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NOTICE

How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking Action in the State Register

State agencies must publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. If an agency seeks outside opinion before promulgating new rules or rule amendments, it must publish a NOTICE OF INTENT TO SOLICIT OUTSIDE OPINION. Such notices are published in the OFFICIAL NOTICES section. Proposed rules and adopted rules are published in separate sections of the

The PROPOSED RULES section contains:

- Proposed new rules (including Notice of Hearing).
- Proposed amendments to rules already in existence in the Minnesota Code of Agency Rules (MCAR).
- Proposed temporary rules.

The ADOPTED RULES section contains:

- Notice of adoption of new rules and rule amendments (those which were adopted without change from the proposed version previously published).
- Adopted amendments to new rules or rule amendments (changes made since the proposed version was published).
- Notice of adoption of temporary rules.
- Adopted amendments to temporary rules (changes made since the proposed version was published).

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PROPOSED RULES

Pursuant to Minn. Laws of 1980, § 15.0412, subd. 4h, an agency may propose to adopt, amend, suspend or repeal rules without first holding a public hearing, as long as the agency determines that the rules will be noncontroversial in nature. The agency must first publish a notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing, together with the proposed rules, in the *State Register*. The notice must advise the public:

- 1. that they have 30 days in which to submit comment on the proposed rules;
- 2. that no public hearing will be held unless seven or more persons make a written request for a hearing within the 30-day comment period;
- 3. of the manner in which persons shall request a hearing on the proposed rules; and
 - 4. that the rule may be modified if modifications are supported by the data and views submitted.

If, during the 30-day comment period, seven or more persons submit to the agency a written request for a hearing of the proposed rules, the agency must proceed under the provisions of § 15.0412, subds. 4 through 4g, which state that if an agency decides to hold a public hearing, it must publish in the *State Register* a notice of its intent to do so. This notice must appear at least 30 days prior to the date set for the hearing, along with the full text of the proposed rules. (If the agency has followed the provisions of subd. 4h and has already published the proposed rules, a citation to the prior publication may be substituted for republication.)

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 15.0412, subd. 5, when a statute, federal law or court order to adopt, suspend or repeal a rule does not allow time for the usual rulemaking process, temporary rules may be proposed. Proposed temporary rules are published in the *State Register*, and for at least 30 days thereafter, interested persons may submit data and views in writing to the proposing agency.

Proposed Amendments to Rules Providing for Waiver of Certain Licensure Requirements; Proposed Repeal of Rules NHA 22 and 23

Notice of Hearing

A public hearing concerning the proposed amendments to NHA 10 and 13 (to be codified as 7 MCAR §§ 6.010 and 6.013) and the proposed repeal of NHA 22 and 23 and portions of NHA 10 will be held in Room 105, Minnesota Department of Health Building, 717 Delaware Street Southeast, Minneapolis, Minnesota, on Tuesday, December 23, 1980, commencing at 9:30 a.m. The proposed amendments and repeals may be modified as a result of the hearing process. Therefore, if you are affected in any manner by the proposed amendments and repeals you are urged to participate in the rule hearing process.

Following the agency's presentation at the hearing, all interested or affected persons will have an opportunity to ask questions and make comments. Statements may be made orally and written material may be submitted. In addition, whether or not an appearance is made at the hearing, written statements or material may be submitted to Jon L. Lunde, Hearing Examiner, Room 300, 1745 University Avenue, St. Paul, Minnesota 55104, telephone: (612) 296-5938, either before the hearing or within five (5) working days after the close of the hearing. The hearing examiner may, at the hearing, order that the record be kept open for a longer period not to exceed twenty (20) calendar days. All such statements will be entered into and become part of the record. For those wishing to submit written statements or exhibits, it is requested that at least two (2) copies be furnished. In addition, it is suggested, to save time and avoid duplication, that those persons, organizations, or associations having a common viewpoint or interest in these proceedings join together where possible and present a single statement in behalf of such interests. The rule hearing procedure is governed by Minn. Stat. §§ 15.0411-15.0417, and 15.052, and by 9 MCAR §§ 2.101-2.113 (Minnesota Code of Agency Rules). If you have any questions about the procedure, call or write the hearing examiner.

Notice is hereby given that twenty-five (25) days prior to the hearing, a Statement of Need and Reasonableness will be available for review at the agency and at the Office of Administrative Hearings. This Statement of Need and Reasonableness will include a summary of all of the evidence and argument which the agency anticipates presenting at the hearing justifying both the need for and the reasonableness of the proposed rules. However, additional evidence may be submitted in response to questions raised by interested persons. You are therefore urged to both review the Statement of Need and Reasonableness before the hearing and to attend the hearing. Copies of the Statement of Need and Reasonableness may be obtained from the Office of Administrative Hearings at a minimal charge.

The agency's authority to amend NHA 10 and 13 and to repeal NHA 22 and 23 is contained in Minn. Stat. §§ 144A.20, 144A.22, 144A.23 and 144A.24 (1978).

PROPOSED RULES

If adopted, the proposed amendments would allow the board to waive certain licensure requirements for any applicant who, on April 15, 1980, was registered with the Commissioner of Health as a hospital administrator and who was on that date administratively responsible for a convalescent and nursing care unit attached to the hospital. The proposed amendments would also allow the board to waive certain licensure requirements and issue a restricted license to a person administering a nursing home operated in accordance with The Church of Christ, Scientist. It is also proposed that NHA 22 and 23 and portions of NHA 10 be repealed.

A copy of the proposed amendments is attached to this Notice of Hearing. Additional copies will be available at the door on the date of the hearing or may be obtained by writing to Phillip C. Notice: Any person may request notification of the date on which the hearing examiner's report will be available, after which date the agency may not take any final action on the rules for a period of five (5) working days. Any person may request notification of the date on which the hearing record has been submitted (or resubmitted) to the Attorney General by the agency. If you desire to be so notified, you may so indicate at the hearing. After the hearing, you may request notification by sending a written request to the hearing examiner (in the case of the hearing examiner's report) or to the agency (in the case of the agency's submission or resubmission to the Attorney General).

Minn. Stat. ch. 10A requires each lobbyist to register with the State Ethical Practices Board within five (5) days after he or she commences lobbying. A lobbyist is defined in Minn. Stat. § 10A.01, subd. 11 (Supp. 1979) as any individual:

- (a) Engaged for pay or other consideration, or authorized by another individual or association to spend money, who spends more than five hours in any month or more than \$250, not including his own travel expenses and membership dues, in any year, for the purpose of attempting to influence legislative or administrative action by communicating or urging others to communicate with public officials; or
- (b) Who spends more than \$250, not including his own traveling expenses and membership dues, in any year for the purpose of attempting to influence legislative or administrative action by communicating or urging others to communicate with public officials.

Amendments as Proposed

7 MCAR § 6.010 NHA-10 Requirements.

- A.(a) No license shall be issued to a person as a nursing home administrator unless the individual:
 - 1.(1) He is at least 18 years of age.
 - 2.(2) He is of sound physical and mental health.
 - 3.(3) He is of good moral character and otherwise suitable.
- 4.(4) He has furnished satisfactory evidence, as required by the board, that he/she possesses the general administrative abilities needed to satisfactorily administer a nursing home and possesses the ability to relate the administration of a nursing home to the physical, psychological, spiritual, emotional and social needs of patients and to create a compassionate and helpful environment.
 - 5.(5) He has paid all license and examination fees as established by the board.
- 6.(6) He has achieved a passing score, to be reasonably established by the board, on all required examinations, unless otherwise hereinafter provided.
- 7.(1) Satisfactory completion of has satisfactorily completed a board approved practicum course in long term care administration of a minimum of 300 clock hours under the guidance of a licensed nursing home administrator preceptor and the supervision of a faculty person coordinating the course at the college or university offering the course.
- 8.(d) After July 1, 1978, no initial license shall be issued unless the applicant has a Baccalaureate degree (or a higher degree) from an accredited institution. If this degree (or a higher degree) is not in health care administration with courses in long term care, the degree must include at least one course in each of the following areas: management, long term care programs, gerontology, issues in health care, medical terminology, business or health care law, accounting or fiscal management, and a practicum experience of a minimum of 300 clock hours in a long term care facility.

PROPOSED RULES

- (b) Any applicant for licensure as a nursing home administrator shall submit evidence, satisfactory to the board, that he has met the following minimum educational requirements.
- (2) Satisfactory completion of a minimum of one college level course of at least six qtr. credit hours or four semester hours in long term care in the area of the applicant's greatest need as determined by the board.
- (3) The board may waive NHA 10(b)(1) and/or NHA 10(b)(2) if the applicant holds either a Baccalaureate or Master's degree in Health Care Administration from an accredited institution if the degree includes courses of a minimum of six qtr. eredit hours or four semester hours in long term care.
- (5) The board may waive NHA 10(b)(2) if the applicant submits satisfactory evidence of having actively served full time (40 hrs. per week) as a licensed nursing home administrator in another state for a minimum period of one year.
- (c) After July 1, 1975, no initial license shall be issued unless the applicant has completed at least two years of college from an accredited institution or has an Associate of Arts degree from an accredited institution. If this does not include or the applicant does not have a minimum of six qtr. credit hours or four semester hours in long term health care and a practicum experience of a minimum of 300 clock hours in a long term care facility, he or she must complete such courses in addition to the above educational requirements.
- (f) The board may waive NHA 10(d) for all applicants whose application for licensure is received in the board office on or before June 30, 1978, but who have not met all licensure requirements as of that date, if:
 - (1) the application for licensure is fully completed with all required supporting data provided;
 - (2) application fee has been paid;
 - (3) the applicant has either:
 - (aa) written the required examination; or
- (bb) has completed, is in the process of completing, or has made timely and final application to take all the educational courses required by NHA 10(c); and
- (4) Satisfactorily writes the required examination and completes all educational courses required by NHA 10(e) by June 15, 1979.

B. Waiver provisions.

- 1.(e) The board may waive NHA 10(e) or NHA 10(d)(a)(7) and 10(a)(8) if the applicant submits satisfactory evidence of having actively served full time (40 hrs. per week) as a licensed nursing home administrator in another state for a minimum period of two continuous years and meets all other licensure requirements.
- 2.(4) The board may waive NHA 10(b)(1)(a)(7) if the applicant submits evidence of having completed satisfactorily one year full time as an administrator or in an assistant administrator position in a health care facility.
- 3. The board may waive the requirements of NHA 10(a)(7) and 10(a)(8) for any applicant who, on April 15, 1980, was registered with the Commissioner of Health as a hospital administrator and who was administratively responsible on April 15, 1980, for a convalescent and nursing care (C&NC) unit attached to a hospital and had served in that capacity for a period of three (3) or more years. Any applicant applying for licensure pursuant to this rule shall be required to pass the currently used written examination.
- 4. The board may waive all, except the following, requirements of NHA 10(a)(7) and 10(a)(8) for any applicant who, on April 15, 1980, was registered with the Commissioner of Health as a hospital administrator and who was administratively responsible on April 15, 1980, for a convalescent and nursing care (C&NC) unit attached to a hospital and had served in that capacity for a period of less than three (3) years:
 - a. Long term care programs.
 - b. Gerontology.

Any applicant applying for licensure pursuant to this rule shall be required to pass the currently used written examination.

PROPOSED RULES:

5. The board may waive any provision of its rules requiring a demonstration of medical knowledge which is contrary to the religious beliefs of the Church of Christ, Scientist for any applicant who seeks to obtain a license restricted to administering a nursing home operated exclusively in accordance with the teachings of the Church of Christ, Scientist. Any license issued pursuant to this section shall be endorsed to restrict the license to administering such institutions.

7 MCAR § 6.013 NHA 13 License—Issuance.

A.(a) An applicant for license as a nursing home administrator who has complied with the requirements of the licensing law and the standards provided herein and has passed the examinations, shall be issued a license on a form provided for that purpose by the board, certifying that such applicant has met the requirements of the laws, rules and regulations entitling him to serve, act and practice, and otherwise hold himself out as a duly licensed nursing home administrator subject to any endorsements on the license. Any license issued by the board shall be under the hand and seal of the chairperson and secretary of the board.

NHA 22 Charges

- (a) Any person, or association, or the board, or any member thereof, may prefer charges against any licensee or temporary licensee;
- (1) Such charges shall be in writing and signed by the complainant and shall be submitted to the board. The board shall provide a copy of the charges to the party being charged.
- (b) The board, or any person or persons appointed by it for the said purpose, may hold a preliminary hearing to determine if a formal hearing on the charges is necessary.
- (1) The board may dismiss the charges and take no action thereon, by formal hearing or otherwise, in which event the charges and the order dismissing the charges shall be filed by the board.
- (c) If the board or the person or persons appointed by it, decide that the charges shall be heard, the board shall designate a hearing officer who is not a member of or an employee of the board to examine the charges and set a time and place for the hearing.
- (1) A copy of the charges, together with a notice of the time and place of the hearing, shall be served on the accused at least (30) days before the date fixed for the hearing.
- (2) Where personal service cannot be effected and such fact is certified, on oath by any person duly authorized to make legal service, the board shall cause to be published twice in each of three successive weeks, a notice of the hearing in a newspaper published in the county in which the accused was last known to practice, and on/or before the date of the first publication a copy of the charges and of such notice shall be mailed to the accused at his last known address.
- (3) When publication of the notice is necessary, the date of the hearing shall be not less than thirty (30) days after the last day of the publication of the notice.
- (d) On the conclusion of the hearing and based upon the findings and conclusions of the hearing officer, the board may revoke the license of the accused or suspend such license for a fixed period, or reprimand, or dismiss the charges.
- (1) An order or suspension made by the board may contain such a provision as to reinstatement of the license as the board shall direct.
- (2) The board, in its discretion may direct a rehearing or take additional evidence, and may rescind or affirm the prior determination after such hearing, but nothing in this paragraph shall preclude appropriate relief under and pursuant to the Laws of Minnesota provided for the review and of the administrative determination by the courts of the state.

NHA 23 Conduct of Hearing

- (a) At any hearing conducted pursuant to these rules, any party to the proceedings may appear personally and with counsel and shall be given the opportunity to produce evidence and witnesses and to cross examine witnesses.
- (b) At any formal hearing conducted pursuant to these rules, if a party shall appear without counsel; the board or person designated as hearing officer shall advise such party of his rights to be represented by counsel; and that if he desires to proceed without counsel, that he may call witnesses, cross-examine witnesses, and produce evidence in his behalf.
 - (e) Appearance shall be noted on the official record of hearing.
- (d) The hearing officer may in his discretion, grant adjournments on the request of any party in the proceedings provided than an adjournment shall not be for an indefinite period of time, but shall be set for a day certain.
- (e) The board or the hearing officer may grant a temporary postponement of the proceedings upon application of any party in advance of the hearing date. Such request shall be submitted to the board in writing five (5) days prior to the date

set for hearing and shall specify the reason for such request. In considering an application for postponement of a hearing the board or hearing officer, shall consider whether the purpose of the hearing will be affected or defeated by the granting of such postponement.

- (f) The conduct of the hearing shall not be strictly bound by the rules of evidence, but the determination and recommendation of the hearing officer shall be founded upon sufficient legal basis to do substantial justice.
- (g) Upon the conclusion of the hearing, the board shall take such action upon the written findings and conclusion of the hearing officer as it deems proper, and shall execute an order in writing carrying such findings and conclusions into effect.

The record of the hearing shall be available only to the board, complainant, the accused, or his attorney.

ADOPTED RULES

The adoption of a rule becomes effective after the requirements of Minn. Stat. § 15.0412, subd. 4, have been met and five working days after the rule is published in the State Register, unless a later date is required by statutes or specified in the rule.

If an adopted rule is identical to its proposed form as previously published, a notice of adoption and a citation to its previous State Register publication will be printed.

If an adopted rule differs from its proposed form, language which has been deleted will be printed with strike outs and new language will be underlined, and the rule's previous State Register publication will be cited.

A temporary rule becomes effective upon the approval of the Attorney General as specified in Minn. Stat. § 15.0412, subd. 5. Notice of his decision will be published as soon as practicable, and the adopted temporary rule will be published in the manner provided for adopted rules under subd. 4.

Adopted Rules for Changes in the Rules for Hospital Rate Review

The rules proposed and published at *State Register*, Volume 4, Number 46, pages 1804-1807, May 19, 1980 (4 S.R. 1804) are adopted as proposed, with the following amendments:

Amendments as Adopted

7 MCAR § 1.505 B. 2. Basis. The single percentage figure established by the Commissioner of Health shall be the algebraic sum of the following percentages:

- a. An estimate of the forthcoming annual rate of change in the average total cost of all goods and services to hospitals. This estimate shall be determined by summing the weighted change in price of each of the natural expense classifications described in 7 MCAR § 1.474 A.2.f. The weights shall be the proportionate contributions of each of these natural expense classifications to hospitals' total cost. The estimate shall explicitly recognize the expected overall level of price change in the state's economy and shall be derived from expected annual changes in the Consumer and/or Producer Price Indices and/or relevant components of the Consumer and/or Producer Price and/or other similar economic indices published by the Bureau an agency of Labor Statistics, United States Department of Commerce the Federal or State Government.
 - b. An estimate of the rate of change in the dollar value of the forthcoming annual statewide rate of change in:
 - (1) the average mix of patients utilizing hospitals, and
- (2) the average intensity of services received by patients during hospital stays or visits as is consistent with the delivery of medical care which is of generally accepted quality and efficiency. The estimate shall not be less than zero nor more than .036.

ADOPTED RULES:

For the purposes of this section:

- (1) "Mix" means the types of illnesses, injuries, and conditions treated in hospitals.
- (2) "Intensity of services" means the styles and methods of treating illness, injuries, and conditions in hospitals.
- c. An estimate of the forthcoming annual rate of change in the statewide number of hospital adjusted admissions per 1,000 population as is consistent with the delivery of medical care which is of generally accepted quality and efficiency.
- 3. For purposes of 7 MCAR § 1.505, hospitals shall be divided into two sets, as of the effective date of these rules and every 5 years thereafter, as follows:
- a. Set I shall be composed of hospitals whose combined total gross acute care charges (inpatient plus outpatient) comprise 15% of total gross acute care charges (inpatient plus outpatient) for all non-state, non-federal acute care hospitals. Determination of the hospitals to be included in this set shall be made as follows:
- (1) The total gross acute care charges used shall be for each hospital's 1977 fiscal year, pursuant to 7 MCAR §
- (2) The hospital with the lowest total gross acute care charges shall be selected first. The hospital with the second lowest total gross acute care charges shall be selected second and its gross acute care charges shall be added to the charges of the first selected hospital. The hospital with the third lowest gross acute care charges shall be selected third and its total gross acute care charges shall be added to the sum of the gross acute care charges of the hospitals selected first and second. The procedure shall continue in direct ascending order so as to maximize the number of hospitals included, but the sum of gross patient acute care charges included shall not exceed 15% of the total gross acute care charges for all non-state and non-federal acute care hospitals subject to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes §§ 144.695-144.703.
- b. Set II shall be composed of all non-state, non-federal acute care hospitals subject to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes §§ 144.695-144.703 and not included in Set I as described in 7 MCAR § 1.505 B.3.a.
 - E. Abbreviated projected operating statement.
- 1. Each hospital claiming exempt status shall file an abbreviated projected operating statement no later than the commencement of its fiscal year or up to sixty days prior to the commencement of its fiscal year. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes § 144.701, Subd. 5, no change in rates may be made until sixty days have elapsed from the date of filing.
- 2. An abbreviated projected operating statement for hospitals in Set II, as described in 7 MCAR § 1.505 B.3.b.1. shall include the following data for the prior, current and budget years:
 - a. A natural expense summary consisting of total institutional expenses for:
 - (1) Salaries and wages,
 - (2) Employee benefits,
 - (3) Medical Fees,
 - (4) Raw food,
 - (5) Drugs,
 - (6) Medical Supplies,
 - (7) Other Supplies,
 - (8) Utilities,
 - (9) Repairs and Maintenance,
 - (10) Rental Expense,
 - (11) Insurance.
 - (12) Interest.
 - (13) Depreciation buildings and fixed equipment,
 - (14) Depreciation movable equipment,
 - (15) Other expense.
 - a.b. Total acute care hospital operating expense.
 - b.e. Total institutional patient charges.
 - c.d. Total acute care hospital patient charges.

- d.e. Total acute care hospital inpatient charges.
- e.f. Total acute care hospital outpatient charges.
- f.g. An expense analysis consisting of acute care:
 - (1) Direct costs for:
 - (a) Daily hospital services,
 - (b) Ancillary service,
 - (c) Non-revenue producing centers.
 - (2) Costs after allocation of non-revenue producing centers costs to:
 - (a) Daily hospital services,
 - (b) Ancillary service.
- g.h. An acute care hospital statistical summary consisting of:
 - (1) Number of patient days (excluding nursery),
 - (2) Number of nursery days,
 - (3) Number of total patient days,
 - (4) Number of admissions,
 - (5) Average length of stay,
 - (6) Occupancy licensed beds,
 - (7) Occupancy staffed and set-up beds,
 - (8) Number of outpatient and emergency room visits.
- h.i. An acute care hospital full time equivalent summary consisting of salary and numbers of full-time equivalent personnel for:
 - (1) Daily hospital services,
 - (2) Ancillary services,
 - (3) Non-revenue producing centers,
 - (4) Total hospital,
 - (5) Total institution.
 - i.j. An acute care bed summary consisting of:
 - (1) Number of licensed beds,
 - (2) Number of physically present beds,
 - (3) Number of staffed and set-up beds.
 - j.k. Depreciation fund.
 - (1) Beginning balance,
 - (2) Ending balance.
- 3. An abbreviated projected operating statement for hospitals in Set I, as described in 7 MCAR § 1.505 B.1.a., shall include all data elements found in 7 MCAR § 1.505 B.2.b,c,d,e,f,g,h,i,j,k.
- 3.4. The information provided on the abbreviated projected operating statement shall support the hospital's claim that it will achieve an increase in gross acute care charges less than that established by the Commissioner of Health pursuant to 7 MCAR § 1.505 B.

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Department of Revenue

Adopted Rules Governing the Ad Valorem (Property) Taxes Imposed on Railroad Companies

The rules as published at *State Register*, Volume 4, Number 41, page 1637-1642, April 14, 1980, (4 S.R. 1637-1642) are now adopted with the following amendments:

Amendments as Proposed

13 MCAR § 1.0021 General procedures. The 1979 Minnesota Legislature included in its Omnibus Tax Bill a Section, Article VII, dealing with the taxation of railroads. The article provides for an ad valorem tax on railroads in place of the gross earnings tax. Laws 1979, Chapter 303, Article VII (the so-called Omnibus Tax Bill) codified as Minn. Stat. § 270.80 et seq. (1979 Supp.) eliminated the gross earnings tax on Minnesota railroads and replaced it with an ad valorem tax on all railroad operating property. The Article also charges the Commissioner of Revenue with the responsibility of developing rules, both temporary and permanent, which will implement the provisions of the law dealing with the ad valorem method of taxing railroads.

The first valuation of railroad operating property will be made for the assessment year 1979. No apportionment of value to the local taxing districts will be made until 1981 for ad valorem taxes payable in 1982.

The methods, procedures, indicators of value, capitalization rates, weighting percents, allocation factors and apportionment standards will be used as described in this chapter for 1979 and subsequent years.

- 13 MCAR § 1.0022 Definitions. As used in this chapter, the following words, terms and phrases shall have the meanings given to them by this rule. Some of the words, terms and phrases listed below are defined by statute but are included here for completeness.
- A. "Allocation" the process of dividing the unit value of a railroad company among the states in which the railroad operates. means the process by which a fair and reasonable portion of each railroad's total unit value is assigned to Minnesota for purposes of taxation.
- B. "Apportionment" means the process of distributing that portion of the railroad's unit value which has been allocated to Minnesota after deducting exempt and non-operating property to the various counties and taxing districts in which the railroad company operates.
- C. "Book depreciation" means the depreciation shown by a railroad company on its corporate books, and allowed the company by the Interstate Commerce Commission.
- D. "Capitalization rate" means an anticipated rate of return from an investment; a rate at which income is processed (capitalized) to indicate the probable capital value. This rate is usually expressed as a percentage.
- E. "Exempt property" means property which is non-taxable for ad valorem tax purposes by statutes. Examples of such property are approved pollution control equipment for which an exemption has been granted, and personal property such as office furniture and licensed vehicles otherwise exempt from taxation under Minn. Stat. Chapter 272.
 - F. "1.C.C." means the Interstate Commerce Commission, a Federal regulatory agency.
- G. "Non-operating property" means all property owned by a railroad company which does not fall under the definition of operating property. Nonoperating property shall include real property which is leased or rented or available for lease or rent to any person which is not a railroad company. Vacant land shall be presumed to be available for lease or rent if it has not been used as operating property for a period of one year preceding the valuation date. It shall also include land which is not necessary and intregal to the performance of railroad transportation services and which is not used on a regular and continual basis in the performance of these services. This property shall be valued by the local or county assessor rather than by the Commissioner of Revenue.
- H. "Operating property" means all property owned or used on a regular and continual basis by a railroad company in the performance of railroad transportation services, including without limitation franchises, rights-of-way, bridges, trestles, shops, docks, wharves, buildings and structures.
- I. "Original cost" means the amount paid for an asset as recorded on the railroad's books in accordance with ICC accounting rules and regulations.
 - J. "P.U.C." means the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission.
- K. "Railroad Company" means any company which as a common carrier operates a railroad or a line or lines of railway situated within or partly within Minnesota.

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- L. "System" means the total tangible property, real and personal, of a company which is used in its railroad operations in all states in which it operates.
- M. "Unit value" means the value of the system of a railroad company taken as a whole without any regard to the value of its component parts.
- N. "Weighting" means the confidence or reliability given to a factor or indicator. It is usually expressed as a portion of 100%.

13 MCAR § 1.0023 Reports required.

- A. The data used in the valuation, allocation and apportionment processes will be drawn from reports submitted to the Department of Revenue by the railroad companies and other sources the Commissioner believes are pertinent. These reports are to be filed with the Commissioner on or before April 30 of each year and shall include:
 - 1. The Minnesota Department of Revenue Annual Railroad Report.
 - 2. Annual Report to the Interstate Commerce Commission (ICC).
 - 3. Annual Report to the Minnesota Public Service Utilities Commission (P.S.C.).
 - 4. Annual Stockholders Report.
- 5. Other commonly accepted sources of railroad income, expense, capitalization and debt and stock values such as Standard & Poor's Stock Guide, Standard & Poor's Statistical Service, Moody's Transportation Manual, and Transportation Statistics in the United States compiled by the Interstate Commerce Commission.
- B. Periodic examination of the supporting data for these reports will be made by the Department of Revenue. The commissioner shall, upon written application from the railroad, extend the filing date 30 days.
- C. In the event any railroad company shall fail to file the required reports, the commissioner shall make a valuation according to his best judgment based on available information.
- D. Other sources of pertinent information may be consulted only when necessary to make the valuation, allocation and apportionment required by §§ 1.0021 to 1.0026. Said sources will, when applicable, be used uniformly and will be commonly accepted sources of data for which they are consulted. Questions unique to the valuation of a particular railroad may be resolved by consulting the books and records of the particular railroad involved.

13 MCAR § 1.0024 Valuation.

- A. General. The Minnesota Legislature has specified that railroads must be valued using the unit basis of estimating value. The approaches to value which will be used in determining the estimated unit value of railroad operating property are cost, capitalized income, and stock and debt except as provided for in 13 MCAR § 1.0024 D. and F. It is the decision of the Commissioner of Revenue that for 1979 and subsequent years the value of railroad property will be determined using these three approaches to value, where applicable, in the manner provided for in this section.
- B. Cost approach to valuation. The cost factor that will be considered in the railroad valuation method is the original cost of the railroad system, plus the original cost of construction work in progress on the assessment date. The railroad system shall be considered to be made up of the following I.C.C. accounts: all road and equipment accounts, all general expenditures and other elements of investment accounts, and railroad property owned but leased to others. As required by statute, no depreciation or obsolescence shall be allowed as a deduction from the original cost of the railroad's assets enumerated above.

The following is an example of how the cost indicator of value is to be computed:

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This cost indicator of value computed in accordance with this rule will bear a weighting of 25 percent of the total unit value estimate of the railroad's property, except in the case of bankrupt railroads, or railroads with no income to be capitalized as provided for in 13 MCAR § 1.0024 F.

- C. Income approach to valuation. The income indicator of value will be calculated by averaging the Net Railway Operating Income (as defined determined by the I.C.C.) of the railroad for the most recent five years preceding the assessment. This average income shall be capitalized by applying to it a capitalization rate which will be computed by using the Band of Investment Method. This method will consider:
 - 1. The capital structure of railroads.
 - 2. The cost of debt or interest rate paying particular attention to imbedded debt of railroads.
 - 3. The yield on preferred stock of railroads.
 - 4. The yield on common stock of railroads.

For 1979 and subsequent years this capitalization rate will be 11%.

An example of a computation of the capitalized income approach to value is as follows:

Five year average Net Railway Operating Income Capitalized at 11% (2,340,250 ÷ 11%) equals \$21,275,000.

The income indicator of value computed in accordance with this rule will shall be weighted 50 percent of the total estimated unit value of the railroad's property except in the case of bankrupt railroads or railroads having no net operating income as provided for in 13 MCAR § 1.0024 F.; and railroads not meeting the requirements for the use of the stock and debt indicator of value. Where no stock and debt indicator of value is used the income indicator will be weighted 75%.

D. Stock and Debt approach to valuation. The "Stock and Debt" approach to value is the third method which will be used to estimate the unit value of the railroad operating property. This approach to value is based on the accounting principle: Assets = Liabilities + Equity. Therefore, when the value of a company's liabilities (debt) is found and this added to the worth of its stock, a value can be established for its assets (property).

The use of this approach to value will be limited to only those railroads meeting certain qualifications listed below:

- 1. The stock of the railroad must be traded on a recognized stock exchange either the New York or American Stock Exchange.
- 2. The bonds of the railroad must be traded or have a rating by a recognized financial rating service either Standard and Poor's or Moody's rating services.
- 3. If the railroad is part of a diversified company the value of the railroad portion of the total stock price must be able to be separated on an earnings basis using the method described below.

For example if a railroad is part of a conglomerate whose stock sells at \$100 per share and 50% of the net earnings of the conglomerate are from railroad operations then the value of the railroad's portion of the stock is \$50 per share.

If a railroad has no net earnings, making it impossible to separate the stock value into its parts, and is part of a conglomerate, then the stock and debt indicator of value will not be used.

The value of the stock used in the stock and debt method shall be an average of the month ending stock prices for the twelve months immediately preceding the assessment date of January 2nd. The value of the bonds, equipment obligations and conditional sales contracts and other long term debts shall also be an average of the cost of money quotes for the twelve months immediately preceding the assessment date of January 2nd. The source for these stock and bond prices shall be Standard and Poor's Stockguide, or other applicable financial service.

An illustration of a computation of the stock and debt approach to value is as follows:

After the gross stock and debt indicator of value has been computed an allowance will be made for the effect, if any, of revenue from other than railway operations included in this indicator of value. This allowance shall be based on the ratio of a five year average of Net Revenue from Railway Operations, as defined determined by the I.C.C., to a similar five year average of Income Available for Fixed Charges as defined determined by the I.C.C. The five year average will be the most recent five years preceding the assessment date.

An example of this computation is as follows:

The stock and debt indicator of value computed in accordance with this rule will bear a weighting of 25 percent of the total unit value of the railroad's property, except in the case of bankrupt railroads, railroads in bankruptcy proceedings or railroads with no income to be capitalized as provided for in 13 MCAR § 1.0024 F.

E. Unit Value Computation. The estimated unit value of the railroad property will be the total of the three weighted indicators of value.

The following is an example of the computation of the unit value.

The weighting shown above may vary from railroad to railroad, as provided for in 13 MCAR § 1.0024 B., C. and D. depending on the conditions and circumstances involved in each valuation. For example a railroad with no outstanding stock would not have a computation for a stock and debt indicator of value, and therefore the income indicator of value would be weighted 75%.

F. Railroads operating at a loss, and Bankrupt railroads involved in federal bankruptcy proceedings, and railroads adjudged bankrupted by a Federal Court. Railroads which are involved in Federal bankruptcy proceedings, adjudged bankrupt or railroads having no net railway operating income will be valued using whatever indicators of value are workable using the cost and stock and debt approaches to value. If the stocks or bonds of such railroads are not traded, or do not meet the other requirements for use of the stock and debt indicator of value then these railroads will be valued using the cost approach to value only.

13 MCAR § 1.0025 Allocation.

- A. General. After the estimated unit value of the railroad property has been determined, the portion of value which is attributable to Minnesota must be established. This is accomplished through the use of certain allocation factors. Each of the factors in the allocation method shows a relationship between the railroad system operations in all states and its Minnesota operations. These relationships are expressed in a percentage figure. These percentages are then added and an average is computed. The resulting average of the factors, multiplied by the unit value, yields the Minnesota portion of the railroad property which will, after the adjustments described in § 1.0026, be subject to ad valorem tax in the State of Minnesota.
- B. Allocation factors. The factors to be considered in making allocations of unit values to Minnesota for railroad companies are:
 - 1. Miles of railroad track operated in Minnesota divided by miles of railroad track operated in all states.
 - 2. Ton miles of revenue freight transported in Minnesota divided by ton miles of revenue freight transported in all states.
- 3. Gross revenues from transportation operations within Minnesota divided by gross revenues from transportation operations in all states.
 - 4. Original cost of road property in Minnesota divided by the original cost of road property in all states.

The following example illustrates the allocation method to be applied to the unit value of railroad property.

13 MCAR § 1.0026 Adjustments for non-formula assessed property or exempt property. After the Minnesota portion of the unit value of the railroad company is determined property which is either exempt from taxation, such as pollution control equipment and personal property, or classified as non-operating will be deducted from the Minnesota portion of the unit value to the extent that it has been included in the computation of this value.

Property which has been included in the computation of the unit value but has been defined as non-operating property will be

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valued by the local assessor. The Minnesota portion of the unit value will be reduced by the original cost of this property. Only non-operating property located within the State of Minnesota will be eligible for this exclusion.

The railroad company shall have the responsibility to submit to the Commissioner of Revenue, in the form required by the commissioner, such schedules of non-operating property as he may require.

In addition to non-operating property which will be valued and assessed locally a deduction from the Minnesota portion of the unit value will be made for personal property. The unit value method presupposes that the value of any one portion of the unit is interdependent upon all other elements of the unit; therefore, it is extremely difficult to make a separation of this value into real and personal property.

A percentage of the Minnesota portion of the unit value after deducting non-operating and exempt property will be excluded as personal property. This percentage will be computed in the following way:

The following I.C.C. accounts for property within Minnesota will be totaled:

That portion of coal and ore wharves determined to be personal property less applicable depreciation;

Communication equipment less applicable depreciation;

Roadway machines less applicable depreciation;

Shop machinery less applicable depreciation;

Power plant machines less applicable depreciation;

Equipment, allocated to Minnesota on the basis of car and locomotive miles in Minnesota compared to total system car and locomotive miles, less applicable depreciation.

The total of these accounts will then be divided by the total of the Minnesota road, equipment, leased property, general expenditures, construction work in progress, and other elements of investment accounts; all less applicable depreciation. The resulting percentage will be used to determine the personal property amount of the Minnesota portion of the unit value. This portion will not be taxable for ad valorem purposes.

The following is an illustration of the computation for the personal property exclusion.

Adopted Rules Relating to the Construction, Equipment, Maintenance, Operation and Licensing of Nursing Homes and Boarding Care Homes

The proposed rules published at *State Register*, Volume 4, Number 34, pages 1317-1325, February 25, 1980 (4 S.R. 1317) with errata published at *State Register*, Volume 4, Number 37, page 1520, March 17, 1980 (4 S.R. 1520) were adopted on October 7, 1980, approved by the Attorney General on October 30, 1980, and filed with the Secretary of State on October 30, 1980, with the following amendments. (Copies of the full text of the adopted rules are available from the Documents Division of the Department of Administration.)

Amendments as Adopted

7 MCAR § 1.044 X. Variance and waivers.

- 2.e. Such other relevant information which the department shall determine is necessary to properly evaluate the request for the variance or waiver.
 - 3. Criteria for evaluation.
 - a. A variance or waiver shall be granted if the department determines that:
 - (1) The alternative measures to be taken are equivalent or superior to those prescribed in the rule or rules;
- (2) The granting of the variance or waiver will not adversely affect the health, treatment, comfort, safety or well being of the patients or residents; and
 - (3) The application of the rule or rules would impose an undue burden upon the applicant.
- a. The decision to grant or deny a variance or waiver shall be based on the department's evaluation of the following criteria:
- (1) The variance or waiver will not adversely affect the health, treatment, comfort, safety or well-being of a patient or resident;
 - (2) The alternative measures to be taken, if any, are equivalent to or superior to those prescribed in the rules; and
 - (3) Compliance with the rule or rules would impose an undue burden upon the applicant.
- 5.b. A variance or waiver may shall be renewed by the department if the applicant continues to satisfy the criteria contained in (3) above and demonstrates compliance with the alternative measures or conditions imposed at the time the original variance or waiver was granted.
- 6. Denial, revocation or refusal to renew. The department shall deny, revoke or refuse to renew a variance or waiver if it is determined that the criteria in 3. above are not met. The applicant shall be notified in writing of the decision to deny, revoke or refuse to renew the variance or waiver, informed of the reasons for the denial, revocation or refusal to renew and informed of the right to appeal this decision.
- 7. Appeal procedure. An applicant may contest the denial, revocation or refusal to renew a variance or waiver by requesting a contested case hearing under the provisions of the Administrative Procedures Act, Minnesota Statutes, § 15.0411 et seq. The applicant shall submit, within 15 days of the receipt of the department's decision, a written request for a hearing. The request for hearing shall set forth in detail the reasons why the applicant contends the decision of the department should be reversed or

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modified. At the hearing, the applicant shall have the burden of proving that it satisfied the criteria specified in 3. above—, except in a proceeding challenging the revocation of a variance or waiver.

7 MCAR § 1.046 L. Use of oxygen.

- 1. Oxygen may be used in a nursing home on an emergency or nonemergency basis. A registered nurse or other person trained in the use of oxygen shall be responsible for its administration and shall be on duty during the entire time that oxygen is administered. The following precautions shall be taken:
 - a. Signs indicating "No Smoking" shall be placed at the bedside and at the entrance to the room.
 - b. All matches, ashtrays and other smoking material shall be removed and kept out of the room.
 - c. No oil or grease shall be used on oxygen equipment.
 - d. Oxygen tanks shall be securely anchored when stored or in use.
- 2.f. Written policies and procedures shall be developed and implemented regarding the care, storage, cleaning and sanitizing of oxygen tanks, equipment and supplies.
- L.3. All oxygen used in the nursing home shall be from cylinders which bear labeling indicating that the oxygen is for medical purposes.

7 MCAR § 1.047 Personnel.

A. Tuberculosis testing of employees. The nursing home or boarding care home shall be responsible for assuring that all employees, prior to employment and as otherwise indicated in this rule, show freedom from tuberculosis in accordance with the provisions of this section. The nursing home and the boarding care home shall reimburse their employees for the costs, if any, of obtaining the necessary tests which demonstrate freedom from tuberculosis.

7 MCAR § 1.048 A.8. Record of patients' and residents' funds.

- a. Admission agreement policy. The admission policies of the nursing home and boarding care home shall specify whether the home will accept the personal funds of patients or residents for safekeeping. If the nursing home or boarding care home accepts the personal funds of patients and residents for safekeeping, written policies regarding the handling and protection of the funds shall be established in accordance with this section.
- b.(1) The personal funds of the patient or resident shall not be accepted for safekeeping without written authorization from the patient or resident or from the patient's or resident's legal guardian or conservator or representative payee.
- (3) A "representative payee" is an individual designated by the Social Security Administration to receive benefits on behalf of the patient or resident.
- c.(4)(a) Each patient or resident and the patient's or resident's <u>legal</u> guardian, <u>or</u> conservator, <u>representative payee</u> or other person designated by the patient or resident shall be allowed access to the written records of all financial arrangements and transactions involving the individual patient's or resident's funds in accordance with the nursing home's and boarding care home's written policy. Such policy shall assure that access be allowed at least one hour 5 days per week provided in accordance with the needs of patients and residents.
- (b) Each patient or resident or the patient's or resident's <u>legal</u> guardian, <u>or conservator</u>, <u>representative payee</u> or other person designated in writing by the patient or resident, shall be <u>provided</u> given a written quarterly accounting of the financial transactions made by or on behalf of the patient or resident.
- (c)(ii) The name of all individuals, other than the patient or resident, who have been authorized, in writing, by the patient or resident or the patient's or resident's legal guardian or conservator or representative payee to withdraw or expend funds from the patient's or resident's personal account.
- (iii) The date and the amount of all withdrawals from the patient's or resident's personal account. Receipts for purchases made with money withdrawn from a patient's or resident's account by individuals other than the patient or refident shall be obtained and placed in the patient's or resident's record.

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- (5) Unless otherwise specified by law, T the personal funds of any patient or resident in excess of 100.00 \$150.00 shall be deposited in a demand account in a financial institution authorized to do business in Minnesota, the deposits of which are federally insured, except that a facility that is operated by a county shall deposit funds with the county treasurer. This account must be in a form which clearly indicates that the facility has only a fiduciary interest in the funds. Records shall be maintained which specify on whose behalf funds are deposited or withdrawn from this account.
- (7) Upon the request of the patient or resident or the patient's or resident's <u>legal</u> guardian or conservator, <u>or representative payee</u>, the nursing home or boarding care home shall return all or any part of the patient's or resident's funds given to the nursing home or boarding care home for safekeeping, including interest, if any, accrued from deposits. The nursing home or boarding care home shall develop a policy specifying the period of time for each day of the week that funds can be withdrawn during which funds can be withdrawn each day of the week. Funds kept outside of the facility shall be returned within three banking five business days.
- d. Discharge of patient or resident. Upon discharge of a patient or resident, unless the patient's or resident's bed is being held for anticipated readmission, all funds of that patient or resident shall be returned to the patient or resident or to an authorized individual the patient's or resident's legal guardian or conservator, representative payee or other person designated, in writing, by the patient or resident, with a written accounting, in exchange for a signed receipt. Funds which are maintained outside of the nursing home or boarding care home shall be returned within three banking five business days.
- e. Death of a patient or resident. Upon the death of a patient or resident, the nursing home or boarding care home shall provide a complete accounting of that patient's or resident's funds and shall return the funds to the appropriate individuals in accordance with state law.
- f. Change of ownership. Prior to a change of ownership of a nursing home or boarding care home, a written verification by a public accountant of all patients' and residents' funds shall be provided to the new licensee in exchange for a signed receipt.

Findings of Fact

John Knapp

- 17. During all of the years 1972, 1973, 1974, 1975, 1976 and 1977, the management of the properties which accounted for the losses claimed was in the same parties, namely, Harold Specktor and Irving Shaw. No one was ever selected or employed to manage the apartment buildings throughout the entire period, and there was no change in the year 1974. Specktor-Shaw Properties did, however, employ three caretakers and one bookkeeper during all the years at issue in connection with the operation of the apartment buildings. Such caretakers were employed for cleaning the premises and not for repair work.
 - 20. The Tax Court entered its decision, reversing the Commissioner's Orders on May 27, 1980.
 - 21. On June 11, 1980, appellee moved for Amended Findings of Fat and Conclusions of Law.

Memorandum

The issue in this case centers around the interpretation of Minn. Stat. § 290.01, subd. 20. That section defines gross income for Minnesota tax purposes as the adjusted gross income computed for federal income tax purposes. In the case of *Wicker v. Commissioner of Revenue*, Minn. Tax Court Dkt. No. 2245, July 25, 1979, this Court was confronted with interpreting that statute as it has been in this case. The Court said:

The statute clearly states that gross income in Minnesota means the taxpayer's adjusted gross income as *computed* for federal income tax purposes. (Emphasis in original) Wicker at 4.

The statute in question is clear in dictating by what means Minnesota gross income will be computed. The Legislature, with its vast insight, has seen fit to dictate what Minnesota gross income is. We are merely applying the definition that the Legislature has outlined. For us to do any more would be improper on the Court's part. Therefore, appellee's Motion for Amended Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law is hereby partly denied and partly granted.

- C. A generator of hazardous waste within the state who has been issued permits by the Pollution Control Agency for a hazardous waste facility to be owned and operated by the generator, on property owned by the generator, and to be used by the generator for managing the hazardous wastes produced by the generator only; and
- D. A person who has been issued permits by the Pollution Control Agency for a commercial hazardous waste processing facility at a site included in the Waste Management Board's inventory of preferred sites for such facilities adopted pursuant to § 115A.09.

Minn. Laws of 1980, ch. 564, Art. IV, § 5 requires at least the following factors be considered in the supplementary review process.

- A. The risk and effect of the proposed facility on local residents, units of government, and the local public health, safety, and welfare, including such dangers as an accidental release of wastes during transportation to the facility; water, air and land pollution; fire or explosion, where appropriate; and the degree to which the risk or effect may be alleviated.
- B. The consistency of the proposed facility with, and its effect on, existing and planned local land use and development; local laws, ordinances, and permits; and local public facilities and services.
- C. The adverse effects of the facility on agriculture and natural resources and opportunities to mitigate or eliminate the adverse effects by additional stipulations, conditions, and requirements respecting the proposed facility at the proposed site.
- D. The need for the proposed facility, especially its contribution to abating solid and hazardous waste disposal, the availability of alternative sites, and opportunities to mitigate or eliminate need by additional and alternative waste management strategies or actions of a significantly different nature.

E. 50592/Sp. State of Minnesota vs. Jesse Botell Moyer, Appellant. Hennepin County.

Trial court did not commit prejudicial error in admitting other-crime evidence under R. 404(b), R. Evid.

Trial court did not clearly and prejudicially abuse its discretion in denying motion by defendant pursuant to R. 609, R. Evid., to her prosecutor from cross-examining defendant about prior rape conviction if he testified.

Trial court, in imposing minimum sentence pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 609.11 (1978), properly rejected argument of defendant that incendiary device used was not a dangerous weapon.

Affirmed. Peterson, J. Concurring specially, Otis, J. and Wahl, J.

51024/Sp. State of Minnesota vs. Ronald Thomas Coe, Appellant. Hennepin County.

Evidence on the issue of identification was not, as defendant contends, legally insufficient.

Trial court did not commit prejudicial error in modifying omnibus hearing order dealing with admission of other-crime evidence bearing on issue of identification.

Affirmed. Peterson, J.

51069/Sp. State of Minnesota vs. Conrad Kegg, Appellant. Mille Lacs County.

Evidence was sufficient to establish assault with a dangerous weapon.

Defendant was not prejudiced by prosecutor's improper questioning concerning defendant's prior "troubles" with the law where evidence of defendant's guilt was strong and where curative instruction requested by defendant was given.

Issues concerning alleged improper statements by prosecutor in closing argument and failure by trial court to submit less serious offense are deemed forfeited by defendant's failure to object to the statements or request submission of the less serious offense.

Affirmed. Todd, J.

50660/341 In the Matter of the Application for the Discipline of Kenneth Allen Johnson, an Attorney at Law of the State of Minnesota. Supreme Court.

In disciplinary proceedings, respondent, who plead guilty to theft over \$2500 in a criminal proceeding, is indefinitely suspended from the practice of law in Minnesota. Respondent may apply for readmission after January 1, 1983, provided he has complied with certain conditions.
