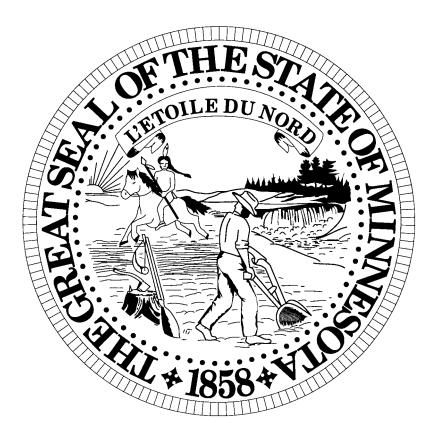

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NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. The current 1999 set is a 13-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the most current edition of the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive; issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26; issues #27-38 inclusive; issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39; issues #40-51 inclusive; and issues #1-52 (or 53 in some years), cumulative for issues #1-52 (or 53). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. 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Adopted Rules

A rule becomes effective after the requirements of *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.05-14.28 have been met and five working days after the rule is published in the *State Register*, unless a later date is required by statutes or specified in the rule.

If an adopted rule is identical to its proposed form as previously published, a notice of adoption and a citation to its previous *State Register* publication will be printed.

If an adopted rules differs from its proposed form, language which has been deleted will be printed with strikeouts and new language will be underlined. The rules previous *State Register* publication will be cited.

Expedited and Emergency Rules

Provisions for the Commissioner of Natural Resources to adopt emergency expedited Game and Fish Rules are specified in *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 84.027. The commissioner may adopt emergency expedited rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with requirements for emergency rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and emergency conditions. Emergency expedited rules are effective upon publication in the *State Register*, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain emergency conditions. Emergency expedited rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months.

Board of Chiropractic Examiners

Adopted Permanent Rules Relating to License Transfer

The rules proposed and published at *State Register*, Volume 27, Number 49, pages 1759-1760, June 2, 2003 (27 SR 1759), are adopted with the following modifications:

2500.0800 APPROVAL OF EXAMINATION FROM ANOTHER STATE OR JURISDICTION.

A practitioner who can demonstrate a cumulative active practice record in another state or jurisdiction for at least five years prior to this application may request that the examination resulting in the practitioner's licensure in that state or jurisdiction be approved for Minnesota licensure. The board shall consider requests according to the requirements in items A to M.

H. If the licensing examination of the other state or jurisdiction is inadequate to meet the requirements of the Minnesota board, or if <u>after initial licensure</u> the applicant has failed a licensing examination administered by any chiropractic licensing board, the applicant may be required to take other exams, including the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners Practical Examination or the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners Special Purposes Examination in Chiropractic.

Revenue Notices

The Department of Revenue began issuing revenue notices in July of 1991. Revenue notices are statements of policy made by the department that provide interpretation, detail, or supplementary information concerning a particular statute, rule, or departmental practice. The authority to issue revenue notices is found in *Minnesota Statutes* § 270.0604

Revenue Notice #04-01: Insurance Taxes – Negative Net Balances

Taxpayers under *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 297I are required to pay taxes or surcharges on gross premiums received in a reporting period less premiums returned in the same reporting period. In the event that the return premiums exceed the gross premiums received during a reporting period, the department, upon the filing of a tax return showing a negative balance, subject to the requirements set forth in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 297I.60 and 297I.70, will issue a refund to the taxpayer equal to the negative amount multiplied by the applicable tax or surcharge rate.

Official Notices

Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes § § 14.101, an agency must first solicit comments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking. The State Register also publishes other official notices of state agencies and non-state agencies, including notices of meetings and matters of public interest.

Authorization List - Newly Added Drugs Requiring Authorization

The following is a listing of added drugs to the current authorization list. The newly added drugs will require authorization on or after February 1, 2004. As authorized by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 256B.0625, subdivision 25, the following list includes all drugs that have been added as a condition of Minnesota Health Care Programs (MHCP) payment. The criteria used to develop this list are as follows:

- A. The health service could be considered, under some circumstances, to be of questionable medical necessity.
- B. Use of the health services needs monitoring to control the expenditure of program funds.
- C. Less costly, appropriate alternatives to the health services are generally available.
- D. The health service is newly developed or modified.
- F. The health service is of a continuing nature and requires monitoring to prevent its continuation when it ceases to be beneficial.
- G. The health service is comparable to a service provided in a skilled nursing facility or hospital but is provided in a recipient's home.
- H. The health service could be considered cosmetic.

These newly added or changed codes will require Authorization for services provided on or after February 1, 2004. DRUGS

Public Notice of Submittal of Proposal for a Five-Year Child Welfare Demonstration

The Minnesota Department of Human Services has submitted a proposal to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Administration on Children, Youth and Families for a five-year Child Welfare Demonstration.

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services requires that states notify the public that a child welfare demonstration project is being proposed and provide an opportunity for comment.

The Department of Human Services proposes a child welfare demonstration program to test the impact of a single benefit rate for foster care, relative custody assistance and adoption assistance. The goal of the single benefit demonstration is to increase the rate of permanency for children in long term foster care through a transfer of permanent legal custody or adoption.

Section 1130 of the Social Security Act, as amended, provides the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services with authority to approve up to 10 State child welfare demonstration projects per year. The Child Welfare Demonstration Project authority was authorized by Congress in 1994 and then expanded and extended as part of the Adoption and Safe Families Act (ASFA) of 1997 (Public Law 105-89). These demonstration projects involve the waiver of certain requirements of Titles IV-E and IV-B, the sections of the Social Security Act that govern foster care and adoption assistance and related expenses for program administration, training and automated systems, as well as the Chafee Foster Care Independence Program, child welfare services, and the Promoting Safe and Stable Families program.

REQUEST FOR COMMENTS on Possible Amendment to Rules Governing Sales Tax, *Minnesota Rules*, Part 8130.5300

Subject of Rules. The Minnesota Department of Revenue requests comments on its possible amendment to rules governing sales and use tax on petroleum products. The current rule is outdated. The department is considering rule amendments to reflect a law change which is set forth in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 297A.68, subdivision 19, providing an exemption from the sales tax for "products upon which a tax has been imposed and paid under *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 296A, and for which no refund has been or will be allowed."

Persons Affected. The amendment to the rules would likely affect purchasers of gasoline or diesel fuel used for off road purposes who paid a petroleum tax and later were given a credit or refund. It would apply primarily to construction equipment owners.

Statutory Authority. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 270.06 (14) grants general rulemaking authority to the Commissioner of Revenue.

Public Comment. Interested persons or groups may submit comments or information on these possible rules in writing until further notice is published in the *State Register* that the department intends to adopt or to withdraw the rules. By law, a notice of intent to adopt cannot be published sooner than 60 days following the publication of the request for comments. The department does not contemplate appointing an advisory committee to comment on the possible rules.

Rules Drafts. The department does not anticipate that a draft of the rules amendments will be available before the publication of the proposed rules.
