**Notices of public hearings on proposed rules and notices of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing are published in the Proposed Rules section and must be submitted two weeks prior to the issue date.

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The *State Register* is the official publication of the State of Minnesota, containing executive orders of the governor, proposed and adopted rules of state agencies, and official notices to the public. Judicial notice shall be taken of material published in the *State Register*.

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How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking Action in the *State Register*

State agencies must publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. If an agency seeks outside opinion before promulgating new rules or rule amendments, it must publish a **NOTICE OF INTENT TO SOLICIT OUTSIDE OPINION**. Such notices are published in the **OFFICIAL NOTICES** section. Proposed rules and adopted rules are published in separate sections of the magazine.

The **PROPOSED RULES** section contains:

- Calendar of Public Hearings on Proposed Rules.
- Proposed new rules (including Notice of Hearing and/or Notice of Intent to Adopt Rules without A Hearing).
- Proposed amendments to rules already in existence in the Minnesota Code of Agency Rules (MCAR).
- Proposed temporary rules.

The **ADOPTED RULES** section contains:

- Notice of adoption of new rules and rule amendments (those which were adopted without change from the proposed version previously published).
- Adopted amendments to new rules or rule amendments (changes made since the proposed version was published).
- Notice of adoption of temporary rules.
- Adopted amendments to temporary rules (changes made since the proposed version was published).

All **ADOPTED RULES** and **ADOPTED AMENDMENTS TO EXISTING RULES** published in the *State Register* will be published in the Minnesota Code of Agency Rules (MCAR). Proposed and adopted **TEMPORARY RULES** appear in the *State Register* but are not published in the MCAR due to the short-term nature of their legal effectiveness.

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PROPOSED RULES

Pursuant to Minn. Laws of 1980, § 15.0412, subd. 4h, an agency may propose to adopt, amend, suspend or repeal rules without first holding a public hearing, as long as the agency determines that the rules will be noncontroversial in nature. The agency must first publish a notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing, together with the proposed rules, in the *State Register*. The notice must advise the public:

1. that they have 30 days in which to submit comment on the proposed rules;
 2. that no public hearing will be held unless seven or more persons make a written request for a hearing within the 30-day comment period;
 3. of the manner in which persons shall request a hearing on the proposed rules;
- and
4. that the rule may be modified if modifications are supported by the data and views submitted.

If, during the 30-day comment period, seven or more persons submit to the agency a written request for a hearing of the proposed rules, the agency must proceed under the provisions of § 15.0412, subds. 4 through 4g, which state that if an agency decides to hold a public hearing, it must publish in the *State Register* a notice of its intent to do so. This notice must appear at least 30 days prior to the date set for the hearing, along with the full text of the proposed rules. (If the agency has followed the provisions of subd. 4h and has already published the proposed rules, a citation to the prior publication may be substituted for republication.)

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 15.0412, subd. 5, when a statute, federal law or court order to adopt, suspend or repeal a rule does not allow time for the usual rulemaking process, temporary rules may be proposed. Proposed temporary rules are published in the *State Register*, and for at least 20 days thereafter, interested persons may submit data and views in writing to the proposing agency.

Proposed Rules Governing Supervised Release Terms, Revocation of Supervised Release, and Extraordinary Discharge

Notice of Hearing

Notice is hereby given that a public hearing in the above entitled matter will be held pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 15.0412, subd. 4 (1980) in the State Office Building, Room 22, St. Paul, Minnesota 55155 on January 5, 1982, commencing at 9:30 a.m. and continuing until all persons have had an opportunity to be heard.

All interested or affected persons will have the opportunity to participate. Statements may be made orally and written material may be submitted at the hearing. In addition, whether or not an appearance is made at the hearing, written statements or material may be submitted to Jon L. Lunde, Hearing Examiner, Room 300, 1745 University Avenue, St. Paul, Minnesota 55104, telephone (612) 296-5938. Unless a longer period, not to exceed 20 calendar days, is ordered by the hearing examiner at the hearing, the record will remain open for the inclusion of written material for five (5) working days after the hearing ends. The proposed rules are subject to changes as a result of the rules hearing process. The agency, therefore, strongly urges those who may be affected in any manner by the substance of the proposed rules to be considered in this hearing to participate in the rules hearing process. In addition, it is suggested, to save time and avoid duplication, that those persons, organizations, or associations having common viewpoints or interests in these proceedings join together where possible and present a single statement on behalf of such interests. All such statements will be entered with and become a part of the record.

The rule hearing procedure is governed by Minn. Stat. §§ 15.0411-15.0417 and 15.052 (1980) and by 9 MCAR §§ 2.101-2.113. All questions and statements about procedure may be directed to the hearing examiner. All questions related to the content of the rules may be directed to Llewellyn Linde, Administrator, Minnesota Corrections Board, 430 Metro Square Building, St. Paul, Minnesota 55101, telephone 612-296-2729. Copies are available, and upon request one free copy can be obtained.

Minn. Stat. §§ 244.05 and 244.06 (1980) effective May 1, 1980, provide that the Minnesota Corrections Board shall promulgate rules for the placement and supervision of inmates serving a supervised release term, for the revocation of supervised release, the period of revocation for each violation of supervised release, and the circumstances under which extraordinary discharge may be approved by the board and the appropriate procedures for approving the same. These rules are intended to fulfill the requirements as indicated in Minn. Stat. §§ 244.05 and 244.06.

The proposed rules, if adopted, would be new rules of the Minnesota Corrections Board. The proposed rules provide policies and procedures of the board and include: (1) conditions of supervised release; (2) revocation of supervised release; (3) supervised release for persons serving mandatory life terms; (4) extraordinary discharge; and (5) Minnesota Sentencing Guideline case hearings.

Minn. Stat. ch. 10A requires each lobbyist to register with the State Ethical Practices Board within five (5) days after he/she commences lobbying. A lobbyist is defined in Minn. Stat. § 1014.01, subd. 11 (1980) as any individual:

(a) Engaged for pay or other consideration, or authorized by another individual or association to spend money, who spends more than five (5) hours in any month or more than \$250, not including *his own* travel expenses and membership dues, in any

year, for the purpose of attempting to influence legislative or administrative action by communicating or urging others to communicate with public officials; or

(b) Who spends more than \$250, not including *his own* travel expenses and membership dues, in any year, for the purpose of attempting to influence legislative or administrative action by communicating or urging others to communicate with public officials.

The statute provides certain exceptions. Questions should be directed to the Ethical Practices Board, 41 State Office Building, St. Paul, Minnesota 55115, telephone 612-296-5615.

The Minnesota Corrections Board estimates that there will be no cost to local public bodies within the state to implement the rule for the two years immediately following the adoption within the meaning of Minn. Stat. § 15.0412, subd. 7.

Notice: Any person may request notification of the date on which the hearing examiner's report will be available, after which date the agency may not take any final action on the rules for a period of five (5) working days. Any person may request notification of the date on which the hearing record has been submitted (or resubmitted) to the Attorney General by the agency. If you desire to be so notified, you may so indicate at the hearing. After the hearing, you may request notifications by sending a written request to the hearing examiner (in the case of the hearing examiner's report), or to the agency (in the case of the agency's submission or resubmission to the Attorney General).

Notice is hereby given that 25 days prior to the hearing, a statement of need and reasonableness will be available for review at the agency and at the Office of Administrative Hearings. This statement of need and reasonableness will include a summary of all the evidence and argument which the agency anticipates presenting at the hearing justifying both the need and reasonableness of the proposed rules. Copies of the Statement of Need and Reasonableness may be obtained from the Office of Administrative Hearings at a minimal charge.

- 11 MCAR § 3.002 Definitions. For the purposes of 11 MCAR §§ 3.002-3.015 the terms defined in this rule have the meanings given them:
 - A. Advanced age. "Advanced age" means an age of 75 years or more of an individual under sentence.
 - B. Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Corrections or his designee.
 - C. Community program. "Community program" means a structured residential or nonresidential program in the community, such as a halfway house program, work release program, chemical dependency treatment center program, or behavior modification treatment program.
 - D. Correctional professional. "Correctional professional" means a caseworker in a state correctional facility, a parole or probation officer, or supervisor of casework services or parole or probation services.
 - E. Family. "Family" means legal parents, legal children, and legal brothers or sisters.
 - F. Inmate. "Inmate" means a person convicted of a felony and imprisoned in a state correctional facility or other place designated by the Commissioner of Corrections.
 - G. Board. "Board" means the Corrections Board.
 - H. Guidelines. "Guidelines" means the Minnesota sentencing guidelines.
 - I. Other extraordinary circumstances. "Other extraordinary circumstances" means any uncommon, exceptional conditions of an individual with respect to a time, place, or event.
 - J. Pardon board. "Pardon board" means the Board of Pardons as defined in Minn. Stat. ch. 638.
 - K. Probable cause. "Probable cause" means that there is a reasonable ground for belief that one or more of the conditions of supervised release have been violated.
 - L. Probation officer. "Probation officer" is a generic term for field or parole agents, parole and probation officers.
 - M. Public interest. "Public interest" means the interest of the public in the maintenance of the integrity of the criminal law sanctions and the legal rights of citizens.
 - N. Public safety. "Public safety" means the protection of the public from injury, danger, and violence.

O. Special condition. "Special condition" means a condition of the supervised release from other than the general conditions setting forth individual specified requirements to be followed by a releasee.

P. Supervised release. "Supervised release" means that portion of a determinate sentence served by an inmate in the community under supervision and subject to the prescribed board rules.

Q. Supervised releasee. "Supervised releasee" or "releasee" means a person serving a supervised release term.

R. Supervised release form. "Supervised release form" means the document containing the standard and special conditions imposed by the Corrections Board.

S. Senility. "Senility" means an individual with physical and mental weakness brought on by old age with loss of mental faculties and disorientation as to date, time, and place.

T. Serious health problem. "Serious health problem" means a documented serious physical health problem of an inmate or releasee which makes the continuation of a criminal sentence impractical and inconsistent with the public interest.

U. Work release agreement. "Work release agreement" means the agreement among the inmate, the Corrections Board, and the Commissioner of Corrections stating the terms and conditions under which an inmate is released to work at paid employment, seek employment, or participate in vocational training or educational programs.

V. Work release. "Work release" means a program in which an inmate is conditionally released from confinement to work at gainful employment, seek employment, or participate in vocational or educational training in the community while serving his sentence. Work release constitutes an extension of the limits of confinement. The inmate shall execute a work release agreement specifying the terms and conditions of the work release.

11 MCAR § 3.004 Supervised release.

A. Minnesota sentencing guidelines initial review process.

1. Between 60 to 90 days after admission, all Minnesota sentencing guidelines cases will be placed on a Corrections Board nonappearance calendar for review and evaluation by the board.

2. This paper review hearing will be conducted by two board members. The inmate's assigned caseworker will be present to provide information and any necessary assistance.

3. The inmate's classification committee report and recommendation, entire case history, including such facts as prior history, current conviction or convictions, institutional behavior, psychiatric and psychological evaluations, and future plans will be evaluated.

4. The minutes shall be written by the board immediately after the review and shall reflect possible special conditions which may be specified at the time of supervised release. If special conditions are indicated, the board minutes shall state the problem or problems to be corrected with supporting reasons along with possible treatment resources or specific supervised release conditions.

5. After the review, cases will be continued to the reentry review unless the board directs otherwise.

B. Minnesota sentencing guidelines reentry process.

1. Between 60 and 90 days prior to an inmate's scheduled release date, the board will conduct a reentry review with the inmate present to go over the rules and conditions of supervised release. At this hearing, the board will study the inmate's entire case history with particular emphasis on institutional behavior, achievements during incarceration, and future plans.

2. After careful consideration of all the facts and case materials, the board will determine whether to impose any special conditions. If special conditions are required, the board shall set forth written reasons in the minutes for the conditions.

C. Process of setting general and special conditions of supervised release. The board will set for each inmate the general and special conditions of supervised release.

1. Sixty to 90 days prior to an inmate's scheduled release date, the board will conduct a personal hearing to go over an inmate's entire case history, including such facts as prior history, current convictions, institutional behavior, achievements during incarceration, and future plans, and require that a pre-release report with recommendations be made.

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2. At this hearing the classification committee summary and recommendation shall also be reviewed.

3. The prospective supervising agent's pre-release report and recommendation shall also be reviewed.

4. An inmate shall be entitled to participate in the hearing and to submit written information to the board in support of his position regarding the conditions of supervised release.

D. Special conditions of supervised release. The board may impose special conditions of supervised release if:

1. The facts of the current offense for which the inmate is imprisoned show that the inmate used a firearm or dangerous weapon to commit an assault, commit any form of prohibited sexual behavior, or engage in terroristic behavior;

2. The inmate has a history of criminal conviction involving the use of and dependency upon mood altering chemicals, or the use of firearms or other dangerous weapons, or the commission of physical assaults, terrorist acts, or any form of prohibited sexual behavior or deviancy; or

3. The inmate, within three years of his scheduled release date, has been diagnosed by a licensed physician, psychologist, chemical dependency counselor or correctional professional in public service or private practice, as being presently or potentially dangerous, chemically dependent, or sexually pathologic. This diagnosis shall be in writing.

E. Inmates currently under pre-May 1, 1980 sentences and Minnesota sentencing guidelines sentences. When an inmate is under a pre-May 1, 1980 sentence and a guidelines sentence concurrently, and the pre-May 1, 1980 sentence exceeds the Minnesota sentencing guidelines sentence, parole shall be granted under Minn. Stat. §§ 243.05 and 243.12.

F. Participation in community programs as condition of supervised release. If participation in a residential community program is prescribed as a special condition of supervised release, failure to enter such a program is grounds for revocation of supervised release; provided, however, that if no community program is available at the time of supervised release, the board may order that the supervised releasee enter the first available community program deemed to be competent to meet his needs.

G. Process of granting work release.

1. When the Department of Corrections submits the name of an eligible inmate for the work release program to the board, within 15 calendar days the board shall set a personal hearing date to approve or disapprove the application.

2. Within seven calendar days after the hearing, the inmate shall be given a written copy of the board's decision.

11 MCAR § 3.005 Reserved for future use.

11 MCAR § 3.006 Conditions of supervised release.

A. Standard conditions. All persons on supervised release shall comply with these standard conditions.

1. The supervised releasee shall report immediately upon arrival at his specified destination as indicated by his agent, either by telephone or personal visit, to the designated supervising agent.

2. The supervised releasee shall at all times follow the instructions of the supervising agent and keep the agent informed of his residence and activities. The supervised releasee shall advise the agent within 24 hours if he is arrested.

3. The supervised releasee shall maintain contact with the supervising agent in the manner prescribed by that agent.

4. The supervised releasee shall submit reports as may be required by the supervising agent and shall respond promptly to any communication regarding his supervised release.

5. The supervised releasee shall follow the supervising agent's instructions with respect to use of intoxicants and shall not possess or use narcotics or other drugs, preparations, or substances as defined by Minn. Stat. ch. 152, except those prescribed for the supervised releasee by a physician.

6. Possession of pistols or handguns is regulated by Minn. Stat. §§ 624.713-624.718 and possession of firearms by persons convicted of a felony is prohibited by the Federal Gun Control Act of 1968, Public Law 90-168; therefore, the supervised releasee shall not purchase or otherwise obtain or have in his possession any type of firearm or dangerous weapon as defined by Minn. Stat. § 609.02, subd. 6.

7. A supervised releasee shall not leave the state without the written permission of the supervising agent specifying the terms and conditions under which permission is granted.

B. Restructure of supervised release; general and special conditions.

1. A person on supervised release may at any time during his supervised release term request that the general and special conditions thereof be modified. The request must be made in writing through his supervising agent.

2. A supervising agent on his own initiative may request a restructure of his client's supervised release general and special conditions.

3. The board may authorize the supervising agent to modify the general and special conditions of supervised release or cause the releasee to be brought before the board for a hearing on the matter of modification.

4. Any modification of the general and special conditions of supervised release shall be in writing and executed with the same formality as the original conditions.

11 MCAR § 3.009 Revocation of supervised release.

A. Grounds.

1. Conviction of a felony, gross misdemeanor, any misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment as defined in Minn. Stat. § 609.02, repeated traffic offenses other than parking violations, or involvement in any activity defined as criminal by the laws of this state, other states, or of the United States is a violation of supervised release and grounds for revocation.

2. Violation of any general or special condition of supervised release constitutes grounds for revocation of supervised release.

B. Dispositions. If the board finds that a releasee has violated his supervised release it may:

1. Counsel the releasee and continue supervised release without modification;
2. Modify and enlarge the conditions of supervised release and continue supervised release; or
3. Revoke supervised release and return the releasee to imprisonment for an appropriate period of time, not to exceed the time remaining on his sentence.

C. Period of imprisonment for violations. The period of imprisonment for violations is as follows:

1. For violations of conditions of supervised release other than conviction of or involvement in criminal activity: three to six months, plus any time spent in jail in connection with the violation.
2. For conviction of misdemeanors or gross misdemeanors: four to six months, plus any time spent in jail in connection with the conviction.
3. For conviction of a felony: six months to expiration of sentence.
4. The board in its discretion for sufficient cause, with written reasons, may mitigate or aggravate the period of imprisonment for parole violations.

D. Revocation procedures.

1. The supervising agent shall investigate all alleged violations of supervised release and after consultation with his supervisor determine whether grounds exist to begin revocation procedures.

2. If grounds are found to exist justifying the initiation of revocation procedures, a violation report shall be submitted to the board together with a recommendation as to the issuance of a warrant directing the apprehension and detention of the releasee pending a hearing.

3. If the board determines that revocation proceedings shall be initiated, the agent shall be so notified in writing.

4. Upon receipt of notice to begin revocation proceedings, the supervising agent shall:

- a. Give the releasee a copy of the violation report;
- b. Advise the releasee of his right to a hearing and to the assistance of counsel of his own choosing or the services of the state public defender, and of his right to present evidence; and
- c. Set the date for the probable cause hearing. If the releasee is in custody pursuant to a warrant by the board, the probable cause hearing must be held within ten days immediately after his detention, unless good cause is shown for a continuance.

5. At the time notice is given to the releasee, or as soon thereafter as possible, notice shall be sent to the state public defender.

6. The probable cause hearing shall be held in a municipality near the site of the alleged violation.

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7. The hearing shall be held before a hearing officer as designated by the commissioner.

8. If probable cause is found, the releasee shall be imprisoned in a place determined by the commissioner, and detained pending a revocation hearing before the board.

9. Appropriate staff at the correctional facility in which the releasee is detained shall schedule a revocation hearing within 60 days of the releasee's admission into the facility.

10. The releasee shall have the same rights of notice, hearing, and the assistance of counsel at the revocation hearing as he had at the probable cause hearing.

11. A supervised releasee may waive his right to a probable cause hearing at any time prior to the hearing. The waiver must be in writing, and the releasee must have been advised that he may be returned immediately to a state correctional facility to await a revocation hearing.

12. Unless taken into custody by an agent under the authority of Minn. Stat. § 243.05, a supervised releasee shall not be taken into custody unless by order or warrant of the board, or any member thereof. Requests for detention orders or warrants must allege the specific facts upon which the alleged violation is based, indicate the sources of information, and cite reasons why detention pending the probable cause hearing is necessary.

13. Warrants may be issued in all cases where a supervised releasee has absconded from supervision, or despite reasonable efforts to locate the releasee, he cannot be found. Issuance of a warrant under these circumstances shall toll the running of time on the sentence until the releasee is returned to custody, when it shall again begin.

14. In all cases where a supervised releasee is returned from out of state, whether by extradition proceedings or waiver of extradition, no probable cause hearing may be required, nor may a probable cause hearing be required in the event of a finding of probable cause in an omnibus hearing or a conviction.

15. Failure of a supervised releasee to appear at a probable cause hearing after having been duly notified will result in the issuance of a warrant and his return to custody in a state correctional facility to await a revocation hearing.

11 MCAR § 3.012 Supervised release for persons serving mandatory life terms.

A. Presumptive term of incarceration. The presumptive term of incarceration must be established on an individual basis.

B. Presumptive scheduled release date. The board shall establish a presumptive scheduled release date for each inmate serving a mandatory life sentence. In establishing the presumptive scheduled release date the board shall take into consideration, but not be limited to, general release criteria involving aggravating and mitigating factors such as:

1. Victim treated with unusual cruelty;
2. History of violent, assaultive behavior; and
3. Institutional adjustment.

C. Procedure for establishing presumptive scheduled release date.

1. Three years prior to completion of the mandatory minimum sentence for persons serving mandatory life sentences the board shall schedule a personal appearance hearing before the full board. At this hearing the board shall thoroughly consider the inmate's entire case history, including the facts and circumstances of the offense for which the life sentence is being served, past criminal history, institutional adjustment, classification committee reports, psychological and psychiatric reports where pertinent, and results of community investigations. The inmate shall be entitled to submit written documentation in support of his position and to speak in his own behalf. The board may also initiate inquiries and take testimony as authorized by Minn. Stat. § 243.05.

2. The inmate shall be given 60 days notice of the hearing to fix his presumptive scheduled release date so that he may make any preparation he deems necessary.

3. Within 30 days after the hearing the board shall notify the inmate of its decision. The board vote must be unanimous in conformance with Minn. Stat. § 243.05. The notice shall be in writing and contain a summary of the factors considered and the reasons for its decision.

D. Recision of presumptive scheduled release date. Once established, a scheduled release date may not be rescinded without a hearing incorporating all of the due process elements required for revocation of supervised release, and then only by unanimous vote of the full board.

11 MCAR § 3.015 Extraordinary discharge.

A. Who may apply; grounds.

1. Any person, whether imprisoned in a state correctional facility or detained elsewhere as authorized by the commissioner, or at liberty in the community under supervision and subject to the rules of the board, may apply to the board for an extraordinary discharge.
2. An application for extraordinary discharge may be based upon the following:
 - a. Serious health problems;
 - b. Senility;
 - c. Advanced age;
 - d. Extraordinary circumstances; or
 - e. Any combination of clauses a., b., or c.
3. Applications, based upon the grounds contained in 2 a., b., and c. must be supported by written statements by licensed physicians attesting to the existence of the alleged grounds and giving their opinion as to whether:
 - a. Continued imprisonment would be detrimental to the health and welfare of the applicant;
 - b. No cost effective health care facilities available to the Department of Corrections are adequate to provide the proper care for the applicant;
 - c. The applicant is 75 years of age or more; or
 - d. The applicant does not pose an actual threat to the personal safety of any individual or the public.
4. Based upon the documentation by physicians and other relevant data, the board in order to approve extraordinary discharge upon a ground contained in 2. a., b., or c. must find that:
 - a. Extraordinary discharge is justified on the alleged grounds;
 - b. The discharge of the applicant will not constitute a threat to the personal safety of any individual or the public; and
 - c. The discharge is compatible with the public interest and the welfare of the applicant.
5. Applications based upon extraordinary circumstances must allege:
 - a. Economic hardship on the immediate family of the applicant;
 - b. The hardship is of such an uncommon and exceptional nature that it may only be alleviated by the discharge of the applicant; and
 - c. The discharge of the applicant will not pose a present or potential threat to any individual or to the public.
6. If, after appropriate inquiry the board finds that the allegations are substantially true, extraordinary discharge may be approved.

B. Application process.

1. Applications for extraordinary discharge must be in writing, contain all of the reasons why the applicant feels such discharge is warranted, and be supported by appropriate documentation.
2. The caseworker at a state correctional facility, or in the case of a supervised releasee, his supervising agent, if requested, shall assist the applicant in the preparation of his application. In all cases the application shall be submitted to the caseworker or supervising agent for review.
3. When satisfied that the application is in proper form and complete, the caseworker or supervising agent will then submit the application to the classification committee of the facility in which the applicant is confined, or to the field supervisor if the applicant is on supervised release. After review of the application, the classification committee or field supervisor shall submit the application to the board together with any recommendations they deem necessary.
4. Within 30 days of receipt of the application from the classification committee or field supervisor, the application shall be placed on the full board calendar. Applications for extraordinary discharge shall be approved or denied by a majority vote of the full board. If the application is approved, it will be forwarded to the Board of Pardons for final disposition.

Unless seven or more persons submit written requests for a public hearing on the proposed rules within the 30-day comment period, a public hearing will not be held. In the event a public hearing is required, the agency will proceed according to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes § 15.0412, subdivisions 4-4f.

Persons who wish to be advised of the submission of this material to the Attorney General, or who wish to receive a copy of the final rules as proposed for adoption, should submit a written statement of such request to Greg Hubinger.

Rules as Proposed (all new material)

6 MCAR § 2.2501 Authority and purpose.

A. Authority. The agency's authority to adopt these rules is contained in Minn. Stat. § 116H.129, as well as 116H.08, clause (a) and 116H.07, clause (i).

B. Purpose. The purpose of these rules is to establish a program requiring an energy audit to be performed upon the sale of residential structures. The three major components of this program are the establishment of: minimum energy efficiency standards for the evaluation of existing residences, mandatory minimum energy efficiency standards for rental buildings and procedures for the energy evaluation disclosure program and the certification of evaluators.

6 MCAR § 2.2502 Definitions. For the purposes of 6 MCAR §§ 2.2501-2.2510, the following terms have the meanings given them.

A. Accessible. "Accessible" means:

1. For purposes of inspection, any area of the residence which can be evaluated with only the removal of temporary components of the structure. Temporary components include, but are not limited to, electrical plate covers, attic hatch covers, and obstructions in closets which provide access to the area of the residence to be evaluated.

2. For purposes of compliance with 6 MCAR § 2.2503, any area that can be made more energy efficient with the installation of program measures that are not determined to be economically infeasible and which area is exposed, without the removal of permanent parts of the structure.

B. Agency. "Agency" means the Minnesota Energy Agency.

C. Apartment building. "Apartment building" means any structure containing two or more residential dwelling units which are rented.

D. Community based organization. "Community based organization" means an organization which has a demonstrated community involvement such that the organization has a history of energy or related community service in a specific service area.

E. Conditioned space. "Conditioned space" means space within a building that is heated or cooled by an energy using system.

F. Cooling degree day. "Cooling degree day" means a unit, based upon temperature difference and time, used in estimating fuel consumption and specifying nominal cooling load in summer. For any one day when the mean temperature is more than 65 degrees Fahrenheit, there exist as many cooling degree days as there are Fahrenheit degrees difference in temperature between the mean temperature for the day and 65 degrees Fahrenheit.

G. Economic feasibility. For the purpose of these rules, the test of economic feasibility is met when the savings in energy procurement costs, based on residential energy costs as certified by the commissioner or the director in the State Register, or on local fuel costs, exceed the cost of acquiring and installing each individual program measure, as amortized over the subsequent ten-year period.

H. Energy conservation measure. "Energy conservation measure" means any of the following measures in a residential building:

1. Caulking consisting of pliable materials used to reduce the passage of air and moisture by filling small gaps located at fixed joints on a building, underneath baseboards inside a building, in exterior walls at electric outlets, around pipes and wires entering a building, and around dryer vents and exhaust fans in exterior walls. Caulking includes, but is not limited to, materials commonly known as "sealants," "putty," and "glazing compounds."

2. Weatherstripping consisting of narrow strips of material placed over or in movable joints of windows and doors to reduce the passage of air and moisture when the windows and doors are closed.

3. Furnace efficiency modifications consisting of:

a. A furnace or boiler, including a heat pump, which replaces an existing furnace or boiler of the same fuel type and which reduces the amount of fuel consumed due to an increase in combustion efficiency, improved heat generation, or reduced heat losses.

b. A furnace replacement burner (oil) which atomizes the fuel oil, mixes it with air, and ignites the fuel-air mixture, and is an integral part of an oil-fire furnace or boiler including the combustion chamber, and uses less oil than the device it replaces.

c. An automatically operated damper installed in a gas-fired furnace (often called a vent damper) which is installed downstream from the drafthood and conserves energy by substantially reducing the flow of heated air through the chimney when the furnace is not in operation.

d. An electrical or mechanical ignition device which, when installed in a gas-fired furnace or boiler, automatically ignites the gas burner and replaces a gas pilot light.

4. A central air conditioner which replaces an existing central air conditioner of the same fuel type and which reduces the amount of fuel consumed due to an increase in efficiency.

5. Ceiling insulation consisting of a material primarily designed to resist heat flow which is installed between the

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conditioned area of a building and an unconditioned attic. Where the conditioned area of a building extends to the roof, the term "ceiling insulation" also applies to such material used between the underside and upside of the roof.

6. Wall and foundation insulation consisting of a material primarily designed to resist heat flow which is installed within or on the walls between conditioned areas of a building and unconditioned areas of a building or the outside.

7. Floor insulation consisting of a material primarily designed to resist heat flow which is installed between the first level conditioned area of a building and an unconditioned basement, a crawl space, or the ground beneath it. Where the first level conditioned area of a building is on a ground level concrete slab, the term "floor insulation" also means such material installed around the perimeter of or on the slab. In the case of mobile homes, the term "floor insulation" also means skirting to enclose the space between the building and the ground.

8. Duct insulation consisting of a material primarily designed to resist heat flow which is installed on a heating or cooling duct in an unconditioned area of a building.

9. Pipe insulation consisting of a material primarily designed to resist heat flow which is installed on a heating, cooling or hot water pipe in an unconditioned area of a building.

10. Water heater insulation consisting of a material primarily designed to resist heat flow which is suitable for wrapping around the exterior surface of the water heater casing.

11. Storm or thermal window consisting of:

- a. A window or glazing material placed outside or inside an ordinary or prime window, creating an insulating air space, to provide greater resistance to heat flow than the prime window alone; or
- b. A window unit with improved thermal performance through the use of two or more sheets of glazing material affixed to a window frame to create one or more insulated air spaces. It may also have an insulating frame and sash.

12. Storm or thermal door consisting of:

- a. A second door, installed outside or inside a prime door, creating an insulating air space;
- b. A door with enhanced resistance to heat flow through the glass area created by affixing two or more sheets of glazing materials; or
- c. A primary exterior door with an R-value of at least two.

13. Heat reflective and heat absorbing window or door material consisting of a window or door glazing material with exceptional heat-absorbing or heat-reflecting properties or of reflective or absorptive films and coatings applied to an existing window or door which thereby result in exceptional heat-absorbing or heat-reflecting properties.

14. Devices associated with electric load management techniques consisting of customer-owned or leased devices that control the maximum kilowatt demand of the residence on an electric utility and which are any of the following:

- a. Part of a radio, ripple or other utility controlled load switching system located on the customer's premises;
- b. Clock-controlled load switching devices;
- c. Interlocks and other load-actuated, load limiting devices; or
- d. Energy storage devices with control systems.

15. Clock thermostat consisting of a device which is designed to reduce energy consumption by regulating the demand on the heating or cooling system in which it is installed and which uses:

- a. A temperature control device for interior spaces incorporating more than one temperature control level, and
- b. A clock or other automatic mechanism for switching from one control level to another.

16. Rim joist insulation consisting of a material primarily designed to resist heat flow which is installed along either side of the rim joist.

I. Energy conserving practice. "Energy conserving practice" means any of the following measures in a residential building:

1. Furnace efficiency maintenance and adjustments consisting of cleaning and combustion efficiency adjustment of gas or oil furnaces, periodic cleaning or replacement of air filters on forced-air heating or cooling systems, lowering the bonnet or plenum thermostats to 80 degrees Fahrenheit on a gas or oil forced-air furnace, and turning off the pilot light on a gas furnace during the summer.

2. Nighttime temperature setback by manually lowering the thermostat control setting for the furnace during the heating season to a maximum of 55 degrees Fahrenheit during sleeping hours.

3. Reducing thermostat settings in winter by limiting the maximum thermostat control setting for the furnace to 68 degrees Fahrenheit during the heating season.

4. Raising thermostat setting in summer by setting the thermostat control for an air conditioner to 78 degrees Fahrenheit or higher during the cooling season.

5. Water flow reduction in showers and faucets accomplished by placing a device in a shower head or faucet to limit the maximum flow to three gallons per minute, or replacing existing shower heads or faucets with those having built-in provisions for limiting the maximum flow to three gallons per minute.

6. Reducing hot water temperature by manually setting back the water heater thermostat setting to 120 degrees Fahrenheit; and reducing the use of heated water for clothes washing.

7. Reducing energy use when a home is unoccupied by reducing the thermostat setting to 55 degrees Fahrenheit when a home is empty for four hours or longer in the heating season, turning an air conditioner off in the cooling season when no one is home, and lowering the thermostat setting of the water heater when a home is vacant for two days or longer.

8. Plugging leaks in attics, basements, and fireplaces by installing scrap insulation or other pliable materials in gaps around pipes, ducts, fans, or other items which enter the attic or basement from a heated space; installing fireproof material to plug any holes around any damper in a fireplace; and adding insulation to an attic or basement door.

9. Sealing leaks in pipes and ducts by installing caulking in any leak in a heating or cooling duct, tightening or plugging any leaking joints in hot water or steam pipes, and replacement of washers in leaking water valves.

10. Efficient use of shading by using shades or drapes to block sunlight from entering a building in the cooling season, to allow sunlight to enter during the heating season, and to cover windows tightly at night during the heating season.

J. Fireplace stove. "Fireplace stove" means a chimney-connected, solid fuel-burning stove having part of its fire chamber open to the rooms.

K. Heating degree day. "Heating degree day" means a unit, based upon temperature difference and time, used in estimating fuel consumption and specifying nominal heating load of a building in winter. For any one day, when the mean temperature is less than 65 degrees Fahrenheit, there exist as many heating degree days as there are Fahrenheit degrees difference in temperature between the mean temperature for the day and 65 degrees Fahrenheit.

L. Positive shut-off. "Positive shut-off" means a manual shut-off device which can be utilized to produce a seal to inhibit the flow of air when a fireplace or fireplace stove is not operating. Examples are damper in fireplace, damper at top of flue, damper in connector pipe, or doors (glass or other) on fireplace or fireplace stove.

M. Program measures. "Program measures" means all energy conservation measures and renewable resource measures included in the minimum energy efficiency standards for existing residences.

N. "R" value. "R" value means the measure of resistance to heat flow through a material or the reciprocal of the heat flow through a material expressed in British thermal units per hour per square foot per degree Fahrenheit at 75 degrees Fahrenheit mean temperature.

O. Renewable resource measures. "Renewable resource measures" means the following measures installed in or connected to a residential building:

1. Solar domestic hot water systems (DHW) designed to absorb the sun's energy and to use this energy to heat water for use in a residential building other than for space heating, including thermosiphon hot water heaters.

2. Passive solar space heating and cooling systems that make efficient use of, or enhance the use of, natural forces—including solar insolation, winds, nighttime coolness and opportunity to lose heat by radiation to the night sky—to heat or cool living space by the use of conductive, convective or radiant energy transfer. Passive solar systems include only:

a. Direct gain glazing systems consisting of south-facing panels of insulated glass, fiberglass, or other similar transparent substances that admit the sun's rays into the living space where the heat is retained. Glazing is either double-paned, or single-paned equipped with movable insulation.

b. Indirect gain systems consisting of panels of insulated glass, fiberglass, or other transparent substances that direct the sun's rays into south-facing specifically constructed thermal walls, ceilings, rockbeds, or containers of water or other fluids where heat is stored and radiated.

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c. Solaria/sunspace systems consisting of structures of glass, fiberglass or similar transparent material which is attached to the south-facing wall of a structure which allows for air circulation to bring heat into the residence and which is able to be closed off from the residential structure during periods of low solar insulation.

d. Window heat gain or loss retardants consisting of mechanisms which significantly reduce summer heat gain or wintertime heat loss through windows by the use of devices such as awnings; insulated rollup shades, external or internal; metal or plastic solar screens; or movable rigid insulation.

3. Wind energy devices that use wind energy to produce energy in any form primarily for use in the residence.

4. Replacement solar swimming pool heaters which are used solely for the purposes of using the sun's energy to heat swimming pool water and which replace a swimming pool heater using electricity, gas or another fossil fuel.

5. Active solar space heating equipment designed to absorb the sun's energy and to use this energy to heat living space by use of mechanically forced energy transfer such as fans or pumps.

P. Residence. "Residence" means any dwelling used for habitation during all or a portion of the months of December through March, or permanently by one or more persons. For rental buildings, "residence" means any dwelling used for habitation during all or a portion of the months November through April. A residence may be owned or rented and may be part of a multi-unit building, multi-family dwelling, or multi-purpose building, but "residence" shall not include buildings such as hotels, hospitals, motels, dormitories, sanitariums, nursing homes, schools and other buildings used for educational purposes, or correctional institutions. Each dwelling unit in a rental building shall be considered as a residence. A mobile home as defined in Minn. Stat. § 168.011, subd. 8, shall be a residence for purposes of these rules.

Q. Rim joist. "Rim joist" means that part of the residential structure between the top of the foundation wall and the sub-floor immediately above the perimeter of the floor joists.

R. Seasonal efficiency. "Seasonal efficiency" means the calculated efficiency of a heating system based on the estimated peak (tuned up) steady state-efficiency corrected for cycling losses.

S. South-facing. "South-facing" means plus or minus 45 degrees of true south.

6 MCAR § 2.2503 Minimum energy efficiency standards.

A. Compliance. The minimum energy efficiency standards listed in B. shall be applied to residences according to Exhibit 6 MCAR § 2.2503 A.-1. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 116H.129, subds. 5 and 7, the standards listed under "Disclosure at time of sale" shall only be used to evaluate the energy efficiency of existing residences built prior to January 1, 1976, at the time of sale. Time of sale means the time when a written purchase agreement is executed by the buyer, or, in the absence of a purchase agreement, the time of execution of any document providing for the conveyance of a residence. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 116H.129, subds. 2 and 3, all residences constructed prior to January 1, 1976, which are renter occupied during all or a portion of the months of November through April shall have been in compliance with standards adopted pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 116H.129, subd. 1 pertaining to caulking and weatherstripping by January 1, 1980, unless those standards are determined to be economically infeasible. Effective July 1, 1983, all residences constructed prior to January 1, 1976, which are renter occupied during all or a portion of the months of November through April shall be in compliance with all standards listed under mandatory compliance and not determined to be economically infeasible. All building owners shall initially determine the economic feasibility of these standards using the calculation procedures adopted by the agency. Those determinations are subject to review and final determination by the agency.

B. Enumeration. The following shall be the minimum energy efficiency standards for existing residences constructed prior to January 1, 1976. These standards shall be used as indicated in Exhibit 6 MCAR § 2.2503 A.-1.

1. Install weatherstripping between exterior operable window sash and frames and between exterior doors and frames. Weatherstripping is not required on storm doors or storm windows.

2. Caulk, gasket or otherwise seal accessible exterior joints between foundation and rim joist; around window and door frames; between wall and roof; between wall panels; at penetrations for utility services through walls, floors, and roofs and all other openings in the exterior envelope.

3. Install storm windows on all single glazed exterior window units enclosing conditioned space.

4. Install storm doors on all exterior door openings into conditioned spaces unless a single door, enclosed porch, vestibule, or other appurtenance provides a double door effect or provides an "R" value of 2 or more.

5. Install positive shut-offs for all fireplaces or fireplace stoves, unless an existing damper provides a positive shut-off.

6. Install insulation in accessible attics to achieve a minimum total "R" value of the insulation of R-19. If there is insufficient space for the installation of the recommended "R" value, then the recommendation by the evaluator shall be based on installing insulation to fill the available space, providing for appropriate ventilation.

7. Install insulation in all accessible rim joist areas to achieve minimum total "R" value of the insulation of R-11. If there is insufficient space for the installation of the recommended "R" value, then the recommendation by the evaluator shall be based on installing insulation to fill the available space.

8. Install insulation in accessible walls and floors enclosing conditioned spaces to achieve a minimum total "R" value of the insulation of R-11, when there is no insulation in a substantial portion of the exterior walls or floors over an unconditioned space. Accessible walls shall include above grade foundation walls of basements, cellars, or crawl spaces. If there is insufficient space for the installation of the recommended "R" value, then the recommendation by the evaluator shall be based on installing insulation to fill the available space.

9. Install insulation in accessible floors over unconditioned spaces and in rim joists to achieve a minimum total "R" value of the insulation of R-19. For slab on grade construction, insulation shall be installed to achieve a minimum total "R" value of the insulation of R-11. If there is insufficient space for the installation of the recommended "R" value, then the recommendation by the evaluator shall be based on installing insulation to fill the available space.

10. Install ceiling insulation to achieve a minimum total "R" value of the insulation of R-44 when the existing "R" value of the ceiling insulation, excluding construction materials, is R-30 or less. If there is insufficient space for the installation of the recommended "R" value, then the recommendation by the evaluator shall be based on installing insulation to fill the available space, providing for appropriate ventilation.

11. Install wall and foundation insulation to achieve a minimum total "R" value of the insulation of R-11, when there is no insulation in a substantial portion of the exterior walls or foundation walls. If there is insufficient space for the installation of the recommended "R" value, then the recommendation by the evaluator shall be based on installing insulation to fill the available space.

12. Install insulation to achieve a minimum total "R" value of the insulation of R-5 on all water heaters when the remaining useful life of the heater appears to be three years or greater and space is available around the water heater to install insulation.

13. Install insulation to achieve a minimum total "R" value of the insulation of R-11 on all accessible heating and cooling ducts in unconditioned spaces.

14. Install insulation to achieve a minimum total "R" value of the insulation of R-5 on all accessible heating, cooling or hot water pipes in unconditioned spaces.

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15. Install a clock thermostat when the residence has a thermostat on the existing furnace or central air conditioner that is compatible with a clock thermostat.
16. Install a replacement furnace or boiler with a unit of the same fuel type that has a minimum seasonal efficiency of 80 percent, when the existing unit is five years old or older and has a seasonal efficiency of less than 80 percent.
17. Replace the oil burner of an existing furnace or boiler with an oil burner that uses less oil than the device it replaces.
18. Install a vent damper on a gas fired boiler or furnace when the furnace combustion air is taken from a conditioned space.
19. Install an electrical or mechanical ignition system on a gas fired boiler or furnace, when the furnace or boiler is located in a conditioned space.
20. Replace all or part of the existing central air conditioner that is five years old or older that has an energy efficiency rating of less than 8.2 with one of the same fuel type to obtain an energy efficiency rating of 8.2 or greater.
21. Install load management devices when the electric utility serving the residence offers a residential rate which reflects any difference in the utility's cost of service between peak and off-peak periods.
22. Install heat reflective or heat absorbing window and door material when the affected rooms of the residence are air conditioned and the cooling degree days for the region exceed 700.
23. Install a solar domestic hot water system when there is a south-facing site that exists on or near the residence that has a prime solar fraction exceeding 0.6.
24. Install a passive solar space heating and cooling system when there is a south-facing site that exists on or near the residence that has a prime solar fraction exceeding 0.7.
25. Install an active solar space heating system when there is a south-facing site that exists on or near the residence that has a prime solar fraction exceeding 0.8.
26. Install a wind energy system when the region's average annual wind speed is equal to or greater than ten miles per hour and there is sufficient unrestricted access to the wind.
27. Install a solar swimming pool heater where a swimming pool is present and it is heated with electricity, gas or another fossil fuel, and the prime solar fraction exceeds 0.8.

6 MCAR § 2.2504 Conducting the evaluation.

- A. Disclosure reports. All evaluators shall use a disclosure report approved by the agency. One copy of the entire completed report shall be given to the seller of the property. Evaluators shall submit reports as required by the agency. Copies of completed disclosure reports shall be retained by evaluators for at least five years. The reports shall be available for review by the agency.
- B. Recommendations. The evaluator shall determine which of the energy conserving practices should save energy in the residence, and in the written report the evaluator shall make a recommendation regarding each practice.
- C. General duties of evaluators. Evaluators shall estimate energy savings and installation costs of each applicable program measure using the calculation procedures in 6 MCAR § 2.2510. An applicable program measure is any program measure which can be installed in the residence to meet the minimum energy efficiency standards in 6 MCAR § 2.2503. Evaluators shall:
 1. Inspect and take actual measurements of the building shell, and inspect the space heating, space cooling, and water heating equipment;
 2. Base economic calculations on local fuel prices, or on those prices provided by the agency, as published in the State Register each August 1 and February 1.
 3. Base economic calculations for materials and installation of measures on prices provided by the agency. Prices shall be made available to evaluators by:
 - a. Publication in the State Register by the agency of the most recent contractors and suppliers price survey; or
 - b. Direct mailing by the agency of the most recent price survey to certified evaluators.
 4. Base calculation procedures for active solar domestic hot water and space heating systems on those contained in the HUD Intermediate Minimum Property Standards Supplement, Solar Heating and Domestic Hot Water Systems 4930.2, 1977 Edition; and
 5. Base any cost and savings estimate for any applicable furnace efficiency modification to a gas or oil furnace or boiler on an evaluation of the seasonal efficiency or the agency published default table, whichever is higher, of the furnace or boiler.

Seasonal efficiency shall be calculated on an estimated peak (tuned-up) steady state efficiency corrected for cycling losses as follows:

a. For oil furnaces or boilers, the steady state efficiency shall be derived by a flue gas analysis of the measured flue gas temperature and carbon dioxide content.

b. For gas furnaces or boilers, the steady state efficiency shall be derived from manufacturer's design data. If the manufacturer's design data do not exist, then a flue gas analysis, as described in a. shall be performed.

6. The auditor shall calculate the energy index for the residence using the procedures in 6 MCAR § 2.2510.

D. Solar water and space heating systems. Every evaluator assessing solar domestic hot water and active solar space heating systems shall include:

1. An evaluation containing:

- a. The square foot area of the solar collector;
- b. The solar collector characteristics, including glazing materials and other solar collector materials;
- c. Any storage system needed, including the capacity of storage;
- d. Any freeze protection needed;
- e. The estimated percent of the water heating load to be met by solar energy;
- f. Any physical connections needed with existing heating systems;
- g. The annual maintenance costs;
- h. Any site preparation needed; or

2. Fact sheets developed by the agency that provide the information in 1. for a typical residence.

E. Passive solar space heating systems. Every evaluator assessing passive solar space heating systems shall include the following information:

1. An evaluation which includes:

- a. A general description and an illustration of the system;
- b. The estimated percent of the maximum heating requirements of the residence that could be met by the system;
- c. The approximate dimensions of the system;
- d. The method employed by the system to store heat, including the heat capacity for heat storage; or

2. Fact sheets developed by the agency that provide the information in 1. for a typical residence.

F. Wind energy devices. Every evaluator assessing wind energy devices shall include the following information:

1. An evaluation which includes:

a. Installation cost estimates, based on the installation costs of a commercially available device with kilowatt ratings appropriate to the level of electricity consumed in the customer's residence;

b. The evaluator's estimate of the average wind speed at the residence based on data available at the nearest wind measurement station;

c. The specifications of the device under consideration;

d. Estimates of energy cost savings, based on average yearly wind speeds and the specification of the selected wind device; or

2. Fact sheets developed by the agency that provide the information in 1. for a typical residence.

G. Disclosure. The following disclosure shall be included in any report prepared pursuant to D., E., or F.:

"The energy cost savings estimates you receive are based on systems which may be somewhat different from the ones you purchase. Also, these estimates were not determined using actual conditions but by using simulated measurements. Therefore, the cost savings we have estimated may be different from the savings which actually occur."

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6 MCAR § 2.2505 Presentation of evaluation results. Upon completion of the evaluation, the evaluator shall provide the following information in writing to the seller or the seller's agent:

A. An estimate of the total cost for materials and labor of installation by a contractor expressed in a range of dollars, within a range of plus or minus 20 percent, of each applicable program measure addressed in the evaluation.

B. An estimate of the total cost of installation by the owner expressed in a range of dollars, within a range of plus or minus 20 percent, of each applicable program measure addressed in the evaluation; however, the evaluator shall not provide an estimate to an owner of the cost of installation by the owner of replacement central air conditioners, wall insulation, furnace efficiency modifications, devices associated with load management techniques, or wind energy devices.

C. An estimate of the savings in energy costs expressed in a range of dollars, within a range of plus or minus 20 percent, which would occur during the first year from the installation of each applicable program measure addressed by the evaluation.

D. An estimate of the payback period, measured in years, from the energy cost savings of each of the applicable program measures installed individually.

E. The following disclosure: "The procedures used to make these estimates are consistent with the Minnesota Energy Agency criteria for residential energy audits. However, the actual installation costs you incur and energy cost savings you realize from installing these measures may be somewhat different from the estimates contained in this audit report. Although the estimates are based on measurements of your house, they are also based on assumptions which may not be appropriate for your household."

F. Sample calculations of the effect of the federal and state energy tax incentives on the cost to the owner of installing one applicable energy conservation program measure and one applicable renewable resource program measure.

G. If the evaluation is of rental property, a separate list of those improvements necessary to bring the residence into compliance with Minn. Stat. § 116H.129, subd. 3.

6 MCAR § 2.2506 Prohibitions.

A. Recommendations and endorsements. The evaluator shall not recommend or discuss any supplier, contractor or lender to any owner. The evaluator shall not endorse the use of specific brand names of materials or products, persons, firms, or contractors which may be used to meet any specific standard. The evaluator shall not make any statements relating to the standards which may be interpreted as an endorsement of any specific material or product.

B. Exclusion of measures. The evaluator shall not exclude any applicable program measures in the presentation of the audit to the owner.

C. Costs of certain products. The evaluator shall not include in the written evaluation costs or energy cost savings of installing any product which is not defined as a program measure.

D. Required disclosure. The evaluator shall provide the owner with a written statement of any interest which the evaluator or the evaluator's employer has, directly or indirectly, in the sale or installation of any program measure, or in the sale of the residence to be evaluated.

6 MCAR § 2.2507 Qualification procedures for evaluators.

A. Prohibition of discrimination. No person shall be denied the right to become an evaluator on the basis of race, religion, nationality, creed, sex, age or sexual preference.

B. Training.

1. Except as provided in 2. no person shall be eligible for certification pursuant to C. unless he or she has first participated in a training course which has been approved by the agency and which covers the subject matter tested in the evaluator certification examination.

2. The following persons shall be permitted to take an appropriate agency approved orientation session, in lieu of the requirements of 1.

a. Any HED evaluator certified before July 1, 1981;

b. Any person successfully completing an approved 30 hour training course for the HED program prior to July 1, 1981;

c. Registered architects and registered engineers with work experience in energy auditing or the design of institutional, commercial, residential or industrial buildings;

d. Any person who has six months' energy auditing experience and who has completed 25 energy audits for a non-profit organization;

e. Members of the American Institute of Real Estate Appraisers, the Society of Real Estate Appraisers, the Independent Fee Appraisers or other associations determined by the agency to have applicable training requirements for their members;

f. Certified evaluators for Truth in Housing Programs;

g. Building officials certified by the Building Codes Division of the Minnesota Department of Administration.

C. Certification. Only those persons who satisfy all of the following conditions shall be certified:

1. All persons must take and pass a certification examination conducted by the agency. The certification examination shall test for the following qualifications:

a. A general understanding of the three types of heat transfer and the effects of temperature and humidity on heat transfer;

b. A general understanding of residential construction terminology and components;

c. A general knowledge of the operation of the heating and cooling systems used in residential buildings, including the need and provision for combustion air;

d. A general knowledge of the different types of each applicable program measure, of the advantages and disadvantages and applications of each, and of the DOE installation standards;

e. The capability to conduct the HED energy evaluation including: a working knowledge of energy conserving practices, the ability to determine the applicability of each of the program measures, and proficiency in the auditing procedures for each applicable program measure established in 6 MCAR § 2.2504;

f. A working ability to calculate the steady state efficiency of furnaces or boilers;

g. An understanding of the nature of solar energy and its residential applications including: insolation, shading, heat capture and transport, and heat transfer for hot water;

h. An understanding of the nature of wind energy and its residential applications including: wind availability, effects of obstruction, wind capture, power generation, and interfaces with residential and utility power lines; and

i. A working knowledge of building and fire codes related to the installation and safety of wood burning appliances.

2. All persons shall submit a \$50 certification fee to the Minnesota Energy Agency. However, no certification fee shall be charged for certified municipal building officials who are directly employed by a municipality as defined in Minn. Stat. § 16.84, subd. 3, or for employees of private non-profit community-based organizations, when the evaluations are performed as part of the employee's normal job responsibilities.

a. No certification fee shall be charged for those persons upgrading their certification who were certified prior to July 1, 1981.

b. The Minnesota Energy Agency may charge a fee for those persons seeking to be recertified.

3. All persons shall provide evidence satisfactory to the agency of liability and of errors and omissions insurance. The minimum value of protection in each category shall be \$50,000, and the insurance shall be of the "occurrence" variety where coverage is based on the date when the evaluation is made. Coverage shall not be required for evaluators who are employed by municipal governments and who perform evaluations as part of their normal job responsibilities. Certified evaluators who have provided a bond to the state as required by the Building Code Division of the Department of Administration shall not be required to obtain the protection required by this paragraph until that bond expires. Bonds shall not be renewed for the purposes of the HED program. In addition, each insurance policy shall:

a. Name the State of Minnesota as a coinsured party.

b. Be written by a corporate surety licensed to do business in the State of Minnesota.

D. Certification examinations. Examinations shall be conducted by the agency and offered at the following times:

1. Within two days after the completion of each state-sponsored training course or orientation session, or

2. Once a month, until June 1982, with a minimum of two examinations per year afterward.

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6 MCAR § 2.2508 Recertification of evaluators.

A. Term of certification. Certification shall be valid for one year.

B. Recertification procedure. Each year, each evaluator shall be recertified. The following procedures shall be completed in order for an evaluator to be recertified.

1. Prior to the date of certificate expiration, the evaluator shall attend a recertification course, as required by the agency. Successful completion of this course shall recertify the evaluator for the next year. Evaluators not completing the recertification course prior to the expiration date of their certification shall be recertified by completing the recertification course and successfully retaking the certification examination.

2. The recertification course requirements for evaluators shall be eliminated for any particular year if the agency determines that no changes were made in the HED Program that year. Certification shall then be automatically renewed.

3. This recertification shall occur annually, for the life of the program.

C. Personnel from other states. Any person who is certified to conduct residential conservation service audits in another state shall not be required to take the training course established in 6 MCAR § 2.2507 B.1., but shall be required to pass the evaluator certification examination.

6 MCAR § 2.2509 Decertification of evaluators.

A. Insurance. Certification shall be revoked upon cancellation or expiration of the insurance protection required in 6 MCAR § 2.2507 C.3.

B. Training. Certification shall be revoked for any HED evaluator certified before July 1, 1981, who does not successfully complete the appropriate training course required in 6 MCAR § 2.2507 B., and the certification examination required in 6 MCAR § 2.2507 C.1.

C. Recertification. Certification shall be revoked for any evaluator not meeting the recertification requirements of 6 MCAR § 2.2508.

D. Non-sufficient fund checks. Certification shall be revoked for any evaluator whose check or draft issued for payment of the certification fee is returned for non-sufficient funds.

E. Wrongful acts. Certification shall be revoked when reasonable evidence indicates an undisclosed conflict of interest, a violation of these rules, unethical practices, or negligent performance of duties as an evaluator. In any of these instances, the agency will, if requested, provide a review to determine whether the revocation was proper. Such a review shall consist of the following procedures:

1. The evaluator shall make a written request for a review to the agency.

2. The manager of the conservation division shall determine a time to review the request.

a. The evaluator may present testimony in person or in writing.

b. The evaluator may present witnesses on the evaluator's behalf.

c. Agency staff may present written or oral testimony, as well as witnesses.

3. The manager of the conservation division shall make a judgment based on the information presented in the review hearing. That judgment shall be presented in writing to the evaluator within three working days of the review.

F. Failure to report. Certification shall be revoked if the reports required in 6 MCAR § 2.2504 A. are not submitted to the agency as requested.

6 MCAR § 2.2510 Calculation procedures. The following procedures shall be the basis for calculating energy savings for program measures.

A. Energy conserving measures.

1. General energy savings equations. The following equations shall be used to calculate energy savings for the practices and measures listed below, except for those that are already termed in E.

(Customer's Indications) and as set forth in B.-D., the specifications, tolerances and other technical standards for commercial weighing and measuring devices as prescribed by the National Conference on Weights and Measures and published in the National Bureau of Standards Handbook 44, 4th Edition, 1976, are hereby adopted by reference as the standards of the State of Minnesota for such devices. ~~Provided However, that should the aforesaid if Handbook 44 contain any~~ contains provisions contrary to the laws of Minnesota or the rules of the Minnesota Public Service Utilities Commission, Minnesota law or Public Service Utilities Commission rule shall govern.

B. Fuel pump sales; measurement and price computation. The following are permissible methods for measurement and price computation of fuel pump sales:

1. Measurement and price computation per gallon;
2. Measurement and price computation per liter; and
3. Measurement and price computation per half-gallon.

However, equipment placed in service after December 31, 1982, shall not use method 3, and after December 31, 1983, all measurement and pricing by half-gallon shall be permanently discontinued.

C. Advertisements. Regardless of the method used in B., all roadside signs and similar advertisements of motor fuel offered for retail sale shall indicate the price per gallon or price per liter.

D. Liter-gallon price comparison. In the case of per liter sales there shall be posting of per gallon and per liter prices at the device, service island, and premises of the establishment in accordance with state and local laws, regulations and ordinances. Posting shall be in a manner which facilitates consumer comparison between the per gallon price and the per liter price.

ADOPTED RULES

The adoption of a rule becomes effective after the requirements of Minn. Stat. § 15.0412, subd. 4, have been met and five working days after the rule is published in the *State Register*, unless a later date is required by statutes or specified in the rule.

If an adopted rule is identical to its proposed form as previously published, a notice of adoption and a citation to its previous *State Register* publication will be printed.

If an adopted rule differs from its proposed form, language which has been deleted will be printed with strike outs and new language will be underlined, and the rule's previous *State Register* publication will be cited.

A temporary rule becomes effective upon the approval of the Attorney General as specified in Minn. Stat. § 15.0412, subd. 5. Notice of his decision will be published as soon as practicable, and the adopted temporary rule will be published in the manner provided for adopted rules under subd. 4.

Commissioner's Order No. 2109

Regulations for the Taking of Turkeys during 1982

Pursuant to authority vested in me by law, I, Joseph N. Alexander, Commissioner of Natural Resources, hereby prescribe the following regulations for the taking of turkeys during 1982.

Section 1. DEFINITIONS.

a. Legal firearms: Only shotguns 20 gauge or larger, or muzzleloading shotguns 12 gauge or larger, using No. 4, 5 or 6 fine shot shall be used.

b. Legal bow and arrow: Bows must have a pull of no less than 40 pounds at or before full draw. The bow may not be drawn, held, or released by a mechanical device. Arrow heads shall be of barbless, edged design, shall have steel blades and shall be wide enough so as to be incapable of passing through a ring the inside diameter of which is seven-eighths of an inch. Arrow heads constructed entirely of steel shall weigh at least 110 grains. Arrow heads with a core or ferrule made of a material other than steel shall weigh at least 90 grains. All arrow heads used for turkey hunting shall be kept sharp. Arrows carrying poison or explosives shall not be used.

c. Legal turkey: Any turkey with a visible beard (feathered appendage protruding from the breast, generally found only on males).

d. Drawing: Computerized random drawing to determine those who will be eligible to apply for a turkey license.

e. Agricultural or Grazing Land: Lands containing plowed or tilled fields, standing crops or their residues, or lands with a maintained fence for the purpose of enclosing domestic livestock.

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ADOPTED RULES

Sec. 2. TURKEY HUNT DRAWING.

a. License Application Drawings: Persons desiring to hunt turkeys must take part in one of the computerized license application drawings conducted by the Department of Natural Resources. The drawings shall be subject to the quotas set forth by Sec. 5. All persons selected by the drawings may apply for a license to hunt turkeys, as set forth by Sec. 3.

b. Eligibility for Drawing: Any person who is at least 16 years of age prior to April 17, 1982, has maintained a legal residence in Minnesota for a period of 60 days immediately preceding April 17, 1982, did not receive a Minnesota turkey license in 1980 or 1981, and has not had any small game hunting privileges revoked within one year prior to February 5, 1982, may take part in the turkey license application drawings.

c. Special Landowner or Tenant Drawing: Persons meeting the eligibility requirements set forth in paragraph (b) of this section who live as landowners or tenants on 40 acres or more of agricultural or grazing land, defined by Sec. 1 of this order, which is located within any zone open to the taking of turkeys may take part in the special landowner-tenant license application drawing. This special drawing shall be subject to the following restrictions:

(1) Applicants must reside in the zone for which the application is made.

(2) For each zone and time period, not more than twenty percent of the successful participants shall be drawn from the special landowner-tenant applications.

(3) Participants in the landowner-tenant drawing may submit only one drawing application and only for the turkey zone in which they reside.

(4) Properly completed applications of participants unsuccessful in the landowner-tenant drawing will be included in the general drawing.

(5) All participants who are successful in the special landowner-tenant drawing must allow turkey hunting on their lands. The Commissioner will provide descriptions of these lands to licensed turkey hunters.

d. Participation in Drawings: All persons desiring to take part in one of the turkey license application drawings must complete either the form entitled "1982 GENERAL TURKEY HUNT APPLICATION FOR COMPUTER DRAWING" or, if appropriate pursuant to paragraph c. of this section, the form entitled "1982 RESIDENT LANDOWNER OR TENANT TURKEY HUNT APPLICATION FOR COMPUTER DRAWING" and return it to the DNR License Bureau. Applications must be returned or postmarked no later than December 11, 1981. All information requested on the forms must be provided, except that the applicant's social security number is only requested, not mandatory. The social security number will be used as an identification number only. Persons submitting the landowner-tenant form must provide a complete and accurate description of the qualifying land. All applicants must choose one of the four zones and one of the four time periods. Two or more persons desiring to hunt together may apply together by submitting their drawing applications in one envelope. Properly completed applications which are submitted in one envelope will either all be selected or none selected. Mixing landowner-tenant applications with general applications will not be permitted for purposes of applying as a party. Any person who makes a faulty application or who applies as a landowner or tenant but does not live on at least 40 acres of agricultural or grazing land or does not live within the zone applied for, will be ineligible for both the landowner-tenant drawing and general drawing.

e. Penalties: No person shall submit more than a total of one application for participation in the drawings. Any person who submits more than one application in any one year shall be ineligible to receive a turkey license in that year and shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sec. 3. LICENSING AND ORIENTATION.

a. Only participants successful in a drawing will be notified.

b. An application for a turkey license, additional instructions and other information will be sent to each participant successful in a drawing.

c. Before hunting turkeys, participants successful in a drawing must:

1. Apply for and receive a 1982 turkey hunting license.

2. Purchase a 1982 Minnesota small game license.

3. Attend a turkey hunting orientation session conducted by the Department of Natural Resources. Successful applicants for 1982 need not attend a turkey hunt orientation session if they received a turkey hunting license in 1978 or 1979 and attended an orientation session at that time.

4. Have the turkey license validated after attending the orientation session.

Sec. 4. SEASON DATES, ZONES, HOURS AND WEAPONS.

a. Hours and weapons: Legal turkeys may be taken by licensed hunters using legal shotgun or legal bow and arrow between one-half hour before sunrise and 12:00 noon daily during the dates and within the zones described in this section.

b. Zones: Each hunter may hunt only within the zone designated on his or her license. All lands within the Upper Mississippi Fish and Wildlife Refuge are closed to the taking of turkeys.

TURKEY ZONE #1

That portion of the state lying within the following described boundary:

Beginning at the intersection of State Trunk Highway (STH) 26 and U.S. Highway 16; thence along U.S. Hwy. 16 to STH 44; thence along STH 44 to STH 76; thence along STH 76 to the southern boundary of the state; thence along the southern boundary of the state to the eastern boundary of the state; thence along the eastern boundary of the state to U.S. Highway 16; thence along U.S. Highway 16 to the point of beginning.

TURKEY ZONE #2

That portion of the state lying within the following described boundary:

Beginning at the intersection of U.S. Hwy. 61 and County State Aid Highway (CSAH) 25, Winona County; thence along CSAH 25 to CSAH 28, Winona County; thence along CSAH 28 to CSAH 31, Winona County; thence along CSAH 31 to State Trunk Highway (STH) 248; thence along STH 248 to CSAH 33, Winona County; thence along CSAH 33 to U.S. Hwy. 14; thence along U.S. Hwy. 14 to CSAH 25, Winona County; thence along CSAH 25 to CSAH 12, Winona County; thence along CSAH 12 to STH 43; thence along STH 43 to CSAH 10, Fillmore County; thence along CSAH 10 to CSAH 23, Fillmore County; thence along CSAH 23 to CSAH 18, Fillmore County; thence along CSAH 18 to CSAH 19, Houston County; thence along CSAH 19 to CSAH 4, Houston County; thence along CSAH 4 to CSAH 11, Houston County; thence along CSAH 11 to CSAH 12, Houston County; thence along CSAH 12 to STH 44; thence along STH 44 to U.S. Highway 16; thence along U.S. Highway 16 to the eastern boundary of the state; thence along the eastern boundary of the state to the northern boundary of Winona County; thence west along the northern boundary of Winona County to U.S. Hwy. 61; thence along U.S. Hwy. 61 to the point of beginning.

TURKEY ZONE #3

That portion of the state lying within the following described boundary:

Beginning at the intersection of State Trunk Highway (STH) 42 and County State Aid Highway (CSAH) 4, Wabasha County; thence along CSAH 4 to CSAH 10, Olmsted County; thence along CSAH 10 to CSAH 9, Olmsted County; thence along CSAH 9 to CSAH 22, Winona County; thence along CSAH 22 to STH 74; thence along STH 74 to U.S. Highway 14; thence along U.S. Highway 14 to CSAH 33, Winona County; thence along CSAH 33 to STH 248; thence along STH 248 to CSAH 31, Winona County; thence along CSAH 31 to CSAH 28, Winona County; thence along CSAH 28 to CSAH 25, Winona County; thence along CSAH 25 to U.S. Highway 61; thence along U.S. Highway 61 to CSAH 14, Wabasha County; thence along CSAH 14 to STH 42; thence along STH 42 to the point of beginning.

TURKEY ZONE #4

That portion of the state lying within the following described boundary:

Beginning at the intersection of U.S. Highway 61 and the southern boundary of Wabasha County; thence along U.S. Hwy. 61 to County State Aid Highway (CSAH) 14, Wabasha County; thence along CSAH 14 to STH 42; thence along STH 42 to CSAH 4, Wabasha County; thence along CSAH 4 to CSAH 33, Wabasha County; thence along CSAH 33 to CSAH 2, Wabasha County; thence along CSAH 2 to U.S. Hwy. 63; thence along U.S. Hwy. 63 to CSAH 15, Wabasha County; thence along CSAH 15 to CSAH 9, Goodhue County; thence along CSAH 9 to CSAH 6, Goodhue County; thence along CSAH 6 to CSAH 1, Goodhue County; thence along CSAH 1 to U.S. Hwy. 61; thence along U.S. Hwy. 61 to U.S. Hwy. 63; thence along U.S. Hwy. 63 to the eastern boundary of the state; thence along the eastern boundary of the state to the southern boundary of Wabasha County; thence west along to the southern boundary of Wabasha County to the point of beginning.

c. Dates: The 1982 turkey season is open in all four zones during the following dates:

April 17 through 21

April 29 through May 3

April 23 through 27

May 5 through 9

Each hunter may hunt only during the five day period designated on his or her license. All dates are inclusive.

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ADOPTED RULES

Sec. 5. QUOTAS.

The following quotas on hunter numbers are established for each zone and time period. These quotas may be subject to modification in order to accommodate party members if the last applicant to be drawn for a zone is a member of a party.

Sec. 6. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.

a. Bag Limit: No hunter shall take more than one legal turkey. No hunter shall tag a turkey which he or she did not take. No hunter shall tag a turkey with the tag of another hunter. All turkeys taken must be killed before being removed from the site where taken.

b. Assisting: Any licensed turkey hunter may assist any other licensed turkey hunter in hunting turkeys. Any licensed turkey hunter who has already taken a turkey may assist any other licensed turkey hunter provided that the assisting hunter shall not carry afield any firearms or bow and arrow. Assisting shall only be done in the zone and during the time for which the assisting hunter is licensed to hunt turkeys.

c. Tagging: Immediately after taking a turkey, hunters must detach the tag from the license, punch date of kill, sign and attach it to the turkey with a strong cord or wire. This tag must remain attached to the turkey during transit.

d. Registration: Every person taking a turkey must register the turkey no later than 2:00 p.m. of the same day when taken. The feathers, head and feet must remain on the turkey until it is registered. No unregistered turkey shall be possessed outside the zone where taken unless it is being transported in a direct route to a registration station. Registration stations will be the district forestry office in Caledonia, Whitewater Wildlife Management Area Headquarters and the Lake City Forestry-Fisheries Office.

e. Turkeys may not be taken with the aid of dogs. No person shall be accompanied by a dog or dogs while hunting or assisting in hunting turkeys.

f. Turkeys may not be taken with the aid of any electronic device.

g. No turkeys shall be taken in any manner in any area of the state except as herein expressly provided or as otherwise provided by statute or Commissioner's Order.

h. None of the provisions of this order shall be construed as modifying or superseding any order establishing legal game refuges within the state nor as permitting the taking of any wild animals within such refuges or within state parks.

Commissioner's Order No. 2111

Regulations for the Retention and Importation of Protected Wild Animals, Superseding Commissioner's Order No. 2022

Pursuant to authority vested in me by law, I, Joseph N. Alexander, Commissioner of Natural Resources, hereby prescribe the following regulations for the retention and importation of protected wild animals.

Sec. 1. Possession and Storage.

a. Except as otherwise provided by law or this order, wild animals protected and lawfully taken in this state or elsewhere may be possessed and stored in any manner except in a commercial cold storage warehouse.

b. The provisions of Sec. 2 through 6 of this order shall not apply to antlers, bear claws, squirrel skins, the hides of deer, moose or bear, dressed furs or to mounted specimens of wild animals.

Sec. 2. Labeling. Except for raw furs and live animals, all wild animals protected in Minnesota, regardless of where taken, which are in storage in Minnesota at any location other than the residence of the person by whom they were taken, shall bear a label containing the following information plainly marked in ink:

- a. Number and species;
- b. Name and address of owner;
- c. Name and address of the person who took the animal; and
- d. The number of the license under which the animal was taken or, if not taken under license, other evidence of lawful taking.

Sec. 3. Reporting Requirement for Retention of Protected Wild Animals.

a. Protected wild animals lawfully taken in Minnesota may be possessed after the fifth day following the close of the applicable hunting, fishing or trapping season only if the owner has first reported his possession of them to the Commissioner or his agent. Such reporting shall be accomplished by submitting a postcard or letter to the Commissioner providing the same information as is required by Sec. 2 of this order and, in addition, the address of the place of storage. When available, reports may be made on forms provided by the Commissioner. All such reports shall be mailed or delivered to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, Division of Enforcement, 658 Cedar Street, Saint Paul, Minnesota 55155.

b. Any wild animal which was taken outside Minnesota and which is protected in Minnesota is subject to the provisions of paragraph a of this section, except that if the animal is brought into Minnesota when the applicable season is closed, the owner shall file the report within five days after bringing the animal into the state.

c. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any raw furs, which are addressed elsewhere in this order, or to wild animals which are otherwise required to be individually registered and tagged after taking or importation into the state.

Sec. 4. Retaining Permits for Raw Furs.

a. The raw fur of any protected wild animal lawfully taken in Minnesota may be possessed and stored by the person who took it after the fifth day following the close of the applicable hunting or trapping season, whichever closes last, only if the person who took it has obtained a raw fur retaining permit from the Commissioner or his agent. Such permit shall be obtained within five days after the close of the applicable season and shall be on a serially numbered form provided by the Commissioner. Raw fur retaining permits shall be issued only after the furs have been presented to the Commissioner's agent for inspection and have been determined by him to have been lawfully taken and possessed.

b. The raw fur of any wild animal which was taken outside Minnesota and which is protected in Minnesota is subject to the provisions of paragraph a of this section, except that if the fur is brought into this state after the end of the applicable Minnesota season or if there is no open season in Minnesota, the owner shall obtain the raw fur retaining permit within five days after bringing the fur into the state.

c. The provisions of paragraphs a and b of this section shall not apply to raw furs which are otherwise required to be individually registered and tagged after taking or importation into the state.

d. The raw fur of any wild animal which is protected in Minnesota, regardless of where taken, which has been purchased by a licensed Minnesota raw fur dealer before the end of the fifth day after the close of the applicable Minnesota hunting or trapping season, whichever closes last, may be possessed and stored by such dealer thereafter only if he obtains a raw fur retaining permit from the Commissioner or his agent. The dealer shall obtain such permit by submitting within five days after the close of the applicable season a signed and notarized inventory of the retained furs, prepared in duplicate on a form provided by the Commissioner. The inventory shall be serially numbered by the Commissioner or his agent, and the duplicate copy shall be returned to the dealer as a raw fur retaining permit for the furs in question.

e. The raw fur of any wild animal which is protected in Minnesota may be purchased by a licensed Minnesota raw fur dealer after the fifth day following the close of the applicable Minnesota hunting or trapping season, whichever closes last, only if the person selling the fur has a raw fur retaining permit for it. If the fur was taken outside Minnesota and there is no open season in Minnesota the licensed Minnesota raw fur dealer may purchase the fur only if the person selling the fur has legally taken, purchased and possessed such raw fur in the state of origin. The seller's complete name and address and the numbers of

appropriate licenses and retaining permits when required shall be recorded in the record book which the dealer is required by law to keep.

f. All raw fur retaining permits issued pursuant to this section shall expire at the end of the day before the first day of the next hunting or trapping season, whichever commences first, for any species listed on the permit. Persons intending to retain raw furs shall obtain a new raw fur retaining permit as provided in this section, before the expiration of the existing permit.

Sec. 5. Importation of Protected Wild Animals.

a. Except for raw furs and live mammals as addressed elsewhere in this order, no wild animals taken outside Minnesota which are protected in Minnesota shall be brought into or transported through this state after the fifth day following the close of the applicable Minnesota hunting, trapping or fishing season, or at any time if there is no open season in Minnesota, unless one of the following conditions is met:

i. The person accompanying such animals has a valid hunting, trapping or fishing license or other proof of lawful possession issued by the state or country in which the animals were taken or otherwise acquired.

ii. The person accompanying such animals has a protected wild animal importation permit from the Commissioner or his agent. Such permit shall be on a serially numbered form provided by the Commissioner and shall be issued only after the animals have been presented to the Commissioner's agent for inspection and have been determined by him to have been lawfully taken and possessed. The permit shall specify the name and address of the owner of the animals, the name and address of the person accompanying them, the species and number of animals involved, their destination and the permit expiration date.

b. Animals brought into or transported through Minnesota by common carrier and accompanied by the proper shipping documents are not subject to the requirements of this section.

Sec. 6. Importation of Raw Furs.

No raw fur of any animal which is protected in Minnesota shall be brought into or transported through this state after the fifth day following the close of the applicable Minnesota hunting or trapping season, or at any time if there is no open season in Minnesota, unless the person accompanying such furs has in his possession the valid hunting or trapping license or other proof of lawful taking that permits the taking or possession of such raw fur in another state or country, or in the case of furs purchased by a licensed Minnesota raw fur dealer the person accompanying the furs must have in immediate possession a bill of sale or bill of lading that indicates the number and species of fur contained in the shipment, the name and address of the seller, the name and address of the purchaser, and the date of sale.

Raw furs brought into or transported through Minnesota by common carrier and accompanied by the proper shipping documents are not subject to the requirements of this section.

Sec. 7. Importation of Live Protected Wild Mammals.

No live wild mammals which are protected in Minnesota shall be brought into or transported through this state at any time, except by common carrier when accompanied by the proper shipping documents, unless the person accompanying such mammals has first obtained a live wild mammal importation permit from the Commissioner or his agent. Such permit shall conform to the permit requirements set forth in Sec. 5a ii. of this order.

Commissioner's Order No. 2022 is hereby superseded.

TAX COURT

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 271.06, subd. 1, an appeal to the tax court may be taken from any official order of the Commissioner of Revenue regarding any tax, fee or assessment, or any matter concerning the tax laws listed in § 271.01, subd. 5, by an interested or affected person, by any political subdivision of the state, by the Attorney General in behalf of the state, or by any resident taxpayer of the state in behalf of the state in case the Attorney General, upon request, shall refuse to appeal. Decisions of the tax court are printed in the *State Register*, except in the case of appeals dealing with property valuation, assessment, or taxation for property tax purposes.

The above matter came on for hearing on the 26th day of July, 1981 at the Olmsted County Courthouse in Rochester before Judge Earl B. Gustafson and was submitted to the Court for decision on post-trial briefs on August 14, 1981.

Joseph Kaminsky, Attorney at Law, appeared for Appellant.

James W. Neher, Special Assistant Attorney General, appeared for Appellee.

Issue

The issue is whether the lease payments received by Appellant for leasing out mobile homes are subject to the sales tax under Minn. Stat. § 297A.01, subd. 3(a) as rental of personal property or exempt as rental of real estate under Minn. Stat. § 297A.01, subd. 3(e).

Decision

The mobile homes leased out by Appellant were not permanently affixed to the land and, therefore, the rental payments were subject to the sales tax as the leasing of personal property.

Findings of Fact

1. During the period of time at issue herein (January 1, 1973-June 30, 1978), Appellant, Silver Lake Mobile Home Park, Inc. ("Silver Lake"), owned eleven mobile homes which were leased out for periods of 30 days or more.
2. The leased mobile homes were located on land owned by Silver Lake and were connected to public utilities, including sewer and water. Their wheels had been removed, and they were resting on, but not affixed to, concrete blocks. The concrete blocks were hidden from view by "skirting" placed around the outside of the mobile homes. None of the homes incorporated a permanent foundation.
3. At all times relevant herein, the mobile homes remained personal property, were listed as personal property by the Olmsted County Assessor, and were never permanently affixed to the land so as to constitute real property.
4. On September 8, 1978, the Commissioner of Revenue, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 297A.32, prepared sales and use tax returns for Silver Lake, assessing additional sales tax on the mobile home lease payments in the amount of \$2,722.20, with penalty and interest in the amounts of \$785.96 and \$737.43, respectively, for a total assessed liability of \$4,245.59.
5. Subsequently, Silver Lake remitted to the commissioner tax, penalty and interest in the sum of \$4,432.89, and on February 21, 1980, filed a claim for refund of that amount. The claim for refund was denied by Commissioner's Order dated August 1, 1980, and Silver Lake has appealed from that Order.

Conclusions of Law

1. Under Minn. Stat. § 278A.01, subd. 3(a), and Minn. Rule Tax S & U 604(B), sales tax was properly imposed upon the rental of Appellant's mobile homes as personal property.
2. The Order of the Commissioner of Revenue, dated August 1, 1980, is affirmed.

LET JUDGMENT BE ENTERED ACCORDINGLY. A STAY OF 15 DAYS IS HEREBY ORDERED.

TAX COURT

Memorandum

This case turns on a fact question: whether the mobile homes were permanently affixed to the land. If they were permanently affixed and became real property, their rental would be exempt from the sales tax under Minn. Stat. § 297A.01, subd. 3(e), as real property rented or leased "for a continuous period of 30 days or more."

The commissioner's assessment of sales tax on the mobile home rentals was based on Minn. Rule Tax S & U 604(B), which, for the sake of uniformity and consistency, was modeled after the criteria applied by local assessors in determining whether mobile homes should be classified as personal or real property. The regulation provides:

B. Property permanently affixed to realty. In some cases, mobile homes or house trailers may lose their identity as personal property because of alterations made to them. Such property will be considered to be real property if all of the following criteria are met:

1. The unit must be affixed to the land by a permanent foundation or in a manner similar to other real property in the district.
2. The unit must be connected to public utilities, especially water and sewer or have its own well and septic tank system or be commensurate with other real property in the district insofar as these facilities are concerned.
3. The wheels must be removed.

Sales of property meeting this criteria are exempt sales of real property.

There was no material conflict in the testimony. Both Mr. Felix Kaminsky, manager and part owner of the mobile home park during the relevant period, and Mr. Richard Byrne, a certified state assessor employed by Olmsted County, testified that the mobile homes (1) were connected to public utilities; (2) rested on concrete blocks with their wheels removed; and (3) utilized "skirting" around the outside for esthetic and insulation purposes.

The mobile homes were not "affixed" to the land, but rather, rested on concrete blocks. None had foundations or footings that went below the frost line "in a manner similar to other real property in the district." The assessor had consistently classified them as personal property, not real property.

Minn. Stat. § 297A.01, subd. 3(a), defines a taxable "sale" as, among other things, ". . . the leasing of . . . tangible personal property, for a consideration in money. . . ." The mobile homes constituted personal property during the period in question and, therefore, their rental was subject to the sales tax.

48197, 50363/93 (1980) *Barbara Alice Schleret, petitioner, Appellant, v. State of Minnesota. Carlton County.*

Circumstantial evidence that successive non-accidental injuries were inflicted upon a three-year-old child while in the custody of appellant was sufficient to support her conviction for manslaughter in the first degree under the rules defining "battered child syndrome" adopted in *State v. Loss*, 295 Minn. 271, 204 N.W.2d 404 (1973).

Affirmed. Otis, J. Dissenting. Wahl, J. and Sheran, C. J.

81-238/Sp. *Donna R. Maday, et al., Appellants, v. Yellow Taxi Company of Minneapolis, Theodore Yankovich, et al., Defendants. Hennepin County.*

Defendants, whose negligence produced indivisible injuries, are jointly and severally liable to plaintiffs for their entire recoverable damages pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 604.01, subd. 1 (1976).

Affirmed in part; reversed in part. Otis, J.

81-322/Sp. *Ronald Olson, et al., Appellants, v. Edward Kozlowski. Chisago County.*

A genuine issue of material fact exists concerning defendant's identity as the tortfeasor.

Reversed and remanded. Otis, J.

50539/334 (1980) State of Minnesota v. William T. Hansen, Sr., Appellant. Pope County.

Out-of-court declaration of an alleged accomplice, which was made after the accomplice was promised a reduced charge and which was not predominantly inculpatory, is not admissible as a statement against interest under Minn. R. Evid. 804(b) (3).

Statement made out of court by a witness, who was not cross-examined and who was motivated by a reward, was not sufficiently reliable to justify admission under the residual hearsay exception, Minn. R. Evid. 804(b) (5).

Admission of the statements of two witnesses, which were not made under oath or tested by cross-examination, violated defendant's sixth amendment right of confrontation when there was no evidence indicating that the witnesses' refusal to testify at trial was caused by defendant's conduct.

52093/Sp. Metropolitan Transit Commission, Appellant, v. Bachman's. Hennepin County.

Habeas corpus petitioner alleging failure of parole authorities to follow applicable procedures in denying parole is entitled to an evidentiary hearing on his allegations where it is not clear as a matter of law from the pleadings that he is not entitled to relief.

51186/Sp. National Indemnity Company, Appellant, v. Mutual Service Casualty Company. Hennepin County.

Minn. Stat. § 65B.53, subd. 1 (1978), which provides for indemnity against insurers of commercial vehicles when an insurer of a noncommercial vehicle has paid basic economic loss benefits, bears a rational relationship to the legitimate purpose of fair loss allocation.

Minn. Stat. § 65B.53, subd. 4 (1980) does not infringe the right to trial by jury since indemnity is an equitable principle.

District court may decide merits of petition for postconviction relief without evidentiary hearing only when there is no material fact in issue.

Employee living in Waterville, Minnesota, is not required to meet employment 60 miles away in the Twin Cities metropolitan area in order to make a "reasonably diligent effort" to find substitute work for purposes of Minn. Stat. § 176.101, subd. 2 (1980).

Where an individual is employed by more than one employer, the right to unemployment compensation benefits must be determined as it relates to each of the multiple employers and the resulting benefits, if any, adjusted according to prescribed statutory procedures.
