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# Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. 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# **Expedited Rules**

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt expedited rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for normal rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the conditions. Expedited rules are effective upon publication in the State Register, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain conditions.

Expedited rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific *Minnesota Statute* citations accompanying these expedited rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.

**Introduction.** The Department of Public Safety intends to adopt rules under the expedited rulemaking process set forth in the rules of the Office of Administrative Hearings, part 1400.2410, and the Administrative Procedure Act, Minnesota Statutes, section 14.389. **Subject of Rules and Statutory Authority.** The proposed expedited new rules govern evidentiary breath testing performed by law enforcement personnel throughout the state. The Department's statutory authority to adopt these rules through the expedited process is set forth in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 169A.75 paragraph (c).

The amendment is to add a third breath testing instrument option. A copy of the proposed rules is published in the *State Register* and attached to this notice as mailed.

Comments. You have until 4:30 p.m. on **February 8, 2012,** to submit written comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed rules or any part or subpart of the rules. Your comment must be in writing and received by the agency contact person by the due date. Comments are encouraged. Your comments should identify the portion of the proposed expedited rule addressed and the reason for the comment. You are encouraged to propose any change that you desire. Any comments that you would like to make on the legality of the propose rule must be made during this comment period.

**Alternative Format/Accommodation.** Upon request, the Department can make this Notice available in an alternative format, such as large print, Braille, or cassette tape. To make such a request please contact the agency contact person at the address or telephone number listed above.

**Modifications.** The Department may modify the proposed expedited rule if the modifications do not make the rule substantially different as defined in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.05, subdivision 2, paragraphs (b) and (c), unless the procedure under part 1400.2110 has been followed. If the final rule is identical to the rule originally published in the *State Register*, the agency will publish a notice of adoption in the State Register. If the final rule is different from the rule originally published in the State Register, the agency must publish a copy of the changes in the State Register. If the proposed expedited rule affects you in any way, you are encouraged to participate in the rulemaking process.

#### 7502.0425 APPROVED BREATH TEST INSTRUMENTS FOR ANALYZING BREATH SAMPLES.

Subpart 1. **Intoxilyzer 5000EN.** The Intoxilyzer 5000EN, which uses that employs infrared technology, is approved by the commissioner for use in this state for the purpose of determining the alcohol concentration of a breath sample.

Subp. 2. **Datamaster DMT-G**. The Datamaster DMT-G, which uses infrared technology and fuel cell technology, is approved by the commissioner for use in this state for the purpose of determining the alcohol concentration of a breath sample with Fuel Cell Option is approved by the commissioner for use for the purpose of determining the alcohol concentration of a breath sample employing infrared technology only, and for use employing infrared technology used in conjunction with fuel cell technology.

# Notice of Public Hearing Regarding the Issuance of Adjustable Rate Supplemental Student Loan Program Revenue Bonds, 2012 Series

The Minnesota Office of Higher Education (the "Issuer"), through its designated Hearing Officer, will hold a public hearing at 9:00 a.m. in 1450 Energy Park Drive, Suite 350, St. Paul, Minnesota on February 1, 2012, on the issuance of Adjustable Rate Supplemental Student Loan Program Revenue Bonds, Series 2012 (the "Bonds").

The Bonds are being issued in one or more series for the purpose of (i) refunding prior bonds issued by the Issuer for the purpose of making loans to eligible students ("Student Loans"), (ii) financing or making additional Student Loans under the Issuer's Supplemental Student Loan Program in accordance with the provisions of *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 136A, as amended, (iii) funding certain funds and (iv) paying a portion of the costs of issuance of the Bonds (the "Project"). The Issuer's principal offices are located at 1450 Energy Park Drive, Suite 350, St. Paul, Minnesota 55108.

The Bonds are proposed to be issued in an amount not to exceed \$135,000,000. The Bonds shall be limited obligations of the Issuer payable from and secured solely by all payments of principal of and interest on certain Student Loans and the proceeds thereof, certain funds and accounts and other collateral constituting the security as to be described in the resolution authorizing the Bonds. The Bonds will not be deemed to constitute a pledge of the faith of the Issuer or the State of Minnesota, but shall be payable solely from revenues pledged by the Issuer in accordance with an indenture of trust, as supplemented. Neither the faith or credit nor the taxing power of the State of Minnesota will be pledged to the payment of principal of or the interest on the Bonds. The Issuer has no taxing power.

The hearing shall provide the fullest opportunity for expression of opinion, for argument on the merits and for the introduction of documentary evidence pertinent to the nature of the Project and the proposed issuance of the Bonds. Written comments will be accepted by the Issuer at 1450 Energy Park Drive, Suite 350, St. Paul, Minnesota 55108, but must be received on or before the date of the hearing.

The Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) is requesting comments on the draft Report for the Mill Creek Fecal Coliform TMDL & Pearl Lake Excessive Nutrient TMDL. The draft TMDL Report is available for review at

Following the comments, the MPCA will revise the draft TMDL Report and submit it to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for approval. Comments must be received by the MPCA contact person by the public comment period end date shown above.

Required by the federal Clean Water Act, a TMDL is a scientific study that calculates the maximum amount of a pollutant that a waterbody can receive and still meet water quality standards for that pollutant. It is a process that identifies all the sources of the pollutant

causing an impairment and allocates necessary reductions among them. This multi-year effort results in a pollution reduction plan and engages stakeholders and the general public. An approved TMDL is followed by implementation activities for achieving the necessary reductions.

Mill Creek from its headwaters to the Sauk River (reach ID 07010202-537) is impaired and does not meet Minnesota water quality standards for pathogen indicator bacteria *Escherichia coli* (*E. coli*). The bacterial abundance in excess of the water quality standards can pose a health risk to swimmers and bathers and can limit other recreational uses.

Mill Creek is a tributary to the Sauk River, located in the southeastern portion of the Sauk River watershed in central Minnesota. The creek flows into the Sauk River in the city of Rockville, 16 miles upstream of the confluence of the Sauk River and the Mississippi River at Sauk Rapids. The Mill Creek watershed is approximately 48 square miles in size, and land use in the watershed is predominantly agricultural.

Pearl Lake (DNR ID 73-0037) is currently listed on the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency's (MPCA) 2010 303(d) Impaired Waters List due to excessive nutrients (phosphorus). Pearl Lake is located in Stearns County, Minnesota and is within the North Central Hardwood Forest (NCHF) ecoregion. Pearl Lake is a relatively shallow, eutrophic lake approximately 750 acres in size.

# Public Notice of Availability of the Draft TMDL Study for Rice Lake Excess Nutrient TMDL Report and Request for Comment

The Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) is requesting comments on the draft Report for Rice Lake Nutrient Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL). The draft TMDL Report for Rice Lake is available for review at

http://www.pca.state.mn.us/water/tmdl/tmdl-draft.html.

Following the comments, the MPCA will revise the draft TMDL Report and submit it to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for approval. Comments must be received by the MPCA contact person listed below by February 8, 2012.

Required by the federal Clean Water Act, a TMDL is a scientific study that calculates the maximum amount of a pollutant that a waterbody can receive and still meet water quality standards for that pollutant. It is a process that identifies all the sources of the pollutant causing an impairment and allocates necessary reductions among them. This multi-year effort results in a pollution reduction plan and engages stakeholders and the general public. An approved TMDL is followed by implementation activities for achieving the necessary reductions.

Rice Lake is a 1,651 acre lake located in the North Fork Crow River watershed in the Upper Mississippi River Basin. In 2008, the MPCA determined that Rice Lake failed to attain the designated use for aquatic life and recreation due to excess nutrients and placed the lake on the 303(d) list.

Rice Lake was placed on the state's impaired waters list because of excess nutrient levels, particularly phosphorus. While phosphorus is an essential nutrient for algae and plants, it is considered a pollutant when it stimulates excessive growth of algae or aquatic plants. The TMDL study assessed the pollutant concentrations and indicated the current phosphorus load of 5.3 kg/day will need to be reduced to 3.78 kg/day for Rice Lake to meet the water-quality standards during the summer growing season.
