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NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. Expedited Rules

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt expedited rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for normal rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the conditions. Expedited rules are effective upon publication in the State Register, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain conditions.

Expedited rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific *Minnesota Statute* citations accompanying these expedited rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.

Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Adopted Expedited Permanent Game and Fish Rules: Prohibited and Regulated Invasive Species

The rules proposed and published at *State Register*, Volume 38, Number 26, pages 917-919, December 23, 2013 (38 SR 917), are adopted with the following modifications:

6216.0250 PROHIBITED INVASIVE SPECIES.

Subp. 2. Aquatic plants. The following aquatic plants are designated as prohibited invasive species:

L. water aloe or water soldiers (Stratiotes aloides) Linnaeus; and

M. water chestnut (Trapa natans) Linnaeus:; and

N. water hyacinth (Eichhornia crassipes) Solms.

Subp. 3. Fish. The following fish are designated as prohibited invasive species:

T. water hyacinth (Eichhornia crassipes) Solms;

U.T. wels catfish (Siluris glanis) Linnaeus;

W. V. white perch (Morone americana) Gmelin;

X. W. yabby (Cherax destructor) Clark; and

Y. X. zander (Stizostedion lucioperca) Linnaeus.

Executive Orders

The governor has the authority to issue written statements or orders, called Executive Orders. as well as Emergency Executive Orders. The governor's authority is specified in the *Constitution of the State of Minnesota*, Article V, and in *Minnesota Statutes* § 4.035. Emergency Executive Orders, for protection from an imminent threat to health and safety, become effective immediately, are filed with the secretary of state, and published in the *State Register* as soon as possible after they are issued. Other Executive Orders become effective 15 days after publication in the *State Register* and filing with the secretary of state. Unless otherwise specified, an executive order expires 90 days after the date the governor who issued the order vacates office.

Office of the Governor

Emergency Executive Order 14-11: Declaring a State of Peacetime Emergency in the State of Minnesota

I, MARK DAYTON, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes do hereby issue this Executive Order:

WHEREAS, beginning on June 11, 2014, persistent and continuing high precipitation severe summer storms affected counties across the state causing flooding, road washouts, mudslides, and wind damage necessitating road closures and creating life safety issues; and

WHEREAS, dangerous driving conditions resulted in multiple stranded vehicles and these conditions created an imminent danger to persons and property, presenting an immediate need to activate emergency resources; and

WHEREAS, the affected counties' emergency operations plans are activated, cities and counties have declared local emergencies, and local jurisdictions are requesting state assistance and resources; and

WHEREAS, the resources of local, county, and state governments are being fully utilized to ensure immediate response to protect the life and safety of persons in the affected areas and to protect property and infrastructure from additional damage; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff of Koochiching County has requested the assistance of the Minnesota National Guard to support flood fighting efforts.

NOW, THEREFORE, I hereby order that:

- 1. A State of Emergency pursuant to *Minnesota Statues* 2013, Section 12.31 exists in the counties of Beltrami, Blue Earth, Brown, Dodge, Faribault, Freeborn, Goodhue, Grant, Hubbard, Jackson, Lake of the Woods, Le Sueur, Lyon, Koochiching, McLeod, Morrison, Mower, Murray, Nicollet, Nobles, Olmsted, Otter Tail, Pipestone, Ramsey, Redwood, Renville, Rice, Rock, Roseau, Saint Louis, Scott, Sibley, Steele, Todd, and Waseca.
- 2. The Department of Public Safety, Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, will activate the Minnesota Emergency Operations Plan, continue the provision of on-site support and assistance to the affected local governments, and determine the need for supplementary emergency assistance.
- 3. All state agencies, in cooperation with appropriate federal agencies, are directed to provide the assistance necessary to help local units of government respond to, and recover from, this emergency.
- 4. The Adjutant General of Minnesota will order to state active duty on or about June 19, 2014, in the service of the State, such personnel and equipment of the military forces of the State as required and for such period of time as necessary to provide assistance and emergency relief services.
- The Adjutant General is authorized to purchase, lease, or contract goods and services necessary to accomplish the mission;
- 6. The cost of subsistence, transportation, fuel, pay, and allowances of said individuals shall be defrayed from the general fund of the State, as provided for in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 192.49, 192.52, 192.54, and as otherwise permitted by law.

Executive Orders

Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes*, section 4.035, subdivision 2, this Emergency Executive Order is effective immediately and must be filed with the Secretary of State and published in the *State Register* as soon as possible after its issuance. This peacetime emergency shall remain in effect for five days, unless extended in accordance with *Minnesota Statutes*, section 12.31, subdivision 2.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Lake Washington Sanitary District, City of Madison Lake, Jamestown Township, Le Ray Township, Kasota Township, and Washington Township have petitioned the chief administrative law judge of the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) to approve the annexation and detachment petition to the Lake Washington Sanitary District.

Minnesota Board of High Pressure Piping Systems

Request for Comments on Possible Amendment to Rules Governing High Pressure Piping, *Minnesota Rules*, Chapter 5230; Revisor's ID Number R-04253

Subject of Rules. The Minnesota Board of High Pressure Piping Systems ("Board") requests comments on its possible amendment to rules governing the High Pressure Piping ("HPP") Code. The Board is considering rule amendments to (1) the HPP Code that must be followed in this state including amendments of amended codes incorporated by reference regarding high pressure steam piping, ammonia refrigeration piping, and bioprocess piping; and (2) the licensure and registration of high pressure piping contractors, journeymen, and other persons engaged in the design, installation, and alteration of high pressure piping systems, except for those individuals licensed under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 326.02, subdivisions 2 and 3.

HPP systems have been regulated in Minnesota law since the enactment of *Laws of Minnesota 1937*, Chapter 367. By the end of World War II, HPP Systems were regulated by the Rules and Regulations Governing the Division of Steam Fitting Standards (adopted in accordance with *Laws of Minnesota 1945*, Chapter 452). Since then, the HPP Code has been revised periodically to stay current with new materials and methods. Rulemaking authority was transferred to the Board in 2007 when the Board was created. The HPP Code was most recently updated in 2008 and, for the first time, then-current national codes regarding HPP systems were incorporated by reference as amended.

The rule amendments being considered by the Board include incorporating by reference, with amendments, the following national model codes:

ANSI/IIAR 2. The standard for Equipment, Design, and Installation of Closed-Circuit Ammonia Mechanical Refrigerating Systems is not subject to frequent change, but from time to time is updated and approved by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) and published by the International Institute of Ammonia Refrigeration (IIAR) as "ANSI/IIAR 2." The code for ammonia refrigeration systems, as part of the HPP Code, currently incorporates by reference, with amendments, the 2008 revision of ANSI/IIAR 2. *Minnesota Rules*, part 5230.5001, subpart 1. ANSI and IIAR have since adopted Addendum A and Addendum B ("Addendums A & B") to the 2008 revision of ANSI/IIAR 2, which the proposed rules will incorporate by reference.

ASME B31.5. The standard for Ammonia Refrigeration Piping is not subject to frequent change, but from time to time is approved and published by the American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME) as "ASME B31.5." The code for ammonia refrigeration piping, as part of the HPP Code, currently incorporates by reference the 2006 revision of ASME B31.5. *Minnesota Rules*, part 5230.5001, subpart 2. ASME has since adopted the 2013 revision of ASME B31.5, which the proposed rules will incorporate by reference.

ASME BPE. The Bioprocessing Equipment Standard is not subject to frequent change, but from time to time is adopted and published by ASME as "ASME BPE." The HPP Code currently incorporates by reference the 2005 edition of ASME BPE. *Minnesota Rules*, part 5230.0220, subpart 1. ASME has since adopted the 2012 edition of ASME BPE, which the proposed rules will incorporate by reference.

ASME section IX. Section IX of the Boiler and Pressure Vessel Code is not subject to frequent change, but from time to time is approved and published by ASME ("ASME section IX"). The code for ammonia refrigeration systems, as part of the HPP Code, currently incorporates by reference the 2007 edition of ASME section IX. *Minnesota Rules*, part 5230.5920, subpart 2. ASME has since adopted the 2013 edition of ASME section IX, which the proposed rules will incorporate by reference.

ASME Code for Power Boilers. Section I of the Boiler and Pressure Vessel Code is not subject to frequent change, but from time to time is approved and published by ASME ("ASME Code for Power Boilers"). The code for steam or heating media piping systems, as part of the HPP Code, currently incorporates by reference the 2007 edition of the ASME Code for Power Boilers. *Minnesota Rules*, part 5230.0260. ASME has since adopted the 2013 edition of the ASME Code for Power Boilers, which the proposed rules will incorporate by reference.

ASME B31.1. The standard for power piping is not subject to frequent change, but from time to time is approved and published by ASME as "ASME B31.1." The code for steam or heating media piping systems, as part of the HPP Code, incorporates by reference, with

amendments, the 2007 ASME B31.1. *Minnesota Rules*, part 5230.0265. ASME has since adopted the 2012 edition of ASME B31.1, which the proposed rules will incorporate by reference.

The Board is considering amendments to the current rules that improve by clarifying and correcting existing rule language, and update by adopting current national model standards. The Board seeks comments on the possible amendments and other topics that naturally flow from the subject matter of the possible amendments.

Persons Affected. Persons affected by the rule amendments may include high pressure pipefitters; high pressure pipefitting contractors and businesses; persons and entities owning, operating, improving or constructing high pressure piping systems; mechanical and biotechnical design professionals; manufacturers of integrated high pressure piping systems; unlicensed individuals who wish to assist in the practical construction and installation of high pressure piping and appurtenances while in the employ of a licensed high pressure piping business; engineers; designers, owners, managers and users of high pressure piping systems; state and local inspectors and enforcement authorities of high pressure piping systems; and employees and members of the public who occupy buildings with high pressure piping systems.

Statutory Authority. The authority to adopt the rules is: *Minnesota Statutes*, section 326B.925, subdivision 2, clauses 3 and 5, which give the Board the power to adopt: (a) the high pressure piping code that must be followed in this state and any high pressure piping code amendments thereto; and (b) rules that regulate the licensure or registration of high pressure piping contractors, journeymen, and other persons engaged in the design, installation, and alteration of high pressure piping systems, except for those individuals licensed under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 326.02, subdivisions 2 and 3. This does not include the authority to adopt rules regulating continuing education.

Public Comment. Interested persons or groups may submit comments or information on these possible rule amendments in writing until further notice is published in the *State Register* that the Board intends to adopt or to withdraw the rules. The Board will not publish a notice of intent to adopt the rules until more than 60 days have elapsed from the date of this request for comments. The Board does not plan to appoint an advisory committee to comment on the possible rule amendments.

The Board requests any information pertaining to whether the rule amendments might require local government to adopt or amend an ordinance or other regulation under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.128, and whether any local unit of government has such an ordinance and, if so, to provide a copy to the Board.

The Board requests any information pertaining to the cumulative effect of this rule with other federal and state regulations related to the specific purposes of these rules as described. Cumulative effect means the impact that results from incremental impact of the proposed rule in addition to other rules, regardless of what state or federal agency has adopted the other rules.

The Board requests any information pertaining to whether there are less costly methods or less intrusive methods for achieving the purpose of the proposed rule, and the probable costs of complying with the proposed rule, including the portion of the total costs that will be borne by identifiable categories or affected parties.

Rules Drafts. In anticipation of the possible rule amendments, the Board created the following sub-committees of Board members: Ammonia Committee, Bioprocess Committee, Welding Committee, and Steam Committee. These committees held public meetings at which the possible rule amendments were discussed. The Board is compiling a draft of the possible rule amendments but has not yet prepared it. Public Notice Regarding Changes to Payment Rates and Methodologies, and Services under the Medical Assistance Program and the MinnesotaCare Program

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to recipients, providers of services, and to the public of certain statutory changes made to the Medical Assistance (MA) Program and the MinnesotaCare Program by the 2014 Minnesota Legislature.

This notice is published pursuant to 42 United States Code § 1396a(a)(13)(A) (§ 1902(a)(13)(A) of the Social Security Act), which requires the Department to publish final institutional payment rates, the methodologies underlying the establishment of such rates, and the justification for such rates. It is also published pursuant to *Code of Federal Regulations*, title 42, part 447, section 205 (42 C.F.R. § 447.205), which requires publication of a notice when there is any significant proposed change in the methods and standards for setting payment rates for Medicaid services.

The legislative changes are estimated to result in a net increase of \$78 million in the MA program for state fiscal year 2015 (July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015), and a net increase of \$96 million in the MA program for state fiscal year 2016 (July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016). Much of the increase in Medical Assistance results from a provider rate increase for home and community based services. There were no legislative changes to the MinnesotaCare program that had fiscal impact for the 2015 and 2016 state fiscal years.

The actual text of most of the 2014 legislative changes is contained in *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Regular Session, Chapters 262, 291, and 312. It is important to note that not all changes made to these programs by the 2014 legislature are mentioned in this notice.

Changes were made to the following program areas:

- I. MA and MinnesotaCare Services and Payment Rates
- II. MA Institutional Payment Rates
- III. MA Home and Community-Based Waivers and Payment Rates

I. MA and MinnesotaCare Services and Payment Rates

Effective July 1, 2014, the managed care procurement that would occur in 2015 is waived; the Commissioner shall negotiate calendar year 2015 managed care contracts with those managed care organizations contracted with in 2014. For calendar year 2016 contracts, the Commissioner shall procure through a statewide procurement. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 291, Article 9, Section 3.

Effective July 1, 2014, Payments for medical supplies and durable medical equipment not subject to a volume purchase contract, and prosthetics and orthotics, shall be decreased by .33 percent through June 30, 2015. Payments for medical supplies and durable medical equipment not subject to a volume purchase contract, and prosthetics and orthotics, provided on or after July 1, 2015, shall be increased by three percent from the rates in effect on June 30, 2014. For medical supplies and durable medical equipment not subject to a volume purchase contract, and prosthetics and orthotics, a three percent rate increase enacted in a prior session and to be effective September 1, 2014, has been repealed. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 24, Section 40.

Effective July 1, 2014, the Commissioner shall reduce parental fees by ten percent for certain children receiving MA without regard to income. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 27, section 49.

Effective July 1, 2014, or upon federal approval, whichever is later, MA covers intensive early intervention treatment for children with autism spectrum disorder (ASD). Treatment will include services to improve communication skills, increase capacity for social interactions, and reduce maladaptive behaviors to improve long-term outcomes for children at a critical time in their development. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 27, section 73.

Effective July 1, 2014, or upon federal approval, whichever is later, the Commissioner may contract directly with the Center for Victims of Torture to provide mental health targeted case management services if the Center is unable to secure a contract with a lead county. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 29, section 5.

Effective July 1, 2014, the Commissioner shall publish for comment the text of all state plan amendments and waiver requests on the Department's website 30 days prior to submission. The Commissioner shall also publish notice of any federal decision related to the state request for approval within 30 days of the decision, including any modifications to the request that have been agreed to by the Commissioner as a condition of receiving federal approval. Persons interested in receiving electronic notifications of publication may sign up by visiting the **Department's web page**. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 24, section 27.

Effective July 1, 2014, or upon federal approval, whichever is later, peer support services may be provided in conjunction with mobile crisis intervention services. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 29, section 6.

Effective January 1, 2015, the Commissioner shall directly pay claims for services provided by rural health clinics and federally qualified health centers to Medical Assistance recipients enrolled in managed care. The Commissioner will either require these clinics to submit claims directly to the Department, or instruct the clinics to submit claims to the recipient's managed care provider, which will then submit the claim to the Department. The Commissioner shall not make any managed care supplemental payments to rural health clinics and federally qualified health centers after June 30, 2017. Laws of Minnesota 2014, Chapter 312, Article 24, section 35.

A twenty percent rate reduction for personal care assistants who are related to the recipient scheduled to begin July 1, 2013, but not implemented due to court order, is repealed. *Laws of Minnesota* 2014, Chapter 291, Article 8, sections 6 - 7.

II. MA Payment Rates for Institutional Providers

Pursuant to the Governor's 2014 supplemental budget, the Department proposed changes to payment rates for inpatient hospital services in the Medical Assistance program. The Minnesota Legislature considered the Department's proposed changes, gathered information, and held public hearings at which advocates, trade associations, providers, and the general public were invited to attend. The legislature considered the public's input and made the following changes:

The 2014 Legislature made numerous changes to the inpatient hospital services payment methodology. A description of those changes is below. Full text and additional detail of the changes is available at *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 24.

The legislature removed numerous references to GAMC throughout Minnesota Statutes Sections 256.9685 and 256.969 (Laws of

Minnesota 2014, Chapter 312, Article 24) and clarified that the term "base year" to potentially include data from more than one calendar year. Laws of Minnesota 2014, Chapter 312, Article 24, sections 5 and 23.

Effective July 1, 2014, the Commissioner shall use all patient-refined diagnosis-related groups (APR-DRGs) or other similar classification programs to determine the relative values of inpatient services and case mix indices. The Commissioner is no longer required to rebase relative values or case mix levels every two years. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 24, section 7.

Effective July 1, 2014, the Commissioner shall require critical access hospitals and hospitals receiving disproportionate population adjustment payments under Section 256.969, subdivision 9 to submit a Medical Assistance cost report within six months of the end of the hospital's fiscal year. The Commissioner shall suspend payments to any hospital that fails to submit the required cost report. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 24, section 14.

Effective July 1, 2014, the Commissioner may establish a separate disproportionate population operating payment rate adjustment for critical access hospitals. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 24, section 19.

Effective July 1, 2014, the Commissioner shall remove certified registered nurse anesthetist (CRNA) costs from the operating payment rate for hospitals when inpatient hospital rates are next rebased. The commissioner shall require hospitals and independently enrolled CRNAs to separately bill for such services. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 24, section 20.

Effective July 1, 2014, the Commissioner, consistent with current practice, shall reimburse long-term hospitals on a per-diem basis. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 24, section 23.

Effective October 31, 2014, the Commissioner shall terminate a ten percent reduction in payments for hospital admissions that began September 1, 2011. For admissions on or after September 1, 2011, through October 31, 2014, the payment reduction is reduced by one percentage point for every percentage point reduction in the overall readmissions rate between the two previous calendar years to a maximum of five percent. The Commissioner shall calculate a readmission rate for admissions to all hospitals occurring within 30 days of a previous discharge using data from the Reducing Avoidable Readmissions Effectively (RARE) campaign. A hospital located in Hennepin County with a licensed capacity of 1,700 beds shall be excluded from the ten percent rate reduction for admissions of children under 18 years of age occurring on or after September 1, 2011, through August 31, 2013. Laws of Minnesota 2014, Chapter 312, Article 24, section 13.

Effective November 1, 2014, the Commissioner shall reimburse hospitals using the following methodologies:

- · critical access hospitals as defined by Medicare shall be paid using a cost-based methodology;
- · long-term hospitals as defined by Medicare shall be paid on a per diem methodology under Section 256.969, subdivision 25;
- rehabilitation hospitals or units of hospitals that are recognized as rehabilitation distinct parts as defined by Medicare shall be paid according to the methodology under Section 256.969, subdivision 12; and
- all other hospitals shall be paid on a diagnosis-related group (DRG) methodology.

Payment rates for critical access hospitals and hospitals paid using a DRG methodology shall have their payment rates rebased in a budget neutral manner that incorporates cost and payment methodologies in a manner similar to Medicare using calendar year 2012 as the base year. For discharges on or after November 1, 2014, through June 30, 2016, the rebased rates shall result in payment rates that fluctuate no more than five percent from the base year payments for any hospital. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 24, section 8.

Effective July 1, 2017, and every two years thereafter, the Commissioner shall rebase payment rates to reflect only those changes in hospital costs between the existing base year and the next base year. The Commissioner shall establish the base year for each rebasing period considering the most recent year for which filed Medicare cost reports are available. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 24, section 8.

Effective November 1, 2014, through June 30, 2015, the Commissioner may implement an interim payment process to pay hospitals, including payments based on each hospital's average payments per claim for state fiscal years 2011 and 2012. These interim payments may be used to pay hospitals if the rebasing described above is not implemented by November 1, 2014. Claims paid at interim payment rates shall be reprocessed upon implementation of the rebased rates. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 24, section 9.

Effective November 1, 2014, the Commissioner shall establish payment rates for outliers that are based on Medicare methodologies. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 24, section 16.

Effective November 1, 2014, the Commissioner shall make payments for hospital residents as follows: payments for the first 180 days of inpatient care shall be the APR-DRG system plus any outliers; and payment for all medically necessary patient care subsequent to the first 180 days shall be reimbursed at a rate computed by multiplying the statewide average cost-to-charge ratio by the usual and customary charges. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 24, section 18.

Effective November 1, 2014, the Commissioner shall, to the extent possible, replicate the existing payment rate methodology for rehabilitation hospitals under the new diagnostic classification system described in *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 24, section 8. The result must be budget neutral ensuring that the total aggregate payments under the new system are equal to the total aggregate payments made for the same number and types of services in the base year, calendar year 2012. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 24, section 21.

Effective November 1, 2014, the Commissioner shall establish payment rates for acute transfers that are based on Medicare methodologies. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 24, section 22.

Intermediate Care Facilities for Persons with Developmental Disabilities (ICFs/DD)

Pursuant to the Governor's 2014 supplemental budget, the Department proposed changes to payment rates for intermediate care facilities for persons with developmental disabilities (ICFs/DD). The Minnesota Legislature considered the Department's proposed changes, gathered information, and held public hearings at which advocates, trade associations, providers, and the general public were invited to attend. The legislature considered the public's input and enacted legislation changing the rate-setting systems as follows:

Effective July 1, 2014, the Commissioner shall increase payment rates to ICF/DD facilities by five percent. Facilities that fail to submit a quality improvement plan by a date and in the format specified by the Commissioner shall have their rates reduced by one percent effective January 1, 2015. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 27, section 71.

Nursing Facilities

Effective July 1, 2014, funds are appropriated for nursing facility moratorium exception construction projects. *Laws of Minnesota* 2014, Chapter 312, Article 27, section 3.

Effective July 1, 2014, permanent funds are established for rate adjustments for facilities deemed to be critical access nursing facilities under M.S. §256B.441, subd. 63. The rate adjustment for critical access nursing facilities was modified and a clause was added requiring the Commissioner to ensure even distribution of critical access facilities across the state. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 27, section 58.

Effective October 1, 2014, the Commissioner will increase operating payment rates to nursing facilities to address changes in compensation costs for nursing facility employees paid less than \$14 per hour. Rate adjustments will occur annually on October 1 based on the requirements in Minnesota Statutes Section 256B.441, subd. 64. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 27, section 59.

additional 1% rate increase tied to provider quality is effective July 1, 2015. *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 27, sections 56 - 57.

Effective July 1, 2014, the Commissioner shall assess Community First Services and Supports agency-providers and financial management service providers a fee of no more than \$20 to cover the cost of background checks performed by the Department. *Laws of Minnesota*, Chapter 312, Article 26, section 3.

Effective July 1, 2014, services provided by the following community services providers will receive a five percent increase in grants, allocations, reimbursement rates, individual limits or service rate limits as applicable. Providers that fail to submit a quality improvement plan by the date and in the format specified by the Commissioner shall have their rates reduced by one percent effective January 1, 2015:

- 1) home and community-based waiver services for persons with developmental disabilities, including consumer-directed community supports, under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 256B.092;
- 2) home and community-based waiver services under community alternatives for disabled individuals, including consumerdirected community supports, under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 256B.49;
- 3) home and community-based waiver services under community alternative care, including consumer-directed community supports, under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 256B.49;
- 4) home and community-based waiver services under the brain injury waiver, including consumer-directed community supports, under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 256B.49;
- 5) home and community-based waiver services for the elderly, including consumer-directed community supports, under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 256B.0915;
- 6) nursing services and home health services, under Minnesota Statutes, section 256B.0625, subdivision 6a;
- 7) personal care services and qualified professional supervision of personal care services, under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 256B.0625, subdivisions 6a and 19a;
- 8) private duty nursing services, under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 256B.0625, subdivision 7;
- 9) community first services and supports, under Minnesota Statutes, section 256B.85;
- 10) essential community supports, under Minnesota Statutes, 256B.0922;
- 11) day training and habilitation services for adults with developmental disabilities or related conditions, under *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 252.41 to 252.46, including the additional cost of rate adjustments on day training and habilitation services, provided as a social service;
- 12) alternative care services, under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 256B.0913; *Laws of Minnesota 2014*, Chapter 312, Article 27, Section 75.

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
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
