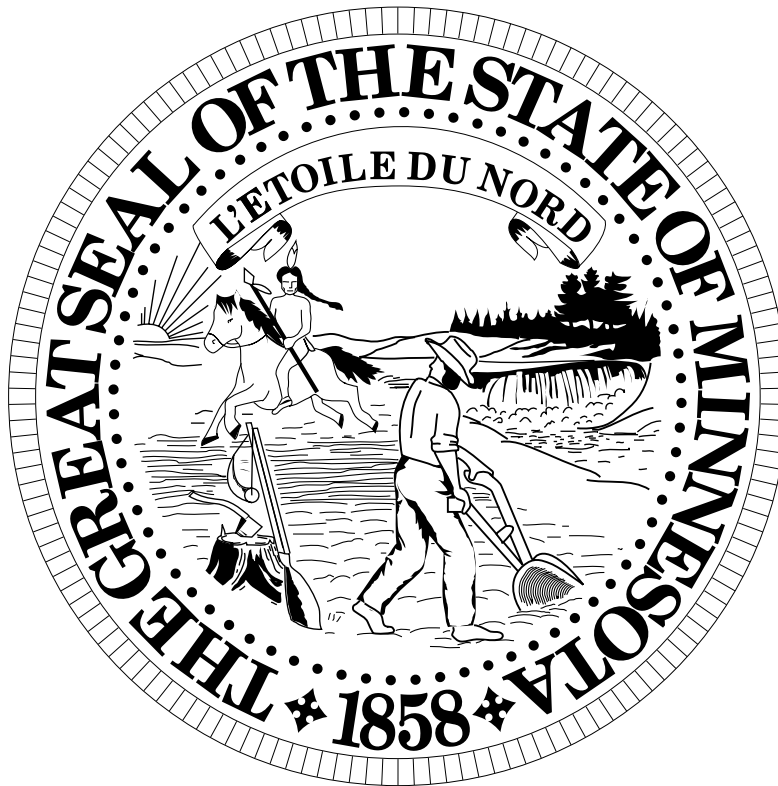

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An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the most current edition of the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive; issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26; issues #27-38 inclusive; issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39; issues #40-51 inclusive; and issues #1-52 (or 53 in some years), cumulative for issues #1-52 (or 53). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. Proposed Rules

Comments on Planned Rules or Rule Amendments

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

Rules to be Adopted After a Hearing

After receiving comments and deciding to hold a public hearing on the rule, an agency drafts its rule. It then publishes its rules with a notice of hearing. All persons wishing to make a statement must register at the hearing. Anyone who wishes to submit written comments may do so at the hearing, or within five working days of the close of the hearing. Administrative law judges may, during the hearing, extend the period for receiving comments up to 20 calendar days. For five business days after the submission period the agency and interested persons may respond to any new information submitted during the written submission period and the record then is closed. The administrative law judge prepares a report within 30 days, stating findings of fact, conclusions and recommendations. After receiving the report, the agency decides whether to adopt, withdraw or modify the proposed rule based on consideration of the comments made during the rule hearing procedure and the report of the administrative law judge. The agency must wait five days after receiving the report before taking any action.

Rules to be Adopted Without a Hearing

Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* § 14.22, an agency may propose to adopt, amend, suspend or repeal rules without first holding a public hearing. An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public. The agency then publishes a notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing, together with the proposed rules, in the *State Register*. If, during the 30-day comment period, 25 or more persons submit to the agency a written request for a hearing of the proposed rules, the agency must proceed under the provisions of §§ 14.14-14.20, which state that if an agency decides to hold a public hearing, it must publish a notice of intent in the *State Register*.

NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT RULES WITHOUT A PUBLIC HEARING

Proposed Amendment to Rules Governing the Crime Victims Reparations Board, *Minnesota Rules*, parts 3050.0100, 3050.2800, 3050.3200, 3050.3400, 3050.3500, 3050.3600, 3050.3700, and 3050.3900

Introduction. The Department of Public Safety intends to adopt rules without a public hearing following the procedures set forth in the Administrative Procedures Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.22 to 14.28, and rules of the Office of Administrative Hearings, *Minnesota Rules*, parts 1400.2300 to 1400.2310. You have 30 days to submit written comments on the proposed rules and may also submit a written request that a hearing be held on the rules.

Agency Contact Person. Comments or questions on the rules and written requests for a public hearing on the rules must be submitted to the agency contact person. Subject of Rules and Statutory Authority. The proposed rules amendments are about claims procedures and eligibility for reparations. The statutory authority to adopt the rules is *Minnesota Statutes*, section 611A.56, subdivision 1, paragraph (b). The proposed amendments are described as follows:

- *Minnesota Rule*, part 3050.0100 **Definitions.** The amendment includes a revised definition of “family members” to make the new rules easier to understand and interpret. It also includes a definition of “domestic partner” which has been contained in the Board’s policies and procedures for several years, but is not currently in the rules.
- *Minnesota Rule*, part 3050.2800 **Board Determination of Reasonableness.** The amendment provides that the board may use the services of outside consultants to assist in determining the reasonableness of accessibility remodeling, and requires that such projects be approved by the board prior to payment.
- *Minnesota Rule*, part 3050.3200 **Loss of Income, subpart 7. Parent and Spouse of the Deceased.** The amendment expands reparations coverage for lost wages to include up to one week of lost income for other family members, ie. adult children or siblings, of homicide victims. The amendment also clarifies that coverage for lost wages includes domestic partners because that has been the Board’s policy and procedure for several years.
- *Minnesota Rule*, part 3050.3400 **Secondary Victims.** The amendment to Subpart 1. clarifies the definition of victim to include domestic partner and family members of the victim, so that the rule is easier to understand and interpret. The amendment to Subp. 2. allows the Board to award payment for additional counseling sessions for secondary victims if the

board finds that there is credible medical evidence showing that the victim may suffer serious, life-threatening emotional injury without additional mental health treatment.

- *Minnesota Rule* part 3050.3500 **Family Members of Injured Victims.** The amendment adds coverage for lost wages, and transportation and lodging expenses, up to \$2000, for other family members, ie. the spouse or children, of an injured victim.
- *Minnesota Rule* part 3050.3600 **Household Services.** The amendment clarifies that household members means persons who are presently residing together.
- *Minnesota Rule*, part 3050.3700 **Cost Ceiling on Hospital and Physician Expenses.** The amendment requires the Board to compensate the claimant in full if the claimant has paid hospital or physician expenses.
- *Minnesota Rule*, part 3050.3900 **Maximum Payment for Sexual Assault Evidentiary Exam.** The amendment allows the Board to adjust the maximum allowable payment for a sexual assault evidentiary exam on an annual basis.

A copy of the proposed rules is published in the *State Register*. A free copy of the rules is available upon request from the agency contact person listed above. You may also download a free copy of the rules by accessing the Minnesota Center for Crime Victim Services homepage from the Department of Public Safety's **website**: www.dps.state.mn.us

Comments. You have until 4:30 p.m. on December 18, 2000, to submit written comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed rules and any part or subpart of the rules. Your comment must be in writing and received by the agency contact person by the due date. Comment is encouraged. Your comment should identify the portion of the proposed rules addressed and the reason for the comment. You are encouraged to propose any change desired. Any comments that you would like to make on the legality of the proposed rules must also be made during this comment period.

Request for a Hearing. In addition to submitting comments, you may also request that a hearing be held on the rules. Your request for a public hearing must be in writing and must be received by the agency contact person by 4:30 p.m. on December 18, 2000. Your written request for a public hearing must include your name and address. You must identify the portion of the proposed rules to which you object or state that you oppose the entire set of rules. Any request that does not comply with these requirements is not valid and cannot be counted by the agency for determining whether a public hearing must be held. You are also encouraged to state the reason for the request and any changes you want made to the proposed rules.

Withdrawal of Requests. If 25 or more persons submit a written request for a hearing, a public hearing will be held unless a sufficient number withdraw their requests in writing. If enough requests for hearing are withdrawn to reduce the number below 25, the agency must give written notice of this to all persons who requested a hearing, explain the actions the agency took to effect the withdrawal, and ask for written comments on this action. If a public hearing is required, the agency will follow the procedures in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20.

Alternative Format. Upon request, this Notice can be made available in an alternative format, such as large print, Braille, or cassette tape. To make such a request, please contact the agency contact person at the address or telephone number listed above.

Modifications. The proposed rules may be modified as a result of public comment. The modifications must be supported by comments and information submitted to the agency, and the adopted rules may not be substantially different than these proposed rules. If the proposed rules affect you in any way, you are encouraged to participate in the rulemaking process.

Statement of Need and Reasonableness. A statement of need and reasonableness is now available from the agency contact person. This statement contains a summary of the justification for the proposed rules, including a description of who will be affected by the proposed rules and an estimate of the probable cost of the proposed rules. Copies of the statement may be obtained at the cost of reproduction from the agency.

Adoption and Review of Rules. If no hearing is required, the agency may adopt the rules after the end of the comment period. The rules and supporting documents will then be submitted to the Office of Administrative Hearings for review for legality. You may ask to be notified of the date the rules are submitted to the office. If you want to be so notified, or want to receive a copy of the adopted rules, or want to register with the agency to receive notice of future rule proceedings, submit your request to the agency contact person listed above.

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Proposed Rules

3050.0100 DEFINITIONS.

[For text of subps 1 to 2, see M.R.]

Subp. 2a. Domestic partner. “Domestic partner” means a person who was in a relationship with the victim of substantial duration with an exclusive mutual commitment similar to that of marriage and who was residing with the victim at the time of the crime.

[For text of subps 3 to 6, see M.R.]

Subp. 7. Family or household members. “Family or household members” means spouses, ~~former spouses or domestic partners,~~ parents, children, grandparents, and siblings, ~~persons who are presently residing together, and persons who have a child in common regardless of whether they have been married or have lived together at any time.~~

3050.2800 BOARD DETERMINATION OF REASONABLENESS.

[For text of subps 1 and 2, see M.R.]

Subp. 3. Accessibility remodeling. The board may use the services of outside consultants to assist in determining the reasonableness of remodeling to improve the accessibility of a living space for an injured victim. Accessibility remodeling projects must be approved by the board prior to payment.

3050.3200 LOSS OF INCOME.

[For text of subps 1 to 6, see M.R.]

Subp. 7. Parent and spouse Family members of deceased. Payment of wage loss compensation for a parent ~~or~~ spouse, or domestic partner of a victim who died as the direct result of a crime usually may not exceed six weeks. If the emotional disability of the parent or spouse continues past six weeks, the parent or spouse may make a request for an extension of the lost wages. The request must include an evaluation by a physician or psychologist stating that there is a continuing emotional disability due to the crime and a date by which the claimant is expected to return to work. The extension may not exceed 46 weeks. Payment of wage loss compensation for other family members of a victim who died as the direct result of a crime may not exceed one week. No extension of lost wages for other family members is allowed, unless there are extraordinary circumstances where the limit imposes undue hardship on the secondary victim.

3050.3400 SECONDARY VICTIMS.

Subpart 1. Victim, definition. For the purposes of this chapter, the term “victim” includes, in addition to those meanings specifically provided in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 611A.52, the following:

- A. a parent, spouse, domestic partner, or minor child of a victim who died as the direct result of a crime;
- B. a witness to a violent crime who suffered physical or emotional injury. Payment for a witness is limited to 20 counseling sessions;
- C. ~~a grandparent, sibling, or adult child family members, other than those listed in item A,~~ of a victim who died as the direct result of a crime, if the ~~grandparent, sibling, or child family member~~ has suffered emotional injury. Payment for ~~a grandparent, sibling, or adult child family members, other than those listed in item A,~~ is limited to 20 counseling sessions;
- D. a person who discovered the body of a victim who died as the direct result of a crime, if the person has suffered emotional injury. Payment for a person who discovered a body is limited to 20 counseling sessions; and
- E. a ~~spouse family member~~ of a victim who was injured as a direct result of a crime. Payment for a ~~spouse family member~~ of an injured victim is limited to 20 counseling sessions.

Subp. 2. Counseling; discretionary award. The board may award payment for additional counseling beyond 20 sessions for a secondary victim if the board finds that there is credible medical evidence showing that the victim may suffer serious, life-threatening emotional injury without additional mental health treatment.

3050.3500 PARENTS FAMILY MEMBERS OF INJURED VICTIMS.

The board shall authorize payment for up to 20 counseling sessions for a ~~parent who is a primary caretaker family member of a an~~ injured victim ~~who was injured as a direct result of a crime,~~ if the treatment plan filed under and complying with part 3050.2700 indicates that the sessions directly benefit the victim.

When care is needed by a victim and when a determination is made by the board that a ~~parent or any other guardian family member~~ of the victim is an appropriate person to provide care to the victim, the board shall authorize payment to reimburse the ~~parent family member~~ for lost wages, and reasonable expenses for transportation and lodging. Total payment to ~~a parent claimants~~ on behalf of any one victim under this provision must not exceed \$2,000. Computation of lost wages shall be the same as under part 3050.3200.

3050.3600 HOUSEHOLD SERVICES.

The board shall not award reparations for household services performed by a family ~~or household~~ member or persons who are presently residing together.

3050.3700 COST CEILING ON HOSPITAL AND PHYSICIAN EXPENSES.

Within 30 days of the beginning of each fiscal year, the board shall determine the percentage of hospital and physician expenses to be paid on all claims submitted for crimes occurring during that fiscal year. The board shall consider the availability of funds to the board when setting the percentage it will pay. The board must not pay more than this percentage of a victim's total hospital and physician expenses after payment by collateral sources. Acceptance of payment for medical services from the Minnesota Crime Victims Reparations Board shall be considered acceptance of payment in full and bars any legal action against the victim for collection. The board shall compensate the claimant in full if the claimant paid the hospital or physician expenses.

3050.3900 MAXIMUM PAYMENT FOR SEXUAL ASSAULT EVIDENTIARY EXAMINATION.

Within 30 days of the beginning of each fiscal year, the board ~~must not pay more than \$500~~ shall determine the maximum amount allowable for a sexual assault evidentiary examination. Any payment by the county for the examination shall be deducted from ~~that~~ \$500 the maximum amount and the board must not pay more than the remaining amount.

Adopted Rules

A rule becomes effective after the requirements of *Minnesota Statutes* §§14.05-14.28 have been met and five working days after the rule is published in the *State Register*, unless a later date is required by statutes or specified in the rule.

If an adopted rule is identical to its proposed form as previously published, a notice of adoption and a citation to its previous *State Register* publication will be printed.

If an adopted rule differs from its proposed form, language which has been deleted will be printed with strikeouts and new language will be underlined. The rule's previous *State Register* publication will be cited.

Exempt Rules

An exempt rule adopted under *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.386 or 14.388 is effective upon its publication in the *State Register*.

Emergency Expedited Rules

Provisions for the Commissioner of Natural Resources to adopt emergency expedited Game and Fish Rules are specified in *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 84.027. The commissioner may adopt emergency expedited rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for emergency rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the emergency conditions. Emergency expedited rules are effective upon publication in the *State Register*, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain emergency conditions. Emergency expedited rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months.

Department of Revenue

Adopted Permanent Rules Governing Individual Income Tax; Innocent Spouse Relief and Liability of Divorced Spouses

The rules proposed and published at *State Register*, Volume 25, Number 9, pages 584-587, August 28, 2000 (25 SR 584), are adopted as proposed.

Expedited Emergency Rules

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt emergency expedited rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for emergency rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the emergency conditions. Emergency expedited rules are effective upon publication in the *State Register*, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain emergency conditions. Emergency expedited rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific *Minnesota Statutes* citations accompanying these emergency expedited rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.
