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### Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

### NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. ### **Adopted Rules**

A rule becomes effective after the requirements of *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.05-14.28 have been met and five working days after the rule is published in the *State Register*, unless a later date is required by statutes or specified in the rule. ### **Executive Orders**

The governor has the authority to issue written statements or orders, called Executive Orders. as well as Emergency Executive Orders. The governor's authority is specified in the *Constitution of the State of Minnesota*, Article V, and in *Minnesota Statutes* § 4.035. Emergency Executive Orders, for protection from an imminent threat to health and safety, become effective immediately, are filed with the secretary of state, and published in the *State Register* as soon as possible after they are issued. Other Executive Orders become effective 15 days after publication in the *State Register* and filing with the secretary of state. Unless otherwise specified, an executive order expires 90 days after the date the governor who issued the order vacates office.

### Office of the Governor

### Emergency Executive Order 15 - 05: Providing for Assistance to the Minnesota Interagency Fire Center

**I, MARK DAYTON, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA**, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes, do hereby issue this Executive Order:

WHEREAS, on Thursday, April 2nd, the Minnesota Interagency Fire Center (MIFC) was managing suppression of more than twenty wildfires;

WHEREAS, the National Weather Service has issued Red Flag Fire weather warnings for all of Minnesota, except the northwest and southeast portions, due to dry conditions, high temperatures, low humidity, and strong winds that have been exacerbated by the lack of snow cover and an early spring, and these conditions are expected to remain extreme for the next several days;

WHEREAS, interstate support is unavailable at this time due to similar conditions across the region;

**WHEREAS**, state agencies, the State Emergency Operations Center, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, and the MIFC do not have adequate aviation resources for widespread wildfire suppression; and

WHEREAS, the MIFC has requested fire suppression and support assets from the Minnesota National Guard.

NOW, THEREFORE, I hereby order that:

- 1. The Adjutant General of Minnesota order to state active duty on or about April 2, 2015, in the service of the State, such personnel and equipment of the military forces of the State as required and for such period of time as necessary to support wildfire suppression in Minnesota.
  - 2. The Adjutant General is authorized to purchase, lease, or contract goods and services necessary to accomplish the mission.
- 3. The cost of subsistence, transportation, fuel, pay, and allowances of said individuals shall be defrayed from the general fund of the State, as provided for in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 192.49, 192.52, 192.54, and as otherwise permitted by law.

Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes*, section 4.035, subdivision 2, this Emergency Order is effective immediately and will remain in effect until such date as elements of the military forces of the State are no longer required.

### **Commissioners' Orders**

## Minnesota Department of Transportation (Mn/DOT) Revisions to the 2011 Minnesota Uniform Traffic Control Devices Manual Order No. 94687

(This is a republication of the Commissioner's Order dated February 10, 2015 revising the record of revisions and additions)

This is the fourth order revising the 2011 Minnesota Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (2011 MN MUTCD).

By Order number 92452 dated December 15, 2011 and published in the *State Register* of December 26, 2011, the Commissioner of Transportation (Commissioner) has adopted the 2011 MN MUTCD establishing a uniform system of traffic control devices for streets and highways of the State of Minnesota as required by *Minnesota Statutes*, Section 169.06, Subdivision 1 (2011). The 2011 MN MUTCD correlates with and so far as possible conforms to the current system as approved by the American Association of State Highway Officials and the national Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (Federal MUTCD). (*Minnesota Statutes* § 169.06, subd. 1 (2011); Federal Highway Administration, 23 C.F.R. § 655.603 (2011).)

The Commissioner adopted revisions and changes to the 2011 MN MUTCD by Order numbers:

93167 dated July 12, 2012 published in the State Register of July 23, 2012,

93799 dated July 8, 2013 published in the State Register of August 5, 2013, and

94040 dated December 11, 2013 published in the State Register December 16, 2013.

A multi-agency committee has reviewed the changes in the 2009 Federal MUTCD and recommended further revisions and additions.
