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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. The current 1999 set is a 13-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the most current edition of the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive; issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26; issues #27-38 inclusive; issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39; issues #40-51 inclusive; and issues #1-52 (or 53 in some years), cumulative for issues #1-52 (or 53). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. 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Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101, an agency must first solicit comments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

The State Register also publishes other official notices of state agencies and non-state agencies, including notices of meetings and matters of public interest.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing will be held by the Minnesota Higher Education Facilities Authority (the "Authority") with respect to a proposal to issue revenue bonds or other obligations on behalf of Bethel University (the "University"), as owner and operator of Bethel University, at the Authority's offices at 380 Jackson Street, Suite 450, St. Paul, Minnesota on Wednesday, June 27, 2007 at 9:00 a.m. Under the proposal, the Authority would issue its revenue bonds or other obligations in the maximum principal amount of \$53,000,000 to finance a project (the "Project") consisting of (a) the acquisition, construction, furnishing and equipping of an approximately 110,000 square foot University Commons, which will include dining facilities, campus store, offices, a casual student assembly and other meeting areas as well as appurtenant site improvements, and (b) the refunding of (i) the Authority's outstanding Adjustable Demand Revenue Bonds, Series Four-S (Bethel College & Seminary) dated June 11, 1998, which were issued in the original principal amount of \$22,865,000 to finance (A) the construction and equipping of a new four-story residence hall, (B) an addition to the Fine Arts Center, (C) remodeling of spaces in various campus buildings, (D) upgrade of campus wiring network and electronics infrastructure, (E) construction of a baseball field to NCAA Division III standards, (F) parking expansion and improvements, (G) acquisition of an existing office building to provide space for the University's Development Office and Continuing Studies Offices, (H) the refunding of the Authority's Mortgage Revenue Bonds, Series W (Bethel College), dated August 1, 1978, originally issued to finance the construction and equipping of two housing residences on the main campus of the University, and (I) the refinancing of indebtedness originally incurred to finance an addition to Nelson Dormitory and a classroom and office addition to the Robertson Building, and (ii) the Authority's outstanding Adjustable Demand Revenue Bonds, Series Five-V (Bethel College & Seminary), dated May 20, 2004, which were issued in the original principal amount of \$8,500,000 to finance the construction and equipping of a student housing facility, including appurtenant site improvements; all owned or to be owned and operated by the University and located on its main Arden Hills campus, the principal street address of which is 3900 Bethel Drive, St. Paul, Minnesota.

At said time and place the Authority shall give all parties who appear or have submitted written comments an opportunity to express their views with respect to the proposal to undertake and finance the Project.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Commissioner of Transportation has appointed a State Aid Variance Advisory Committee who will meet on Thursday, June 14, 2007 at 9:00 a.m. at the Mn/DOT Arden Hills Training Center, located at 1900 West County Road I, in Shoreview, Minnesota, 55126.

This notice is given pursuant to Minnesota Statute 14.46.

The purpose of this open meeting is to investigate and determine recommendations for variance requests from minimum State Aid roadway standards and administrative procedures as governed by *Minnesota Rules* for State Aid Operations 8820 adopted pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* Chapters 161 and 162.

The agenda will be limited to the following:

1. Petition of Murray County for a variance from *Minnesota Rules* 8820.9961 as they apply to the reconstruction of CSAH 4 between Grace Street and McDonnell Street in the City of Iona, so as to allow a 62 foot side street with parking stall depths of 18 feet for 45-defree diagonal parking in lieu of the minimum depth of 20 foot parking tall depths and a street width of 66 feet.

2. Petition of Morrison County for a variance from *Minnesota Rules* 8820.9936 as they apply to the reconstruction of CSAH 104, located between Superior Avenue and CSAH 1 in the city of Randall, so as to allow a design speed of less than the minimum at the railroad grade crossing in lieu of the minimum 30 miles per hour.

3. Petition of Ramsey County for a variance from *Minnesota Rules* 8820.2900 as they apply to receive County State Aid Highway Turnback funds for reconstruction and major maintenance on the following State Trunk Highways: CSAH 96 from Old Highway 8 in New Brighton to Trunk Highway 61 in White Bear Lake, CSAH 49 from University Avenue in St. Paul to County Road J in Shoreview/ North Oaks, and University Avenue from Robert Street in St. Paul to the west boundary of Ramsey County so as to allow and extension

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of County State Aid Highway Turnback funds for a period of 25 years beyond the date of jurisdiction transfer in lieu of 15 years.

4. Petition of Winona County for a variance from *Minnesota Rules* 8820.9936 as they apply to a proposed reconstruction of CSAH 7, located on both sides of proposed bridge 85536 located adjacent to the Pickwick Mill in the city of Pickwick as to allow reconstruction of the bridge on the existing alignment but shifted southernly approximately 10 feet in lieu of the minimum 30 mph design speed on horizontal curves.

5. Petition of the City of Duluth for a variance from *Minnesota Rules* 8820.9922 as they apply to the proposed reconstruction of Lincoln Park Drive over Miller Creek, located between .21 miles north of West 3rd Street and .25 miles north of West 3rd Street in the city of Duluth, so as to allow the five following requests: 150 foot radius at -0.02 supervelevation on a horizontal curve in lieu of the minimum 273 foot radius at 0.06 supereleavation required by standards, 150 foot vertical curve in lieu of a 291 foot curve required by standards, an 11 foot lane with 2 foot shoulder widths in lieu of 12 foot lane with 4 foot shoulder widths required by standards, a 9 foot recovery area with 1:3 inslope in lieu of 10 foot recovery area with 1:4 inslope required by standards, a bridge width of 26 feet in lieu of 32 feet.
