that compensation. Service on boards of corporate members of a unitary business, as defined in *Minnesota Statutes* 291.17, subdivision 4, is treated as serving on a single board.

The alternative method is the time the director spends in Minnesota generating compensation for being a director on a corporate board divided by the total time the director spends generating the compensation from that board. In other words:

$$\text{MN sales} = \frac{\text{time spent in Minnesota working for that board}}{\text{time spent everywhere working for that board}} \times \text{compensation paid for that board}$$

If a director is compensated for being on two boards during the year, a separate computation is made for each board and the Minnesota sales equal the total of the two computations.

This alternative method replaces the method otherwise required by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 290.191, subdivision 5(j).

If an individual does not qualify for this alternative apportionment, the individual must either attribute sales based on *Minnesota Statutes*, section 290.191, subdivision 5(j) or request and be granted an alternative apportionment method under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 290.20.

The alternative method provided by this Notice is available retroactively to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2007, subject to the applicable statute of limitation for assessment and refund.

Minnesota Department of Human Services (DHS) REQUEST FOR COMMENTS on Possible Adoption of Rules Governing Positive Support Strategies, Person-Centered Planning, Limits on Use of Restrictive Interventions and Emergency Use of Manual Restraint, and Repeal of Rules Governing Aversive and Deprivation Procedures in *Minnesota Rules, 9525.2700 to 9525.2810*; Revisor's ID No. R-04213 This Request for Comments Notice Supersedes the Request for Comments Notice Published in the *State Register* on Monday, August 26, 2013 (Cite 38 SR 277)

Subject of Rules. The Minnesota Department of Human Services (Department) requests comments on its possible adoption of rules governing the use of positive support strategies, person-centered planning, limits on use of restrictive interventions and emergency use of manual restraint, repeal of rules governing aversive and deprivation procedures, and related matters. The Department is considering rules which require the use of positive support strategies and person-centered planning techniques, establish a process to phase out the use of restrictive interventions for the rare situation when such use may be temporarily and briefly authorized, and govern the emergency use of manual restraint. The Department is also considering the repeal of rules governing the use of aversive and deprivation procedures now prohibited by *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 245D. The possible new rules will apply to all facilities and services, including the home and community-based services, licensed under *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 245D that are provided to persons with a disability or persons age 65 and older, and to all Department-licensed facilities and licensed services serving persons with a developmental disability or a related condition. The Department previously published a Request for Comments in August 2013, before the legislature expanded the scope of the rule to also include all Department-licensed facilities and licensed services serving persons with a developmental disability or a related condition.

Persons Affected. This adoption and repeal of rules would likely affect persons with disabilities and persons age 65 and older who receive services from persons or entities licensed under *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 245D; persons with developmental disabilities or a related condition who receive services from persons or entities licensed by the Department; and their families. Persons and entities licensed by the Department and their employees and other persons and entities who provide goods and services to the license holders may also be affected.

Statutory Authority. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 245.8251, subdivisions 1 and 3, as amended, require the Department to adopt rules "to govern the use of positive support strategies, and ensure the applicability of chapter 245D prohibitions and limits on the emergency use of manual restraint and on the use of restrictive interventions to facilities and services governed by the rules." The statute further states that "(t)he rules apply to all facilities and services licensed under chapter 245D and all licensed facilities and licensed services serving

persons with a developmental disability or related condition.”

Public Comment. Interested persons or groups may submit comments or information on these possible rules and repeal in writing or orally until further notice is published in the *State Register* that the Department intends to adopt or to withdraw the rules. The Department will not publish a notice of intent to adopt the rules until more than 60 days have elapsed from the date of this request for comments.

Rules Drafts. Draft rules are not yet available for review. Proposed rules will be available for review no later than December 2014. The Department may post updates before then on the Department website at http://www.dhs.state.mn.us/main/id_016414#.

Request for Comments on Planned Amendments to Water Quality Standards to Incorporate a Classification System Based on the Application of Tiered Aquatic Life Uses, *Minnesota Rules* Chapters 7050, 7052 and 7053

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) requests comments on planned changes to rules governing water quality standards, *Minnesota Rules* chapter 7050 (Waters of the State). The changes being considered will add a new framework called Tiered Aquatic Life Uses (TALU). TALU will add a biologic component to the existing standards for Class 2 (aquatic life and recreation) waters. Possible supporting changes to *Minnesota Rules* chapters 7052 (Lake Superior Basin), and 7053 (State Waters Discharge Restrictions) are also being considered. Comments should be submitted according to the Public Comment section below.

Subject of Rules: Minnesota's surface waters are currently classified according to a number of possible uses (e.g. drinking water, aquatic life, industrial use) and physical and chemical criteria apply according to those uses. Adoption of the TALU framework will not change the existing uses or physical/chemical criteria, but will more accurately categorize rivers and streams based on biological communities. TALU will change the current aquatic life use standards from a "one-size-fits-all" approach to one that protects rivers and streams based on their biological potential. This means:

- High quality or "Exceptional Use" rivers and streams will be given additional protection to maintain the condition of these habitats.
- Categories of "Modified" and "Limited Use" will be added to address some waters that cannot meet aquatic life use goals, either as a result of past practices such as ditching or channelization or because of technological limits.
- Assessment and enforcement of water quality standards will be more effective and transparent.

The changes being considered will include changes to Class 2 use classes and to the biological standards that are necessary to implement the TALU framework, but will not extend to changes to the chemical/physical standards (numeric and narrative) that already apply to Minnesota waters. The MPCA does not intend to change *Minnesota Rules* chapters 7052 or 7053 except as needed to correspond to the TALU changes being made to *Minnesota Rules* chapter 7050 or to make minor changes or corrections found in the course of the rulemaking process.

The state rulemaking process requires agencies to consider several specific topics as it develops rules. The MPCA is specifically asking for comment about the expected economic effect and cumulative impact¹ of the changes being considered (*Minnesota Statutes* §14.131), and also whether a local government may be required to adopt or amend an ordinance or other regulation in response to the changes. (*Minnesota Statutes* § 14.128).

Plain English Summary: This Request for Comments is the MPCA's legal notice of its intent to begin rulemaking. This is the first of several opportunities for public comment and input on this rulemaking. At this stage there is no draft rule available to review; we want your feedback to inform us about the ideas described under the Subject of Rules section above. If you have other ideas or information related to this topic that we need to consider, please provide them. Submitting your ideas and information to us at this early stage in rulemaking allows time to address issues and ensures informed decision-making.
