Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. Exempt Rules

Exempt rules are excluded from the normal rulemaking procedures (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.386 and 14.388). They are most often of two kinds. One kind is specifically exempted by the Legislature from rulemaking procedures, but approved for form by the Revisor of Statutes, reviewed for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings, and then published in the *State Register*. These exempt rules are effective for two years only.

The second kind of exempt rule is one adopted where an agency for good cause finds that the rulemaking provisions of *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 14 are unnecessary, impracticable, or contrary to the public interest. This exemption can be used only where the rules:

- (1) address a serious and immediate threat to the public health, safety, or welfare, or
- (2) comply with a court order or a requirement in federal law in a manner that does not allow for compliance with *Minnesota Statutes* Sections 14.14-14.28, or
 - (3) incorporate specific changes set forth in applicable statutes when no interpretation of law is required, or
 - (4) make changes that do not alter the sense, meaning, or effect of the rules.

These exempt rules are also reviewed for form by the Revisor of Statutes, for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings and then published in the *State Register*. In addition, the Office of Administrative Hearings must determine whether the agency has provided adequate justification for the use of this exemption. Rules adopted under clauses (1) or (2) above are effective for two years only. The Legislature may also exempt an agency from the normal rulemaking procedures and establish other procedural and substantive requirements unique to that exemption.

Board of Cosmetologist ExaminersAdopted Exempt Permanent Rules Relating to Cosmetology; License Renewal

2105.0200 LICENSE RENEWAL FOR INDIVIDUALS.

Subpart 1. **Application.** All licenses expire on December 31 the last day of the individual's birth month of the year due and each licensee is responsible for renewing his or her license. An individual who does not renew his or her license by December 31 the last day of the birth month of the year in which it is due is considered unlicensed as of January 1. A postmark of December 31 constitutes timely renewal the first day of the following month. Failure to receive a notice of renewal from the board does not constitute a valid excuse for not renewing the license.

2105.0330 SALON LICENSE RENEWAL.

Subpart 1. Requirements. The requirements of subparts 2 to 4 shall be met in order to renew a license.

Subp. 2. **Request for renewal.** All licenses expire on December 31 the last day of the month of initial licensure of the year due and each licensee is responsible for renewing his or her license. A salon license that is not renewed by December 31 the last day of the month of initial licensure of the year due is considered unlicensed as of January 1. A postmark of December 31 constitutes timely renewal the first day of the following month. Not receiving a notice of renewal from the board does not constitute a valid excuse for not renewing the license.

The rules proposed and published at *State Register*, Volume 35, Number 14, pages 531-540, October 04, 2010 (35 SR 531), are adopted as proposed.

Expedited Rules

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt expedited rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for normal rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the conditions. Expedited rules are effective upon publication in the State Register, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain conditions.

Expedited rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific *Minnesota Statute* citations accompanying these expedited rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.

Department of Health (MDH)Adopted Expedited Permanent Rules Relating to Health Quality Measures

The rules proposed and published at *State Register*, Volume 35, Number 6, pages 194-196, August 09, 2010 (35 SR 194), are adopted with the following modifications:

4654.0200 **DEFINITIONS.**

Subp. 13. **Physician clinic.** "Physician clinic" means any location where primary or specialty care ambulatory services are provided for a fee by one or more physicians in the state of Minnesota. Physician clinic includes outpatient surgery ambulatory surgical centers and hospital-based outpatient locations that provide primary or specialty care ambulatory services for a fee. With the exception of ambulatory surgical centers, multiple clinic locations may be considered a single physician clinic when the multiple locations have common ownership and a majority of common clinical staff working across the multiple locations, and the total clinical staff across all locations is no greater than 20 full-time equivalent employees.

Subp. 22. **Urgent care center.** "Urgent care center" means a medical facility where ambulatory patients can walk in without an appointment and receive services required to treat an illness or injury that would not result in further disability or death if not treated immediately, but requires professional attention and that has the potential to develop such a threat if treatment is delayed. Urgent care center does not include physician clinics offering extended hours for patient care.

4654.0300 PROVIDER SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS.

Subpart 1. Physician clinics.

- C. Each physician clinic with an electronic medical record in place for an entire measurement period must begin to report on a full population basis in the subsequent reporting cycle.
- D. If less than ten percent of a physician clinic's population is age 18 or older, that physician clinic is exempt from reporting on quality measures in Appendix A applicable to patients age 18 or older.

Subp. 2. Hospitals.

B. If less than ten percent of a hospital's patient population is age 18 or older, that hospital is exempt from reporting on quality measures in Appendix B applicable to patients age 18 or older.

4654.0800 INCORPORATION BY REFERENCE.

"Minnesota Statewide Quality Reporting and Measurement System: Appendices to Minnesota Administrative Rules, Chapter 4654," issued by the Minnesota Department of Health, <u>August November</u> 2010, is incorporated by reference. Expedited Emergency Rules

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt expedited emergency rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for emergency rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the emergency conditions. Expedited emergency rules are effective upon publication in the State Register, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain emergency conditions.

Expedited emergency rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific *Minnesota Statute* citations accompanying these expedited emergency rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.

Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Adopted Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rules: Spring Turkey Hunt

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the above entitled rules have been adopted through the process prescribed by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 84.027, subdivision 13 (b). The statutory authority for the contents of the rules is *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 97A.435, 97B.711, and 97B.723.

Annual turkey population and harvest data needed for selecting hunters, setting quotas and areas are not available until August. Comments taken during public meetings suggest that changing the application deadline and the streamlining the application process will result in more hunter participation. This change is part of an upcoming permanent rule package that could not be completed before the 2011 application deadline.

6236.0300 TURKEY HUNT DRAWING.

Subp. 2. **Participation in application drawings.** Applicants may complete an application for either the spring or fall turkey hunt or both. A person may not apply more than once for a hunt, whether as an individual or as a member of a group. Qualifying individuals may apply for the resident landowner-tenant turkey drawing. All of the information in items A to <u>G_H</u> must be supplied on the application forms

D: An applicant must select a first choice of wild turkey permit area and time period and may select a second choice of wild turkey permit area in specified time periods as authorized by the commissioner.

- $\underline{\mathbf{E}}\underline{\mathbf{D}}$. Up to four persons desiring to hunt together as a group may apply as a group. Group applications shall either all be selected or none selected. All group members must apply for the same wild turkey permit areas and time periods. The preference rating of applicants who apply as a group shall be determined by the individual in the group with the lowest preference. Group applications may be made up of all general or all landowner-tenant applications, but not both.
- F<u>E</u>. A person who applies as a landowner or tenant but does not meet the definition as provided by this part will be ineligible for that season's drawings.
 - <u>G.F.</u> Application deadlines are as follows:
 - (1) spring season: the first Friday in December second Friday in January; and
 - (2) fall season: the last Friday in July.
- G. A person who has not purchased a 2011 spring turkey license for seasons A to F may purchase a turkey hunting license to hunt the spring turkey season during either the seventh time period May 13-19 or the eighth time period May 20-26.

Expedited Emergency Rules

(1) A turkey hunting license under this item may be purchased directly from an ELS vendor and is separate from the lottery process.

(2) Turkey lottery preference points shall not be reduced for a person purchasing a license under this item.

H. Youth age 17 and younger may purchase a turkey hunting license to hunt one of the eight spring turkey seasons. A turkey hunting license under this item is separate from the normal lottery process and is effective for hunting only in wild turkey permit areas during an established time period. The youth hunter must select a permit area.

6236.0810 WILD TURKEY PERMITAREA DESCRIPTIONS.

Wild turkey permit areas are comprised of registration blocks with the same numbers, as established in part 6232.4700, except as follows:

- A. wild turkey permit area 425 consists of registration blocks 425 282 and 435 281;
- B. wild turkey permit area 451 consists of registration blocks 451 234, 452 237, and 453 294; and
- C. wild turkey permit area 454 consists of registration blocks 454 238 and 455. 295; and

D. permit areas 230 to 233, 237, 250 to 255, and 269 to 299 shall be identified in application materials and on electronically issued licenses by the three-digit number that appears in parenthesis following the permit area number under part 6236.1060.





Exhibit A-4 (25-140-37) and Exhibit A-5 (9,16-141-36):

These two designations are for routes which have a history of motorized use for access by duck hunters. Designation and subsequent posting of the routes as minimum maintenance forest roads will allow for legal motorized use on State land classified as "limited".



Section 8-142-37: these are portions of old skid trails from a logging operation which are not used by motorized vehicles.

Official Notices
