By Laws 1907, Chapter 470, the state auditor was made the secretary of the state drainage commission and paid at the rate of \$400.00 per year. Members of the legislature at the time of the passage of the act are not prohibited from becoming candidates for state auditor at the ensuing primary election. *Benson v Schmahl*, 125 M 104, 145 NW 794.

The several drainage statutes, including Laws 1905, Chapter 230, and Laws 1907, Chapter 470, and subsequent amendments thereof, all relating to one general subject, namely, the drainage of wet and overflowed agricultural lands, are in pari materia, and should be construed together as one law. *Wold v Bankers Surety*, 133 M 90, 157 NW 990.

The conservation commissioner during drouth may cooperate with municipalities in the construction of dams and so operate them as to raise the water to ordinary high-water mark and relieve distress. OAG Aug. 14, 1934 (983d).

The rule laid down in *Sheehan v Flynn*, 59 M 436, 61 NW 462, that by reasonable drainage works on his own premises a landowner may dispose of surface water as best he can so long as he does not unreasonably injure his neighbor, applies only to private rights. It has no application to a public drainage proceeding wherein the statute requires compensation to all who suffer damage. In *re Town Ditch No. 1*, 208 M 566, 295 NW 47.

Following *State v Watts*, 116 M 326, to the effect that a departure by the engineer in his report in drainage proceedings from the points of commencement and terminus of the proposed ditch, when found necessary to render effective and complete a proposed drain, is not fatal to the proceedings. *Boetcher v Nelson*, 137 M 265, 161 NW 714, 163 NW 510.

The question of the necessity and propriety of drainage projects is addressed to the judgment and discretion of the tribunal having jurisdiction of the matter whose conclusions may be disturbed only when the evidence furnishes no legal basis for the decision of such tribunal. *Boetcher v Nelson*, 137 M 265, 161 NW 714, 163 NW 510.
