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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. 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Adopted Rules

A rule becomes effective after the requirements of *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.05-14.28 have been met and five working days after the rule is published in the *State Register*, unless a later date is required by statutes or specified in the rule. If an adopted rule is identical to its proposed form as previously published, a notice of adoption and a citation to its previous *State Register* publication will be printed. If an adopted rule differs from its proposed form, language which has been deleted will be printed with strikeouts and new language will be underlined. The rule's previous *State Register* publication will be cited.

KEY: Proposed Rules - <u>Underlining</u> indicates additions to existing rule language. Strikeouts indicate deletions from existing rule language. If a proposed rule is totally new, it is designated "all new material." **Adopted Rules** - <u>Underlining</u> indicates additions to proposed rule language. Strikeout indicates deletions from proposed rule language.

Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry (DLI) Adopted Permanent Rules Relating to OSHA Filing and Service

The rules proposed and published at *State Register*, Volume 38, Number 20, pages 605-607, November 12, 2013 (38 SR 605), are adopted as proposed.

Executive Orders

The governor has the authority to issue written statements or orders, called Executive Orders. as well as Emergency Executive Orders. The governor's authority is specified in the *Constitution of the State of Minnesota*, Article V, and in *Minnesota Statutes* § 4.035. Emergency Executive Orders, for protection from an imminent threat to health and safety, become effective immediately, are filed with the secretary of state, and published in the *State Register* as soon as possible after they are issued. Other Executive Orders become effective 15 days after publication in the *State Register* and filing with the secretary of state. Unless otherwise specified, an executive order expires 90 days after the date the governor who issued the order vacates office.

Office of the Governor Executive Order 14-09: Directing Agency Cooperation on the Minnesota Agricultural Water Quality Certification Program

I, MARK DAYTON, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, by virtue of the power vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes do hereby issue this Executive Order:

WHEREAS, Minnesota farmers provide food, feed, fuel, and fiber for the Nation and the World, and agriculture is a cornerstone of Minnesota's economy;

WHEREAS, Minnesotans value the health of our rivers, lakes, streams, wetlands, and groundwater;

Executive Orders =

WHEREAS, we must continue to protect the environment while supporting economic development in the State of Minnesota;

WHEREAS, we seek to recognize the environmental stewardship of farmers and ranchers who implement and maintain desired soil and water practices;

WHEREAS, on January 17, 2012, I signed a historic Memorandum of Understanding with Thomas J. Vilsack, Secretary, U.S. Department of Agriculture and Lisa Jackson, Administrator, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, pledging to work together to support the development of Minnesota's Agricultural Water Quality Certification Program;

WHEREAS, in 2013, the Minnesota Legislature passed *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 17.9891- 17.993, authorizing Minnesota Department of Agriculture, in consultation with Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, and Minnesota Board of Water and Soil Resources, to implement a Minnesota Agricultural Water Quality Certification Program;

WHEREAS, this voluntary program will first be piloted in selected watersheds across the state, until the Commissioner of Minnesota Department of Agriculture, in consultation with the Minnesota Agricultural Water Quality Certification Program Advisory Committee, the Commissioner of the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, the Commissioner of the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, and the Minnesota Board of Soil and Water Resources, determines the program is suitable to be implemented in other watersheds;

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Agricultural Water Quality Certification Program will help to enhance the water quality of Minnesota's rivers, lakes, streams, wetlands and groundwater, as well as promote the environmental stewardship of Minnesota's farmers;

WHEREAS, Minnesota water quality protection authorities and responsibilities are shared between several state agencies.

NOW, THEREFORE, I order that:

1. The Commissioner of Minnesota Department of Agriculture, on behalf of Minnesota Department of Agriculture, Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, Minnesota Board of Water and Soil Resources, and Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, will sign the certification contracts with the producers upon evidence that the producers have satisfied all program requirements; and

2. The Commissioners of Minnesota Department of Agriculture, Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, Minnesota Board of Water and Soil Resources, and Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, shall honor Minnesota Department of Agriculture's certification contracts with the producers; and

3. In accordance with Minnesota Statutes, each previously mentioned agency shall honor the producers' certification contracts with Minnesota Department of Agriculture, when implementing new water quality laws and rules that are adopted following the producers' certifications; and

4. By conclusion of the pilot period, the previously mentioned agencies shall develop a memorandum of understanding clarifying the roles and responsibilities of each agency for the permanent program.

This Executive Order shall remain in effect until rescinded by proper authority or until it expires in accordance with *Minnesota Statutes*, section 4.035, subdivision 3.

Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101, an agency must first solicit comments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

Description of Projects and Proposed JCF Funding:

Andersen Corporation is expanding at 100 Fourth Avenue North, in Bayport (Washington County), Minnesota. The project will involve improvements to an existing building and purchase of machinery and equipment with total project costs of approximately \$18 million. The company expects to create at least 100 full-time permanent jobs at an average cash wage of \$17.62 per hour. The project is eligible for a job creation award of up to \$500,000 and a capital investment rebate of up to \$126,900.

Rosemount, Inc., a subsidiary of Emerson, is expanding at 6201 Innovation Drive, in Shakopee (Scott County), Minnesota. The project will involve an expansion of an existing building with total project expenditures of approximately \$26 million. The company expects to create 200 full-time permanent jobs within three years at an average cash wage of \$17.80 per hour. The project is eligible for a job creation award of up to \$905,000.

Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) Division of Environmental Health, Environmental Surveillance and Assessment Section REQUEST FOR COMMENTS on Possible Amendments to Rules Governing Health Risk Limits, *Minnesota Rules*, Parts 4717.7500, 4717.7850, and 4717.7860

Subject of Rules. The Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) requests comments on possible amendments to rules governing Health Risk Limits (HRLs) for water. The amendments will add new HRL values or replace outdated HRL values for water contaminants to the existing Health Risk Limits Tables (parts 4717.7500, 4717.7850, and 4717.7860) in the existing rule, plus any related changes necessary accomplish this.

Persons Affected. The possible amendments to the rules will likely affect risk managers in partner state and local agencies: the Minnesota Department of Agriculture (MDA), the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA), and local public health agencies. Partner agencies rely on HRL values as one standard for environmental assessment and risk management to protect water. Industries that manufacture the identified chemicals and environmental groups that monitor water quality are also affected. The proposed amendments ultimately affect drinking water of all Minnesotans.

Statutory Authority. The Groundwater Protection Act of 1989 (*Minnesota Statutes*, Section 103H.201); *Laws of Minnesota 2013*, chapter 137, article 2, section 8; and *Minnesota Statutes*, Section 144.12, subd. 1 (5) authorize MDH to adopt and revise health risk limits for substances degrading water. The 2001 Health Standards Statute (*Minnesota Statutes*, Section 144.0751) specifies additional requirements for establishing safe drinking water standards.

Public Comment. MDH is seeking comment at this time on the specific water contaminants and the corresponding values that are being considered for the rule amendment. MDH is also seeking comment on the cumulative regulatory results from adding the incremental impact of the proposed rule to other state and federal rules related to the same specific purpose.

Interested persons or groups may submit comments or information on these possible rules in writing or orally until MDH publishes a notice of intent to adopt amendments in the *State Register*. MDH will not publish such a notice until more than 60 days have elapsed from the date of this request for comments. Minnesota Statute section 161.315 prohibits the Commissioner, counties, towns, or home rule or statutory cities from awarding or approving the award of a contract for goods or services to a person who is suspended or debarred, including:

- 1) any contract under which a debarred or suspended person will serve as a subcontractor or material supplier,
- 2) any business or affiliate which the debarred or suspended person exercises substantial influence or control, and
- 3) any business or entity, which is sold or transferred by a debarred person to a relative or any other party over whose actions the debarred person exercises substantial influence or control, remains ineligible during the duration of the seller's or transfer's debarment.

State Grants & Loans

In addition to requests by state agencies for technical/professional services (published in the State Contracts Section), the *State Register* also publishes notices about grants and loans available through any agency or branch of state government. Although some grant and loan programs specifically require printing in a statewide publication such as the *State Register*, there is no requirement for publication in the *State Register* itself. Agencies are encouraged to publish grant and loan notices, and to provide financial estimates as well as sufficient time for interested parties to respond.
