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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. 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Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101, an agency must first solicit comments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 says before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

The State Register also publishes other official notices of state agencies and non-state agencies, including notices of meetings and matters of public interest.

Public Notice of Maximum Allowable Costs of Medical Assistance Outpatient **Prescribed Drugs**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to recipients, providers of services, and to the public of additions to the state Medical Assistance maximum allowable cost (state MAC) list for certain outpatient prescribed drugs.

Minnesota Statute 256B.0625 subd. 13e (e) gives the commissioner the authority to negotiate reimbursement rates for specialty pharmacy products. The commissioner employs a Specialty Maximum Allowable Cost (Specialty MAC) reimbursement methodology for specialty products. Specialty pharmaceutical products include injectable and infusion therapies, biotechnology drugs, antihemophilic factor products, high-cost therapies, and therapies that require complex care.

No earlier than March 19, 2013 the Department may add the following outpatient prescribed drugs to the state MAC list:

Drug UPC Name

GATTEX (TEDUGLUTIDE)

These additions are made to bring Medical Assistance reimbursement to pharmacists more closely in line with the actual acquisition cost of the drugs listed above. The Department estimates that there will be a state savings of \$10,000 for State Fiscal Year 2013 (July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013).

This notice is published pursuant to *Code of Federal Regulations*, Title 42, section 447.205, which requires publication of a notice when there is a rate change in the methods and standards for setting payment rates for Medical Assistance services.

Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Notice of Proposed Changes Affecting Recreational Trails and Off-Highway Vehicle Use on State Forest Lands in Pine County

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is considering changes to recreational trails and off-trail motor vehicle use on state forest lands in the Chengwatana, Nemadji, St. Croix, and General Andrews state forests in Pine County.

The proposed changes include: designating new motorized trail segments; designating new hunter-walking trails; designating new motorized uses for existing motorized trails; undesignating segments of existing trail; and designating areas where off-trail motor vehicle use is prohibited during hunting and trapping activities ("areas with limitations").

The four affected forests are classified "Limited" with respect to motorized use, which means forest roads are open to motor vehicle use unless posted closed, and forest trails are closed to motor vehicle use unless posted open. The DNR does not propose to change the "Limited" classification.

Minnesota Statutes, section 89.19, subdivision 2 governs designations of forest trails and changes to existing designations. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 84.926, subdivision 5 governs the designation of areas with limitations on off-trail motor vehicle use for hunting big game and installing hunting stands, retrieving big game, tending traps, and trapping minnows.

The DNR will hold an open house to present information and receive public comments on the proposed changes. The open house is scheduled for May 22, 2013, from 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM at the Askov Town Hall, 6369 Kobmagergade, Askov, MN 55704.
