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# Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. The current 1999 set is a 13-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the most current edition of the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive; issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26; issues #27-38 inclusive; issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39; issues #40-51 inclusive; and issues #1-52 (or 53 in some years), cumulative for issues #1-52 (or 53). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. 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# **Adopted Rules**

A rule becomes effective after the requirements of *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.05-14.28 have been met and five working days after the rule is published in the *State Register*, unless a later date is required by statutes or specified in the rule. If an adopted rule is identical to its proposed form as previously published, a notice of adoption and a citation to its previous *State Register* publication will be printed. If an adopted rule differs from its proposed form, language which has been deleted will be printed with strikeouts and new language will be underlined. The rule's previous *State Register* publication will be cited.

**KEY: Proposed Rules** - <u>Underlining</u> indicates additions to existing rule language. Strikeouts indicate deletions from existing rule language. If a proposed rule is totally new, it is designated "all new material." **Adopted Rules** - <u>Underlining</u> indicates additions to proposed rule language. Strikeout indicates deletions from proposed rule language.

### **Department of Agriculture** Adopted Permanent Rules Relating to Labeling Statements

The rules proposed and published at *State Register*, Volume 33, Number 30, pages 1295-1297, January 26, 2009 (33 SR 1295), are adopted as proposed.

# **Executive Orders**

The governor has the authority to issue written statements or orders, called Executive Orders. as well as Emergency Executive Orders. The governor's authority is specified in the *Constitution of the State of Minnesota*, Article V, and in *Minnesota Statutes* § 4.035. Emergency Executive Orders, for protection from an imminent threat to health and safety, become effective immediately, are filed with the secretary of state, and published in the *State Register* as soon as possible after they are issued. Other Executive Orders become effective 15 days after publication in the *State Register* and filing with the secretary of state. Unless otherwise specified, an executive order expires 90 days after the date the governor who issued the order vacates office.

# Emergency Executive Order # 09-08: Providing for Fire Suppression Assistance to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources

**I, TIM PAWLENTY, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA,** by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable laws, do hereby issue this executive order:

**WHEREAS**, on Monday, April 6, 2009, a wild grassfire was burning in and around the Carlos Avery Wildlife Refuge just west of Forest Lake and continues to do so; and

WHEREAS, several hundred acres have already burned and about 10 homes have been evacuated; and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources does not have adequate aviation resources for wildfire suppression; and

WHEREAS, the DNR has requested air wild grassfire suppression assets from the Minnesota National Guard.

# **Executive Orders**

NOW, THEREFORE, I hereby order that:

- 1. The Adjutant General of Minnesota order to state active duty on or about April 6, 2009 in the service of the State, such personnel and equipment of the military forces of the State as required and for such period of time as necessary to assist and support air wild grassfire suppression in and around the Carlos Avery Wild Life Refuge.
- 2. The Adjutant General is authorized to purchase, lease or contract goods or services necessary to accomplish the mission.
- 3. The cost of subsistence, transportation, fuel, pay and allowances of said individuals shall by defrayed from the general fund of the State, as provided for in Minnesota Statutes 2008, Sections 192.49, 192.52 and 192.54.

Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* 2008, Section 4.035, Subdivision 2, this Emergency Executive Order shall be effective retroactively to April 6, 2009, and will remain in effect until the conclusion of the emergency.

### <u>Modification of</u> Revenue Notice # 05-03: Sales and Use Tax – Telecommunications Services – Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) Service

This Revenue Notice sets forth the department's position on the sales tax treatment of Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) services.

#### **Statutory Authority**

*Minnesota Statutes*, section 297A.61, subdivision 3(i), provides that the furnishing for consideration of telecommunications services constitutes a sale or purchase for purposes of the Minnesota sales tax. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 297A.61, subdivision 24, provides that "telecommunications services" means "the <u>electronic</u> transmission, conveyance, or routing of voice, data, audio, video, or any other information or signals to a point, or between or among points<del>, by or through any electronic, satellite, optical, microwave, or other medium or method now in existence or hereafter devised, regardless of the protocol used for such transmission, conveyance, or routing."</del>

Paragraph (c)(<u>1</u>)(<u>3</u>) of subdivision 24 provides that telecommunications services do not include "<u>data processing and information</u> <u>services that allow data to be generated, acquired, stored, processed, or retrieved and delivered by an electronic transmission to a purchaser</u> when the purchaser's primary purpose for the underlying transaction is the processed data or information <del>services which are defined in</del> paragraph (d) of subdivision 24 as "the offering of the capability for generating, acquiring, storing, transforming, processing, retrieving, utilizing, or making available information."

#### **Department Position**

VoIP is a telecommunications service as defined in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 297A.61, subdivision 24 that is subject to the Minnesota state sales and use tax. For purposes of the Minnesota sales and use tax, VoIP is not an information service since it uses computer processing applications solely for the management, control,\_or operation of a telecommunications system or the management of a telecommunications service. Although VoIP uses Internet protocol that allows the transmission of packeted data across a network, it merely serves to address and route the voice, data, or audio.

### Minnesota Racing Commission Request for Comments on Possible Amendment to Rules Governing Horse Racing, *Minnesota Rules*, 7869 Definitions; 7870 Licensure

**Subject of Rules.** The Minnesota Racing Commission requests comments on its possible amendment to rules governing horse racing. The Commission is considering rule amendments that would include compliance with the ADA Amendments Act regarding contract approval and that would update its Affirmative Action rules, 7870.0510.

Persons Affected. The amendment to the rules would likely affect Class A, B, & D Licensees and contractors.

### Sustainable Resources Center Notice of Intent to Request Release of Funds

On or about April 21<sup>st</sup>, 2009 the Sustainable Resources Center will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the release of Operation Lead Elimination Action Program, with funding authorized by the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2008, Public Law 110-161 for the following multi-year program/project: Sustainable Resources Center LEAP Program for the purpose of Lead Hazard Control in conjunction with household weatherization in Hennepin, Ramsey, Dakota, Anoka and Washington counties. The Sustainable Resources Center is requesting the release of \$1,541,107 in Federal Assistance with a match of \$377,910, for the period of 10/1/2008 through 9/30/2011.

The proposed hazard control activities to be funded under this/these program(s) is/are categorically excluded from the National Environmental Policy Act requirements, but subject to compliance with some of the environmental laws and authorities listed at § 58.5 of 24 CFR Part 58. In accordance with §58.15, a tiered review process has been structured, whereby some environmental laws and authorities have been reviewed and studied for the intended target area(s) listed above. Other applicable environmental laws and authorities will be complied with, when individual projects are ripe for review. Specifically, the target area(s) has/have been studied and compliance with the following laws and authorities have been established in this Tier 1 review: Floodplain Management, Coastal Barriers Resource Act, and Coastal Zone Management Act. In the Tiered 2 review, compliance with the following environmental laws and authorities will take place for proposed projects funded under the program(s) listed above: Historic Preservation, National Flood Insurance Program requirements, Explosive & Flammable Operations, toxics/hazardous materials. Should individual aggregate projects exceed the threshold for categorical exclusion detailed at §58.35(a), an Environmental Assessment will be completed and a separate Finding of No Significant Impact and Request for Release of Funds published.
