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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101, an agency must first solicit comments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

The *State Register* also publishes other official notices of state agencies and non-state agencies, including notices of meetings and matters of public interest.

Notice of Request for Comment on Preliminary Policies for the Implementation of the Minnesota Buffer Program

The Minnesota Board of Water and Soil Resources (BWSR) is requesting public review and comment on preliminary draft policies to support the implementation of Minnesota Statutes 103F.48, relating to water resources riparian protection requirements on public waters and public drainage systems.

The Buffer Program was enacted in 2015, subsequently amended in 2016, and includes the following provisions:

- Requires landowners to establish and maintain buffers adjacent to public waters and public drainage ditches;
- Requires soil and water conservation districts to identify other waters for inclusion in local water plans;
- Exempts certain land uses and areas from the riparian protection requirement;
- Allows landowners to meet the buffer requirements through other conservation practices that will protect water quality;
- Requires soil and water conservation districts to assist landowners in complying with the riparian protection requirement;
- Provides for enforcement by counties, watershed districts or BWSR.

BWSR is considering the following policies for Buffer Program implementation relating to:

- 1) Compliance Determinations (Parcel and Bank Approach);
- 2) Reporting and Progress Tracking;
- 3) MS4 Exemption;
- 4) Alternative Practices Implementation;
- 5) Other Alternative Practices Approved by the Board;
- 6) Local Water Resources Riparian Protection ("Other Watercourses"); and
- 7) Failure to Implement

Minnesota Rules 4770.1900, Subp. 5 requires that the Minnesota Department of Health's Office of Medical Cannabis review the analyte list that that approved cannabis laboratories must be able to test for prior to the manufacturers distributing medical cannabis to an approved patient, and publish a notice of any analyte updates in the *State Register* at least every six months. Public Notice Regarding Changes to Payment Rates and Methodologies, and Services under the Medical Assistance Program and the MinnesotaCare Program

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to recipients, providers of services, and to the public of certain statutory changes made to the Medical Assistance (MA) Program and the MinnesotaCare Program by the 2016 Minnesota Legislature.

This notice is published pursuant to 42 United States Code § 1396a(a)(13)(A) (§ 1902(a)(13)(A) of the Social Security Act), which requires the Department to publish final institutional payment rates, the methodologies underlying the establishment of such rates, and the justification for such rates. It is also published pursuant to *Code of Federal Regulations*, title 42, part 447, section 205 (42 C.F.R. § 447.205), which requires publication of a notice when there is any significant proposed change in the methods and standards for setting payment rates for Medicaid services. Changes to the MinnesotaCare program are published pursuant to *Code of Federal Regulations*, title 42, part 600, section 115 (42 C.F.R. § 600.115), which requires publication of significant changes to the Basic Health Plan Blueprint.

The legislative changes are estimated to affect net spending in the MA program as described below.

The actual text of most of the 2016 legislative changes is contained in *Laws of Minnesota 2016*, Regular Session, Chapters 140, 163, and 189. It is important to note that not all changes made to these programs by the 2016 legislature are mentioned in this notice.

Changes were made to the following program areas:

- I. MA and MinnesotaCare Services and Payment Rates
- II. MA Institutional Payment Rates

I. MA and MinnesotaCare Services and Payment Rates

Effective July 1, 2015, the Commissioner shall increase reimbursement rates for durable medical equipment and supplies not subject to a volume purchase contract, prosthetics, and orthotics that were subject to reduced reimbursement under the Medicare competitive bid program, by 9.5 percent over rates in effect on June 30, 2015. The Commissioner shall increase reimbursement for durable medical equipment and supplies not subject to a volume purchase contract, prosthetics, and orthotics by 2.94 percent over rates in effect on June 30, 2015. The 2.94 percent increase is in addition to the 9.5 percent increase applied to certain items. These changes do not apply to products subject to the preferred diabetic testing supply program, items provided to recipients dually eligible for both Medicare and MA when Medicare is the primary payer for the item, and individually priced items. *Laws of Minnesota 2016*, Chapter 189, Article 19, section 19. This change clarifies a reimbursement increase approved under *Laws of Minnesota 2015*, Chapter 71, Article 11, section 43, and does not impact spending in the MA program.

Effective July 1, 2016, the Commissioner shall increase reimbursement rates for ambulance services by 5 percent over rates in effect on June 30, 2016, for providers located within a municipality with a population of less than 1,000, or located outside the seven-county metro area and the cities of Duluth, Mankato, Moorhead, St. Cloud, and Rochester. *Laws of Minnesota 2016*, Chapter 189, Article 19, section 10. This change is estimated to result in a net spending increase of \$624,000 in the MA program in state fiscal year 2017, and a net spending increase of \$1,275,000 in state fiscal year 2018.

Effective July 1, 2016, for critical access dental providers, other than those owned by a managed care organization, the Commissioner shall increase the payment rate under the critical access dental program to 37.5 percent from 35 percent above the reimbursement rate that would otherwise be paid to the dental provider. *Laws of Minnesota 2016*, Chapter 189, Article 19, section 18. This change is estimated to result in a net spending increase of \$142,000 in the MA program in state fiscal year 2017, and a net savings of \$3,000 in state fiscal year 2018.

Effective January 1, 2017, the Commissioner shall increase payment rates by 9.65% for all dental services provided outside the seven-county metro regardless of the provider's primary office location. This is a technical change to the increase in payment rates approved under *Laws of Minnesota 2015*, Chapter 71, Article 11, section 40, and does not result in an additional increase in payment rates. *Laws of Minnesota 2016*, Chapter 189, Article 19, section 17.

Effective January 1, 2017, Medical Assistance covers in home visits by a community emergency medical technician for beneficiaries recently discharged from a hospital. The Commissioner shall reimburse these services at a rate of \$9.75 per 15 minutes. *Laws of Minnesota 2016*, Chapter 189, Article 19, section 13. This change is estimated to result in a net spending increase of \$2,000 in the MA program in state fiscal year 2017, and a net spending increase of \$7,000 in state fiscal year 2018.

II. MA Payment Rates for Institutional Providers Nursing Facilities

Effective July 1, 2016, funds are appropriated for construction projects that are exceptions from the nursing facility moratorium. *Laws of Minnesota 2016*, Chapter 189, Article 18, section 3. This change is estimated to result in a net spending increase of \$100,000 in the MA program in state fiscal year 2017, and a net spending increase of \$400,000 in state fiscal year 2018.

Effective October 1, 2016, the nursing facility employee scholarship program is expanded to include costs related to components of an approved nursing assistant training program for adult basic education. *Laws of Minnesota 2016*, Chapter 189, Article

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18, section 8. This change is estimated to result in a net spending increase of \$2,000 in the MA program in state fiscal year 2017, and a net spending increase of \$4,000 in state fiscal year 2018.

Effective January 1, 2017, for nursing facility consolidations, the Commissioner will include adjustments in the payment rate for external fixed costs and will no longer include the adjustment in the property payment rate. *Laws of Minnesota 2016*, Chapter 140, sections 1-4. This change is estimated to result in a net spending increase of \$0 in the MA program in state fiscal year 2017, and a net spending increase of \$0 in state fiscal year 2018.

Effective January 1, 2017, or, upon completion of the closure and new construction authorized in Minnesota Statutes, section 144A.071, Subdivision 4c, paragraph (a), clause (6), whichever is later, the Commissioner will include adjustments for nursing facility consolidations in the payment-rate for external fixed costs and will no longer include the adjustment in the property payment rate. *Laws of Minnesota 2016*, Chapter 140, section 1. This change is estimated to result in a net spending increase of \$0 in the MA program in state fiscal year 2017, and a net spending increase of \$0 in state fiscal year 2018.

Notice of Availability of the Draft Watershed Restoration and Protection Strategies Report and Total Maximum Daily Loads and Request for Comment

Public Comment Period Begins: June 27, 2016 Public Comment Period Ends: July 27, 2016

The Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) is requesting comments on the Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDLs) for the Long Prairie River Watershed. The draft TMDLs is available for review at:

Written comments on the draft TMDLs must be sent to the MPCA contact person listed below by **July 27, 2016, 4:30 p.m.** The MPCA will prepare responses to comments received and make any necessary revisions of the document. Subsequent to the revision(s), the draft TMDLs will be submitted to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for approval.

This TMDL study addresses aquatic recreation use impairments due to eutrophication (phosphorus) in seven lakes, and aquatic recreation use impairments due to E. coli in three streams in the Long Prairie River Watershed in central Minnesota (Table 1, Figure 1). The goal of this TMDL is to provide wasteload allocations (WLAs) and load allocations (LAs) and to quantify the pollutant reductions needed to meet the state water quality standards. These TMDLs are being established in accordance with section 303(d) of the Clean Water Act, because the State of Minnesota has determined that these lakes and streams exceed the state established standards.

The impaired lakes and streams included in this study are located within the Long Prairie River Watershed (HUC 07010108), a tributary to the Mississippi River in the Upper Mississippi River Basin in central Minnesota. The Long Prairie River Watershed drains approximately 885 square miles (566,612 acres) in all or parts of Douglas, Otter Tail, Todd, Morrison, and Wadena Counties. The Long Prairie River begins in Douglas County and flows through Todd and Morrison counties before entering the Crow Wing River south of Motley. No tribal lands are located within the Long Prairie River Watershed.

Preliminary Determination on the draft WRAPS and TMDL Reports: The MPCA Commissioner has made a preliminary determination to approve this WRAPS Report and submit this TMDL Report to the EPA for final approval. http://www.pca.state.mn.us/hd68k9u. Suggested changes will be considered before the documents are finalized and the TMDL Report is sent to the EPA for approval.

Written Comments: You may submit written comments on the conditions of the draft WRAPS and TMDL Reports or on the Commissioner's preliminary determination. Written comments must include the following:

- 1. A statement of your interest in the draft WRAPS and/or TMDL Reports;
- 2. A statement of the action you wish the MPCA to take, including specific references to sections of the draft documents that you believe should be changed; and
- 3. The reasons supporting your position, stated with sufficient specificity as to allow the Commissioner to investigate the merits of your position.

Petition for Public Informational Meeting: You also may request that the MPCA Commissioner hold a public informational meeting. A public informational meeting is an informal meeting that may be held to solicit public comment and statements on matters before the MPCA, and help clarify parts of the document and resolve issues. A petition requesting a public informational meeting must include the following information:

- 1. A statement identifying the matter of concern;
- 2. The information required under items 1 through 3 of "Written Comments," identified above;
- 3. A statement of the reasons for holding a public informational meeting; and
- 4. The issues that you would like addressed at the public informational meeting.

Petition for Contested Case Hearing: You also may submit a petition for a contested case hearing. A contested case hearing is a formal hearing before an administrative law judge that provides evidence on issues requested to be change. In accordance with Minn. R. 7000.1900, the MPCA will grant a petition to hold a contested case hearing if it finds that: (1) there is a material issue of fact in dispute concerning the application or draft WRAPS and/or TMDL Reports; (2) the MPCA has the jurisdiction to make a determination on the disputed material issue of fact; and (3) there is a reasonable basis underlying the disputed material issue of fact or facts such that the holding of the contested case hearing would allow the introduction of information that would aid the MPCA in resolving the disputed facts in making a final decision on the draft WRAPS and/or TMDL Reports. A material issue of fact means a fact question, as distinguished from a policy question, whose resolution could have a direct bearing on a final MPCA decision. A petition for a contested case hearing must include the following information:

- 1. A statement of reasons or proposed findings supporting the MPCA decision to hold a contested case hearing according to the criteria in Minn. R. 7000.1900, as discussed above; and
- 2. A statement of the issues proposed to be addressed by a contested case hearing and the specific relief requested or resolution of the matter.

In addition and to the extent known, a petition for a contested case hearing should also include the following information:

- 1. A proposed list of prospective witnesses to be called, including experts, with a brief description of proposed testimony or summary of evidence to be presented at a contested case hearing;
 - 2. A proposed list of publications, references, or studies to be introduced and relied upon at a contested case hearing; and
 - 3. An estimate of time required for you to present the matter at a contested case hearing.

MPCA Decision: The written comments, requests, and petitions submitted on or before the last day of the public comment period will be considered in the final decision on this TMDL Report. If the MPCA does not receive written comments, requests, or petitions during the public comment period, MPCA staff as authorized by the Commissioner, will make the final decision on the draft TMDL Report.
