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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions:

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 75 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. This is a ten-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Proposed and adopted emergency rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

If an agency seeks outside opinion before issuing new rules or rule amendments, it must publish a NOTICE OF INTENT TO SOLICIT OUT-SIDE OPINION in the Official Notices section of the State Register. When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the State Register, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues 1-13 inclusive; issues 14-25 inclusive; issue 26, cumulative for issues 1-26; issues 27-38 inclusive; issue 39, cumulative for 1-39; issues 40-51 inclusive; and issue 52, cumulative for 1-52. An annual subject matter index for rules appears in August. 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Proposed Rules

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§ 14.22, an agency may propose to adopt, amend, suspend or repeal rules without first holding a public hearing, as long as the agency determines that the rules will be noncontroversial in nature. The agency must first publish a notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing, together with the proposed rules, in the State Register. The notice must advise the public:

- 1. that they have 30 days in which to submit comment on the proposed rules;
- 2. that no public hearing will be held unless 25 or more persons make a written request for a hearing within the 30-day comment period;
- 3. of the manner in which persons shall request a hearing on the proposed rules; and
- 4. that the rule may be modified if the modifications are supported by the data and views submitted.

If, during the 30-day comment period, 25 or more persons submit to the agency a written request for a hearing of the proposed rules, the agency must proceed under the provisions of §§ 14.14-14.20, which state that if an agency decides to hold a public hearing, it must publish a notice of intent in the *State Register*.

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§ 14.29 and 14.30, agencies may propose emergency rules under certain circumstances. Proposed emergency rules are published in the *State Register* and, for at least 25 days thereafter, interested persons may submit data and views in writing to the proposing agency.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Center for Arts Education Board intends to amend the above-entitled rule without a public hearing following the procedures set forth in the Administrative Procedure Act for adopting rules without a public hearing in *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.22 to 14.28 (1990). Proposed Permanent Rules Relating to Licensure Fees

Notice of Intent to Adopt Rules Without a Public Hearing

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Board of Pharmacy (hereinafter "Board") proposes to amend *Minnesota Rules* pts. 6800.1150, 6800.1250, and 6800.1300 relating to fees. A copy of the proposed amendments is attached to this Notice. One additional free copy is available from the Board upon request. Procedures for the adoption of noncontroversial rules, found in *Minnesota Statutes* 14.22 to 14.28 (1986), will be used.

THE PUBLIC IS HEREBY ADVISED that:

- 1. They have 30 days in which to submit comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed amendments, and comment is encouraged.
- 2. Each comment should identify the portion of the proposed rules addressed, the reason for the comments, and any change proposed.
- 3. In addition to submitting comments, interested persons may request in writing, during the 30 day comment period, that a hearing be held on the proposed rule amendment.
- 4. All comments, including requests for a public hearing, shall be submitted to David E. Holmstrom, Executive Director, Minnesota Board of Pharmacy, Room 107, Colonial Office Park Building, 2700 University Avenue West, Suite 107, St. Paul, Minnesota 55114-1079.
- 5. Any person requesting a public hearing should state his or her name and address, and is encouraged to identify the portion of the proposed rule addressed, the reason for the request, and any change proposed.
- 6. The proposed amendments may be modified if the modifications are supported by the data and views submitted and do not result in a substantial change in the proposed language.
- 7. A public hearing will be held only if 25 or more persons submit, in writing, requests for a hearing on the proposed rules or a portion thereof within 30 days of this notice. If a hearing is required, it will be held in accordance with the provisions of *Minnesota Statutes* 14.131 to 14.20 (1986).
- 8. Under the procedure for adopting noncontroversial rules, the Board must submit any action on its rules to the Attorney General for review of the form and legality of the rule change. Notice of the date of submission of the proposed amendments to the Attorney General for review will be mailed to any person requesting to receive the notice. Requests to receive notice must be submitted to Mr. Holmstrom at the above address.
- 9. Authority to adopt *Minnesota Rules* pts. 6800.1150, 6800.1250, and 6800.1300 is contained in *Minnesota Statute* sections 151.06, 214.06, and 16A.128. Additionally, a **STATEMENT OF NEED AND REASONABLENESS** that describes the need for and reasonableness of the proposed amendments has been prepared and is now available. - 10. The approval of the Commissioner of Finance for adoption of rules relating to fees is required by *Minnesota Statute* section 214.06, subd. 1. Rules as Proposed

6800.1150 ANNUAL RENEWAL, FEES, AND POSTING.

Each pharmacist license shall expire on March 1 of each year and shall be renewed annually by filing an application for license renewal on or before February 1 of each year, together with a fee of \$65 \$75. Any pharmacist license renewal application submitted after March 1 shall be subject to a late filing fee of \$25 an amount equal to 50 percent of the renewal fee in addition to the renewal fee.

Each pharmacist shall post his or her the license or renewal in a conspicuous place within the pharmacy in which he or she the pharmacist is practicing his or her profession. For community pharmacies, this place shall be a place which is readily visible to the public.

6800.1250 APPLICATIONS FOR LICENSURE.

Subpart 1. **Submitting.** Applicants for licensure by examination shall submit a completed application for examination including affidavits of internship, a copy of applicant's birth certificate, and a recent photograph. All applicants shall show evidence of graduation with a bachelor of science degree or doctor of pharmacy degree, as the first professional undergraduate degree in pharmacy, from a college of pharmacy or a department of pharmacy of a university approved by the board and meeting at least the minimum standards set by the American Council on Pharmaceutical Education in the current edition of its accreditation manual. The evidence shall be shown by submitting an official final transcript showing the date on which degree was conferred. The above listed documents together with a check for \$200 \$250 must be submitted to the board at least 45 days prior to the examination. An applicant who is a graduate of a school or college of pharmacy located outside the United States, which has not been recognized and approved by the board, but who is otherwise qualified to apply for a license to practice pharmacy in this state, is considered to have satisfied the requirements of graduation if the applicant verifies to the board the applicant's academic record and the applicant's graduation. Before taking the licensing examination, a foreign graduate applicant shall pass the Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Equivalency Examination, which is recognized and approved by the board, given by the Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Examination Commission and demonstrate proficiency in the English language by passing the Test of English as a Foreign Language, which is recognized and approved by the board, given by the Educational Testing Service as a prerequisite to taking the licensure examination.

Subp. 2. **Retaking exam.** Any applicant who has failed to pass the examination required by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 151.06, 151.07, 151.10, or 151.12, may retake the examination within the next ensuing 14 months, provided that no applicant who has failed in three examinations shall be permitted to take a further examination, except upon petition setting forth facts acceptable to the board. The applicant shall, at least 45 days before an examination, notify the board in writing of the intention to retake the examination, certifying that information furnished on the original application remains true and correct, or reporting any changes therein, including additional education and experience, and shall submit a fee of \$200 \$250 payable to the Minnesota Board of Pharmacy. The board reserves the right to request a full and complete application.

6800.1300 RECIPROCITY.

Subpart 1. Applications. Applications for reciprocal licensure (licensure as a pharmacist on the basis of licensure as a pharmacist in another state) together with a fee of \$165 \$175 shall be filed with the secretary of the board at least 30 days before the date the application is to be considered by the board. The board will consider applications for reciprocity in at least January and June of each calendar year.

Rules as Proposed 7890.0100 DEFINITIONS.

Subp. 13. **Medication.** "Medication" is a substance, compound, or element, or combination thereof, which is or can be administered to a horse for the purpose of preventing, curing, or alleviating the effects of any disease, condition, ailment, or infirmity, or symptom thereof, or for altering in any way the behavior, attitude, temperament, or performance of a horse, including athletic performance. The term medication includes all analgesics, anesthetics, depressants, narcotics, stimulants, tranquilizers, and other classifications of medications. Nothing herein shall be deemed to include:

- B. Lasix®, provided, however, that if it is administered pursuant to the provisions of part 7890.0140, subpart 6 7a, and further provided that the test sample does not contain:
 - (1) more than 80 nanograms per milliliter of plasma furosemide;
 - (2) less than 40 milligrams creatinine per 100 milliliters urine; and
- (3) <u>urine furosemide</u>, <u>measured in micrograms per milliliter</u>, in a quantity such that the ratio of <u>urine furosemide</u> to <u>urine</u> creatinine exceeds 0.15.

Subp. 15. **Positive test.** "Positive test" means the detection of any medication or metabolites thereof in a test sample or a test level of Bute or Lasix® above the allowed level.

Subp. 17. Test level. "Test level" means the concentration of Bute or Lasix® found in a test sample.

7890.0130 FINDINGS OF CHEMIST.

- Subpart 1. **Prima facie evidence.** A finding by a chemist of any medication, substance foreign to the natural horse, or Bute or Lasix® exceeding the allowable test level levels provided in part 7890.0100, subpart 13, item items A and B, in the test sample of a horse shall be considered prima facie evidence that the medication, substance, or Bute or Lasix® was administered to the horse and carried in the body of the horse while participating in a race.
- Subp. 2. **Distributed purse money.** The fact that purse money has been distributed prior to the issuance of the chemist's report shall not be deemed a finding that no medication or Bute or <u>Lasix</u>® exceeding allowable <u>level</u> <u>levels</u> was administered to the horse earning such purse money in violation of this chapter.

7890.0140 BLEEDERS.

[For text of subps 1 to 5, see M.R.]

- Subp. 6. Lasix® may be administered to permitted for certified bleeders. Upon request, any horse placed on the bleeder list shall, in its next race, be permitted the use of Lasix®. Once a horse has raced with Lasix®, it must continue to race with Lasix® in all subsequent races unless a request is made to discontinue the use. If the use of Lasix® is discontinued, the horse shall be prohibited from again racing with Lasix® unless it is later observed to be bleeding pursuant to subpart 1 or meets the requirements of subpart 3. Requests for the use of or discontinuance of Lasix® must be made to the commission veterinarian by the horse's trainer or assistant trainer on a form prescribed by the commission on or before the day of entry into the race for which the request is made.
- <u>Subp. 7a.</u> Conditions required for Lasix® administration. Lasix® shall be administered intravenously by a veterinarian employed by the owner or trainer of the horse. The Lasix® must be administered at least four hours before scheduled post time for any horse bleeder entered to race and the dose level of Lasix® must be at least 150 milligrams and must not exceed 250 milligrams (no less than three nor more than five milliliters of a 50 milligram/milliliter or five percent solution) per administration.

The practicing veterinarian must deposit with the commission veterinarian at the Lasix® detention barn an unopened supply of Lasix® and sterile hypodermic needles and syringes to be used for the administration. The horse must be brought to the Lasix® detention barn for treatment not less than four hours before scheduled post time for the race in which it is entered to start. The Lasix® must be administered under the supervision of a person employed by the commission. Once at the Lasix® detention barn, a horse shall remain there until it is taken to the paddock to be saddled or harnessed for a race.

Subp. 10. Responsibility of trainer. While in the detention barn The trainer is responsible for ensuring that the horse is available at the appropriate time for its treatment. At the time of treatment, the trainer must provide to the commission employee observing the treatment a statement signed by the trainer or assistant trainer that indicates the barn number and stall number where the horse will be detained following treatment and the names of all employees permitted by the trainer to be in contact with the horse during that time. The statements shall be on a form prescribed by the commission. After having been administered Lasix®, the horse shall at all times be in the care, custody, and under the control visual supervision of the trainer or a licensed person assigned by the trainer.

Proposed Rules =

The horse must remain in its own stall until it is taken to the paddock to be saddled or harnessed for a race. It shall not be handled by anyone other than the trainer, the owner, or the employees listed on the trainer's signed statement. If emergency veterinary attention becomes necessary, the trainer is responsible for immediately notifying the commission veterinarian of the nature of the need and of the identity of the responding veterinarian. The trainer shall be responsible for the guarding, condition, care, and handling of the horse while it remains in the security area at all times.

7890.0150 DISCLOSURE OF APPROVED MEDICATIONS TO PUBLIC.

The names of all horses that have been approved for race day use of <u>Bute or Lasix®</u> must be identified in the daily racing program. The names of all horses that have been treated with Bute shall be posted on the public information boards in the grandstand by the association by one hour before post time of the first race on the day such horses are to race. Horses that are racing for the first time using Lasix®, must be so identified in the daily racing program.

7890.0160 RESPONSIBILITY OF VETERINARIAN.

No veterinarian may administer a medication or substance foreign to the natural horse to any horse that is scheduled to race within 48 hours, except as permitted in part 7890.0100, subpart 13, or in the case of a medical emergency requiring immediate treatment. No veterinarian may place a nasogastric tube in a horse that is scheduled to race within 48 hours, except in the case of a medical emergency requiring immediate treatment. No veterinarian may enter the stall of or otherwise handle a horse that is scheduled to race within four hours, except in the case of a medical emergency requiring immediate treatment. In emergency cases it is the responsibility of the attending veterinarian to notify the commission veterinarian of the nature of the emergency and the exact treatment provided. The notification must be made as soon as practical (within one-half hour of an emergency that occurs during training or racing hours or by 8:00 a.m. on the morning following an emergency which occurred during evening or night hours) and on a form prescribed by the commission.

Tentative opening dates announced for many 1992 Minnesota hunting seasons: Opening dates for many of the 1992 Minnesota hunting seasons were announced this week by

Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Commissioner Rod Sando. The dates are being announced now for the benefit of those who must establish their vacation plans well in advance, he said. Although these dates are tentative, Sando said it is unlikely they will change. The general small game seasons for grouse, rabbits, squirrels, Hungarian partridge and fox are scheduled to open on Saturday, Sept. 19. The pheasant season opener is scheduled for Saturday, Oct. 10. The spring turkey season will begin April 15, and the fall turkey season will begin Oct. 14. The firearms deer opener will be Nov. 7. Archery deer hunting will begin Sept. 19. Muzzleloader deer hunting will begin Nov. 28. The mink, muskrat, beaver and otter season openers will be split into north and south zones again in 1992. The south zone opener will be Oct. 31, and the north zone opener will be Oct. 24. The raccoon, badger and opossum seasons will be announced later. The bear season will open Sept. 1. Waterfowl season opening dates and additional season details will be announced next summer, Sando said. Wildlife public input meetings to gather opinions about seasons and proposed new regulations are planned for March at sites around the state. Locations and times will be announced in late January. Funds available for urban, community forestry projects: Trees improve the quality of life for city residents, enhance property values and help conserve energy. The Minnesota DNR, in cooperation

with the U.S. Forest Service and the Minnesota Shade Tree Advisory Committee, is offering a Challenge Grants Program. A total of \$65,000 is available in cost-share funds for urban and community forestry projects in Minnesota. Funding is available for local units of government and their entities as well as non-profit organizations. To receive funding, applicants must have an eligible project and contribute at least 50 percent of the total project cost either in cash or in-kind contributions. Community applicants must also meet the standards of the Tree City USA program listed below: have a legally constituted tree board or department; have a municipal tree ordinance; have a comprehensive community forestry program supported by a minimum of \$2 per capita; and have an annual Arbor Day proclamation and observance. Communities that do not currently meet the Tree City USA standards may still apply for grant funding, but will not receive approval until the standards are achieved. (Grant monies may be used to help meet the per capita expenditure requirement.) Types of projects eligible for funding include program development, demonstration projects, and information and education programs. No more than 20 percent of these funds can be used for tree planting projects. Successful applicants may be as varied as a county agency, a neighborhood beautification group, or a scout troop. Ethical Practices Board Schedules Meeting for Prospective and Experienced Lobbyists for 1992 Legislative Session: Registered


