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# Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. Comments on Planned Rules or Rule Amendments. An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

Rules to be Adopted After a Hearing. After receiving comments and deciding to hold a public hearing on the rule, an agency drafts its rule. It then publishes its rules with a notice of hearing. All persons wishing to make a statement must register at the hearing. Anyone who wishes to submit written comments may do so at the hearing, or within five working days of the close of the hearing. Administrative law judges may, during the hearing, extend the period for receiving comments up to 20 calendar days. For five business days after the submission period the agency and interested persons may respond to any new information submitted during the written submission period and the record then is closed. The administrative law judge prepares a report within 30 days, stating findings of fact, conclusions and recommendations. After receiving the report, the agency decides whether to adopt, withdraw or modify the proposed rule based on consideration of the comments made during the rule hearing procedure and the report of the administrative law judge. The agency must wait five days after receiving the report before taking any action.

Rules to be Adopted Without a Hearing. Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* § 14.22, an agency may propose to adopt, amend, suspend or repeal rules without first holding a public hearing. An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public. The agency then publishes a notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing, together with the proposed rules, in the *State Register*. If, during the 30-day comment period, 25 or more persons submit to the agency a written request for a hearing of the proposed rules, the agency must proceed under the provisions of §§ 14.14-14.20, which state that if an agency decides to hold a public hearing, it must publish a notice of intent in the *State Register*.

**Introduction.** The Board of Chiropractic Examiners intends to adopt rules without a public hearing following the procedures in the rules of the Office of Administrative Hearings, *Minnesota Rules*, parts 1400.2300 to 1400.2310, and the Administrative Procedure Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.22 to 14.28. If, however, 25 or more persons submit a written request for a hearing on the rules by 4:30 p.m. on June 13, 2014, the Board will hold a public hearing in Conference Room A, fourth floor, University Park Plaza, 2829 University Avenue Southeast, Minneapolis, Minnesota 55414, starting at 9:30 AM on Tuesday, July 8, 2014. To find out whether the Board will adopt the rules without a hearing or if it will hold the hearing, you should contact the agency contact person after June 13, 2014 and before July 8, 2014.

**Subject of Rules and Statutory Authority.** The proposed rules are relating to Independent Examiner Registrations. The statutory authority to adopt the rules is *Minnesota Statutes*, section § 148.08 (2013). A copy of the proposed rules is published in the *State Register*; posted on the Board web site *www.mn-chiroboard.state.mn.us* under Laws & Rules, Rules Promulgation; and attached to this notice as mailed via U.S. Mail,.

Comments. You have until 4:30 p.m. on Friday June 13, 2014, to submit written comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed rules or any part or subpart of the rules. Your comment must be in writing and received by the agency contact person by the due date. Comment is encouraged. Your comments should identify the portion of the proposed rules addressed, the reason for the comment, and any change proposed. You are encouraged to propose any change that you desire. Any comments that you have about the legality of

the proposed rules must also be made during this comment period.

Request for a Hearing. In addition to submitting comments, you may also request that the Board hold a hearing on the rules. You must make your request for a public hearing in writing, which the agency contact person must receive by 4:30 p.m. on Friday June 13, 2014. You must include your name and address in your written request. In addition, you must identify the portion of the proposed rules that you object to or state that you oppose the entire set of rules. Any request that does not comply with these requirements is not valid and the agency cannot count it when determining whether it must hold a public hearing. You are also encouraged to state the reason for the request and any changes you want made to the proposed rules.

**Withdrawal of Requests.** If 25 or more persons submit a valid written request for a hearing, the Board will hold a public hearing unless a sufficient number of persons withdraw their requests in writing. If enough requests for hearing are withdrawn to reduce the number below 25, the agency must give written notice of this to all persons who requested a hearing, explain the actions the agency took to effect the withdrawal, and ask for written comments on this action. If a public hearing is required, the agency will follow the procedures in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20.

**Alternative Format/Accommodation.** Upon request, this information can be made available in an alternative format, such as large print, braille, or audio. To make such a request or if you need an accommodation to make this hearing accessible, please contact the agency contact person at the address or telephone number listed above.

**Modifications.** The Board might modify the proposed rules, either as a result of public comment or as a result of the rule hearing process. It must support modifications by data and views submitted to the agency or presented at the hearing. The adopted rules may not be substantially different than these proposed rules unless the Board follows the procedure under *Minnesota Rules*, part 1400.2110. If the proposed rules affect you in any way, the Board encourages you to participate in the rulemaking process.

Cancellation of Hearing. The Board will cancel the hearing scheduled for Tuesday, July 8, 2014, if the agency does not receive requests for a hearing from 25 or more persons. If you requested a public hearing, the agency will notify you before the scheduled hearing whether the hearing will be held. **Notice of Hearing.** If 25 or more persons submit valid written requests for a public hearing on the rules, the Board will hold a hearing following the procedures in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20. The Board will hold the hearing on the date and at the time and place listed above. The hearing will continue until all interested persons have been heard. Administrative Law Judge, Eric L. Lipman is assigned to conduct the hearing. Judge Lipman's Legal Assistant, Denise Collins can be reached at the Office of Administrative Hearings, 600 North Robert Street, P.O. **Hearing Procedure.** If the Board holds a hearing, you and all interested or affected persons, including representatives of associations or other interested groups, will have an opportunity to participate. You may present your views either orally at the hearing or in writing at any time before the hearing record closes. All evidence presented should relate to the proposed rules. You may also submit written material to the Administrative Law Judge to be recorded in the hearing record for five working days after the public hearing ends. At the hearing the Administrative Law Judge may order that this five-day comment period is extended for a longer period but not more than 20 calendar days. Following the comment period, there is a five-working-day rebuttal period when the agency and any interested person may respond in writing to any new information submitted. No one may submit additional evidence during the five-day rebuttal period. The Office of Administrative Hearings must receive all comments and responses submitted to the Administrative Law Judge no later than 4:30 p.m. on the due date. All comments or responses received will be available for review at the Office of Administrative Hearings. This rule hearing procedure is governed by *Minnesota Rules*, parts 1400.2000 to 1400.2240, and *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20. You may direct questions about the procedure to the Administrative Law Judge.

The agency requests that any person submitting written views or data to the Administrative Law Judge before the hearing or during the comment or rebuttal period also submit a copy of the written views or data to the agency contact person at the address stated above.

**Statement of Need and Reasonableness.** The statement of need and reasonableness summarizes the justification for the proposed rules, including a description of who will be affected by the proposed rules and an estimate of the probable cost of the proposed rules. It is now available from the agency contact person. You may obtain copies for the cost of reproduction by contacting the agency contact person or view the document at **www.mn-chiroboard.state.mn.us** under Laws & Rules, Rules Promulgation.

Adoption Procedure if No Hearing. If no hearing is required, the agency may adopt the rules after the end of the comment period. The Board will submit the rules and supporting documents to the Office of Administrative Hearings for a legal review. You may ask to be notified of the date the rules are submitted to the office. If you want either to receive notice of this, to receive a copy of the adopted rules, or to register with the agency to receive notice of future rule proceedings, submit your request to the agency contact person listed above.

Adoption Procedure After a Hearing. If a hearing is held, after the close of the hearing record, the Administrative Law Judge will issue a report on the proposed rules. You may ask to be notified of the date that the Administrative Law Judge's report will become available, and can make this request at the hearing or in writing to the Administrative Law Judge. You may also ask to be notified of the date that the agency adopts the rules and the rules are filed with the Secretary of State by requesting this at the hearing or by writing to the agency contact person stated above.

Board of Chiropractic Examiners

#### 2500.1160 INDEPENDENT EXAMINATION REGISTRATION.

Subpart 1. **Qualifications; proof.** Documentation establishing that a chiropractor meets the qualifications must be included with the application to register with the board as an independent examiner under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 148.09. A chiropractor must be licensed to practice in Minnesota and must have been in practice for the two years immediately preceding registration.

The chiropractor/instructor must present to the board proof of instructor status or attest to being involved in direct patient care for 50 percent of the time spent in practice during the two years immediately preceding the independent examination of a patient. <u>Direct patient care is defined specifically as the number of hours in direct face-to-face contact providing examination or treatment of the registrant's own patients.</u> An affidavit on a form <del>as</del> provided by the board must be filed with the board at the time of application to register.

Subp. 2. **Registration.** The chiropractor must apply for registration with the board <del>not less than 30 days</del> prior to the <del>anticipated date of</del> commencement of independent examinations. The chiropractor must pay a registration fee as established by the board in part 2500.1150, item G.

Subp. 2a. Third party presence. The subject of an independent examination shall not be prohibited from having a third party of the subject's choice present at all times during the consultation and examination conducted under this part. No third party may be barred from participation based upon any training or credential they may or may not hold. The third party shall only be required to provide their name to the examiner, but is not required to provide any form of proof of identification. The examiner must include the presence and stated identity of a third party in a written report. Advance notice to the examiner or any other person, organization, or agency is not required. The third party may record the proceedings in written or audio form, provided the third party does not substantially interfere with the conduct of the examination. The third party is prohibited from video-recording the consultation or examination. An examinee exercising these rights shall not be considered as failing to cooperate with an examination. In any event in which the examiner declares that there has been substantial interference with the examination, the examiner shall describe the interference in detail in the body of the report.

Subp. 2b. **Records.** The examiner shall identify the source of records, as well as the dates or period of provided services which were reviewed by the examiner as part of the examination or report generated. The examiner's handwritten or otherwise generated notes, including a copy of the written final report, must be kept for a period of four years following the conduct of the examination.

Subp. 2c. Disclosures. The examiner shall provide disclosures to the patient in written form that clearly state the purpose for the

examination and the right of the examinee to have a third party present as described in subpart 2a.

Subp. 4. **Violation.** A violation of this part is considered unprofessional conduct pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes*, section 148.10, subdivision 1, paragraphs (a), clause (11), and (e).

#### 6262.0200 FISHING REGULATIONS FOR INLAND WATERS.

Subpart 1. **General inland fishing regulations.** Fish may be taken in inland waters by angling during the time specified for each of the following species, however, certain waters of the state are subject to experimental regulations, special regulations, or are closed for the taking and possession of fish. When the closing date of a season falls on a Saturday, the season will extend extends through the following Sunday.

Species and Open Season

Daily and Possession Limits

A. Largemouth and smallmouth bass.

 In all waters lying east and north of U.S. Highway 53 from Duluth to International Falls and Pelican and Ash Lakes, St. Louis County.

From the Saturday two weeks prior to the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend to the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend, angling for bass is limited to catch and release only. Any bass must be immediately returned to the water. It is unlawful for anyone to have in possession, regardless of where taken, any bass while on or fishing in these waters. The Saturday of Memorial Day weekend to the last Sunday in February is the harvest season.

From the second Monday in September to the end of the season, angling for smallmouth bass shall be <u>is</u> limited to catch and release only. Any smallmouth bass must be immediately returned to the water and it shall be <u>is</u> unlawful for anyone to have in possession, regardless of where taken, any smallmouth bass while on or fishing in inland these waters.

A. Licensed anglers, or those exempt from licensing, may possess only one limit of fish while on the adjacent state's boundary waters listed in parts 6266.0200, subpart 1; 6266.0300, subpart 1; 6266.0400, subpart 1; and 6266.0500, subpart 1, regardless of the number of licenses held.

- B. Where regulations differ between this state and an adjacent state on such boundary waters, the exercise of the more liberal regulations is limited to persons licensed by the more liberal state and confined to the territorial waters of the more liberal state.
- C. Fish that are taken by angling on Minnesota boundary waters with South Dakota, Wisconsin, and North Dakota and not immediately released freely into the water immediately after capture or returned to the water as defined in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 97A.015, subdivision 26c, are considered to be in possession and part of the bag limit. No culling or live well sorting (the act of replacing one fish with another one) is allowed. Fish may not be released after being reduced to possession, except that an angler may release fish to the same water body where the fish were taken when the angler is done fishing for that day and before the angler leaves the water body.
- D. Licensed anglers, or those exempt from licensing, must follow the general restrictions on transport, possession, and packing of fish while on a boundary water unless otherwise specified in this chapter or part 6262.0300.

- A. Season A: four licenses in Kittson County Central Elk Zone valid for legal antlered bull elk and two licenses in the Kittson County Northeast Elk Zone valid for legal antlered bull elk; and
  - B. Season B: three licenses in Kittson County Central Elk Zone valid for legal antlered bull elk.

#### Subp. 24. Open areas.

- A. A license for the Grygla elk zones is valid for taking elk within The Primary Grygla Elk Zone prescribed as described in part 6232.4600, subpart 1, and the Secondary Grygla Elk Zone as described in part 6232.4600, subpart 2, are closed for the 2014 elk season.
- B. A license for the Kittson County Central Elk Zone is valid for taking elk within the elk zone prescribed in part 6232.4600, subpart 3.
- C. A license for the Kittson County Northeast Elk Zone is valid for taking elk within the elk zone prescribed in part 6232.4600, subpart 4.

#### 6232.4400 GENERAL REGULATIONS FOR TAKING ELK.

These parties would be offered the opportunity to purchase licenses that have been offered to a successful party, but not purchased. The pool consists of the remaining landowners, tenants, and parties from the general drawing. An alternate party shall only be notified in the event that a successful party decides not to purchase a license.

Finding of the Commissioner of Health Regarding the Definition of Elevated Blood Lead Level Under *Minnesota Statutes*, Section 144.9501, subdivision 9

#### Findings:

- 1. Exposure to lead has long been associated with IQ deficits, attention-related behaviors, and decreased academic achievement among children. Cardiovascular, immunological, and endocrine effects have also been reported.
- 2. Children less than six years old are most vulnerable to lead's toxicity due to their growing bodies, nutritional needs, normal mouthing behavior, and routinely spending time on the floor. Pregnant women and the developing fetus are also at risk because lead easily

passes through the placenta to the fetus. Certain populations, including children enrolled in medical assistance programs, refugees, and immigrants, are at increased risk of lead poisoning.

- 3. There are many sources of lead, such as soil contaminated from years of leaded gasoline, lead dust accidentally brought home from parents' workplaces and hobby areas, and some imported products and traditional remedies. However, dust from deteriorated lead paint in homes is the main source of lead exposure for Minnesota children today.
- 4. The Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) collaborates with other agencies and groups to respond to elevated blood lead levels and support primary prevention of lead poisoning. These partnerships include local public health agencies, the medical community, and community organizations that receive Swab Team Services Grants, which are authorized under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 144.9512.
- 5. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 144.9501, subdivision 9, defines an "elevated blood lead level" as a diagnostic blood lead test with a result that is equal to or greater than ten micrograms of lead per deciliter of whole blood in any person, *unless the commissioner finds that a lower concentration is necessary to protect public health* [emphasis added].
- 6. Through a coordinated, multilateral public health effort, the number of children under six years of age with measured blood lead concentrations of at least ten micrograms per deciliter has decreased more than 80%, from 4,339 in 1995 to 527 in 2012. However, these numbers underestimate the thousands of Minnesota families that are still impacted by lead every year.
- 7. New scientific evidence has demonstrated adverse cognitive and physiological outcomes associated with blood lead concentrations less than ten micrograms per deciliter.
- 8. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has acknowledged that no measureable level of blood lead is known to be without deleterious effects, and the effects of lead appear to be irreversible in the absence of any other interventions.
- 9. CDC currently recommends the use of a reference value for prioritizing the distribution of public health resources to respond to lead exposure, where a reference value is the 97.5th percentile of blood lead concentrations in the population.
- 10. Based on the National Health and Nutrition Examination Survey (NHANES), the current blood lead concentration reference value for children less than six years of age in the United States is five micrograms per deciliter.
- 11. MDH has a public health interest in preventing lead poisoning. Decreasing the threshold for blood lead concentrations that are considered elevated will give MDH and local public health agencies the authority to provide additional services to families that are affected by exposure to lead, but do not meet the current definition of an elevated blood lead level.
- 12. A change in the threshold for blood lead concentrations that are considered elevated will not alter *Minnesota Statutes*, section 144.9504, subdivision 2, which identifies the conditions under which an assessing agency shall conduct a lead risk assessment. Assessing agencies may still conduct lead risk assessments for children with any elevated blood lead level, within the limits of available local, state, and federal appropriations.
- 13. MDH guidelines for preventing childhood lead poisoning, which are assessed and updated regularly in collaboration with a range of partners to ensure consistency with recent scientific literature, indicate a number of steps for finding and responding to blood lead test results less than ten micrograms per deciliter.
- 14. The elimination of elevated blood lead in children is a goal at both the state and federal levels, through the State of Minnesota Childhood Lead Poisoning Elimination Plan and Healthy People 2020, respectively.

**Conclusion:** The threshold for an "elevated blood lead level", as defined in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 144.9501, subdivision 9, of a diagnostic blood lead test with a result that is equal to or greater than ten micrograms of lead per deciliter of whole blood in any person is insufficient to protect public health and is not consistent with current best practices.

#### **FINDING**

**I FIND THAT** in order to protect public health, the definition of an "elevated blood lead level", as defined in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 144.9501, subdivision 9, shall be modified to be a diagnostic blood lead test with a result that is equal to or greater than five micrograms
