# Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

### NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. # **Expedited Emergency Rules**

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt expedited emergency rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for emergency rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the emergency conditions. Expedited emergency rules are effective upon publication in the State Register, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain emergency conditions.

Expedited emergency rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific *Minnesota Statute* citations accompanying these expedited emergency rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.

# Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Adopted Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rules: Waterfowl Season

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the above entitled rules have been adopted through the process prescribed by *Minnesota Statutes*, Section 84.027, subdivision 13 (b). The statutory authority for the contents of the rule is *Minnesota Statutes*, Sections 97B.105, 97B.112, 97B.731, and 97B.803.

The emergency conditions that do not allow compliance with Minnesota Statutes, Sections 97A.0451 to 97A.0459, are as follows: The waterfowl hunting seasons are based on annual determinations of season timing and selection of the options as allowed under federal frameworks for migratory bird hunting. Provisions for taking waterfowl are based on population data that are not available until June and selection of options as allowed under federal frameworks for migratory bird hunting announced in August of each year.

### 6234.0800 HUNTING BY FALCONRY.

Subp. 4. **Open season and hours for migratory game birds.** Woodcock, sora and Virginia rails, mourning dove, and common snipe may be taken by falconry from September 1 to December 16. Ducks, coots, and moorhens (Gallinules) may be taken by falconry from the Saturday nearest October 1 to the Saturday nearest January 14 September 22 to December 2 only when they may be taken by firearm and from December 15 to January 29 statewide. Geese may be taken by falconry during any open goose season. Crows may be taken by

falconry during the open season. Falconry hours are from one-half hour before sunrise to sunset, except during the regular waterfowl season when falconry hours are the same as waterfowl shooting hours.

#### 6240.0610 YOUTH WATERFOWL HUNTING DAYS.

Subpart 1. **Dates, eligibility, and license requirements.** Ducks, mergansers, coots, moorhens, and Canada geese may be taken statewide on the Saturday nearest, September 17.8, by hunters 15 years of age or younger. An adult mentor 18 years of age or older, who is authorized by the youth's parent or guardian, must accompany the youth hunter at all times during the hunt. The accompanying adult may not hunt. No hunting license or waterfowl stamps are required.

#### 6240.0650 TAKING COOTS, MOORHENS, AND DUCKS.

Subpart 1. Open season. Coots, moorhens, and ducks may be taken:

A. in the North Waterfowl Zone, as described in subpart 3, during the 60-day period from September 22 to November 20;

B. in the Central Waterfowl Zone, as described in subpart 3, during the 60-day period that includes September 20 to 30 and October 6 to November 25; and

C. in the remainder of the state during the 60-day period that includes September 22 to 30 and October 13 to December 2.

Subp. 2. **Daily limits.** In any one day, a person may not take more than six ducks, five mergansers, and a total of 15 coots and moorhens. The daily limit of ducks, other than mergansers, may not include more than four mallards, including two female mallards; two pintail; two redheads; four scaup; three wood ducks; one black duck; and one canvasback. The daily limit of mergansers may not include more than two hooded mergansers.

#### Subp. 3. Waterfowl zones. Zones for ducks and geese are designated and described as follows:

A. the North Waterfowl Zone consists of that portion of the state north of a line beginning on Minnesota Highway 210 at the western boundary of the state; thence along Minnesota Highway 210 to Minnesota Highway 23; thence along Minnesota Highway 23 to Minnesota Highway 39; thence along Minnesota Highway 39 to the eastern border of the state;

B. the South Waterfowl Zone consists of that portion of the state south of a line extending from the South Dakota state line along U.S. Highway 212 to Interstate 494; thence along Interstate 494 to Interstate 94; thence along Interstate 94 to the Wisconsin state line; and

C. the Central Waterfowl Zone consists of that portion of the state that is not included in the North or South Waterfowl Zone.

### 6240.0950 TAKING CANADA GEESE.

Subpart 1. Open season. Canada geese may be taken:

A. in the North Waterfowl Zone, as described in part 6240.0650, subpart 3, during the 86-day period from September 22 to December 16;

B. in the Central Waterfowl Zone, as described in part 6240.0650, subpart 3, during the 86-day period that includes September 22 to 30 and October 6 to December 21; and

C. in the South Waterfowl Zone, as described in part 6240.0860, subpart 3, during the 86-day period that includes September 22 to 30 and October 13 to December 28.

Subp. 2. Daily limit. A person may not take more than three Canada geese statewide.

**EFFECTIVE PERIOD.** The emergency amendments to *Minnesota Rules*, parts 6234.0800 and 6240.0610, expire January 30, 2013. After the emergency amendments expire, the permanent rules as they read prior to those amendments again take effect, except as they may be amended by permanent rule. *Minnesota Rules*, parts 6240.0650 and 6240.0950, expire January 30, 2013.

Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101, an agency must first solicit comments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

The Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) is requesting comments on the draft Crystal Lake Excess Nutrient Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL). The draft Lake Nutrient TMDL Report for Crystal Lake in Blue Earth County is available for review at:

Following the comments, the MPCA will revise the draft TMDL Report and submit it to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for approval. Comments must be sent to the MPCA contact person listed below by 4:30 p.m. on September 26, 2012.

Required by the federal Clean Water Act, a TMDL is a scientific study that calculates the maximum amount of a pollutant that a waterbody can receive and still meet water quality standards for that pollutant. It is a process that identifies sources of the pollutant causing an impairment and allocates necessary reductions among them. This multi-year effort results in a pollution reduction plan and engages stakeholders and the general public. An approved TMDL is followed by implementation activities for achieving the necessary reductions.

This TMDL study covers Crystal Lake, a 355 acre shallow lake located in the Middle Minnesota River Basin and its contributing watershed of approximately 14,000 acres that includes the Crystal Loon Mills Lakes watersheds and the City of Lake Crystal. The watershed has local significance as a popular recreational resource and has experienced several toxic algae blooms in recent years affecting utilization of the lake.

**Written Comments:** You may submit written comments on the conditions of the draft TMDL Report or on the Commissioner's preliminary determination.

Written comments must include the following:

- 1. A statement of your interest in the draft TMDL Report;
- 2. A statement of the action you wish the MPCA to take, including specific references to sections of the draft TMDL that you believe should be changed; and
- 3. The reasons supporting your position, stated with sufficient specificity as to allow the Commissioner to investigate the merits of your position.

**Petition for Public Informational Meeting:** You also may request that the MPCA Commissioner hold a public informational meeting. A public informational meeting is an informal meeting that the MPCA may hold to solicit public comment and statements on matters before the MPCA, and to help clarify and resolve issues.

A petition requesting a public informational meeting must include the following information:

- 1. A statement identifying the matter of concern;
- 2. The information required under items 1 through 3 of "Written Comments," identified above;
- 3. A statement of the reasons the MPCA should hold a public informational meeting; and
- 4. The issues that you would like the MPCA to address at the public informational meeting.

**Petition for Contested Case Hearing:** You also may submit a petition for a contested case hearing. A contested case hearing is a formal evidentiary hearing before an administrative law judge. In accordance with *Minnesota Rules* 7000.1900, the MPCA will grant a petition to hold a contested case hearing if it finds that: (1) there is a material issue of fact in dispute concerning the application or draft TMDL Report; (2) the MPCA has the jurisdiction to make a determination on the disputed material issue of fact; and (3) there is a reasonable basis underlying the disputed material issue of fact or facts such that the holding of the contested case hearing would allow the introduction of information that would aid the MPCA in resolving the disputed facts in making a final decision on the draft TMDL Report. A material issue of fact means a fact question, as distinguished from a policy question, whose resolution could have a direct bearing on a final MPCA decision.

A petition for a contested case hearing must include the following information:

- A statement of reasons or proposed findings supporting the MPCA decision to hold a contested case hearing according to the criteria in *Minnesota Rules* 7000.1900, as discussed above; and
- A statement of the issues proposed to be addressed by a contested case hearing and the specific relief requested or resolution of the matter.

In addition and to the extent known, a petition for a contested case hearing should also include the following information:

- 1. A proposed list of prospective witnesses to be called, including experts, with a brief description of proposed testimony or summary of evidence to be presented at a contested case hearing;
- 2. A proposed list of publications, references, or studies to be introduced and relied upon at a contested case hearing; and

3. An estimate of time required for you to present the matter at a contested case hearing.

MPCA Decision: You may submit a petition to the Commissioner requesting that the MPCA Citizens' Board consider the TMDL Report approval. To be considered timely, the petition must be received by the MPCA by 4:30 p.m. on the date the public comment period ends, identified on page 1 of this notice. Under the provisions of *Minnesota Statutes* § 116.02, subd 6 (4), the decision whether to submit the TMDL Report and, if so, under what terms will be presented to the Board for decision if: (1) the Commissioner grants the petition requesting the matter be presented to the Board; (2) one or more Board members request to hear the matter before the time the Commissioner makes a final decision on the TMDL Report; or (3) a timely request for a contested case hearing is pending. You may participate in the activities of the MPCA Board as provided in *Minnesota Rules* 7000.0650.

The written comments, requests, and petitions submitted on or before the last day of the public comment period will be considered in the final decision on this TMDL Report. If the MPCA does not receive written comments, requests, or petitions during the public comment period, MPCA staff as authorized by the Board, will make the final decision on the draft TMDL Report.
