Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. The current 1999 set is a 13-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the State Register, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the most current edition of the Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive; issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26; issues #27-38 inclusive; issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39; issues #40-51 inclusive; and issues #1-52 (or 53 in some years), cumulative for issues #1-52 (or 53). 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Exempt Rules

Exempt rules are excluded from the normal rulemaking procedures (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.386 and 14.388). They are most often of two kinds. One kind is specifically exempted by the Legislature from rulemaking procedures, but approved for form by the Revisor of Statutes, reviewed for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings, and then published in the *State Register*. These exempt rules are effective for two years only.

The second kind of exempt rule is one adopted where an agency for good cause finds that the rulemaking provisions of *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 14 are unnecessary, impracticable, or contrary to the public interest. This exemption can be used only where the rules:

- (1) address a serious and immediate threat to the public health, safety, or welfare, or
- (2) comply with a court order or a requirement in federal law in a manner that does not allow for compliance with *Minnesota Statutes* Sections 14.14-14.28, or
 - (3) incorporate specific changes set forth in applicable statutes when no interpretation of law is required, or
 - (4) make changes that do not alter the sense, meaning, or effect of the rules.

These exempt rules are also reviewed for form by the Revisor of Statutes, for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings and then published in the *State Register*. In addition, the Office of Administrative Hearings must determine whether the agency has provided adequate justification for the use of this exemption. Rules adopted under clauses (1) or (2) above are effective for two years only. The Legislature may also exempt an agency from the normal rulemaking procedures and establish other procedural and substantive requirements unique to that exemption.

Proposed Revisions to the Occupational Safety and Health Standards and Request for Comments

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Department of Labor and Industry, Occupational Safety and Health Division (Minnesota OSHA) proposes to adopt the following revisions to the Department of Labor and Industry, Occupational Safety and Health Rules, as authorized under *Minnesota Statutes* § 182.655 (2004). This notice proposes the adoption by reference of amendments to Occupational Safety and Health Standards that have already been proposed and adopted by the Federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration (Federal OSHA).

All interested or affected persons have 30 days from the date this notice is published in the *State Register* to submit, in writing, data and views on the proposed amendments to the rule. Comments in support of or in opposition to the proposed amendments are encouraged. Each comment should identify the portion of the proposed amendment addressed, the reason for the comment, and any proposed change. Any person may file with the Commissioner written objections to the proposed amendments stating the grounds for those objections and may request a public hearing. A public hearing will be held if 25 or more persons submit written requests for a public hearing on the proposed amendments within the 30-day comment period. Requests for hearing must include the name and address of the person submitting the request, define the reasons for the request, and discuss any proposed changes. If a public hearing is required, the Department will proceed according to the provisions of *Minnesota Statutes* § 182.655 and *Minnesota Rules* 5210.0020 to 5210.0100.

SUMMARY OF CHANGES

The following is a brief summary of the proposed amendments. The listing of federal standards being proposed for adoption follow this summary. To review the complete *Federal Register* notices referenced below, visit *www.osha.gov*.

(A) "Standards Improvement Project – Phase II; final rule." Federal OSHA published a final rule in the January 5, 2005, *Federal Register*, on the second phase of its standards improvement project. The project addresses inconsistent, duplicative or outdated provisions in OSHA's safety and health standards for general industry, maritime and construction.

The final rule revises or eliminates medical provisions in older standards that were once considered accepted practice, but have since been deemed obsolete or unnecessary in current medical practice. For example, annual rather than semi-annual medical examinations will now be required for long-term employees exposed to inorganic arsenic, coke oven emissions, and vinyl chloride. The final rule also eliminates reporting requirements that have failed to benefit employee health. For example, employers will no longer have to notify OSHA of all workplace releases for certain specified carcinogens. In addition, while employers are still required to establish regulated work areas

for vinyl chloride, inorganic arsenic, acrylonitrile, and for the 13 known occupational carcinogens, they will no longer be required to notify OSHA each time they do so. The final rule updates chemical exposure provisions by making them consistent in terms of the frequency of monitoring and the manner of employee notification of monitoring results. This final rule became effective at the federal level on March 7, 2005.

By this notice, Minnesota OSHA proposes to adopt the final rule as published in the Federal Register on January 5, 2005.

The bonds will be issued as qualified mortgage bonds subject to the mortgage eligibility requirements of Section 143 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and, after payment of expenses and funding of reserves, will provide approximately \$240,000,000 of mortgage loans to certain low and moderate income, first-time homebuyers of single family owner-occupied residences located throughout the State of Minnesota, which homebuyers qualify under the Agency's single family mortgage program and applicable federal tax law.

The Agency's single family mortgage program is further described in the MHFA Mortgage Program Procedural Manual, a copy of which may be obtained from the Agency. Said bonds may be issued either as refunding bonds to refund certain outstanding bonds of the Agency or as "new money" bonds using a portion of the Agency's state bond volume allocation, and may be issued either as short-term bonds, subject to refunding or remarketing at a subsequent date on a long-term, fixed or variable rate basis, or as long-term, fixed or variable rate bonds on original issuance. The bonds covered by this hearing notice, up to an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$250,000,000, are anticipated to be issued periodically to fund the Program during the calendar years 2005 and 2006, until fully utilized.

Adoption of Additional Praxis II Examination and Passing Score for Teachers of Reading K-12 Licensure

The test and required passing score in this announcement becomes effective for all licensure applications postmarked on or after September 1, 2005. As required by *Minnesota Rules*, Part 8710.0500, subpart 4, the Minnesota Board of Teaching hereby notifies citizens of Minnesota that the following examination has been adopted as requirement for first time applicants for the Teachers of Reading K-12 licensure in Minnesota.

The test announced herein is *in addition to* the already-required examinations in *Minnesota Rules* 8710,0500, subpart 1, item A & B. Minnesota licensed classroom teachers *adding* the Teachers of Reading K-12 licensure field on or after September 1, 2005, must take the content test specified, but there shall be no minimum passing score enforced until 2006. The test and "Passing Score" listed below is the minimum projected passing score the Board will enforce for applications postmarked *on or after September 1*, 2006.

For purposes of this requirement, the term "classroom teacher license" does not include licenses as a Teachers of Parent and Family Education, School Counselor, School Social Worker, School Psychologist, Educational Speech-Language Pathologists, Teacher Coordinators of Work-Based Learning, or Teachers of Adult Basic Education.

Applicants prepared outside Minnesota shall be granted temporary licenses under the provisions of *Minnesota Rules* 8710.0500, subpart 11.

The examination listed below is from the Praxis II series of examinations by the Educational Testing Service (ETS). For information regarding Praxis examinations, applicants should contact their teacher preparation institution or the Minnesota Board of Teaching (651) 582-8833.

These grants are competitive and applicants for previous grants should be aware that each application must stand on its own merits. Information that may have been submitted in previous applications and Department staff's personal knowledge of the applicant will not be considered in scoring. Exception: an applicant who previously received a grant but who failed to fulfill the terms of that grant will not be considered for funding.

Eligible Applicants

Applicants must be boards of health with responsibility under Minnesota Statutes, section 144.9504, for responding to reports of elevated blood lead levels.

Eligible Costs

Eligible costs include moving costs and rent for a temporary residence for any low income resident temporarily relocated during lead hazard reduction. Eligible costs include the following:

- 1. inspection of housing prior to rental;
- 2. rental of temporary housing found by inspection to be free of deteriorating lead-based paint, bare lead-contaminated soil and dust, and lead-contaminated drinking water;
 - 3. cleaning of the housing after occupancy;
