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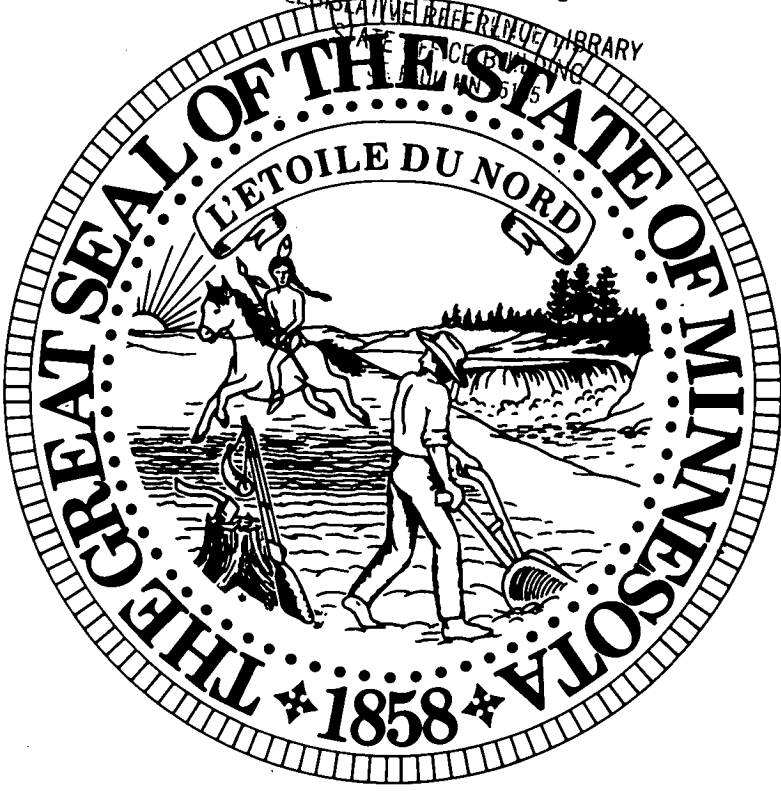

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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the *State Register*

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 75 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific *Minnesota Rule* chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the *Minnesota Rules* are published. This is a ten-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Proposed and adopted emergency rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

If an agency seeks outside opinion before issuing new rules or rule amendments, it must publish a NOTICE OF INTENT TO SOLICIT OUTSIDE OPINION in the *Official Notices* section of the *State Register*. When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues 1-13 inclusive; issues 14-25 inclusive; issue 26, cumulative for issues 1-26; issues 27-38 inclusive; issue 39, cumulative for 1-39; issues 40-51 inclusive; and issue 52, cumulative for 1-52. An annual subject matter index for rules appears in August. 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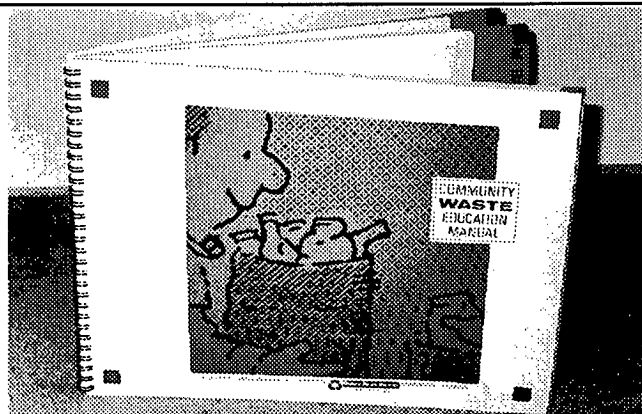
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Proposed Rules

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§ 14.22, an agency may propose to adopt, amend, suspend or repeal rules without first holding a public hearing, as long as the agency determines that the rules will be noncontroversial in nature. The agency must first publish a notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing, together with the proposed rules, in the *State Register*. The notice must advise the public:

1. that they have 30 days in which to submit comment on the proposed rules;
2. that no public hearing will be held unless 25 or more persons make a written request for a hearing within the 30-day comment period;
3. of the manner in which persons shall request a hearing on the proposed rules; and
4. that the rule may be modified if the modifications are supported by the data and views submitted.

If, during the 30-day comment period, 25 or more persons submit to the agency a written request for a hearing of the proposed rules, the agency must proceed under the provisions of §§ 14.14-14.20, which state that if an agency decides to hold a public hearing, it must publish a notice of intent in the *State Register*.

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§ 14.29 and 14.30, agencies may propose emergency rules under certain circumstances. Proposed emergency rules are published in the *State Register* and, for at least 25 days thereafter, interested persons may submit data and views in writing to the proposing agency.

Proposed Permanent Rules Governing Weights and Measures

Notice of Intent to Adopt a Rule Without a Public Hearing Unless 25 or More Persons Request a Hearing, and Notice of Hearing if 25 or More Requests for Hearing are Received

Introduction. The Minnesota Department of Public Service, Weights and Measures Division intends to adopt permanent rules without a public hearing following the procedures set forth in the Administrative Procedures Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, Sections 14.22 to 14.28. If, however, 25 or more persons submit a written request for a hearing on the rule by 4:30 p.m. on January 5, 1994, a public hearing will be held on January 19, 1994. To find out whether the rule will be adopted without a hearing or if the hearing will be held, you should contact the agency contact person after January 5, 1994 and before January 19, 1994. All interested or affected persons will have an opportunity to participate.

Subject of Rule and Statutory Authority. *Minnesota Statutes* Section 239.06 states that the Department of Public Service shall prescribe and adopt such rules as it may deem necessary to carry out the provisions of this chapter, and it may change, modify, or amend any or all rules when deemed necessary and the rules so made shall have the force and effect of law.

The proposed rules cover: definition of terms; variances to rules; the incorporation of NIST Handbooks 44 and 133; specifications for scales and weighing devices; specifications for liquified petroleum gas liquid measuring devices; and a registration program for persons who install, adjust, repair, service, or test commercial weighing and measuring equipment.

A copy of the proposed rule is published in the *State Register* and attached to this notice as mailed. A free copy of the proposed rule is available on request from Michael Blacik.

Comments. You have 30 calendar days, until 4:30 p.m. on January 5, 1994 to submit written comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed rule or any part or subpart of the rule. Your comment must be in writing and received by Michael Blacik by 4:30 p.m. on January 5, 1994. Comment is encouraged. Your comments should identify the portion of the proposed rule addressed, the reason for the comment, and any change proposed.

Request for a Hearing. In addition to submitting comments, you have 30 calendar days to request that a hearing be held on the rule. Your request for a public hearing must be in writing and must be received by Michael Blacik by 4:30 p.m. on January 5, 1994. Your written request for a public hearing must include your name, address, and telephone number. You are encouraged to identify the portion of the proposed rule which caused your request, the reason for the request, and any changes you want made to the proposed rule. If 25 or more persons submit a written request for a hearing, a public hearing will be held unless a sufficient number withdraw their requests in writing.

Modifications. The proposed rule may be modified, either as a result of public comment or as a result of the rule hearing process. Modifications must not result in a substantial change in the proposed rule as attached and printed in the *State Register* and must be supported by data and views submitted to the agency or presented at the hearing. If the proposed rule affects you in any way, you are encouraged to participate in the rulemaking process.

Cancellation of Hearing. The hearing scheduled for January 19, 1994 will be canceled if the agency does not receive requests from 25 or more persons that a hearing be held on the rule. If you requested a public hearing, the agency will notify you before the scheduled hearing whether or not the hearing will be held. You may also call Michael Blacik at (612) 639-4010 after January 5, 1994 to find out whether a hearing will be held.

Notice of Hearing. If 25 or more persons submit written requests for a public hearing on the rule, a hearing will be held following the procedures in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.14 to 14.20. The hearing will be held on January 19, 1994 at The Department of Public Service, Metro Square, 121 7th Place East, Suite 200, St. Paul, Minnesota, beginning at 9:00 a.m. and continuing until all persons have been heard. The hearing will continue, if necessary, at additional times and places as determined during the hearing by the Administrative Law Judge. The Administrative Law Judge assigned to conduct the hearing is Richard C. Luis. Judge Luis can be reached at the Office of Administrative Hearings, 100 Washington Square, Suite 1700, Minneapolis, Minnesota 55401-2138, telephone (612) 349-2542 or fax (612) 349-2665. The agency expects that fewer than ten persons will attend the hearing and that the agency will need approximately one to two hours to present its evidence at the hearing. The agency does not intend to provide discretionary additional public notice of the proposed rules, authorized by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.14, subdivision 1a.

Hearing Procedure. If a hearing is held, you and all interested or affected persons including representatives of associations or other interested groups, will have the opportunity to participate. You may present your views either orally at the hearing or in writing at any time prior to the close of the hearing record. All evidence presented should relate to the proposed rule. You may also mail written material to the administrative law judge to be recorded in the hearing record for five working days after the public hearing ends. This five-day comment period may be extended for a longer period not to exceed 20 calendar days if ordered by the administrative law judge at the hearing. Comments received during this period will be available for review at the Office of Administrative Hearings. You and the agency may respond in writing within five business days after the submission period ends to any new information submitted. All written materials and responses submitted to the administrative law judge must be received at the Office of Administrative Hearings no later than 4:30 p.m. on the due date. No additional evidence may be submitted during the five-day period. This rule hearing procedure is governed by *Minnesota Rules*, parts 1400.0200 to 1400.1200 and *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.14 to 14.20. Questions about procedure may be directed to the administrative law judge.

Statement of Need and Reasonableness. A statement of need and reasonableness is now available for review at the agency from Michael Blacik and at the Office of Administrative Hearings. This statement describes the need for and the reasonableness of each provision of the proposed rule. This statement of need and reasonableness includes a summary of all the evidence, and argument which the department anticipates presenting at the hearing, if one is held. Copies of the statement are available from the agency at no cost and copies may be obtained at the cost of reproduction from the Office of Administrative Hearings.

Small Business Considerations. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.115 requires that an agency consider five factors for reducing the impact of proposed rules on small businesses. A discussion of the impact on small businesses is contained in the Statement of Need and Reasonableness.

Expenditure of Public Money by Local Public Bodies. The adoption of the proposed rules do not require the expenditure of public money by local public bodies of greater than \$100,000 in the two years following promulgation.

Lobbyist Registration. *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 10A requires each lobbyist to register with the Ethical Practices Board. Adoption Procedure if No Hearing. If no hearing is required, after the end of the comment period the agency may adopt the rule. The rule and supporting documents will then be submitted to the attorney general for review as to legality and form to the extent form relates to legality. You may request to be notified of the date the rule is submitted to the attorney general or be notified of the attorney general's decision on the rule. If you want to be so notified, or wish to receive a copy of the adopted rule, submit your request to Michael Blacik.

Adoption Procedure After the Hearing. If a hearing is held, after the close of the hearing record, the administrative law judge will issue a report on the proposed rule. You may request to be notified of the date on which the administrative law judge's report will

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be available, after which date the agency may not take any final action on the rule for a period of five working days. If you want to be notified about the report, you may so indicate at the hearing. After the hearing, you may request notification by sending a written request to the administrative law judge. You may also request notification of the date on which the rule is adopted and filed with the Secretary of State. The agency's notice of adoption must be mailed on the same day the rule is filed. If you want to be notified of the adoption, you may so indicate at the hearing or send a request in writing to the agency contact person at any time prior to the filing of the rule with the Secretary of State.

Rules as Proposed (all new material)

7601.0100 DEFINITIONS.

Subpart 1. **Scope.** The terms used in this chapter have the meanings given them in this part.

Subp. 2. **Animal scale and livestock scale.** "Animal scale" and "livestock scale" mean platform scales designed and used to weigh livestock. An animal scale is used to weigh a single animal. A livestock scale is used to weigh several animals. Both have an enclosure and gates built on the scale platform.

Subp. 3. **Commercial; commercial use; commercial purpose.** "Commercial," "commercial use," and "commercial purpose" refer to weights and measures used or located on premises where they could be used to:

A. determine the weight, measure, or count of commodities or things sold, offered, or exposed for sale, on the basis of weight, measure, or count; and

B. compute the basic charge or payment for services rendered on the basis of weight, measure, or count.

Subp. 4. **Commissioner.** "Commissioner" means the commissioner of the Department of Public Service.

Subp. 5. **Department.** "Department" means the Department of Public Service.

Subp. 6. **Director.** "Director" means the director of the Weights and Measures Division of the Department of Public Service.

Subp. 7. **Division.** "Division" means the Weights and Measures Division of the Department of Public Service, and employees of the Weights and Measures Division having statutory authority delegated by the director.

Subp. 8. **Hopper scale.** "Hopper scale" means a scale designed and used to weigh bulk commodities in a container, hopper, box, or tank mounted on the scale.

Subp. 9. **Minnesota seal.** "Minnesota seal" means a security seal placed on commercial weighing and measuring equipment by the division to prevent unauthorized adjustment of the equipment.

Subp. 10. **National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST).** "National Institute of Standards and Technology" and "NIST" mean the United States Department of Commerce, National Institute of Standards and Technology.

Subp. 11. **National Type Evaluation Program (NTEP).** "National Type Evaluation Program" and "NTEP" mean a program of weighing and measuring device evaluation and certification operated by the United States Department of Commerce, National Institute of Standards and Technology.

Subp. 12. **Place in service.** "Place in service" means to authorize commercial use of newly installed or repaired weighing and measuring equipment pending an inspection by the division. This type of authorization may only be performed by a registered person.

Subp. 13. **Railroad track scale.** "Railroad track scale" means a scale of appropriate capacity and design that is used to weigh a rail car.

Subp. 14. **Random package.** "Random package" means a package that is one of a lot, shipment, or delivery of packages of the same consumer commodity with varying weights.

Subp. 15. **Registered person, registrant.** "Registered person" and "registrant" mean a person who has voluntarily registered with the division and who installs, services, repairs, or reconditions weighing and measuring equipment.

Subp. 16. **Registration certificate.** "Registration certificate" means an annual certificate issued by the division to a person who voluntarily registers with the division and who installs, adjusts, services, repairs, or reconditions commercial weighing and measuring equipment.

Subp. 17. **Scale division.** "Scale division" means the value, in units of mass, of the smallest subdivision or unit that can be indicated by a scale.

Subp. 18. **Sensitivity requirement.** "Sensitivity requirement" means a performance requirement for a scale equipped with a

nonautomatic indicator. It is a prescribed change in the rest position of the indicator, caused by a prescribed change in load on the scale. The requirement is stated in terms of scale divisions. For example, a load equivalent to two divisions must cause the prescribed change in the rest position of the indicator.

Subp. 19. **Soil bearing.** "Soil bearing" refers to the load, in units of mass per area, that can be placed upon soil without causing deformation, settling, or soil failure.

Subp. 20. **Vehicle scale.** "Vehicle scale" means a platform scale designed and used to weigh trucks, farm equipment, or other large industrial or highway vehicles in one draft or weighing operation.

Subp. 21. **Weighing and measuring equipment.** "Weighing and measuring equipment" means all weights and measures of every kind, all instruments and devices for weighing and measuring, and any appliances and accessories associated with those instruments and devices, which are used to:

A. determine the weight, measure, or count of commodities or things sold, offered, or exposed for sale on the basis of weight, measure, or count; or

B. compute the basic service charge or payment for services rendered on the basis of weight, measure, or count.

7601.0200 VARIANCES.

Subpart 1. **Director to grant.** The director shall, if requested in a manner prescribed by subparts 2 and 3, grant a variance to any part of this chapter, except a rule that specifies a tolerance or the value of a scale division.

Subp. 2. **Request.** An owner or operator of commercial weighing and measuring equipment may apply to the director for a variance to any part of this chapter. The request must be in writing and must:

A. explain why a variance is needed;

B. explain the proposed alternative to the rule; and

C. include drawings if the request is for a railroad track, vehicle, or livestock scale. The drawings must illustrate the design, construction, and location of the scale.

Subp. 3. **Approval criteria.** A request for a variance may be granted if:

A. the rule for which a variance is sought causes an undue hardship for the applicant, or if it is impossible for the applicant to comply with the rule;

B. the variance will not harm the owner or operator, or their customers; and

C. the director is able to determine that under normal operating conditions the weighing and measuring equipment will remain accurate and reliable.

Subp. 4. **Refusal to grant.** The director shall refuse to grant a variance if the request does not meet the requirements of subparts 2 and 3.

Subp. 5. **Response by division to request.** All requests will be answered by the division in writing, setting forth the reasons for granting or refusing to grant the requested variance.

UNIFORM NATIONAL CODES

7601.1000 NIST HANDBOOK 44 INCORPORATED BY REFERENCE.

Subpart 1. **NIST Handbook 44 (1993).** Weighing and measuring equipment manufactured, offered, or exposed for sale or sold or given away for use in trade or commerce in Minnesota must conform to the requirements and specifications of NIST Handbook 44, NIST Handbook 44 (1993), "Specifications, Tolerances, and Other Technical Requirements for Weighing and Measuring Devices," as adopted by the 77th National Conference on Weights and Measures and published by the United States Department of Commerce, National Institute of Standards and Technology, (Washington, D.C., October 1992), is incorporated by reference subject to the following exceptions:

A. If NIST Handbook 44 (1993) contains any provisions contrary to the laws of Minnesota or the rules of the Minnesota Department of Public Service, Minnesota law and department rules govern and supersede contrary provisions of NIST Handbook 44.

B. The final sentence of NIST Handbook 44 (1993), section 2 (scale code), specification S.1.8.3., is deleted.

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Subp. 2. **Location.** NIST Handbook 44 is available to the public at the Minnesota State Law Library, Minnesota Judicial Center, 25 Constitution Avenue, Saint Paul, Minnesota, 55155, and is not subject to frequent change.

7601.1010 NIST HANDBOOK 44; COMPLIANCE REQUIRED.

Subpart 1. **Compliance.** A person who owns or operates weighing or measuring equipment for commercial purposes in Minnesota must use weighing and measuring equipment that meets all applicable requirements in NIST Handbook 44 as adopted under part 7601.1000. Only the director, or a department employee delegated by the director, shall determine the applicability of, and compliance with, the requirements of NIST Handbook 44.

Subp. 2. **NTEP Certification.** A person who sells, installs, owns, or operates commercial weighing or measuring equipment manufactured after January 1, 1995, must sell, install, or use only weighing or measuring equipment of a make, model, and type for which a "Certificate of Conformance" has been issued by the United States Department of Commerce, National Institute of Standards and Technology, Office of Weights and Measures.

7601.1020 NIST HANDBOOK 133 INCORPORATED BY REFERENCE.

Subpart 1. **NIST Handbook 133.** NIST Handbook 133 (September, 1988), "Checking the Net Contents of Packaged Goods," with additions and amendments to it published in supplements issued through October, 1992, as adopted by the 77th National Conference on Weights and Measures and published by the United States Department of Commerce, National Institute of Standards and Technology, (Washington, D.C., October 1992), is incorporated by reference. If NIST Handbook 133 and its supplements contain any provision contrary to the laws of Minnesota, the rules of the Minnesota Department of Public Service, or the packaging or labeling rules of the Minnesota Department of Agriculture, Minnesota laws and rules govern and supersede contrary provisions of NIST Handbook 133 and its supplements.

Subp. 2. **Location.** NIST Handbook 133 and supplements are available to the public at the Minnesota State Law Library, Minnesota Judicial Center, 25 Constitution Avenue, Saint Paul, Minnesota, 55155, and are not subject to frequent change.

PACKAGED COMMODITIES

7601.1500 MEAT PRODUCTS PACKED BY RETAILER.

When meat, meat products, poultry, fish, and seafood have been packaged or wrapped by the retailer, and the packages are part of a lot that includes packages of varying weights, each package shall be accurately marked with the net weight, the selling price per pound, and the total selling price. This requirement does not apply to packages containing:

- A. shellfish; or
- B. food items intended to be consumed immediately on or off the premises where sold.

REQUIREMENTS FOR SCALES, GENERALLY

7601.2000 PROTECTION FROM ENVIRONMENT.

Subpart 1. **Outdoor scales.** The director shall require special protection from the environment for an outdoor scale if the division finds that the scale is adversely affected by weather or other environmental factors. Environmental protection includes:

- A. belting or other suitable material to cover the clearance around a scale platform;
- B. wind skirts, wind walls, or effective foundation heating for above-ground scales;
- C. an improved drainage system or sump pump for pit-type scales;
- D. special shielding or weatherproofing of a scale indicator;
- E. a complete building to protect a scale from the weather; and
- F. modifications, shielding, and other special measures to protect an electronic scale from radio frequency interference and electromagnetic interference.

Subp. 2. **Fertilizer scales.** A hopper, tank, or mixer scale used for weighing dry or liquid bulk fertilizer must be completely enclosed in a building.

7601.2010 SENSITIVITY REQUIREMENT.

For a scale not equipped with a balance indicator, but with a minimum graduated interval less than ten pounds, the sensitivity requirement is three times the value of the minimum graduated interval or 15 pounds, whichever is less.

RAILROAD TRACK SCALES

7601.3000 RAILROAD TRACK SCALES; PLANS.

Subpart 1. **Manufacturer's plans.** Before installing a railroad track scale, the scale manufacturer shall furnish complete design, assembly, and construction plans to the purchaser.

Subp. 2. **Installer's plans.** The scale purchaser shall furnish installation plans to the director. The plans must show the scale location, the foundation drawings, and all commodity-handling equipment that could affect the operation of the scale. The plans must also include the information on soil bearing required by part 7601.3020, subpart 1.

7601.3010 RAILROAD TRACK SCALE PERMITS.

The director may issue permits to install railroad track scales. A railroad track scale must not be installed without a permit. The director shall review and approve the plans required in part 7601.3000 before issuing a permit.

7601.3020 RAILROAD TRACK SCALE FOUNDATION.

Subpart 1. **Soil bearing.** The owner, operator, or installer of a railroad track scale shall complete a soil bearing test, performed by a registered engineer, before constructing the scale foundation. The soil bearing test must determine the load-bearing capacity of the soil that will lie under the completed scale foundation. The engineer's report, including a statement that the soil bearing is suitable for the scale to be installed, must be submitted to the director before constructing the scale foundation. The director shall review and approve the report before issuing a permit for a scale installation.

Subp. 2. **Materials and construction.** Foundation walls, floors, footings, and weighing element support piers must be constructed of reinforced, poured concrete that conforms to the scale manufacturer's design requirements and drawings. The concrete must be uniform and continuous. Reinforcing material in the piers and walls must be securely tied to the reinforcing material in the adjacent walls and floor.

Subp. 3. **Dimensions.** The foundation must be deep enough to provide a finished pit seven feet deep, measured from the top of the finished foundation wall to the top surface of the finished pit floor.

Subp. 4. **Length.** For a railroad track scale installed after January 1, 1994, the length or combination of lengths of the weighing element or elements must be sufficient to allow single draft weighing.

7601.3030 APPROACH RAILS AND PIERS.

Subpart 1. **Approach rails.** A railroad track scale must be installed with approach rails at the end of the scale. The approach rails must be at least 50 feet long and must be parallel to the scale rails in both the horizontal and vertical planes.

Subp. 2. **Approach panels.** A reinforced concrete approach panel must be installed at each end of the scale. The panels must:

- A. be level;
- B. extend 25 feet from the scale foundation end walls;
- C. be formed independently of the end walls, and rest on extensions of the end walls or on the scale foundation footings; and
- D. be designed to maintain a permanent and level approach to the scale.

VEHICLE AND LIVESTOCK SCALES

7601.4000 VEHICLE AND LIVESTOCK SCALES; PLANS.

Subpart 1. **Scales installed by buyer.** For a vehicle or livestock scale needing assembly or foundation construction by the scale buyer, the manufacturer shall provide to the buyer complete plans, drawings, and instructions for assembling and installing the scale and for building the foundation. The director may require a scale buyer to submit plans to the division before construction.

Subp. 2. **Above-ground vehicle and livestock scales.** The owner, operator, or installer of an above-ground vehicle or livestock scale shall submit complete plans and drawings of the scale and foundation to the director before installing the scale. The drawings must show the finished grade level of the area that will surround the scale site. The director shall review and approve the drawings, and must respond in writing to the scale owner or operator.

Subp. 3. **Floating concrete slab foundation.** The owner, operator, or installer of an above-ground vehicle or livestock scale to be installed on a floating concrete slab foundation shall comply with subpart 2 and shall complete a soil bearing test, performed by a registered engineer, before constructing the scale foundation. The soil bearing test must determine the load-bearing capacity of the soil that will lie under the completed scale foundation. The engineer's report, including a statement that the soil bearing is suitable for the scale to be installed, must be submitted to the director before constructing the scale foundation. The director shall review and approve the report and respond in writing to the owner or operator.

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7601.4010 VEHICLE AND LIVESTOCK SCALE FOUNDATIONS.

Subpart 1. **Generally.** Vehicle and livestock scales installed after December 31, 1985, must be installed on a reinforced, poured, concrete foundation. Scales may be installed in a concrete pit, according to subpart 2, or above grade level according to subpart 3 or 4. The foundation must be designed to support the weight of the scale and the anticipated maximum load on the scale without significant settling or cracking. Weighing element stands or bases must be securely bolted to the foundation. Space between a stand or base and the foundation must be filled with nonshrinking grout.

Subp. 2. **Pit-type scale foundation.** A pit-type vehicle or livestock scale foundation must meet the following requirements:

- A. the walls, floors, footings, and weighing element support piers must be reinforced, poured concrete;
- B. the clearance between the bottom of the weighbridge or other main structural member and the surface of the pit floor must be at least 48 inches;
- C. for outdoor scales, the pit floor must have an effective drain system so that the pit floor remains reasonably dry and clean;
- D. for outdoor scales, the tops of the pit walls must be above the existing grade level so that water will drain away from the scale; and
- E. for outdoor scales, the foundation must extend below the local frost line.

Subp. 3. **Above-ground scale; concrete pier foundation.** An above-ground vehicle or livestock scale foundation must meet the following requirements:

- A. the weighing elements must be supported on reinforced concrete foundation piers;
- B. concrete surface slabs must be poured independently between the main foundation piers;
- C. the end piers of the foundation must have end walls to prevent fill material from interfering with scale operation;
- D. where foundation construction techniques allow, the surface of the foundation slab must be sloped down from the longitudinal centerline to each side to prevent dirt accumulation under the platform;
- E. the clearance between the bottom of the weighbridge or other main structural member and the slab surface must be at least six inches for vehicle scales and at least 12 inches for livestock scales;
- F. the scale platform, structural members, foundation surfaces, and surrounding area must be designed to allow access for cleaning under the scale platform and around all weighing elements;
- G. for outdoor scales, the tops of the piers and the surfaces of the slab or slabs between the piers must be above the existing grade level so that water will drain away from the scale;
- H. the vertical surfaces of the end walls and the horizontal surfaces of the end piers must have hooks or other devices to allow installation of surface-mounted heating cables; and
- I. the piers must extend below the local frost line.

Subp. 4. **Above-ground scale; floating concrete slab foundation.** An above-ground vehicle or livestock scale may be installed on a floating concrete slab foundation. The foundation must meet the following requirements:

- A. The scale weighing element or elements must be supported on a monolithic, reinforced concrete slab. The entire slab must be at least 12 inches thick, and must conform to the scale manufacturer's installation and reinforcing requirements.
- B. The foundation must be constructed on soil that has a uniform natural or engineered soil bearing of at least 1,500 pounds per square foot. See part 7601.4000, subpart 3.
- C. A base of uniform, compacted, permeable aggregate, at least 24 inches deep, must be installed. The concrete slab foundation must be poured on top of this base.
- D. The top surface of the foundation slab must be installed above the surrounding grade level so that water will flow away from the foundation and away from the permeable aggregate base that supports the foundation.

7601.4020 VEHICLE AND LIVESTOCK SCALE APPROACHES.

Subpart 1. **Before January 1, 1986.** A vehicle scale installed before January 1, 1986, must have at least 12 feet or a distance equal to one-third of the deck length, whichever is greater, of straight hard surface driveway on either end of the scale not over one-third inch per foot out of level of the platform. The first six feet on both ends must be constructed of reinforced concrete.

Subp. 2. **After December 31, 1985.** For a vehicle or livestock scale installed after December 31, 1985, each end of the scale must have a straight, paved approach that meets the following requirements:

- A. Approaches must be at least as wide as the scale platform and at least ten feet long or one-third of the scale platform length, whichever is greater.

B. The first ten feet of each approach must be a reinforced concrete approach panel, one end of which rests on an extension of the scale foundation end wall. The remaining length of each approach must be paved with concrete or asphalt.

C. Approaches must be sloped down from the scale platform. Maximum slope allowed is one-third inch per foot. Approaches must not be sloped up from the scale platform.

D. For above-ground scales, the foundation end walls must have wing wall extensions, or the sides of the approach slopes must be paved, so that fill material cannot fall under the scale platform.

7601.4030 ANIMAL AND LIVESTOCK SCALES; PRINTER REQUIRED.

An animal or livestock scale must be equipped with a printing device. The printer must be maintained in good working condition so that a clear printed record of each transaction is available to both buyer and seller.

7601.4040 ANIMAL AND LIVESTOCK SCALES; TOLERANCES.

Subpart 1. **Tolerance.** For animal and livestock scales, the basic maintenance tolerance is one pound per 1000 pounds of test load (0.1 percent). The acceptance tolerance is one-half of the basic maintenance tolerance.

Subp. 2. **Shift test tolerance.** A shift test must be conducted on animal and livestock scales. The maximum test load is one-fourth of the scale capacity. A scale may be approved if the sum of the indicated errors for two load-bearing readings in the same section is within tolerance.

"Section" means a part of a vehicle, livestock, or railroad track scale that consists of a pair of main load-bearing supports arranged so that the vertical plane passing through both supports is usually transverse to the direction that the load is applied to the scale platform.

HOPPER SCALES

7601.5000 HOPPER SCALES.

Subpart 1. **Scale divisions; weighing fertilizer.** For a hopper scale used to weigh fertilizer and marked as an NTEP Class III or Class IIIL device, the weighing range of the indicator (from zero load to capacity) must indicate at least 2,000 scale divisions.

Subp. 2. **Capacity.** For a hopper scale, the load capacity of the hopper must be at least 80 percent of the capacity of the weight indicator. Load capacity must be determined by using the highest density material that will normally be weighed in the hopper.

Subp. 3. **Dust-control systems.** Weighing accuracy of a hopper scale system must not be affected by air flow or by a fluctuation or differential in air pressure caused by a dust-control system. If scale accuracy can be affected by adjusting dampers or flow-control devices in the dust-control system, the dampers and devices must be sealed with a Minnesota seal to prevent adjustment.

MEASURING LIQUEFIED PETROLEUM GAS

7601.6000 TEMPERATURE CORRECTION FOR MEASURING LIQUEFIED PETROLEUM GAS.

Subpart 1. **Requirements.** When liquefied petroleum gas is sold or delivered to a consumer as a liquid and by liquid measurement, the volume of liquid sold and delivered must be corrected to a temperature of 60 degrees Fahrenheit through the use of the volume correction table, shown in part 7601.9900, and calculated under subpart 2, or through use of an approved meter with a sealed automatic compensating mechanism. A sale ticket must show the delivered gallons, the temperature at the time of delivery, and the corrected gallonage, or must state that temperature correction was automatically made.

This part does not apply to unit sales or deliveries made directly to mobile fuel tanks with a capacity of less than 100 gallons.

Subp. 2. **Calculation.** To convert from measured volume at another temperature to net volume at 60 degrees Fahrenheit: measure the volume and temperature, determine the specific gravity at 60 degrees Fahrenheit, refer to the column in the volume conversion table, set forth in part 7601.9900, corresponding to the specific gravity, and read the volume conversion factor opposite the observed temperature. Multiply the observed volume by this factor to obtain the volume at 60 degrees Fahrenheit.

VOLUNTARY PLACING IN SERVICE PROGRAM

7601.7000 PLACING IN SERVICE PROGRAM; PURPOSE AND POLICY.

Subpart 1. **Registered persons.** The director shall offer a voluntary registration program for persons who install, adjust, repair, service, or test commercial weighing and measuring equipment. The purposes of the program are to:

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A. allow privately employed individuals to place newly installed or repaired weighing and measuring equipment into commercial service, pending an inspection by the division; and

B. minimize the compliance burden on owners and operators of weighing and measuring equipment by simplifying installation and repair and by reducing the amount of time the equipment is out of service.

Subp. 2. **Nonregistered persons.** A nonregistered person is not prohibited from repairing commercial weighing and measuring equipment. However, *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 239, prohibits commercial use of equipment that has been repaired by a nonregistered person until the equipment has been approved by the division.

7601.7010 VOLUNTARY REGISTRATION.

Subpart 1. **Placing in service registration.** The director will accept applications for voluntary registration in the placing in service program, and will issue annual registration certificates to qualified persons.

Subp. 2. **Application for voluntary registration.** An applicant shall provide the following information on an application form provided by the division:

A. the applicant's name, business name, business address, and business telephone number;

B. the applicant's social security number and Minnesota tax identification number;

C. evidence that the applicant has the required test equipment available for use, and has met the equipment calibration requirements in part 7601.7080; and

D. the category of weighing and measuring equipment that the applicant will service.

7601.7020 CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION.

The director shall issue a registration certificate to an applicant who meets the requirements of this part. The certificate authorizes the applicant to exercise the privileges in part 7601.7050 and to fulfill the responsibilities in part 7601.7060 for a category of commercial weighing and measuring equipment specified by the director. The certificate remains in effect for 12 months following the date of issue, or until it is returned by the registrant or revoked by the director. The director shall issue a certificate to an applicant who has:

A. fulfilled the application requirements in part 7601.7010 or the reciprocity requirements in part 7601.7040;

B. met the standards and test equipment requirements in part 7601.7080;

C. attended a placing in service training seminar offered by the division to all new applicants, except that a registrant who renews a registration certificate is not required to attend annually; and

D. completed and passed a written examination to demonstrate the applicant's understanding of the appropriate requirements in department rules, including NIST Handbook 44.

7601.7030 REGISTRATION FEE.

The division shall charge an annual fee for each registration certificate issued, as set by part 7602.0100. It must include the costs of administering the placing in service program and calibrating the registrant's standards and test equipment.

7601.7040 RECIPROCITY.

The director may issue a registration certificate to a person who is registered in a placing in service program in another state. The person is required to:

A. meet the application requirements in part 7601.7010;

B. provide evidence of registration in another state;

C. provide evidence that the standards and test equipment requirements in part 7601.7080 have been met;

D. attend a placing in service training seminar offered by the division to all new applicants, except that a registrant who renews a registration certificate is not required to attend annually; and

E. complete and pass a written examination to demonstrate the applicant's understanding of the appropriate requirements in department rules, including NIST Handbook 44.

7601.7050 PRIVILEGES OF VOLUNTARY REGISTRANT.

A registrant may:

A. remove an official rejection tag placed on weighing and measuring equipment by the division;

B. remove a Minnesota security seal installed on weighing and measuring equipment by the division;

C. repair and place in service weighing and measuring equipment rejected by the division; and

D. place in service new or newly installed weighing and measuring equipment.

7601.7060 RESPONSIBILITIES OF VOLUNTARY REGISTRANT.

Subpart 1. **Performance.** A registrant shall:

- A. ensure that all equipment placed in service complies with this chapter, including NIST Handbook 44;
- B. personally perform or observe all installation, service, adjustment, repair, and testing of weighing and measuring equipment placed in service; and
- C. use only standards and test equipment that meet the requirements of part 7601.7080.

Subp. 2. **Placing in service required.** A registrant shall place in service all commercial weighing and measuring equipment when the registrant, or a person under the direct supervision and observation of the registrant, has:

- A. installed the equipment;
- B. repaired the equipment, following official rejection by the division; or
- C. removed a Minnesota security seal from the equipment.

Subp. 3. **Reporting.** When work authorized in part 7601.7050 is performed, a registrant shall:

- A. fill out a placed in service report form;
- B. carefully follow the instructions on the form and provide all of the required information in legible handwriting or typewriting;
- C. submit the original form to the division within five days after completing the work;
- D. submit a copy of the form to the owner or operator of the equipment when the work is completed; and
- E. retain a copy of the form.

Subp. 4. **Security seals.** When a registrant removes a security seal from the adjusting or calibrating mechanism of a weighing or measuring device, the registrant shall:

- A. install a new security seal in a manner that will ensure that the device cannot be adjusted without removing or defacing the security seal; and
- B. imprint the seal with the registrant's placing in service registration number.

7601.7070 PLACED IN SERVICE REPORT.

Upon request from a registrant, the director shall provide a supply of placed in service report forms to the registrant.

7601.7080 STANDARDS AND TESTING EQUIPMENT.

Subpart 1. **Required equipment list.** The director shall publish a list of the standards and test equipment required for registration in each category of weighing and measuring equipment service.

Subp. 2. **Annual calibration required.** A registrant shall annually submit the required standards and test equipment for inspection, testing, and calibration by the division's metrology laboratory, by the federal government, or by a NIST-certified metrology laboratory operated by an agency of another state government.

7601.7090 PROBLEM RESOLUTION SYSTEM; CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION.

Subpart 1. **Director may inspect.** The director shall, at any time, inspect the work performed by a registrant. The director shall use these inspections to determine whether the registrant is performing repairs in compliance with *Minnesota Statutes* and department rules.

Subp. 2. **Problem resolution.** After careful investigation and consideration, and for good cause, the director shall take any of the remedial actions in subparts 3 to 7 for a registrant who has failed to meet the requirements of *Minnesota Statutes* or department rules.

Subp. 3. **Additional training.** The director shall, for good cause, require a registrant to attend additional training or tutoring offered by the division. The director has good cause to require additional training when division employees report to the director that a registrant has installed or repaired commercial weighing or measuring equipment that does not comply with department rules.

Subp. 4. **Warning letter.** The director shall, for good cause, issue a warning letter to a registrant. The letter must state that the

registrant has violated department rules, must specify the violations, and must state that the director may suspend or revoke the registration certificate for continued violations. Good cause to issue a warning letter is limited to those instances when a registrant has:

- A. failed to submit a placing in service report for commercial weighing or measuring equipment that the registrant has installed, adjusted, or repaired;
- B. submitted a placing in service report that is incomplete or that contains inaccurate information;
- C. placed in service weighing or measuring equipment without using the test equipment required by the director under part 7601.7080;
- D. placed in service weighing or measuring equipment that does not meet the specifications, tolerances, and other requirements of department rules;
- E. after expiration of the registration certificate, placed in service weighing or measuring equipment or removed a rejection tag from weighing or measuring equipment; or
- F. failed to apply a security seal to weighing or measuring equipment as required by part 7601.7060, subpart 4.

Subp. 5. **30-day suspension.** The director shall, for good cause, suspend a registration certificate for up to 30 days. The director must inform the registrant in writing of the suspension, the reasons for the suspension, and the privileges that must not be exercised while the certificate is under suspension. Good cause to suspend a registration certificate for up to 30 days is limited to those instances when a registrant has committed, on three or more occasions within a 90-day period, one of the violations listed in subpart 4.

Subp. 6. **90-day suspension.** The director shall, for good cause, suspend a registration certificate for up to 90 days. The director must inform the registrant in writing of the suspension, the reasons for the suspension, and the privileges that must not be exercised while the certificate is under suspension. Good cause to suspend a registration certificate for up to 90 days is limited to those instances when a registrant has:

- A. continued to install, adjust, or repair commercial weighing or measuring equipment after the director has suspended the registration certificate; or
- B. on six or more occasions within a 90-day period, committed one of the violations listed in subpart 4.

Subp. 7. **Revocation.** The director shall, for good cause, revoke a registration certificate. The director must inform the registrant in writing of the revocation, the reasons for the revocation, and the activities that are prohibited by the revocation. Good cause to revoke a registration certificate is limited to those instances when a registrant has:

- A. continued to install, adjust, or repair weighing or measuring equipment, subsequently used for commercial purposes, after the director has suspended the registration certificate for 90 days under the requirements of subpart 6; or
- B. failed to pay a registration fee or equipment calibration fee.

Subp. 8. **Reinstatement.** The director may reinstate a registration certificate that has been revoked. An applicant for reinstatement must meet all of the requirements of parts 7601.7010 to 7601.7040. The director may reinstate a certificate only after the applicant has paid all registration fees and calibration fees required in part 7602.0100. When a person is applying for reinstatement, the director may impose more stringent written examination requirements than the initial written examination specified in parts 7601.7020 and 7601.7040.

7601.7100 LISTS OF REGISTERED SERVICE PERSONS.

The director may publish, and may supply upon request, lists of registered service persons.

No system of water supply or system for the on-site disposal of sewage, ~~industrial waste, garbage, or refuse, in case any where~~ such system is for public use or for the use of any considerable number of persons, or in case any such system affects or tends to affect the public health in any manner, shall be installed by any public agency or by any person or corporation, nor shall any such existing system be materially altered or extended, until complete plans and specifications for the installation, alteration, or extension, together with such information as the commissioner of health may require, have been submitted in duplicate and approved by the commissioner of health insofar as any features thereof affect or tend to affect the public health, and no construction shall take place except in accordance with the approved plans. A well installed or materially altered for the purpose of providing water to a noncommunity or nontransient noncommunity water supply is exempt from this part.

4725.0350 FEES APPLICABLE TO THIS CHAPTER.

Subp. 5. **Water supply well notification fee.** A nonrefundable well notification fee of \$100 for each new water supply well drilled must be paid by a property owner where the well is to be located.

Subp. 6. **Permit fee fees.** A nonrefundable permit fee to be paid by a property owner where a well or wells are to be located is required as follows:

A. \$100 annually for a water supply well that is not in use and under a maintenance permit;

F. \$100 for a vertical heat exchanger ~~in addition to the notification fee specified in subpart 5;~~

G. \$100 for the construction of a dewatering well except a dewatering project comprising more than ~~ten~~ five wells shall pay no more than \$500 for a single permit for the wells recorded on the permit;

FOR USE OF ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY ORDER AUTHORITY

INTRODUCTION

The Minnesota Emergency Response Commission has developed this plan for the use of Administrative Penalty Orders (APO). Authority to use these enforcement tools was granted by the 1993 legislature by amending *Minnesota Statutes* 299K.10. The purpose of the APO authority is to give the Commission a new administrative remedy to seek compliance with the various sections of Title III.

The federal Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1986 (SARA) included the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (Title III). In 1989, Minnesota enacted a state Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (*Minnesota Statutes*, Section 299K) which provides the following authorities to the Minnesota Emergency Response Commission:

- Enforce the federal act;
- Issue, enter into, or enforce orders, schedules of compliance, and stipulation agreements;
- Conduct investigations, issue notices, and hold hearings;
- Examine and copy any records that are related to data required to be submitted to the Commission;
- Enter property to take an authorized action;
- Issue subpoenas; and
- Issue and collect penalties.

The Commission may delegate its authority to state or local governmental agencies or organizations to conduct investigations, examine and copy records, and enter property.

The Minnesota Emergency Response Commission has previously adopted a compliance and enforcement strategy to assure that enforcement actions for violations are arrived at in a fair, uniform, and consistent manner and that the enforcement response is appropriate for the violation committed. The penalty determination process for negotiation of stipulation agreements for violations of Title III is attached as Appendix I.

The remainder of this plan establishes the process by which the Commission will apply administrative penalty orders, the scope of violations which trigger the process, hearing processes related to the orders, and the relationship of APO authority to the stipulation agreement process.

APPLICATION

APO authority applies to all parts of SARA Title III including:

Section 302 - Facilities Storing Extremely Hazardous Substances

Section 303 - Comprehensive Emergency Response Plans

Section 304 - Emergency Notification

Section 311 - Chemical Lists/Hazardous Chemical Report

Section 312 - Chemical Inventory Forms

Section 313 - Toxic Chemical Release Form

ENFORCEMENT CONSISTENCY

In order to ensure consistency in enforcement actions brought under an APO or under a civil action as provided under *Minnesota Statute*, Chapter 299K, the nature, extent, gravity, and circumstances of a violation will be identically defined. This will allow all facts of an action to be acted upon in an identical manner regardless of the type of action.

It is the intention of the Commission to pursue the administrative remedy, an APO, for a violation prior to pursuing a civil action.

Enforcement action will proceed on the basis of a single finding (regarding nature, extent, gravity, and circumstances) from the least stringent forgivable APO through a most stringent civil action.

ENFORCEMENT OBJECTIVES

The following five enforcement objectives guide the development of an enforcement action to resolve violations:

- (1) Penalties should be based on the nature, extent, and gravity of the violation.
- (2) Penalties should be large enough to deter non-compliance and to impose an actual penalty.
- (3) Penalties should be larger than the economic benefit of non-compliance.
- (4) Penalties should be consistent with penalties proposed for similarly situated regulated parties, to the extent possible, in order to provide fair and equitable treatment to the regulated community.
- (5) Penalties should be reviewed from time to time to recognize changing regulatory factors and to ensure that public safety and the environment are fully protected.

RECORDS & DOCUMENTATION

The reports under all sections of SARA Title III which are filed with the Commission, correspondence with a facility or facility representative, and public statements recorded as part of Commission meetings will serve as records and documentation for enforcement actions.

All information in the Commission's possession, except as protected by trade secret provisions of the law, is open and readily accessible to the public and other agencies.

ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY ORDER AUTHORITY

Minnesota Statutes 1992, section 299K.10, Subd. 9., grants the Commission authority to issue administrative penalty orders requiring that violations be corrected and allows for assessment of monetary penalties. The administrative penalty order identifies violations that have been discovered, requires that the violations be corrected, and imposes a penalty that may or may not be forgiven depending on the seriousness or repeated nature of the violation and the response to the order.

The statute provides items to be considered when determining a penalty of up to a total of \$10,000 for a compliance review. Willfulness, gravity, history, number of violations, economic benefit, and other factors are the items which may be considered. For repeat violations, the Commission may also consider similarity to previous violations and the response of the party to the most recent violation. The order must include:

- A statement of fact supporting the claim that violations have occurred,
- A reference to the section of the statute, rule, or order violated,
- The amount of the penalty and the factors used to calculate the amount, and
- A statement of the person's right to review the order.

An expedited hearing process is provided in the event of an appeal.

The administrative penalty order will be issued by the Commission through the Office of the Emergency Response Commission, Department of Public Safety. Notification will be made to all Commission members and the Attorney General when an order is issued.

The penalty proposed in an order to settle an enforcement action will consider the following four factors:

- the "Nature" of the violation,
- the "Extent" of the violation.
- the "Gravity" of the violation, and
- the "Circumstances" of the violation.

Extreme conditions under each factor will be considered serious and will be reflected in the APO. For a serious violation, the Commission may issue an order which is not forgivable. Such an order will require both a corrective action and a penalty.

For violations which are not considered serious, the Commission may issue an order which requires a corrective action and establishes a penalty which may be completely or partially forgiven if compliance with the order is considered adequate. Adequate compliance will be determined by the Commission.

Nature

Nature describes the type of violation or requirement violated. Under this law, there are two basic types of violations: emergency response violations and emergency preparedness/right-to-know violations.

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Emergency response violations are those in which the violator failed to provide proper notification and written follow-up reports after an accidental release of a hazardous substance as required under Section 304 of the federal act.

Emergency preparedness/right-to-know violations include the following:

- Failure to notify the Emergency Response Commission that the facility is subject to the provisions of the Act as required under Section 302.
- Failure to notify the Regional Review Committee (RRC) or Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) of any relevant changes at the facility as required under Section 303(d)(2).
- Failure to provide information to the RRC or LEPC upon request as required under Section 303(d)(3).
- Failure to submit Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDSs) or a list of MSDSs (or failure to include a chemical on the list) to each of the following: the Emergency Response Commission and the fire department with jurisdiction over the facility as required under Section 311(a).
- Failure to submit a MSDS to the RRC or LEPC upon request as required under Section 311(c).
- Failure to submit (or incomplete submission of) Emergency and Hazardous Chemical Inventory Form to each of the following: the Emergency Response Commission and the fire department with jurisdiction over the facility as required under Section 312.
- Failure to provide Tier II information as described in Section 312(d) to a SERC, RRC, LEPC, or fire department upon request as required under Section 312(e).
- Failure to submit (or incomplete submission of) Toxic Chemical Inventory Reporting Form to the Emergency Response Commission as required under Section 313.

Serious Violations:

Examples of the nature of serious violations include:

- Failure to provide proper notification of an accidental release of a hazardous substance.
- Failure to respond to a Commission request regarding reporting compliance.
- Failure to submit a Toxic Chemical Inventory Reporting Form to the Commission under Section 313.

Extent

The extent factor reflects the amount of deviation from the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act and its regulatory requirements. A violation may range from being substantially in compliance with the provisions of the law to being in total disregard of the requirement. In addition, the elements of timeliness and completeness also define the extent of the violation.

Serious Violations:

Examples of the extent of serious violations include:

- Notification to the Commission via the State Duty Officer of the accidental release of a hazardous substance more than two hours after the release.
- Late response to a Commission request regarding reporting compliance.

Gravity

Gravity is determined by the amount of substance involved and the hazards posed by the chemical.

For the purposes of the emergency response violations, gravity is determined by the amount of the substance involved in the violation. CERCLA hazardous substances and Title III extremely hazardous substances have reportable quantities (RQs) that vary depending on the substance, but range from 1 pound to 10,000 pounds. Reportable quantities were established for hazardous substances to indicate an amount, which if exceeded in a release, would require immediate notification to the proper governmental authorities.

For the purposes of emergency preparedness/right-to-know violations, the number and/or amount of the chemical(s) in excess of the reporting threshold present at the facility forms the basis for determining gravity of non-reporting.

For Sections 311 and 312, the reporting threshold for extremely hazardous substances (EHSs) is 500 pounds or the EHS-specific threshold planning quantity (TPQ), whichever is less. For other hazardous chemicals, the reporting threshold is 10,000 pounds. In addition, hazards posed by the chemicals are also considered in assessing the gravity of Sections 311 and 312 violations for non-reporting.

For Section 313, the reporting threshold is 10,000 pounds or 25,000 pounds depending on how the toxic chemical is used at the facility. The number and amount of the toxic chemical(s) in excess of the reporting threshold that were not reported as well as the amount of releases of those toxic chemicals to the environment provide the basis for determining gravity.

Serious Violations:

Examples of the gravity of serious violations include:

- Failure or late reporting of an accidental release of a hazardous substance in excess of five times the reportable quantity.
- Failure or late reporting of an accidental release of a hazardous substance which causes injury, death, or severe environmental damage.
- Knowing failure to report storage of an EHS at a facility under Section 302.

Circumstances

Circumstances refer to the potential consequences of the violation, in addition to ability to pay, prior history of violation, and degree of culpability. In determining the potential consequences of the violation, consideration may be given to the relative proximity of the surrounding population, to the effect the non-compliance has on the ability to plan for a chemical emergency, and any problems that first responders and emergency managers would encounter because of the failure to notify or submit reports in a timely manner. Other circumstances include the following.

• **History of recalcitrance.** A history of recalcitrance may increase a penalty. Such historical factors include past violations, bad faith, unjustified delay in responding to violations, failure to provide timely and full information, and violation of prior stipulation agreements or compliance orders.

• **Culpability.** The intent or carelessness of the violator may be considered as an upward adjustment to the amount of a penalty. A knowing or willful violation, for example, should result in the penalty being adjusted upward.

• **Response to Violation.** The degree to which the violator responded when the violator learned of the violation is a consideration. Cooperation throughout the process is expected of the violator. Extremely cooperative violators, who respond quickly and fully to eliminate or mitigate a violation, may have their civil penalties reduced, while uncooperative violators may have their civil penalties adjusted upward. On the other hand, alleged violators who fairly exercise their rights in disputing violations will not be penalized.

• **Deterrence.** Consideration will be given to ensuring that the civil penalty is sufficient to deter future non-compliance.

• **Ability-to-Pay.** The financial status of the violator may be considered in establishing a civil penalty. Penalties may be paid in installments if the violator supplies information to the Commission demonstrating severe financial consequences would result from a one time, lump sum payment.

• **Litigation.** Litigation is expensive and time-consuming. The likelihood of success on the merits in court and the amount of time and expense involved in litigating the case may be considered in adjusting a proposed civil penalty.

• **Other factors.** In any case there may be unique factors that lead to a conclusion that a civil penalty should be adjusted up or down. There is a reservation of the right to rely on other factors to adjust a penalty. In each case these factors will be identified and the appropriate adjustment made.

Serious Violations:

Examples of the circumstances of serious violations include:

- Failure to respond to a Commission request regarding compliance with reporting requirements or an order.
- Knowing failure to report under any section of the law in order to avoid fees.

This penalty determination document recognizes that adjustments to a civil penalty may be appropriate; this document does not establish the amount of any adjustment. The amount of any adjustment will be determined on a case-by-case basis.

COMPLIANCE DETERMINATION

Following the response of a party to an administrative penalty order, the Commission shall review and evaluate all information related to an order to determine if the violation has been corrected. This determination may be made by examining documentation, site-visits, or other means. The Commission will notify the regulated party of the compliance determination.

Except for serious violations, if a violation has been corrected or an acceptable plan for correction has been submitted to the Commission, the penalty must be forgiven.

• Within 31 days, the regulated party must provide information to the Commission demonstrating that the violation has been corrected or appropriate steps have been taken to correct the violation.

• The Commission will review all information and determine whether a violation has been corrected and provide notice to the regulated party of the violation status and penalty status within 10 working days after receipt of the information.

• If the regulated party is determined to have complied with the order in a timely manner, the penalty will be forgiven.

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PENALTY PAYMENT

Unless the regulated party requests an expedited administrative hearing to review the order, the penalty is due on the 31st day after the order was received if:

- The party fails to provide information that demonstrates the violation has been corrected, or
- The party has not taken appropriate steps to correct the violation.

If the information submitted to the Commission is determined insufficient to show that the violation has been corrected or appropriate steps have been taken to correct the violation, the penalty is due on the 20th day after the regulated party receives this determination.

Interest at the rate established by the state court administrator pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes*, section 549.09 begins to accrue on penalties on the 31st day after the order was received by the regulated party.

HEARING REQUESTS

The recipient of an administrative penalty order has the right to request a review of the order and the factors upon which it is based. The Commission will provide two forums for review; order review conferences and expedited hearings.

Order Review Conference

An order review conference is intended to provide the recipient of an order the opportunity to meet with the Commission to discuss an order and findings which lead to the order. This discussion may take place as part of a regularly scheduled Commission meeting, an item of business for an Executive Committee meeting, or between the recipient and Commission staff. The choice of the format for the review will be made by the recipient and arranged by Commission staff. The outcome of an order review conference will be considered binding by all parties. However, by participating in a conference, the recipient of an order does not forfeit their right to an expedited hearing.

The Commission views an order review conference as a timely and efficient method to resolve issues surrounding an order. The Commission encourages recipients to pursue a conference rather than a hearing to resolve disputes about an order.

The request for a conference must be made by the following deadlines:

- The recipient of an administrative penalty order who failed to provide information showing the violation has been corrected or has submitted a corrective plan has 30 days from receipt of the administrative penalty order to request an order review conference.
- A recipient of an administrative penalty order who provides documentation showing the violation has been corrected or submits a corrective plan and receives notice that the Commission has determined that a violation has not been corrected or an appropriate plan has not been approved, has 20 days after receipt of that notice to request a conference.

An order review conference will be held within 31 days of receipt of the request for a conference by Commission staff. Commission staff will initiate discussions to arrange a conference with the requesting party within seven days of receipt of the request.

If the recipient of an order requests an order review conference and desires to request a hearing after completion of the conference process, the date of completion of the conference process will be considered the date of receipt of the order for initiation of the expedited hearing process.

Expedited Hearing

The recipient of an administrative penalty order has the right to challenge the order by requesting an expedited administrative hearing. There are two alternative deadlines for requesting a hearing as described in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 144.991, subdivision 5.

- The recipient of an administrative penalty order who failed to provide information showing the violation has been corrected or has submitted a corrective plan has 30 days from receipt of the administrative penalty order to request an expedited administrative hearing.
- A recipient of an administrative penalty order who provides documentation showing the violation has been corrected or submits a corrective plan who receives notice that the Commission has determined that a violation has not been corrected or an appropriate plan has not been approved, has 20 days after receipt of that notice to request a hearing.

In any hearing request, the recipient of the administrative penalty order must specifically state the reasons for requesting the hearing. If the recipient does not respond to the administrative penalty order, Commission staff may contact the recipient before the end of the 30-day compliance period to determine the recipient's intentions.

Procedural timelines for the hearing process are set out in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 144.991, subdivision 5. The hearing must be held within 30 days after the recipient of an administrative penalty order files a hearing request with the Commission, unless all parties agree to a later date. The Commission must notify the recipient of the time and place of the hearing at least 20 days before the hearing.

The hearing will be conducted by an administrative law judge from the Office of Administrative Hearings. The procedures for the conduct of the hearing are set out in *Minnesota Rules*, parts 1400.8510 to 1400.8612, as modified by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 144.991.

At the hearing, both parties will have an opportunity to present evidence. Any party wishing to submit written arguments to the administrative law judge must do so within ten days after the end of the hearing. The administrative law judge must issue a report making recommendations to the Commission within 30 days after the close of the hearing record. After the Commission receives the administrative judge's report, the recipient of the administrative penalty order has five days in which to submit comments for consideration by the Commission before the Commission issues a final administrative penalty order. If the administrative law judge makes a finding that the hearing was requested solely for purposes of delay or that the hearing request was frivolous, the Commission may add to the amount of the penalty the costs charged to the agency by the office of administrative hearings for the hearing.

The recipient of the final administrative penalty order may appeal it to the Minnesota Court of Appeals. If the recipient does not appeal a final administrative penalty order to the Minnesota Court of Appeals, or the order is reviewed and upheld, then the recipient must pay the amount of the penalty plus interest accruing from 31 days after the recipient received the original administrative penalty order.

Mediation; Collection; District Court Petition

In addition to review of a penalty assessment by the office of administrative hearings on these proceedings, the Commission may enter into mediation.

The Attorney General may enforce penalties that are due and payable in any manner provided by law for the collection of debts and may bring a civil action in district court seeking payment of the penalties, injunctive or other appropriate relief including monetary damages, attorney fees, costs and interest.

The Attorney General may petition the district court to file the administrative penalty order as an order of the court. At any court hearing the only issue the parties may contest are procedural and notice issues. Once entered, the administrative penalty order may be enforced in the same manner as a final judgment of the district court. In any judicial action brought by the attorney general, if the state finally prevails and if the proven violation was willful, the state may be allowed an amount determined by the court to be the reasonable value of all or part of the litigation expenses incurred by the state. In determining the amount the court shall give consideration, in addition to other penalties to the economic circumstances of the defendant.

CIVIL PENALTY

In order to take enforcement action for a violation, the Commission may also pursue a civil penalty. It is the intention of the Commission to pursue a civil penalty only in cases where an administrative penalty order will not provide a great enough deterrent.

The civil penalty specified in a stipulation agreement will be based on the nature, extent, and gravity of the violation adjusted according to the circumstances of the violation. The proposed penalty amounts may be negotiated by the director of the Emergency Response Commission and, in appropriate cases, the Attorney General's Office, but all stipulation agreements are subject to approval by the Emergency Response Commission. If a stipulation agreement is not agreed to, the Emergency Response Commission is not bound by the penalty specified in the stipulation agreement. The Commission may seek court costs and attorney fees in a civil judicial action. Settlements that occur after litigation has commenced may include the reasonable value of all or part of litigation expenses incurred by the State, if violations are willful.

CRIMINAL PROSECUTIONS

Knowing failure to report the release of a hazardous substance under U.S. Code, title 42, section 9603 or an extremely hazardous substance under U.S. Code, title 42, section 11004 is a criminal offense. Nothing in this document is intended to preclude the appropriate governmental entity, such as the county attorney, from commencing a criminal prosecution for violation of environmental laws. Any settlement of civil enforcement actions will be made without any prejudice to a possible criminal prosecution.

PLAN REVISION

This plan shall be evaluated as necessary and at least every two years. If modification is warranted, public notice that the plan has been modified shall be made.

FINALIZATION OF PLAN; ADOPTION

EMERGENCY RESPONSE COMMISSION PENALTY DETERMINATION PROCESS FOR NEGOTIATIONS OF STIPULATION AGREEMENTS FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE EMERGENCY PLANNING AND COMMUNITY RIGHT-TO-KNOW ACT

I. INTRODUCTION

The federal Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1986 (SARA) created the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (Title III). In 1989, Minnesota enacted a state Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (*Minnesota Statutes*, Section 299K) which provides the following authorities to the Minnesota Emergency Response Commission:

- Enforce the federal act;
- Issue, enter into, or enforce orders, schedules of compliance, and stipulation agreements;
- Conduct investigations, issue notices, and hold hearings;
- Examine and copy any records that are related to data required to be submitted to the Commission;
- Enter property to take an authorized action;
- Issue subpoenas; and
- Penalties.

The Commission may delegate its authority to state or local governmental agencies or organizations to conduct investigations, examine and copy records, and enter property.

The Minnesota Emergency Response Commission has adopted a compliance and enforcement strategy to assure that enforcement actions for violations are arrived at in a fair, uniform, and consistent manner and that the enforcement response is appropriate for the violation committed. The strategy includes sending an informational letter when there is a question about whether a company is subject to the Title III requirements, issuing a compliance order, proposing a stipulation agreement, and filing a civil judicial action. The purpose of this document is to describe the factors utilized in proposing a penalty in stipulation agreements.

This penalty determination document is not intended, and cannot be relied upon, to create any rights, substantive or procedural, that can be enforced in litigation or any administrative proceeding with the State of Minnesota. The Commission and the Attorney General reserve the right to act at variance with the process outlined in this document, and to change the process at any time or to commence litigation without prior initiation of settlement discussions based upon applicable law and relevant facts of a specific case.

Moreover, this penalty determination document is not binding upon the Emergency Response Commission in passing upon any settlement proposed in an enforcement action. The Emergency Response Commission reserves its full rights as final decisionmaker to reject or modify any proposed settlement recommended in the stipulation agreement.

Nothing in this document shall be construed to restrict any action that may be taken by the Emergency Response Commission or the Attorney General, on behalf of the State of Minnesota, in any litigation. If no settlement is reached, the Emergency Response Commission and the Attorney General maintain their full rights under the law to seek appropriate civil penalties or other available remedies in a court of law having competent jurisdiction. The penalty determination process outlined in this document is applicable only to settlement through the stipulation agreement.

This document is intended to only describe the internal process utilized to develop stipulated settlements voluntarily agreed to by regulated parties. It is consistent with the general penalty guidelines of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the process followed by the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency for violations of Minnesota environmental laws.

II. ENFORCEMENT OBJECTIVES

The following five enforcement objectives guide the development of a civil penalty to resolve violations:

- (1) Penalties should be based on the nature, extent, and gravity of the violation.
- (2) Penalties should be large enough to deter non-compliance and to impose an actual penalty.
- (3) Penalties should be larger than the economic benefit of non-compliance.
- (4) Penalties should be consistent with penalties proposed for similarly situated regulated parties, to the extent possible, in order to provide fair and equitable treatment to the regulated community.
- (5) Penalties should be reviewed from time to time to recognize changing regulatory factors and to ensure that the environment is fully protected.

III. PENALTY CALCULATION METHODOLOGY

The penalty proposed in the stipulation agreement to settle an enforcement action will consider the following four factors:

- the "Nature" of the violation,
- the "Extent" of the violation.
- the "Gravity" of the violation, and
- the "Circumstances" of the violation.

A. Nature

Nature describes the type of violation or requirement violated. Under this law, there are two basic types of violations: emergency response violations and emergency preparedness/right-to-know violations. Emergency response violations are those in which the violator failed to provide proper notification and written follow-up reports after an accidental release of a hazardous substance as required under Section 304 of the federal act. Emergency preparedness/right-to-know violations include the following:

- Failure to notify the Emergency Response Commission that the facility is subject to the provisions of the Act as required under Section 302.
- Failure to notify the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) of any relevant changes at the facility as required under Section 303(d)(2).
- Failure to provide information to the LEPC upon request as required under Section 303(d)(3).
- Failure to submit Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDSs) or a list of MSDSs (or failure to include a chemical on the list) to each of the following: the Emergency Response Commission and the fire department with jurisdiction over the facility as required under Section 311(a).
- Failure to submit a MSDS to the LEPC upon request as required under Section 311(c).
- Failure to submit (or incomplete submission of) Emergency and Hazardous Chemical Inventory Form to each of the following: the Emergency Response Commission and the fire department with jurisdiction over the facility as required under Section 312.
- Failure to provide Tier II information as described in Section 312(d) to a SERC, LEPC, or fire department upon request as required under Section 312(e).
- Failure to submit (or incomplete submission of) Toxic Chemical Inventory Reporting Form to the Emergency Planning Commission as required under Section 313.

In the Compliance and Enforcement Strategy adopted by the Emergency Response Commission, the Commission has considered failure to report under Sections 304 and 313 to be particularly serious violations.

B. Extent

The extent factor reflects the amount of deviation from the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act and its regulatory requirements. A violation may range from being substantially in compliance with the provisions of the law to being in total disregard of the requirement. In addition, the elements of timeliness and completeness also define the extent of the violation.

C. Gravity

Gravity is determined by the amount of substance involved and the hazards posed by the chemical. For the purposes of the emergency response violations, gravity is determined by the amount of the substance involved in the violation. CERCLA hazardous substances and Title III extremely hazardous substances have reportable quantities (RQs) that vary depending on the substance, but range from 1 pound to 10,000 pounds. Reportable quantities were established for hazardous substances to indicate an amount, which if exceeded in a release, would require immediate notification to the proper governmental authorities. The RQ scale itself is a relative measure of the hazards posed by the chemical and therefore the potential threat to human health and the environment; the lower the RQ, the greater the potential threat to human health and the environment. The greater the amount released over the RQ, the greater the potential for the need for immediate notification.

For the purposes of emergency preparedness/right-to-know violations, the number and/or amount of the chemical(s) in excess of the reporting threshold present at the facility forms the basis for determining gravity. For Sections 311 and 312, the reporting threshold for extremely hazardous substances (EHSs) is 500 pounds or the EHS-specific threshold planning quantity (TPQ), whichever is less. For other hazardous chemicals, the reporting threshold is 10,000 pounds. In addition, hazards posed by the chemicals are also considered in assessing the gravity of Sections 311 and 312 violations. For Section 313, the reporting threshold is 10,000 pounds or 25,000 pounds depending on how the toxic chemical is used at the facility. The number and amount of the toxic chemical(s) in excess of the reporting threshold as well as the amount of releases of those toxic chemicals to the environment provide the basis for determining gravity.

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D. Circumstances

Circumstances refer to the potential consequences of the violation, in addition to ability to pay, prior history of violation, and degree of culpability. In determining the potential consequences of the violation, consideration may be given to the relative proximity of the surrounding population, to the effect the non-compliance has on the ability to plan for a chemical emergency, and any problems that first responders and emergency managers would encounter because of the failure to notify or submit reports in a timely manner. Other circumstances include the following.

- History of recalcitrance. A history of recalcitrance may increase a penalty. Such historical factors include past violations, bad faith, unjustified delay in responding to violations, failure to provide timely and full information, and violation of prior stipulation agreements or compliance orders.

Settlements that occur after litigation has commenced may include the reasonable value of all or part of litigation expenses incurred by the State, if violations are willful.

According to Minn. Stat. of 1984, §§14.29-14.30, state agencies may propose adoption of emergency rules if: 1) expressly required; 2) authorized by statute; or 3) if the manner permitted by a directive (given by statute, federal law or court order) does not allow for compliance with sections 14.14-14.28. The agency must, however, publish a notice of intent to adopt emergency rules, along with the rules themselves, in the *State Register*. The notice must advise the public:

- 1) that a free copy of the proposed emergency rule is available upon request from the agency;
- 2) that notice of the date that the rule is submitted to the attorney general will be mailed to persons requesting notification;
- 3) that the public has at least 25 days after publication of the proposed emergency rule to submit data and views in writing; and
- 4) that the emergency rule may be modified if the data and views submitted support such modification.

Adopted Emergency Rules

Emergency rules take effect five working days after approval by the attorney general, and after compliance with Minn. Stat. §§14.29-14.365. As soon as possible, emergency rules are published in the *State Register* in the manner provided for in section 14.18.

Emergency rules are effective for the period stated in the notice of intent to adopt emergency rules. This may not exceed 180 days.

Continued/Extended Emergency Rules

Adopted emergency rules may be continued in effect (extended) for an additional 180 days. To do this, the agency must give notice by: 1) publishing notice in the *State Register*; and 2) mailing the same notice to all persons who requested notification on rulemaking. Revenue Notices

The Department of Revenue began issuing revenue notices in July of 1991. Revenue notices are statements of policy made by the department that provide interpretation, detail, or supplementary information concerning a particular statute, rule, or departmental practice. The authority to issue revenue notices is found in *Minnesota Statutes* § 270.0604.

Department of Revenue

Revenue Notice #93-20: Individual Income Tax—Abatement of Late Filing Penalty for Individuals Who Have an Extension for More Than Six Months to File Their Federal Income Tax Return

Minnesota Statutes § 289A.60, subdivision 2 imposes a late filing penalty of ten percent of the unpaid tax on individual income tax returns filed more than six months past the due date of the return. There is no late filing penalty if the return is filed within the first six months after the due date.

This statutory six month grace period is meant to coincide with the maximum allowable period for extending a federal income tax return. As long as the Minnesota return is filed within the six month period, there is no late filing penalty, regardless of whether the taxpayer actually obtained a federal extension.

Under the United States Tax Code, in virtually all circumstances, the maximum allowable extension to file an individual income tax return is six months. However, in rare circumstances, ordinarily involving military personnel or taxpayers living abroad, the due date for filing the federal individual income tax return may be extended for longer than six months.

In those instances the Department of Revenue will not assess the late filing penalty as long as the Minnesota return is filed by the federal extended due date and the taxpayer documents entitlement to the federal extension as part of the Minnesota return. Taxpayers should attach a short letter of explanation to the front of their Minnesota return, along with a copy of their approved federal extension request (or other proof of entitlement to the federal extension).

The penalty will be assessed against those taxpayers who fail to follow this procedure. However, the Department will grant timely filed abatement requests if the taxpayer provides the above mentioned documentation after notice of assessment of the penalty.

The Minnesota Department of Corrections, Community Services Division, announces the availability of funds for development of intensive community supervision projects. Development of a Five-Year Business Strategic Plan

1. Overview

The Public Employees Retirement Association of the State of Minnesota (PERA) is a multi-employer pension fund serving approximately 155,000 active members and beneficiaries and 2,200 governmental subdivision units in the State as defined by *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 353. PERA is a state agency and has been operational since 1931. The agency is administered by an Executive Director who is responsible to a policy setting ten-member Board of Trustees. The agency employs 70 full-time staff and extensively utilizes in-house mainframe computer based information systems to record and maintain membership records and to process monthly annuity and benefit payments. PERA operates and maintains its own Data Processing facility independent of the State's Data Processing operation.

PERA's current computer technology and information systems have been operating since the early 1980s. In the past 12 years, PERA's business processes and information systems have undergone significant change to accommodate ongoing legislative changes, increases in service programs, and expanded use of technology. A high-level examination of the organization's administrative operations indicated PERA is being constrained in its efforts to be responsive and efficient by outdated technology and complex process methods and procedures. To begin the process of transforming the organization's operations to meet the challenges of the 1990s, PERA's Board of Trustees and management staff would like to contract the services of a consulting firm to assist them in developing a five-year business strategic plan.

Pursuant to the *Laws of Minnesota 1991*, Chapter 345, the Commission on Reform and Efficiency (CORE) organized and established a vision for Minnesota state government that states, government should be "mission driven, oriented toward quality outcomes, efficient, responsive to clients, and respectful of all stakeholders." PERA's management staff and board members believe in the value of the CORE vision and are committed to accomplishing the vision by integrating total quality management (TQM) philosophies and practices

into PERA's business operations. For this reason, PERA is seeking to contract with a consulting firm that has experienced professionals who can provide quality management leadership, training, and a proven methodology for developing an quality-driven business strategic plan.

2. Scope of Project

The general the scope of this project is to develop a written five-year business plan that establishes clearly defined business goals, objectives, and quality measurement indicators to guide PERA's operations transformation and quality management efforts during the next 5 years.

For the purposes of this project, a "business strategic plan" will include the formation and documentation of (1) vision and mission statements, (2) clearly defined and prioritized business objectives to accomplish the vision, (3) factors to measure quality achievement and (4) a strategic plan for developing a technology infrastructure to support the stated business objectives.

The process for developing the Plan must involve PERA's external customers, stakeholders, and internal customers (employees) as participants in establishing an external customer-focused direction for the organization. The outcome must be an evolving multi-year plan that all employees can support and help implement.

A Strategic Planning Team, consisting of approximately 11 PERA employees representing all divisions and levels of the organization, will perform the strategic planning project tasks with guidance from a contracted consulting firm. Project team participants will have received some basic training related to quality management values and practices prior to beginning the project. It is expected that the project team members will need additional training in the application of quality management principles and methods to be effective in their strategic planning efforts. Training services will be provided by the contracted consulting firm to ensure the project team members receive the appropriate training.

3. Goal and Objective

The objective of this consulting contract is to obtain support services from experienced professionals to guide PERA in developing a business strategic plan. The goal of PERA's strategic planning effort is to decide business objectives based on an external customer perception of quality rather than an internal process and technology driven need. The strategic planning approach used by the consultant should establish a foundation for PERA to integrate quality management principles into its ongoing operations.

4. Contract Requirements

This project will require the consulting firm to perform the following services:

- A. Assist the project team in refining the project tasks, objectives, deliverables, resource requirements, and work plan schedule.
- B. Provide leadership and training to guide PERA's Strategic Planning Team in making the transition to quality management strategic thinking and in learning how to apply quality management principles and techniques during the strategic planning process.
- C. Guide the project team in developing an effective project communications plan.
- D. Provide tools and methods to conduct a quality review process to measure customer satisfaction and to determine opportunities for improving service quality.
- E. Conduct 2-3 focus group meetings with PERA employees and PERA stakeholders to determine the requirements of stakeholders in meeting PERA customer needs.
- F. Guide the team in refining PERA's vision and mission statements.
- G. Review findings from previous assessments of PERA's culture and business operations and direct the project team in conducting further evaluations that may be needed.
- H. Provide the methods, tools, and expertise to assist the project team in translating study findings into clearly stated 5-year business strategic objectives.
- I. Conduct an assessment of PERA's current technology infrastructure and recommend a technology infrastructure and a migration plan needed to achieve the stated business objectives.
- J. Prepare drafts and the final Business Strategic Plan document, or guide the project team in preparing the documented plan.
- K. When required, participate in presenting overviews of the strategic planning activities and outcomes to PERA employees and Board of Trustees.

5. Completion Date

A contract is expected to be awarded by December 15, 1993. PERA's executive staff must present a proposed operations plan and administrative budget plan for fiscal year 1994-95 to the PERA Board Finance Committee in May 1994. It is expected that PERA's business strategic planning efforts will identify some significant changes that will require additional resources that must be planned for in the proposed budget plan. Therefore, respondent's should recommend a work plan that will anticipate a draft of the strategic

plan document being completed by May 1, 1994 and the final plan document being completed by June 1, 1994.

6. Proposal Contents

The following will be considered as the minimally required content of a respondent's proposal.

A. A restatement of the objectives, goals and tasks to show or demonstrate the respondent's understanding of the services requested under the contract.

B. Presentation of a feasible project strategy that details the tasks referenced in Contract Requirements, item 4. 10. Affirmative Action

D. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices in a form to be prescribed by the Commissioner of the Minnesota Department of Human Rights. Such notices shall state the contractor's obligations under the law to take affirmative action to employ and advance in employment qualified disabled employees and applicants for employment, and the rights of applicants and employees.

E. The contractor shall notify each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract of understanding, that the contractor is bound by the terms of *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 363.073 of the Minnesota Human Rights Act and is committed to take affirmative action to employ and advance in employment physically and mentally disabled individuals.

11. Workers' Compensation
