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NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. The current 1999 set is a 13-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term *Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the commen period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the most current edition of the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issue #14-25 inclusive; issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26; issues #27-38 inclusive; issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39; issues #40-51 inclusive; and issues #1-52 (or 53 in some years), cumulative for issues #1-52 (or 53). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. 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Adopted Rules

A rule becomes effective after the requirements of *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.05-14.28 have been met and five working days after the rule is published in the *State Register*, unless a later date is required by statutes or specified in the rule. If an adopted rule is identical to its proposed form as previously published, a notice of adoption and a citation to its previous *State Register* publication will be printed. If an adopted rule differs from its proposed form, language which has been deleted will be printed with strikeouts and new language will be underlined. The rule's previous *State Register* publication will be cited.

KEY: Proposed Rules - <u>Underlining</u> indicates additions to existing rule language. Strikeouts indicate deletions from existing rule language. If a proposed rule is totally new, it is designated "all new material." **Adopted Rules** - <u>Underlining</u> indicates additions to proposed rule language. Strikeout indicates deletions from proposed rule language.

Pesticide and Fertilizer Management Division Notice of Comment Period on Draft Revised Water Quality Best Management Practices for Acetochlor and Water Quality Best Management Practices for Agricultural Herbicides

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Commissioner of the Minnesota Department of Agriculture (MDA) is accepting comments on draft revisions to the February 2004 "Water Quality Best Management Practices for Acetochlor," and those portions of the February 2004 "Water Quality Best Management Practices" affected by such revisions. Comments will be accepted for 60 days, ending on Friday, January 8, 2010. Information on submitting comments is given at the end of this notice.

Copies of the draft revised best management practices (BMPs) and the February 2004 best management practices are available at

www.mda.state.mn.us/herbicidebmps. They are also available by contacting the MDA; contact information is given at the end of this notice.

In revising the BMPs, the MDA specifically focused on:

- application setbacks or vegetative buffers along rivers, near lakes, around standpipes in tile-drained fields, and around other potential field runoff drainage conveyances — specifically methods of calculating or estimating necessary application setback distances or vegetative buffer widths to prevent or minimize herbicide runoff losses to adjacent surface waters;
- · reduced herbicide rates associated with changes in weed management in herbicide-resistant crops; and,
- · herbicide application technologies.

The BMPs were revised following the process outlined in MDA's "Pesticide Management Plan: A Plan for the Protection of Groundwater and Surface Water" (*http://www.mda.state.mn.us/protecting/waterprotection/pmp.aspx*). After seeking information from acetochlor product registrants, commodity groups and user groups, and after conducting literature reviews and consulting with local water planning authorities and University of Minnesota weed scientists, initial draft BMPs were prepared and distributed in June 2009 for comment to interested parties via the MDA's pesticide non-point source email listserv (instructions for subscribing to this listserv are given below). Based on comments received, draft revised BMPs are now being made available for comment.

Following the 60-day comment period, the Commissioner of the MDA will consider further revisions to the BMPs based on comments received. Once finalized, the revised "Water Quality Best Management Practices for Acetochlor," and "Water Quality Best Management Practices for Agricultural Herbicides" will be made available on the MDA's website (*www.mda.state.mn/herbicidebmps*) and distributed via the MDA's pesticide non-point source email listserv.

Minnesota Department of Health Division of Environmental Health, Indoor Environments and Radiation Section Request for Comments on Possible Amendment to Rules Governing Lead Poisoning and Prevention, *Minnesota Rules*, 4761.2000 to 4761.2700

Subject of Rules. The Minnesota Department of Health (department) requests comments on its possible amendment to rules governing lead poisoning and prevention. The department is considering rule amendments that will incorporate the US Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Pre-Renovation Education (PRE) regulation, and Renovation, Repair and Painting (RRP) regulation into the department's existing Lead Poisoning and Prevention Rules. The department is also looking at additional amendments to allow the department to develop a web-based program that allows electronic submission of lead applications and notices. The Department will also amend existing language to conform to these new provisions.

Persons Affected. The amendment to the rules would likely affect:

- currently licensed lead individuals and certified lead firms,
- property owners and occupants having renovation work done in their pre-1978 property, residence or child-occupied facility, and
- · individuals performing renovation, repair, and painting activities in pre-1978 residences and child-occupied facilities.

Statutory Authority. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 144.9508, requires the department to adopt rules consistent with sections 402(c)(3) and 406(b) of EPA's Toxic Substances Control Act.

Public Comment. Interested persons or groups may submit comments or information on these possible rules in writing until 4:30 p.m. on March 31, 2010. The department is also holding six public meetings throughout Minnesota from November 2009 through March 2010 to discuss EPA's PRE and RRP regulations and the department's current lead abatement rules. These meetings will also allow persons to make comments on the future implementation of these regulations.

The department is considering forming an advisory committee after the public comment period is over to discuss actual rule changes. Please include with your comments whether you are interested in included in the advisory committee.

Rules Drafts. The department has not yet prepared a draft of the possible rules amendments.

Request for Comments on Biennial Review of Rulemaking Procedures and Rules Related to the Minnesota Health Care Administrative Simplification Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, Sections 62J.50 to 62J.61

Rulemaking authority and procedure. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 62J.61, establishes a rulemaking procedure for adopting rules to implement the Minnesota Health Care Administrative Simplification Act. The procedure provides that:

- the Commissioner of Health must publish proposed rules in the State Register;
- the Commissioner may publish a notice describing the rules and offering a free copy instead of publishing the text of the rules, if the rules would be so lengthy as to be unduly cumbersome to publish;
- interested parties have 30 days to comment; and
- after considering all comments, the Commissioner may adopt the rules by publishing a notice of adoption in the State Register.

Reason for rulemaking authority. Health care industry billing procedures change frequently. It is important that rules keep current with these frequently changing procedures. The Legislature recognized that the normal rulemaking procedures in *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 14, which take an average of 18 months, would not be adequate to keep pace with the changes in the health care industry. Further, some of the billing manuals and implementation guides are hundreds of pages long. It would not be practical to publish these in the *State Register*, especially when these are of interest to a very small group of interested parties. It would be more cost effective to publish a notice and to give a free copy to anyone who requests one.

Biennial review of rulemaking procedures and rules. Section 62J.61, subdivision 5, requires that the Commissioner of Health conduct a biennial review of the rulemaking procedures and rules by seeking "comments from affected parties about the effectiveness of and continued need for the rulemaking procedures . . . and about the quality and effectiveness of rules adopted using these procedures." The Commissioner is required to invite oral or written comments by holding a meeting and by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 30 days before the meeting. The Commissioner is also required to write a report summarizing the comments and to submit the report to the Minnesota Health Data Institute and the Minnesota Administrative Uniformity Committee by January 15 of every evennumbered year.

Oral and written comments invited; deadline. Oral and written comments are invited about the effectiveness and continuing need for the rulemaking procedures and about the quality and effectiveness of rules adopted using these procedures. Comments may be

submitted until 4:00 p.m. on January 8, 2010. Comments may be submitted at the meeting described below or by sending them to the agency contact person, as set out later in this Request. Following the conclusion of the comment period on Friday, January 8, 2010, the Department will compile the comments and prepare the biennial report.

Meeting for receiving oral and written comments. The Department will hold a meeting to receive oral and written comments about the rulemaking procedures in section 62J.61. The meeting will be held in Room 365, Golden Rule Building, 85 East Seventh Place, St. Paul, Minnesota 55101, 9:00 a.m.- 11:00 a.m. on Wednesday, December 9, 2010. Background. The requirement to conduct a biennial review became effective on June 30, 1997. The Department used the rulemaking process pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes*, section 62J.61 most recently during 2007-2009 in rulemaking for Minnesota Uniform Companion Guides for the Implementation of the: Eligibility Inquiry and Response Electronic Transaction; Health Care Claim Electronic Transactions (Professional, Institutional, Dental and Pharmacy); and Health Care Claim Payment and Remittance Advice Electronic Transaction, as required by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 62J.536. The Department will be using the rulemaking procedure in 2010 for similar rulemaking to update and modify versions of Minnesota uniform companion guides as needed to be compliant with new versions of federal health care transactions standards.

Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) Division of Environmental Health, Indoor Environments and Radiation Section Request for Comments on Possible Amendment to Rules Governing Radioactive Materials, *Minnesota Rules*, Chapter 4731

Subject of Rules: The Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) requests comments on its possible amendment to rules governing radioactive material. The Department is considering rule amendments that include rules required by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) for compatibility as an Agreement State. The changes include qualifications for the nuclear medicine technologists. MDH adopted Chapter 4731, rules that govern radioactive material on January 3, 2005, amended the rule on November 20, 2007 and January 29, 2009.

Persons Affected. The amendment to the rules would likely affect persons who are licensed by MDH to own, posses, or use radioactive materials. This would include medical, veterinary, and industrial facilities. In addition, the amendment will impact individuals performing nuclear medicine procedures.

Statutory Authority. *Minnesota Statues*, sections 144.12, subdivision 1, item (15), authorize the MDH to adopt rules that allow the state to regulate radioactive materials for the safety of the patients and the public.

Public Comment. Interested persons or groups may submit comments or information on the amendment in writing when the MDH publishes it in the State Register. MDH will not publish a notice of intent to adopt the rules until more than 60 days have elapsed from the date of this request for comments.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to recipients, providers of services, and to the public of additions to the state Medical Assistance maximum allowable cost (state MAC) list for certain outpatient prescribed drugs.

At least once each calendar year, the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services, publishes a federal upper limit (FUL) payment schedule for many commonly prescribed multiple-source drugs. The federal upper limit is set at a rate equal to 150 percent of the published price for the least costly therapeutic equivalent that can be purchased by pharmacists. This FUL payment schedule constitutes the federal MAC list. For many multiple-source drugs that are not on the federal

MAC list, the Department establishes a state MAC list. Additionally, the Department imposes a state MAC for many multiple-source drugs that are on the federal MAC list, as long as the savings are at least as much as the savings would be using the federal MAC list.

The Department requires Medical Assistance pharmacy providers to submit their usual and customary costs. Pharmacy providers are reimbursed at the lower of: 1) the federal or state MAC, plus a dispensing fee; 2) the submitted usual and customary charge to the general public; or 3) a discount off of average wholesale price, plus a dispensing fee.

No earlier than November 10, 2009 the Department may add the following outpatient prescribed drugs to the state MAC list: Drug Name

BRIMONIDINE TARTRATE

These additions are made to bring Medical Assistance reimbursement to pharmacists more closely in line with the actual acquisition cost of the drugs listed above. The Department estimates that there will be a state savings of \$5,000.00 for State Fiscal Year 2009 (July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010).

Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) Public Notice on Draft/Proposed Air Emission Facility, Part 70 Fiberglass General Permit

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the Commissioner of the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) proposes to issue a federal general permit governing fiberglass sources with or without pollution control equipment. The issuance of this general permit is authorized by *Minnesota Rules* 7007.1100, subp. 1, which allows the MPCA to issue a general permit if "numerous and similar stationary sources are subject to substantially similar regulatory requirements. "The general permit applies to new and existing sources.

The stationary source eligible for the proposed general permit are major sources as defined in *Minnesota Rules* 7007.0200. The general permit covers stationary sources required to obtain permits under *Minnesota Rules* 7007.0250. The proposed general permit contains federally enforceable conditions to limit the potential-to-emit (PTE) of each pollutant (particulate matter (PM), particulate matter less than 10 microns (PM_{10}), particulate matter less that 2.5 microns ($PM_{2.5}$), carbon monoxide (CO), nitrogen oxides (NO_x), sulfur dioxide (SO_2) to less than 90 tons per year (tpy)), hazardous air pollutants (HAPs) to less than 100 tpy, and Ozone (volatile organic compounds (VOC)) to less than 240 tpy; therefore, each stationary source covered by this general permit is a non major source as defined in 40 CFR § 52.21 Prevention of Significant Deterioration (*Minnesota Rules* 7007.3000). Also, each stationary source is a non major source as defined in 40 CFR § 52.24 (*Minnesota Rules* 7007.4000) for all pollutants.

Each stationary source eligible for the proposed general permit may include the following types of equipment and activities for which a permit is required by *Minnesota Rules* 7007.0150: spray guns, spray and coating booths, molding, casting, lamination, mixing cleaning of surfaces, sanding, abrasive blasting, resin and gel coat, acid cleaning surfaces, fuel storage, boilers, catalytic and thermal oxidizers, baghouses, fabric filters, wall filters, flares, generators (internal combustion engines), burn-off ovens, furnaces, space heaters, dip tanks, ovens, soldering, welding, brazing, screen printing, stenciling, storage tanks, and other insignificant activities listed in *Minnesota Rules* 7007.1300 and/or conditionally insignificant activities listed in *Minnesota Rules* 7008.

A stationary source is not eligible for the proposed general permit, or ceases to be eligible for the proposed general permit, if any of the following are true:

- 1. The stationary source has an emission unit other than those described above;
- The stationary source has an emission unit subject to a Standard of Performance for New Stationary Sources in 40 CFR pt. 60 already adopted other than 40 CFR pt. 60, subp. Dc for small industrial commercial institutional steam generating units, subp. Kb for volatile organic liquid storage vessels, subp. IIII for compression ignition internal combustion engines and subp. JJJJ for spark ignition internal combustion engines;
- 3. The stationary source is affected by a 40 CFR pt. 63 National Emission Standard for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) already adopted other than 40 CFR pt. 63, subp. MMMM for surface coating of miscellaneous metal parts and products, subp. PPPP for surface coating of plastic parts, subp. WWWW for reinforced plastic composities production and subp. ZZZZ for reciprocating internal combustion engines;
- 4. The stationary source is one of the source categories listed in 40 CFR § 52.21(b)(1)(iii), the PSD of air quality rule;
- 5. The stationary source is located in or comes to be located in a PM_{10} maintenance area;
- 6. The stationary source includes a type of control equipment not covered in the proposed general permit;
- 7. The stationary source emits at any time a 12-month rolling sum of more than 90 tons of PM, PM₁₀, PM₂, CO, NO₂, and SO₂;
- 8. The stationary source emits at any time a 12-month rolling sum of more that 100 tons of HAPs and more than 240 tons of VOC;

A summary of the highest allowable PTE rates in tpy for each stationary source described in the proposed general permit are as follows:

As allowed by *Minnesota Rules* 7007.1100, subp. 5, the MPCA has developed a source-specific permit application that does not include all the required information given in *Minnesota Rules* 7007.0100 to 7007.1850. The differences between the application requirements and this general permit application are discussed in the Technical Support Document (TSD). The MPCA has developed application forms tailored to this general permit which the MPCA plans to use. The application forms and worksheets will be updated periodically, but will continue to contain the elements discussed in the TSD needed to determine eligibility for the general permit.

The overall general permit contains each applicable requirement that could apply to eligible stationary sources. Based upon the information in the permit application, certain geographic requirements that do not apply to a particular source's location will not be included in the general permit issued to that source. If a source is located outside the Minneapolis-St. Paul Air Quality Control Region, it will receive a general permit that does not include requirements that only apply to that region. Similarly, for sources located in the Minneapolis - St. Paul Air Quality Control Region, requirements that only outside the Twin Cities region will not be included in the general permit issue to the source. This will reduce unnecessary material in the general permits issued that could confuse a source.

The preliminary determination to issue the air emission general permit is tentative. There are four formal procedures for public participation in the MPCA's consideration of the general permit. Interested persons may (1) submit written comments on the proposed general permit; (2) request that the MPCA hold a public information meeting; (3) request the MPCA hold a contested case hearing; and/ or (4) submit a petition to the Commissioner requesting that the MPCA Board consider the permit matter.

The decision whether to issue the permit and, if so, under what terms, will be presented to the MPCA Board for decision if: (1) the Commissioner grants the petition requesting the matter be presented to the MPCA Board; (2) an MPCA Board member requests to hear the matter prior to the time the Commissioner makes a final decision on the permit; or (3) a request for a contested case hearing is pending. Otherwise, the Commissioner will make the decision.

Persons who submit comments or petitions to the MPCA must state (1) their interest in the general permit application or the draft permit; (2) the action they wish the MPCA to take, including specific references to the section of the draft permit they believe should be changed; and (3) the reasons supporting their position, stated with sufficient specificity as to allow the MPCA to investigate the merits of the position.

As described in Minnesota Rules 7000.1800, persons who submit requests for a contested case hearing must also state the issues they

propose to address in a contested case hearing, the specific relief requested or resolution of the matter, and the reasons (which may be in the form of proposed findings) supporting an MPCA decision to hold a contested case hearing. Failure to comply with these rules exactly may result in a denial of the request. The decision whether to hold a contested case hearing will be made under *Minnesota Rules* 7000.1900. Most public libraries throughout the state have copies of the current *Minnesota Rules*. They are also available on the Internet at *www.revisor.leg.state.mn.us*.
