Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions =

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. The current 1999 set is a 13-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive; issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26; issues #27-38 inclusive; issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39; issues #40-51 inclusive; and issues #1-52 (or 53 in some years), cumulative for issues #1-52 (or 53). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. Adopted Rules

A rule becomes effective after the requirements of *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.05-14.28 have been met and five working days after the rule is published in the *State Register*, unless a later date is required by statutes or specified in the rule.

If an adopted rule is identical to its proposed form as previously published, a notice of adoption and a citation to its previous *State Register* publication will be printed.

If an adopted rules differs from its proposed form, language which has been deleted will be printed with strikeouts and new language will be underlined. The rules previous *State Register* publication will be cited.

Expedited and Emergency Rules

Provisions for the Commissioner of Natural Resources to adopt emergency expedited Game and Fish Rules are specified in *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 84.027. The commissioner may adopt emergency expedited rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with requirements for emergency rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and emergency conditions. Emergency expedited rules are effective upon publication in the *State Register*, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain emergency conditions. Emergency expedited rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months.

Adopted Permanent Rules Relating to Certificate of Real Estate Value

The rules proposed and published at *State Register*, Volume 27, Number 30, pages 1156-1160, January 21, 2003 (27 SR 1156), are adopted with the following modifications:

8110.0100 GENERAL INFORMATION REQUIRED

In order to be accepted for filing a certificate of real estate value must contain the following data:

E. A statement signed by the buyer that the information provided on the certificate is correct and complete under penalty of the law. "Buyer" for the purpose of this rule means the individual or one of the individuals who will get title to the property. If a partnership will get title to the property, the buyer is a partner. If a corporation will get title, the buyer is an officer.

For any other entity, "buyer" may also include a natural person who is an agent of the buyer and who has knowledge of the transaction.

Expedited Emergency Rules

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt emergency expedited rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for emergency rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the emergency conditions. Emergency expedited rules are effective upon publication in the *State Register*, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain emergency conditions. Emergency expedited rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific *Minnesota Statutes* citations accompanying these emergency expedited rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.

Executive Orders

The governor has the authority to issue written statements of orders, called Executive Orders, as well as Emergency Executive Orders. The governor's authority is specified in the *Constitution of the State of Minnesota*, Article V, and in *Minnesota Statues* 4.035. Emergency Executive Orders, for protection from an imminent threat to health and safety, become effective immediately, are filed with the secretary of state, and published in the *State Register* as soon as possible after they are issued. Other Executive Orders become effective 15 days after publication in the *State Register* and filing with the secretary of state. Unless otherwise specified, an executive order expires 90 days after the date the governor who issued the order vacates office.

EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE ORDER #03-06: Providing for Assistance to the Minnesota Interagency Fire Center

I, TIM PAWLENTY, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the applicable statutes, do hereby issue this Executive Order:

WHEREAS, due to dry conditions and strong winds, a wildfire in the Appleton, Minnesota, area has spread into terrain not accessible by ground-based firefighting equipment; and

WHEREAS, the fire danger rating remains extreme throughout much of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, Swift County does not have adequate local resources for fighting this fire; and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Interagency Fire Center has requested fire suppression assets from the Minnesota National Guard; NOW THEREFORE L barraby order that:

NOW, THEREFORE, I hereby order that:

- 1. The Adjutant General of Minnesota order to state active duty on or about April 13, 2003, in the service of the State, such personnel and equipment of the military forces of the State as required and for such period of time as necessary to assist and support wildfire suppression in West Central Minnesota.
- 2. The Adjutant General is authorized to purchase, lease or contract goods or services necessary to accomplish the mission.
- 3. The cost of subsistence, transportation, fuel, pay and allowances of said individuals shall be defrayed from the general fund of the State, as provided for in *Minnesota Statutes* 2002, Sections 192.49, subd. 1; 192.52 and 192.54.

Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* 2002, Section 4.035, Subd. 2, this Order is effective immediately and shall remain in effect until such date as elements of the military forces of the State are no longer required.

Revenue Notices

The Department of Revenue began issuing revenue notices in July of 1991. Revenue notices are statements of policy made by the department that provide interpretation, detail, or supplementary information concerning a particular statute, rule, or departmental practice. The authority to issue revenue notices is found in *Minnesota Statutes* § 270.0604

Department of Revenue

REVENUE NOTICE #03-02: Property Tax - Sustainable Forest Incentive Act - Violation of a Condition of Enrollment

Background

Minnesota Statutes, section 290C.03 provides that property may be enrolled in the Sustainable Forest Incentive Program (The Program) if all of the conditions for enrollment are met. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 290C.11(a) provides that if the Commissioner of Revenue determines that land enrolled in The Program is in violation of the conditions for enrollment as specified in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 290C.03, the commissioner shall notify the claimant of his or her intent to remove all enrolled land from The Program. Upon notification, the claimant has 60 days to administratively appeal the determination. If the commissioner denies the appeal the claimant may appeal to tax court.

Issue

One of the conditions of enrollment is that the Timber Harvesting and Forest Management Guidelines adopted by the Minnesota Forest Resources Council (The Guidelines) must be used in conjunction with any timber harvesting or forest management activities. The statute does not indicate what activities or omissions constitute a violation of The Guidelines.

This Revenue Notice provides guidance in determining what constitutes a violation of The Guidelines. This Revenue Notice does not deal with any of the other conditions of enrollment. Even if the claimant's activities do not constitute a violation of The Guidelines, there may still be violations of the other conditions of enrollment, which would lead to the land being removed from The Program. One example of this is if there are delinquent property taxes on the property.

Department of Revenue Position

If deviations from The Guidelines:

- 1. are of an accidental or inadvertent character;
- 2. the claimant has made a good faith effort to follow The Guidelines;
- 3. the claimant has made efforts to correct any damage, if possible; and
- 4. the claimant has taken measures to avoid future violations,

the commissioner may determine that a violation of The Guidelines has not occurred. Where development activities have occurred in violation of the covenant required under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 290C.04, the commissioner is not required to take into account any actions in mitigation.

In determining whether land enrolled in The Program is in violation of The Guidelines the commissioner shall take into consideration:

- 1. The cause of the violation.
- 2. The extent of the violation (area of damage).
- 3. Whether the claimant has substantially complied with the Forest Management Plan (The Plan).
- 4. Whether the claimant has substantially complied with The Guidelines in timber harvest and forest management activities.
- 5. Whether the claimant took measures to avoid the violation.
- 6. If the claimant has violated one or more of The Guidelines concerning harvest practices, whether the claimant has attempted to mitigate the violation.
- 7. Whether the claimant has taken measures to avoid future violations.
- 8. Whether there has been a pattern of violations by the claimant related to any land enrolled in The Program.

Examples

For purposes of this notice the term "claimant" includes all persons and entities bound by the covenant and all employees, contractors and agents of the claimant.

Example 1

The claimant locates a skid trail in such a way as to avoid a large part of a wetland, and during creation of the trail it becomes clear that a small, unforeseen portion of the wetland is impacted. The claimant stops construction as soon as it encounters the problem and reroutes the trail in order to minimize or avoid damage to the wetland.

Department of Revenue =

This set of circumstances would not give rise to a violation even though there has been some damage to a wetland because the claimant clearly intended to avoid the damage and changed its course of action once it noticed the problem.

Example 2

The claimant conducts a harvest during the summer in a low area knowing that the area is likely to be negatively impacted. During operations the equipment causes rutting. The claimant continues operations despite the conditions and only moves trails to avoid equipment getting stuck.

Under these circumstances the commissioner could find a violation because the claimant knew that there could be a negative impact and when the damage occurred did nothing to minimize it.

Requirements to Provide Notice to Patients and Copy of Notice

Introduction. The Minnesota Department of Health has updated the Access to Health Records Notice of Rights document. The Notice informs patients how they may access and obtain copies of their health records. The notice informs patients how their health records may be disclosed without their consent. A copy of the Notice is published in this issue of the *State Register*. The original Notice was published at 19 *State Register* 1739. This Notice was developed and is being published as required by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 144.335, subdivision 5a.

Updated for HIPAA. This Notice has been updated to reflect changes in federal law. The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of *1996 Public Law* 104-191, gives some specific situations when a patient's health record may be disclosed without patient consent.

Healthcare Providers are Required to Post this Notice. If you are a healthcare provider, you are required by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 144.335, subdivision 5a, to provide this Notice to patients in a clear and conspicuous manner. This requirement is satisfied if this Notice is included with the notice and copy of the patient and resident bill of rights or if this Notice is displayed prominently in the provider's place of business.

ACCESS TO HEALTH RECORDS NOTICE OF RIGHTS

This notice explains the rights you have to access your health record, and when certain information in your health record can be released without your consent. This notice does not change any protections you have under the law.

YOUR RIGHT TO ACCESS AND PROTECT YOUR HEALTH RECORD

You have the following rights relating to your health record under the law:

- A health care provider, or a person who gets health records from a provider, must have your signed and dated consent to release your health record, except for specific reasons in the law.
- You can see your health record for information about any diagnosis, treatment, and prognosis.
- You can ask, in writing, for a copy or summary of your health record, which must be given to you promptly.
- You must be given a copy or a summary of your health record unless it would be detrimental to your physical or mental health, or cause you to harm another.
- You cannot be charged if you request a copy of your health record to review your current care.
- If you request a copy of your health record and it does not include your current care, you can only be charged the maximum amount set by Minnesota law for copying your record.

RELEASE OF YOUR HEALTH RECORD WITHOUT YOUR CONSENT

There are specific times that the law allows some health record information held by your provider to be released without your written consent. Some, but not all, of the reasons for release under federal law are:

- For specific public health activities
- When health information about victims of abuse, neglect, or domestic violence must be released to a government authority
- For health oversight activities
- For judicial and administrative proceedings
- For specific law enforcement purposes
- For certain organ donation purposes
- When health information about decedents is required for specific individuals to carry out their duties under the law
- For research purposes approved by a privacy board
- To stop a serious threat to health or safety
- For specialized government functions related to national security
- For workers' compensation purposes

Under Minnesota law, health record information may be released without your consent in a medical emergency, or when a court order or subpoena requires it. The following include some of the agencies, persons, or organizations that specific health record information may or must be released to for specific purposes, or after certain conditions are met:

- The Departments of Health, Human Services, Public Safety, Commerce, Employee Relations, Labor & Industry, and Education
- Insurers and employers in workers' compensation cases
- Ombudsman for Mental Health and Mental Retardation
- Health professional licensing boards/agencies
- Victims of serious threats of physical violence
- The State Fire Marshal
- Local welfare agencies

- Medical examiners or coroners
- Schools, childcare facilities, and Community Action Agencies to transfer immunization records
- Medical or scientific researchers
- Parent/legal guardian who did not consent for a minor's treatment, when failure to release health information could cause serious health problems
- Law enforcement agencies
- Insurance companies and other payors paying for an independent medical examination
