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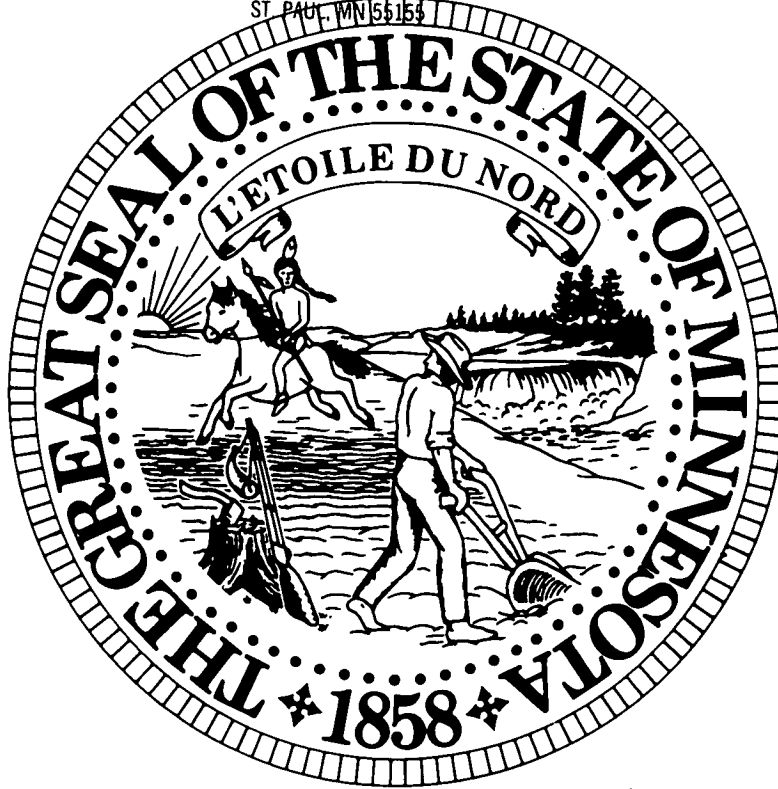

Requests for deadline extensions should be made only in valid emergency situations.

**Notices of public hearings on proposed rules and notices of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing are published in the Proposed Rules section and must be submitted two weeks prior to the issue date.

A *State Register Contracts Supplement* is published every Thursday. The Monday edition is the vehicle for conveying all information about state agency rulemaking, including official notices; hearing notices; proposed, adopted and emergency rules. It also contains executive orders of the governor; commissioners' orders; state contracts and advertised bids; professional, technical and consulting contracts; non-state public contracts; state grants; decisions of the supreme court; a monthly calendar of scheduled cases before the supreme court; and other announcements. The Thursday edition contains additional state contracts and advertised bids, and the most complete listing of contract awards available in one source.

In accordance with expressed legislative intent that the *State Register* be self-supporting, the following subscription rates have been established: the Monday edition costs \$140.00 per year and includes an index issue published in August (single issues are available at the address listed above for \$3.50 per copy); the combined Monday and Thursday editions cost \$195.00 (subscriptions are not available for just the *Contracts Supplement*); trial subscriptions are available for \$60.00, include both the Monday and Thursday edition, last for 13 weeks, and may be converted to a full subscription anytime by making up the price difference. No refunds will be made in the event of subscription cancellation.

Both editions are delivered postpaid to points in the United States, second class postage paid for the Monday edition at St. Paul, MN, first class for the Thursday edition. Publication Number 326630 (ISSN 0146-7751).

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NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 75 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific *Minnesota Rule* chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the *Minnesota Rules* are published. This is a ten-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Proposed and adopted emergency rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

If an agency seeks outside opinion before issuing new rules or rule amendments, it must publish a NOTICE OF INTENT TO SOLICIT OUTSIDE OPINION in the *Official Notices* section of the *State Register*. When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues 1-13 inclusive; issues 14-25 inclusive; issue 26, cumulative for issues 1-26; issues 27-38 inclusive; issue 39, cumulative for 1-39; issues 40-51 inclusive; and issue 52, cumulative for 1-52. An annual subject matter index for rules appears in August. Proposed Rules

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§ 14.22, an agency may propose to adopt, amend, suspend or repeal rules without first holding a public hearing, as long as the agency determines that the rules will be noncontroversial in nature. The agency must first publish a notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing, together with the proposed rules, in the *State Register*. The notice must advise the public:

1. that they have 30 days in which to submit comment on the proposed rules;
2. that no public hearing will be held unless 25 or more persons make a written request for a hearing within the 30-day comment period;
3. of the manner in which persons shall request a hearing on the proposed rules; and
4. that the rule may be modified if the modifications are supported by the data and views submitted.

If, during the 30-day comment period, 25 or more persons submit to the agency a written request for a hearing of the proposed rules, the agency must proceed under the provisions of §§ 14.14-14.20, which state that if an agency decides to hold a public hearing, it must publish a notice of intent in the *State Register*.

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§ 14.29 and 14.30, agencies may propose emergency rules under certain circumstances. Proposed emergency rules are published in the *State Register* and, for at least 25 days thereafter, interested persons may submit data and views in writing to the proposing agency.

Proposed Permanent Rules Relating to Rehabilitation Services for Blind and Visually Handicapped Persons

Notice of Intent to Adopt Rules With a Public Hearing

NOTICE IS GIVEN that a public hearing will be held pursuant to *Minnesota Statute* Section 14.14, subdivision 1, in the above entitled matter in Room 5 of the State Office Building, 100 Constitution Avenue, St. Paul, Minnesota, 55155, on Saturday, December 15, 1990 at 9:00 a.m. and continuing until all interested persons have had an opportunity to be heard concerning adoption of these proposed rules by submitting either oral or written data, statements or arguments. Statements, briefs or written materials may be submitted within the comment period described in this notice without appearing at the hearing by sending them to the administrative law judge assigned to conduct the hearing, Administrative Law Judge Jon L. Lunde, Office of Administrative Hearings, 400 Summit Bank, 310 4th Avenue South, Minneapolis, Minnesota 55415, (612) 341-7645. The rule hearing procedure is governed by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.14-14.20 and by *Minnesota Rules* parts 1400.0200-1200. Questions regarding procedures may be directed to the Administrative Law Judge at the above listed address and phone number.

The Commissioner of Jobs and Training (hereinafter "Commissioner") has determined that the proposed adoption of these rules is necessary to assure appropriate and consistent delivery of rehabilitation services to persons who are blind or visually handicapped.

Authority for the adoption of these rules is contained in *Minnesota Statutes* section 248.07 subdivision 14. A. Additionally a Statement of Need and Reasonableness that describes the need and reasonableness of each provision of the proposed rules and identifies the data and information relied upon to support the proposed rules has been prepared and is available for resource at Services for the Blind and Visually Handicapped, 1745 University Avenue, St. Paul, Minnesota, 55104, and at the Office of Administrative Hearings. Copies of the Statement of Need and Reasonableness may be obtained from the Office of Administrative Hearings at the cost of reproduction. You are advised, pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* section 14.115 "Small Business Consideration in Rulemaking", that the proposed rules will not have an impact on small business in Minnesota. Also, pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.11 "Special Notice of Rulemaking" the adoption of these rules will not have any impact on agricultural land nor should the expenditure of public money exceed \$200,000 in either of the two years following the adoption of these rules, within the meaning of that law.

All interested or affected persons will have an opportunity to participate by presenting oral and/or written evidence at the hearing. Questioning of agency representatives and persons making oral statements will be permitted for purposes material to the evaluation or formulation of the proposed rules. As a result of the hearing process, the proposed rule may be modified. Therefore, if you are affected in any manner by the proposed rules, you are urged to participate in the rule hearing process.

Written material may be submitted to the Administrative Law Judge and recorded in the hearing record for five working days after the public hearing ends. The comment period may be extended for a longer period not to exceed 20 calendar days if ordered by the Administrative Law Judge at the hearing. Comments received during the comment period will be available for preview at the Office of Administrative Hearings. Following the five to twenty day comment period, there will be a three day period in which the agency may indicate in writing whether there are any amendments suggested by other persons which the agency is willing to adopt. Additional evidence may be submitted during the three day period. The written responses will be added to the record of the proceedings.

Notice: Any person may request notification of the dates which the Administrative Law Judge's report will be available after which dates Services for the Blind and Visually Handicapped may not take any final action on the rules for a period of five working days. If you desire to be so notified, you may so indicate at the hearing. After the hearing, you may request notification by sending a written request to the Administrative Law Judge. Any person may request notification of the date on which the rules were adopted and filed

with the Secretary of State. The notice must be mailed on the same day that the rules are filed. If you want to be so notified you may so indicate at the hearing or send a request to Services for the Blind and Visually Handicapped at any time prior to the filing of the rules with the Secretary of State.

Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 10A requires such lobbyist to register with the State Ethical Practices Board within five days after he or she commences lobbying. A lobbyist is defined in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 10 A.01, subdivision 11 as an individual:

a.) Engaged for pay or other consideration, or authorized by another individual or association to spend money, who spends more than five hours in any month or more than \$250, not including travel expenses or membership dues, in any year, for the purpose of attempting to influence legislative or administrative action by communicating or urging others to communicate with public officials; or

b.) Who spends more than \$350, not including travel expenses and membership dues, in any year for the purpose of attempting to influence legislative or administrative action by communicating or urging others to communicate with public officials.

Rules as Proposed

GENERAL

3325.0100 PURPOSE AND SCOPE.

Subpart 1. **Purpose.** The purpose of parts 3325.0100 to ~~3325.0490~~ 3325.0500 is to establish procedures and standards for the provision of rehabilitation services to blind and visually handicapped persons present in Minnesota.

Subp. 2. **Scope.** Parts 3325.0100 to ~~3325.0490~~ 3325.0500 apply to Services for the Blind and Visually Handicapped (SSB), all vendors of services under agreement with SSB and all persons applying for or receiving rehabilitation service from SSB. Parts 3325.0100 to ~~3325.0490~~ 3325.0500 do not require expenditures for a client if funds are not available to SSB from federal and state appropriations for the provision of rehabilitation services under the program in which the client is being served.

Subp. 3. **Exclusion.** All matters pertaining to the operation of the Business Enterprises Program under the Code of Federal Regulations, title 34, part 395 are governed by parts ~~9570.0100~~ 3321.0100 to ~~9570.1400~~ 3321.1400 and are not affected by parts 3325.0100 to ~~3325.0490~~ 3325.0500.

3325.0110 DEFINITIONS.

Subpart 1. **Scope.** The terms used in parts 3325.0100 to ~~3325.0490~~ 3325.0500 have the meanings given to them in this part.

Subp. 4. **Alternative techniques.** "Alternative techniques" means methods ~~which that~~ enable persons to perform homemaking ~~and self-care, or other~~ activities independently without sight or with limited sight. These methods include cane travel and braille reading and writing.

Subp. 5. **Appellant.** "Appellant" means an applicant or client who has filed ~~an appeal~~ a request for review under part 3325.0480, subpart 1; ~~3325.0490, subpart 1; or 3325.0500, subpart 1.~~

Subp. 10. **Client assistance program.** "Client assistance program" means the federal and state sponsored program through which ~~handicapped~~ persons with handicaps in the vocational rehabilitation and independent living program are provided with advocates to represent and assist them on matters related to rehabilitation.

Subp. 12. **Communication skills training.** "Communication skills training" means instruction aimed at improving a blind or visually handicapped person's ability to communicate with others. This training ~~consists of~~ includes instruction in one or more of the following: braille; cursive writing; typing; sign language and other forms of manual communication; and the use of telecommunications, sensory, and other technological aids and devices which aid communication.

Subp. 12a. Comparable services and benefits. "Comparable services and benefits" means services or financial assistance available to clients from one or more sources other than SSB or a client to meet, in whole or part, the cost of rehabilitation services to be provided under a client's written plan. Comparable services and benefits include benefits available to clients from Medicare, Medicaid, the Veteran's Administration, individual and group insurance, community social service agencies, state agencies other than SSB, and public and private educational grants.

Subp. 16. **Diagnostic evaluation services.** "Diagnostic evaluation services" means medical examinations, optometric examinations, audiological evaluations, low vision evaluations, and other rehabilitation services provided to help an applicant or client and a rehabilitation counselor assess the applicant's or client's skills, abilities, and aptitudes in order to determine eligibility, establish a rehabilitation goal, and identify the specific rehabilitation services the client will need to achieve the client's rehabilitation goal.

Subp. 18. **Disability and licensed health professional.** "Disability" means a physical or mental condition ~~diagnosed by the appropriate licensed health professional~~ which materially limits, contributes to limiting, or, if not corrected, will probably result in limiting a person's employment activities, vocational functioning, ability to perform self-care activities, or capacity for growth and development. "~~Licensed health professional~~" means a person licensed under *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 147 or 148.

Subp. 23. **Gainful employment or gainful occupation.** "Gainful employment" or "gainful occupation" ~~refers to~~ means competitive employment; self-employment including employment under the Business Enterprises Program; homemaking; unpaid family work; supported employment; or sheltered employment at a wage above the range specified for work activity centers under the Code of Federal Regulations, title 29, section 525.2; ~~as amended~~. The specific categories of gainful employment are defined as follows:

E. "Sheltered employment" means employment in a workshop or employment by a workshop at a work site physically separate from the workshop. "Workshop" means a rehabilitation facility, or that part of a rehabilitation facility, engaged in production or service for the primary purpose of providing gainful employment as an interim step in the rehabilitation process for handicapped persons with handicaps who cannot readily obtain competitive employment.

F. "Supported employment" means:

(1) competitive work in an integrated work setting with ongoing support services for individuals with severe handicaps for whom competitive employment:

(a) has not traditionally occurred; or

(b) has been interrupted or intermittent as a result of severe handicaps; or

(2) transitional employment for individuals with chronic mental illness.

"Competitive work" means work performed on a full-time basis or on a part-time basis averaging at least 20 hours per week for each pay period, and for which an individual is compensated in a manner consistent with the federal Fair Labor Standards Act.

"Transitional employment" means competitive work in an integrated work setting for individuals with chronic mental illness who may need support services, but not necessarily job skills training services, provided either at the work site or away from the work site to perform the work.

"Integrated work setting" means job sites where:

(a) i. most coworkers are not handicapped; and

ii. individuals with handicaps are not part of a work group of other individuals with handicaps; or

(b) i. most coworkers are not handicapped; and

ii. if a job site described in unit (a), subunit ii, is not possible, individuals with handicaps are part of a small work group of not more than eight individuals with handicaps; or

(c) if there are no coworkers or the only coworkers are members of a small work group of not more than eight individuals, all of whom have handicaps, individuals with handicaps have regular contact with nonhandicapped individuals, other than personnel providing support services, in the immediate work setting.

“Ongoing support services” means continuous or periodic job skill training services provided at least twice monthly at the worksite throughout the term of employment to enable the individual to perform the work. Ongoing support services also includes other support services provided at or away from the worksite, if skill training services are also needed by and provided to that individual at the worksite.

Subp. 28. **Independent living program.** “Independent living program” means the state and federally funded SSB program under which ~~severely handicapped~~ clients with severe handicaps receive rehabilitation services ~~in accordance with~~ according to individualized written rehabilitation plans in order to improve their ability to function independently.

Subp. 28a. Individual with severe disability. “Individual with severe disability” means a disability that causes a person to be an individual with severe handicaps as defined in subpart 28b.

Subp. 28b. Individual with severe handicaps. “Individual with severe handicaps” means an individual with severe handicaps as defined in Code of Federal Regulations, title 34, section 361.1(c)(2).

Subp. 39. **Low vision services.** “Low vision services” means services which help clients use or improve the use of their residual vision in performing specific tasks involved in achieving and maintaining their rehabilitation goals. These services consist of low vision aids ~~and the functional assessments, ophthalmologic or optometric examinations~~ and training necessary for the provision and effective use of low vision aids.

Subp. 43. **Mental disorder.** “Mental disorder” means a disorder specified in the American Psychiatric Association’s Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, Third Edition ~~(1980) (DSM-III)~~ (1987) (DSM-III-R). This manual is incorporated by reference and is not subject to frequent change. It is available for inspection at the Minnesota State Law Library.

Subp. 44a. Nurse. “Nurse” means a registered nurse who is currently licensed to practice professional nursing under Minnesota Statutes, chapter 148.

Subp. 45. **Occupational equipment.** “Occupational equipment” means occupational fixtures, vehicles, and machinery normally required by ~~nonhandicapped~~ persons without handicaps to operate a business or maintain employment.

Subp. 47. **Occupational tools.** “Occupational tools” means instruments normally required by ~~nonhandicapped~~ persons without handicaps for entry into employment or for efficient job performance.

Subp. 54a. Physician’s assistant. “Physician’s assistant” means a person who is currently licensed as a physician’s assistant under parts 5600.2600 to 5600.2665.

Subp. 55. **Postemployment services.** “Postemployment services” ~~refers to~~ means rehabilitation services provided to help a client maintain or regain employment after the client has been determined to be rehabilitated under part 3325.0190, subpart 2.

Subp. 56. **Psychiatrist.** “Psychiatrist” means a physician who specializes in mental disorders as defined in the American Psychiatric Association’s Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, Third Edition ~~(1980) DSM-III~~ (1987) (DSM-III-R), and who is board certified by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology, or board eligible.

Subp. 62a. Rehabilitation engineering. “Rehabilitation engineering” means the systematic application of technologies, engineering methodologies, or scientific principles to meet the needs of and address the barriers confronted by individuals with handicaps in areas that include education, rehabilitation, employment, transportation, independent living, and recreation.

Subp. 63. Rehabilitation facility. “Rehabilitation facility” means a facility as defined in ~~the~~ Code of Federal Regulations, title 34, section 361.1(c)(2) which is operated for the primary purpose of providing rehabilitation services to persons who are blind or ~~other~~ otherwise handicapped ~~persons~~.

Subp. 68. Restoration services. “Restoration services” means the medical or medically related services provided to correct or substantially modify, within a reasonable time, a physical or mental condition which is stable or slowly progressive. These services consist of the services listed under ~~the definition of~~ “physical and mental restoration services” in ~~the~~ Code of Federal Regulations, title 34, section 361.1(c)(2).

Subp. 77. Services for the Blind and Visually Handicapped or SSB. “Services for the Blind and Visually Handicapped” or “SSB” means the organizational unit of the Department of Jobs and Training responsible for providing and coordinating the provision of rehabilitation services to persons who are blind ~~and or~~ visually handicapped ~~persons~~. For purposes of the vocational rehabilitation and independent living programs, [“]Services for the Blind and Visually Handicapped[”] or [“]SSB[”] is the state unit as defined in ~~the~~ Code of Federal Regulations, title 34, sections 361.1(c)(2)(1) and ~~361.6(b)~~ 365.5(b).

- (2) there is a reasonable expectation that providing the applicant with rehabilitation services available under part 3325.0390 is likely to improve the applicant's capacity for growth and development; and

(3) the applicant is under age 21.

Subp. 4. **Notice of ineligibility.** After a rehabilitation counselor has determined that an applicant is ineligible for rehabilitation services, the rehabilitation counselor shall inform the applicant in writing of the reasons for the determination and of the applicant's appeal rights under parts 3325.0480 and 3325.0490. The notice must be mailed or personally delivered within ten working days after the decision is made.

3325.0380 INDIVIDUALIZED WRITTEN REHABILITATION PLAN.

Subpart 1. **Preparation of written plan.** After a ~~thorough~~ comprehensive evaluation is completed, the client and the client's rehabilitation counselor shall jointly prepare an individualized written rehabilitation plan for the client. The written plan must be signed by the rehabilitation counselor and the client's legal representative. The client must be provided with a copy of the written plan.

Subp. 2. **Contents of written plan.** The written plan must contain the following information:

E. A summary of the client's appeal rights under parts 3325.0480 and 3325.0490.

Subp. 3. **Basis for contents of written plan.** The rehabilitation goal and services identified in a client's written plan must be based on and supported by information obtained in the client's ~~preliminary and thorough~~ comprehensive evaluations and subsequent information developed during the rehabilitation process in assessing the client's rehabilitation potential and service needs.

Subp. 5. **Amendment to written plan.** A client's written plan may be amended jointly by the client and the client's rehabilitation counselor at any time to reflect substantial changes in the client's service needs, financial situation, health, intermediate rehabilitation objectives, or rehabilitation goal. The amendment must be signed by the client's legal representative unless the amendment is a closure amendment under part ~~3325.0390~~ 3325.0400, subpart 2 or 3.

3325.0400 TERMINATION OF SERVICES.

Subp. 2. **Conditions for terminating the provision of services to rehabilitated clients.** SSB shall terminate services being provided to a child rehabilitation client due to rehabilitation of the client if the client has achieved the intermediate rehabilitation objectives and rehabilitation goal identified in the client's written plan and displayed evidence of improved growth and development, the client has been consulted regarding the proposed termination, and has been provided an amendment to the client's written plan reflecting the termination and the basis upon which that determination has been made.

Subp. 3. **Notice of termination and amendment to written plan.** If a client's services are to be terminated for reasons other than successful rehabilitation under subpart 2, SSB shall notify the client and amend the client's written plan to reflect the termination. The amendment and notice must contain a summary or description of the information or circumstances upon which the termination decision was based and a summary of the client's ~~appeal~~ review rights under parts 3325.0480 and 3325.0490. If the termination decision was based on the client's refusal to accept or use necessary services provided by SSB, the amendment must include a description of the efforts made by the rehabilitation counselor to encourage the client's participation in the rehabilitation process.

PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION

3325.0420 CONDITIONS OF SERVICE.

Subp. 9. **Postemployment services.** Items A and B govern the provision of postemployment services.

A. SSB may provide postemployment services as ~~needed to keep a client employed~~ necessary for a client to maintain or regain other suitable employment only if:

- (1) the client has been determined to be rehabilitated under part 3325.0190, subpart 2, item A; and
- (2) the client's service needs do not require a complex or comprehensive rehabilitation effort.

Subp. 12. **Restoration services.** Items A to D govern the provision of restoration services.

B. SSB may purchase restoration services only from physicians, optometrists, or other health professionals licensed under *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 147 or 148, or licensed by a state with standards equivalent to those under *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 147 or 148.

[For text of subp 13, see M.R.]

Subp. 14. **Vocational training services.** SSB may provide tuition and supplies to a client for training at an institution of higher learning only if there is evidence that the client is capable of completing the required coursework or degree program. Tuition paid by SSB for training at a private or non-Minnesota institution of higher learning must not exceed the tuition charged by Minnesota public colleges, universities, or technical institutes unless ~~the necessary training is not available at a public Minnesota institution. When a client attends a non-Minnesota institution, SSB shall not pay more for maintenance and transportation than SSB would otherwise be required to pay in covering these costs for the client's attendance at an institution located in Minnesota unless the necessary training is not available at a Minnesota institution.;~~

A. the necessary training is not available at a public Minnesota institution;

B. the client is, by reasons of admission standards, unable to obtain the necessary training at a public Minnesota institution;
or

C. the private or non-Minnesota institution would more appropriately meet the training needs of the client by:

(1) offering a course of study within a training program that would be more suitable for the client in light of the client's capabilities, abilities, and interest;

(2) being closer geographically to the client's home address;

(3) having a job placement rate for the desired training program higher than that of any public Minnesota institution offering the necessary training available to the client; or

(4) having an average earnings per graduate from the desired training program higher than that of any public Minnesota institution offering the necessary training available to the client.

When a client attends a non-Minnesota institution, SSB shall not pay more for maintenance and transportation than SSB would otherwise be required to pay in covering these costs for the client's attendance at an institution located in Minnesota unless one or more of the conditions stated in items A to C are met.

3325.0430 SIMILAR COMPARABLE SERVICES AND BENEFITS.

Subpart 1. **Scope.** Similar Comparable services and benefits which would contribute toward and not interfere with a client's rehabilitation must be determined and used if available to a client or members of a client's family for all rehabilitation services identified in the client's written plan except:

Subp. 2. **Client responsibilities.** A client shall, with the assistance of the client's rehabilitation counselor, participate in the search for and use of similar comparable services and benefits as follows including:

A. ~~Before receiving restoration services other than nonprescription low vision aids, a client shall file a claim or application for coverage with the client's health insurer, if any. If the client has no health insurance or if the restoration services provided are not covered by the client's health insurance, the client shall apply to a local human services agency for medical assistance under *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 256B.~~

~~B.~~ Before receiving any rehabilitation service other than those identified in subpart 1, items A to F, a client shall apply ~~or~~ and provide evidence of ~~having already applied the determination of availability~~ for any ~~state or federal~~ assistance program for which the client's rehabilitation counselor determines the client may be eligible.

~~C.~~ B. Before receiving vocational training services in an institution of higher learning, a client shall apply for and provide evidence of a determination of educational grants sufficient to cover the costs of tuition, supplies, and living expenses.

~~D.~~ C. The application for ~~or and~~ use of similar comparable services and benefits for ~~restoration services or maintenance~~ shall not be required if the application or use would significantly delay the provision of ~~these services to the detriment of the a client who is at extreme medical risk.~~

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Proposed Rules

D. “Extreme medical risk” means a risk of substantially increasing functional impairment or death if medical services are not provided expeditiously.

Subp. 3. **Relation to financial need eligibility.** The extent to which ~~similar~~ comparable services and benefits are available to a client must be determined before determining the degree of financial participation required of the client under part 3325.0440.

3325.0440 FINANCIAL PARTICIPATION BY CLIENTS.

Subpart 1. **Services exempted from financial participation.** Regardless of a client's income, SSB shall not require client financial participation for the following services:

- A. diagnostic evaluation services except those services provided under an extended evaluation which are not diagnostic in nature;
- B. rehabilitation counseling and other adjustment to blindness services;
- C. job placement services;
- D. referral services;
- E. interpreter and note-taking services for the deaf-blind;
- F. low vision services, ~~including closed circuit televisions, up to a cumulative value of \$500;~~
- G. communication center services;
- H. maintenance or transportation services needed by a client to obtain adjustment to blindness services;
- I. reader services;
- J. telecommunications, sensory, and other technological aids and devices, ~~other than those which can be classified as low vision aids, up to a cumulative value of \$3,000; and~~
- K. postemployment services consisting of the services identified in this subpart; and
- L. rehabilitation engineering services.

Subp. 3. **Basis for determining the degree of financial participation required.** The degree of financial participation required of a client is ~~determined on the basis of the client's monthly and annual family income in relation~~ based on the relationship of the client's annualized average monthly income over the preceding six months less any income received for dependent children to the most recent estimate of the Minnesota median income levels as adjusted for a family size of one using the adjustment methodology ~~specified in the~~ Code of Federal Regulations, title 45, section 96.85. This estimate is published annually by the United States Department of Health and Human Services in the Federal Register. The applicable sections of the Federal Register are incorporated by reference.

Subp. 4. **No required financial participation.** A client whose monthly ~~family~~ income as determined under subpart 3 is equal to or less than the state median monthly income as adjusted for a family size of one is not required to pay any portion of the cost of the rehabilitation services which the client receives.

Subp. 5. **Financial participation required.** A client whose monthly ~~family~~ income is more than the state median monthly income as adjusted for a family size of one shall pay for rehabilitation services provided under the client's written plan an amount equal to the percentage by which the client's family income exceeds the adjusted median income. Example: If a client's monthly family income exceeds the state median monthly income adjusted for ~~the~~ a client's family size of one by ten percent, the client shall pay ten percent of the cost of rehabilitation services provided under the client's written plan; SSB would pay 90 percent.

Subp. 6. **Limitation on financial participation.** Financial participation by a client in any month shall not exceed ten percent of the client's monthly ~~family~~ income as most recently determined by SSB or the difference between the client's monthly ~~family~~ income and the state median monthly income adjusted for ~~the client's~~ a family size of one, whichever is less.

Subp. 7. **Variance.** A client who is unable to pay for rehabilitation services to the extent required by subparts 4 and 5 because of unusual financial circumstances may apply to the director for a variance in the determination of the client's financial need as follows:

B. The director shall determine whether the client is eligible for a variance and notify the client of the determination in writing within 30 days after the director receives all the information required under item A. The written notification must:

- (1) specify whether the client is eligible for a variance;
- (2) indicate the reasons for the determination;
- (3) specify the amount of the variance, if any;

- (4) inform the client of relevant review and appeal rights under parts part 3325.0480 and 3325.0490, or 3325.0500; and
- (5) be signed and dated by the director.

Subp. 8. **Income verification.** If a client's written plan includes or is expected to include rehabilitation services other than those ~~identified~~ in subpart 1, the client must provide SSB with written verification or a signed written statement of the client's ~~current~~ monthly family income over the preceding six months and sources of that income.

Subp. 9. **Annual redetermination.** SSB shall redetermine, at least annually, the financial need of each client ~~and of each former client who is still making lease payments on equipment under part 3325.0460~~ receiving services subject to subpart 2.

3325.0450 RECOVERY OF MONETARY ASSISTANCE OVERPAYMENTS.

Subpart 1. **Written notification.** SSB shall notify a client in writing as soon as possible after discovering that the client has received monetary assistance from SSB in excess of that to which the client is entitled under parts 3325.0100 to 3325.0490. The written notification must:

- A: specify the dates and amounts of incorrect payments;
- B. indicate SSB's basis for determining that the payments were incorrect;
- C. inform the client of appeal rights under ~~parts part~~ part 3325.0480 and 3325.0490, or 3325.0500;
- D. indicate whether SSB intends to refer the case to the attorney general to investigate the possibility of fraud; and
- E. be signed and dated by the client's rehabilitation counselor.

3325.0460 PROVISION AND RECOVERY OF EQUIPMENT.

Subp. 2. **Written lease agreement.** ~~Prior to~~ Before receiving any item of equipment costing \$300 or more, a client shall sign a written lease agreement which indicates the duration of the lease, ~~the financial obligations of the client under subpart 3, if any,~~ and the terms for renewal. The duration of the lease must not exceed one year.

Subp. 3. [See Repealer.]

Subp. 4. **Lease renewal.** Unless the equipment is subject to transfer of title under subpart 5 ~~6~~, SSB shall renew the lease to the equipment upon expiration of the lease if the client ~~or former client~~ still wants and needs the equipment ~~to achieve or maintain the client's rehabilitation goal and is still using the equipment in a manner consistent with the individualized written rehabilitation plan under which the equipment was provided.~~ Renewal of the lease requires the signature of the client and SSB.

Subp. 5. [See Repealer.]

Subp. 6. **Transfer of title.** SSB shall transfer legal title of equipment leased under this part only to a ~~client or former client~~ and only if the following conditions are satisfied:

A. ~~five two~~ two calendar years have elapsed since ~~the client or former client signed the lease under subpart 2~~ services were terminated to the rehabilitated client; and

B. ~~the client or former client has met the financial obligations under part 3325.0440; continues to want, and is using the equipment in a manner consistent with the individualized written rehabilitation plan under which the equipment was provided.~~

~~C. the client or former client continues to want and need the equipment for employment; and~~

~~D. the client or former client has not requested or received a lease extension under subpart 7.~~

Subp. 7. [See Repealer.]

Subp. 8. **Maintenance responsibility.** SSB ~~shall be~~ is responsible for regular maintenance and repair of equipment leased under this part ~~unless until~~ title to the equipment has been transferred to the ~~former client or other party~~ former client under subpart 6.

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Proposed Rules

Subp. 10. **Recovery of equipment.** A client shall return leased equipment to SSB if:

- A. ~~the client fails to make the lease payments required under subpart 3;~~
- ~~B. the client's lease to the equipment has expired and the conditions of subpart 4 or 6 have not been satisfied; or~~
- ~~C. B. the conditions of subpart 3 and subpart or 4 or 6 have been met but the client has refused to execute a renewal of the expired lease as required under subpart 4 or has refused to sign the documents necessary to facilitate a transfer of title under subpart 6.~~

If the client fails to return the equipment as required under this subpart, SSB may recover the equipment or the reasonable value of the equipment under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 248.091, subdivision 2.

Subp. 11. **Abuse or neglect of equipment.** SSB shall not provide additional equipment to a client if the client has a history of abuse or neglect with respect to equipment previously provided to the client by SSB. "History of abuse or neglect" means that on two or more occasions equipment provided to a client has sustained, by reason of acts or omissions of the client, damage beyond that which would result from normal use.

3325.0480 ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMAL REVIEW OF REHABILITATION COUNSELOR DETERMINATION.

Subpart 1. **Request for informal review.** An applicant or client may make a written request to the director for a an informal review and redetermination of any action taken by SSB regarding the provision or denial of rehabilitation services. To preserve the applicant's or client's right to ~~appeal an informal~~ review, the request must be received by the director no more than 30 days after the applicant or client is notified of the action for which the informal review is requested. If the disputed SSB action is a proposed change in a client's written plan, the change must be delayed for 30 days beyond the effective date of the proposed change if the client's review request is received by the director ~~prior to~~ before the effective date of the proposed change. The request for informal review must state:

- A. the specific SSB action which the appellant wants reviewed;
- B. the reasons for the appellant's dissatisfaction with the action;
- C. the appellant's recommendation as to the action SSB should take in lieu of the action to be informally reviewed; and
- D. whether the appellant desires a conference to discuss the action to be informally reviewed.

Subp. 2. **Informal review and redetermination.** Informal review and redetermination under this part must be conducted by supervisory staff not involved in the original decision or action ~~which that~~ caused the appellant to ask for a an informal review. Supervisory staff conducting the informal review shall consider all written and oral evidence and argument presented from the time the request for an informal review is received until the final decision is made. The final decision must be made by the reviewing supervisory staff within 30 days after the director receives the appellant's request for an informal review unless agreed otherwise by the appellant and reviewing supervisory staff.

Subp. 3. **Informal review conference.** ~~A~~ An informal review conference may be requested by the appellant or supervisory staff conducting the informal review. If a an informal review conference is requested within five days after the director receives the ~~administrative informal~~ review request under subpart 1, a review conference must be held. The conference must be held within ~~15~~ ten days after the conference is requested. The supervisory staff conducting the informal review shall convene the conference at SSB during regular SSB working hours unless an alternative date, time, or place is agreed upon by the supervisor and appellant. When a time and place for the conference is set, the supervisor conducting the informal review shall notify the appellant of the time and place at least ~~ten~~ five days before the conference. At a minimum, the supervisor conducting the informal review, the appellant, and appropriate SSB staff shall participate in the conference. The appellant must be present at the conference but may be represented and may bring witnesses to speak on the appellant's behalf. If the appellant is handicapped in communication, then SSB shall appoint an interpreter, consistent with *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 546.42 to 546.44.

Subp. 4. **Written notice of decision.** The supervisory staff conducting the informal review shall notify the appellant in writing of the informal review decision. The notice must contain a summary of the nature and basis of the decision and the appellant's appeal rights under either part 3325.0490 or 3325.0500.

Subp. 5. **Relationship to formal review.** The request for and use of the informal review process may not be used to delay a more formal hearing for vocational rehabilitation and independent living program applicants or clients before an impartial hearing officer, as provided in part 3325.0500, unless the parties jointly agree to a delay.

3325.0490 EVIDENTIARY HEARING.

Subpart 1. **Written request for hearing.** An applicant or client of the child rehabilitation program or the self-care program who is dissatisfied with the results of the ~~administrative informal~~ review under part 3325.0480, subpart 2, may request a hearing by submitting a written request for a hearing to SSB within 15 days after receiving the written notice of the ~~administrative informal~~ review decision

under part 3325.0480, subpart 4. SSB shall file the request for assignment of an administrative law judge as required under part 1400.5300 within ten working days of the date the appellant's written request for a hearing is received.

Subp. 3. **Decision and notice.** The director shall make the final decision after the hearing ~~in accordance with~~ according to Minnesota Statutes, sections 14.61 and 14.62, and shall not delegate the responsibility for making the final decision to any other person. The director shall notify the appellant of the decision ~~in accordance with~~ according to Minnesota Statutes, section 14.62. The notice shall inform the appellant of the appellant's right to judicial review ~~or federal agency review~~ of the director's decision.

3325.0500 FORMAL REVIEW OF REHABILITATION COUNSELOR DETERMINATION.

Subpart 1. Request for formal review. An applicant or client of the vocational rehabilitation program or the independent living program may make a written request to the director for a formal review of any action taken by SSB regarding the provision or denial of any vocational rehabilitation or independent living rehabilitation service. This request may be in addition to and not contingent on any request or decision made under part 3325.0480. To preserve the applicant's or client's right to appeal, the request must be received by the director no more than 30 days after the applicant or client is notified of the action for which the formal review is requested. If the disputed SSB action is a proposed change in a client's written plan, the change must be delayed for 30 days beyond the effective date of the proposed change. The request for formal review must state:

- A. the specific SSB action which the appellant wants formally reviewed;
- B. the reasons for the appellant's dissatisfaction with the action; and
- C. the appellant's recommendation as to the action SSB should take in lieu of the action to be reviewed.

Subp. 2. Impartial hearing. Review under this part, including a hearing, must be conducted by an impartial hearing officer within 45 days of request. The appellant or, if appropriate, the appellant's representative may present additional evidence, information, and witnesses to the impartial hearing officer, be represented by counsel or other appropriate advocate, and examine all witnesses and other relevant sources of information and evidence.

Subp. 3. Impartial hearing report. The impartial hearing officer conducting the review shall make a decision based on the approved state plan for either vocational rehabilitation or independent living and the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended by United States Code, title 29, section 711(c), and shall provide to the appellant or, if appropriate, the appellant's representative, and to the director a full written report of the findings and grounds for the decision within 30 days of the completion of the hearing.

Subp. 4. Director review. If the director decides to review the decision of the impartial hearing officer, the appellant or, if appropriate, the applicant's representative is notified in writing within 20 days of the mailing of the impartial hearing officer's decision. If the director fails to provide this notice, the impartial hearing officer's decision becomes a final decision.

Subp. 5. Basis of director's decision to review. The decision of the director to review the impartial hearing officer's decision can only be based on the following standards of review:

- A. whether the impartial hearing officer's decision is arbitrary, capricious, an abuse of discretion, or otherwise unreasonable;
- B. whether the impartial hearing officer's decision is unsupported by substantial evidence or inconsistent with the facts or applicable federal and state policy; or
- C. whether the impartial hearing officer failed to give appropriate and adequate attention to such factors as:
 - (1) the federal statutes and regulations as they apply to specific issues in question;
 - (2) the state plan as it applies to specific issues in question;
 - (3) key portions of conflicting testimony;
 - (4) state agency options in the delivery of services, where these options are permissible under federal law;
 - (5) restrictions under federal law with regard to supportive services; and
 - (6) approved federal or state agency policy as it relates to issues in question.

Subp. 6. Conduct of director's review. If the director reviews the decision reported under subpart 3, the appellant or, as appropriate, the appellant's representative, shall have the opportunity to submit additional evidence and information relevant to the final decision.

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Proposed Rules

Subp. 7. Director's final decision. Within 30 days of providing notice of intent to review the decision reported under subpart 3, the director shall make a final decision and provide a full report in writing of the decision, and of the findings and grounds for the decision, to the appellant or, if appropriate, the appellant's representative. The director shall not delegate this responsibility to any other person. The report shall inform the appellant of the right to judicial review of the director's decision.

Subp. 8. Time extension. Except for the time limitations in subpart 4, both parties may agree upon reasonable time extensions for good cause.

If 25 or more persons submit a written request for a public hearing within the comment period, a public hearing will be held unless a sufficient number withdraw their requests in writing. You are hereby advised, pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* § 14.11, subd. 2 (1988), "Agricultural lands," that the proposed amendments will not have an effect on the supply of land for agriculture. The proposed amendments deal with solid waste land disposal and are not expected to impose secondary costs high enough to affect agricultural land values.

If no hearing is required, upon adoption of the rule, the rule and the required supporting documents will be submitted to the Attorney

General for review as to legality and form to the extent form relates to legality. Any person may request notification of the date of submission to the Attorney General. 7035.2685 COST ESTIMATES FOR CLOSURE, POSTCLOSURE CARE, AND CORRECTIVE ACTION.

Subpart 1. **Cost estimate requirements.** The following provisions apply to cost estimates.

A. The owner or operator shall make a written estimate, in current dollars, of the cost of closing the facility in accordance with part 7035.2625 and applicable closure requirements in part 7035.2635. The estimate must be calculated according to subitems (1) and (2).

(1) The closure cost estimate must equal the cost of closure at the point in the facility's operating life when the extent and manner of its operation would make closure the most expensive, as indicated by its closure plan.

(2) An owner or operator who establishes a trust under part 7035.2705 or 7035.2715 or a dedicated long-term care trust fund under part 7035.2720 may make the closure cost estimate in present value terms, provided that interest earned from investment becomes part of the fund.

The method used to calculate a present value for closure cost estimates must have the following form:

$$P = \frac{F}{(1 + i)^n}$$

in which: P = the present value,
 F = the estimated cost of facility closure as calculated under subitem (1),
 i = the interest rate, and
 n = the time period in which the design capacity of the facility is filled, expressed as the number of years after the date on which the cost estimate is made.

The interest rate used must be the Federal Reserve Bank discount rate in effect at the Federal Reserve Bank in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

B. The owner or operator of a facility subject to postclosure monitoring or maintenance requirements shall make a written estimate, in current dollars, of the annual cost of monitoring and maintenance of the facility in accordance with the applicable postclosure requirements in part 7035.2645. The estimate must be calculated according to subitems (1) and (2).

(1) The owner or operator must calculate the postclosure cost estimate by multiplying the annual postclosure cost estimate by the number of years of postclosure care required under part 7035.2655. The postclosure cost estimate must include a contingency element that accounts for inflation expected to occur after site closure.

(2) An owner or operator who establishes a trust under part 7035.2705 or 7035.2715 or a dedicated long-term care trust fund under part 7035.2720 may make the postclosure cost estimate in present value terms, provided that interest earned from investment becomes part of the fund.

A present value must be reported for each year of the postclosure care period. The time periods used must begin the year after facility closure. The method used to calculate a present value must have the following form:

$$P = \frac{F}{(1 + i)^n}$$

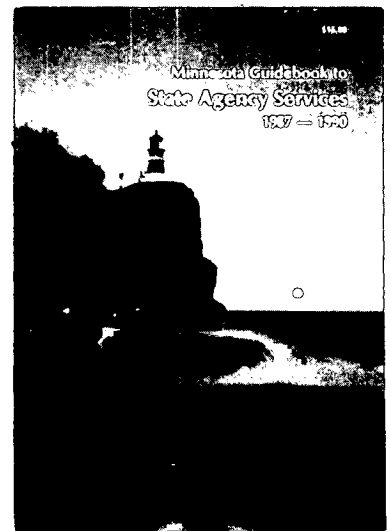

Report on Land for Possible New Major Airport: A consultant report to the Metropolitan Council concludes that there is sufficient land in the 14-county area around the Twin Cities to designate a search area for a possible new major airport. The conclusion is based on the application of six criteria to the study area, which is made up of Anoka, Carver, Chisago, Dakota, Goodhue, Hennepin, Isanti, Le Sueur, Ramsey, Rice, Scott, Sherburne, Washington and Wright Counties. The criteria, adopted by the council earlier this year, generally include: accessibility (distance and travel time); presence of environmental features, such as lakes, streams or wetlands; land requirements for a new airport; airspace needs, such as the absence of tall structures like power lines or power plants stacks; the amount of urban and rural development; and metropolitan policy guidelines. Apogee Research, Inc. prepared the draft document, *A Report on the General Land Availability for a New Major Airport to Serve the Twin Cities Metropolitan Area* under contract with the council and to fulfill a legislative requirement. During November, the council staff and consultants will use the information collected in the preparation of the report to locate potential search areas. A 37-member New Airport Search Area Advisory Task Force is helping the council with the planning. The candidate search areas will be announced in mid-December. That will trigger a public review phase that will lead up to council selection of a search area by the end of 1991.

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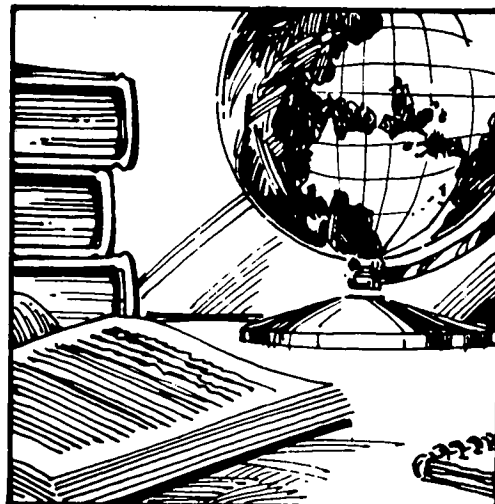
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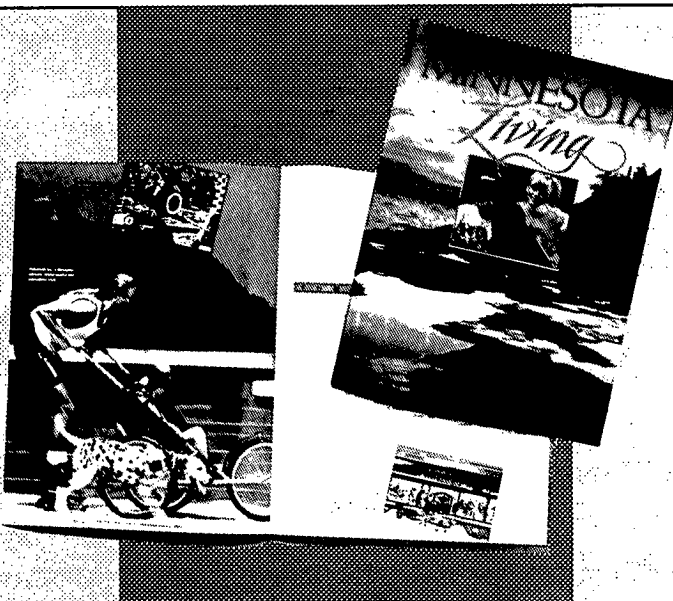
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
