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# Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

#### NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. The current 1999 set is a 13-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the most current edition of the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive; issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26; issues #27-38 inclusive; issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39; issues #40-51 inclusive; and issues #1-52 (or 53 in some years), cumulative for issues #1-52 (or 53). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. # **Expedited Emergency Rules**

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt expedited emergency rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for emergency rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the emergency conditions. Expedited emergency rules are effective upon publication in the State Register, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain emergency conditions.

Expedited emergency rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific *Minnesota Statute* citations accompanying these expedited emergency rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.

Subp. 2. Area 802A. Prairie chicken permit area 802A consists of that portion of the state lying within the following described boundary: Beginning at the intersection of Pennington County StateAid Highway (CSAH) 3 and State Trunk Highway (STH) 32; thence along STH 32 to United States Highway (US) 2; thence along US 2 to US 75; thence along US 75 to Polk CSAH 21; thence along Polk CSAH 21 to Pennington CSAH 3; thence along Pennington CSAH 3 to the point of beginning. Prairie chicken permit area 808A consists of that portion of the state lying within the following described boundary: Beginning at the intersection of State Trunk Highway (STH) 9 and Clay County StateAid Highway (CSAH) 34; thence along Clay CSAH 34 to STH 32; thence along STH 32 to United States Highway (US) 10; thence along US 10 to STH 9; thence along STH 9 to the point of beginning.

Subp. 9. Area 809A. Prairie chicken permit area 809A consists of that portion of the state lying within the following described boundary: Beginning at the intersection of Clay County State Aid Highway (CSAH) 11 and United States Highway (US) 10; thence along US 10 to State Trunk Highway (STH) 32; thence along STH 32 to STH 34; thence along STH 34 to Clay CSAH 2; thence along Clay CSAH 2 to Clay CSAH 11; thence along Clay CSAH 11 to the point of beginning.

Subp. 10. Area 810A. Prairie chicken permit area 810A consists of that portion of the state lying within the following described boundary: Beginning at the intersection of Clay County StateAid Highway (CSAH) 2 and Interstate Highway 94 (I94); thence along I94 to Ottertail CSAH 24; thence along Ottertail CSAH 24 to Wilkin CSAH 26; thence along Wilkin CSAH 26 to Wilkin CSAH 3; thence along Wilkin CSAH 3 to the point of beginning.

Subp. 11. Area 811A. **EFFECTIVE PERIOD.** The emergency amendments to Minnesota Rules, parts 6236.0700, 6236.0810, and 6237.0400, expire December 31, 2006. The repeal of Minnesota Rules, part 6237.0500, expires December 31, 2006. After the emergency amendments and the repealer expire, the permanent rules as they read prior to those amendments or repealer again take effect, except as they may be amended by permanent rule. Minnesota Rules, part 6237.0500, expires December 31, 2006.

### Notice of Review of Minnesota Rules Containing Outdated Language and Changes

Notice of Review of Minnesota Rules Containing Outdated Language and Changes to be Made by the Revisor of Statutes On May 10, 2005, a bill relating to state government that changes the terminology for mentally retarded, mental retardation, physically handicapped, and similar terms in state statutes (H.F. 487) was passed by the Legislature. The bill was signed by Governor Pawlenty on May 18, 2005. This legislation is now contained in 2005 Session Laws Chapter 56.

The Governor's Council on Developmental Disabilities, Department of Administration, agreed to post notice in the <u>State Register</u> stating that the Office of the Revisor of Statutes will be updating like terminology contained in Minnesota Rules. Specifically, references to handicapped" will be replaced with "disability;" and references to "mental retardation," "idiot," "mental retardation or a related condition," and "mental retardation and related condition" will be replaced with "developmental disability."

All updated references will refer to people first and the disability second. In addition, "language changes...shall not expand or exclude eligibility to services."

### Compliance Monitoring Division, Managed Care Systems Section Notice of Intent to Solicit Comments on a Health Maintenance Organization Demonstration Project Application

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Minnesota Department of Health is soliciting public comments on an application for a demonstration project submitted by First Plan of Minnesota (First Plan), a certified health maintenance organization (HMO). *Minnesota Statutes 62D.30* allows the Commissioner of Health to waive compliance with certain statutes and rules that apply to HMOs.

Under the demonstration project, First Plan would provide health coverage to small-business employers and their employees in First Plan's approved service area, which includes the following Minnesota counties: Carlton, Cook, Itasca, Koochiching, Lake, Pine (northern half) & St. Louis.

First Plan has requested that the Commissioner of Health waive certain statutes and rules as part of the demonstration project. According to the application, the waivers would allow First Plan to:

- apply a lifetime maximum benefit on in-network services (Minnesota Statutes 62D.02, subdivision 4)
- exclude coverage for bariatric surgery for weight loss, infertility treatment and all related services and supplies (*Minnesota Statutes 62D.02, subdivision 7*)
- exclude coverage for surgical and nonsurgical treatment for TMJ disorder and craniomandibular disorder (*Minnesota Statutes 62D.02, subdivision 7 and Minnesota Statutes 62A.043, subdivision 3*)
- charge coinsurance on some preventive health services (*Minnesota Statutes 62D.02, subdivision 7; Minnesota Statutes 62D.095, subdivision 5;* and *Minnesota Rules 4685.0801, Subpart 8*)
- exclude prescription drug costs from accumulating toward the annual out-of-pocket maximum benefits (*Minnesota Statutes* 62D.095, subdivision 4)

# Authorization List of All Drugs That Have Been Added Requiring Authorization as a Condition of Minnesota Health Care Programs (MHCP) Payment

The following is a listing of added drugs to the current authorization list. The newly added drug codes will require authorization on or after August 1, 2006.

As authorized by Minnesota Statutes, section <u>256B.0625</u>, subd 25, the following list includes all drugs that have been added requiring authorization as a condition of MHCP payment. The criteria used to develop this list are as follows:

- A. The health service could be considered, under some circumstances, to be of questionable medical necessity.
- B. Use of the health service needs monitoring to control the expenditure of program funds.
- C. Less costly, appropriate alternatives to the health service are generally available.
- D. The health service is investigative.
- E. The health service is newly developed or modified.
- F. The health service is of a continuing nature and requires monitoring to prevent its continuation when it ceases to be beneficial.
- G. The health service is comparable to a service provided in a skilled nursing facility or hospital but is provided in a recipient's home.
- Η.
- I. The health service could be considered cosmetic.

These newly added non preferred drugs will require Authorization for services provided on or after August 1, 2006.

If a practice is receiving cost-share or incentive funds from another governmental grant program, that practice will not be eligible to receive Section 319 funds solely to increase the level of cost-share or incentive payments. 
